Ember Fasts.—The Ember Days occur four times a year as follows:

(1) Wednesday, Friday, Saturday following the first Sunday in Lent;

(2) Wednesday, Friday, Saturday following Pentecost Sunday;

(3) Wednesday, Friday, Saturday following the Exaltation of the Holy Cross;

(4) Wednesday, Friday, Saturday of the third week in Advent.

Vigil Fasts of the Church are the vigils of

(1) Christmas;

(2) Pentecost;

(3) Assumption of the Blessed Virgin;

(4) Feast of All Saints.

Vigil Fasts of our Congregation are the vigils of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (December 8), and the Feast of our holy Father St. Francis (October 4).

Method of Assisting at Mass

From St. Leonard of Port Maurice

To pay the fourfold debt which you owe to God, imagine that you are the debtor in the Gospel, who owed ten thousand talents, and that you hear the divine Justice demanding payment. Ask the Lord to have patience with you, and to allow you sufficient time to hear Mass; tell him that, in the Mass, Jesus will enable you to make full satisfaction to His Justice. Then divide the Mass into four parts.

FROM THE BEGINNING TO THE OFFERTORY

Humble yourself with Jesus, and sinking into the abyss of your own nothingness, confess sincerely that you are a most miserable nothing before the Majesty of God; thus humbled interiorly, and with a composed and modest exterior, say:

O MY God, I adore Thee. I acknowledge Thee as my Lord, and the Master of my soul. I protest that all I am and have are Thy gifts. And, because Thy Majesty merits infinite honor and homage, I, who am a poor miserable creature, utterly incapable of paying the great debt which I owe to Thee, offer to Thee the humiliations and homage which Jesus presents to Thee on the altar: what Jesus does, I also intend to do. I humble and prostrate myself with Him before Thy Majesty. I am filled with

joy and delight in reflecting that Jesus gives Thee, for me, infinite honor and homage.

FROM THE OFFERTORY TO THE ELEVATION

Reflect on the enormity of your sins, and on the immense debt which you have contracted by them toward the divine Justice, and say with a humble heart:

BEHOLD, my God, the sinner, who has so often rebelled against Thee. With a sorrowful heart, and with all the affections of my soul, I abhor and detest all my sins, and I offer for them the same satisfaction which Jesus presents to Thee on the altar. I offer to Thee all the merits of Jesus, the blood of Jesus, Jesus entirely, God and man, who is here immolated again for me. And since my Jesus Himself is here on this altar, my Mediator and Advocate, and since, with His most precious blood He implores pardon for me, I unite with the cry of His blood, and supplicate mercy for all my sins. The blood of Jesus cries for mercy; my sorrowful heart also implores mercy. Ah, my heavenly Father, if my tears do not move Thee, let at least the groans of my Jesus excite Thy pity. Why should He

not obtain for me that mercy which He obtained on the cross for the whole human race? Yes, I hope, in view of that most precious blood, that Thou wilt pardon all my sins, which I shall bewail till my last breath.

FROM THE ELEVATION TO THE COMMUNION

Reflecting on the great benefits received from God, you ought in return offer Him a gift of infinite value; this is the body and blood of Christ. Invite all the angels and saints to thank God, in the following, or in some similar manner:

BEHOLD me, O my most loving God, loaded with the general and particular benefits which Thou hast bestowed, and wilt bestow upon me in time and eternity. I know that Thy mercies to me are infinite. But I am ready to pay Thee for all, even to the last farthing. Behold, the tribute of my gratitude, the payment which I offer for all Thy goodness, is this divine blood, this most precious body, this innocent Victim, which I present to Thee by the hands of the priest. I am certain that this oblation is sufficient to pay for all the gifts Thou hast conferred upon me: this gift of infinite value is an equivalent for all the favors I have ever

received from Thee. Ah, ye holy angels, and all ye blessed spirits, help me to thank my God; and in thanksgiving for all His benefits, offer to Him not only this Mass, but also all the Masses that are now celebrated throughout the world, that His loving goodness may be fully recompensed for all the graces which He has bestowed, and will bestow upon me, now and for all eternity. Amen.

FROM THE COMMUNION TO THE END OF MASS

Knowing that during this time Jesus is united with you and prays and supplicates for you, dilate your heart, and with great confidence ask for graces, not for things of little value, but for great graces; for great is the oblation of the divine Son, which you present to the Father. Say to Him with a humble heart:

O ETERNAL Father, I acknowledge that I am utterly unworthy of Thy favors. I confess my unworthiness, and that for my many sins, I do not deserve to be heard. But how canst Thou refuse to hear Thy Son, who on this altar prays for me, and offers for me His blood and His life? My most loving God, hear the prayers of my great Advocate, and for His sake, grant me all the graces which

Thou knowest to be necessary to secure my salvation. I am now encouraged to ask of Thee a general pardon of all my sins, and the gift of final perseverance. Trusting in the merits of my Jesus, I ask of Thee, O my God, all virtues in a heroic degree, and all the efficacious helps necessary to make me a saint. I ask of Thee the conversion of all sinners especially of those related to me. I ask for my sisters in religion a true devotion: make them all saints, that this house may be to Thee a place of delights, and a school of virtue to us all. Amen.

