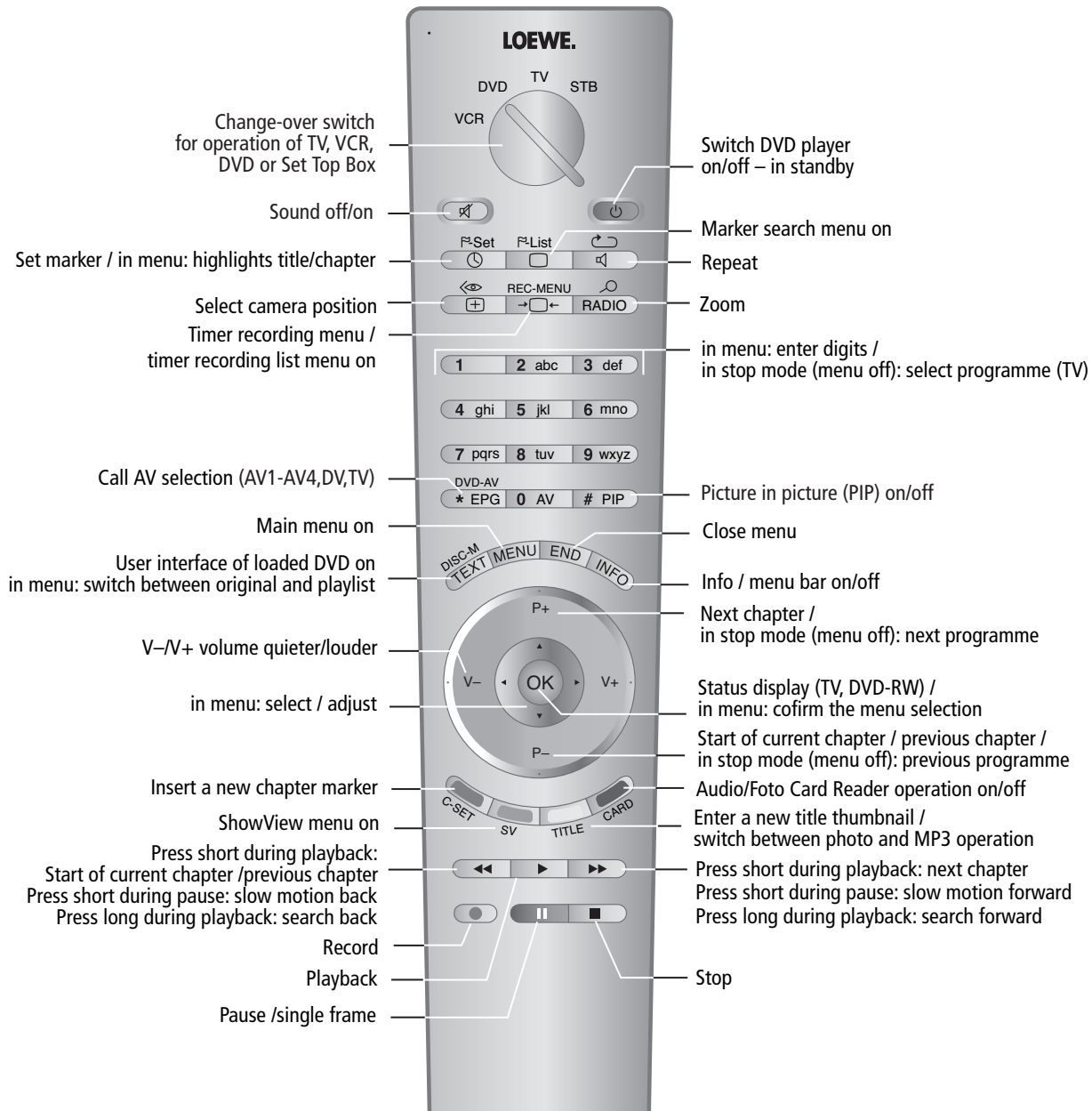


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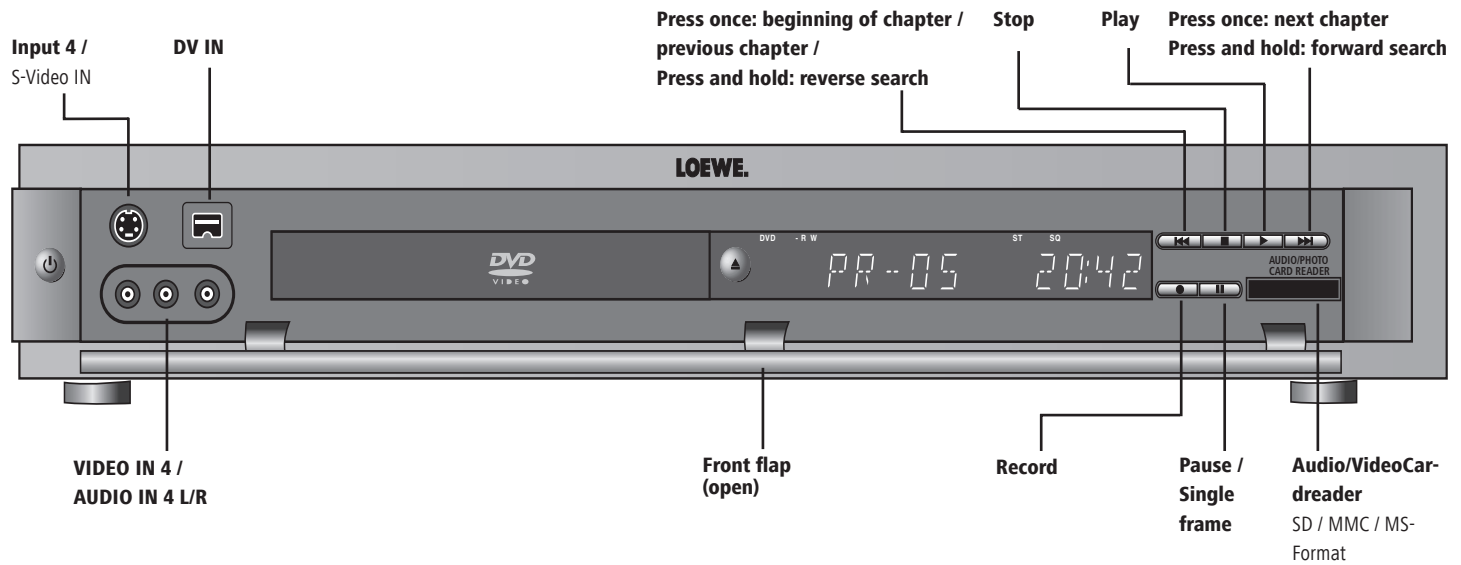
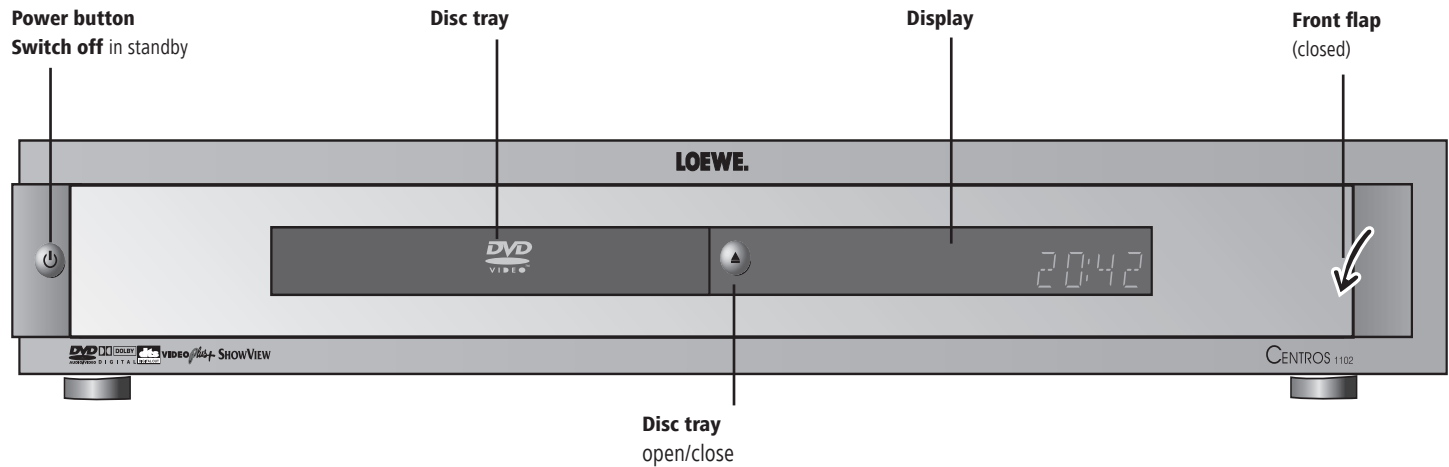
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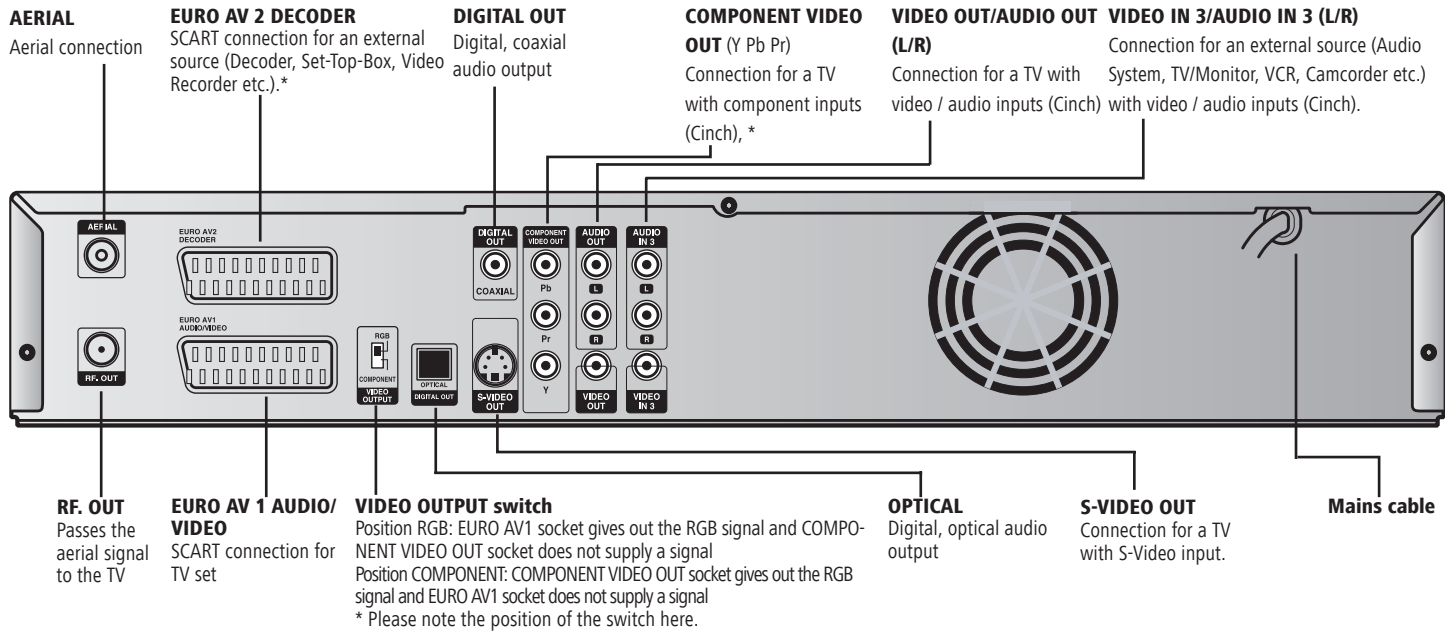
Remote control RC3 – DVD operation



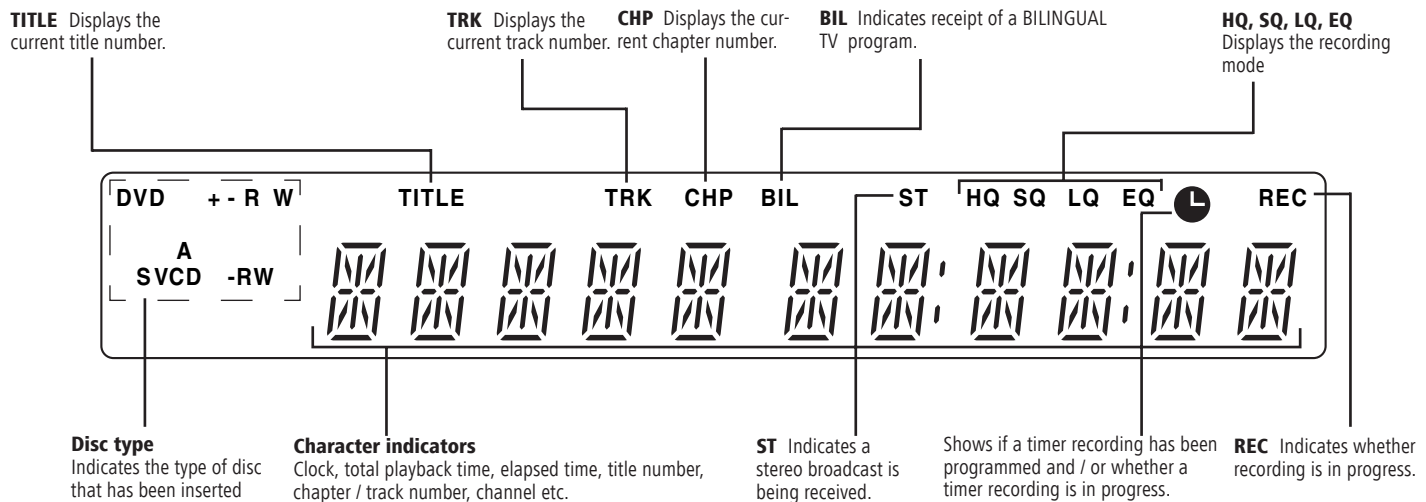
Centros Front Panel

You can use the remote control to operate four units: as well as this DVD recorder, a Loewe television, a Loewe video recorder and a set-top box (STB).

Set up

- Place the DVD recorder on a firm, level base.
- Do not place the DVD recorder in the vicinity of sources of intense heat or in direct sunlight.
- When installing in a cabinet or enclosed shelf: Leave about 2.5cm free space around the DVD player for unhindered air circulation to prevent build-up of heat.

