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Section 1: Getting Started

This section helps you to quickly start using your device.

Understanding this User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 114.

Also included is important safety information beginning on page 87, that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from the Home screen. To get to the Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, see "Securing Your Device" on page 10.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings, and may vary from your device, depending on the software version on your device. and any changes to the device's Settings.

Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's Settings.

Special Text

In this manual, you'll find text that is set apart from the rest. These are intended to point out important information, share guick methods for activating features, to define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature or menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods, or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings to your attention important information to prevent loss of data or functionality, or even damage to your device.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

 \rightarrow Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures. For example:

"From the Home screen, touch Apps →







SIM Card

Your device uses a 4G LTE SIM (Subscriber Identity Module). The 4G LTE SIM is a small, rectangular plastic card that stores your device number, information about your wireless service, and other information such as messages and contacts.

If you purchased your device at a Verizon Wireless store, the SIM card is activated and ready to use. If you ordered a new device, the card may need to be activated before you can use it. For more information about activating the SIM card, visit:

Caution!: Do not bend or scratch the SIM card. Take care when handling, installing, or removing the SIM card, and avoid exposing the SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt. Keep the SIM card out of reach of small children.

Installing the 4G LTE SIM Card

The SIM card must remain in the device when in use.

Important!: Turn the device off before installing or removing the SIM card. To turn the device off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

- Open the SIM card slot and carefully insert the 4G LTE SIM Card into the slot, with the Verizon Wireless logo facing up.
- 2. Push the SIM card in gently until it clicks into place.

Warning!: Do not insert a microSD or other memory card into the SIM card slot.



Removing the 4G LTE SIM Card

Important!: Turn the device off before installing or removing the SIM card. To turn the device off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

- Open the SIM card slot and gently push the 4G LTE SIM Card inward to release it.
- Carefully slide the 4G LTE SIM Card out of the slot.



Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) are included with the device, for charging the battery.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time. A fully discharged battery requires up to 4 hours of charge time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

Warning!: Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The battery icon in the System Bar shows battery power level.

Before the battery becomes too low to operate, the empty battery icon will flash and a tone will sound. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device will shut down.

Charging the Battery

Your device comes with a Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) to charge your device from any 110/220 VAC outlet.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time. A fully discharged battery requires up to 4 hours of charge time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

1. Insert the USB cable into the port.



Connect the USB cable to the charging head.



- 3. Plug the charging head into a standard AC power outlet.
- When charging is complete, unplug the charging head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Turning Your Device On and Off

Turning Your Device On

Press and hold the b Power/Lock Key. While powering on, the device connects with the network, then displays the Home screen and active alerts.



Turning Your Device Off

- Press and hold the b Power/Lock Key.
- 2. Follow the prompts to confirm the shut-down.

Your Google Account

Your new device uses your Google account to fully utilize its Android features, including Gmail, Google Talk and Android Market.

When you turn on your device for the first time, follow the prompts to set up a connection with your existing Google account, or create a new Google account.

To create a Google account, or set up your Google account on your device at any time, use Accounts & sync settings. For more information, see "Accounts & sync" on page 78.

Roaming

When you travel outside your home network's coverage area, your device can roam to acquire service on other compatible digital networks. When Roaming is active, the Roaming icon appears in the System bar of the display.

Tip: You can set your device's roaming behavior. For more information, see "Mobile networks" on page 68.

During roaming, some services may not be available. Depending on your coverage area and service plan, extra charges may apply when accessing data networks. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information about your coverage area and service plan.

Securing Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

For lock screen options, use the Configure lock screen setting under Location and security settings. For more information, see "Configure lock screen" on page 74.

For other settings related to securing your device, see "Location & security" on page 72.

Locking the Device

 By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out.

- or -

Lock the device by pressing the ϕ Power/Lock Key.

Unlocking the Device

Unlock the device using the default unlock, or for increased security, set and use a personal screen lock PIN, password, or pattern.

Press the 6 Power/Lock Key, then touch and drag the 6 lock icon out of the circle.

Features



- SIM Card Slot: Install the 4G LTE SIM card, for 4G LTE service.
- 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in an optional equipment.
- 3. Speaker: Play alert tones, music, audio, and other sounds.
- 4. Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off, or to access Silent mode, Airplane mode, or Restart your device when the device is turned on. Press to lock the device, or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From the Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume. During playback, press to adjust volume. Press to mute an alert notification.
- Widescreen HD Display: View device UI and media.
- USB Power/Accessory Port: Connect a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.
- 2 Megapixel Front Camera: Use when taking pictures and recording video.
- Speaker: Play alert tones, music, audio, and other sounds.
- 3 Megapixel Camera Lens: Use when taking photos or recording videos.
- 11. Camera Flash: Used when taking photos.

Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.



Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's Settings.

Display settings

You can customize display settings to your preferences. For more information, see "Screen" on page 71.

- Action Bar: Always available at the top of the screen.
 Changes to provide options, navigation, and other items related to the current application or screen.
- Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common applications. For more information, see "App Shortcuts" on page 20.
- System Bar: Always present at the bottom of the screen, to show notifications, system status, and soft navigation buttons.

Navigation

Warning!: Please note that a touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. For more information, see "Warranty Information" on page 103.

Touch

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- . Touch an item to select it.
- Touch an application's icon to launch the application.

Touch and Hold

Activate onscreen items by a touch and hold gesture. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget or app icon on the Home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Flick or drag

Flick or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- · Unlocking the screen
- . Scrolling the Home screen or a menu

Pinch

Using two fingers, make a pinch motion on the screen. For example:

- Pinch in to zoom in on pictures or screens.
- Pinch out to zoom out on pictures or screens.

Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus 4 panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, outlines on the right and left of the screen show whether another screen is available.



Customizing the Home Screen

You can customize the Home screen to include your favorite widgets, shortcuts to applications, wallpaper and more.

- 1. Navigate to the Home screen you want to customize.
- 2. Touch Customize in the Action Bar at the top right of the screen.
 - or -

Touch and hold on the screen.

- Touch a category of items:
 - Widgets: Add widgets to the screen. For more information, see "Widgets" on page 19.
 - App shortcuts: Place a shortcut to an application. For more information, see "App Shortcuts" on page 20.
 - Wallpapers: Choose an image from Gallery, or select pre-loaded still or live wallpapers. For more information, see "Wallpapers" on page 23.
 - More: Add shortcuts to specific types of content, such as Browser bookmarks, shortcuts to directions in Maps, a music playlist, or a specific setting. For more information, see "More" on page 23.
- Touch an item to place it on the current panel, or touch and hold to drag it to a different panel.

Action Bar

The Action Bar is always available at the top of the screen, and updates automatically to provide access to options, navigation, and other items related to the current application or screen.

Google Search

Touch \mathbb{Q} Google to enter criteria to search the web or your device.

Touch $\underline{\P}$ to speak your search criteria.

Apps

Touch Apps to open the Apps screen to launch applications.

Customize

Touch — Customize to configure the current screen to your preferences.

Menu

In some cases, a context-sensitive **Menu** is available at the right side of the Action bar. Touch **Menu** to display options for the current screen or feature.

System Bar

The System Bar offers navigation tools, plus information about your device's current status.

Home

Touch home to display the Home screen.

Back

Touch \blacksquare Back to return to the previous screen, option or step.

Recent Apps

Touch Touch Recent Apps to view apps you recently launched. From Recent Apps, touch an app to return to it.

Notifications

The Notifications area of the System Bar contains icons that tell you about messages and device status. Touch an icon to see the email, reminder, or other notification.



Notifications Status details

Status details

Touch Status details to view more information about device status and current notifications.

Touch items to open them, or touch ${\bf X}\;$ to dismiss the notification.



Quick settings

In Status details, touch $\frac{\overline{a_0}^0}{-}$ Settings to display Quick settings, then touch settings to quickly configure them to your preferences. From Quick settings, you can touch $\frac{\overline{a_0}^0}{-}$ Settings to access all settings.



Status & notification icons

The right side of the System bar shows the current time, with network, battery status and other details, including these icons.



Battery Level: Shown fully charged.



Charging Indicator: Battery is charging.



Device Power Critical: Charge immediately. If not charged, device will shut down.



USB Charging Indicator: Connected to PC via USB cable. When connected to a PC, the battery only charges when the device is turned off



USB Connected: Connected to a PC using a USB cable.



Updates Available: Updates to the applications you have downloaded are available



Download in progress: An application is being downloaded to the device.



Download Successful: A recent application download or update completed successfully.



Airplane Mode: Airplane Mode is active. You can use many of your device's features, but cannot access online information



New Email Message: You have new email. Touch the icon for additional information.



New Gmail Message: You have new Gmail. Touch the icon for additional information.



Google Talk Invitation: Someone has invited you to chat using Google Talk.



Configure input methods: When the keyboard is displayed, touch for a menu of quick keyboard settings.



Bluetooth Active: Bluetooth is turned on.



Music Player: A song is playing. Touch the Music icon or Status details to see the song title and controls.



Wi-Fi Active: Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Searching for GPS: Device is searching for a GPS signal.



Navigation Active: Navigation App is active.

Widgets

Widgets are self-contained applications that you can place on the Home screen for quick access.

