





FEATURES

DTV/TV/CATV

You can use your remote control to select channels which are broadcast in conventional analog, standard definition, and high definition formats. Also, cable subscribers can access their cable TV channels.

• Program Information Display (DTV only)

You can display the title, contents and other information of the current DTV program on the screen.

Autoscan

This TV can automatically scan and memorize the channels receivable in your residential area. This feature eliminates the need of a difficult setting procedure.

• V-CHIP

This feature allows you to block children's access to inappropriate programs.

Closed Caption Decoder

This TV contains the built-in Closed Caption Decoder that displays text across the screen. It allows you to read the dialogue of a TV program or other information in the Closed Caption-supported programs.

MTS/SAP Tuner

This feature allows you to select with the remote control your desired audio language.

• Auto Shut Off Function

If there is no signal input from the antenna terminal and no operation for 15 minutes, the unit will turn itself off automatically.

About Interference to Infrared Devices

Please note in advance that using other infrared devices (such as infrared cordless headphones) near the plasma display may cause infrared interference to occur.

About Pixel Defects


A plasma display is created by using a collection of miniature pixels. It is possible to display more than 99.99% of valid pixels, however a small fraction of pixels over the life of the product may not illuminate or may constantly be illuminated. This is not to be considered a defect in the plasma panel.

Preventing Image Burn on the plasma display

Fixed images displayed on the plasma display for an extended period of several hours may cause uneven pixel aging causing damage to the plasma display. You should try to avoid displaying fixed images for extended periods on the plasma display.


Images of high luminance displayed on the plasma display for more than 60 seconds may cause lingering images to remain on the screen. These images will automatically disappear, but may take time depending on the luminance of the images and how long they were displayed on the screen.





INSTALLING THE BATTERIES

Install two AA batteries (included) matching the polarity (++/--) indicated inside battery compartment of the remote control.




[BATTERY PRECAUTIONS]

- Be sure to follow the correct polarity as indicated in the battery compartment.
 Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-Zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture.

REMOTE CONTROL RANGE

Operate the remote control within a 30 degree angle on both sides of the infrared sensor on the main unit. You can operate the remote control from a distance of several yards away from the main unit.



NOTE:

 Other devices which use infrared beams, sunlight, fluorescent lights, etc., may affect the range and effectiveness of the remote control. Make sure the TV is positioned in a place which minimizes interference from them.

PREPARATION FOR USE

CONNECTION

This section describes how to connect your TV to an antenna, cable box, etc.

MAKE SURE YOU HAVE AN ANTENNA.

As DTV is only available over the air, you need an antenna to receive a digital signal.


NOTE:

• Be sure your antenna or other source is connected properly before plugging in the power cord.

[ANTENNA CABLE CONNECTION]

- 1) When connecting your TV to an antenna
 - Connect the Coaxial cable on your home outlet to the ANT. IN jack of this TV.
- 2) When connecting TV to cable TV company (without box)

Connect the Coaxial cable on your home outlet to the ANT. IN jack of this TV.



*Once connections are completed, turn on the TV and begin initial setup.

Channel scanning is necessary for the TV to memorize all available channels in your area.


(Refer to "INITIAL SETUP" on page 13.)

NOTES:

- For your safety and to avoid damage to equipment, please unplug the coaxial cable from the ANT.IN jack before moving the unit.
- If you use an antenna in order to receive analog TV, the same antenna generally will work for DTV reception.
 Outdoor or attic antennas will be more effective than set-top versions.
- To easily switch between antenna and cable wires, you can purchase an "Antenna Selector" commercially available.
- If you connect a cable system directly, contact the CATV installer.

[CONNECTION TO CABLE/SATELLITE BOX]


- 1) Connect the coaxial cable on your home outlet to the input jack of the CABLE/SATELLITE box.
- 2) Use another coaxial cable to connect the ANT. IN jack of your TV to the output jack of the CABLE/SATEL-LITE box.
- *Required cables in 2) and connecting methods differ depending on the CABLE/SATELLITE box. For more information, please contact your cable/satellite provider.



