

On Placement

# Maintenance

#### Cleaning the Disc

- A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback. Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.
- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface. Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth. NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do NOT use irregular shaped discs (example: heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.
- **Cleaning the Unit**
- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the car power adapter before maintaining the unit
- Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth that has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, then wipe with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do NOT use compressed air to remove dust. Important Note