- There can be interference to the images and sound of any nearby television, video recorder or radio. If this occurs, do not place the unit near to a television, video recorder or radio, or switch the unit off after removing the disc.
- Install the DVD recorder where there is nothing to obstruct the remote control's infrared signal from reaching the DVD recorder display.
- Do not place strong artificial light sources in front of the device. This may affect infrared reception.
- If there is an electrical storm, disconnect the antenna and mains plug. Power surges caused by lightning strikes can damage the unit through the antenna system or the mains.
- The antenna and mains should also be disconnected if the unit is to remain unsupervised for a long period of time.
- The mains plug must be easily accessible so that the unit can be disconnected at any time.
- Lay the cable in such a way that it cannot get damaged. The power cable should not be kinked or laid over sharp edges, not stood upon or exposed to chemicals - the latter also applies to the device as a whole. A mains cable with damaged insulation can cause electric shocks and is a fire hazard.
- When removing the power plug, pull the body of the plug, and not the cable. Otherwise, the wires in the plug could get damaged and cause a short circuit the next time it is plugged in.

Disposal

Cardboard box and packaging

You have opted for a durable and technically sophisticated product. In line with national regulations regarding the disposal of packaging materials, we pay a fee to authorised recyclers who collect packaging from dealers. However, we recommend that you keep the original cardboard box and the rest of the packaging materials so that the unit can, if necessary, be transported in the safest possible conditions.

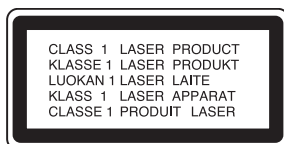
Cleaning

- Only clean your DVD recorder with a damp, soft, clean cloth (with no aggressive cleaning agents).
- If DVD recorder fails to read the disc correctly, the reader unit in the device may be soiled. Use a commercially-available cleaning disc.
- Always keep the disc drawer closed to prevent dust getting into the drawer and onto the lens.

For your safety

For your own safety and to avoid unnecessary damage to your unit, please read and follow the safety advice below:

- This DVD recorder is only to be used for receiving, displaying and playing visual and sound signals.
- Switch off your DVD system (Centros, TV and any other audio components which may be connected) before connecting or disconnecting other devices or speakers.



- Do not open up the housing, or you could be directly exposed to the laser beam. The laser beam will be visible if the unit is open. DO NOT LOOK INTO THE LASER BEAM.

Protect your DVD recorder from ...

- liquids and damp
- shock and mechanical stress
- magnetic and electrical fields
- cold, heat, direct sunlight and extreme fluctuations in temperature
- dust
- anything which obstructs ventilation
- manual interference with the unit's interior

Your Centros has only been designed for use in a domestic environment. The warranty covers this normal use of the DVD recorder.

PLEASE NOTE: TO AVOID RISK OF ELECTRICAL SHOCK, DO NOT REMOVE THE COVER (OR THE REAR OF THE UNIT). THERE ARE NO PARTS INSIDE THE UNIT THAT CAN BE REPAIRED BY THE USER. REPAIRS SHOULD ONLY BE CARRIED OUT BY A LOEWE DEALER.

If you have moved the DVD recorder from a cold to a warm environment, leave it to stand for about an hour because of the risk of condensation building up. Do not switch it on until it has reached room temperature. This will avoid seriously damaging the components.

Read this operating manual, and experiment with your new equipment's features so that you are familiar with it.

Advantages of connection to a Loewe TV set

You can use **Digital Link** to install the DVD recorder e.g. in an enclosed rack or a wall unit, without there being direct visible contact with the DVD recorder. Using the DVD remote control, you can operate the DVD recorder via the Loewe television. To do this, Digital Link must be switched on at the DVD recorder (see page 17).

If you want to make timer recordings from the satellite tuner in the television, the recording is controlled by Digital Link.

Digital Link Plus enables channel data to be transferred from the television's satellite and cable channels to the DVD recorder, so that the same channels appear in the same channel position. This means that timer recordings of satellite and cable channels can easily be programmed from the television using the EPG (Electronic Program Guide). The timer data is copied to the DVD recorder, which then, independently of the television, carries out the timer recording. With timer data for satellite stations, the television starts and stops the DVD recorder and sets it to the Euro AV 1 input. If playback begins, this is immediately shown on the television, no matter which TV channel you are currently watching (if the television is switched off, it will automatically switched on).

Essential Information

Writable Discs



DVD-RW (Digital Video Disk - ReWritable)

These discs can be written to several times. Recordings can be deleted and the disc can then be rewritten.



DVD-R (Digital Video Disk - Recordable)

These discs can be written to only once. Following finalisation a DVD-R disc can no longer be written to or edited.



DVD+ReWritable

DVD+RW (Digital Video Disk + ReWritable)

These discs can be written to several times. Recordings can be deleted and the disc can then be rewritten.



DVD+R

DVD+R (Digital Video Disk + Recordable)

These discs can be written to only once. Following finalisation a DVD+R disc can no longer be written to or edited.

Notes:

- This recorder cannot write to CD-R or CD-RW discs.
- DVD-R/RW, DVD+R/RW and CD-R/RW discs written to using a PC or a DVD or CD recorder cannot be played if the disc is damaged or dirty or if there is condensation on the recorder's lens.
- If you record a disc using a PC, even if it is in a compatible format, the disc may not play depending on the settings of the application software used to create the disc. (Further information can be obtained from the software provider.)

In addition this unit can play DVD-R/DVD-RW discs, DVD+R/DVD+RW discs, CD-R/CD-RW discs containing audio titles, MP3* or JPEG files, SVCD and Kodak picture CDs.

Notes:

- Depending on the recording unit or the CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/±RW) disc itself, some CD-R/RW (or DVD±R/±RW) discs cannot be played with this unit.
- Do not attach any labels to either side (the labeled side or the written side) of a disc.
- Do not use any irregularly shaped CDs (e.g. heart-shaped or octagonal). If you use these discs malfunctions may occur.

Regional code of the DVD recorder and DVDs



This DVD recorder can only play Region "2" or "all" coded DVDs. The region code on the label of some DVDs shows which type of DVD

recorder can play those discs. If you play other discs the error message "Incorrect region code. Playback not possible." will be displayed on the TV screen.

Some discs may not have the label with the region code even though they cannot be played in all regions.

Notes on DVDs and Video CDs: Some DVDs and Video CD playback functions can be programmed in a particular way by some software manufacturers. As this unit plays DVDs and Video CDs as they have been designed by the software manufacturer, some playback functions may not be available whilst other additional functions may be available. Further information can be found in the instructions supplied with the DVDs and Video CDs. The unit may not be able to play some DVDs made for specific business purposes.

Essential Information

Disc-related Terms

Title (DVD only)

A title is the main film content or the content of the accompanying feature or the music album. Each title has a title number enabling you to locate it easily.

Chapter (DVD only)

Chapters are sections of a film or a piece of music that are smaller than a title. A title consists of one or several chapters. Each chapter has a chapter number to enable you to locate the desired chapter. Depending on the disc, chapters may not be labeled.

Track (Video CD or Audio CD only)

Sections of a film or a piece of music on a Video CD or an Audio CD. Each track has a track number to enable you to find the desired track.

Scene

On a Video CD with PBC (Playback Control) functions, moving pictures and still pictures are divided into sections that are called "scenes". Each scene is displayed in the scene menu and has a scene number to enable you to find the scene quickly. A scene consists of one or more tracks.

Types of Video CDs

There are two types of Video CDs:

Video CDs equipped with PBC (Version 2.0)


PBC (Playback Control) functions enable you to interact with the system via menus, search functions or other typical computer operations. In addition high-resolution still pictures can be displayed if they are available on the disc.

Video CDs not equipped with PBC (Version 1.1)

These discs are operated in the same way as Audio CDs and allow playback of video pictures and sound. They are not however equipped with PBC.

Symbols

The symbol on the screen

During operation "" may appear on the screen. This symbol means that the desired function is not currently available on this disc.

Disc symbols in the operating instructions

If part of the operating instructions contains one of the symbols listed below, the section is only applicable to the disc shown on the symbol.

Many functions of this recorder are dependent on the selected recording quality. One or more of the symbols (*DVD*, *Video*, *+RW*, *MP3*) are displayed for each function described in the manual so that you can immediately see whether the disc supports this function.

The finalized DVD disc is a DVD-Video disc.

DVD-R and DVD-RW discs

How are DVD-R and DVD-RW discs different?

The essential difference between a DVD-R and a DVD-RW disc is the fact that a DVD-R disc can only be written to once, whilst a DVD-RW disc can be written to several times. In addition, its content can be deleted. You can write to and delete a DVD-RW disc approx. 1000 times.

Playback of writable discs on normal DVD players

DVD-R discs and DVD-RW discs written to in Video mode can be played on some normal DVD players. They must however be finalized first. This process fixes the content of the disc so that it can be read by other DVD players as a DVD-Video disc.

Essential Information

What are “Recording Modes”?

This recorder offers two recording modes: VR mode and Video mode. Recordings on DVD-R discs are always in Video mode. Recordings on DVD-RW discs can be in either VR or Video mode.

DVD-R and DVD-RW Discs

VR Mode Recording

- 4 possible picture quality/recording time settings (EQ, LQ, SQ, HQ), see page 24.
- Cannot be played on normal DVD players.
- Recordings can be comprehensively edited.
- Use of original lists and playlists (see page 48 and 49).

Video Mode Recording

- 4 possible picture quality/recording time settings (EQ, LQ, SQ, HQ), see page 24.
- Can be played on normal DVD players (after finalization)
- Limited editing functions.

Note: The “Video mode” DVD-Video format is a new format for recording on DVD-R/RW discs that was approved by the DVD Forum in 2000. For this reason you may experience problems playing writable DVD discs on some players. Symptoms include video artifacts, audio and/or video dropout and playback stopping suddenly. Our company cannot take any responsibility for problems playing discs recorded on this recorder on other players.

Use of “Original” and “Playlist”

Throughout this manual you will often see the words “Original” and “Playlist” used to describe the actual content and the edited version.

- **Original:** Content refers to what is actually recorded on the disc.
- **Playlist:** Content refers to the edited version of the disc, i.e. how the original content should be played.

DVD+R and DVD+RW Discs

Recording on DVD+RW Discs

- 4 possible picture quality/recording time settings (EQ, LQ, SQ, HQ), see page 24.
- Can be played on many DVD players that support the +RW format (where appropriate, only after finalization).
- Titles/chapters of recordings can be edited.
- Edited content can only be played after finalization on some DVD players.

Recording on DVD+R Discs

- 4 possible picture quality/recording time settings (EQ, LQ, SQ, HQ), see page 24.
- Can be played on many DVD players that support the +R format (where appropriate, only after finalization).
- Limited editing of titles/chapters.
- Edited content cannot be played on normal DVD players. (Hide, combined chapters, added chapter markers etc.).

DVD Recordings

Note: Fingerprints and scratches on the disc can affect playback and/or recording. Take proper care of your discs.

Disc Types and Recording Formats, Modes and Settings

This recorder can play five different types of DVD disc:

- DVD-Video disc
- DVD-RW disc
- DVD-R- disc
- DVD+RW disc
- DVD+R- disc.

A DVD-R disc is always formatted in “Video Format” - the same as prerecorded DVD-Video discs, i.e. after finalization you can play a DVD-R disc on a normal DVD player.

“Video Recording Format” (VR) is the default format for a DVD-RW disc. If required, the disc can be changed to Video format through subsequent reformatting (“Disc → Formatting” in the main menu) (Caution! The contents of the disc will be erased).

The recording quality is closely related to the formatting.

Essential Information

If the disc format is Video Recording format, the recording mode for the disc is referred to as „VR mode“. However, the recording mode of a Video format disc is referred to as „Video mode“ (Exception: a prerecorded DVD-Video disc which is not recordable has no recording mode).

The recording modes determine the recording and editing options for the whole disc. Amongst other things they determine the picture quality and how much space the recording will take up on the disc.

Notes on Recording

- The displayed recording time is not exact as the recorder uses variable bit-rate video compression. This means that the exact recording time will depend on the material that is being recorded.
- When recording a television broadcast the recording time may be shorter if the reception is poor or the picture contains interference.
- If you record only still pictures or audio, the recording time may be shorter.
- The displayed recording time and remaining time may not always add up to the total length of the disc.
- The available recording time may be shorter following intensive editing of the disc.
- If you use a DVD-RW disc, make sure you select the recording format (Video mode or VR mode) before you start recording. See page 25 (Formatting) for more information.
- If you use a DVD-R disc you can continue recording until the disc is full or until you finalize it. Before you start recording check how much recording time is available on the disc.
- If you use a DVD-RW disc in Video mode, the available recording time will increase if you delete the last title recorded on the disc.
- The „Delete Title“ function in the „Title List-Original“ menu only hides the title, it does not however delete it from the disc and does not therefore increase the recording time (except if you delete the last recorded title on a DVD-RW disc in Video mode).
- Overwrite recording is only possible on DVD+RW discs.

Recording TV-Audio Channels

This recorder can also record NICAM audio. If the NICAM setting (page 20) is set to "Auto", NICAM audio will be recorded in the case of a NICAM transmission.

Restrictions on Video Recording

- You cannot record any copy-protected film material with this recorder. Copy-protected video includes DVD-Video discs and some satellite transmissions. If copy-protected material is encountered during recording, recording is paused or stopped automatically and an error message appears on the screen.
- Video that can only be copied once can only be recorded using a DVD-RW disc in VR mode with CPRM (see below).
- NTSC format signals from analog or DV inputs cannot be recorded correctly with this recorder.
- SECAM format video signals (from an integrated TV tuner or from analog inputs) are recorded in PAL format.

CPRM

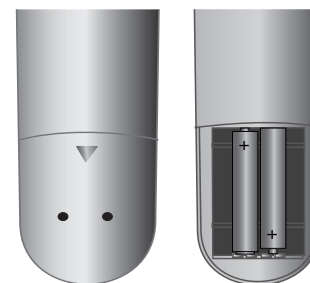
CPRM is a copy protection system (with scramble system) that only allows the recording of "copy once" broadcasts. CPRM is the abbreviation for "Content Protection for Recordable Media".

This recorder is CPRM compatible. You can therefore record copy-once broadcasts but cannot make copies of these recordings. CPRM recordings are only possible with VR mode formatted DVD-RW discs and can only be played on players with CPRM compatibility.

Copyright

- The recording equipment should only be used for lawful copying. You should find out what constitutes lawful copying in the country in which you are making a copy. Copying of copyrighted material e.g. films or music is only lawful if permitted by a legal exception or consented to by the rights owner.
- The product contains copyright protection technology that offers protection through certain US patents and other intellectual property rights and is the property of the Macrovision Corporation and other companies. It is only intended for private or other limited use unless otherwise authorized by the Macrovision Corporation. Reverse engineering and disassembly are prohibited.

Initial Remote Control Setup





To insert or change the batteries, press on the imprinted arrow. Slide off and remove the battery compartment cover. Insert alkaline-manganese LR 03 (AAA) type batteries and make sure the + and – poles are aligned correctly. Then, replace the cover.

Resetting the DVD Recorder

If any of the following problems occur...

- The unit is plugged in but will not turn on or off.
- The display panel does not work.
- The DVD recorder is not functioning normally.