CONNECTING OTHER DEVICES

[HDMI]


1) High Definition Multimedia Interface (HDMI) uses the latest technology to ensure the signal maintains the highest degree of integrity from source to TV. Both video and audio travel through a single cable.



Rear of this TV

NOTES:

- This TV accepts 480i / 480p / 720p / 1080i video signals, and 32kHz / 44.1kHz / 48kHz audio signals.
- This TV accepts only 2 channel audio signal (LPCM).
- You need to select "PCM" for the digital audio output of the device you connect or the HDMI audio setting. Audio sometimes makes no sound if you select "Bitstream", etc.
- This TV only accepts signals corresponding EIA861.
- 2) When your video device has a DVI output jack, connect the HDMI conversion cable (not included) from the DVI output jack.



NOTES:

- This TV accepts 480i / 480p / 720p / 1080i video signals.
- An HDMI conversion cable requires a separate audio cable connection as well.
- Audio signals are converted from digital to analog if you make the connection in paragraph 2) above.
- DVI does not show image if the 480i does not accept EIA/CEA-861/861B.


[COMPONENT CABLE CONNECTION]

Offers better picture quality for video devices connected to your TV.

Use a component video cable (not included) to connect your TV to external video devices equipped with component video jacks.

If you connect to your TV's COMPONENT1 input jack, connect audio cables to the AUDIO L/R jacks of COMPONENT1.

If you connect to your TV's COMPONENT2 input jack, connect audio cables to the AUDIO L/R jacks of COMPONENT2.



NOTE:


• This TV accepts 480i / 480p / 720p / 1080i video signals.

[S-VIDEO CABLE CONNECTION]

Offers good picture quality for video devices connected to your TV.

Use an S-video cable (not included) to connect your TV to external video devices equipped with S-video connectors

If you connect to your TV's S-VIDEO1 input jack, connect audio cables to the AUDIO L/R jacks of VIDEO1. If you connect to your TV's S-VIDEO2 input jack, connect audio cables to the AUDIO L/R jacks of VIDEO2.




NOTE:

• If you connect to the S-VIDEO jack and the VIDEO jack at the same time, the S-Video connection will have priority.

[VIDEO CONNECTION]


Offers standard picture quality for video devices connected to your TV.

When the audio jack of the video device is monaural, connect the audio cable to the audio L input jack.



[DIGITAL AUDIO CONNECTION]


If you connect this TV to an external digital audio device, you can enjoy multi-channel audio like 5.1ch digital broadcasting sound. Required digital audio coaxial cable not included.


[ANALOG AUDIO CONNECTION]

If you connect this TV to an external analog audio device, you can enjoy stereophonic (2 channel) audio sound. Required audio cable not included.



CONNECTING THE POWER CABLE

Connect the power cord (included) to the TV before connecting it to the power source.



- **1** Connect the power cable to this TV first.
- 2 Connect the power cable to an AC outlet.

A CAUTION

- Do not connect the power cable to a power supply outside the indicated voltage of this TV (AC 120V). Connecting the power cable to a power supply outside of this range may result in fire or electrical shocks.
- Always use the power cable included with this TV. Do not use any other cable.
 For safety, make sure to always connect the power cable to a three pronged AC outlet.

NITIAL SETTINGS

INITIAL SETUP

This section will guide you through your TV's initial set up which includes selecting a language for your on-screen menu and AUTOSCAN, which automatically scans and memorizes viewable channels.



- **1** After making all the necessary connections, turn on your TV.
- 2 Press [POWER]. Initial Setup menu will appear.
 - This operation may take a few moments.
 - If Initial Setup menu does not appear, press and hold [ENTER] for 3 seconds, initial setup will appear then proceed to step 3.
 - If initial set up has already been completed, refer to "LANGUAGE SELECTION" on page 17.
- **3** When you first turn on your TV, the following screen is displayed. Use [▲/▼] to select the on-screen menu language from the choices on the right side of the screen.



