1.2 Introducing the TV

You can watch SECAM/ PAL/ DVB-T broadcast, cable, or digital television channels, and easily connect a VCR, STB or DVD player to the SCART, component, and HDMI input ports (location of these ports depends on model). You can also use the TV as a monitor for your PC by connecting it through the VGA port.

Convenient control buttons located on the TV and a handy remote control let you change channels, adjust the volume, and change display settings through an easy-to-use on-screen display menu system. The built-in stereo speakers provide full rich sound and a convenient audio output port lets you connect to an external audio system or earphones.




- For best results, use the remote control within a proper distance from the front of the TV. Do not exceed an angle of 30 degrees when pointing at TV.
- The operational distance may be shortened when the signal sensor is directly exposed to strong light.
- Aim the transmitter on the remote control at the signal sensor and ensure that there are no obstacles between them.

1.6.1 **Inserting the Remote Control Batteries**


1 Open the battery compartment cover at the back of the remote control (A).



Insert the batteries paying attention to the polarity markings inside the battery compartment (B).



Replace the battery compartment cover (C).





CAUTION

- If the remote control is not used for a long period, remove the batteries and store them properly.
- Handle damaged or leaking batteries carefully, and wash hands with soap if they come in contact with leaked chemical fluids.
- If your remote control has two batteries, do not mix new and old batteries, or the life of the new batteries will be shortened. Chemical fluids may leak from the old batteries.
- Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the equipment manufacturer. Discard used batteries according to manufacturer's instructions.

Setting up your TV


2.1 Basic Connections

2.1.1 Power Connection

- 1 Connect the power cord to the AC IN input jack on the rear of the TV.
- 2 Insert the plug at the other end of the power cord into a power outlet.

2.1.2 Connecting an Antenna or Cable TV

Connect one end of the VHF/UHF (Antenna) or CATV cable to TV/DTV jack on the rear of the TV.




Note:

- · Images are for illustration only and may vary by model or region.
- If you cannot receive channels after connecting to an antenna or cable TV line, try scanning for channels.

2.2 Connecting External Devices

Connect external devices such as VCRs, STBs, DVD players, video game consoles, earphones, or a PC to the TV using the appropriate ports on the rear of the TV.

2.2.1 Connecting External Earphones




Note:

- External speakers or headphones are not included with the TV.
- The internal TV speakers will not output sound when headphones are plugged in.
- Use external speakers with built-in amplifiers only.
- Only one external device for sound can be connected at a time.


2.2.2 **Connecting to AV Devices**

2.2.3 Connecting a VCR/ STB/ DVD Player Using Component Video


Connect the TV to a VCR/ STB/ DVD player using the component video inputs.



2.2.4 Connecting a PC using VGA

Connect the TV to your PC to use it as the monitor using the VGA port as shown.


- 1 Connect the VGA port of the TV to the VGA output of the PC.
- 2 Connect the line out port of the PC to the PC LINE IN port of your TV to listen to audio from the PC.



2.2.5 **Connecting a PC using DVI**


Connect the TV to your PC to use it as the monitor using the DVI port as shown.

- Connect the HDMI port of the TV to the DVI output of the PC.
- 2 Connect the line out port of the PC to the PC LINE IN port of your TV to listen to audio from the PC.



2.2.6 **Connecting HDMI**

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) assures that the best video signal is always sent from source to the TV. Refer to the following illustration to connect an HDMI device to the TV.




Note:

When the HDMI cable is connected, connecting the audio cable is not necessary. However, it is necessary to do so if a HDMI to DVI cable is connected.

2.2.7 Connecting a VCR/ STB/ DVD Player using SCART

Connect the SCART (optional) to connect a TV, VCR, VCD, DVD player or video game console. You can choose to use a SCART cable or adapter for the connection depending on the ports available on your player.



Note:

- The S-Video connector and AV connectors cannot be connected at the same time, or the wrong signals might be generated.
- The cables are color-coded (black, red, white, and yellow). Connect each color-coded cable to the appropriate connector on your device.

2.3 Using the TV

2.3.1 Turning the TV On and Off

- 1 Press () on the control panel or remote control. The power LED indicator on the TV changes from amber to blue, indicating that the TV is on.
- 2 Press (1) again. The power LED changes from blue to amber, indicating that the TV is off

2.3.2 Switching Source Signals

Press **INPUT** on the control panel or remote control to select the incoming source signal to set TV source for channel search.

2.3.3 Performing an Automatic Channel Search

Before using the TV to view programs, you need to activate the channel search first.

- 1 Press MENU on the control panel or remote control, then select to enter the Channel menu.
- 2 Select Auto scan, then Start option.
- 3 Press **OK** on the remote control to run the channel search.

2.3.4 Selecting Channels

- Press P▲ on the remote control or control panel to increase the channel number.
- Press P▼ on the remote control or control panel to decrease the channel number.
- Enter the specific channel number by pressing the number buttons on the remote control.