..., the DVD recorder can be reset in the following way:

- Hold the  button down for at least 5 seconds. The unit will switch off. Press the  button again to switch the unit back on.
- or unplug the power cable, wait at least 20 seconds and plug the cable back in.

Initial Installation

Shipping the Unit

The original shipping box and packaging materials should be used to ship the unit. To give the unit the best possible protection, repack it as it was originally packed by the manufacturer.

Notes on Discs

Handling Discs

Do not touch the prerecorded side of the disc. Hold the disc at the edges so as not to touch the surface with your fingers. Do not stick paper or tape to either side of the disc.

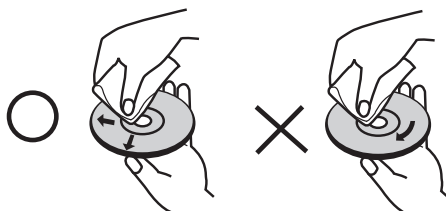


Storing Discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or a source of heat and never leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight as there may be a considerable increase in temperature inside the car.

Cleaning Discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can affect the picture and sound quality. Clean the disc before playing it with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center outwards.



Do not use any strong solvents such as alcohol, benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners or anti-static sprays intended for vinyl records.

Connections - General

Notes:

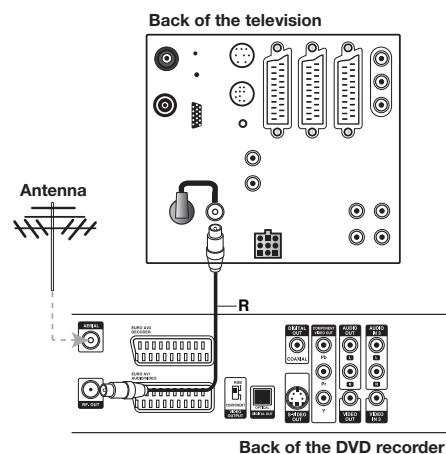
- Depending on your television set and the other units you want to connect, there are several ways of connecting your recorder to your TV set. Only use the connection methods described below.
- Refer as necessary to the manuals for your television, DVD recorder, stereo system and other units in order to make the best possible connections.

Caution:

- The DVD recorder must be connected directly to the television. Tune the television to the correct video input channel.
- Do not connect the DVD recorder AUDIO OUT socket to the audio system Phono In socket.

Connecting to the Aerial

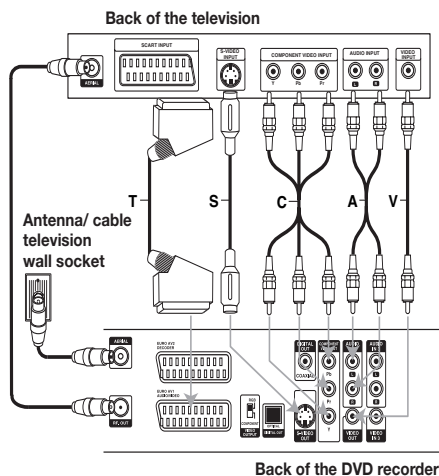
Remove the existing aerial cable plug (for terrestrial or cable televisions) from the television and plug it into the aerial socket on the back of the DVD recorder ("AERIAL" socket). Plug one end of the supplied aerial cable into the TV socket on the DVD recorder ("RF. OUT") and the other end into the aerial socket on the television.



Initial Installation

Connecting to the Television

Make one of the following connections depending on the functionality of your existing equipment.



SCART Connection (e.g. Loewe TV)

Connect the EURO AV1 AUDIO/VIDEO Scart socket on the DVD recorder to the corresponding input socket on the television using Scart cable (T).

Video Connection

Connect the VIDEO OUT socket on the DVD player to the Video input socket on the television using Video cable (V).

S-Video Connection

Connect the S-VIDEO OUT socket on the DVD player to the S-Video input socket on the television using S-Video cable (S).

Component Video Connection

Connect the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT socket on the DVD recorder to the corresponding input socket on the television using a Y Pb Pr cable (C).

Audio Connection (Left/Right)

Connect the left and right AUDIO OUT sockets on the DVD recorder to the left and right IN sockets on the television using the audio cable (A).

What is "Digital Out"?

If your Loewe TV set has an AC3 module or a DIS module you should connect to with the DVD recorder using Digital Audio. Connect the DIGITAL OUT socket on the DVD recorder to the DIGITAL IN socket on the TV set. Then assign the AV socket on the TV set to the DIGITAL IN socket using the TV menu SETTINGS → AV-SETTINGS → AUDIO DIGITAL.

Note: If you use the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT connections, switch the VIDEO OUTPUT switch to COMPONENT. If you use the SCART socket, switch the VIDEO OUTPUT switch to RGB.

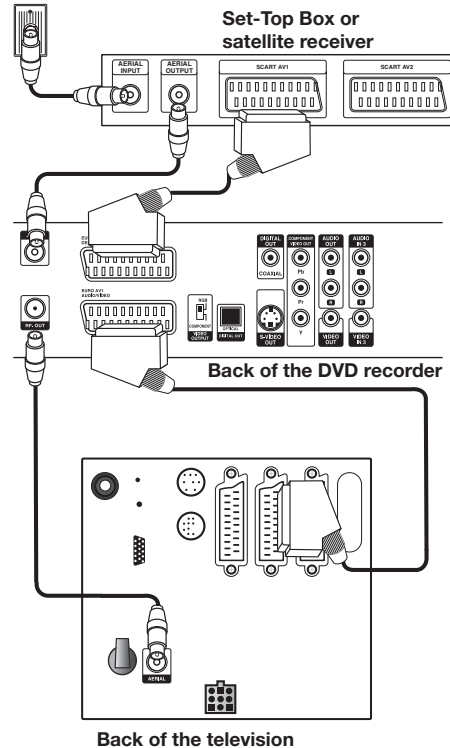
Connecting to a Set Top Box / Satellite Receiver

If you use a cable or satellite receiver with integrated decoder, connect it to your recorder and television set as described below. If you use a separate decoder box for your cable/satellite television, follow the instructions in the next section "Connecting to an External Decoder Box".

1. Connect the aerial cable as shown. This enables you to watch and record TV channels.
2. Connect the EURO AV1 AUDIO/VIDEO socket to a EURO AV socket on your television using the SCART cable. This enables you to watch discs.
3. Connect the EURO AV2 DECODER socket to the EURO AV socket on your Set Top Box / satellite receiver using a SCART cable. This enables you to watch the TV channels.

Notes: This recorder is equipped with a „Loop-Through“ function. This function enables you to record a television broadcast from this recorder's integrated TV tuner whilst watching a satellite or Set Top Box channel (see page 43). Do not connect the recorder „via“ your video recorder, satellite receiver or Set Top Box.

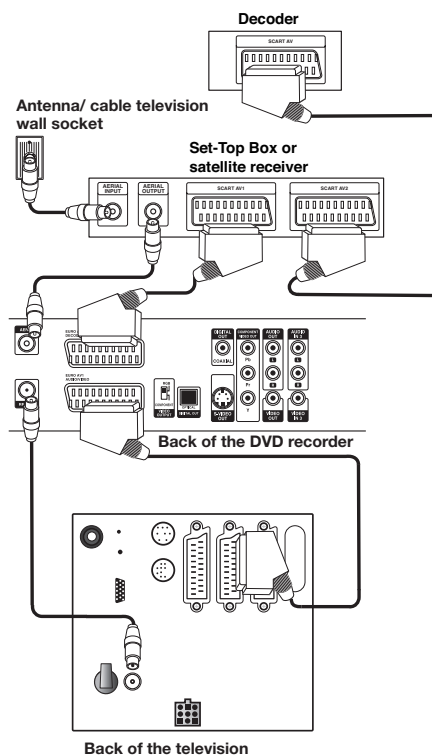
Connecting to an External Decoder Box

If you use an external decoder box for your satellite or cable TV system, follow the connection procedure described below.

1. Connect your aerial socket in the wall to the aerial input socket on your Set Top Box / satellite receiver using an aerial cable.
2. Connect the decoder to the EURO AV DECODER socket on the Set Top Box /satellite receiver using a SCART cable. Further instructions can be found in the manual for your decoder box.
3. Connect the EURO AV2 socket on the DVD recorder to a EURO AV socket on your Set Top Box / satellite receiver using a SCART cable.
4. Connect the EURO AV1 socket on the DVD recorder to a EURO AV socket on your television using the SCART cable.

Caution:

- Do not connect the decoder box directly to your recorder.
- Information from the decoder (e.g. about Pay TV services) can only be viewed if the recorder is switched off (standby mode).
- For timer recordings to work properly on this recorder, the satellite / Set Top Box must also be switched on during recording.
- With this configuration you cannot watch one television broadcast and record another at the same time.



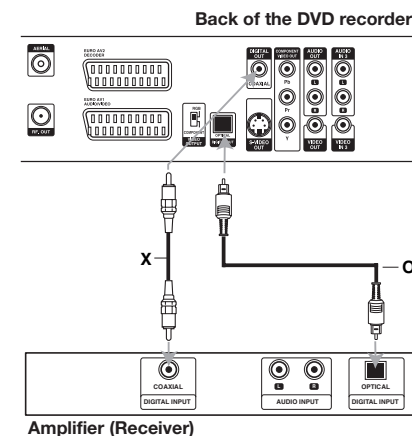
Connecting to an Amplifier

Connecting to an amplifier equipped with analog 2 channel stereo or Dolby Pro Logic II / Pro Logic

Connect the left and right AUDIO OUT sockets on the DVD recorder to the left and right AUDIO IN sockets on the amplifier, receiver or stereo system using the audio cable (A).

Connecting to an amplifier equipped with two channel digital stereo (PCM) or to an Audio/Video receiver equipped with a multi-channel decoder (Dolby Digital™, MPEG 2 or DTS).

1. Connect one of the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT sockets (OPTICAL **O** or COAXIAL **X**) on the DVD recorder to the corresponding input socket on your amplifier. Use the appropriate digital audio cable (Optical **O** or Coaxial **X**).
2. You must configure the digital output of the recorder (see "Audio" on page 22).



Digital Multi-Channel Sound

A digital multi-channel connection offers the best sound quality. For this you need a multi-channel Audio/Video receiver that supports one or more audio formats e.g. MPEG 2, Dolby Digital and DTS. More information can be found in the receiver manual and on the logos on the front of the receiver.

Caution: Due to the DTS licensing agreement the digital output will be to DTS Digital Out when a DTS audio stream is selected.

Notes:

- If the audio format of the digital output does not

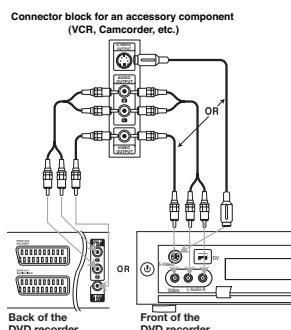
correspond to the capabilities of your receiver, the receiver will emit a strong distorted sound or no sound at all.

- 5.1 digital surround sound via the digital connection can only be obtained if your receiver is equipped with a digital multi-channel decoder.
- You can obtain information about the audio format of the current DVD via the "Disc Info" menu (see page 28 and 33).
- This recorder does not perform internal (2-channel) decoding (downmix) of a DTS sound track. To enjoy DTS multi-channel surround sound, you must connect this recorder to a DTS compatible receiver via one of the recorder's digital audio outputs.

Connecting to Audio/Video (A/V) Accessories

Connect the DVD recorder's input sockets (AV3 = AUDIO IN 3 / VIDEO IN 3 on the back of the unit or AV4 = input 4 on the front of the unit (see page 4)) to the audio/video out sockets on the accessory component using audio/video cables.

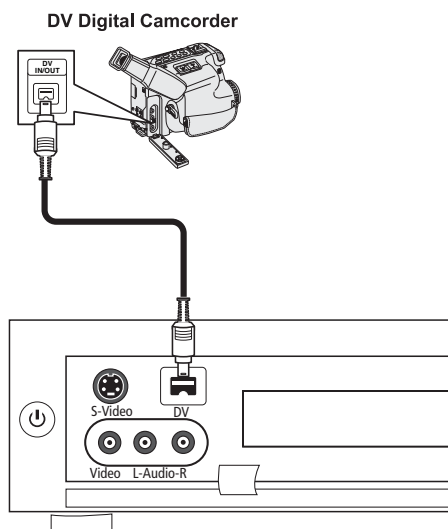
Note: If you use the S-VIDEO IN socket on the front panel, the VIDEO IN socket on the front panel cannot be used.



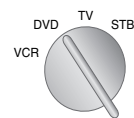
Connecting to a Digital Camcorder

You can connect a digital camcorder (DV) or a digital DVD-R/RW recorder to the DV IN socket on the front panel and digitally transfer the content of DV tapes or DVD-/RW discs onto DVD-R/RW discs. Use a DV cable (not supplied) to connect the DV IN/OUT socket on your camcorder/video deck to the DV IN socket on the front panel of this recorder.

Note: Only DV units can be connected to this socket (The source signal must be in the DV-25 format; see page 46 and 47). It is not compatible with digital satellite tuners or S-VHS video decks.



Basic Settings



Set the rotating switch on the remote control to DVD mode.



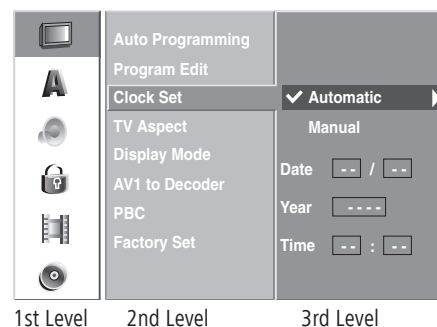
Push the On/Off button on the DVD recorder or ...



... the On/Off switch on the remote control.

The menu system offers several ways of changing settings. Most menus consist of three levels for setting up options. If you press **MENU**, only the first and second levels of the menu system are displayed on the screen. You can display the third level by pressing "▶". When navigating in the menus, "▶" on the right side of the menu tab shows you that the next level can be called up.

In this operating manual the RC3 remote control arrow keys are represented as follows:



The arrows correspond to "▲▼◀▶" in the text. The OK function is represented as "OK" in the text.

Activating Digital Link

With Digital Link, Loewe TV sets pass on the remote control signals to Centros via the Euro-AV connection. Digital Link is useful if you want to install Centros in a concealed place, e.g. in a closed rack.

Centros must be switched on. Press the key **on Centros** for > 3 secs. "LINK" appears briefly in the Centros display.
- Switching off Digital Link.
Centros must be switched on. Press the key **on Centros** for > 3 secs. "FRONT" appears briefly in the Centros display.

