

SAFETY NOTES

Safety notes for this camera

- Do not drop the camera or allow it to hit solid objects.
- Do not attempt to disassemble the camera.
- To prevent the camera from being damaged by moisture, do not use or store the camera in very humid environments, such as in rain or near bodies of water.
- Do not use or store the camera in dusty places or on a beach to prevent dust or sand from entering the camera, causing possible damage to it.
- Do not use or store the camera in a hot environment or under direct sunlight.
- Do not use or store the camera near a powerful magnetic field, for example near a magnet or transformer.
- Avoid touching the lens of the camera.
- Do not expose the camera to direct sunlight for a long period time.
- Turn the camera off, remove the battery and the memory card, and dry it within 24 hours if water accidentally comes in contact with the camera.
- When you take the camera from a cold place to a warmer environment, condensation may occur. Please wait for a reasonable period of time before you turn it on.
- When you use the camera, remove the battery if it overheats. Wait until the unit cools down.

- Download your photos and remove the memory card when you are going to store the camera for a long period of time.
- Store the camera in a dry environment and place it on a flat surface when you are going to store the camera for a long period of time.
- Before you remove the battery and memory card, the camera should be turned off.
- When you clean the body of the camera, do not use abrasive, alcohol-based or organic cleaner.
- Use the professional lens wiping cloth and dedicated cleaner to wipe and clean the lens.

Safety notes for battery

- To prevent the battery from being damaged, do not drop the battery or allow it to hit solid objects or to be scratched by the objects.
- Do not let the battery come in contact with metal objects (including coins) to avoid short circuiting, discharging, excessive heat, or possible leakage.
- Do not attempt to disassemble the battery.
- Do not expose the battery to water. Always keep the battery contacts dry.
- Do not heat the battery or throw it into a fire to avoid a possible explosion.

- Do not store the battery in a hot environment or in direct sunlight.
- · Only use the supplied battery.
- If the rechargeable Li-ion battery supplied with the camera needs to be replaced, contact the retailer or the customer service number listed in this manual.
- If the rechargeable Li-ion battery in this camera overheats during charging, stop charging immediately and wait until it cools down to resume charging.
- When the camera is stored for a long period of time, remove the battery and keep it in a dry place that is not accessible to the infants and children.
- In a colder environment, the performance of the battery could be noticeably reduced.
- When you install the battery, install it according to the positive and negative markings on the battery compartment. Never force it into the battery compartment.

Safety notes for memory card

- Do not drop the memory card or allow it to hit solid objects to avoid damaging it.
- Do not attempt to disassemble or repair the memory card.
- Do not expose the memory card to water. Always keep it dry.
- Do not remove the memory card when the camera is turned on. Otherwise, the memory card could be damaged.
- Do not directly edit the data on the memory card. Copy the data to your PC before you edit them.
- When the camera is stored for a long period of time, be sure to download your photos and remove the memory card. Store it in a dry environment.
- Format the memory card using the camera before you use it or insert a new one.
- We suggest buying only well-known, name brand memory cards to ensure peak performance.
- Do not modify the name of the files or folders of the memory card using your PC. Modifying the file names may cause the files to not be recognized on the camera or a possible error may occur.
- A photo taken with the camera will be stored in the folder that is automatically generated on the SD card. Do not store photos that are not taken using this camera in these folders as the pictures cannot be recognized during the playback.

 When you insert a memory card, make sure the notch of the card matches the markings on the top of the card slot.

Other Safety Notes

- Do not disconnect the power or turn the camera off during the update process. Doing so may cause incorrect data to be written and the camera may not power on later.
- Do not hang the camera or strap around the neck of small children.
- If the rechargeable Li-ion battery is used for the camera, only charge it with the supplied battery charger.
- If battery fluid leaks inside the camera, contact our customer service department.
- If battery fluid leaks onto your skin, rinse your skin with clean water and seek immediate medical attention.
- Disposal of used batteries should be carried out in accordance with the local (national or regional) regulations.
- When using your camera on an airplane, observe the relevant rules specified by the airline.
- Due to the limitations of manufacturing technology, the LCD screen may have a few dead or bright pixels. These pixels do no effect the quality or performance of the camera, photos or video.
- Do not expose the LCD screen to water. In a humid environment, only wipe it with a soft and dry cleaning cloth.