2.3.5 Adjusting the Volume

- 1 Press **VOL+** on the control panel or remote control to increase the volume.
- 2 Press **VOL-** on the control panel or remote panel to decrease the volume.
- 3 Press MUTE to eliminate sounds, and press MUTE again or press the volume buttons to restore the original volume.


Adjusting On-Screen Display (OSD) Settings

The On-Screen Display (OSD) menu system provides a quick and simple method to adjust the TV settings. The OSD menu can be accessed conveniently through the buttons on the remote control.

Before going into details of each OSD option, you may get acquainted with the placement of the OSD system:.

3.1 **OSD Setting Menus**

Follow the instructions indicated on the down side of the OSD Function Menu. Press P▲/▼on the control panel or _ / _ arrow keys to scroll through the menus, VOL + on the control panel or the > arrow key to select an item, or **MENU** to exit the OSD menu.

The following menus can be set by different adjustment methods.

Adjusting Picture Settings 3.2

- Press MENU to enter the OSD Main Menu screen. The Picture menu is then displayed.
- 2 Press > to enter the Picture menu.
- Press 🔨 / 🗸 to select an item.
- 4 Press < / > to adjust the scales or options settings.



- **5** Press **OK** to confirm the setting. Press **MENU** to return to the **Picture** menu.
- 6 Press MENU to exit the OSD menu.
- The Picture menu can be used to adjust the Scenario Mode, Brightness, Contrast, Hue, Colour, Sharpness, Phase, Colour Temp, Advanced Picture Adjust, and Reset Picture settings.
 - The Scenario Mode can be set to Standard, Movie, Sport, Concert, Game, or User.
 - The Colour Temp can be set to Standard, Warm, or Cold.
 - The Advanced Picture Adjust can be set to Noise Reduction, CTI, Backlight control. ACM and DCG.
 - Noise Reduction reduces vidual noise without reducing details. Select from Off, Low, Medium or High.
 - CTI (Colour Transition Improvement) smoothes out the edges of color images so that colors can be more precisely reproduced. Select from Off, Low, Medium or High.
 - Backlight control helps to manually turn down the backlight in dark scenes, generating a deeper black color. Press 🗸 / 🗲 to adjust the scales from 0-100.

- ACM (Adaptive Contrast Management) delivers high contrast ratio and optimum brightness to produce the best possible picture. It enhances the panel contrast by making bright areas brighter and dark areas darker.
- **DCG** balances the screen contrast. When the backlight is dark, the image turns bright. When the backlight is light, the image turns dark.

The options available on the OSD may vary depending on the input signal source.

3.3 Adjusting Sound Settings

- Press MENU to enter the OSD Main Menu screen.
- 2 Press v to select the Audio menu.
- 3 Press > to enter the Audio menu.
- 4 Press ∧ / ∨ to select an item.
- Fress \(/ \) adjust the scales or options settings.



- **6** Press **OK** to confirm the setting. Press **MENU** to return to the **Audio** menu.
- 7 Press MENU to exit the OSD menu the OSD menu.
- 8 The Audio menu can be used to adjust the Scenario Mode, Treble, Bass, Balance, Sound Effect, and Reset Audio settings.
 - The Scenario Mode can be set to Standard, Movie, Sport, Concert, Game, or User.

Note:

The options available on the OSD may vary depending on the input signal source.

3.4 Adjusting Channel Settings

- 1 Press **MENU** to enter the OSD Main Menu screen.
- 2 Press to select the Channel Management menu.
- 3 Press > to enter the Channel Management menu.
- 4 Press ∧ / ∨ to select an item.
- **5** Press **〈** / **>** adjust the scales or options settings.



- 6 Press **OK** to confirm the setting. Press **MENU** to return to the **Channel** menu.
- 7 Press MENU to exit the OSD menu.
- 8 The Channel Management menu can be used to perform a channel search and to adjust the Country, Daylight Saving, Time Zone, Auto Scan, Manual Scan, Channel Edit, Preferred Audio, Preferred Subtitle, Subtitle Type, and Digital Teletext Language settings.
 - The Country can be set to UK, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Swizerland, Denmark, Belgium, Netherlands, Luxembourg, Czech Rep., United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Portugal, and Other.
 - The Daylight saving can be set to On/Off.
 - The Time Zone will display the location of the Time Zone option.
 - Select Auto Scan to activate the automatic TV channel search. Select Manual Scan to search the TV channels manually.





9 Press > to enter the Channel Edit menu, the Channel Editor allows you to edit the detailed items, including Name, Skip, and Reorder for each channel.



- The Subtitle Type can be set to Normal and Hearing Impaired.
- The Digital Teletext Language can be set to **English**, **French**, **German**, **Italian**, **Spanish**, **Portuguese**, **Dutch** and **Polish**.



3.6 Parental Control

Parental Control allows you to block channels, programs not appropriate to certain ages, or input devices with a password you setup.

- Press MENU to enter the OSD Main Menu screen
- 2 Press v to select the Parental Control menu entry.
- 3 Press OK to enter the Parental Control menu
- 4 Press A / V to select Channel Block, Age Rating, Input Block, or Change Password.
- Press < / > to adjust the scales or options settings.