Automatic Programming

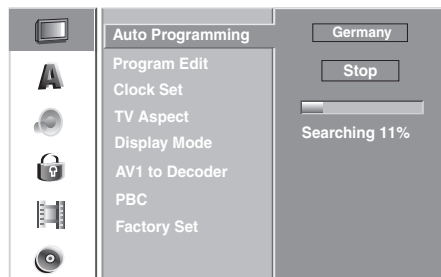
This DVD recorder is fitted with a tuner capable of receiving up to 88 channels.

Note: The channel is set automatically when using Digital Link Plus.

Preparation:

Connect the DVD recorder to the aerial system. See "Connecting to the Aerial" on page 13.

1. Press **MENU**.
The menu is displayed.
2. Select the "General" option with ▲ / ▼.
3. Press ▶ to call up the second level.
4. Select the "Auto Programming" option with ▲ / ▼.
5. Press ▶ to call up the third level. The country option is highlighted.
6. Select a country with ▲ / ▼ and press ▶.
The "Start Search" symbol is highlighted.
7. Press **OK** to start the program search.
The tuner cycles automatically through all available channels and transfers all programs found to the tuner's memory.



Digital Link Plus

If you have connected the DVD recorder to a Loewe TV set with Digital Link Plus or a comparable system from another manufacturer (e.g. EasyLink, Mega Logic, Project 50), the program list will be transferred from the television set to the DVD recorder. This takes place when you register the DVD recorder with the TV set, or when you make any changes to the programs on the TV set (re-sorting, deleting, adding). After a change of this sort, the TV set will ask you to start transferring the changed program list.

The DVD recorder detects a connected TV set with Digital Link Plus or a similar system from another manufacturer and adjusts the DVD recorder accordingly. This means that you cannot search for, delete or sort TV programs on the DVD recorder. The menu items are grayed out; during the automatic search it is only possible to transfer the program information from the TV set.

Note that all programs that you receive via aerial or cable must be stored in program numbers 1 to 88 on the TV set.

If the TV set does not ask you to transfer the program information, then start the transfer on the DVD recorder.

If your TV set is equipped with Digital Link Plus or with a comparable system from another manufacturer, only carry out program changes on the TV set.

If the TV set that you have connected to the DVD recorder does not have Digital Link Plus or a comparable system, then you should harmonize the DVD recorder and TV set program lists. This will help you to find programs on the TV set and DVD recorder.

Edit program

PAL/SECAM (with Centros 1172): Changes the receiver standard. If there is interference with the image, use ◀ / ▶ to select the "PAL/SECAM" option and then use ▲ / ▼ to select "SECAM" for the SECAM-L standard.

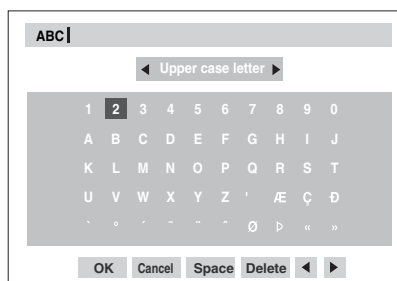
4. Then press **OK** to confirm the settings and return to the "Program list" menu.

Note: If the DVD recorder has got the station from a Loewe television via Digital Link Plus (DLP), the "Edit programme", "Move" and "Delete" functions are blocked and can only be used once more when the station is overwritten again by automatic programming.

Renaming stations

You can give whatever name you like to a station. Names should have a maximum of five characters.

1. Use ▲ / ▼ to select a programme in the "Programme list" and press **OK**. The options are displayed on the left-hand side of the "Programme list" menu.
2. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the "Rename station" option, and press **OK**. The "Keypad" menu is displayed.



3. Enter a name for the station. Use ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ to select a character and press **OK**.

- **Upper case letter:** Switches the keypad so that only upper case is used.
- **Lower case letter:** Switches the keypad so that only lower case is used.
- **Symbols:** Switches the keypad to symbol characters.
- **ABC...123:** Inserts the corresponding character at the cursor position.
- **OK:** Select this option to end and save.
- **Cancel:** Select this option to close the menu. Any changes made will be discarded.
- **Space:** Inserts a space at the cursor position.
- **Delete:** Deletes the character to the left of the cursor position.
- ◀ / ▶: Moves the cursor to the left or right.

Note: Remote control buttons for keying in a name (all selections must be confirmed using the remote control's **OK** button).

▶: Inserts a space at the cursor position.

■: Deletes the character to the right of the cursor position.

■: Deletes the character to the left of the cursor position.

P+ / P-: Moves the cursor to the left or right.

TEXT, INFO: Toggles the keypad between upper case, lower case and symbols.

4. Then press **OK** to confirm the settings and return to the "Program list" menu.

Moving programmes

You can sort the programme positions in the "Programme list" menu.

1. Use ▲ / ▼ to select a programme in the "Programme list" and press **OK**. The options are displayed on the left-hand side of the "Programme list" menu.
2. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the "Move" option, and press **OK**.
3. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the position you require. Then press **OK** or **END** again in the programme list to change.

Deleting a programme

You can delete a programme from the "Programme list" menu.

1. Use ▲ / ▼ to select a programme in the "Programme list" and press **OK**.

Decoder on/off

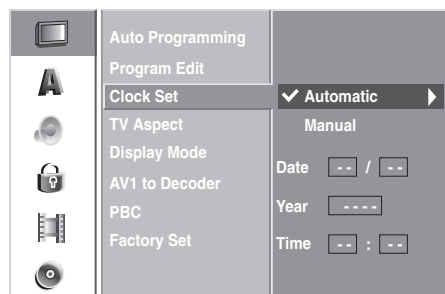
NICAM auto/off

This DVD recorder can receive Hi-Fi sound transmissions in NICAM Stereo. Bad reception can however cause distortion. You can switch the function off ("off").

1. Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select a program in the "Program List" menu, and press **OK**. The options are displayed on the left side of the "Program List" menu.
2. Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select the "NICAM auto/off" option from the program list and press **OK**. If you select "auto", "NICAM" appears under the program shown in the small picture.

Setting the Clock

If the automatic channel search is finished, the date and time will also be set automatically (depending on the broadcasting station), the same is true when the power supply returns after a power cut or after the mains cable has been unplugged. The "Automatic" option must be set to enable this.

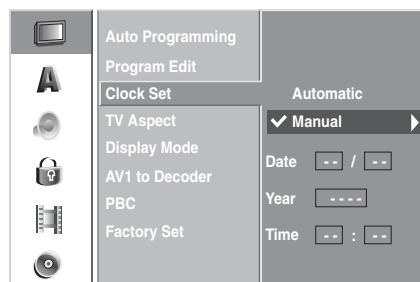

Manual Setting of the Date / Time

Playback Control - PBC

VCD, SVCD

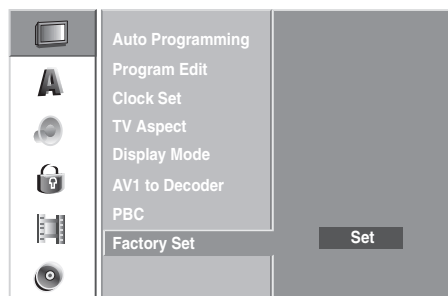
If a VCD (or SVCD) contains playback control (PBC) features and if "PBC" in the menu is set to "On", then the disc playback is controlled via the menu contained on the disc. Otherwise the VCD is played in the same way as an audio CD.



Factory Settings

If required you can restore all the factory settings on the recorder. Select the "Execute" symbol and press **OK**.

Note: Some options cannot be reset (security rating, password and country code, program list, timer list).

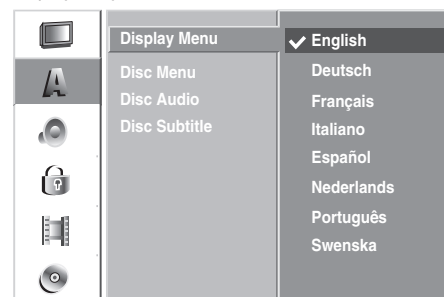

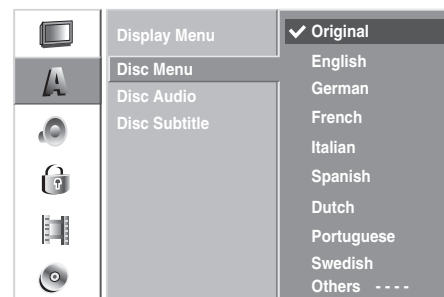
Menu Language

Disc Languages

Select a language for the disc's menu, audio and subtitles.

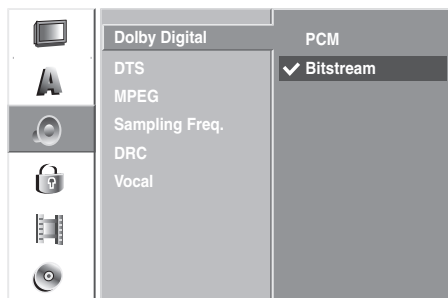

Dolby Digital

PCM: Select this option if the unit is connected to a digital two channel stereo amplifier. The DVD recorder's digital audio outputs emit sound in PCM 2 channel format if you play a DVD-Video disc with Dolby Digital audio format.

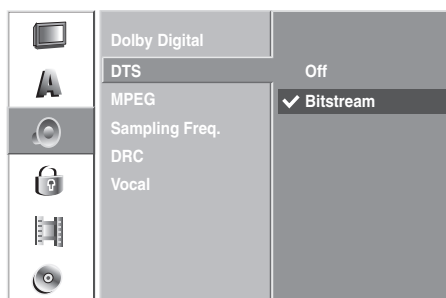
Bitstream: Select "Bitstream" if you have a Dolby Digital decoder (or amplifier, a Loewe TV with AC3 or DIS module or another unit with Dolby Digital decoder) connected to the DIGITAL OUT socket of the DVD recorder.



DTS

Off: If you select "Off" the DTS signal is not emitted from the DIGITAL OUT socket.

Bitstream: Select "Bitstream" if you have a Dolby Digital decoder (or amplifier, a Loewe TV with AC3 or DIS module or another unit with Dolby Digital decoder) connected to the DIGITAL OUT socket of the DVD recorder.



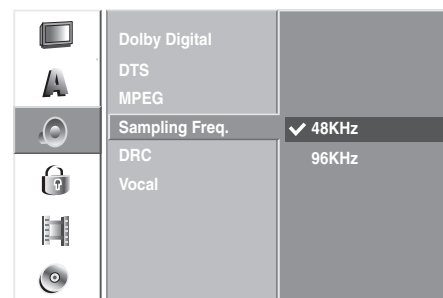
MPEG

PCM: Select this option if the unit is connected to a digital two channel stereo amplifier. The DVD recorder's digital audio outputs emit sound in PCM 2 channel format if you play a DVD-Video disc with Dolby Digital audio format.

Bitstream: Select "Bitstream" if you have a Dolby Digital decoder (or amplifier, a Loewe TV with AC3 or DIS module or another unit with Dolby Digital decoder) connected to the DIGITAL OUT socket of the DVD recorder.

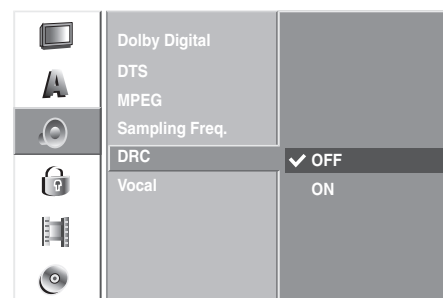
Sampling Frequency

If your receiver or amplifier is NOT designed for 96 kHz signals, select 48 kHz. If you have made this selection, the unit automatically converts the 96 kHz signals to 48 kHz signals that the system can decode. If your receiver or amplifier is designed for 96 kHz signals, select 96 kHz.



Night Mode

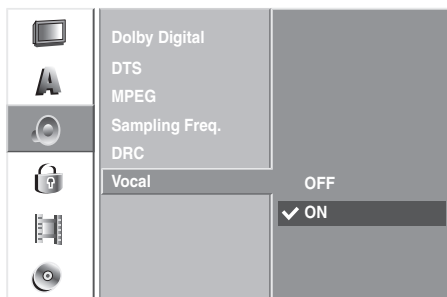
Thanks to digital audio technology the DVD format enables you to hear soundtracks in the most accurate and realistic way possible. However, you may wish to limit the dynamics (i.e. the difference between the loudest and the quietest sounds). In this way you can play a film with minimum volume differences. For this purpose switch "Night Mode" to "On".



Initial Installation

Karaoke Audio

Switch the singing option (karaoke audio) on, if you want to play a multi-channel karaoke DVD. The karaoke channels on the disc are mixed into normal stereo sound.

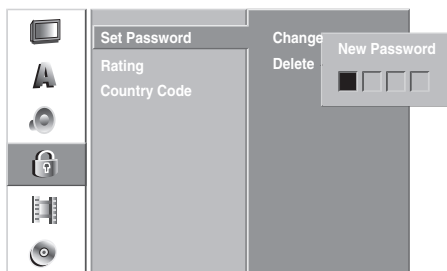

Changing the 4-digit code

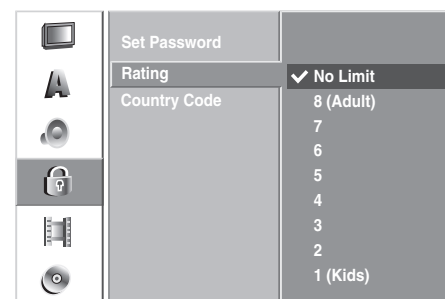

Rating

Films on DVD can contain scenes that are not suitable for children. For this reason discs can contain child protection information that applies to the whole disc or only to certain scenes on the disc. The ratings are country-dependent. The child lock function enables you to prevent your children watching certain discs or scenes.



1. Follow steps 1 - 3 as described in "Password".
2. Select the "Rating" option with **▲ / ▼**.
3. Press **▶** to call up the third level.
4. Follow step 6 as described left (see „Password“).
5. Select a protection level between 1 and 8 using the **▲ / ▼** keys. 1 has the least playback limitations. 8 has the most playback limitations.
No Limits: If you select "No Limits" the child

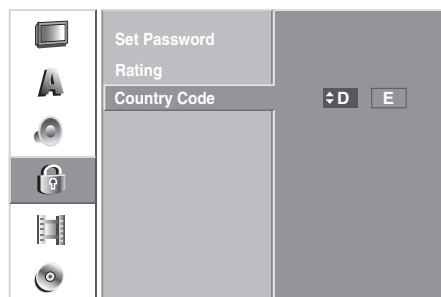
lock is not active. The disc will play in full.

Steps 1 to 8: Some discs contain scenes that are not suitable for children. If you assign a security rating to your DVD recorder it will only play the scenes on the inserted disc that correspond to or are below the assigned security rating. Scenes of a higher level on the DVD will only be played if appropriate replacement scenes are available on the disc. The alternative scenes must have the same or a lower security rating. If no suitable alternative is found, play is stopped. You must enter the 4-digit password or change the rating level to continue to play the disc.

