- Be careful not to put your hand into the disc tray.
- Do not place anything other than the disc in the disc tray.
- Exterior interference such as lightning and static electricity can affect normal operation of this HDD & DVD RECORDER. If this occurs, turn the HDD & DVD RECORDER off and on again with the DVD POWER button, or disconnect and then reconnect the AC power cord to the AC power outlet. The HDD & DVD RECORDER will operate normally.
- Be sure to remove the disc and turn off the HDD & DVD RECORDER after use.
- Disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet when you don't intend to use the HDD & DVD RECORDER for long periods of time.
- Clean the disc by wiping in a straight line from the inside to the outside of the disc.

Maintenance of Cabinet

For safety reasons, be sure to disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet.

- Do not use benzene, thinner, or other solvents for cleaning.
- · Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth.

HDD (Hard Disc Drive)

The hard disk has a high storage density, which enables long recording durations and quick access to written data. However, it can easily be damaged by shock, vibration or dust and should be kept away from magnets. To avioid losing important data, observe the following precautions.

- Do not use the HDD & DVD RECORDER in a place subject to extreame changes in temperature.
- Do not apply a strong shock to the HDD & DVD RECORDER.
- Do not place the HDD & DVD RECORDER in a location subject to mechanical vibrations or in an unstable location.

- Do not place the HDD & DVD RECORDER on top of a heat source.
- Do not disconnect the AC power cord while the power is on.
- Do not attempt to change the hard disk. This may result in a malfunction.

Should the hard disk be damaged, you cannot recover lost data. The hard disk is only a temporary storage space.

Disc Handling

• Use discs with regular shapes. If an irregular disc (a disc with a special shape) is used, this HDD & DVD RECORDER may be damaged.



Holding discs

 Avoid touching the surface of a disc where recording is performed.



DVD-RAM, DVD-RW and DVD-R

- Clean with an optional DVD-RAM/PD disc cleaner.
- Do not use cleaners or cloths for CDs to clean DVD-RAM/ -RW/-R discs.



DVD-Video, Audio-CD

 Wipe off dirt or contamination on the disc with a soft cloth.

Cautions on handling discs

- Do not write on the printed side with a ball-point pen or pencil.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays or antistatic.
 Also, do not use volatile chemicals, such as benzene or thinner.
- Do not apply labels or stickers to discs. (Do not use discs fixed with exposed tape adhesive or leftover peeled-off stickers.)
- · Do not use scratch-proof protectors or covers.

- Do not use discs printed with label printers available on the market.
- · Do not load warped or cracked discs.

Disc Storage

Be careful not to harm the disc because the data on these discs is highly vulnerable to the environment.

- · Do not keep under direct sunlight.
- · Keep in a cool ventilated area.
- · Store vertically.
- · Keep in a clean protection jacket.
- Did you move your HDD & DVD RECORDER suddenly from a cold place to a warm place?
 In this case, do not connect the plug to the power outlet and wait for two hours. Then insert the disc and try to playback again. It will work properly when condensation has evaporated.

Disc Specifications

DVD-Video

- A digital versatile disc (DVD) can contain up to 135-minutes of images, 8-language audio and 32 subtitle languages. It is equipped with MPEG-2 picture compression and Dolby 3D surrounding, allowing you to enjoy vivid and clear theater quality images in the comfort of your own home.
- When switching from the first layer to the second layer of a double-layered DVD Video disc, there may be momentary distortion in the image and sound. This is not a malfunction of the unit.
- Once a DVD-RW/-R recorded in Video Mode is finalized, it becomes DVD-Video.

Audio CD

- An audio disc on which 44.1kHz PCM Audio is recorded.
- Plays CD-DA format audio CD-R and CD-RW discs.
 The unit may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW discs due to the condition of the recording.

