
1 Getting Started


Outstanding features that your m536 digital camera has:



- Customized different scene shooting modes for more accurate and convenient picture taking.



. Inserting the Battery into the Camera

One Lithium Ion rechargeable battery is supplied with the product. For a detailed guideline on battery usage, please see "Using Your Battery" on page 108.

- 1. Open the camera battery door by pushing it outwards as illustrated.
- Insert the battery as shown, ensuring you follow the +/- signs correctly.
- Close the battery door by pressing it downwards and then sliding it towards the camera to lock.







Charging the Battery

After purchase and before use, charge the battery for 8 hours initially and about 2 hours for subsequent chargings.

 Install the battery as shown, and press the battery downwards onto the charger till you hear a click sound. Make sure the battery is securely seated in the battery slot.

Connect the plug to the charger as shown and connect the adapter to the household power outlet.



Battery Charge LED in Red	Charge is in progress.
Battery Charge LED in Green	Charge is complete.


NOTE:

The AC adapter will stop operation once the battery is fully charged. It is recommended to disconnect the AC adapter from the charger when the battery charge LED turns green.

Only use the supplied Lithium Ion rechargeable battery with the camera. This rechargeable battery should last for the life of the camera, but as is the case with all rechargeable batteries the actual charge held may decline with use. Should it ever become necessary to replace the rechargeable battery, please contact your distributor or visit www.polaroid-digital.com for more information on replacement or backup batteries.

• Turning the Camera On and Off

- Press and hold the button until the LCD screen is activated.
- Press the button again to turn the power off.



NOTE:

Pressing the button also powers on the camera. Pressing the button again switches to the capture mode for taking pictures.

Checking the Battery Level

Check the battery power level before taking pictures.


- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Check the battery power level that appears on the LCD screen.
- Battery power is full.Battery power is low.
- Battery power is exhausted. Please recharge the battery.

2 Camera Settings

• Checking Camera Status

Turn on the camera, view the camera's LCD screen to check which camera settings are active. Those particular features whose icons are not displayed are not activated.

Camera Modes

The camera has two working modes, Capture mode and Playback mode. Pressing the button switches between the Capture mode and Playback mode.



Capture Mode

Under this mode, you can record still images, video and audio clips. This mode allows selecting the image and video settings according to the shooting environment. For more details, refer to "Taking Pictures" on page 32, "Recording Video Clips" on page 50 and "Recording Audio Clips" on page 52.


Playback Mode

This mode allows the review, rotation, protection or deletion of pictures and video clips from the camera. You also can add your favorite sticker and a voice memo to a picture. For more details, please refer to "Managing Pictures and Video Clips" on page 54.

Capture Modes

The camera has three modes for recording still images, video clips and audio clips.

Pressing the button cycles through these three modes.



• How to Navigate Menus

Menus are used to select capture and play settings, as well as other camera settings like the Date/Time and Auto Power Off.



- 1. Press the or button to enter a menu bar and press it again to exit.
- 2. Press the and buttons to scroll left and right through the menu bar.



- 3. Press the and buttons to scroll up and down through menu options.
- 4. Press the button to enter a submenu or confirm your choice.

Setup Menu

You can change the basic settings of the camera in Capture mode and Playback mode

- 1. Press the button.
- 2. Press the or button to choose \square SETUP).
- 3. Press the button to enter the setup menu.
- 4. Press the button to exit the setup menu.





Adjusting the Beep Sound Volume

You can turn the beep sound on and off in the setup menu. When the beep sound is turned on, the camera will beep when you press the buttons.

- 1. Access the setup menu.
- 2. (SOUNDS) is the current selection.
- 3. Press the button.
- 4. "VOLUME" is the current selection.
- 5. Press the or button to select the desired setting
- 6. Press the button.
- 7. Press the button to exit the menu.





Selecting start-up Sound

- 1. Access the setup menu.
- 2. (SOUNDS) is the current selection.
- 3. Press the button.
- Press the button to select "START-UP SOUND".
- 5. Press the or button to select and listen to the desired start-up sound.
- 6. Press the button.
- 7. Press the button to exit the menu.
 - NOTE:
 This setting is also available in (Video) and (Playback) modes.