6. Press **OK** to confirm the selected security rating. Press **MENU** to quit the menu.

Country Code (for Rating)

Enter the code for a country/region whose standards are to be used to rate the DVD-Video disc. (See "Country Code List" on page 69.) For Great Britain select „G B“.

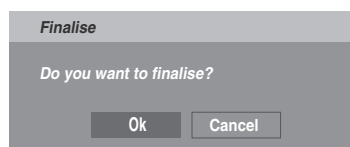
Finalization

Finalization fixes recordings so that the disc can be played on a regular DVD player or a computer with a suitable DVD-ROM drive. During finalization of a Video mode disc a menu is created for disc navigation. You can access the menu by pressing the **TEXT** button.

Caution: Following recording and finalization of DVD-R and DVD+R discs no other editing or recording can take place. This does not however apply for a DVD+RW and DVD-RW disc.



1. Follow steps 1 - 3 described on page 25 (Formatting).
2. Select the „Finalization“ option with ▲ / ▼.
3. Press ▶ to call up the third level. „Finalization“ is highlighted.

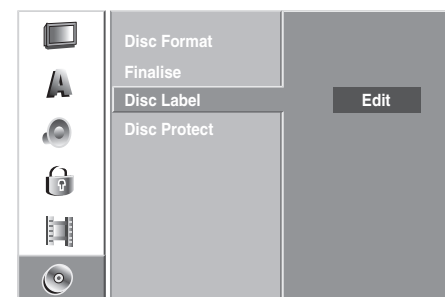
Note: The time needed for finalization depends on the type of disc, how much is recorded on the disc and the number of titles on the disc. Finalization of a prerecorded disc can take up to 8 minutes.

Tip: If you insert a finalized DVD-RW or DVD+RW disc, the finalization can be reversed by selecting „Unfinalize“ in the „Finalization“ menu. Then the disc can be edited and re-recorded.

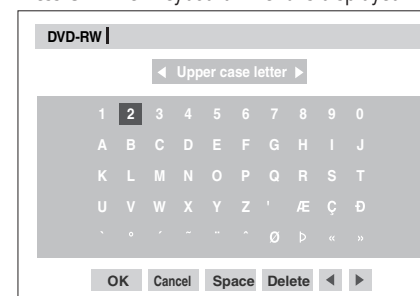
Disc Name

Use this option to enter a name for the disc. The name is displayed when the disc is loaded and when you display disc information on the screen.

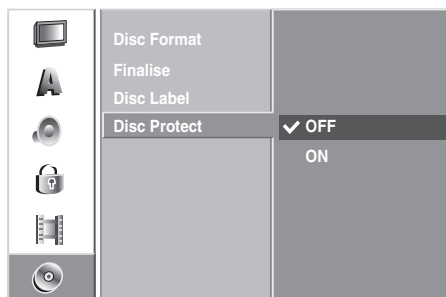

Disc Protection


When recording onto a DVD+RW/+R disc in DVD+RW disc mode protection should be switched to "On" to avoid inadvertent recording, changing or deleting of the disc. To release the disc again, select "Off".



Additional Screen Menus

This manual contains basic instructions for operating the DVD recorder. Some DVDs require specific handling or only permit limited operation during playback. If this is the case the  symbol appears on the screen. This indicates that certain operations are not permitted at certain points or that no menu is available on the disc.

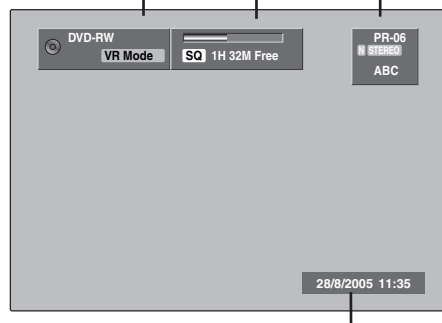
Displaying Information when the DVD Recorder is Supplying the TV Broadcast.

If you are watching a TV program that is being supplied by the integrated receiver in the DVD recorder (DVD recorder is in stop mode), then you can show (and hide) information about the TV program and the disc in the player by pressing **OK** or . Example: A DVD-RW disc in VR mode is inserted and the program 06 called "ABC" is currently running:

Indicates the channel number, station name and the audio signal (NICAM, STEREO, MONO) for the current broadcast.

Indicates in a progress bar the ratio of used to free space on the inserted disc, the free space in minutes and the recording quality (for other discs see next page)




Indicates the name and format of the disc.



Indicates the current date and time.

Displaying Disc Information on the Screen during Disc Playback

You can display a variety of information about the inserted disc on the screen.

1. Press  twice to show disc information whose parameters can be changed.
2. To hide the screen display again, press  or .




Using DVDs and Video CDs

Playing back a DVD or video CD (VCD, SVCD)

Preparing for playback

Switch the television on and set the video source to be the input that the DVD recorder has been connected to or activate the "Control voltage" option for the television's AV input.

If you have connected the DVD recorder to an audio system, switch on the audio system and, as the source, set the input that the DVD recorder has been connected to.

1. Press **▲** on the unit to open the disc drawer.
2. Insert the disc that you have selected, with the side that is to be played back face-down, in the drawer.
3. Press **▲** on the unit to close the disc drawer.
4. **READING** shows on the display while disc recognition is in progress.

Play

When the disc has been recognised, playback begins automatically (if it does not, start it manually **▶**) and the menu on the disc will display (or the film will start immediately if there is no such menu). When the disc menu appears, proceed as follows:

DVD: Use the **◀ ▶ ▲ ▼** buttons to select the title or chapter that you wish to see. Then press **OK** to start playback.

VCD: Use the number buttons to select the track you want.

The disc's menu options and its precise mode of operation may differ from disc to disc. Follow the instructions on each menu page.

Further information can be found from page 21.

Notes:

1. If the child lock is active and the DVD disc's security rating is higher than that of the child lock, the four-digit password will need to be entered (see "Ratings" on page 23).
2. DVD's have a country code. The recorder will not play a disc that has a country code which differs from the country code stored in the unit. This player has country code 2.
3. You can also switch Play back control - PBC (see page 21) off from the main menu (OFF).

General functions

Note: Unless otherwise indicated, the remote control is able to control the functions described. The DVD recorder's own controls can also be used to control certain functions.

Selecting a different TITLE



DVD Video VR

If there is more than one title on a disc, you can switch to a different title as follows:

Press **INFO** twice and use **▲ / ▼** to select the title's symbol. Then press the appropriate number button (0-9) or **◀ / ▶** to select a title number. After pressing **OK**, the title will play.

Selecting a different CHAPTER or TRACK



DVD Video VR VCD

If a disc title has more than one chapter/track, you can select a different chapter or track as follows:

During playback, press **P+** or **P-** to go to the next chapter or next track, or to go back to the start of the current chapter or track.

Press **P-** twice to go back to the previous chapter/track.

During playback, you can select a chapter or track directly by pressing **INFO** twice. Then use **▲ / ▼** to select the chapter symbol (or the track symbol on a video CD). Then use the number buttons (0-9) to input the chapter/track number or use **◀ / ▶** to select it. When **OK** is pressed, the chapter will play.

Using DVDs and Video CDs

Searching

DVD Video VR VCD

1. Press or during playback. The recorder now switches to Search mode.
2. Press or repeatedly to select the speed you want:
 toggles between x2, x4, x8, x16, x100 (backwards) or x2, x4, x8, x16, x100 (forwards).
With a video CD, the search speed changes as follows: x2, x4, x8 .
3. You can leave Search mode by pressing .

Freeze-frame and Picture For Picture playback

The recorder now switches to PAUSE mode.

1. You can page backwards and forwards between images by pressing / repeatedly or page continuously by holding / down.
2. You can leave PAUSE mode by pressing .

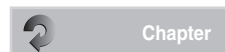

With a video CD, the slow motion speed changes as follows:
 1/8, 1/4 or 1/2 (forwards).
4. You can leave Slow Motion mode by pressing .

Note: Video CDs do not support slow motion backwards playback.

DVD discs - Repeating chapter/title/OFF

Press to select the repeat mode that you want:

- Chapter: repeats the current chapter.
- Title: repeats the current title.
- All: repeats all the titles on the disc.
(VR mode - only DVD-RW discs)

Video CDs - repeat track/all/OFF

Press to select the repeat mode that you want.

- Track: repeats the current track.
- All: repeats all the tracks on the disc.
- OFF: no playback repeated.

order to use the Repeat function. Further information can be found from page 21.

Time (Play from ...)



DVD Video VR

The “Time” function enables you to select the time that the disc begins to play.

1. During playback, press twice. The Info bar will appear on the television.
The elapsed playing time of the current disc shows in the “Time” field.
2. Use / to select the “Time” symbol.
“0:00:00” displays in the “Time” field.
3. Use the number buttons to input the required start time within 20 seconds. From left to right, input the hour, the minutes and the seconds of the disc’s start time.
You cannot input an invalid start time. If you have input incorrect figures, press / to move the cursor () to the incorrect figure. Input the correct numbers.
4. Press **OK** within 20 seconds to confirm the start time. Playback will start at the time selected.

Using DVDs and Video CDs

Zoom

DVD Video VR VCD

You can use the Zoom function to expand the video image and navigate in the enlarged image.

1. During playback or freeze-frame playback, press **RADIO** to activate the Zoom function.
Each time that you press the **RADIO** button, the screen will change as follows:
Size x1, size x2, size x4, size x1 (normal size).
2. Use the **◀ ▶ ▲ ▼** buttons to move around within the zoomed image.
3. To continue with normal playback, press **RADIO** repeatedly until the image is back to the normal size.

Note: With some DVDs, the Zoom function may not work.

Markers

How to set a marker

You can start playback from a marker that has been saved. Up to six markers can be saved.

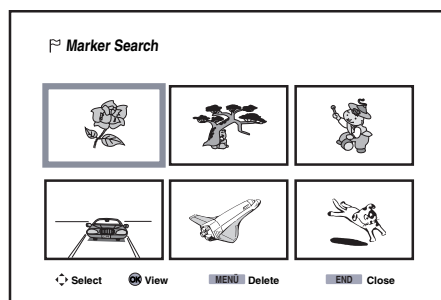
How to set a marker:

1. During playback, press **⏸** when you are at the point at which you want to save a marker.
The marker symbol will appear on the screen for a short time.
2. Repeat step 1 to set up to six markers on a disc.

How to recall a scene that has been marked

1. Press **□** during playback. The "Marker search" menu will appear on the screen.
2. Use the **◀ ▶ ▲ ▼** buttons to select a marked scene that you wish to recall.
3. Press **OK**.
Playback will start from the marked scene.

4. Press **END** to turn off the "Marker search" menu.



How to delete a marker

1. Press **□** during playback or while in Stop mode.
The "Marker search" menu will appear on the screen.
2. Use the **◀ ▶ ▲ ▼** to select the marker that you wish to delete.
3. Press **MENU**.
The message "The selected marker has been deleted" will appear.
4. Use **◀ / ▶** to select the "Yes" option, and press **OK**.
5. Repeat steps 2 -4 to delete other markers.
6. Press **END** to turn off the "Marker search" menu.

Disc menus

Most DVDs have their own menus. There is a difference between the disc menu and the so-called title menu.

Title menu

DVD

1. Press **TITLE**. If the current DVD has a title menu, it will appear on the screen. Otherwise the disc menu may be shown.
2. The menu may cover camera angles, languages spoken, sub-title options and chapters for the title.

Disc menu

DVD

1. Press **TEXT**.
The disc menu is displayed.
2. Make the settings you require by using **◀ ▶ ▲ ▼** and **OK**.
3. Press **TEXT** again to close the disc menu (or it may automatically close when **OK** is pressed).




Using DVDs and Video CDs

Camera positions



DVD

If the DVD contains scenes that have been captured using different camera positions, you can switch to a different camera position during playback.






- Press  during playback and then press  /  repeatedly to select the camera angle you require.
The number of the current camera position is shown on the screen.

Note: A camera symbol will appear on the screen during scenes that were recorded using different camera positions.

Digital sound formats and film language




Here you can select the digital sound format in connection with the film language. To do this, press  2x during playback and use  /  to select the „Audio“ menu item. Then press  /  to get a different film language or sound format.

Note: Some discs have got Dolby Digital and DTS sound tracks. If DTS is selected, there is no analogue audio output. To listen to the DTS sound track, connect the recorder via one of the digital outputs to a DTS amplifier (see page 15).

Changing the audio channel

If have inserted a video CD, press  2x during playback and use  /  to select the „Audio“ menu item. Then press  /  to listen to a different audio channel (STEREO, LEFT or RIGHT).

3D surround sound

This unit can produce a 3D surround sound effect that uses two ordinary stereo speakers to simulate multi-channel audio playback with the five speakers or more that are normally required for multi-channel audio in a home cinema system.

1. Press  2x and use  /  to select the „Sound“ menu item. Then press  /  during playback to select „3D SUR“.
2. Select „NORMAL“ to switch off the 3D surround sound effect.

Storing the last disc settings

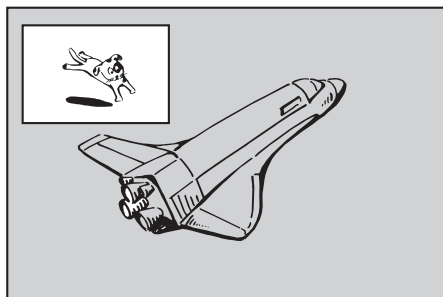
The recorder saves the user settings for the last disc that you have watched. The settings are saved until you remove the disc from the recorder or switch it off.

If you insert a disc that has already been played back, playback will continue from the last stopping point.

PIP (Picture In Picture)

DVD Video VR VCD

This function enables you, during playback, to watch television programmes or images from other connected AV sources in a small picture.



PIP on / off

Press **# PIP** to switch the small picture on. Press this button again to switch it back off.

Selecting the small picture

Press *** EPG** to select the signal source for the small picture. Each time that the button is pressed, the different signal sources for the small picture are displayed as below.

Tuner, AV1, AV2, AV3, AV4, Tuner

Selecting a TV programme for the small picture

Use **▲ / ▼** to change the programme when the small picture input is set to Tuner. The number of the programme selected appears on the screen.

You can replace the large picture with the TV programme showing in the small picture by using **■** to end the DVD playback (the small picture is then suppressed).

Changing the position of the small picture

Press **◀ / ▶** repeatedly until you reach the position you want. The small picture can be moved clockwise and counter-clockwise.

Zooming the small picture

Press **RADIO** repeatedly to increase the size of the small picture. 3 different sizes are available.

