



Inserting Batteries



Remote control



Point the remote control at the unit's sensor. Avoid obstacles in the path of the transmission. The maximum range of the remote control is 7 m directly in front of the unit. Keep the transmission window and the unit sensor clean. The procedure can be impaired by direct sunlight or doors of glass cabinets.

Child lock

You can lock the buttons of the unit and the remote control.

- Press and hold **RETURN** and **ENTER** until X HOLD appears in the display. The unit is now locked.
- In order to unlock the child lock, repeat the procedure until X HOLD disappears.

Operating a television set

Change the remote control code to operate your television set.

- Press and hold the TV on and off switch button.
- Enter the two-digit code for your television set.
 - The input must be repeated after batteries are changed.

Switching to AV input on your Panasonic television set

Press AV. Each press of the button switches between TV reception and AV input.

If you use another Panasonic device at the same location, change the mode of the remote control so that you can operate the units independently of each other.

Setting the remote control

Setting the remote control mode for unit.

- · Press FUNCTIONS in stop mode.
- Use ▲▼ to select [To Others] and confirm with ENTER.
- Use ▲▼ to select SETUP and confirm with ENTER.
- Use ▲▼ to select [Others], ▶ to select [Remote Control] and confirm with ENTER.
- Use ▲▼ to select the desired mode [DVD 1, 2 or 3] and confirm with ENTER.

Accept the desired mode on the remote control.

- Press and hold the ENTER button for approx. 2 seconds and, at the same time, enter the number that corresponds to the selected mode (1, 2 or 3).
- Press RETURN to exit the menu.
- FMAT **H**VH

If the mode of the remote control does not correspond with that of the unit, [REMOTE DVD 1 / 2 / 3] will appear on the unit display.

• Press and hold the ENTER button for approx. 2 seconds and, at the same time, enter the number that corresponds to the selected mode (1, 2 or 3).

If you want to operate two units independently of each other with the same remote control, then change the mode of the remote control.

The input must be repeated after batteries are changed.







Connecting with a 21-pin Scart cable



Follow the steps below.

Disconnect AC mains from all units.

- 1 Connect the aerial to the RF IN (Aerial input) of the DVD Recorder.
- **2** Connect the RF OUT (Aerial output) of the DVD Recorder to the Aerial input of the television set.
- **3** Connect the AV1 socket (21-pin Scart socket) of the DVD Recorder to the Scart input of the television set.
- **4** Connect the DVD Recorder and the television set to the AC mains socket.

If your television supports Q Link follow the steps for Auto-Setup with Q Link on page 11. If your television doesn't support Q Link follow the steps for Auto-Setup without Q Link on page 11.

If your television supports Q Link or RGB, connect it to the DVD Recorder with a fully wired 21-pin Scart cable.

Download from TV using QLink (Registered trademark of Panasonic)

You can download the tuning positions for analogue channels from the TV set. Time and date will be set automatically by Auto Clock Setting function.

Note that you must first perform a station search if you use the TV for the first time. If you have a Panasonic television, [Download from TV] will be displayed automatically at the beginning of the station transfer.

- Switch your television on and select the AV channel.
- Switch the device on using the Standby/on switch.

The unit starts the station transfer. A station search for the digital channel starts first. The number of channels found is displayed on the screen after the station search. Then the analogue station positions are automatically transferred from the television. The station transfer is complete when the Owner ID screen appears.

Owner ID

You can complete the Owner ID now or skip this step and do it later. To do it later, press the **RETURN** button. Your DVD Recorder is now ready to use.

- To set the Owner ID now, use ▶ and press the Numeric buttons or ▲▼ ▶ to enter a fourdigit PIN number. Press ◄, to correct the digit.

Auto-Setup

The automatic setup saves all available TV stations. If the station also broadcasts date and time, then the clock is also set automatically.

- Switch on your television and select the AV channel.
- With the Standby/on switch turn on the DVD Recorder.
- Automatic tuning for all available TV stations begins. The search is first performed for the digital and then the analogue stations. The number of channels found is displayed on the screen after the station search. Approximate duration is 5 minutes. After Automatic tuning has finished, the Owner ID screen will appear.

Owner ID

You can complete the Owner ID now or skip this step and do it later. To do it later, press the **RETURN** button. Your DVD Recorder is now ready to use.

- To set the Owner ID now, use ▶ and press the Numeric buttons or ▲▼▶ to enter a fourdigit PIN number. Press ◄, to correct the digit.
- Make sure that you will remember the PIN number (make a note of it).
- Press the ENTER button twice to confirm.
- Enter the [Name], [House No] and [Postcode] in the same way, using ▲▼ ◀▶.
- Press the ENTER button to confirm each entry.
- Press the **RETURN** button to leave the Owner ID screen.

