

Precautions

Installing your TV

- Place the TV on the floor or on a sturdy platform. The
 mounting surface should be flat and steady. If you install the
 TV on a soft floor, make sure that the floor is not damaged
 by the weight of the TV.
- This TV set may be used only with the Toshiba stands shown on page 48. Use with other stands may result in instability, causing possible injury.
- Place the TV far enough away from the walls to allow proper ventilation. This will prevent the TV from overheating and avoid possible damage to the TV. Avoid dusty areas too.

Using your TV

- Do not stand or climb on the TV.
- Do not put any heavy object on top of the TV.
- Do not place containers with liquids such as drinks or cosmetics on the TV. If any foreign material or water leaks into the TV, unplug the power cord and contact your dealer.
- Avoid displaying stationary images on your TV screen for extended periods of time. Stationary patterns generated by a Multi-Window display, computer displays, video games, stock market reports, etc., can become permanently engrained on the picture tube. This damage is not protected by your warranty because it is the result of misuse. If you wish to use your TV to display still images, reduce brightness and contrast settings. Never leave a Multi-Window, computer, or video game display unattended.

Cleaning your TV

- To clean the TV screen:
 - 1. First remove the plug from the power outlet to avoid possible shock hazard.
- 2. Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of mild detergent and warm water to clean the TV screen and trim. Do not use too much water on the TV screen. Water spills into the cabinet and may cause damage to the TV. Avoid excess water.
- Remove any extra moisture with the same cloth or a dry one.

CAUTION

Never use strong solvents such as thinner, benzene or other chemicals on or near cabinet, as they might damage the finish of the cabinet.

Introduction

Welcome to Toshiba

Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.


This manual applies to models 32AFX61 and 36AFX61. Before you start reading, check your model number by looking at the rear of the TV.


Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You can also use the controls on the TV if they have the same name as those on the remote control.


Please read all the safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep the manual for future reference.

Exploring your new TV

You can operate your TV by using the buttons on the front panel or the remote control. The back panel and front panel (behind the door) provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other equipment to your TV.







Connecting your TV

If you have not connected electronic equipment before, or you have been frustrated in the past, you may wish to read this section. (Cables are not supplied.)


- A coaxial cable is the standard cable that comes in from your antenna or cable converter box. Coaxial cables use "F" connectors.
- Audio and video cables are usually color-coded according to use: yellow for video and red and white for audio. The red audio cable is for the stereo right channel, and the white audio cable is for the stereo (or mono) left channel. If you look at the rear panel of the TV, you will see that the terminals are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-video cables provide better picture performance. S-video cables can only be used with S-video compatible components.
- ColorStream® cables come in sets of three. A ColorStream connection will provide the best picture performance.


Connecting a VCR

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record from one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (one S-video cable for an S-VHS VCR)





Caution:

Do not plug the TV in until you have finished connecting all of your equipment.

Caution:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable. If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video


cable (in the S-Video inputs) instead of a regular video cable.

Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time. Doing so will distort the picture.

Connecting a cable converter box

This connection allows you to watch cable and premium channels. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels, select ANT-2 and tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), then use the converter box to change channels. You will need:

· two coaxial cables



Note:


When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

Connecting a cable converter box and VCR

This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, watch videotapes, and record one TV channel while watching another TV channel. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels or record with the VCR, select ANT-2, change the TV channel to 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and then use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- one two-way cable signal splitter
- three coaxial cables
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (one S-video cable for an S-VHS VCR)



Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable. If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable (in the S-video jacks) instead of a regular video cable. Do not connect both a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time. Doing so will distort the picture.


When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

Connecting a DVD player or satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, and TV programs. You can record one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (one single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (between the TV and VCR)
- one S-video cable (between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver



Connecting a DVD player with or without ColorStream[®] and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, and TV programs, and record TV and some DVD programs. You can record from one source while watching a program from another source.

Your TV has ColorStream component video inputs. Connecting your TV to a ColorStream-compatible DVD player (such as a Toshiba ColorStream DVD player) can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- three pairs of audio cables (two single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- two video cables
- one set of ColorStream video cables (one S-video cable for a non-ColorStream DVD player; see notes at right of illustration on next page).

Note:


For the highest possible picture quality from a non-ColorStream DVD player/satellite receiver, you must use an S-video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver. (If your DVD player or satellite receiver is ColorStream-compatible, see page 8).

Do not connect both an S-video cable and a regular video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time. Doing so will distort the picture.