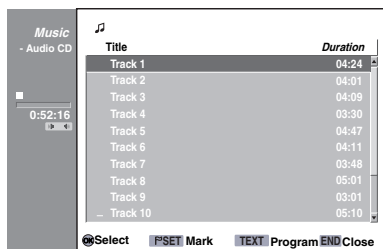

Playing audio CDs or MP3 discs

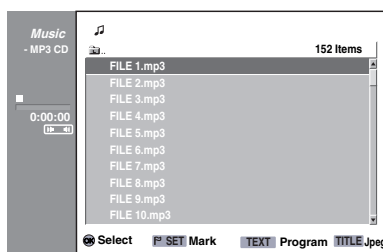
CD MP3

The DVD recorder can be used to play audio CDs. Recordings made in the MP3 format can also be played back on CD-ROM, CD-R or CD-RW discs (before playing MP3 recordings, read the advice on MP3 recordings on page 36).

1. Insert the disc and close the drawer. The "Music - Audio CD" or "Music - MP3 CD" menu appears on the screen.

2. Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select a track, and press \blacktriangleright . It begins to play. During playback, the amount of time that has elapsed of the current track is displayed in the left-hand window. When the disc comes to an end, playback stops automatically.

Notes:

- a.) To see the channel that the DVD recorder is delivering, or the images from the AV inputs, press DVD-AV/ \star EPG. Use the DISC-M/ TEXT button to return to the CD menu.

b.) You can switch between the programme list and the original list by pressing TEXT (see page 37).

Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to switch to the previous/next list page.

c.) With mixed CDs (Audio tracks, MP3 and JPEG files) you can switch between the „Audio CD“, „MP3 CD“ and „Photo CD“ menus by repeatedly pressing TITLE TEXT when in Stop mode.

3. To interrupt playback at any time, press \blacksquare .

Options in the Music menu

1. To display menu options, select a track (or folder) in the menu and press **OK**.
2. Use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to select an option and then always press **OK** to execute the function.

The Search speed and Search direction are displayed on the screen.
3. Use  to come out of the Search mode.

Advice on MP3 recording

About MP3

- An MP3 file is made up of audio data that have been compressed using MPEG1 audio layer 3 file coding. Files with the ".mp3" extension are known as MP3 files.
- The recorder cannot read MP3 files that have an extension other than ".mp3".

The compatibility of MP3 discs and this recorder is subject to the following restrictions:

1. The physical format of the CD-R should conform to ISO 9660 and JOLIET.
2. If you record MP3 files with software such as "Direct CD", which cannot create a FILE SYSTEM, you cannot play back MP3 files.
3. The total number of files and folders on the disc should be no more than 999.





To achieve the best possible playback quality, the discs and recordings that are played on the DVD recorder should meet certain technical standards. DVDs that have already been played meet these standards. With writable disc formats, there are many different types (e.g. a CD-R with MP3 files) that have to meet certain conditions (see above) if compatibility is to be assured when playing.

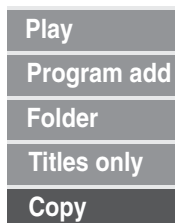
It should also be noted that permission is required to download MP3 files and music from the Internet. Our company is not authorised to issue such permission. The permission required should always be sought from the copyright holder.

Copying files / folders from a CD to an audio/photo card

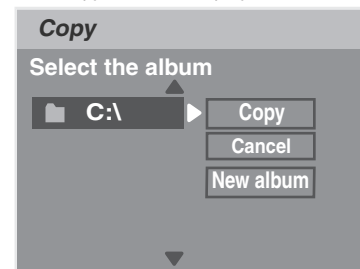
MP3 and photo files can be copied from a CD to a memory card in the audio/photo card reader. This can be used, for example, to play files on portable playback devices (such as MP3 players).




Note: You should be sure to switch off any write protection on the memory card and check that there is sufficient storage space on the card.

1. Use  /  to select a file / a folder on the CD and then press **OK**. In the menu that appears, use  /  to select "Copy" and then press







2. The "Copy" menu is displayed.

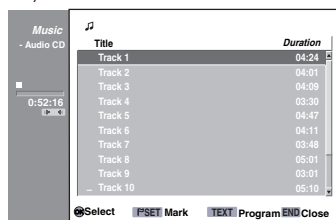





3. Use  /  to select the folder on the memory card that will receive the copy, and then press .
4. Select "Copy" and press **OK**. The selected files / folders are copied to the selected folder on the memory card. Use "Cancel" to return to the starting menu. "New folder" can be used to create a new folder on the memory card. You can then copy the selected files / folders to it.

Programmed replay with audio CD and MP3

You can use the Program function to combine your favourite items from a disc or memory card in the order you want and thus create a personalised program. The memory will hold either 99 tracks (audio CD) or 256 tracks (MP3).

1. Insert an audio CD or an MP3 disc or a memory card. The "Audio CD" or "MP3 CD" / "MP3 card" menu will display.
2. Use ▲ / ▼ to select a track (or folder). To select more than one track or folder at once:
 - a.) Press . The track/folder will be marked (✓). By pressing  again, you can delete the mark.
 - b.) Repeat step a) for other tracks (folders).
3. Press **OK**. The options are displayed in the left half of the menu.
4. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the "Program add" option and then press **OK** to transfer the selected items to the programme list.
Note: When a folder is added to the programme list, only the tracks in this folder will be copied - not those in any sub-folders.
5. To add more tracks to the programme list, repeat steps 2-4.
6. When you have finished creating the programme list, press  to display this in the "Programme list" menu (the  button switches between the programme list and the original list).



7. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the programme track that is to be the first one to be played.
Note: With programme lists of more than one page, you can use  or  to page backwards and forwards.
8. Press .

The tracks are played back in the order that has been programmed. Playback stops after the last track in the programme has played.

Options in the Programme list menu

1. To display the menu options for any item in the programme list, select a track in the "Programme list" menu and press **OK**. The options are displayed in the left half of the menu.
2. Use ▲ / ▼ to select an option, and press **OK** to confirm.

3. Select "Delete" and press **OK**. The selected track is removed from the programme list.
Note: Select "Delete all" to remove all the tracks.

Changing the track order in the programme list

1. Select the track that you wish to move.
Note: You can use the  button to select more than one track.
2. Press **OK**. The options are displayed in the left half of the menu.
3. Select "Move" and press **OK**. A blue deletion line appears in the programme list.
4. Use ▲ / ▼ to move the blue deletion line to the appropriate place, and press **OK**. The selected track is moved.

Saving programme lists

MP3

This recorder automatically saves the programmed user list for the disc. The programme list remains in memory, even when the disc is taken out or the recorder is switched off.

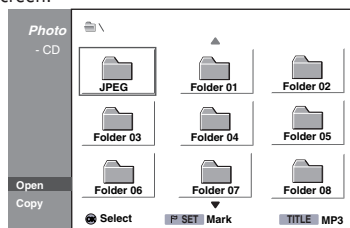

The recorder can be used to play discs with JPEG files. Before playback, read the "Notes on JPEG files" on the right.

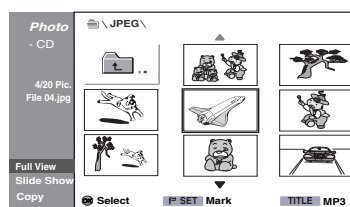
1. Insert the disc and close the drawer.
The photo menu (overview) will appear on the screen.



2. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select a folder, and then press **OK**. The left half of the menu displays the options that you can use on the selected item. Select a JPEG file and press **OK**, then continue from Point 6.

Note: If the ? symbol appears in the photo menu, these JPEG files cannot be displayed.

3. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select the "Open" option, and press **OK**.
4. The contents of the selected folder are displayed.



5. The options are displayed in the left half of the menu.

Notes:

a.) To go back from the file list to the folder above, press \uparrow / \downarrow on the remote control to mark the .. symbol, and press **OK**.

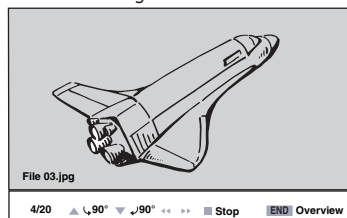
b.) To see the television programme that the DVD recorder is transmitting, or the images from the devices attached to the AV inputs, press * EPG .

. Use the TEXT button to go back to the menu.

c.) Press \leftarrow or \rightarrow in the photo menu to switch to the previous or next page.

d.) With mixed CDs (audio tracks, MP3 and JPEG files), when you are in Stop mode you can switch between the AUDIO CD, MP3 CD and Photo CD menus by repeatedly pressing **TITLE**.

6. Use \uparrow / \downarrow to select the "Full View" option, and press **OK**. Information and user guidance regarding the current image is displayed in the lower part of the screen. You can toggle this bar on and off using **OK**.



7. Return to the overview using OK .

Accessing images one by one

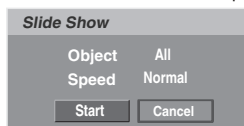
In the full display, press \rightarrow / \leftarrow once to display the next or previous file.

Rotating images

Press \uparrow / \downarrow to rotate an image that is being displayed 90° clockwise or anti-clockwise.

Slide show

1. Select "Slide show" in the photo menu.



2. Press **OK**.
The "Slide show" menu is displayed.
3. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select the options.
Item: display selected files or all files (see note

below). Speed: To set the slide show speed (Slow, Normal or Fast).

4. Select "Start" and press **OK** to begin the slide show.
5. Press \blacksquare to stop the slide show and go back to the photo menu.

Note: You can use the OK button to select single files and make them into a slide show.

Notes about JPEG files

Depending on the size and number of JPEG files, it can take several minutes to read the disc. If nothing appears on the screen after a few minutes, some files are too large. Reduce the resolution of the JPEG files to less than 4 Megapixels and burn the disc again.

There is no limit on the total number of files and folders, but the total number of files in the folder has to be fewer than 999.

Due to different recording formats or the condition of the CD, some discs may be incompatible.

When using burning software to burn JPEG files onto a CD-R, all the selected files must have the ".jpg" or ".jpeg" extension before they will be burned onto the CD.

If the files have the ".jpe" extension, they must be renamed to ".jpg" or ".jpeg".

This recorder cannot read file names without the ".jpg" or ".jpeg" extension, even if the files appear as JPEG images in Windows Explorer.

Using the audio/photocard reader


Overview

About the system

You can use the digital audio/photo card reader built into the DVD recorder to display on the screen images from digital cameras with the most common memory cards.

MP3 audio files can also be played. You can create and play a programme list consisting of a selection of MP3 titles.

You use the Loewe DVD recorder's remote control to operate the audio/photo card reader.

When the memory card is inserted, you can use the **CARD**  button to switch to using the audio/photo card reader. An overview will appear of the images or MP3 files stored on the card - depending on the last method of use.

If there are over 9 images stored, you can use  or  to go to other pages of the overview.

You can manually mark and view an image, and switch to the next or previous image.

You can rotate images that were taken in portrait mode, or that need to be turned upside-down.

The Slide show function can be used to automatically move on to the next image. You can use the menu to specify how quickly the images should be changed (see page 41).

MP3 or JPEG files can be copied from a data CD to a memory card with enough free storage space, so that they can be played on, e.g., portable playback devices (see page 37).

Data/memory card compatibility

The images stored on the card must be in the JPEG baseline DCF format. Other formats will not be displayed and are identified in the overview by a question mark. There is a maximum of 8 Megapixels. For further details about JPEG files, refer to page 38.

MP3 files are played at 32 - 320 kBps bit rates and at variable bit rates.

If the memory card is formatted on a PC or Mac, to then save a series of pictures on the card, it must be formatted in FAT 12, 16 or 32. Memory cards with other formats cannot be read.

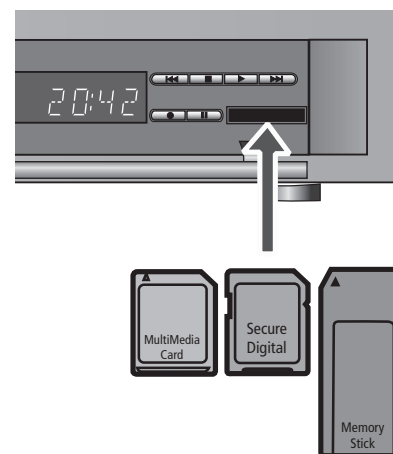

Inserting/removing memory cards

It is recommended that memory cards are only inserted and removed when the unit is switched off.



Inserting a memory card: Push the card in until it snaps into place.

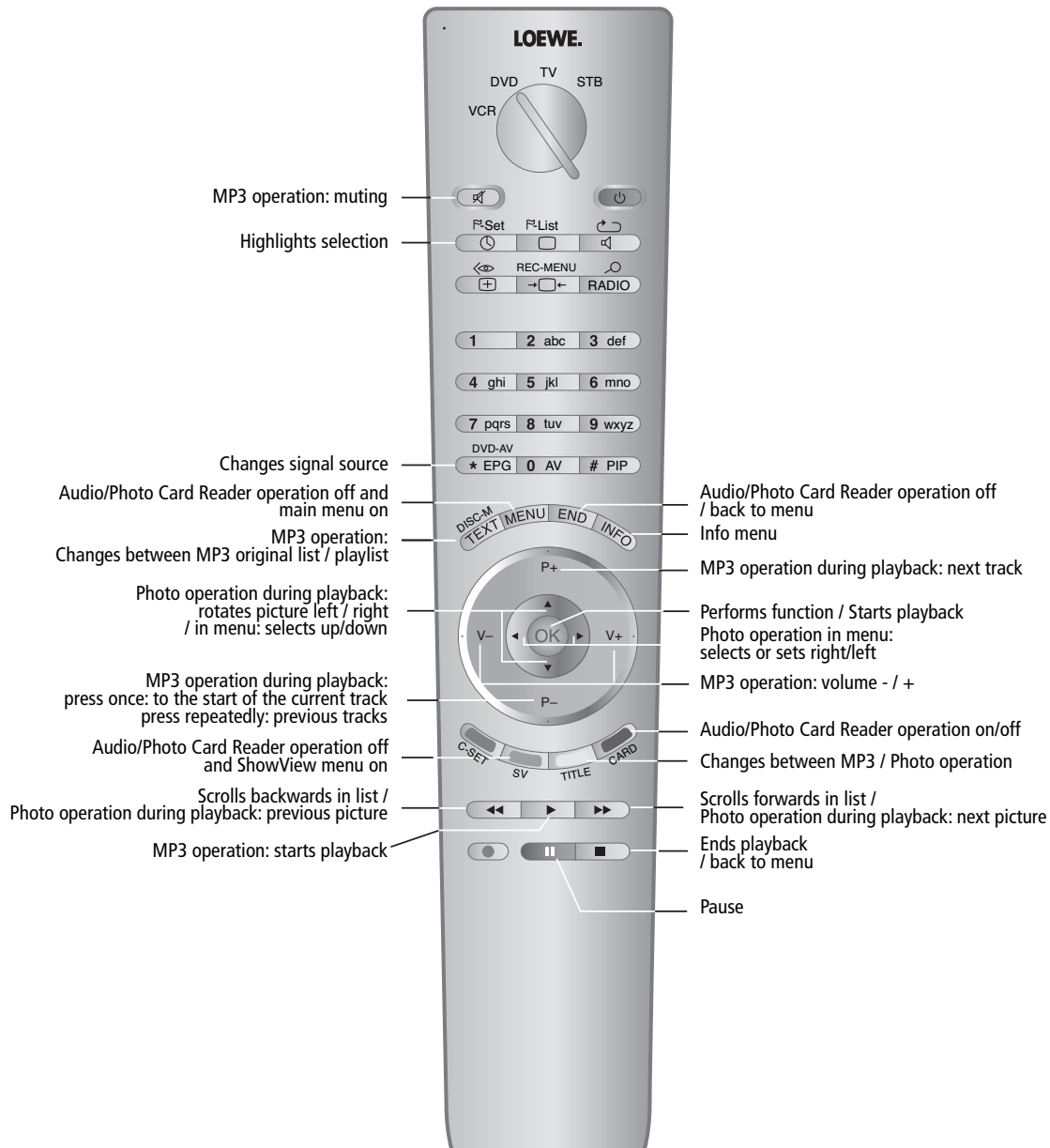
Removing a memory card: Press gently on the middle of the front of the card until it disengages, and then carefully withdraw the card.

