40. **Pictorial 1837 Hard Times token.** Smiths Clock Establishment, No. 7½ Bowery, New York. Rev shows clock face with Roman numerals, "Time is money". HT#317, 28½mm, chocolate, XF-AU. Range \$60 to \$100. Min. \$45.

41. Four varieties of Hartford, CT beer tokens, Scheller & Craemer, 22 Central Row. Scarce. Revs all have Good For 5 Drink. 1 variety has cent-sign after 5. All octagonal, brass, 7/8", lettering and border markings all different. Range \$75 to \$100. Min. \$55.

46. Four Joan of Arc charms and pendant. 3 silver charms from 5/8" to 7/8". 1 aluminum pendant 1-1/8". All have loops for suspension. Fine condition or better. Range \$75 to \$100. Min. \$55.

47. **Two satirical Jackass tokens.** Both brass, 1-1/8", with common rev. showing 2 jackasses, "When shall we three meet again" ••Applegates Palace of Flying Animals. Stained, VF. ••Sinkler & Davey, Manuf. Of Fancy Metalwork, etc. Phila., F. Range \$40 to \$50. Min. \$30.

48. Salt spoon, bowl is 1883 silver Hawaiian dime. Twist silver handle. 3". Dime toned XF-AU. Hand-made. Range \$200 to \$250. Min. \$150.

51. **1955 silver American Legion life membership card.** Engraved to member, Post 15, Dade City, Florida. Raised Legion logo in gold & copper. Facsimile signatures. 3-1/8"x2-1/8", 21.6 grams, XF. Range \$100 to \$125. Min. \$75.

52. NGC certified MS66, 1959 silver Alaska Statehood medal, type 1. Bust of Seward right, flanked by mountains and grizzly bears. Rev Alaska flag, "Alaska, admitted to the Union, 1959". Type 1 where size and weight are the same as the U.S. Mint commem half dollars – to prevent confusion with U.S. commem halves the thickness and weight was increased on the type 2 so-called half dollar. Type one is the rarer of the two issues. 31mm. Range \$150 to \$175. Min. \$110.

55. **1907 Jamestown Expo relic medal.** Indian canoe shaped top bar, "Jamestown Exposition". Attached below is an anchor made from iron taken from The U.S.S. Merrimack. Anchor stamped "Merrimack, 1862, Virginia", rev stamped "Jamestown Exposition:". Comes with original damaged card which shows picture of the ironclad battle. Rare with original card and Jamestown attachment. Medal is 1-5/8" overall. VF. Range \$250 to \$350. Min. \$185.

58. **1875** Connecticut copper. Military bust right. Miller 4.3-D, rarity 6. VG-F. Cleaned at one time, showing unnatural orange patina, now starting to retone. Planchet laminations on rev. Homely, but scarce. Range \$125 to \$175. Min. \$95

59. Scovills Daguerreotype Miller token. New York. Libertyhead as on \$10 gold., "Scovills" on coronet, "101 William St. N.Y.". Rev eagle. Miller NY805. Gilt-brass, ca 1850, reeded edge, 27mm, XF with couple old scratches and punch mark on rev. Range \$60 to \$100. Min. \$45.

60. Brass British coin weight, George II pictured, (1727-1760). "George II Rex". Rev shows crown, "1 Guinea, W" Brass, ¾", F-VF. Range \$60 to \$85. Min. \$45.