The electronic TV Guide provides a quick overview of the television and radio programmes of your digital stations. The TV Guide provides up to 7 days preview and the option of restricting the display to certain categories like Movies or Sports.

First use of the TV Guide:

Programme information will be gradually stored on the TV Guide list after completion of Auto Setup or each time mains power to the unit is switched on. This process may take some time due to the nature of broadcast.

Note: all programme information will be lost when mains power to the unit is switched off.

Direct Access:

- Press GUIDE on your remote control.
 - The TV Guide programme overview is displayed.



Handling Discs

If the surface of a disc that does not have or was removed from a cartridge is damaged, scratches, dirt, dust or fingerprints can compromise the recording, editing or playback. Such damage can also occur when the disc is inserted back into the cartridge.

Cleaning the DVD-RAM

Clean the disc with a special DVD-RAM cleaner (optional) and read the cleaner instructions throughly before use.

Cleaning DVD-Videos, Video CDs and CDs

If the disc is dirty, wipe it with a moist and then a dry cloth. Bad scratches and stubborn dirt may not be able to be removed so that recording, editing or playback is still compromised even after cleaning. The disc should then no longer be used. Do not use benzine, alcohol, water, cleaning sprays, household cleaners or other solvents.



Only for Panasonic's DVD recorders. Do NOT use this cleaner with any other Panasonic DVD products or with the DVD products of any other companies since doing so may damage the products.

Place the disc in the tray with the label facing upwards.


With double-sided discs, place the side that you want to play, with the label facing up.

Note:

Only the label side of the disc may be written on. Use a soft oil-based felt pen. Do not use a ball-point pen or other hard writing instrument. Do not affix any stickers or labels to the disc. The disc can warp and may become unusable.

When not in use, place the disc in its jewel case or cartridge so that it does not become scratched or dirty.

Do not drop the disc, place them on top of each other and never bang them. Do not place anything on top of the disc. Protect the disc from dirt, dust, heat, humidity, direct sunlight or strong temperature fluctuations (since condensation water can form).

RAM Cartridge discs

When the write-protection device is activated, you can neither record nor edit or delete the contents of a disc.



Cartridge write protection Remove 8cm discs from the cartridge before you use them on the unit.



DVD-Video Recording Format (VR)

This format enables the free editing of recordings. Digital programmes that allow "one time only recording" can be recorded once on a CPRM-compatible DVD-RAM. Playback is only possible on compatible units.



Programme Delivery Control adjusts the start and stop time of a timer recording automatically to ensure the recording starts and finishes in line with the programme broadcast.

This is useful when a programme over-runs the published times.

The station must be transmitting PDC and the exact time must be set for PDC to work. The DVD Recorder detects whether a station is transmitting PDC only during the tuning process. 

This DVD Recorder is not designed to control (switch on or change channel) your satellite receiver, however, it can be taught to recognise VIDEO Plus+ Codes for Satellite stations. The Satellite Receiver must be switched on and the correct station selected. Some receivers have their own timer facility for this purpose.

Please refer to your Satellite Receiver instructions for use of such timer facilities. For your DVD Recorder to recognise the VIDEO Plus+ Codes for each satellite station, you must teach your DVD Recorder which channel or AV input to record from for the first time. Otherwise when setting a VIDEO Plus+ recording, the [- -] symbol will appear in the channel position indicating that the DVD Recorder does not know which channel position to set.


Once you have set the channel/AV input the DVD Recorder will remember it whenever you use a VIDEO Plus+ Code for the station again.

- VIDEO Plus+ Press the VIDEO Plus+ button.
 - Enter a VIDEO Plus+ Code from a Satellite TV Guide for a satellite channel, e.g. Sky 1 using the **Numeric** buttons. Press ◀ to correct any mistakes.
 - Press the ENTER button. [-] will appear instead of a channel number/AV input.
 - Press the **CH** button to select the channel or AV input that is to be used for recording from the satellite channel.
 - Press the ENTER button to memorise the setting. The DVD Recorder will now automatically set the programme position or AV input correctly when a VIDEO Plus+ recording is set for this satellite station in the future.
 - Press to select the programme that you have just set. Now press the CANCEL/RESET button to delete it from the timer recording list. It is no longer needed.
 - Repeat the steps above until you have set and deleted dummy timer recordings for each of the satellite stations that you will make VIDEO Plus+ recordings from.

Ext Link 1:

For digital receivers that send a special recording control signal, e.g. the SKY SATELLITE RECEIVER.

External recording control for satellites or digital receivers (video signal).

If the television is connected to the AV1 connection via the 21-pin Scart cable, the picture to be recorded appears on the screen.

The beginning of the recording may not be recorded correctly in certain cases.

The Ext Link 2 setting cannot be used if the input signal is in NTSC format.