The Antenna Confirmation menu on step 4 will be displayed in the selected language after you press **[ENTER]**.

4 Select source of ANT. IN jack using [▲/▼], press [ENTER].



5 Autoscan will start automatically.



 When scanning has completed, the lowest memorized channel will be displayed.

NOTES:

- If you do not operate your TV for more than 45 seconds during the initial setup, the message boxes start to move to the lower left-hand corner of the screen to prevent burn-in. This is to save your screen from burn-in. Press any key except [POWER] to cancel it.
- The initial Autoscan function can be executed for either "Air" or "Cable" only once. When you change the connection (Air/Cable), set the "Autoscan" again. (Refer to page 14.)
- If you connect a cable system directly, contact the CATV installer
- When the scanning is not completed, Helpful Hint will be displayed every time you turn on the power. If you have previously registered channels when this screen appears you can select a channel with [the Number buttons].

CHANNEL SETTINGS

AUTOSCAN

With AUTOSCAN, your TV automatically scans and memorizes your area's viewable channels. Activate AUTOSCAN when you turn on your TV for the first time, change broadcast sources (e.g. from antenna to CATV), or move your TV to a different broadcast area.



NOTE:

• Make sure the TV is connected to antenna or cable.

- 1 Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "CHANNEL" and press [ENTER] to confirm
 - Using [▲/▼], select "Autoscan".



• Press [ENTER].

3 For TV channels, using [▲/▼], select "Air". For CATV channels, select "Cable".



Press [ENTER].
 Scanning and memorizing the channels automatically starts.



 When the scanning and memorizing are completed, the lowest memorized channel in the broadcasting will be displayed.

NOTES:

- If you do not operate this TV for more than 45 seconds during initial setup, the message boxes start to move to the lower left-hand corner of the screen. This is to save your screen from burn-in. Press any key except [POWER] to cancel it.
- If you connect a cable system directly, contact the CATV installer
- If you press [POWER] or [SETUP] during Autoscan, this setting will be canceled.
- If there is no reception connected or a poor signal is detected, a Hint will appear on screen once scanning stops.

CHANNEL LIST

This function lets you remove undesired channels from the Channel Registration List.



- 1 Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "CHANNEL" and press [ENTER] to confirm.
 - Using [▲/▼], select "Channel List".



- Press [ENTER].
- **3** Select the channel you want to remove.
 - Using [▲/▼], select the channel.



- Press [ENTER] to highlight the channel selected for removal. You will not be able to select the channel again using [CH ▲/▼].
- To reactivate the removed channel, highlight it and press [ENTER].
- When you remove a major channel, you remove its minor channels, too.

NOTE:

- The channel with "DTV" indicated on the display is ATSC, otherwise the channel is NTSC.
- 4 To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

MANUAL REGISTER

This function lets you manually add channels not memorized due to poor broadcast strength during AUTOSCAN.



- 1 Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "CHANNEL" and press [ENTER] to confirm
 - Using [▲/▼], select "Manual Register".



- Press [ENTER].
- **3** Select the channel you want to add.
 - Using [the Number buttons], select your desired channel.



- Select "Register" with [ENTER].
- **4** To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

NOTES:

- If set up completes successfully, "Registered to the Channel List" is displayed.
- If Video 1 is being used, set up will not be completed successfully and "Unavailable" will be displayed on the screen.

ANTENNA CONFIRMATION

Displays signal strength for each channel.



- 1 Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "CHANNEL" and press [ENTER] to confirm.
 - Using [▲/▼], select "Antenna".



- Press [ENTER].
- Using [the Number buttons] or [CH ▲/▼], select the channel for which you want to check signal strength.



• If the channel is set to external input, you cannot confirm the antenna situation.



 ${m 3}$ To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

LANGUAGE SELECTION

You can choose English, Spanish, or French as your on screen language.



- 1 Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "LANGUAGE" and press [ENTER] to confirm.
 - Using [▲/▼], select "English", "Español" or "Français".



