

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
If the operation of the unit or display is not normal, even though the appropriate buttons have been pressed.

COMPACT DISC OPERATION







NOTES:

 If the disc is loaded with the label facing downward, or if a badly scratched disc a loaded, or if no disc is loaded, "no dISC" blinks.

If this occurs, load the disc correctly with the label facing upward, or replace the damaged disc.

- Opening the CD compartment lid while a CD is playing could scratch the disc.
- Always press [STOP] and wait for the disc to stop rotating before opening the CD compartment lid.

Compact discs

• Both 3-inch and 5-inch discs can be played in this unit.

NOTE: Place only one disc at a time in the CD compartment.

 Only discs bearing the logo as shown can be played in this unit.



- Always place the compact disc in the CD compartment with the label facing up. Compact discs can be played on only one side.
- Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped from the disc's signal surface (opposite the label side) with a soft cloth. Gently wipe in a straight motion from the inside to the outside of the disc.
- Discs should be returned to their cases after use to avoid serious scratches which could cause the player to skip.
- Do not expose a disc to direct sunlight, high humidity, or high temperatures for extended periods of time to prevent warping the disc.
- Do not apply paper or writing instruments, or the inks used in some felt-tip pens, may damage the surfaces of the disc.
- Do not use cleaners or antistatic sprays on discs, such as those used for phonograph records.



Temporarily stopping play

1. Press [PLAY/PAUSE] during play. Play will temporarily stop, and the elapsed time will blink.



2. Press [PLAY/PAUSE] again to resume play.

Skip play

To skip to track 6 while track 3 is playing, press [SKIP/SEARCH] ►►I repeatedly until "06" appears in the CH/TR section on the display. To skip back to track 3 while track 6 is playing, press [SKIP/SEARCH] I◄◄ repeatedly until "03" appears.

Search (forward/reverse)

If [SKIP/SEARCH] ►► or I◄◄ is pressed during play, the player search at high speed in the forward or reverse direction while the button is being pressed. When the button is released, normal play will continue.

- 1. In the stop mode, press [PROGRAM] repeatedly until the selection to be replaced is displayed.
- 2. Select the track number as explained above.
- 3. Press [PROGRAM].




To improve reception


TIMER OPERATION

TIMER

Before setting the timer, make sure that the clock is set to the present time (See "AD-JUSTING THE CLOCK"). Load a CD or tune in to the desired band and station and, then adjust the volume level as desired.

Example:

Set waking up 7:30AM every day.



1. Press [TIMER] for at least 2 seconds.



"TIMER" blinks.

2. Press [VOLUME] + or -.

- The display returns to the previous function.
- 4. Press [U/ON] to turn off the power.
- 5. Press [TIMER]. "TIMER" appears on the display.



6. Press [FUNCTION] to select "CD", "TUNER" or "BUZZER". The selected function appears on the display.

- When the waking up time arrives, the power is turned on automatically and the units starts playing with the preset function selected.
- When you still want to sleep for a while, press [snooze], playing or beep sound stops temporarily, 9 minutes later playing continues or beep sound can be heared again.
- When timer wake up, function playing (CD or TUNER or BUZZER) for 60 minutes and then power off.
- CD mode will jump to BUZZER mode if no disc inside a unit.
- If [⁽⁾/ON] is pressed during timer operation, the power is turned off and the timer is set to the standby mode.

NOTE:

- The BUZZER sound level is the constant level, not concerned with the volume level.
- The timer functions every day, unless it is released. To release the timer, press "TIMER" again with the power off. "TIMER" disappears on the display.




This feature will notify you of the time lapse every 10 minutes after the set time arrives. When first ten-minute passed. One beep sound can be heard, second ten-minute pass two beep sounds can be heared. In the same way, when sixth ten-minute pass, six beep sounds can be heard and then power off.


Note:

Beep sound level is not concerned with the volume level.

 The beep sound is mixed with function sound (CD, TUNER).



- Set the TIMER time first. See "TIMER" section.
- Press [SNOOZE/ALARM]. "ALARM" appears.



When the timer ON time arrives, the power is turned on automatically, and the unit start playing with the preset function selected.


NOTE:

It only can be set under timer set on and power off status.

SNOOZE

When the timer is switched on, the sound will be turned up to the position previously set with the VOLUME control.

Press [SNOOZE/ALARM]. "SNOOZE" blinks on the display. The sound stop for about 9 minutes, then start again. This is repeated every time [SNOOZE/ALARM] is pressed until the timer goes out.



Each time [SLEEP] is pressed, there is a different preset time appears on display, there are 9 time periods available: 90, 80, 70, 60, 50, 40, 30, 20 and 10 minutes. The timer automatically switches off the power after a preset time has elapsed. To release the sleep, press [SLEEP] repeatedly until "00" appears. "SLEEP" disappears on the display.



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
Cleaning the unit

in substanting

Clean the outside of the unit with a clean soft cloth, moistened with lukewarm water. Do not use solvents such as benzene or thinner. These will permanently damage the units finish.

Cleaning the CD player lens

The lens should never be touched. If dust is on the lens, blow it off using a camera lens blower. (Please consult your dealer.)



If trouble occurs ...