Do not connect the DVD player/satellite receiver and VCR to the same video channel on the TV. (See the illustration, which shows the DVD player/satellite receiver connected to Video-1 and the VCR connected to Video-2.)

Caution:

The unauthorized recording of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials may infringe upon the provisions of copyright laws.




Connecting two VCRs

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from one VCR to another VCR while watching a videotape. You can also record from one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (two single audio cables for mono VCRs)
- two video cables (two S-video cables for S-VHS VCRs)



Note:

For the highest possible picture quality, you must use the ColorStream connections between the TV and DVD player. You can connect the ColorStream cables from the DVD player to either ColorStream jack on the TV (HD1 or HD2).

The ColorStream HD1 and HD2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p) and Interlace (480i, 1080i) scan systems.

If your DVD player is not ColorStreamcompatible, use the S-video connections (both audio and video) instead of the ColorStream connections.

Do not connect both S-Video and ColorStream cables between the TV and DVD player at the same time. Doing so will distort the picture.

To record from the DVD player (when authorized), set the VCR to Line IN. To monitor recording from the DVD player, set the VCR to Line IN and the TV to Video-1.

Caution:

The unauthorized recording of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials may infringe upon the provisions of copyright laws.

Note:

Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.

If you have S-VHS VCRs, use S-video cables (in the S-video jacks) instead of regular video cables. Do not connect both a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time.

To dub or edit, VCR 2 must select Line IN, and the TV must select Video-1.

- * The Audio OUT jacks can output the sound of either the Main or PIP picture (see "Selecting the Audio OUT sound" on page 45).
- ** The Video OUT jack does not output the PIP picture.



Connecting a camcorder

This connection allows you to watch video materials recorded on a camcorder.

You will need:

- one pair of audio cables
- one video cable (one S-video cable for an S-VHS camcorder)



Note:

If you have an S-VHS camcorder, the picture quality will increase if you use an S-video cable (in the S-video jacks) instead of a regular video cable.

Do not connect both a regular video cable and an S-video cable to at the same time.


Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier to adjust the audio level. This also allows you to use external speakers.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the built-in speakers. (See "Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 45.)

You will need:

• one pair of audio cables



From Cable, Cable Box or Antenna

Note:

To hear sound when using an external audio amplifier, the volume of both the TV and amplifier must be set above 0 (zero).

For example, if the volume of the TV is set to 0, you will not be able to hear any sound, even if the volume of the amplifier is at its highest level.


Connecting an A/V receiver

This connection allows you to use an A/V (audio/video) receiver to enhance your TV's sound.


If you have a system with Dolby Pro Logic® surround sound, you can add to the realism of the sound by using the TV speakers as center channel speakers.

You will need:

- one pair of audio cables
- · one single audio cable for the audio center channel
- · one video cable



Dolby Pro Logic* surround sound system connection example



*Dolby Pro Logic is a registered trademark of Dolby Laboratories Licensing Corporation.

Caution:

To avoid damaging the speakers, turn the TV off before connecting or disconnecting the Audio Center Channel cable.

Note:

Refer to the instructions provided with your A/V receiver for details about your sound system.

When the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the TV speakers will function only as center channel speakers.

To adjust the volume of the center channel speakers, use the center level control on the A/V receiver.

To use the TV speakers as normal speakers, set the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch to the OFF position.

Using the remote control

Preparing the remote control for use

Your Toshiba TV remote control has one dedicated TV mode and five universal modes: VCR, Cable/SAT, DVD, Audio1, and Audio2. The target and default devices being programmed for each mode are as follows:



Repeatedly press MODE to cycle among the modes. If you own different brands of audio/video devices, you first have to program your remote control (see "Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices" on page 14).


Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.



2. Install two "AA" size alkaline batteries. Match the + and - signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.




3. Slide the battery cover back on the remote control until the lock snaps.

Note:

Your TV remote control may not operate certain features on your VCR, DVD player, cable TV converter, or other electronic device.

Refer to the owner's manuals for your other devices to determine their available features. If your TV remote control does not operate a specific feature on another device, use the remote control that came with the device.



Note:

• Battery life expectancy is about one year with normal use.

Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or you do not intend to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

- "VCR ——>" will jump to last active VCR or DVD. Active VCR/DVD is defined as the mode that remains for a minimum of 5 seconds, or if a key is pressed in that mode.
- * The VOLUME and MUTE will jump to "TV" by default. When the volume is unlocked, all the devices will have their own volume. The AUDIO1/2 (Receiver, CD) modes will have their own volume even if Volume Lock is on TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, or DVD. See "Using the Volume Lock feature" on page 15.

Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices

Device code setup

- 1. Refer to the device code table on pages 16–19 to find the code for the brand of your device.
 - If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find one that works.
- 2. Repeatedly press MODE until the device mode indicator (CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, AUDIO2) lights up.
- 3. While holding down the RECALL button, press the Channel Number buttons to enter the four-digit code for your device. If a valid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink two times. If an invalid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink one long blink.
- 4. Point the remote control at the device and press POWER to test the code.
 - If the device responds to the remote control, you have entered the correct code.
 - If the device does not respond to the remote control, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 3 and 4 using another code.
- 5. To control the TV, repeatedly press MODE until the TV mode indicator lights up.


Searching and sampling the code of a device (991)

If you do not know the device code for a particular target unit, you can cycle the remote through the available codes for that device mode and sample functions in order to find the code that properly operates the desired target device. The keys available to be sampled, provided they are applicable to that mode, are 0, 1, 2, 3, POWER, VOL \triangle , CH \triangle , PLAY and STOP. Invalid keys will be ignored while in program mode.

To cycle through each available device code and sample its functions:

- 1. Press MODE to select the mode you want to set up.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 9–9–1. The remote control will enter program mode.
- 3. Point the remote control at the target device and press POWER (or other function buttons that are available to be sampled).
- 4. If the device responds to the remote control:
 Press RECALL to store the device code.
 The mode indicator will blink two times and the remote control will exit program mode.
 - If the device does not respond to the remote control:
 Press ▲, and then press POWER.
 Repeat this step until the device responds to the remote control, and then press RECALL.

Note: When a search cycle is complete, the mode indicator will blink three times. The remote control will begin to cycle through the available codes again. If no key is pressed within 10 seconds while programming, the remote control will exit the program mode and return to the previous



Note:

- Every time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2." If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to any of the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control.

Verifying the device code (990)

Use this feature to verify the codes for your other electronic devices. The number of blinks after pressing the 1, 2, 3, and 4 buttons is the 4-digit code set up for that mode.

For example, to verify the device code of the VCR mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE to select VCR mode.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 9–9–0.
- 3. Press $1 \rightarrow 2$ blinks.
- 4. Press $2 \rightarrow 3$ blinks.
- 5. Press $3 \rightarrow 4$ blinks.
- 6. Press $4 \rightarrow 5$ blinks.

This verifies that the device code of the VCR mode is "2345."

Using the Volume Lock feature (993)

For the TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, and DVD modes, the volume controls (VOL ▲▼ and MUTE) can be programmed (locked) to the selected device mode. This feature does not apply to the AUDIO1/2 modes.

For example, to lock the volume controls to always jump to the CABLE/SAT mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE to select the CABLE/SAT mode.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 9–9–3.
- 3. Press VOL ▲. The Mode indicator will blink two times (locked).



Learning about the remote control

POWER turns the TV on and off.

SLEEP allows access to the automatic TV shut-off function (page 41).

LIGHT The first press of the LIGHT button lights the keypad and turns on the Illumination mode. With the Illumination mode on, pressing any other key lights the keypad for 5 seconds (10 seconds if the remote control is in programming mode). Subsequent presses of the LIGHT button toggle the Illumination mode on and off.






Learning about the menu system


After you have installed the batteries and programmed the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on the TV using the menu system. You can access the menus using the buttons on your TV or remote control.

- Press MENU to display the menu system.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select a menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select an item.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select or adjust a setting.
- If you do not make a selection within 15 seconds, the main menus close automatically (6 seconds for the other menus).
- To close an on-screen display instantly, press EXIT.

 All menu adjustments are saved automatically, whether you press EXIT to close the display or not.









Changing the on-screen display language

Adding channels to the TV's memory



Programming channels automatically


Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in its memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels. If you use both ANT-1 and ANT-2 input sources, you must program channels for each

To program channels automatically:


- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ until TV/CABLE is highlighted.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight either TV or CABLE, depending on which you use. If you use an antenna, highlight TV. If you use cable, highlight CABLE.