If the LCD screen is damaged and the liquid crystal comes into contact with your skin, wipe your skin with a dry cloth immediately and rinse it with clean water. If liquid crystal comes into contact with your eyes, wash them with clean water at least for 15 minutes and seek immediate medical attention. If you accidentally swallow liquid crystal, rinse your mouth immediately and seek medical attention.


Attaching the Lens Cap and Shoulder Strap







Charging Battery

Before you charge your battery, you should turn the camera off and insert the battery.


- Connect the camera and the power charger using the supplied USB cable. (The plug shape of the power charger may vary depending on the country or region. The actual item may vary from the drawing below).
- Insert the plug of the power charger into the wall outlet to charge the battery.



The charger is for indoor use only.



3. When the camera is turned off, you can also connect the camera to your PC using a USB cable to charge the battery.

To have maximum battery life, charge the battery for at

least 4 hours the first time.








Installing Battery and Memory Card


1. Open the battery cover.






2. Insert the battery into the battery slot in the correct position as shown in the following diagram:






3. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot as shown in the diagram below:




The memory card (SD/SDHC) is optional and not included in all camera packaging. If you have to purchase a memory card, select one with storage capacity between 4GB and 32GB to ensure correct data storage.

To remove your memory card, open the battery cover, gently press the memory card to eject it and remove it carefully.

4. Close the battery cover.





Turning Camera On and Off

Turn the power switch to turn on/off the camera.

Set your Language, Date/Time

Set your Language, Date/Time after the first power-on

- 1. When you turn the camera on for the first time, the language selection screen appears.
- 2. Press the arrow buttons to select your desired language.
- 3. After you press the (st) button to confirm the selection, the Date/Time settings screen appears.
- Press the left/right arrow button to select the Date/Time to be adjusted: Time is displayed in yyyy:MM:dd HH:mm.
- Press the up/down arrow button to adjust the value for the selected Date/Time.
- 6. Press the (st) button to confirm the time settings and the snapshot screen appears.

Resetting your Language

After you set your language for the first time, follow the instructions below to reset your language.

- 1. Turn the camera on via the power switch.
- 2. Press the button, press the up/down arrow button to select, and press the select button to enter the menu.
- 3. Press the up/down arrow button to select the (st) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.

- 4. Press the up/down arrow button to select 「Language」 and press the (sr) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 5. Press the arrow buttons to select your desired language and press the (st) button to confirm.
- 6. Press the button and the snapshot screen appears.





Resetting Date/Time

After you set your Date/Time for the first time, follow the instructions below to reset date and time.

- 1. Turn the camera on via the power switch.
- 2. Press the button, press the up/down arrow button to select and press the select button to enter the menu.
- 3. Press the up/down arrow button to select we, and press the (set) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 4. Press the up/down arrow button to select 「Date/Time」 and press the (st) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- Press the left/right arrow button to select the Date/Time to be adjusted: Time is displayed in yyyy:MM:dd HH:mm.
- Press the up/down arrow button to press the value for your selected block. After you finish your settings, press the (set) button to confirm.




For optimal video shooting, it is recommended that an SDHC memory card be used. If you shoot video using only the camera's internal memory, the end results may have image jitter, noise and vastly shorter recording times.



Optical Zoom and Digital Zoom can be adjusted. Digital Zoom can be adusted to 6X (156X in total).

Using the Mode Dial

This GE camera provides a convenient mode dial that allows you to manually switch between different modes with ease. The available modes are listed below:

Mode Name	Icon	Description	
Auto Mode	O	In this mode, the optimal conditions for taking pictures will be set based on the subject and environment. It is the most commonly used mode for taking pictures.	
Manual Mode	M	Many of the camera settings can be configured manually in this mode.	
Shutter Priority	S	Setting allows you to choose a specific shutter speed so the camera will adjust the aperture automatically to ensure correct exposure.	
Program AE	Р	Setting allows you to choose the EV value and the camera will select both the shutter speed and aperture automatically.	
Face Beautifier	+ ,*	This mode automatically enhances facial features with skin softening touches and eye brightening capabilities.	
Panorama Mode	I	Switch to this mode to take a series of pictures which will be stitched into a panoramic picture by camera.	
Black and White	BW	In this mode, the user can take pictures with different black and white effects.	
Scene Mode	SCN	Choose from 25 different pre-set scene types and effects for your photos.	
Movie Mode	43	Record videos.	
Custom Settings	CS	The user can store the frequently used shooting modes and parameters and switch to this mode for quick adjustment.	

