
Fuel tank door release and cap






Overdrive switch

To turn "ON" or "OFF" Depress the overdrive switch to choose either three-speed ("OFF") or four-speed ("ON") operation. During normal driving conditions, always drive with overdrive "ON," this allows the transmission to shift automatically into four-speed operation at higher speeds, improving fuel economy. If the indicator light on the instrument cluster is illuminated, overdrive is "OFF."



Doors-Child safety locks



Move the lever to "LOCK," allowing the door to be opened only from the outside.



If belt is fully extended, then retracted even slightly, it cannot be re-extended beyond that point, unless fully retracted again. This feature is used to help hold child restraint systems securely.
