The mains lead on this equipment is supplied with a moulded plug incorporating a fuse. The value of the fuse is indicated on the pin face of the plug. If it requires replacing, a fuse approved to BS1362 of the same rating must be used.

Holding discs

 Clean with an optional DVD-RAM/PD disc cleaner.

DVD-Video, CD

 Wipe off dirt or contamination on the disc with a soft cloth

Cautions on handling discs

- Do not write on the printed side with a ball-point pen or pencil.

Disc Specifications

DVD-Video

- A digital versatile disc (DVD) can contain up to 135-minutes of images, 8-language audio and 32 subtitle languages. It is equipped with MPEG-2 picture compression and Dolby 3D surround, allowing you to enjoy vivid and clear theater quality images in the comfort of your own home.
- When switching from the first layer to the second layer of a double-layered DVD Video disc, there may be momentary distortion in the image and sound

This is not a malfunction of the unit.

 Once a DVD-RW/DVD-R recorded in Video Mode is finalized, it becomes DVD-Video.

Audio CD

- An audio disc on which 44.1kHz PCM Audio is recorded.
- Plays CDDA format audio CD-R and CD-RW discs.
 This unit may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW discs due to the condition of the recording.

CD-R/-RW

MP3 CD-R/-RW

- Only CD-R discs with MP3 files recorded with ISO9660 or JOLIET format can be played back
- Only MP3 files with the "mp3", and "MP3" extension can be used.
- For MP3 files recorded with a VBR(Variable Bit Rates), from 32 Kbps to 320 Kbps, the sound may cut in out.
- Playable bitrate range is from 56Kbps to 320Kbps.
- The unit can handle a maximum of 1000 files and folders.

JPEG CD-R/-RW

- Only JPEG files with the ".jpg", ".JPG" extension can be used.
- The unit can handle a maximum of 1000 files and folders.
- Maximum size of progressive JPEG is 3M pixels.
- MOTION JPEG is not supported.

Using CD-R/-RW

- Use a 700MB(80 minutes) CD-R/-RW disc.
 If possible, do not use a 800MB(90 minutes) or above disc, as the disc may not play back.
- If the CD-R/-RW disc was not recorded as a closed ses-sion, you may experience a delay in the early play-back time, and all recorded files may not play.
- Some CD-R/-RW discs may not be playable with this unit, depending on the device which was used to burn them.

For contents recorded on CD-R/-RW media from CDs for your personal use, playability may vary depending on contents and discs.

DVD-R Disc Playback and Recording

- Once a DVD-RW/DVD-R recorded in Video Mode is finalized, it becomes DVD-Video.
- You can record onto the available space on the disc and perform editing functions such as giving titles to discs and programs and erasing programs before finalizing.
- When programming is erased from a DVD-R, that space does not become available. Once an area on a DVD-R is recorded on, that area is no longer available for recording, whether the recording is erased or not.
- It takes about 30 seconds for the unit to complete recording management information after recording finishes.
- This product optimizes the DVD-R for each recording. Optimizing is carried out when you start recording after inserting the disc or turn on the unit. Recording onto the disc may become impossible if optimizing is carried out too many times.
- Playback may be impossible in some cases due to the condition of recording.
- This unit can play back DVD-R discs recorded and finalized with a Thoshiba DVD recorder. It may not be able to play some DVD-R discs depending on the disc and the condition of the recording.

DVD-RW Disc Playback and Recording

- Recording and playback can be performed on DVD-RW discs in both Video and VR Modes.
- Once a DVD-RW recorded in VR Mode is finalized, you cannot perform additional recording.
- Once a DVD-RW recorded in Video Mode is finalized, it becomes DVD-Video.
- In both modes, playback can be performed before and after finalization, but additional recording, deleting and editing can not be performed after finalization.
- If you want to record the disc in VR Mode and then record in V Mode, be sure to execute Format. Be careful when executing Format because all the recorded data may be lost.
- A DVD-RW blank disc is initialized to VR Mode when first initialized.