CD-RW/-R

MP3 CD-RW/-R

- Only CD-R discs with MP3 files recorded with ISO9660 or JOLIET format can be played back
- Only MP3 files with the ".mp3", ".MP3" extension can be used.
- For MP3 files recorded with a VBR(Variable Bit Rates), from 32 Kbps to 320 Kbps, the sound may cut in out
- Playable bitrate range is from 56Kbps to 320Kbps.
- The unit can handle a maximum of 1000 files and folders.

JPEG CD-RW/-R

- Only JPEG files with the ".jpg", ".JPG" extension can be used.
- The unit can handle a maximum of 1000 files and folders.
- · Maximum size of progressive JPEG is 3M pixels.
- · MOTION JPEG is not supported.

Using CD-RW/-R

- Use a 700MB(80 minutes) CD-RW/-R disc.
 If possible, do not use a 800MB(90 minutes) or above disc, as the disc may not play back.
- If the CD-RW/-R disc was not recorded as a closed session, you may experience a delay in the early playback time, and all recorded files may not play.
- Some CD-RW/-R discs may not be playable with this unit, depending on the device which was used to burn them.

For contents recorded on CD-RW/-R media from CDs for your personal use, playability may vary depending on contents and discs.

DVD-R Disc Playback and Recording

- Once a DVD-R recorded in Video Mode is finalized, it becomes a DVD-Video disc.
- You can record onto the available space on the disc and perform editing functions such as giving titles to discs and programs and erasing programs before finalizing.
- When programming is erased from a DVD-R, that space does not become available. Once an area on a DVD-R is recorded on, that area is no longer available for recording, whether the recording is erased or not.

- It takes about 30 seconds for the unit to complete recording management information after recording finishes.
- This product optimizes the DVD-R for each recording. Optimizing is carried out when you start recording after inserting the disc or turning on the unit.
 Recording onto the disc may become impossible if optimizing is carried out too many times.
- Playback may be impossible in some cases due to the condition of recording.
- This unit can play back DVD-R discs recorded and finalized with a Samsung DVD video recorder. It may not be able to play some DVD-R discs depending on the disc and the condition of the recording.

DVD-RW Disc Playback and Recording

- Recording and playback can be performed on DVD-RW discs in both the Video and VR Modes.
- Once a DVD-RW recorded in VR Mode or Video mode is finalized, you cannot perform additional recording.
- Once a DVD-RW recorded in Video Mode is finalized, it becomes DVD-Video.
- In both modes, playback can be performed before and after finalization, but additional recording, deleting and editing can not be performed after finalization.
- If you want to record the disc in VR Mode and then record in V Mode, be sure to execute Format.
 Be careful when executing Format because all the recorded data may be lost.
- A DVD-RW blank disc is initialized to VR Mode when first initialized.

• DVD-RW (VR mode)

- This is a format that is used for recording data on a DVD-RAM or DVD-RW disc. You can record multiple titles, edit, delete, partial delete, create a playlist, etc.
- A disc that is recorded in this mode may not be played by an existing DVD player.

• DVD-RW (Video mode)

- This is a format that is used for recording data on a DVD-RW or DVD-R disc. The disc can be played by an existing DVD player once it has been finalized.
- If a disc that has been recorded in Video Mode by a different maker's recorder but has not been finalized, it cannot be played or additionally be recorded by this HDD & DVD RECORDER.

DVD-RAM Disc Playback and Recording

- DVD-RAM discs come with or without a cartridge. For this product, we recommend DVD-RAM discs that come without cartridges.
- Ensure that the recording mode is set to VR mode.
 Otherwise, this product will not be able to play the recording.
- You cannot play a DVD-RAM in most DVD players due to compatibility issues.
- Only DVD-RAM standard Version 2.0. discs can be played in this unit.
- DVD-RAM recorded on this unit may not work with other DVD players. To determine compatibility with these DVD-RAM discs, refer to the user's manual for the player.
- For cartridge type DVD-RAM discs, remove the cartridge and use the disc only.