- Press [ENTER].
- 3 To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

SETTING THE PANEL SAVER

Panel saver prevents the display from being etched by an unchanging image. You can specify a setting for it.



- **1** Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "DETAIL" and press [ENTER] to confirm.
 - Using [▲/▼], select "Panel Saver" and press [ENTER] to confirm.



- 3 Switch the Panel Saver mode.
 - Using [▲/▼], select "Strong", "Weak" or "Off" and press [ENTER] to confirm.



NOTE:

- "Weak" moves 1 pixel every 5 minutes and "Strong" moves 1 pixel every minute. This prevents burn-in.
- 4 To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

WATCHING TV

CHANNEL SELECTION

Select channels by pressing [CH ▲/▼] found on remote control or on the TV's control panel, or by pressing [the Number buttons] found on the remote control.



[CH ▲/▼]

- Use [CH ▲/▼] to change the channel.

[the Number buttons]

- Press the channel number with [the Number buttons] to select a channel you want to watch, then press [ENTER].
 - When selecting analog channel 12



 When selecting digital channel 12-1
 Be sure to press [-] before entering the minor channel number.




- If the channel broadcasts NTSC and ATSC both and you don't press [–], you will receive the NTSC channel only. The moment you press [–], the lowest memorized digital channel will be displayed.
- Press [CH RETURN] to return to the previously viewed channel.

NOTE:

 In DTV broadcasting, one channel sometimes broadcasts multiple programs depending on the air time. In this case, the main channel is called major channel and the minor channel is called minor channel.

About minor channel broadcasting:

There may be different programs being broadcast on minor channels through a single channel from ATSC. You can watch each minor channel program being broadcast by selecting one of the minor channels.



- → : change automatically
- ⇒ : change manually by pressing [CH ▲ /▼] on your remote control

NOTE:

 "No Signal" will appear on the screen after the minor channel broadcast is over.
 You will need to change the channel to continue watching another TV program.

VOLUME ADJUSTMENT

This section describes how to adjust the volume. The mute function, which turns the sound off and on, will also be described.



[VOL. △/▽]

- Use [VOL. △/▽] to adjust the audio volume.
- The same operation is available with [VOLUME ∆/∇] on the control panel of the main unit.
- The volume bar will be displayed at the bottom of the screen when adjusting the volume.



The volume bar display will automatically disappear in a few seconds.

[MUTE]

• Press [MUTE] to turn off and on the sound.



- "Mute" is displayed on the screen for a few seconds
- Press [MUTE] again or [VOL. △/▽] ([VOLUME △/▽]) to release the Mute status.

STILL MODE

You can freeze the image shown on the screen.



1 Pause the image.

 When you press [STILL], the image shown on the screen is paused.



- The audio is not paused and keeps on reading out.
- If the digital signal is gone or protected, the image will remain paused and the audio will be muted.
- The Still function will be released after 5 minutes.

2 Canceling Still function.

 The Still function will be canceled by pressing any button while Still function is working.

NOTE:

• Press any key except [POWER] to cancel still mode.

SELECTING AUDIO CHANNELS

This section describes how to switch the audio in the analog mode and how to switch the audio language in the digital mode.



TV

When you press [AUDIO], the currently selected audio mode will be displayed on the screen



Press [AUDIO] to cycle through available audio channels.

When the broadcasting has all audio...

MONO

(cannot be switched.)

STEREO: Outputs stereo-audio

DTV

When you press [AUDIO], the currently selected language and the number of available languages will be displayed on the screen.



Press [AUDIO] to cycle through available audio languages.



- Available languages differ depending on the broadcast.
- The information display will automatically disappear in one minute.

NOTE:

• Pressing [AUDIO] does not control external audio source.


ACCESSING EXTERNAL DEVICES

Use your remote control to access DVD recorders, home audio systems and other external devices when they are connected to your television.



Use your remote control to select external component.

When you press [INPUT SELECT] or [CH ▼]
 on the remote control, the input mode will be switched as below.