• DVD-RW (VR mode)

- This is a format that is used for recording data on a DVD-RAM or DVD-RW disc. You can repeat recording, editing, deleting, partial deletion, creation of playlist, and etc.
- A disc that is recorded in this mode may not be played by existing DVD players.

• DVD-RW (Video mode)

- This is a format that is used for recording data on a DVD-RW or DVD-R disc. The disc can be played by an existing DVD player once it has been finalized.
- If a disc that has been recorded in Video mode by a different manufacturer's recorder but has not been finalized it cannot be played or additionally be recorded by this recorder.

DVD-RAM Disc Playback and Recording

- DVD-RAM discs come with or without a cartridge.
 For this product, we recommend DVD-RAM discs that come with cartridges.
- Some cartridges are able to eject the disc inside.
 Even if you are able to eject the disc, always use the disc with the cartridge to ensure correct operation
- DVD-RAM discs have a Write Protect tab in order to avoid accidental erasure of recorded data. With the Write Protect tab set to PROTECT, you can play the disc, but recording or erasing will not work. Set the Write Protect tab to UNPROTECT to format the disc or erase data.
- Ensure that the recording mode is set to VR mode.
 Otherwise, this product will not be able to play the recording.
- You cannot play a DVD-RAM in most DVD players due to compatibility issues.
- Only DVD-RAM standard Version 2.0 discs can be played in this unit.
- DVD-RAM recorded on this unit may not work with other DVD Players. To determine compatibility with these DVD-RAM discs, refer to the user's manual for the player.
- This unit is compatible with both non-cartridge and cartridge DVD-RAM, but the write-protect tabs on cartridge-type discs give better protection to your recordings.

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General Features

The DVD-D-R3 allows you to record and play high quality digital images on DVD-RAM/DVD-RW/DVD-R discs. You can record and edit digital images on DVD-RAM/DVD-RW/DVD-R discs as if they were VCR tapes.

High quality digital audio and video recording and playback

Record up to 12-hours of images with a double sided 9.4 GB DVD-RAM disc, and up to 6-hours of images with a 4.7 GB DVD-RAM/DVD-RW/DVD-R disc, depending on the recording mode.

Selectable Recording Mode

You can set your recorder to one of five different recording speeds, each varying in recording quality and length. EP mode yields the most recording time, LP & SP modes provide less recording time with higher quality recording, and XP mode gives you the highest quality recording. There's also the FR (Flexible Recording) mode that lets you record with the best picture quality possible for the recording time and remaining space on the disc in timer recording.

Automated Quality Adjustment for Timer Recording

If FR mode is selected, the video quality is adjusted automatically so that all images for the scheduled time can be recorded onto the free disc space. (See page 42.)

Time Slip and Picture In Picture (PIP)

Use the Time Slip function to review the recorded images while a recording is underway.

Use the PIP function to view both the playback and recording screens simultaneously.

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How to use the DVD Recorder

Step 1 Select the disc type

This unit can record on the following types of discs. If you want to repeatedly record on the same disc or you want to edit the disc after recording, select a rewritable DVD-RW or DVD-RAM type disc. If you want to save recording without any change, choose a non-rewritable DVD-R.









Step 2 Format the disc to start recording

Unlike a VCR, the recorder automatically starts formatting when an unused disc is inserted. This is required for the preparation of recording on a disc.

Using a DVD-RAM

This type of disc can be formatted in DVD-Video Recording format (VR mode). You can edit recorded image and create a playlist and edit images in a specific sequence according to your requirements.

Using a DVD-RW

This type of disc can be formatted in either DVD-Video format (Video mode) or DVD-Video Recording format (VR mode). For an unused disc, a message that asks whether to format in VR Mode or not is displayed. You can play a Video mode disc on various DVD components. A VR mode disc allows more varied editing.

Using a DVD-R

This type of disc can be formatted in DVD Video format. After formatting is complete, you can record on the disc. You can play this type of discs on various DVD components only when they have been finalised.



- You can only use one format on a DVD-RW.
- You can change the DVD-RW format to another format. It should be noted that the data of the disc may be lost when changing formats.