General Features

The HDD (Hard Disk Drive) & DVD RECORDER allows you to record and play high quality digital video on DVD-RAM/-RW/-R discs or on the HDD. You can also edit digital images on DVD-RAM/-RW/-R discs or HDD.

HDD Recording

You can record up to 208 hours of video (in Extend EP mode) on the internal 120GB (gigabyte) hard disk (HDD). With both recordable DVD and a high-capacity HDD in the same recorder, you have the flexibility to keep recordings on the HDD for quick access anytime, or record to DVD for archiving or playing on other DVD players.

Copy between HDD and DVD

You can copy recordings from the HDD to recordable DVD, or from DVD to the HDD. Usually you can use the high speed copy feature.

You can also choose to copy material at a different recording quality from the original. For example, you might want to copy at XP mode (highest quality) recording on the HDD to SP (standard play) quality on a DVD so that you can fit other recordings on the same disc.

Simultaneous Recording and Playback

Playback and recording for both the DVD and the built-in hard disk drive (HDD) are completely independent. For example you can record a broadcast program to either a recordable DVD or the HDD, while watching another recording you already made on the same DVD or on the HDD.

High quality digital audio and video recording and playback

Record up to 16-hours of video with a double sided 9.4 GB DVD-RAM disc, up to 8-hours of video with a 4.7 GB DVD-RAM/-RW/-R disc, up to 208 hours of video with the HDD, depending on the recording mode.

Selectable Recording Mode

You can set your HDD & DVD RECORDER to one of four different recording speeds, each varying in recording quality and length. EP (6Hr or 8Hr) mode yields the most recording time, LP & SP modes provide less recording time with higher quality recording, XP mode gives you the highest quality recording.

Creating a DVD video title using DVD-RW/-R disc

With the HDD & DVD RECORDER, you can create your own DVD Video titles on 4.7 GB DVD-RW/-R discs.

Copying data from a digital camcorder using a DV input jack

Record DV Device video onto HDD, DVD-RAM, DVD-RW or DVD-R discs using the DV input jack (IEEE 1394-4pin/4pin). (See page 83)

High quality progressive scan

Progressive scanning provides high resolution and flicker free video. The 10-bit 54-MHz DAC and 2D Y/C Separating Circuitry provides the highest image playback and recording quality. (See pages 44~46)

A variety of functions with an easy-to-use user interface

The integrated menu system allows you to perform desired operations both easily and conveniently. With a HDD, DVD-RAM or DVD-RW disc, you can edit recorded video, create a playlist, edit video in a specific sequence according to your requirements.



How to use the HDD & DVD RECORDER

Step 1 Select the disc type or HDD

This unit can record on the following types of discs. If you want to repeatedly record on the same disc or you want to edit the disc after recording, select a rewritable DVD-RW or DVD-RAM type disc. If you want to save a recording without any changes, choose a non-rewritable DVD-R. You can record files directly to the built-in HDD or edit a recorded file.









Unlike a VCR, the HDD & DVD RECORDER automatically starts formatting when an unused disc is inserted. This is required for the preparation of recording on a disc.

Using the HDD

Formatting unneccessory.

Using a DVD-RAM

This type of disc can be formatted in DVD-Video Recording format (VR mode). You can edit recorded video and create a playlist and edit video in a specific sequence according to your requirements.

Using a DVD-RW

This type of disc can be formatted in either DVD-Video format (V mode) or DVD-Video Recording format (VR mode). For an unused disc, a message that asks whether to format in VR Mode or not is displayed. You can play a Video mode disc on various DVD components. A VR mode disc allows more varied editing.

Using a DVD-R

This type of disc can be formatted in DVD Video format. After formatting is complete, you can record on the disc. You can play these type of discs on various DVD components only when they have been finalized.



- You can only use either the VR or Video mode on a DVD-RW, but not both at the same time.
- You can change the DVD-RW to another format by reinitializing. It should be noted that the disc's data will be lost when changing formats.