Auto Mode 💿

Auto Mode is the easiest mode to take photos. While operating in this mode, the camera automatically optimizes numerous camera settings to adjust your photos and videos for the best possible results.

Follow these steps:

- 1. Use the power switch to turn the camera on.
- 2. Switch the Mode Digl to Auto Mode ().
- Compose your picture in the LCD screen and press the Shutter button halfway down to focus on the subject.
- The LCD screen will show a green focus frame when the subject is in focus.
- 5. Fully press the shutter button down to take pictures.

Manual Mode M

When selecting manual (\mathbf{M}) mode, you can set the aperture and shutter speed manually.

1. Turn the Mode Dail to \mathbf{M} and press the $\mathbf{\square}$ button to configure settings.



- Press the left/right arrow button to select an adjustment setting.
- 3. Press the up/down button to adjust the parameters.
- 4. Press the $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{g}}_{\text{ED}}$ button to confirm the settings and enter the shooting screen.

Shutter Priority S

When S (Shutter Priority) is selected, you can adjust the shutter speed and EV value. The camera automatically sets the aperture value based on the shutter speed value to get the most appropriate exposure value.

1. Turn the mode dial to \boldsymbol{S} and press the $\boldsymbol{\boxtimes}$ button to configure settings.



- Press the left/right arrow button to select an adjustment item.
- 3. Press the up/down button to adjust the parameters.
- 4 Press the (str) button to confirm the settings and enter the shooting screen.

Auto Program Exposure P

When ${f P}$ (Program AE) mode is selected, you can adjust the EV value and ISO value.

Turn the mode dail to P and press the button to configure settings.



- Press the left/right arrow button to select an adjustment item.
- 3. Press the up/down button to adjust the parameters.
- 4. Press the $\mbox{\scriptsize (st)}$ button to engage the settings and enter the shooting screen.

Face Beautifier 💠

In Portrait Mode, the camera is set to automatically adjust camera exposure for realistic portrayal of skin tones.

- Turn the Mode Dial to select Face Beautifier Mode (★[↑]).
- 2. Press the button and press the up/down button to select .
- Press the left/right arrow button to select Face Beautifier and press the (st) button to confirm and return to photo shooting mode.



Beautifier Mode has 3 effects:

- K Effect 1: Skin Beautifying
- 💥 2 Effect 2: Skin Beautifying + Eye Enlarging
- K seffect 3: Skin Beautifying + Eye Enlarging + Eye Brightening

Panorama Mode 🖼

With Panorama Mode, you can take a series of pictures which will be stitched automatically into a ultra-wide panoramic picture by the camera.

Follow the steps below:

- 1. Turn the Mode Dial to Panorama Mode ().
- 2. Press the arrow buttons to select a shooting direction. (The right direction is used as default if you do not make any choice.) 2 seconds later, the camera is ready to take pictures. You can also press the (st) button or half press the shutter button to be ready to take pictures.
- Compose your shot on the LCD screen and half press the shutter button to focus on the subject. After focusing, fully press the shutter button down to take the first picture. At this time, the process dialog of panorama mode stitching appears on the screen.





- 4. Move or rotate the camera according to the set direction. When the range of movement or rotation meets the internal settings of the camera, the progress dialog along the indication arrow partially turns green. When it completely turns green, panorama mode shooting is finished.
- The camera automatically stitches the pictures taken into a panoramic picture. After stitching, you can preivew it for 1 second.
- During shooting, the flash, self-timer, macro modes and exposure compensation are not available. Focus adjustment is also not available at this time.
- The shooting direction can be reset in the Panorama
- During panorama mode shooting, press the (新 button to interrupt shooting and save the current pictures taken. Press the down arrow button (面) to cancel shooting and not to save the previously taken pictures.
- During panorama mode shooting, when the moving direction of the camera is wrong or the angle deviates from the internal settings, the LCD shows a warning message 「Improper alignment. Please try again.」 and the current pictures taken are saved.