Step 3 Recording

There are two different recording methods, Direct Recording and Timer Recording. Timer recording is classified as recording type: Once, Daily or Weekly or recording mode: XP (high quality mode), SP (standard quality mode), LP (long recording mode), and EP (extended mode) according to the recording mode. When recording is set in the FR mode, the best quality picture is recorded with regards to the remaining time on the disc.

Step 6 Finalizing & Playing on other DVD components

To play your DVD on other DVD components, finalizing may be necessary. First, finish all editing and recording operations, then finalise the disc.

When using a DVD-RW disc in VR Mode

Although finalizing is generally unnecessary when playing the disc on a VR Mode compatible component, a finalised disc should be used for playback on that type of component.

When using a DVD-RW disc in Video Mode

The disc should be finalised first to enable playback on anything other than this recorder. No more editing or recording can be made on the disc once it has been finalised.

When using a DVD-R disc

You should finalise the disc to play it on a component other than this recorder. You cannot edit or record on the disc once it has been finalised.

Step 4 Playing

You can select the title you want to play in a displayed menu and then immediately start playback. A DVD consists of sections, called titles, and sub sections, called chapters.

During recording, a title is created between two points where you start and stop recording. DVD-R/DVD-RW discs (in Video mode) can automatically create chapters according to the recording mode when finalised.



Step 5 Editing a recorded disc

Editing on discs is easier than conventional video tapes. The recorder supports many different edit functions, possible only with DVDs.

With a simple and easy edit menu, you can operate various edit functions, such as delete, copy, rename, lock, etc., on a recorded title.

Creating a playlist (DVD-RAM/-RW in VR mode)



Description



Front Panel



1. STANDBY/ON

Turns the recorder on and off.

2 DV-IN

Connects external digital equipment with a DV jack.

3. AV4 IN

Connects external equipment.

4. DISC TRAY

Opens to accept a disc.

5. DISPLAY

Displays the playing status, title/ chapter/ time, etc.

6. OPEN/CLOSE

Opens and closes the disc tray.

7. STOP

Stops disc playback.

8. PLAY/PAUSE

Plays a disc or pauses playback.

9. SEARCH

Goes to the next title/chapter/track, or goes back to the previous title/chapter/track.

10. RECORD MODE

Selects the recording mode.

11. REC

Starts recording.

12. PR (∨ ^)

Select TV preset channels. Same as PROG buttons in remote control.

13. REC PAUSE

Pauses recording.

14. TIME SLIP

The Time Slip function allows you to view a recorded program through the PIP window at least 10 seconds after recording starts. Playback and recording can be done at the same time.

15. INPUT

Selects equipment connected to the line inputs.

16. PIP

To watch an external source on the PIP(sub) picture or to monitor Time Slip.


17. LAST MARK

Goes to the last bookmarked position.

18. TIME SLIP LED

The LED indicator lights up green when the Time Slip function operates.


Front Panel Display



- This lights to indicate the names of the sections of the disc being played.
- 2. Lights to indicate the timer recording mode.
- 3. Lights in the record mode.

- 4. Lights in the playback/pause mode.
- 5. Displays the title, chapter, title list or playlist number and displays the message during playback.

Rear Panel



1. DIGITAL AUDIO OUT

Connects to an amplifier having a digital input jack.

2. ANALOGUE AUDIO OUT

Connects to the audio input of external equipment using audio cables.

3. VIDEO OUT

Connects the input of external equipment using a Video or S-Video cable.

4. AV1(TV) OUTPUT SCART

5. AV2(EXT) INPUT SCART


6. AV3 IN(AUDIO/VIDEO)

Connects the output of external equipment using an audio/video or S-Video cable.

7. VHF/UHF

Connects antenna cables.

Tour of the Remote Control



1. DVD STANDBY/ON Button

2. Number Buttons

3. TV/DVD Button

4. TV Button

Press this to operate TV.

5. DVD Button

Press this when you use a DVD.

6. TV Control Buttons

- TV VOL Button
- TV volume adjustment
- PROG Button

Allows you to program a specific order. Same as PR buttons in Front panel.