Notes:

- When activating the audio/photo card reader, the DVD recorder should be idle, with no additional screen displays (no menu or Picture In Picture display).
- Take care with the card's polarity / tag (see diagram above).
- Keep memory cards out of reach of children. If swallowed, a doctor is required immediately.
- Cards should not be touched with electrical contacts, or the memory may be damaged.

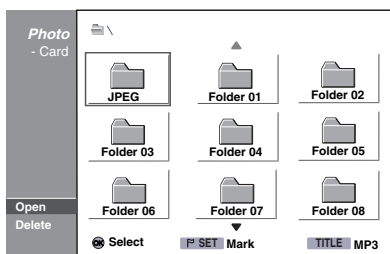

Using photo

Displaying image files

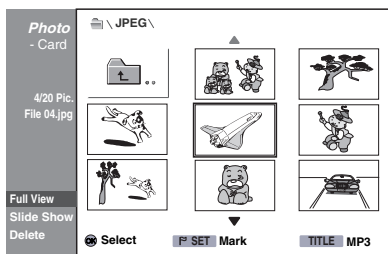
1. Press the **CARD** button and the "Photo card" mode will display. The photo menu appears on the screen.



2. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select a folder, and then press **OK**. The left half of the menu displays the options that you can use on the selected item. Select a JPEG file and press **OK**, then continue from Point 6.

Note: If the ? symbol appears in the photo menu, these JPEG files cannot be displayed.

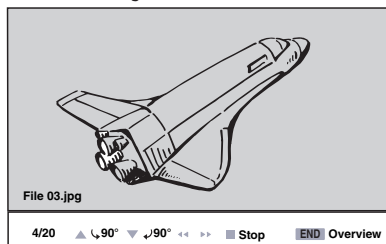
3. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select the "Open" option, and press **OK**.
4. The contents of the selected folder are displayed.



5. The options are displayed in the left half of the menu.

Notes:

- a.) To go back from the file list to the folder above, press \uparrow / \downarrow on the remote control to mark the .. symbol, and press **OK**.
 - b.) To see the television programme that the DVD recorder is transmitting, or the images from the devices attached to the AV inputs, press DVD-AV/ EPG . Use the DISC-M/ TEXT button to go back to the menu.
 - c.) Press \leftarrow or \rightarrow in the photo menu to switch to the previous or next page.
 - d.) With mixed CDs (audio tracks, MP3 and JPEG files), when you are in Stop mode you can switch between the "Music MP3 card" and "Photo card" menus by repeatedly pressing **TITLE**.
6. Use \uparrow / \downarrow to select the "Full view" option, and press **OK**. Information and user guidance regarding the current image is displayed in the lower part of the screen. You can toggle this bar on and off using **OK**.



7. Return to the overview using \blacksquare .

Note: To go to the folder above, use \uparrow \downarrow to mark .. , and press **OK**.

Accessing images one by one

In the full display, press \rightarrow / \leftarrow once to display the next or previous file.

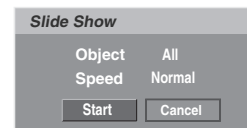
Rotating images

Press \uparrow / \downarrow to rotate an image that is being displayed 90° clockwise or anti-clockwise.

Slide show

1. Select "Slide show" in the photo menu.

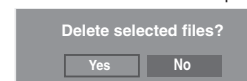
2. Press **OK**. The "Slide show" menu is displayed.



3. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select the options. Item: display selected files or all files. Speed: To set the slide show speed (Slow, Normal or Fast).
4. Select "Start" and press **OK** to begin the slide show.
5. Press \blacksquare to stop the slide show and go back to the photo menu.
6. Note: You can use the clock button to select single files and make them into a slide show.

Deleting images or folders

1. Use \uparrow \downarrow \leftarrow \rightarrow to select the folder or file that is to be deleted. To delete more than one folder/file, first use the clock button to mark them.
2. Press **OK** and select "Delete" from the photo menu. The "Delete" menu is displayed.



3. Select "Yes" if you want to permanently delete the selected folders/files, and press **OK**. The delete procedure on the memory card cannot be reversed.

Note: You may need to ensure that, if the memory card is write-protected, this is removed in advance.

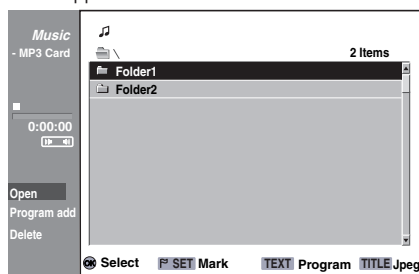

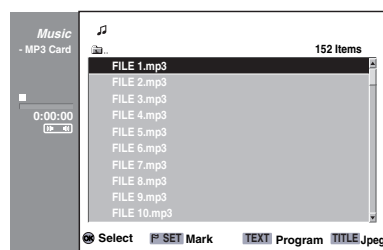
Playing MP3 files

Before playing MP3 recordings, read the notes regarding MP3 recordings on page 36.

1. Insert the memory card. Press the **CARD** button. The "Music-MP3 card" or "Photo-card" modes appear. In the latter case, press the **TITLE** button so that the "Music-MP3 card" menu appears on the screen.



2. Use **▲ ▼ ◀ ▶** to select a folder or file, and press **OK**. The menu options are displayed on the left. If you have selected a folder and pressed **OK**, select the "Open" option from the menu and press **OK**.



3. Use **▲ / ▼** to select a file and press **▶** or press **OK**, then select "Play" from the menu options that appear, and press **OK** again. Playback begins. During playback, the amount of time that has elapsed of the current track is displayed in the menu. When the list comes to an end, playback will stop. You can press **DISC-M/TITLE** to toggle between the original list and the programme list.

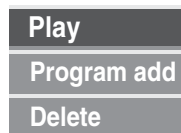
Press **◀▶** or **▶▶** in the "Music-MP3 card" menu to switch to the previous/next page. When the memory card has mixed content (MP3 and JPEG files), you can press **TITLE** when in Stop mode to toggle between the "Music-MP3 card" and "Photo-card" menus.

4. To interrupt playback at any time, press **■**.

Options in the Music menu

1. To display menu options, select a track (or folder) in the menu and press **OK**.
2. Use **▲ / ▼** to select an option, and press **OK** to confirm.

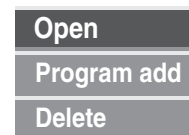
Options in the Music MP3 card menu



When a track is selected:

- **Play**: Starts playing the selected track.
- **Program add**: Adds tracks to the programme list. (page 37)
- **Delete**: Deletes the selected track.

When a folder is selected:



- **Open**: Displays a subfolder and all MP3 files in this folder.
- **Program add**: Adds all the tracks in the folder to the list. (see page 37)
- **Delete**: Deletes the selected folder.

Note: Only empty folders can be deleted.

Pause

1. During playback, press **||**.
2. To continue playback, press **▶** or again **||**.

Playing a different TRACK

- During playback, press **P-** or **P+** once to go to the next track or to go back to the start of the current track.
- Press **P-** twice to go back to the previous track.

Repeating

Press **🔊** for the Repeat type that you want.



- **TRACK**: repeats the current track.
- **FOLDER**: repeats all the tracks in the current folder.
- **OFF**: no repeat.

Recording - first steps



Manual recording

Proceed as follows to record television programmes.

Recording will start immediately and will continue until the disc is full or you stop the recording.


1. Switch the recorder on and insert a writable disc. Using the **DVD-AV/TEXT** button, switch the recorder input to the signal source that you wish to record from. If you insert an empty disc, it is first initialised automatically by the recorder (see page 25).
2. Set the recording quality (see page 24).
3. If you wish to record a TV programme, use the **P+ / P-** buttons to select a television programme or a signal source (e.g. AV1). The programme number, name and the current sound status are displayed on the screen.
 - For dual-language TV recordings, select the sound channel in the "Record → TV rec audio" submenu in the main menu (see page 25).
 - This recorder can also record NICAM audio. If the NICAM setting (see page 20) is set to Auto, audio will be automatically changed to NICAM whenever a NICAM programme is broadcast. If poor reception distorts the NICAM sound, you can switch off the programme's NICAM setting.
4. Press  once. Recording will begin. (The red **REC** display comes on in the DVD recorder's display window.)
5. Recording will go on until you press  or until the disc is full. You can find out about specifying the length of the recording under "Immediate Timer Recording".

Stopping the recording

1. Press  to stop the disc during a recording.
2. If you wish to continue the recording, press .

Immediate Timer Recording


The "Immediate Timer Recording" enables you to make a recording with a specified length without using the programme timer.

1. Follow steps 1-4 (see "Manual recording").
2. Press  several times to set the duration of the recording. Recording will begin after the first press of the button. Each additional press of the button extends the length of the recording by 10 minutes. When the set time elapses, the DVD recorder will stop recording. It then automatically switches off.





"Immediate Timer Recording" menu

Checking the recording time

Press  once to check the recording time. The length of recording time that remains will display. When the button is pressed again, while the display is still visible, "Continue" will display instead of the length of recording time that remains.

Extending the recording time


You can extend the recording time whenever you wish by pressing  while "Continue" is displayed.

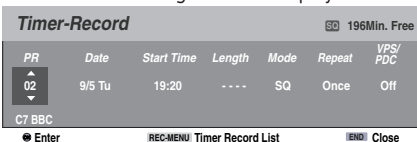
Each time that  is pressed, the recording will extend by 10 minutes, and the new recording time will be displayed instead of "Continue".

Caution: If the recorder is cut off from the power supply while it is recording (or if there is a power cut), the recording will be lost.

Timer recording

This DVD recorder can be programmed so that it can make up to seven recordings in a month. For recording with nobody in attendance, the timer has to know which signal sources (TV stations or from AV devices) should be recorded, and it needs the start time and the inputs which define the recording length.

1. Insert a writable disc and press . The "Timer Recording" menu is displayed.







- PR – Select a stored programme number or one of the external inputs for the recording.
- Date – Select a date that lies, at most, one month from the current date.
- Start Time – Sets the recording's start time (see Notes).
- Length – Sets the duration of the recording.
- Mode – Select a recording quality (HQ, SQ, LQ, EQ, or AT).
The AT (Auto) mode establishes how much disc time is available and, if necessary, switches to the recording quality to stop recording the programme (see page 24 for the other modes).
- Repeat – Select the repeat type that you require (once, daily (Monday - Friday) or weekly).
- VPS/PDC – The VPS/PDC system automatically alters the recording time so that you do not miss the programme if the programme schedule has been changed. For VPS/PDC to work properly, you need to key in the VPS time (which may differ from the actual time of day - see the Notes below) and the date of the programme that you wish to record.



Notes:

- You should be aware that not all stations work with VPS.
- Stations that use VPS/PDC usually have VPS/PDC information on their teletext pages. Look for information on those pages when you are going to make a timer recording.
- It takes around 30 seconds for the recorder to tune in and for recording to begin. If you are using VPS/PDC, the first few seconds of the programme may not be recorded.
- The actual time of day and the actual date will have to be keyed into the DVD recorder (see page 20).

2. Input the information needed for your timer recording(s).



-  /  (left/right) – select the input fields
-  /  (up/down) – changes the setting in the active input field.

The other options in this menu are:


- **OK** - saves your inputs in the timer (see point 3).
-  - closes the menu and discards the inputs.
-  - opens the timer recording list.

3. When you press **OK** the DVD recorder saves the programmed recording and displays the timer recording list.

Check in the "Status" column that the timer recording has been programmed correctly and a playable disc has been inserted.

4. Press  to close the timer recording list.
5. Press  to switch the unit to standby.

Notes:

- The timer's LED lights up in the unit's display window when the recorder is in standby mode and at least one timer recording has been programmed.
- For dual-language TV recordings, select the sound channel in the "Record → TV rec audio" submenu in the main menu (see page 25).
- To stop a timer recording that is underway, press the  button.
- The recording's start time must be at least 3 minutes into the future!

Timer recordings with the ShowView® system

Programming timer recordings with this system is child's play. Most television schedule publications include the SHOWVIEW code numbers along with the information about the programmes. So when you want to make a timer recording of a programme, you only need to key in the appropriate SHOWVIEW code number. The date, start time, end time and station are set automatically. You only need to set the recording quality and specify whether it is to be a one-off or repeated recording. You can save up to seven timer programmes on the recorder.

1. Press the green key **SV**.
The "Showview" menu is displayed.



To close the menu, press **SV** again.

Input fields

- Number – key in the SHOWVIEW code number.
- Repeat – select the repeat type that you require (once, daily or weekly).

2. Use the number buttons to input the SHOWVIEW code number.
 - ◀ / ▶ (left/right) – select the input fields.
 - If you make a wrong input, press repeatedly **MENU** before you press **OK** to delete the numbers one by one and then correct the password. You can also use ◀ / ▶ to go straight to the input field that you wish to correct and then overwrite the numbers that are there by using 0-9.
3. Use ◀ / ▶ to place the cursor in the "Repeat" column. Use ▲ / ▼ to select the "Repeat" option (once, daily [Monday - Friday] or weekly).
4. When you have input all the programme's details, press **OK**.
The "Timer recording" menu will appear. The settings can be altered from here.
5. Carry out steps 3-5 on the previous page (Timer recording).

Checking/changing the timer recording details

You can check the programming when the DVD recorder is switched on. Press **→□←** twice. The "Timer recording list" menu is displayed.

Edit a timer program

- Use ▲ / ▼ to select a timer recording that you wish to check.
- Press **OK** to go to the selected program.
- Press **→□←** to open the "Timer recording" menu, where you can make the change.

Deleting a timer program

You can delete a timer program at any time before recording starts.

Use ▲ / ▼ to select the entry in the timer recording list that you want to delete. If you wish to delete the recording, press **MENU**.

Cancelling a timer recording

After a timer recording has begun, you can cancel it at any time by pressing **⏻**.