4. Press ▼ to highlight CH PROGRAM.



- 5. Press ◀ or ▶ to start channel programming. The TV will automatically cycle through all the TV or cable channels (depending on which you selected), and store all active channels in the channel memory.
 - While the TV is cycling through the channels, the message "Programming Now—Please Wait" appears.
- 6. When channel programming is complete, the message "Completed" appears.




Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have programmed the channels automatically, you can manually add or erase specific channels.

To manually add or erase channels:

- Select the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you must select the channel using the Channel Number buttons.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight ADD/ERASE.





Adjusting the tilt correction feature

When you install the TV or change the direction of the TV, the picture may become tilted because of the earth's magnetic field. If this happens, make the following adjustment.

To adjust the tilt correction:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight TILT CORRECTION.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to correct the picture tilt between +10 and -10.



Changing channels


To change to the next programmed channel:


Press Channel ▲ or ▼ on the TV or remote control.

To change to a specific channel (programmed or unprogrammed):

Press the Channel Number buttons (0-9 and 100).

For channels 100 and higher, press the 100 button and then the next two numbers. For example, to select channel 125, press 100–2–5.

Adjusting the channel settings

Switching between two channels

You can switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.

To switch between two channels:

- 1. Select the first channel you want to view.
- 2. Select a second channel with the Channel Number buttons (0-9, 100).
- 3. Press CH RTN. The previous channel will be displayed.

Each time you press CH RTN, the TV will switch back and forth between the two channels.

Programming your favorite channels

You can preset up to 9 of your favorite channels each for FAVORITE CH 1 and FAVORITE CH 2 modes using the Favorite Channel Programming feature. Because this feature scans through only your favorite channels, it allows you to skip other channels you do not normally watch.


To program your favorite channels:

- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight FAVORITE CH1 or FAVORITE CH2.



3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the FAVORITE CH1 menu, for example.

CH INPUT will be highlighted.









Labeling channels


Channel labels appear above the on-screen channel number display each time you turn on the TV, select a channel, or press the RECALL button. You can choose any four characters to identify the channels.

To create channel labels:



To erase channel labels:

- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.

- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the CH LABELING menu.
- 4. Press ▼ to highlight CH INPUT, and then select the channel you want to clear with the Channel Number buttons.
- 5. Press ▼ to highlight CLEAR.



- 6. Press ◀ or ▶ to erase the channel label.
- 7. Repeat steps 4–6 to erase other channel labels.




Watching picture-in-picture (PIP)

The picture-in-picture (PIP) feature allows you to watch two pictures at the same time. The smaller picture can come from a TV broadcast or an external source, such as a VCR.


To display a TV broadcast as a small picture:

- 1. Turn on the TV and select the program you want to watch.
- 2. Press PIP once to display a small picture. A window 1/9 the size of the screen will appear. Press PIP a second time to display a 1/16-size window.




3. Press PIP CH ▲ ▼ to choose the program you want to be displayed as a small picture.

If the V-CHIP feature is active and you try to watch a TV program that exceeds the rating limits you set, the TV will enter into the program block mode. See "Using the V-CHIP menu" on page 32.




To display a picture from an external source as a small picture:

- 1. Make sure you have connected the external source equipment properly. For more information, see the "Connecting your TV" on page 5.
- 2. Turn on the TV and select the program you want to watch.
- 3. Press PIP once to display a small picture. A window 1/9 the size of the screen will appear. Press PIP a second time to display a 1/16-size window.
- 4. Repeatedly press SOURCE to select the input source (VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, or VIDEO 3) for the small picture. The selected source will be displayed in purple. ColorStream cannot be selected.
- 5. You can play a tape as the small picture or select a channel for the small picture using the VCR's channel button.



To turn PIP off:

Press PIP once or twice, depending on the size of the small picture screen you selected.




Note:

- PIP cannot be turned on when the ColorStream input is being viewed.
- You cannot display the signal sources input through the ANT-2 terminal as a small picture.
- You can choose to hear the sound of either the main or PIP picture (see "Selecting the audio out sound" on page 45).


Switching the main and small pictures

Press SWAP while you are using the PIP feature to switch the main and small pictures. The main and small pictures will switch each time you press the SWAP button.




Changing the position of the small picture

Press LOCATE repeatedly while you are watching a small picture. The display position of the small picture will change in the following order:



Freezing the small picture


Press STILL while you are watching a small picture. The small picture will become a still picture. To return to the moving picture, press STILL again.