7. OPEN/CLOSE Button

To open and close the disc tray.

8. VIDEO Plus+ Button

Press to make a timer recoding of a programme by entering the programmes VIDEO Plus+ number.

9. Playback-related buttons

Search, Skip, Stop, Play/Pause

10. MENU Button

Brings up the DVD Recorder's setup menu.

11. TITLE LIST/DISC MENU Button

Use this to enter the View Recording list/Disc menu.

12. OK/DIRECTION Buttons

(UP/DOWN or LEFT/RIGHT Buttons) This button functions as a toggle switch.

13. RETURN Button

Returns to a previous menu.

14. REPEAT Button

Allows you to repeat a title, chapter, track or disc.

15. DISPLAY. Button

This will display current setting or disc status.

16. REC Button

Use to make a recording on DVD-RAM/-RW/-R discs.

17. REVERSE STEP Button

Each press of this button will play one-frame reverse.

18. PIP Button

Use to watch a sub program on the PIP screen while watching the main program on the main screen

19. TV STANDBY/ON Button

20. AUDIO/TV MUTE Button

Use this to access various audio functions on a disc.(DVD mode)

This operates as Sound Mute. (TV mode)

21. CM SKIP Button

When a program recorded on a DVD-RAM, a DVD-RW, a DVD-R or DVD-Video is played, the unit can be set to automatically skip a portion of the program.

22. INPUT SEL Button

Select line input signal in external input mode(Tuner or Line input)

23. TIME SLIP Button

The Time Slip function allows you to view a recorded program through the PIP window at least 10 seconds after recording starts. Playback and recording can be done at the same time.

24. MARKER Button

Use this to bookmark a position while playing a disc.

25. QUICK Button

Use this to view the status of the disc that is being played.

26. PLAY LIST/TITLE MENU Button

Use this to return to the Title menu, or to view the recorded files list.

27. CANCEL Button

28. REPEAT(A-B) Button

Press to repeat between A-B disc.

29. SUBTITLE Button

Press this to switch the DVD's subtitle language.

30. REC PAUSE Button

Use this to pause during recording.

31. FORWARD STEP Button

Each press of this button will play one-frame forward

32. REC SPEED Button

Connecting & Setting Up



Step 2: Connecting SCART Cable

There are several ways to connect your DVD Recorder using scart cables.

Select one of the following connections that best suits you.

- Method 1 : Antenna + DVD Recorder + TV
- Method 2 : Antenna + VCR/satellite receiver/cable box + DVD Recorder + TV



If you are using an off-air antenna that has 300-ohm twin flat leads, use an external antenna connector (300-75 ohm adaptor : not supplied) to connect the antenna to the DVD Recorder.



 If you have two separate antennas (one VHF and the other UHF), use a UHF/VHF combiner-adaptor (available at most electronics shops) to connect the antenna to the DVD Recorder.




The VHF/UHF RF OUT jack of this product sends only signals received through the antenna. It does not output Audio/ video signals. You must connect audio/video cables to view Video from the unit. (i.e. DVD playback)

Method 1 : Antenna + DVD Recorder + TV

You can connect your DVD Recorder to the television using the SCART cable if the appropriate input is available on the television. You thus:


- Obtain better quality sound and pictures
- Simplify the setting up procedure of your DVD Recorder
- 1. Connect the RF cable as shown.
- 2. Connect one end of the SCART cable to the AV1 socket on the rear of the DVD Recorder.
- Plug the other end into the appropriate connector on the television.





- Regardless of the type of connection chosen, you must always connect the RF cable supplied. Otherwise, no picture will be visible on the screen when the DVD Recorder is switched off.
- Make sure that both the television and the DVD Recorder is switched off before connecting the cables.
- If you want to record one channel while watching another channel on TV screen, press TV/DVD button.

Method 2 : Antenna + VCR/satellite receiver/cable box + DVD Recorder + TV



Before making or changing any rear panel connections, make sure that all components are switched off and unplugged from the wall outlet.