- Pressing [CH A] on the remote control reverses direction.
- To use the VIDEO1 or S-VIDEO1 input jack on the TV, select "Video1".
- To use the VIDEO2 or S-VIDEO2 input jack on the TV, select "Video2".
- To use the COMPONENT1 input jacks on the TV, select "Component1".
- To use the COMPONENT2 input jacks on the TV, select "Component2".
- To use the HDMI IN jack on the TV, select "HDMI".

- When you press [INFO], the current external input mode, the type of resolutions for video signal, TV aspect ratio, CC and TV rating will be displayed at the top-right of the screen.
- The information display will automatically disappear in 1 minute.

CHANGING THE SCREEN DISPLAY MODE

Each of 4 display modes can be selected in either 4:3 or 16:9 aspect ratios.




- **1** Press [SCREEN MODE], to switch the TV aspect ratio.
- **2** Press [SCREEN MODE] repeatedly until the normal screen displays.

NOTES:

- Some programs may not offer all display mode options.
- By changing the screen display mode from time to time, you can reduce burn-in on screen.

When the broadcast is sending 4:3 video signal...



[Sidebar]

Sidebar displays a 4:3 picture at its standard 4:3 size. Sidebars will be displayed on the right and left edges of the screen.

[Full]

Full displays a 4:3 picture at a 16:9 size, with horizontal elongation necessary to fill the screen.


[Cinema]

Cinema displays a 4:3 picture at a 16:9 size, with less horizontal elongation necessary to fill the screen because a little bit of the top and bottom edge of the screen will be cut off.

[Wide]

Wide displays the center of the picture as original size and the outer sides of the picture will be elongated. The size of the picture will depend on the original signal.

When the broadcast is sending 16:9 video signal...



[Full]

A picture is displayed at 16:9 size as it is.

[∠oom

Zoom displays a 16:9 picture without changing its horizontal and vertical ratio, at its maximum size.

[Cinema]

Cinema displays a 16:9 picture with vertical elongation.

[Expand]

Expand displays a 16:9 picture with horizontal elongation.

SCREEN INFORMATION

You can display the currently selected channel or other information such as the audio mode on the screen.



ΤV

In the analog mode, the current channel and the audio mode are displayed.

- **1** Display the channel number and the audio mode.
 - Press [INFO] on the remote control.
 The current channel number, audio mode, type of resolutions for video signal, TV aspect ratio, CC and TV rating are displayed at the top-right of the screen.




• To clear the display, press [BACK] or [INFO] again.

DTV

In the digital mode, the detailed information for the current channel such as the Program guide is displayed.

- **1** Display the detailed information for the channel.
 - Press [INFO] on the remote control.
 The currently selected program details are displayed on the screen.
 - The following information is displayed.
 - (1) Program title
 - (2) Broadcast station
 - (3) Program guide (max. 4 lines displayed)
 - (4) Channel number
 - (5) Audio language ("Other" is displayed when the audio language cannot be acquired, or the acquired languages are other than English, Spanish or French.)
 - (6) Effective scanning lines and scan mode
 - (7) Program definition
 - (8) Program aspect ratio
 - (9) Program rating
 - (10) CC (Not available if the CC set to "Off")



NOTES:

- When the program guide is displayed in more than 4 lines, use [▲/▼] to scroll.
- "No description provided" is displayed when the program guide is not provided.
- The following screen is displayed when connecting to external devices:
 - e.g.) When using VIDEO1 input jack for connection



OPTIONAL SETTINGS

SLEEP TIMER

The Sleep Timer can be set to automatically turn off your television after an incremental period of time.



- 1 Press [SLEEP] on the remote control to set the Sleep Timer.
 - The setting display for Sleep Timer is shown on the screen.



- 2 You can set your TV to turn off after a set period of time (from 10 to 90 minutes). After set up, you can display the remaining time before shut off by pressing [SLEEP] again.
 - To cancel the sleep timer, press [SLEEP] repeatedly until "Sleep Off" is displayed.