Step 3 Recording

There are two different recording methods, Direct Recording and Timer Recording. Timer recording is classified as Follows:

Recording mode: XP (high quality mode), SP (standard quality mode), LP (long recording mode), and EP (extended mode)



Step 4 Playing

You can select the title you want to play in a displayed menu and then immediately start playback.

A DVD consists of sections, called titles, and sub-sections, called chapters.

During recording, a title is created between two points where you start and stop recording. Chapters will be created automatically when you finalize recording on DVD-RW/-R discs in Video mode.

The chapter's length (interval between chapters) varies according to the recording mode.



Step 5 Editing a recorded disc

Editing on discs is easier than conventional video tapes. The HDD & DVD RECORDER supports many different edit functions, possible only with DVDs and HDD

With a simple and easy edit menu, you can operate various edit functions, such as delete, copy, rename, lock, etc., on a recorded title.

Creating a playlist (DVD-RAM/-RW in VR mode, HDD)

With this HDD & DVD RECORDER, you can create a new playlist on a disc and edit it without the original, pre-existing recording.



Step 6 Finalizing & Playing on other DVD components

To play your DVD on other DVD components, finalizing may be necessary. First, finish all editing and recording operations, then finalize the disc.

When using a DVD-RW disc in VR Mode

DVD discs recorded in VR mode can only be played back in DVD recorders, not players.

When using a DVD-RW disc in Video Mode

The disc should be finalized first to enable playback on anything other than this HDD & DVD RECORDER. No more editing or recording can be made on the disc once it has been finalized.

To enable recording on the disc again, the disc must be unfinalized.


When using a DVD-R disc

You should finalize the disc to play it on a component other than this HDD & DVD RECORDER. You cannot edit or record on the disc once it has been finalized.

Preparing the Remote Control


Install Batteries in the Remote Control

- · Open the battery cover on the back of the remote control.
- Insert two AAA batteries. Make sure that the polarities (+ and -) are aligned correctly.
- Replace the battery cover.

If the remote does not operate properly:

- Check the polarity + of the batteries (Dry-Cell)
- Check if the batteries are drained.
- · Check if remote sensor is blocked by obstacles.
- · Check if there is any fluorescent lighting nearby.

Dispose of batteries according to local environmental regulations. Do not put them in the household trash.



Setting the Remote Control

You can control certain functions of another manufacturer's TV with this remote control. Control function buttons involve: TV POWER, CH ∧ ∨, TV VOL + -, number buttons, TV MUTE, INPUT button.

Connect your cable box to the G-Link jack on the rear panel of the HDD & DVD RECORDER using the IR Blaster cable as shown. This connection enables you to control the cable box's power and channels.



Getting Connected






Step 5 : Connecting the Power Cord



"Auto" appears in the panel display. This means that the current time is being set automatically (Auto Program) through the antenna under connection and also the channel is being set. The setup may take a few minutes.

When the HDD & DVD RECORDER operates normally, the current time is automatically set and displayed in the front panel display.





NOTE

After the current time is set automatically, HDD & DVD RECORDER will perform Auto Channel Memory for about 3 minutes. If power is turned on while Auto Channel Memory is in process, Auto Channel Memory will stop. In this case, do Auto Channel Memory from MENU (See page 34).







- Select Antenna or Cable TV(depending on the hookup you chose) using the ▲▼ buttons, then press the ENTER or ▶ button.
- Select Auto Channel Memory using the ▲▼ buttons, then press the ENTER or ▶ button. Auto Channel Memory will be performed.





 Press the RETURN or ENTER button to stop Auto Channel Memory.

Manual Channel Set

Manual Channel Set can be used after you have first performed Auto Channel Memory. Use the Manual Channel Setting to delete unnecessary channels after using the Auto Channel Memory.

- With the unit in Stop mode, press the **MENU** button.
- Press the ▲▼ buttons to select **Setup**, then press the **ENTER** or ▶ button.