Selecting Auto Review Period

When the auto review feature is activated, the picture just taken will be shown on the LCD screen for a certain period.

- 1. Access the setup menu.
- Press the or button to select (AUTO REVIEW).
- 3. Press the button.
- Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the button.

The camera performs the following power save operation to conserve battery power.

The power save feature is not activated.

The camera is designed to go into sleep mode automatically to save battery life after the specified period of inactivity and will switch off after 1 minute inactivity.

Setting the file numbers in series for all taken picture on the internal memory or a memory card avoids the file name duplication when images are downloaded to a computer.

- 3. Press the button.
- 4. Press the or button to select the desired setting.

Choosing a Startup Image

A start-up animation image appears on the LCD screen for a few seconds when the camera is turned on.

You can choose a recorded image in your camera as your own startup image:

- 1. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- 2. Press the or button to select a desired image.
- 3. Press the button.
- 4. Press the or button to select (S.IMAGE).



- 6. Press the button.
- 7. Access the setup menu.
- 8. Press the or button to select (S.IMAGE).

The image that you choose will stored in directory as a startup image.

The startup image will not be deleted even if the original image is deleted or memory is formatted.

• Formatting the Internal Memory

Formatting the internal memory deletes all data stored in it.

- 1. Access the setup menu.
- Press the or button to select (FORMAT).
- 3. Press the button.
- 4. Press the button to exit the menu.







NOTE:

- Data deleted by a format operation is not recoverable. Make sure you do not have any useful data currently stored in the internal memory before you format it.
- Formatting the internal memory destroys all the pictures, even those are protected.
- With a memory card inserted, the above operation would format the inserted memory card only. The internal memory will not be formatted.

Resetting to Default Settings

You can easily change all the settings you made back to the camera default setting by the following steps.

Please refer to "Camera Default Settings" on page 107 for more details.

- 1. Access the setup menu.
- Press the or button to select (RESET ALL).



- 3. Press the button.
- 4. Press the or button to select "YES".
- 5. Press the button.





3 Taking Pictures

Before you take pictures, please read this note first:

NOTE:

NOTE:

Never remove the battery while a picture is being saved. Doing so will prevent the current picture from being saved and may corrupt other pictures already stored on the camera's internal memory or a memory card.

Taking Pictures in Normal Mode

Use this mode to capture subjects and make sure they are at least the distance from the taking lens as indicated below:

Wide Angle: 1.3 ft ~ Infinity (0.4 m ~ Infinity) Telephoto: 1.7 ft ~ Infinity (0.5 m ~ Infinity)

NOTE:

Most settings are saved by the camera when the power is turned off so that the same setting is automatically available when the power is turned on again. Make sure you verify your settings when turning the camera on again.

- 1. Set the camera to the Still Image mode.
- 2. Frame your subject using the LCD screen.

Press the Shutter button halfway to set the exposure and focus. The camera automatically detects the subject. The camera's focus mark is highlighted in green and the Auto Focus LED remains on when the camera's focus is locked on the subject.







- Capture mode by default.
- When the camera's focus mark is highlighted in red and the Auto Focus LED blinks, the subject is not in proper focus. Release the Shutter button, recompose the scene and press the Shutter button halfway to reset the focus.
- The LCD screen will show you the aperture value and shutter speed at which
 you take the picture.
- 4. Hold the camera steady and slowly press the shutter button down to take your image.

• Taking Pictures in Macro Mode

Use this mode to capture subjects this close to the lens:

Wide Angle: $0.32 \text{ ft} \sim 2.6 \text{ ft} (0.1 \text{ m} \sim 0.8 \text{ m})$ Telephoto: $0.3 \text{ ft} \sim 2.6 \text{ ft} (0.09 \text{ m} \sim 0.8 \text{ m})$

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button and the sicon appears on the LCD screen.
- 3. Capture procedures are the same as for taking a picture in the normal capture mode. See page 32.





• Taking Pictures in Different Scene Shooting Modes Select a mode that is suitable to your shooting conditions:

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button to show the scene shooting mode screen.