 The Sleep Timer setting display will automatically disappear in a few seconds.

NOTE:

 When you disconnect your TV from its power source or when a power failure occurs, the sleep timer setting will be canceled.

SETUP SCREEN

This section describes the overview of the setup screen displayed when you press [SETUP]. For more details, see the reference page for each item

The setup screen consists of the function setting items below.

• DEXIT

To exit settings.

• PICTURE

You can adjust the picture quality (Picture Mode, Brightness, Contrast, Color, Tint, Sharpness, Color Temp.).

(Refer to "PICTURE ADJUSTMENT" on page 24.)

• CHANNEL

You can automatically scan the viewable channels and remove those that are undesired. (Refer to "AUTOSCAN" on page 14.)

• DETAIL

You can change closed captioning display formats and font styles. (Refer to "CLOSED CAPTION" on page 25.)

Block children's access to inappropriate programming. (Refer to "V-CHIP" on page 28.)
And select HDMI Audio if your TV is connected to a digital external device like a DVD recorder. (Refer to "HDMI AUDIO" on page 30.)

LANGUAGE

You can change the language (English, Spanish, French) displayed on the setup screen.

(Refer to "LANGUAGE SELECTION" on page 17.)

NOTES:

- To cancel the setup screen, press [SETUP].
- If you do not operate this TV for more than 45 seconds during initial setup, the message boxes start to move to the lower left-hand corner of the screen. This is to save your screen from burn-in. Press any key except [POWER] to cancel it

PICTURE ADJUSTMENT

You can select from four default picture color settings. You can also adjust brightness, contrast, color, tint, sharpness and color temperature settings.



Sharpness

Using [◀ /▶], adjust the detail of the picture.

- ►: To clear



Reset Settings

Using [▲/▼], select "Reset".

You can reset setting of the Picture Mode you select.



Color Temp.

Using [▲/▼], adjust Color Temperature from the selection, then press [ENTER]. (Cool, Neutral and Warm)



• The adjustment bar for picture quality item is displayed on the screen.

NOTE:

- To move to the normal screen, press [SETUP].
- **4** To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

CLOSED CAPTION

You can view closed captioning (cc) for TV programs, movies, news, and prerecorded tapes.
Closed captions refer to text of dialogue or descriptions displayed on-screen for the hearing impaired.



- 1 Display the setup screen.
 - Press [SETUP].
 The following setup screen appears.



- 2 Select "DETAIL" and press [ENTER] to confirm.
 - Using [A/V], select "Closed Caption" and press [ENTER] to confirm.



3 Select "Conventional CC" and press [ENTER] to confirm.

 Using [A/V], select the desired closed caption, then press [ENTER].

[Caption Mode]

CC1 and Text1:

are the primary caption and text services. The captioning or text is displayed in the same language as the program's dialogue

(up to 4 lines of script on the screen, where it does not obstruct relevant parts of the picture).

CC3 and Text3:

serve as the preferred data channels. The captioning or text is often a secondary language translation, simplified English or displayed at a slower rate.

CC2, CC4, Text2 and Text4:

are rarely available and broadcasters use them only in special conditions, such as when CC1 and CC3 are not available or Text1 and Text3 are not available.

 There are three display modes according to programs:

Paint-on mode: Displays input characters on the

screen immediately.

Pop-on mode : Once characters are stored in

memory, they are displayed all

at once.

Roll-up mode : Displays the characters continu-

ously by scrolling (max. 4 lines).

5 To exit the setup, press [SETUP].

NOTES:

- Closed captions must be broadcast or included in your recorded content to appear on your TV.
- If the closed caption is not broadcasted, nothing is displayed.
- The closed caption is not displayed when you use HDMI connection.
- When your TV receives a special effects playback signal (i.e., Search, Slow and Still) from a VCR's video output channel (CH3 or CH4), the TV may not display the correct caption or text.
- Captions and texts may not match the TV voice exactly.
- Interference may cause the closed caption system not to function properly.
- The caption or text characters will not be displayed while the menu display or functions display is shown.
- If a black box appears on the screen, this means that the TV is set to TEXT mode. To clear screen, select CAPTION "CC1", "CC2", "CC3", "CC4"or "Off".