Press the ▲▼ buttons to select Channel

Add/Delete, then press the ENTER or ▶ button.



Press the ▲▼ or number buttons to select the channels you want to add or delete on the **Select channel** screen. Then, press the **ENTER** button.



- Using ▲▼ buttons for channel selection allows the user to add/delete one channel at a time.
- Using CH (⊙ ⊙) buttons for channel selection jumps to the next channel memorized in Auto Channel Memory.
- **7** Press the **◄** ▶ buttons to select **Add** or **Delete**, then press the **ENTER** button.
 - The message "Channel is added." or "Channel is deleted." will be displayed in the center of the screen.
 - Continue to add or delete as many channels as you want to memorize or delete. This can be used to add channels not stored automatically due to weak signal strength.

Auto Power Off Setting

This feature automatically turns off your HDD & DVD RECORDER if you do not press any button for 2 or 6 hours

Press the ▲▼ buttons to select System, then press the ENTER or ▶ button. System menu will be displayed.

- Press the ▲▼ buttons to select the desired item, then press the ENTER or ▶ button.
 - Off: Auto power off is disabled.
 - 2 Hour : HDD & DVD RECORDER will automatically turn off for 2 hours after the last button is pressed.
 - 6 Hour : HDD & DVD RECORDER will automatically turn off for 6 hours after the last button is pressed.

If the turn off time set with the Auto Power off function is reached during playback or recording, the device will operate until the playback or recording is finished.

CM Skip Time Setting

When a program recorded on a HDD, a DVD-RAM, a DVD-RW, or a DVD-R is played, the unit can be set to automatically skip a portion of the program corresponding to a CM(commercial) skip time set by the user.

- When the time set is more than a remaining time of a play list, the next scene is played.
- CM Skip does not work in still picture mode.
- When a set time is greater than the remaining time of a scene, last title, or last track that is currently displayed, a prohibition mark appears.
- CM Skip releases Repeat (including Repeat A-B, Chapter, and Title).
- CM Skip may not operate with some DVD-Video discs.

EP Mode Time Setting

You can select one of four recording modes by pressing the **REC MODE** button repeatedly.

EP mode is one of four REC modes (XP, SP, LP, EP). In EP(Extended Play) mode, you can set recording time to 6 or 8 hours with this setting.

With the unit in Stop mode, press the **MENU** button

Automatic Chapter Creator

The Automatic Chapter Creator function doesn't operate when you record the current TV program on the TV GUIDE screen.





(V mode)



- On-Screen Menu: For the on-screen menu of your HDD & DVD RECORDER.

- The selected language will only appear if it is supported on the disc.

Setting up the Audio Options

You can connect the HDD & DVD RECORDER to an external amp or Home theater.

Allows you to setup the Audio device and sound status depending on the audio system in use.

- With the unit in Stop mode, press the MENU button
- Press the ▲▼ buttons to select **Setup**, then press the **ENTER** or ▶ button.



Press the ▲▼ buttons to select Audio, then press the ENTER or ▶ button.

Audio setup menu will be displayed.



- Press the ▲▼ buttons to select the desired audio option, then press the ENTER or ▶ button.

 Press the RETURN or ◀ button to return to the previous menu.

Digital Output

- PCM : Select this when your equipment is not Dolby Digital compatible.
- Bitstream : Outputs Dolby Digital (or MPEG-2) audio as bitstream. Select this when your AV receiver or AV amplifier has a Dolby Digital (or MPEG-2) Decoder.



 Be sure to select the correct Digital Output or you will hear no sound or a loud noise.

DTS

- Off: Doesn't output DTS signal. Select this when your AV receiver or AV amplifier does not have DTS decoder.
- On: Outputs DTS Bitstream via digital output when you play DTS track. Select this only when your AV receiver (or AV amplifier) have DTS decoder.



 When DTS soundtrack is played, sound does not output from AV Audio Output.