Using the Multi-Window feature


The Multi-Window feature provides two channel search modes. One is the Preview that scans the channels programmed in the TV memory by the CH PROGRAM function (6-picture multi-search), and the other is the Favorite that scans the channels programmed in the TV memory by the FAVORITE CH function (9-picture multi-search).

The Strobe function is convenient when watching a quickly moving picture such as a sports program.



Using the preview function

Press INFO to scan the channels you previously programmed into the TV's memory (see "Adding channels to the TV's memory" on page 23). A 6-picture multi-window scan will start.



To cancel the preview function: Press INFO again.


Using the favorite function

1. Press FAVORITE to scan the channels you previously programmed into the TV's memory (see "Programming your favorite channels" on page 25).

A 9-picture multi-window scan will start.

The first window will display as a moving picture.

- 2. Press ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ to select the channel you want to watch. The selected channel will display as a moving picture in the 9-picture multi-window.
- 3. Press ENTER to display the channel you selected in step 2 as a normal picture.



Each time you press FAVORITE, the display will change in the following order:

FAVORITE CH1— FAVORITE CH2 — Off

To cancel the favorite function:

Press FAVORITE again.

Using the strobe function


Press MULTI to start the strobe function. A 9-picture multi-window strobe starts for the current main picture.



For example, you can strobe the action of the TV program you are watching, or view a decisive moment of a sports program that was previously recorded.

To cancel the strobe function:

Press MULTI again.


- A program or channel you set up as blocked in the Locks menu may not always display as blocked during INFO (preview) or FAVORITE multi-window scanning. When blocked properly, the program will appear as a black window with an "X" under the channel number.
- The preview (INFO) function does not work when ANT 2 mode is selected.
- The INFO (preview), FAVORITE, and MULTI (strobe) functions do not work when the main picture source is ColorStream.

Using the LOCKS menu

The LOCKS menu includes the V-Chip, CH Lock, Video Lock, and New PIN Code functions. You can use these functions after entering the correct PIN code.

Entering the PIN code

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the LOCKS menu appears.



- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to display the pin code entering mode.
- Factory reset status:
 Set your 4-digit code by pressing the Number buttons (0–9).
- When the PIN code is already stored:

Press the Channel Number buttons (0–9) to enter the 4-digit PIN code used for blocking channels.







If a wrong PIN code is entered, the message "Incorrect" will appear. Enter the code again.

If you cannot remember the PIN code you stored, while you are in the PIN code entering mode, press RECALL four times within 5 seconds. The PIN code you stored will be released (returned to factory reset status).

3. Press ENTER to display the LOCKS menu.



Continue to set each item following the steps on the next page.



Using the V-CHIP menu

Some TV programs and movies include signals that classify the content of the program (violence, sex, dialog, language). The V-CHIP control feature in this TV detects the signals and blocks the programs according to your selections. To use this feature, perform the following setup.

ENABLE BLOCKING

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select ENABLE BLOCKING.
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ to select ON or OFF.

ON: To enable your setting (Lock)

OFF: To release your setting (Unlock)

Note: The CH LOCK function is not affected by this selection.

Unlocking programs temporarily

1. If you try to watch a TV program that exceeds the rating limits you set, the TV will enter into the program lock mode.



- 2. If you want to watch the locked program temporarily, press MUTE.
- 3. Press the Channel Number buttons (0–9) to enter the 4-digit PIN code you stored (see "Entering the PIN code" on page 31).



4. Press ENTER.

If the number is correct, the lock mode will be released and the normal picture will appear.


If you press RESET on the remote control (instead of selecting it in the menu), you will reset both your picture and your audio adjustments to their factory settings.

Watching video input

You can use the INPUT button on the remote control or the TV/VIDEO button on the TV to view a signal coming from other devices connected to your TV, such as VCRs or video disc players. Select VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, VIDEO 3, or ColorStream, depending on which input jacks are used for connecting the devices (see "Connecting your TV" on page 5).






Using the closed caption feature

The closed caption feature has two options:

- Captions—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of programs and videos that are closed-captioned (usually identified as "CC" in program guides).
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the program, such as weather or stock data (when provided by individual stations).

To view captions or text:

- 1. Tune the TV to the desired program or video.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 3. Press ∇ or \triangle to highlight CC.




- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight the preferred closed caption mode:
- To view captions, highlight C1, C2, C3, or C4 (C1 displays the primary language in your area).

Note: If the program or video you selected is not closed-captioned, no captions will display on-screen.