DTV CLOSED CAPTION

DTV

Apart from closed captions, DTV has its own closed captions called DTV CC. Use this menu to change the settings for DTV CC.





ATTACHING A WALL MOUNT BRACKET (SOLD SEPARATELY)

The following is a description of the method for attaching a wall mount to the TV. When performing this operation, refer to the instruction manual included with the wall mount kit.

A CAUTION

- Any damage caused by incorrectly attempting to mount the TV is not covered under the terms of the manufacturer's warranty.
- This TV is for use only with the Sanus Systems Model VMPL. Wall Mount. Use with other wall mounts may result in instability causing possible injury.



1 Turn the TV over and place it screen-first onto a table which has a soft cloth draped over it. Place the TV in a way so that the stands hang over the edge of the table.

NOTES:

- Make sure to use a table which can support the weight of the TV and is larger than the TV.
- Make sure the table is in a stable location.
- **2** Remove the stands from the TV. Unscrew the M5 screws indicated by ①, and remove the left and right stands.

NOTE:


- The screws and stands you have removed are necessary for reattachment at a later date. Make sure to keep them in a safe place.
- 3 Attach the left and right TV rails to the TV using the M8 screws included with the wall mount kit.
 ② indicates the position of the screw holes on the TV.

NOTES:

- Only use the screw holes indicated by ② for mounting the TV.
- For instructions on how to attach the TV rails, refer to the instruction manual included with the mount wall kit.
- **4** Attach the TV to the wall.

NOTE:

- Refer to the instruction manual included with the mount wall when securing the TV to the wall.
- * If you want to attach the stands of this TV again, insert the stand slowly as illustrated below and drive screws in the 4 threaded holes (1).



The problem might be limited to the broadcasting station.
Picture distorted	 When the outside antenna is used, check the wire condition and connection. View other TV channels. The problem might be limited to the broadcasting station.
Weak picture	 Check the antenna or cable connection to the main unit. When the outside antenna is used, check the wire condition and connection. Adjust Contrast and Brightness in the setup screen. View other TV channels. The problem might be limited to the broadcasting station.
Lines or streaks in picture	 When the outside antenna is used, check the wire condition and connection. Electrical interference from nearby appliances may affect picture quality. View other TV channels. The problem might be limited to the broadcasting station.
Picture blurred	 When the outside antenna is used, check the wire condition and connection. View other TV channels. The problem might be limited to the broadcasting station.

When Autoscan is interrupted, some channels will not be received. Make sure to complete Autoscan in the setup screen.
Channel changes automatically	 Many digital channels have alternate channel numbers. TV changes the numbers automatically to the ones signifying the broadcasting stations. These are the numbers used for analog broadcasts.
Remote Control doesn't work	 Check the antenna or cable connection to the main unit. Check the batteries of the remote control. Check if there is an obstacle between the sensor and the remote control. Test the signal output. If OK, there might be remote sensor trouble. (Refer to "IR SIGNAL CHECK" on page 36.)

IGNITION NOISE:

Black spots or horizontal streaks may appear, picture may flutter or drift. Usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills and other electrical appliances.



•GHOSTS:

Ghosts are caused by the television signal following two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected from tall buildings, hills or some other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve reception. Ghosting may also be caused by defects in the antenna system such as unshielded leads or connecting several sets to the same antenna without using multiple antenna couplers. Ghosting occurring when the TV is connected to a cable TV system may indicate a bad cable wire or loose connection. Confirm that the cable wire is properly connected.



•SNOW:

If your receiver is located in the fringe area of a television station where the signal is weak, your picture may be marred by the appearance of small dots. When the signal is extremely weak, it may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the picture.