- Connect the cable from the antenna/cable TV outlet to the antenna input on your VCR/satellite receiver/cable box.
- Connect the antenna output of your VCR/satellite receiver/cable box to the ANTENNA IN of DVD Recorder using antenna cable.
- Use another RF antenna cable to connect the ANTENNA OUT of DVD Recorder to the antenna input on your TV.
- Connect the AV1 connector on DVD Recorder to the SCART AV connector on TV using a SCART cable.
- Connect the AV2 connector to a SCART AV connector on VCR/satellite receiver/cable box.
- 6. Setup "AV1 Out option" using on-screen menu. Refer to page 29.

Step3 : Other type of connecting the Video output cable


S-Video Output Modes

 S-Video output are available only if your TV supports S-Video input. If S-Video output does not work, check the TV connections and the TV input selection settings. (For information on how to connect to a TV, see pages 15 to 16.)

Method 1 : Connecting to a Composite Video output jack

Connect a video(yellow) cable between the VIDEO (yellow) OUT jack on DVD Recorder and VIDEO (yellow) IN jack on the TV (or AV amplifier).


- You will enjoy regular quality images.
- Connect audio cables(white and red) between the ANALOGUE AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD Recorder and AUDIO IN jacks on TV(or AV amplifier). (See page 18)



Method 2 : Connecting to an S-video output jack

Connect an S-video cable(not supplied) between the S-VIDEO OUT jack on DVD Recorder and S-VIDEO IN jack on the TV (or AV amplifier).

 You will enjoy high quality images. S-Video separates the picture element into black and white (Y) and color (C) signals to present clearer images than regular video input mode.



Connecting a VCR or external device to AV3 IN jacks of the DVD Recorder.

You can record from connected equipment (VCR, STB or DVD).





- When the S-Video jack and Video jack are both connected, the S-Video jack will have priority.



When an input source is inserted into AV 4 while viewing TV, the input will be switched to AV 4 automatically.



Method 3 : Connecting a Camcorder to the DV IN jack

If your camcorder has a DV output jack, connect it to the DV input jack of your DVD Recorder. DVs can be used as only input jack, not output jack.


Install Batteries in the Remote Control

- Open the battery cover on the back of the remote.
- Insert two AAA batteries. Make sure that the polarities (+ and -) are aligned correctly.
- Replace the battery cover.

If remote does not operate properly:

- Check the polarity + of the batteries (Dry-Cell)
- Check if the batteries are drained.
- Check if remote sensor is blocked by obstacles.
- Check if there is any fluorescent lighting nearby.

Dispose of batteries according to local environmental regulations. Do not put them in the household trash.



Setting the Remote Control

Your DVD Recorder remote control will work with Samsung televisions and compatible brands.



To determine whether your television is compatible, follow the instructions below.

- 1. Switch your television on.
- 2. Point the remote control towards the television.
- Hold down the TV STANDBY/ON button and enter the two-figure code corresponding to the brand of your television, by pressing the appropriate numeric buttons.





CM Skip Time Setting

When a program recorded on a DVD-RAM, a DVD-RW, or a DVD-R is played, the unit can be set to automatically skip a portion of the program corresponding to a CM(commercial) Skip Time set by the user.

The program can then be played from a point after the CM Skip Time. If the CM Skip button is pressed while a DVD disc is played, an instant skip function is performed for the set CM Skip Time.

With the unit in Stop mode, press the MENU button on the remote control.

2 Select Setup using the ▲▼ buttons, then press the ► or OK button.

You can't use the Setup functions while playing a disc.



3 Select System using the ▲▼ buttons, then press the ► or OK button.

System menu will be displayed.

- CM Skip is not performed with respect to a still picture.
- When a set time is less than a remaining time of a scene, a last title, or a last track that is displayed currently, a prohibition mark appears.
- When the time set is less than the remaining time of the currently displayed track, title or scene, a prohibition mark
- CM Skip releases Repeat (including Repeat A-B, Chapter, and Title).
- This may not operate with some DVD-Video discs.