Setting Flash Mode

Flash Range for Normal mode:

Wide Angle: 1.3 ft \sim 8.0 ft (0.4 m \sim 2.4 m) Telephoto: 1.7 ft \sim 5 ft (0.5 m \sim 1.5 m)

Flash Range for Macro mode:

Wide Angle: $0.33 \text{ ft} \sim 2.7 \text{ ft } (0.1 \text{ m} \sim 0.8 \text{ m})$ Telephoto: $0.3 \text{ ft} \sim 2.7 \text{ ft } (0.09 \text{ m} \sim 0.8 \text{ m})$

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button to cycle through the flash settings and select the one you need. The icon (according to the flash setting you selected) will appear on the LCD screen.





The camera has five flash modes (default setting is Auto Flash). Use the flash when you take pictures at night, indoors, or outdoors in heavy shadows.

Display	Option	Description
4 A	Auto flash	The flash fires automatically as needed. Use this setting to take most pictures.
40	Red-eye Reduction	The flash fires for every picture. The flash fires multiple times before shooting to reduce red-eye phenomenon.
4	Flash On	The flash fires for every picture. Use this setting in high-contrast situations to provide fill-light or use it indoors in low light.
S \$	slow sync	The flash fires regardless of the surrounding brightness. In low light conditions, slow shutter speed provides better lighting of the background that is out of range of the flash.
③	Flash Off	The flash does not fire. Use this setting for outdoor pictures or where flash is prohibited or may be distracting. Also use when shooting toward a reflective surface, such as a window or mirror. If you do not have enough light when using this setting, your pictures will be too dark.



- Flash modes are only used in still image shooting.
 - · Never touch or block the flash with your fingers.

Setting Self-timer

Your camera is designed with a self timer function which will allow you to take pictures with a count down of 2 or 10 seconds.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Press the button repeatedly to cycle through the self-timer settings and select the one you need.

NOTE:

- · This feature is only available in Still Image mode.
- Place the camera on a flat surface or use a tripod when using the self-timer function.

• Taking Continuous Pictures

Continuous pictures mode lets you take up to 4 pictures in succession.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Press button repeatedly until the licon appears on the LCD screen.
- 3. Capture procedures are the same as for taking a picture in the normal capture mode. See page 32.



The flash is automatically disabled in the (Continuous) mode.





Zoom Feature

There are two types of zoom in this camera: optical zoom and digital zoom. Optical zoom alters the focal distance of the lens zoom, and its factor range is 1X to 3X. Digital zoom is activated after you reach the maximum optical zoom (3X). It enlarges the part of the image at the centre of the image screen. Digital zoom factor range is 1X to 4X. These zoom features let you zoom in the central area of an image and photograph only the enlarged portion of the picture.



- · Using the digital zoom may cause a decrease in image quality.
- Digital zoom feature is not available during the recording of video clips.


Turn Digital Zoom On/Off


- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (DIGITAL ZOOM).
- 4. Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- Press the button.



To Zoom In and Out

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the to zoom in the subject, or press the button to return to original zoom status. While you press the or wbuttons, a red square will show on the zoom status bar as illustrated. The red square in the bar indicates the zoom status. "T" stands for "Tele" and "W" stands for "Wide". Keep the button pressed, and the camera switches from optical zoom to digital zoom when it reaches the maximum optical zoom.
- 3. Now you can takes pictures and review them under the zoom setting you just made. The zoom setting will remain after pictures are taken. If you want to take a normal size picture, please use the w button.





. Setting the Image Size and Quality

Picture resolution refers to the number of pixels in a digital picture. Picture quality depends on the JPEG file compression that the camera applies when the picture is taken. Higher resolution and less compression make better quality which occupies more memory space. Smaller size pictures with normal quality are easier to email while larger size with fine quality are better for printing.

Resolution setting

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (RESOLUTION).



5. Press the button.



It is recommended to use the **5M** resolution for printing pictures.



Quality setting

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (QUALITY).
- 4. Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the 🕮 button.