Dynamic Compression

This is only active when a Dolby Digital signal is detected.

- 1. Off: You can enjoy the movie with the standard Dynamic Range.
- On: When Movie soundtracks are played at low volume or from smaller speakers, the system can apply appropriate compression to make low-level content more intelligible and prevent dramatic passages from getting too loud.

Setting up the Video display Options

This function allows you to setup the TV screen settings. This function depends on disc type. It may not work for some disc types.

With the unit in Stop mode, press the MENU button.

Press the ▲▼ buttons to select **Setup**, then press the **ENTER** or ▶ button.




 4:3 Letter Box: Select when you want to see the total 16:9 ratio screen DVD supplies, even though you have a TV with a 4:3 ratio screen. Black bars will appear at the top and bottom of the screen.



 4:3 Pan/Scan: Select this for conventional size TVwhen you want to see the central portion of the 16:9 screen. (Extreme left and right side of movie picture will be cut off.)



16:9 Wide: You can view the full 16:9 picture on your widescreen TV.



Input Level

Adjusts the level of the input signal.

Darker : If you feel the screen is too light and you want to make the sceen darker.

Lighter: If you feel the screen is too dark and you want to make the sceen lighter.

Black Level

Adjusts the black level of the screen.

This is the standard NTSC reference black level for consistent brightness/ contrast across all sources.
 Select this when you want a darker screen.

 7.5 IRE: This will enhance the black level for increased brightness/contrast when viewing DVDs. Select this when you want a lighter screen.

3D Noise Reduction (motion adaptive noise reduction)

1. Off: Normal

2. On: Provides a clear picture through noise reduction (for recording).

Setting up the Progressive scan

If your TV supports Progressive Scan, press the **P.SCAN** button on the front of the HDD & DVD RECORDER. To view 'Progressive scan mode', first connect the component cable.

(See page 22)

Be sure the Component cables are connected properly.

With the unit in Stop mode, press the **P.SCAN** button on the front of the HDD & DVD RECORDER.

The message "Press [Yes] to confirm Progressive scan mode. Otherwise, press [No]." will appear.

Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select **Yes**, and then press the **ENTER** button.



The message "Please, set your TV to Progressive input. To deactivate, press [STOP] key." will appear. Press the **ENTER** button.



The message "Video Output Mode Progressive Scan" will appear. The video will now be Progressive Scan.





- If the P.SCAN button on the HDD & DVD RECORDER's front panel is pressed during playback, the message "This function is possible only on stop mode" appears on the screen.
- Progressive setting is only available when the HDD & DVD RECORDER is in stop mode.

Canceling the Progressive scan

With the unit in Stop mode, press the P.SCAN button on the front of the HDD & DVD RECORDER. The message "Press [Yes] to confirm Interlace scan mode. Otherwise, press [No]." will appear. Press the ◀ ▶ buttons to select **Yes**, and then press the ENTER button.

The message "Video Output Mode Interlace Scan" will appear.

Setting up the Parental Control

Playing a Disc



- ◆ Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.
- Place a disc gently into the tray with the disc's label facing up.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to close the disc tray.

 Your HDD & DVD RECORDER closes the disc tray and plays the disc automatically.
 - The HDD & DVD RECORDER does not play discs automatically after the initial power on.
 - When the HDD & DVD RECORDER is powered on and a disc is in the tray, the unit will be activated and wait in stop status.
 - Press the PLAY(
) button to start playback.
 - If you insert an MP3 Disc, your HDD & DVD RECORDER will display the file list on the screen and start playing.
 - If you insert a JPEG Disc, folders and files are displayed in the thumbnail picture.
 - If you want the unit to play automatically when it is powered on with a disc in the unit, power on with the PLAY(•) button.
- Press the **STOP(**①) button to stop playback.