- 7 The PC Setup menu can be used to adjust the Picture, Audio, Setting, and Parental Control settings.
 - The Picture submenu can be used to adjust the Scenario Mode, Brightness, Contrast, Colour Temp, Advanced Picture Adjust, VGA and Reset Picture settings.
 - · The Scenario Mode can be set to Standard, Movie, Sport, Concert, Game, or User.

- The Colour Temp can be set to Standard, Warm, or Cold.
- The Advanced Picture Adjust can be set to Noise Reduction, CTI, Backlight control. ACM or DCG.
 - Noise Reduction reduces vidual noise without reducing details. Select from Off, Low, Medium or High.
 - CTI (Colour Transition Improvement) smoothes out the ediges of color images so that colors can be more precisely reproduced. Select from Off, Low, Medium or High.
 - Backlight control helps to manually turn down the backlight in dark scenes, generating a deeper black color. Press

 / > to adjust the scales from 0-100.
 - ACM (Adaptive Contrast Management) delivers high contrast ratio and optimum brightness to produce the best possible picture. It enhances the panel contrast by making bright areas brighter and dark areas darker.
 - DCG balances the screen contrast. When the backlight is dark, the image turns bright. When the backlight is light, the image turns dark.
 - VGA can be used to adjust the H Position, V Position, Phase, Clock and Auto Adjust setting.
 - Reset setting resets settings to the defaults.
- The Audio menu can be used to adjust the Scenario Mode, Treble, Bass, Balance, Sound Effect, and Reset Audio settings.
 - The Scenario Mode can be set to Standard, Movie, Sport, Concert, Game, or User.
- The Setting menu can be used to adjust the Aspect, Menu Language, DPMS, Blue Mute, Sleep, SCART and Reset Setting.
 - The available Aspect selections include Full and Normal.
 - The available Menu Language are English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese. Dutch and Polish.
 - · The Blue Mute can be set to On or Off.
 - The Sleep can be set to Off, 15, 30, 45, 60, 90 or 120 minutes.
 - The SCART mode selections include SCART1, SCART2: SCART1: Auto, Mixed, RGB, CVBS, S-Video. SCART2: CVBS, S-Video, Auto, Mixed. The SCART1 can be set to AUTO, Mixed, RGB, CVBS or S-VIDEO. The SCART2 can only be set to CVBS, S-Video, Auto, or Mixed.
 - · Select Reset Setting to reset settings to the defaults.

 The Aspect modes include HDMI, SCART Component, and TV modes for Video mode selection. The PC mode selection includes Full and Normal. Please see the pictures below for details.

No picture and sound.	 Press on the control panel or remote control. Press Input to cycle through connected video sources. Press P▲ or P▼ to switch to other TV programs. Make sure all cables are connected properly.
No picture, or poor picture, sound is OK.	 Check the antenna and cable connections. Adjust the brightness in the Picture OSD menu.
Picture is not in color.	Adjust the colour option in the Picture OSD menu.
Picture is OK, no sound.	 Make sure the source device is functioning properly. Make sure the audio cable is connected securely. Turn the mute off. Press VOL + on the control panel or remote control.
One of the speakers has no sound.	Adjust the balance in the Audio OSD menu.
Cannot receive some TV channels using cable TV.	Try the Auto Scan function in the Channel Management OSD menu.
Want to reset TV settings.	Use the Reset Setting function in the Setting OSD menu.
Cannot operate menus.	If OSD items are colored in gray, the system is in a state such that those settings are not available.
Screen image turns over.	Make sure the video signal cable is connected properly.
Snow appears on the screen.	 Adjust the location of the antenna, placing it far from roads or sources of interference. Check the antenna and the video signal line connections.
Blurred or overlapped images.	 Adjust the sharpness setting. Choose programs with high quality signals. Adjust the direction of the antenna or replace the video signal cable.

Dissembling the stand base

- Disconnect all the cables and cords from the TV to prevent breakage.
- Carefully place the TV face down on a soft and flat surface (blanket, foam, cloth, etc) to prevent any damage to the TV. 2
- 3 Squeeze the sides to release the retaining plastic tabs and pull the stand cover
- Remove the six (6) screws so that the stand base can be removed. 4
- Gently remove the stand base.



Wall mounting the TV:

- Purchase a VESA compatible wall bracket: VESA 100 X 200, 6 holes, M4, 8mm, 20 kg.
- Locate your ideal TV position on the wall. 2
- Fix the wall bracket firmly on the wall.
- Secure the TV to the bracket using the 6 mount holes on the back and center of the TV.



Note:

- Please read the instructions of your specific wall bracket to properly wall mount
- The pitch of the mounting holes is 100mm horizontally and 100mm vertically.
- The screws type required is metric: M4, 8 mm length.
- The 28" TV stand base can be screwed on a table or a hard surface using the hole on the back of the stand base.