• Setting Light Metering

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (METERING).
- Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the button
- NOTE:
 This setting is also available in (Video) mode.





Setting the Sharpness

Use the sharpness setting to highlight or blend the edges of subjects in pictures.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (SHARPNESS).



- Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the button.

Option	Description
L	Increases contrast on the edge of the picture. But noise may occur in the recording image.
L	The edges of the image are sharp, This is suitable for printing.
	Soften the edge of the picture, creating a "soft focus" effect

Setting the Photo Effect.

This setting allows control over the color tones and moods of a picture.

1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.

2. Press the button.

3. Press the or button to select (EFFECT).



- Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the button.

SEPIA	For taking pictures with a brown and antique look.

GREEN	For taking pictures with a greenish hue.

- This setting is available in Still Image and Playback modes
- The mosaic effect only can be set in Playback mode.

• Setting Date/Time, Display On/Off

Date and time are displayed on the picture by default. You can hide one or both of them by the following steps.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (DATE STAMP).
- 4. Press or button to select the desired setting.
- Press the button.



Setting White Balance

Selecting the right type of white balance can help to make the colour of a subject appear more natural under the type of lighting that is available.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select (WHITE BALANCE).



- 4. Press the or button to select the desired setting.

Setting the ISO

This function enables you to change the camera's sensitivity to light by selecting the different ISO values. ISO is a measure of how quickly your camera reacts to light. The higher the ISO value, the less light the camera needs to make an exposure, allowing the same exposure to be achieved with higher shutter speeds or smaller apertures. In a digital camera, higher ISO value allows higher shutter speed, at the expense of mottled or grain appearing in the final picture.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select "ISO".
- 4. Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the button.

AUTO

The camera's sensitivity is automatically changed by different lighting value or subject brightness.



In the same lighting condition, the higher the ISO value is, the faster the shutter speed will be.

Setting Exposure Compensation

You can adjust the exposure compensation value (EV) within the range of -2EV to +2EV in order to compensate for current lighting conditions. This setting can be used to obtain better results when shooting with backlighting, indirect indoor lighting, a dark background, and so on.

- 1. Set the camera to Still Image mode.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Press the or button to select "EXPOSURE".
- 4. Press the or button to select the desired setting.
- 5. Press the button.

- A higher EV value is better used for light-coloured and backlit subjects. A lower EV value is better for dark-coloured and shooting outdoors on a clear day.
 - When shooting under very dark or very bright conditions, you may not be able to obtain satisfactory results even if performing exposure compensation.

Use the Video mode to record video clips with audio. The Power / Auto Focus LED button blinks and the remaining time that can be recorded will increase in seconds while recording.

PictBridge is a new industry standard that allows you to print images directly from a PictBridge enable digital still camera to a PictBridge compatible printer without using a photo editing software or a computer.

Printing Procedures

1. Preparing the camera and the printer.

Printer	Refer to the user guide that comes with your printer and make preparations (paper, ink cassette, cartridge, etc.) as required.



NOTE:

If your batteries are low or exhausted, re-charge or replace them before you continue.

- 4. Select print settings.

5. Printing

Press the find button to start printing.

Cancelling Printing

Press the button to cancel printing the print job. The printer will stop printing and eject the paper.



Printing Errors

If for some reason an error occurs during or

before printing, press $\hfill \Box$ button to exit and reconfigure printing settings.







About DPOF

DPOF stands for "Digital Print Order Format", which is a format for recording on a memory card or other medium which digital camera images should be printed and how many copies of the image should be printed. You can print on a DPOF-compatible printer or at a professional print service from the memory card in accordance with the file name and number of copies settings recorded on the card.

With this camera, you should always select images by viewing them on the LCD screen. Do not specify images by file name without viewing the file contents.



IMPORTANT!

DPOF print settings can be configured for images on a memory card only, not for images in the camera's built-in memory.

Setting the DPOF:

- Insert an SD card into the camera.
- Turn on the camera.
- 3. Set the camera to (Playback mode).