■ When you stop playing back a disc, the HDD & DVD RECORDER remembers where you stopped, so when you press PLAY(→) button again, it will pick up where you left off. (Unless the disc is removed or the HDD & DVD RECORDER is unplugged, or if you press the STOP(→) button twice.).



- Do not move your HDD & DVD RECORDER while playing, as this may cause damage to the disc.
- Make sure to press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open or close the disc tray.
- Do not push the disc tray while it is being opened or closed, as this may cause a product malfunction.
- Do not place foreign materials on or in the disc tray.
- Some functions may perform differently or be disabled depending on the disc type.
 If this occurs, refer to the instructions written on the disc case.
- Be especially careful that children's fingers are not caught between the disc tray and the tray chassis when it closes.
- You must only insert one DVD disc at a time. Inserting two or more discs will not allow playback and may cause damage to the HDD & DVD RECORDER.

Using the Disc Menu & Title Menu

Some type of discs contain a dedicated menu system that allows you to select special functions for title, chapter, audio track, subtitle, film preview, information on characters, etc.

For DVD-VIDEO discs



- Press the **DISC MENU** button to enter the disc menu of the disc.
 - Move to the setup menu related to playback operation.
 - You can select audio language and subtitle etc. provided by the disc.
- Press the TITLE MENU button to move to the disc's title menu of the disc.
 - Press this button if the disc contains more than one title. Some discs may not support the title menu functionality.

For HDD/DVD-RAM/-RW/-R Disc









Press the **TITLE LIST** button to display title list.



- Title List: Title List is a list of previously recorded programs. If a title is deleted, that title cannot be played again.
- Play List: This refers to a list of user-selected titles. When one playlist is played, only the scene selected by the user will play and then stop.
 Even if the playlist is deleted, the original recording will

remain. (VR mode only)

Skipping Chapters, Tracks or Markers

Press and hold the **SEARCH** () buttons during pause, the disc will play slowly at 1/4 speed. If the button is released, the pause operation will resume.

About ANYKEY

The ANYKEY function allows you to easily search for a desired scene by accessing title, chapter, track, time. You can also change the subtitle and audio settings and set some features including Marker, Angle, Zoom, Repeat, Select Media, Disc Manager.

- Enter the time in the sequence of hours, minutes, and seconds using the number buttons, then press the ENTER button.



- This may not work for some discs. When an audio CD(CD-DA) or an MP3 disc is inserted, depending on the disc type, the information display may not appear.
 - The Time Search function does not operate in some discs.
 - To make the screen disappear, press the ANYKEY button again

The selected entry (title) will be played back.

- About INFO button -

During playback, if you press the **INFO** button once during playback, the system information screen appears.: Displays Active Status, Background Status, and Main Screen information.

DVD-RW: When an unused DVD-RW disc is first inserted, the message "Uninitialized Disc Do you want to initialize this disc?" will be displayed. If you select **Yes**, the disc will be formatted in VR mode.

DVD-R: Formatting DVD is unnecessary and only Video Mode Recording is supported.

DVD-RW(V mode)/-R

- Chapters will be created automatically when you finalize recording on DVD-RW/-R discs in Video mode.

Once "Copy Once" has been recorded, recording cannot be done anymore.

- Content Protection for Recordable Media (CPRM)
CPRM is a mechanism that ties a recording to the media on which it is recorded. It is supported by some HDD & DVD RECORDERs, but not by many DVD players. Each blank recordable DVD has a unique 64-bit media ID etched in the BCA. When protected content is recorded onto the disc, it can be encrypted with a 56-bit C2 (Cryptomeria) cipher derived from the media ID.

During playback, the ID is read from the BCA and used to generate a key to decrypt the contents of the disc. If the contents of the disc are copied to other media, the ID will be absent or wrong and the data will not be decryptable.



· Title List

Title List is a list of previously recorded programs. If a title is deleted, that title cannot be played again.

· Play List

This refers to a list of user-selected titles. When one playlist is played, only the scene selected by the user will play and then stop.