• To view text, highlight T1, T2, T3, or T4.\

Note: If text is not available, a black rectangle may appear on your screen. If this happens, turn the Closed Caption feature off.



To turn the closed-caption feature off, highlight OFF in the Closed Caption menu.

A closed caption signal may not be decoded in the following situations:

- · When a videotape has been dubbed
- · When the signal reception is weak
- · When the signal reception is nonstandard


Setting the sleep timer

To set the sleep timer to turn the TV off automatically:

- 1. Press SLEEP (or MENU and ▲▼) to display the CUSTOM menu. TIMER will be highlighted.
- 2. After the number position starts to blink, press SLEEP repeatedly to enter the length of time until the TV turns off automatically (in 10-minute increments to a maximum of 180).

The SLEEP button can also be used to increment the time interval of 10 minutes up to 180 minutes.

3. Press ENTER to start the timer.




To cancel the sleep timer:

Press POWER two times.

Setting the clock

To set the clock:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CLOCK SET.
- 3. After the number position starts to blink, press the Channel Number buttons (0–9) to enter the correct time. The clock operates on a 12-hour cycle.
- 4. Press ENTER to start the clock.




To display the time on-screen:

Press RECALL.

Note:

To display the amount of time remaining until the TV turns off automatically, press SLEEP once. To clear the display, press EXIT.



Note:

If the power source for the TV is interrupted (for example, the power cord is unplugged or a power failure occurs), you will need to reset the clock.

Adjusting the sound

Muting the sound

Press MUTE to temporarily turn off the sound. While the sound is off, the screen will display the word MUTE in the lower right corner. To restore the sound, press MUTE again.

When you press the MUTE button, the Closed Caption feature is automatically activated. To deactivate this feature, press MUTE again. This feature works only when the Closed Caption mode is set to OFF. See "Using the closed caption feature" on page 40 for more information.

Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts


The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to listen to high-fidelity stereo sound while you watch TV. MTS can also transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word STEREO or SAP appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or RECALL is pressed.


The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.




- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight STEREO.




You can leave your TV in STEREO mode because it automatically outputs the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural). If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise. The word STEREO or SAP displays in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

To listen to SAP (if available):

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight SAP. You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers while viewing the original program's picture (see note at right).





Note:

A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it.

For example, some TV stations broadcast music as a second audio program. If the TV is in SAP mode, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music instead of the program's normal audio.

However, if the TV is in SAP mode but the station you are watching is not broadcasting a second audio program, you will see the picture but not hear any sound. If this happens, put the TV in STEREO mode to hear the station's normal audio.

Using the surround sound feature

The surround sound feature expands the audio listening field wider and deeper to create exceptional sound quality from the TV's speakers. The feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.

To turn on the surround sound feature:

- 1. Select the STEREO mode (see "Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts" on page 42).
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the THEATER menu appears.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to highlight SURROUND.
- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight MATRIX.



To turn off the surround sound feature:

Highlight OFF in step 4 above.


In general, you can leave your TV in MATRIX mode because it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (surround stereo or monaural).

Adjusting the sound quality

You can change the quality of your TV's sound by adjusting the bass, treble, and balance.

To adjust the sound quality:


- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to highlight the item you want to adjust.



- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the level.
- \blacktriangleleft makes the sound quality weaker or decreases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.
- The makes the sound quality stronger or decreases the balance in the left channel, depending on the item selected.

Note:

When the MATRIX surround mode is selected, the StableSound[™] feature is automatically turned off (see "Using the StableSound feature" on page 46).





Understanding the auto power off feature

The TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This feature does not work in VIDEO mode.

Understanding the last mode memory feature

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the last mode memory feature turns the TV on automatically when the power is resupplied.

If the power is going to be off for a long time or you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.

No sound, picture OK	 The sound may be muted. Press VOLUME. The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. Check that the SPEAKERS function in the AUDIO menu is set correctly.
Poor sound, picture OK	• The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
Poor picture, sound OK	 Check the antenna connections. The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. Adjust the PICTURE menu.
Poor reception of broadcast channels	 The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. Check the antenna connections. If you are using a VCR, make sure the TV/VCR button is set correctly.
Cannot receive above channel 13	• Make sure the TV/CABLE switch is set to the mode that corresponds with the signal source (antenna or cable).
Black box appears on the screen	• The closed caption feature may be set to one of the Text modes (T1, T2, T3, or T4). Turn closed captioning off.