Conditions that will prevent recording

When the timer has been programmed, the recorder will not record under the following circumstances:

- No disc has been inserted.
- A non-writable disc has been inserted.
- "Disc protection" is switched on in the main menu (see page 27).

- There is no electric current.
- 99 titles have already been recorded on the disc.
- The recording start time is less than 3 minutes from the time it was programmed.

You cannot program the timer under the following circumstances:

- A recording is already in progress.
- The start time required is in the past.
- Seven timer recordings have already been programmed.

Multiple overlapping timer programs:





- The earlier recording takes priority.
- When the earlier recording ends, the later one will start.
- When two recordings begin at the same time, the first to be input takes priority.

If the disc is damaged, it is possible that the recording will not be done properly. Even if the "Recording OK" message appears in the "Status" field, this is not necessarily true in this case.

Recording from external sources

Recording from external components

You can record from an external source, e.g. a camcorder or video recorder connected to one of the recorder's external inputs.

1. The component that you wish to record from must be properly connected to the DVD recorder. Further information can be found on Page 16.
2. Press DVD-AV/  several times to select the external input which is to be used to make the recording.
 - Tuner: integrated tuner
 - AV1: EURO AV1 AUDIO VIDEO to the rear of the housing
 - AV2: EURO AV2 DECODER to the rear of the housing
 - AV3: AUDIO AV IN 3 / VIDEO IN 3 to the rear of the housing
 - AV4: AUDIO IN 4 / VIDEO IN 4 / S-Video IN to the front of the housing
 - DV: DV IN to the front of the housing.
3. Insert a writable disc. If you insert an empty disc, it is first initialised automatically by the recorder (see page 24).
4. Set the recording quality (see page 24).
5. Press  once.
Recording begins (the red REC comes on in the unit's display window).
Recording will go on until you press  or until the disc is full.
You can find out about specifying the length of the recording under "Immediate Timer Recording" on page 43.
6. To stop the recording press .

Note: If your source is copy-protected by Copy-Guard, you cannot use this recorder to record from it. Read the copyright notes on page 12.

General "DV" information

With DV (Digital Video, also known as i.LINK), you can use a DV cable as the audio, video, data and control signals input / output to connect a camcorder that has DV to this recorder. The i.LINK interface complies with the IEEE 1394-1995 standard.

"i.LINK" and the "i.LINK" logo are trademarks.

- This recorder is only compatible with DV-format (DV-25) camcorders. Digital satellite tuners and digital VHS video recorders are not compatible.
- You cannot connect more than one DV camcorder at a time to this recorder.
- You cannot control this recorder with external devices that are connected via the DV IN socket (incl. two DVD recorders).
- The camcorder connected via the DV IN socket cannot necessarily, in every case, be controlled.
- Digital camcorders can usually record audio as 16 bit/48 kHz stereo or twin stereo tracks with 12 bit/32 kHz. This recorder can only record one stereo audio track. Set "Record → DV sound" as required or Audio 1 or Audio 2 (see page 25).
- The sampling rate of the digital sound input to the DV IN socket must be either 32 or 48 kHz (not 44.1 kHz).
- Recording may suffer from interference if the camcorder stops playing back, if a part of the tape that has not been recorded on is played back, if the electricity supply to the camcorder is cut off, or if the DV cable comes out.
- When "Record DV sound" is set to "Audio 2" and there is no Audio 2 signal, „Record → DV sound" will automatically be set to "Audio 1".

DV messages

When you are using the DV IN socket, the following messages may appear on the screen.

Not connected to camcorder

The camcorder is not properly connected, or the camcorder is switched off.

Too many devices connected

This recorder's DV socket only supports the connection of one camcorder.

Check tape

There is no tape in the device that is connected.

Incompatible device

The recorder is unable to control the camcorder.

Information is being reloaded

The camcorder is updating data for DV.

Camera mode

The camcorder is set to camera mode.

Troubleshooting

If you are not receiving images and/or sound via the DV IN socket, check the following:
The DV cable must be properly connected.
Switch off the camcorder that is connected, and switch it back on.
Tune the audio input in to the DVD recorder.

Note: This DVD recorder cannot necessarily control every camcorder that is connected to it.



Recording from external sources



Recording from a digital camcorder

You can record from a camcorder that is connected to the DV IN socket in the recorder's front panel. You can use the recorder's remote to control a camcorder and the recorder. Before recording, make sure that the audio input has been set up for the DV IN socket (see page 25).

Notes:

- The source signal must be in the DV-25 format.
- The DVD recorder cannot control all camcorders.
- If you use a DV cable to connect a second DVD recorder, you cannot use the first device to control the second DVD recorder.
- You cannot use a device that is connected to the DV IN socket to control the DVD recorder remotely.
- You cannot record the date and time information from a DV cassette.

1. The digital camcorder must be connected to the DV IN socket at the front of the housing. Further information can be found on Page 16.
2. Check that the DV audio input fulfils the necessary conditions.
You can choose from between Audio 1 (original audio) and Audio 2 (overdubbed audio).
The DV input is set using the "Record → DV sound" submenu of the main menu (see page 25).
3. Press DVD-AV/ repeatedly to select the DV input.
"DV" appears in the DVD recorder's display window and on the screen.
4. Look for the point on the camcorder tape that you wish to record from.
For the best results, you should stop the playback at the point that you wish to record from. Depending on the camcorder, you can use the Stop, PLAY and PAUSE functions on the DVD recorder.
5. Press  once to start the recording.
 - The recording is automatically stopped if the

- DVD recorder fails to recognise a signal.
- You can pause or stop the recording by pressing  or . You cannot use the DVD recorder to control the camcorder while recording is in progress.
- In Video mode, the last frame of the recording is shown on the screen for a short time after recording has ended.
- For timer recordings to work properly on this recorder, the digital camcorder should be switched on and operational.



Title List and Chapter List (VR)


The "Title List-Original" Menu VR

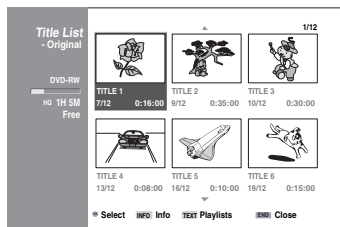
The playlist (see page 49) is created and edited in the "Title List-Original" menu, titles can be deleted and other changes can be made to the original content of the disc. Different playlists (dependent on the program with an audio CD) can be created and edited.

The individual titles can be played directly from the menu. The unit must be in stop mode in order to edit a title in this menu.



1. Press DISC-M/  to call up the "Title List-Original" menu.

With more than 6 titles use  /  to display the previous/next page.

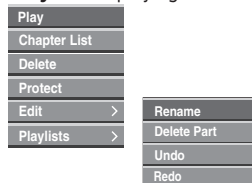

- **Play**: Starts playing the selected title.
- **Rename**: Edits the title name. (page 56)

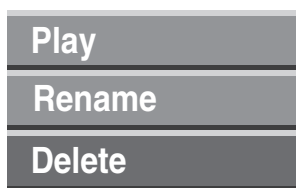
Deleting a Title


Before finalizing a disc you can delete titles recorded on the disc.

Caution:

- If you delete a title from a DVD-R disc, the title is hidden from the Title List but the available recording time does not increase.
- If you delete a title from a DVD-RW disc, the remaining recording time will only increase if the title is the last one on the disc. In this case it is actually deleted, in other cases it is simply hidden.

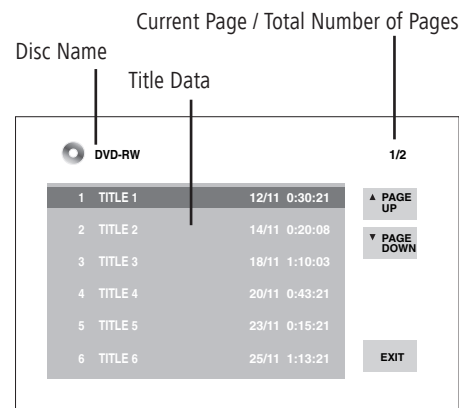

Press **OK** or  to play the selected title. Using  /  and **OK** you can scroll up and down the list as required or you can use "Exit" to quit the menu.

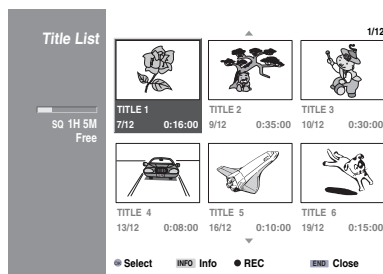

Title and Chapter Editing

Original Lists and Playlists

VR

If you edit the original lists (for titles and chapters) you change the content of the disc. If, for example, you delete a title or a chapter, the title or chapter is deleted from the disc.

However, if you edit a playlist you do not change the content of the disc. Example: If you delete a title from the playlist, you are simply telling the DVD recorder not to play the title. However, it is not deleted from the disc.

Titles, Chapters and Parts

VR

Titles in the disc's original content contain one or more chapters. If you insert a title into a playlist, all the chapters within that title are also transferred. The chapters in a playlist behave in exactly the same way as those on a DVD-Video disc.

Parts are sections of original or playlist titles. You can add parts to a playlist via the "Title List-Original" and "Chapter List-Original" menus. You can also delete parts from a playlist.

Notes:

- If you add, delete or move parts, the start and end images may be slightly different.
- During playback of a playlist there may be short pauses between the individual items. This is not a malfunction.

Adding Chapter Markers


VR



You can insert a chapter marker anywhere in a playlist or an original title during recording or playback.

Once the chapters have been marked, the chapter search can be used and chapters can be deleted, combined and moved in the Chapter List-Original or the Chapter List-Playlist.

You can insert up to 999 chapter markers.

1. Play a title (original or from a playlist).
2. Press C-SET  at the point you want a new chapter to start. The above display appears on the screen.

Notes:


- Chapter markers can also be added automatically at regular intervals.
- You can change this interval in the main menu "Recording → Automatic Chapter" (see "Automatic Chapter" on page 25).

Changing Title Thumbnails

VR Video



Each title displayed in the "Title List" menu is also represented by a thumbnail. These can be changed as you wish.


1. Play a title (original or playlist).
2. Press TITLE  when the desired new picture appears on the screen. A new thumbnail is then entered into the "Original" or "Play-list" menu.

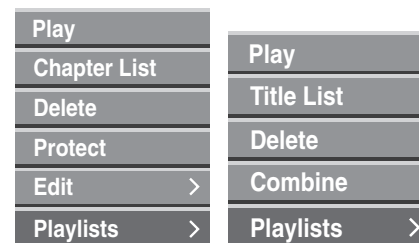
Creating a New Playlist

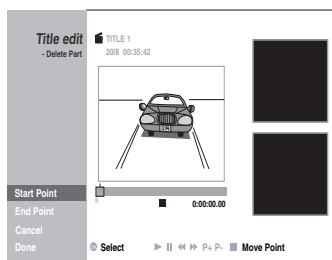


Menu options for "Title List-Original"

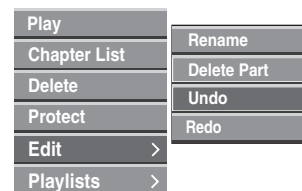

Undoing the Last Deletion

Playing your Recordings on other DVD Players

Finalized Video, DVD+R or DVD+RW discs can be played on most DVD players.

A few DVD players can also play prerecorded finalized and unfinalized DVD-RW discs in VR mode. Supported discs are listed in the manual for each player. Finalizing „fixes“ the recordings so that the discs can be played on normal DVD players or computers with DVD-ROM drives. During finalization of a disc in Video mode a disc menu is created for navigating the disc. This is accessed by pressing the DISC-M/ key.

Note: Unfinalized DVD+RW discs can be played on normal DVD players provided that their recordings have not been edited at a later date.

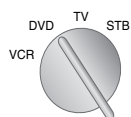

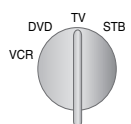

Use the rotary switch to select VCR, TV or a set-top box. Loewe video recorders, Loewe television sets and the d-box which is commonly used in Germany as a set-top box are set up ex-factory.

Using the drive buttons in the TV and STB position for a VCR, DVD or digital recorder

With both the TV and the STB, you can switch over the six drive buttons (◀▶, ▶▶, ▶▶▶, ●, ⏸, ■) so that they control a VCR or DVD player/recorder (ex-factory it is set to control the built-in "Digital Recorder Plus"):

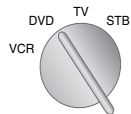


First set the switch to the main TV or STB function.

Then press the **END** and *** EPG** buttons simultaneously for at least 5 seconds. The display in the top left of the remote control will flash twice.

Key in the figures 988. The display will flash twice more. Now set the switch to the function that you require for the drive buttons:

to DVD or VCR, or TV if the digital recorder is to be used. Press the **# PIP** button to finalise the setting. The display will flash another two times.

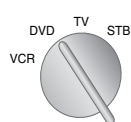
Setting the remote to control devices made by other manufacturers

You can set the remote to work with other video recorders, DVD players or set-top boxes if the infra-red code of the device type appears in the code list or if it is held in the RC3's code memory.

Even if the device's manufacturer appears in the code list, it could be that the device cannot be controlled.

Using a code input to set the remote

Look for the code number for your device in the code list (see from page 63). The list is sorted according to device type – DVD, VCR, STB – and alphabetically by manufacturer. You will find one or more code numbers next to the manufacturer name.

Use the rotary switch to select whether you want to switch to using a VCR, DVD device or a set-top box.

Press the **END** and *** EPG** buttons simultaneously for at least 5 seconds. The display in the top left of the remote control will flash twice.

Key in, one at a time, the four figures that you have found in the code list (e.g. 0539 for the Loewe DVD player).

After each figure that you key in, the display will flash once, and after the last figure it will flash

twice. If the figure was wrong, the display will stay illuminated for longer. This means that the code number has not been accepted. If a double-flash signifies that the code has been accepted, you can test the functionality of the device that you have programmed.

If you are unable to control the device, or have difficulty in controlling it properly, repeat the code input with the next code in the list. If there are no other codes listed for the manufacturer in question, try using the remote control's suggestions.

Using the remote's suggestions to set up remote control

Switch on the device which you want to convert the remote control to. Note that Standby is inadequate!

Use the rotary switch to select whether you want to switch to using a VCR, DVD device or a set-top box.

Press the **END** and *** EPG** buttons simultaneously for at least 5 seconds. The display in the top left of the remote control will flash twice.

Key in, one by one, the figures 991. The display will flash once after each figure is input.

Press the **# PIP** button to select the first code.

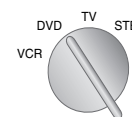
Point the remote at the device which you want to convert it to control. Watch the device.

Now press the ▶ (Play) or **On/Off** buttons on the remote control.

Wait a moment for the device to react. If the device fails to react, this is not the right code. Press the **# PIP** button again to get the next code.