8 Using the SD (Secure Digital) Card

Using the SD Card

Your camera comes with built-in flash memory for storing pictures and video clips. You can expand the memory using a commercially available SD card (up to 1 GB). The camera senses whether a memory card is inserted, and automatically saves pictures and video clips accordingly. Note that you cannot save pictures or video clips to the built-in flash memory while a memory card is installed in the camera.

See pages 101 to 105 for storage capacities.

Memory card precautions:

- 1. Use only an SD memory card with this camera.
- An electrostatic charge, electrical noise, and other phenomena can cause data corruption or even loss. Always make sure that you always back up important data on other media (MO disc, computer hard drive, etc.).
- If a memory card starts to behave abnormally, you can restore normal operation by formatting it. However, we recommend that you always take along with more than one memory card whenever using the camera far away from your home or office.
- 4. We recommend that you format a memory card when using it for the first time, or whenever the card you are using seems to be the cause of abnormal pictures. Remember to format a memory card if it was used in another digital camera or other devices.

MPORTANT!


- Make sure you turn off the camera before inserting or removing a memory card.
- Be sure to orient the card correctly when inserting it. Never try to force a memory card into the slot when you feel resistance.
- SD memory cards have a write protection switch that you can use to protect
 files from accidental deletion. However, you must remove the write protection
 whenever you want to record new files onto it, format it, or delete its files.
- Files contained in the SD card recorded by other cameras may conflict with the m536 camera, and valuable data in your existing SD card may be distorted or lost when the card is inserted in the m536 camera. We strongly recommend the user to use a NEW or formatted SD card for the m536 camera. The manufacturer is not liable for losing or corrupting any valuable data or files in your SD card due to improper operation.
- As tests prove, the m536 works best with popular brands of memory cards such as SanDisk, Panasonic, Lexar and TOSHIBA. Consider using these cards for best performance.

Inserting a SD card

- 1. Turn off the camera.
- 2. Open the SD card door by pushing it outwards as illustrated.
- Insert the SD card and ensure the card is inserted the correct position as illustrated.
- Close the SD card door by pressing it downwards and then slide it back to lock.







The $\frac{1}{\pi}$ icon will appear on the LCD screen when a SD card is inserted into the camera.

Removing the SD card

To remove the SD card, turn off your camera and open the SD card door. Gently push the SD card inwards and then release it. The SD card will eiect out of the SD card slot.









IMPORTANT!

- Never insert any other object into the camera's SD card slot. Doing so creates the risk of damage to the camera and card.
 - Should water or any foreign objects ever get into the card slot, immediately turn off the camera, remove the battery or disconnect the AC adapter, and contact your dealer or the nearest service provider.
 - Never remove a card from the camera while the camera is powered on. Doing so can cause the picture or video recording operation to fail, and even damage the memory card.

Formatting a SD card

Formatting a memory card erases all data stored on it, including the protected ones. Removing the SD card during formatting may damage the card.

- 1. Insert an SD card into the camera.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- 3. Access the setup menu.
- Press the or button to select (FORMAT).
- 5. Press the button.
- 6. Press the button.







IMPORTANT!

- SD cards formatted in another camera, computer or other devices may not work properly. It is recommended to format SD cards with your m536 camera.
 - Note that data deleted by formatting operation cannot be recovered. Make sure you do not have any useful data currently stored on a memory card before you format it.

• Copying Pictures, Video and Audio Clips to Memory Card

This setting allows you to copy pictures, video and audio clips stored in the internal memory to a memory card.

- 1. Insert an SD card into the camera.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- Set the camera to (Playback mode).
- 4. Press the button.
- 5. Press the or button to select (COPY TO CARD).
- 6. Press the or button to select the desired setting.





- 5. All the pictures, video and audio clips are in the directory folder. Highlight the pictures, video and audio clips and drag them to a folder of your choice. You can also create sub folders to group them or use the Arcsoft software to edit and manage the pictures.

For Mac user, directly plug-in the camera, no need to install the driver.

- 1. Turn on the camera
- 2. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Connect the camera to Mac via the USB cable, the systems will automatically recognize the MASS STORAGE drive. (System will automatically create a Mass Storage named "INTERNAL" / "EXTERNAL")