I give Thee my will, my affections, my desires, and all that I have. From this day forward do with me, and whatever belongs to me, what Thou pleasest; I ask and desire only Thy love, the gift of final perseverance, and the perfect accomplishment of Thy holy will. I recommend to Thee the souls in purgatory, particularly those who were most devout to the blessed Sacrament and to holy Mary; and I recommend to Thee all poor sinners. Finally, my dear Savior, I unite all my affections to Thy most loving Heart, and thus united, I offer them to Thy eternal Father, and I beseech Him in Thy name, and for Thy sake, to accept them. Amen.

Spiritual Communion

I BELIEVE in Thee, O my Jesus, present in the most holy Sacrament of the Altar; I love Thee above all things, and I desire to receive Thee into my soul.

Since I cannot now receive Thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace Thee, and I unite myself to Thee, as if Thou wert already there. The Franciscan Crown

Finding that he could not continue this devout practice in the Order, he was about to leave, when our blessed Mother appeared to him and told him not to leave the Order, since by reciting a rosary of the seven joys every day, he could offer her a more pleasing crown.

Every time a religious of the Franciscan Order recites the Crown, she gains a plenary indulgence.

The seven joyful mysteries are as follows:

First—The Annunciation.

Second—The Visitation.

Third—The Nativity.

Fourth—The Adoration of the Magi.

Fifth—The Finding of Jesus in the Temple.

Sixth—Our Lord's Apparition to His blessed Mother after His Resurrection.

Seventh—The Assumption and Coronation of our Blessed Mother.

Two Aves are then said to make seventy-two.

A Pater and an Ave are said at the end for the Sovereign Pontiff.

which Thou hast merited for me by Thy sufferings and by the effusion of Thy precious blood. Come, O God of light, come and dissipate the darkness of my mind. Come to my soul, O God of sanctity, and replenish it with those graces which flow in abundance from Thy Sacred Heart. Come into my heart, O God of charity, and inflame it with that ardor which is hidden with Thee in this adorable Sacrament, the furnace of sacred love. Come to my body, O God of all purity, to purify and sanctify this sinful flesh.

I accept, with an entire submission, death, which I have deserved; but I plead that Thou wouldst receive as a sacrifice of love, what I am obliged to pay Thy justice as a debt contracted by my sins. I wish to die, because I have deserved death; I wish to die, that I may be united to Thee forever; but above all, I wish to die, because such is Thy holy will. Strike, then, my Lord and my God, when it shall please Thee, provided Thou Thyself dost prepare me. It is with these dispositions, O my God and Savior, that I desire to receive Thee. Come, my Jesus, come; my whole soul desires Thee. Come, and

teach me to die well, that I may live forever with Thee in heaven. Amen.

AFTER RECEIVING THE HOLY VIATICUM

NOW, my God and Savior, Thou art mine; Thou Thyself art my Viaticum. Glory and thanksgiving be to Thee, O Jesus, who in Thy sweetness hast been pleased to visit my poor soul. Now, that Thou art come to me, I will never let Thee go. Nothing, my Jesus, nothing shall ever separate me from Thee. I desire to be dissolved and to be with Thee; for Thou art my life, and to die will be my gain. Now I will fear no evil, though I walk in the midst of the shadows of death, for Thou, O Lord, art with me. Thou hast come to be the companion of my soul in its journey to eternity. O sanctify, for the last time, my poor body, and put the seal of immortality upon it. Thy glorified body, my Jesus, is applied to the body of Thy poor creature; Thy blood is running through my veins, leaving everywhere the pledge and germ of a new life.

What have I now to fear! Being thus armed and fortified, I need not dread the most formidable enemies I may have to encounter, since I possess, in the sacred Viaticum, the Lord of Hosts, who Himself combats in me and for me. Lord, in Thee have I trusted, let me never be confounded. Amen.

Extreme Unction

this renovation to the sanctity of the state in which I live; I owe it in gratitude for the many graces I have received; I owe it to the sorrow and reparation which are required for the many faults I have committed; I owe it to the edification of those with whom I live; I owe it to the care of my perfection, which I have much neglected; I owe it to the spiritual good of those who are entrusted to me; I owe it, in fine, to the preparation for my eternity, into which I may perhaps enter before another renovation is allowed to me. I know what I have to fear from my weakness, after the sad experience of the past, after so many other renovations, after so many repeated promises; it will not be the same, I hope, after this one. Aid me, O my God, with fresh help of Thy grace; with this help I promise Thee a more constant fidelity in fulfilling all my duties. From this day forward, I shall labor for this end. May I never go astray from it all my life! Most holy Virgin, St. Joseph, my good guardian angel and my holy patron, obtain for me the grace to be faithful to these resolutions, to be entirely renewed in heart, in words, and in deeds.