Snowing occurring when the TV is connected to a cable TV system may indicate a bad cable wire or loose connection. Confirm that the cable wire is properly connected.



•RADIO FREQUENCY INTERFERENCE:

The interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks, and in some cases, causes loss of contrast in the picture.

•PREVENTION OF AN OBSTACLE TO RADIO RECEIVERS: This TV has been designed pursuant to the FCC class B Rules. This is to prevent a problem to Radio receivers. If this TV causes a problem to

- Radio receivers, then take the following steps:
 Keep the monitor away from Radio.
 - Adjust Radio antennas in order for the TV not to receive interference.
 - -The antenna cable of Radio should be kept away from the TV.
 - -Use a coaxial cable for antenna.

You can check if this TV influences Radio receivers by turning off all other equipment other than the TV.

If you find a problem receiving Radio when using the TV, check the instructions mentioned above.

Vertical stripes appear, depending on the screen contents. •The plasma display panel is lighting the phosphors by the discharge of internal radiation. Depending on the screen contents, in rare cases this may cause vertical stripes to appear because of failure to light. Please note that this is not a malfunction.

GLOSSARY

ATSC

Acronym that stands for Advanced Television Systems Committee and the name of the digital broadcasting standards.

Aspect ratio

The width of a TV screen relative to its height. Conventional TVs are 4:3 (in other words, the screen is almost square); widescreen models are 16:9 (the screen is almost twice as wide as its height).

Component video

This is a video signal format that conveys each of three principal colors of light (red, blue and green) through different signal lines. This allows the viewers to experience picture colors as original as it is. There are several signal formats, including Y / Pb / Pr and Y / Cb / Cr.

Dolby Digital

The system developed by Dolby Laboratories to compress digital sound. It offers stereo sound (2ch) or multi-channel audio.

HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface)

Interface that supports all uncompressed, digital audio/video formats including set-top box, DVD player or digital television, over a single cable.

High Definition TV (HDTV)

Ultimate digital format that produces high resolution and high picture quality. **LPCM**

(Linear Pulse Code Modulation)

LPCM is a format that can have up to 8 channels of audio. It is mainly used in music production. The format samples and captures analog signals and transforms them into digital signals without compressing the sound data.

NTSC

Acronym that stands for National Television Systems Committee and the name of the current analog broadcasting standards.

Password

A stored 4-digit number that allows access to parental control features.

SAP

(Secondary Audio Program)

Second-audio channel delivered separately from main-audio channel. This audio channel is used as an alternate in bilingual broadcasting.

Standard Definition TV (SDTV)

Standard digital format that is similar to the NTSC picture quality.

S-Video

Offers higher quality images by delivering each signal, color (c) and luminance (y) independently of each other through separate cables.

MAINTENANCE

CABINET CLEANING

- Always unplug the TV from the AC outlet before cleaning.
- Clean the case of the TV with a soft cloth which has been wet and wrung dry.
- If the screen is dirty or dusty, wipe it clean with a soft cloth.

NOTES:

- Never use a solvent, alcohol or any other abrasive liquid to clean the TV.
- Always make sure the area around vents on the TV is clear and clean. Failure to do this may result in fire or cause the TV to fail prematurely.

SERVICING

Should your unit become inoperative, do not try to correct the problem yourself. There are no user serviceable parts inside. Turn off the TV, unplug the power cord and call our toll free customer support line found on the cover of this manual to locate an authorized service center.

IR SIGNAL CHECK

If the remote control isn't working properly, you can use an AM radio or digital camera (including a cellular phone with built-in camera) to see if it is sending out an infrared signal.

With an AM radio:

Tune the AM radio station to a non-broadcasting frequency. Point the remote control towards it, push any button and listen. If the sound from the radio flutters, it is receiving the remote control's infrared signal.





 With a digital camera (including builtin cell phone cameras):

Point a digital camera towards the remote control. Push any button on the remote control and look through the digital camera. If the infrared light appears through the camera, the remote control is working.