Black and White

In the different black and White Mode, you can take pictures with different black and white effects.

- Rotate the Mode Dial to mess button to enter for setting.
- Press the left/right arrow button to select the Black and White option.



3. Press the (SET) button to show the photo shooting screen.

In the Black and White Mode, the black and white effect has the following 8 options:

Scene Mode (SCN)

You can select an appropriate mode from the 25 scene modes according to the type of environment you are shooting. The camera then configures the most appropriate settings automatically.

Turn the Mode Dial to the Scene Mode to enter the Scene Mode menu. What the LCD screen displays is shown in the screen shot below:



Press the arrow buttons to select a scene , and press the button to confirm.

Scene	Description	
ASON Auto Scene	Identifies the scene automatically; Person, Backlighting, Landscape, Macro, Night Scene, Night Scene Person, Auto.	
<u>Landscape</u>	For landscapes and outdoor shots. Vivid reproduction of green and blue.	
€ Sport	For fast-moving subjects. Capture sharp, action shots with minimal blur. This mode is not recommended for shooting indoors.	
Beach	For taking pictures in areas with strong sunlight.	
Sunset	For sunsets. Capture subjects in strong sunlight.	
Fireworks	For fireworks at night. Slower shutter speed is adjusted for brilliant images. The use of a tripod recommended.	
Night Landscape	For night scenes. The use of tripod is recommended.	
Multi Exposure	Take several photos continuously.	
Snow	For snow scenes. Reproduce natural, clear white scenes.	
Children	Turns off flash automatically. Avoids disturbing subject, suitable for taking photos of children.	
EM ID	For shooting ID size photos. (It is recommended to print using 6-inch 4R (6X4) photographic paper).	
Glass	For objects behind transparent glass.	
Photo Frame	For adding interesting frame effects to the photo.

Panning Shot	Suitable for capturing fast moving objects to have a clear subject with a blurred background.	
Text	For taking pictures of text, documents or white boards.	
Portrait	Most suitable for capturing people with focus on their face.

Auto Scene Mode (ASCN)

In "ASCN" scene mode, the camera can detect different environments intelligently and automatically select the best scene and photo settings for you.

To use "ASCN":

1. Turn the Mode Dial to "SCN" and select "ASCN" mode.



- Hold the camera steadily and aim at the subject. The optimum scene mode will be selected automatically.
- 3. Press the shutter button half-way down to focus.
- 4. Press the shutter button all the way down to take pictures.

Mode Name	Description
Landscape Mode	For landscapes, ASCN will automatically adjust the exposure and reproduce vivid green and blue colors.
Portrait Mode	Most suitable for capturing people with focus on their faces.
Night Portrait	When you take portraits at night, or in low light conditions, ASCN will automatically adjust the exposure for people and night scenes.
Backlit Portrait	When the sun or any other light source is behind you, ASCN will automatically adjust the foreground exposure to produce the best pictures possible.
Night Landscape Mode	For night scenes, ASCN will automatically increase the ISO value to compensate for low light.
Macro Mode	To produce more detailed close-ups, ASCN will automatically engage the camera's Macro Mode and automatically focus the lens.
Auto Mode	The camera will automatically adjusts the exposure and focus to ensure the best possible pictures.

Custom Settings CS

The user can store the frequently used shooting modes and parameters and switch to this mode for quick adjustment.

Follow the steps below:

- 1. Select any mode or scene mode to be stored.
- 2. Set your desired parameters in the current mode.
- 3. Press the button, press the up/down arrow button to select , and press the set button to enter the menu.
- 4. Press up/down arrow button to select (a), and press the (st) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 5. Press the up/down arrow button select 「Custom Settings」 and press the st button or the right arrow button to enter the menu.



6. Select $\ulcorner \, \mathsf{Yes} \, \lrcorner \,$ to save or $\ulcorner \, \mathsf{No} \, \lrcorner \,$ to cancel.



- 7. Turn the mode dial to switch to the custom settings (CS).
- 8. The photo settings you store the last time are invoked.