Even if the playlist is deleted, the original recording will remain. (VR mode only)

Recording or editing might not be completed if an error, such as a sudden power failure occurs. Please be aware that a material that has been damaged is unable to be retrieved to its original content.






- Video Window displays TV video while the Guide is displayed
- · Tile displays show title
- · Highlight indicates an active tile
- Info Box provides information for a highlighted item
- Info Button cycles through the various Info Box sizes
- Channel Logo identifies network
- · Record/Remind Icons indicates a show is set to Record or set as a Reminder
- Panel Ad location where show- or product-specific information appears (and also where Panel Menu appears)
- Channel Ad location where show-specific information appears
- Service Bar provides access to the main Guide Services
- Current Service Label indented to indicate current Service displayed



Video Window

The **Video Window** is located in the upper-left corner of the Guide. When you enter the Guide, the TV video for the current show appears in the Video Window. The Video Window also includes a clock display and a lock/unlock icon to indicate the status of the Video Window.

You can set the Video Window to remain on a single channel (lock) or change channels (unlock) as you navigate through **LISTINGS**. With a channel logo or the **LISTINGS** Service Label highlighted, press the Menu button to display the option to Lock/Unlock the Video Window.



Info Box

An **Info Box** contains information about a show, service, ad, or provides general help. A Show Listing Info Box can have up to three sizes: Small, Large, and "No". The default size of the Info Box is Last Used. Press the Info Button to cycle among the sizes. The user may change the default size in the Setup Service.

Info Button

- Pressing the INFO button on the remote cycles between Info box sizes, as available.



Panel Menu



- A Panel Menu appears when the **MENU** or **ENTER** (context dependent) button is pressed on a highlighted tile and additional options are available.
- When a Panel Menu appears, the highlighted tile is parked (changes color).
- The Panel Menu displays over the Panel Ad and below the Video Window.
- Panel Menu options within a Service are described in each respective Service section.
- The up and down arrow moves between the options within the Panel Menu.
- The left and right arrows move to adjacent options unless highlight is on an odometer, where left/right arrows change the odometer choice.
- If a Panel Menu contains more menu options than can be displayed on a single screen, a more ▼ icon appears at the bottom of a menu.

Pressing **ENTER** from an odometer or number entry box moves the highlight to the **default command** button of that Panel Menu (for example, Schedule Reminder).

- Pressing ENTER from a highlighted command button executes the action and closes the Panel Menu.

Can I set a Record or Remind event without highlighting a show title in the Guide?

Yes. TV Guide On Screen has a Manual Record and Remind feature. Highlight Schedule and press menu. Choose the event type, press ENTER and then enter date, start and stop time, channel number, etc.

What do the frequencies for Record and Remind mean?



- 1394 High-speed port that is used to transfer certain types of data in real-time, such as video

- Expanded Info Box A window that covers the right side of the Guide and provides additional information about a topic. This window appears for a highlighted Panel Ad or Channel Ad, or when the Info button is pressed in a Panel Menu when highlighting one of the main Services
- Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) questions and answers for users, based on their past product experience
- Guide TV Guide On Screen Interactive Program Guide that provides show listings, search, schedule, recordings, and setup capabilities
- Highlight A visual cue indicating the current area of focus
- Icons Symbols representing features or services.
 For example,



- Info Box Contains text describing the currently highlighted area in the Guide that may be in the form of help text or information about the highlighted area (e.g., show description)
- Info Button A remote control button that is used to cycle between Info box sizes, as available; page forward, if there are more pages of information (e.g., Panel Ad); or access Help text, as available
- Initial Setup After your device is connected, setup your Guide so you can receive program listings and use Guide recording capabilities; if Setup in not completed initially, the Setup Reminder Screen appears next time

- Setup Service A feature that lets you modify existing Guide settings, modify option settings (e.g., Record defaults), or change channel display settings

- Video Window The video area that appears in the top left corner in the Guide