Setting Up NICAM Options

NICAM programmes are divided into 3 types. NICAM Stereo, NICAM Mono and Bilingual (transmission in another language). NICAM programmes are always accompanied by a standard mono sound broadcast and you can select the desired sound by setting NICAM on or off

- With the unit in Stop mode, press the MENU button on the remote.
- Select "Setup" using ▼▲ buttons, then press the ▶ or OK button.



3 Using the **V**▲ buttons, move the selection bar to "System" then press **>** or OK button to select.



- 4 Using the ▼▲ buttons, move the selection bar to "NICAM" then press ▶ or OK button to select.
- 5 Using the **V**▲ and OK buttons, select "On" or "Off".
 - Off: Only set at this position to record the standard mono sound during a NICAM broadcast if the stereo sound is distorted due to inferior reception conditions.

Setting Up Scart Jack Options

If you connect external device (VCR/satellite receiver/cable box) or TV to DVD Recoder with Scart Jack(21pin), you need to set this options.

- 2 Select "Setup" using **V**▲ buttons, then press the **>** or OK button.
- 3 Using the ▼▲ buttons, move the selection bar to "System" then press ► or OK button to select.

If you set the player menu, disc menu, audio and subtitle language in advance, they will come up automatically every time you watch a movie.

If the selected language is not recorded on the disc, the original pre-recorded language is selected.

Audio Options

Digital Output

- Select this when you have no equipment that can decode Dolby Digital (or MPEG-2) signal. When you play Dolby Digital (or MPEG-2) sound track, the digital output are converted to PCM Stereo.
 - Bitstream : Output Dolby Digital (or MPEG-2) audio as bitstream. Select this when your AV receiver or AV amplifier have Dolby Digital (or MPEG-2) Decoder.



- Digital output setting is equally applied to both Dolby Digital and MPEG-2 audio.
 LPCM sound track is always outputted as PCM. It has no relation with Digital Output setting.
- Be sure to select the correct Digital Output or you will hear no sound or loud noise.

DTS

- Doesn't output DTS signal.
 Select this when your AV receiver or AV
 - amplifier does not have DTS decoder.
- 2. On : Outputs DTS Bitstream via digital output when you play DTS track.

Select this only when your AV receiver (or AV amplifier) have DTS decoder.



When DTS soundtrack is played, sound does not output from Analogue Audio Output.

Dynamic Compression

Dynamic Range Compression: This is only active when a Dolby Digital signal is detected.

- On: When the Movie-soundtracks are played at low volume or from smaller speakers, the system can apply appropriate compression to make low-level content more intelligible and prevent dramatic passages from getting too loud.
- Off: You can enjoy the movie with standard Dynamic Range.

Setting Up the Display(Video) Options

This function allows you to setup the TV screen settings.

With the unit in Stop mode, press the MENU button on the remote.

You can't use the Setup functions during playback.

2 Select "Setup" using ▼▲ buttons, then press the ▶ or OK button.



3 Select "Video" using ▼▲ buttons, then press the ▶ or OK button.

Video setup menu will be displayed.

4 Use ▼▲ buttons to select the desired sub menu and press the OK or ▶ button.

Display(Video) Options

Front Display

Adjust the brightness of the unit's front panel display.



- Auto Dim: Makes the Front Panel Display dim automatically when playing a DVD.
- Dim : Makes the Front Panel Display dim.

Setting Up the Parental Control

The Parental Control function works in conjunction with DVDs that have been assigned a rating which helps you control the types of DVDs that your family watches. There are up to 8 rating levels on a disc.





Recording Formats

When YES is selected, the mode will be formatted in VR Mode.

- V/P: VPS(Video Programme System) or PDC(Programme Delivery Control) function.

If timer recording is set for the first program and then again for the second program and both programs overlap, the following message will appear on the screen: "This setting is identical with 1"The message shows that the first program has priority. After recording of the first program is complete, the second program starts being recorded.

To exit without saving the current setting Press the MENU button.

To return to the previous menu

Press the RETURN button if you don't want to set a timer recording.