The factory default settings are Program AE (\boldsymbol{P}) and other parameters.



Custom Settings only keep the photo shooting mode and parameters you set the last time you used the camera in this mode.

BASIC OPERATION

Using EVF (Electronic View Finder)

EVF functions as the LCD, which can be used to observe the scene and objects and for playback, preview and menu operations.

EVF has the following advantages:

- Avoid excessive power consumption caused by turning on the LCD screen to increase the time for taking pictures and battery life.
- It will not be affected by ambient light and may avoid poor composition due to light reflection on the LCD screen.

Follow the steps below:

Using the Zoom Function

Your camera is equipped with two types of zoom functions:





 The camera emits a brief pre-flash before the picture is taken to reduce red-eye effects.

White Balance Setting

The White Balance Setting allows you to adjust the color temperature for different lighting sources to ensure the most accurate color reproduction.





To select the best setting for optimum photos, follow these steps:

Exposure Compensation

The exposure compensation feature allows you to adjust the light exposure value to control the brightness of the image.



The adjustable range of exposure value is from EV -3.0 to EV+3.0.

ISO

The ISO function allows you to set the sensitivity of the camera's light sensor based on the brightness of the scene. To improve the camera's sensor performance in darker environments, a higher ISO value is required. A lower ISO value is needed when shooting in brighter conditions.

Pictures taken at higher ISO settings will generally have more noise than those taken at lower ISO settings.



The camera's ISO settings include: automatic, 100, 200, 400, 800, 1600 and 3200.

Shutter Adjustment

You can adjust the shutter speed value. Selecting a higher shutter speed will capture fast moving objects more clearly. Selecting a slower shutter speed will result in some motion blur of moving objects.



Aperture Adjustment

You can adjust the aperture size value. Selecting a large aperture opening will emphasize the point of focus and show a blurry background and foreground. A small aperture opening will keep both the background and main object in clear focus.



Using Quick Recording

In shooting mode, press the Recording short cut button (a) to begin recording video.



After finishing, press the Recording short cut button or the Shutter Button to stop and store the video. The camera will return to shooting mode automatically.




Transferring files to your computer

The computer will automatically detect the camera as a removable drive. Double-click the My Computer icon on the desktop to locate the removable drive and to copy folders and files in the drive to a directory on your PC as you would copy any typical folder or file.

Follow the steps below to connect the camera to a computer.

- 1. Make sure both the camera and computer are turned on.
- Connect one end of the supplied USB cable to the USB/AV OUT port on your camera.
- 3. Connect the other end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.



 After the transmission is complete, disconnect the USB cable according to the instructions specifying how to safely remove USB devices.

Video System

Use this feature to switch the video system from either NTSC or PAL.

- 1. Press the a button, press the up/down arrow button to select and press the st button to enter the menu.
- 2. Press up/down arrow button to select of and press the strong button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 3. Press the up/down arrow button to select $\lceil \text{TV-System} \rfloor$ and press the sst button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 4. Press the up/down arrow buttons to select \lceil NTSC \rfloor or \lceil PAL \rfloor and press the (set) button to confirm.



The video output signal can be switched to NTSC or PAL to accommodate different regional TV standards. The appropriate setting will vary between regions.

NTSC: USA, Canada, Taiwan, Japan, etc.

PAL: Europe, Asia (excluding Taiwan), Oceania, etc.

Note: The TV output will not display properly if an incorrect

video system is selected.

Set Eye-Fi SD Card Connection Mode

This camera supports wireless connection of an Eye-Fi SD Card. Upload the photos from the camera to the Internet using the following steps:


- 1. Press the (a) button, press the up/down arrow button to select (a) and press the (st) button to enter the menu.
- 2. Press up/down arrow button to select of and press the str button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 3. Press the up/down arrow button to select 「Eye-Fi」 and press the (sir) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 4. Press the up/down arrow buttons to select $\lceil On \rfloor$ or $\lceil Off \rfloor$ and press the (set) button to confirm.



Supported HDMI Connections

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface), is a fully digital audio/video transmission interface, through which uncompressed audio and video signals are transmitted.

Direct transmission of digital video signals to your TV reduces conversion loss and improves image quality.



Connecting HDMI-Ready TV

- Use a High-Definition output terminal cable (optional) to connect your camera to an HDMI compliant TV.
- 2. The camera will be automatically detected by the TV.
- After connecting via HDMI, the camera enters Playback Mode.



Make sure the camera and the TV are both turned on before connecting.



Refer to your TV instruction manual for information on what resolution sizes it will support. The resolution and output formats that are not supported will be grayed out on the camera's LCD screen.

Connecting to a PictBridge Compatible Printer



PictBridge technology allows printing of the photos saved in the memory card by the printer.

To find out if a printer is PictBridge compatible, simply look for the PictBridge logo on the packaging or check the owner's manual

for specifications. With the PictBridge function on your camera, you can print the captured photos directly to a PictBridge compatible printer using the supplied USB cable, without the need for a PC.

Setting the USB Mode

The camera's USB port can be set to connect with either a PC or a Printer, the following steps will ensure that the camera is correctly configured to connect with a Printer.

- Press the a button, press the up/down arrow button to select and press the st button to enter the menu.
- 2. Press up/down arrow button to select on and press the strong button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- Press the up/down arrow button to select 「USB」 and press the (st) button or right arrow button to enter the menu.
- 4. Press the up/down arrow buttons to select 「Printer」 and press the (sɛr) button to confirm.






After the camera is reset, it will switch to PC mode automatically from USB mode.

Connecting to your Printer

- 1. Make sure both the camera and printer are turned on.
- 2. Connect one end of the supplied USB cable to the USB port on your camera.
- 3. Connect the other end of the cable to the USB port on the printer.



If the camera is not connected to a PictBridge compatible printer, the following error message will appear on the LCD screen.





The error message above will also appear if the USB mode is set incorrectly, in which case you should disconnect the USB cable, check the USB mode settings, ensure that the Printer is turned on, and then try connecting the USB cable again.

Using the PictBridge Menu

After setting the USB mode to Printer, the **PictBridge** Menu will appear.



Press the up/down arrow button to select a menu item and press the (st) button or right arrow button to enter the item.

Refer to the following sections for more detailed information on each setting. $% \label{eq:control}$

Print (with Date)

If you have set the date and time on your camera, the date and time will be recorded and saved with each photo you take.

 In the PictBridge menu, select 「Print (with Date)」 and the screen as shown below appears.



Press the left/right arrow button to select a photo to be printed.

- Press the up/down arrow button to select the number of copies for the currently displayed photo.
- 4. Press the (SET) button and the following screen will appear.



5. Select 「Yes」 and press the (st) button to confirm; select 「Cancel」 to cancel printing.

Print (without Date)

Use this setting to print the photos without dates on them.

1. In the PictBridge menu, select \lceil Print (without Date) \rfloor and the screen as shown below appears.



- Press the left/right arrow button to select a photo to be printed.
- Press the up/down arrow button to select the number of copies for the currently displayed photo.
- 4. Press the $\ensuremath{\text{(SET)}}$ button and the following screen will appear.



5. Select \lceil Yes \rfloor and press the (set) button to confirm; select \lceil Cancel \rfloor to cancel printing.

Print Index

You can print all photos in the camera via this function.

1. In the PictBridge menu, select \lceil Print Index \rfloor and the screen as shown below appears.



2. Select \lceil Yes \rfloor and press the (st) button to confirm; select \lceil Cancel \rfloor to cancel printing.

Print DPOF Images

To use DPOF printing, you must select your photos for printing using the DPOF settings beforehand. See "DPOF" section on page 65.


In the PictBridge menu, select \(\times \) Print DPOF Images \(\times \) and the screen as shown below appears.



2. Select \lceil Yes \rfloor and press the (st) button to confirm; select \lceil Cancel \rfloor to cancel printing.

Exit

Select $\ \lceil$ Exit $\ \rfloor$ to exit the PictBridge menu. At this time, the message $\ \lceil$ Remove USB Cable! $\ \rfloor$ appears on the screen.



Disconnect the USB cable from the camera and printer.