Playing a Disc

When you stop playing disc, the recorder remembers where you stopped. So when you press PLAY button again, it will pick up where you left off. - Do not move your DVD Recorder while playing, as this may cause damage to the disc
- Make sure to press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open or close the disc tray.
- Do not push the disc tray while it is being opened or closed, as this may cause a product malfunction.
- Do not place foreign materials on or in the disc tray.
- Some functions may perform differently or be disabled depending on the disc type.
 If this occurs, refer to the instructions written on the disc case.
- Be especially careful that children's fingers are not caught between the disc tray and the tray chassis when it closes.

Using the Disc & Title Menu

Some type of discs contain a dedicated menu system that allows you to select special functions for the title, such as chapters, audio tracks, subtitles, film previews, information on characters, etc.

For DVD-VIDEO discs



Press the DISC MENU button to enter the disc menu of the disc.

- Move to the setup menu related to the playback operation.
- You can select the audio languages and the subtitles provided by the disc.

Press the TITLE MENU button to move to the title menu of the disc.

• Use this button if the disc contains more than one title. Some type of discs may not support the title menu function.

For DVD-RAM/RW/R discs







Press the TITLE LIST button to move to the Title List.



- Title List: Title refers to a recorded video stream. Title List shows a list to help you select a title. Since the title list consists of the information on stream that is actually recorded, if one title is deleted, that title cannot be played
- Play List: This refers to a unit of playback, which is made by selecting a desired scene in the entire Title List. When one playlist is played, only the scene selected by the user will play and then stop. Since only the information necessary for playing a desired scene is included in a playlist, even if that playlist is deleted, the original stream will not be

Play List

This refers to a unit of playback, which is made by selecting a desired scene in the entire Title List. When one playlist is played, only the scene selected by the user will play and then stop. Since only the information necessary for playing a desired scene is included in a playlist, even if that playlist is deleted, the original stream will not be deleted.

If recording or editing could have not been finished properly because of any kinds of error, such as sudden power failure, the recording or editing might have not been done.

Please be aware that a material that has been damaged is unable to be retrieved to its original content.

Renaming(Labeling) a Title

Follow these instructions to rename a title list entry, i.e., to edit the title of a recorded program.

Troubleshooting

If your product malfunctions, go through the checkpoints below before contacting a Toshiba authorized service center.

Power

The input is displayed for a while when the power is turned on.



Checkpoint 1

The DVD recorder requires some time to initialize and the input will be displayed for approx. 10 seconds after it is turned on.

Recording

Cannot record TV programs.



Checkpoint 1

Check whether the power cord is securely plugged into the power outlet.

Checkpoint 2

Did you set the DVD recorder channel settings correctly?

Checkpoint 3

Check the free space on your DVD-RAM/DVD-RW/DVD-R discs.

I pressed the REC button but there is no response.



Checkpoint 1

Recording is possible for DVD-RAM/DVD-RW/DVD-R discs only. If a program is copy protected, it cannot be recorded.



Checkpoint 1

Each press of the Stop button during recording creates a title. When the REC PAUSE button is pressed, the paused state is kept. When the REC PAUSE button is pressed again during REC pause, the title under pause will be kept recording.

Play mode settings are different from the settings configured in the Settings menu.



Checkpoint 1

The disc does not support all selected functions. In this case, some settings configured in the settings menu may not work properly.

Cannot change the aspect ratio.



Checkpoint 1

The aspect ratio is fixed for DVD discs. (See page 30.)

Cannot play the disc.

Check whether the disc is damaged. Clean the disc, if necessary.

Checkpoint 4

Check whether the disc is inserted correctly with the label facing up.

Checkpoint 1

Check whether you have selected the correct digital output options in the Audio Output Options menu. (See page 31.)

Timer Recording

Timer lamp flickers.



Checkpoint 1

Check there is enough space in the disc for recording.

Checkpoint 2

Check whether the current disc is recordable or not.

Make sure to check before the start time of recording.

Timer recording does not work properly.



Checkpoint 1

Re-check the recording time and the end time settings again.

Checkpoint 2

Recording will be cancelled, if the power is disconnected due to a power failure or another similar reason while recording.

The remote control doesn't work.