Prompts and Warning Messages

Message	Description	Action
Warning! Battery exhausted.	The camera battery is used up. It is a warning indicating that the camera is going to shut down.	Replace with new batteries. The camera will shut down in 2 seconds.
Lens obstruction, Re-start Camera.	The lens is jammed or some foreign object is preventing the lens from functioning properly.	Turn off the camera and restart it to reset the lens.
Suggest using tripod.	When continuous exposure is enabled, this prompt message is displayed when the photo shooting screen is displayed for the first time.	The message will disappear after 2 seconds
Battery temperature is too high.	The battery temperature reaches 53.5°C.	Let the battery cool before attempting to use the camera again. The message will disappear after 2 seconds
Built-in memory error!	An error occurs in interal memory.	Try shutting down the camera and turning it on again. The message will disappear after 2 seconds
Slow shutter is on: may easily cause overexposure.	When the B shutter is on, the prompt appears on the screen after you go back to the photo shooting screen.	The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Improper alignment. Please try again.	The offset is too big for panorama shooting.	Retry taking the panoramic picture. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.

Message	Description	Action
Image cannot be saved, improper alignment. Please try again.	The saved panoramic pictures cannot be stitched.	Retry taking the panoramic picture. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Firmware update failed.	The camera cannot be updated during the firmware update process.	The camera will shut down in 2 seconds.
Firmware version mismatch.	The firmware version does not match during the firmware update process.	The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Warning! Do not turn off your camera during update!	The message appears during the firmware update process.	The message disappears after the camera update and restart.
Remove USB Cable!	Indicates that you can disconnect the USB cable.	The message disappears after you disconnect the USB cable.
Connection Failed!	Failure to connect to your PC, printer, TV (with HDMI).	Remove USB cable and retry connection

Message	Description	Action
Write Protect!	The SD card is locked.	Remove SD card and switch the lever on the side of card to UNLOCK. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Card Full!	Indicates that the SD card is full.	Replace SD card with another that has available memory. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Memory Full!	Indicates that the camera memory is full.	It disappears after 2 seconds.
Card Error!	During power-on, the SD card cannot be recognized or a read/write error occurs.	Format the SD card. WARNING: Formatting the SD card will erase all data on the card. Copy the data from the SD card to another storage, such as a computer. Otherwise, all data will be erased after the format. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Card is not formatted.	When an error occurs in the SD card, the message "Not Formatted" appears.	Format the SD card. WARNING: Formatting the SD card will erase all data on the card. Copy the data from the SD card to another storage, such as a computer. Otherwise, all data will be erased after the format. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Slow access	When a SD card lower than Class 4 is used to record a HD movie, the writting speed will be slower and recording will not continue.	Replace SD card with a higher Class over 4. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.

Exceeded maximum folder number.	This indicates that the SD card exceeded the maximum number of folders (999). This could cause a long read time during the camera's power up.	The message will disappear after 2 seconds.
Too many pictures for quick processing.	During the playback by date, the images exceed specifications so that it is not possible to play by date.	The message disappears after 2 seconds and the camera returns to the normal playback mode.
Unable to recognize files.	The format of the file to be viewed is not supported or the file is corrupted so it cannot be properly read.	This image message disappears only after the file is deleted.
No Picture!	When you press the play button, no image files exist in the camera or memory card.	The message disappears 2 seconds later to return to the photo shooting screen.
No continuous group file.	When you switch from the playback mode to continuous photo mode, there is no contiunous group file.	The message disappears after 2 seconds and the camera returns to the normal playback mode.
Protected! Undeletable!	The file is protected. The message appears when you delete it.	Remove SD card and switch the lever on the side of card to UNLOCK. Place back into the camera and try again. The message will disappear after 2 seconds.

Troubleshooting

Cannot write to the memory card	The SD memory card has been locked.	Release the write lock of the memory card or replace with another card.
	The camera may experience trouble recording HD movies to SD cards with a rating lower than Class 4.	Use an SD card with write Class higher than 4 to improve performance.
Too many movies to process	The number of pictures or folders in the SD memory card exceed the specifications, so the playback of data folder can not be displayed.	Delete unwanted files.