Adding Widgets to the Home screen

- Navigate to the Home screen where you want to place the widget.
- 2. Touch and hold on the screen.
 - or -
 - Touch Customize in the Application bar.
- Touch Widgets to display available widgets. Scroll the widgets by sweeping your finger right and left.
- 4. Touch a widget to add it to the selected Home screen

- or -

Touch and hold on a widget, then drag it to any Home screen.

Removing Widgets

► Touch and hold the widget until Remove appears at the upper right corner of the screen, then drag the Widget to the Remove icon.

Widgets



Available widgets include:

- Analog clock: Display an analog clock. Touch the widget to view alarms or add a new alarm. The alarms you set in the widget are also available in the Clock app.
- Bookmarks: Display your bookmarked webpages. Sweep up or down to view all bookmarks and touch an entry to open the page. For more information, see "Using Bookmarks" on page 41.
- Books: Display a link to your Google Books. Sweep your finger lightly from top to bottom or bottom to top to flip forward or backward through your books. Touch the cover of the book you want to open.
- Calendar: Display a calendar. For more information, see "Calendar" on page 57.

- Contact: Show messages from a contact, and link to the contact, to quickly compose an Email or Gmail message. For more information about sending messages, see "Messaging" on page 37.
- Email: Access your Email accounts. If you have more than one account set up, all inboxes display. For more information, see "Email" on page 37.
- Gmail: Access Gmail, Google's web-based email. For more information, see "Gmail" on page 39.
- Google Search: Display a Google Search bar.
- Latitude: Locate your friends on a map, and share or hide your location.
- Market: Download and manage applications from the Android Market.
 For more information, see "Market" on page 59.
- Music: Control music playback from the Home screen. For more information about playing music on your device, see "Music" on page 44.
- Picture frame: Select a photo from Gallery to display.
- YouTube: Search YouTube and watch videos.

App Shortcuts

Use App shortcuts to quickly access applications from the Home screen.

Adding Shortcuts from the Home screen

Navigate to a Home screen.

- Touch and hold on the screen.
 - or –Touch

 Customize in the Application bar.
- Touch App shortcuts to display available shortcuts. Scroll the shortcuts by sweeping your finger right and left.
- 4. Touch a shortcut to add it to the selected Home screen
 - or -

Touch and hold on a shortcut, then drag it to a panel.

Adding shortcuts from Apps

- 1. Touch Apps.
- 2. Touch and hold on an app, then drag it to a Home screen.

Removing Shortcuts

► Touch and hold the Shortcut until Remove appears, then drag the Shortcut to the Remove icon.

Applications

The Apps screen holds all applications installed on your wireless device. Applications that you download and install from Android Market or from the web are displayed on the My apps tab.

You can place shortcuts to applications on the Home screen, for quick access to the application. For more information, see "Adding shortcuts from Apps" on page 20.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps.
- Slide your finger left or right to scroll the Applications screens.
- Touch an icon to launch the application.

Application Information

To view information about an App, force an App to stop, uninstall updates, and clear data, use the Information feature.

- Touch and hold an App icon, then drag it to (i to view App details.

Books: Google eBooks is a new way to discover, buy. and enjoy your favorite books online and offline.



Browser: Access the Internet.



Calculator: Perform mathematical calculations.



Calendar: Record events and appointments to manage your schedule.



Camera: Take pictures or record videos.



Clock: Display a clock and set alarm(s).



Contacts: Save and manage contact information for your friends and colleagues.



Downloads: View, reopen, or delete items you have downloaded.



Email: Send and receive email from your device.



Gallery: View and manage pictures stored on your device.



Gmail: Send and receive emails via Gmail, Google's web-based email.



Google Search: Search the web and your device with Google Search bar.



Latitude: Use Google Latitude to locate your friends on a map, and share or hide your location.



Maps: Find locations and get directions with Google Maps.



Market: Browse, download, and install Android applications.



Media Hub: Browse the latest movies and TV shows. then rent or purchase the media for viewing on your phone.



Movie Studio: Use Movie Studio to edit videos into movies.



Music: Play music.



Navigation: Use Google Maps Navigation to search for locations, and get turn-by-turn directions.



Places: Use Google Maps to find places of interest, plus add your own favorite places.



Quickoffice: Create and save Microsoft Word, Excel, and Powerpoint documents, and view PDFs.



Settings: Configure your device to your preferences.



Talk: Chat with other Google Talk users.



Videos: Rent and view videos from your favorite video sources.



Voice Search: Perform a Google search by speaking your search terms.



YouTube: View and upload YouTube videos, right from vour device.

Wallpapers

Choose a picture to display in the background of the Home screen and Lock screen. You can choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images, or select a picture you've taken with the Camera or downloaded.

- 1. Touch and hold on the Home screen.
 - or -
 - Touch Customize in the Application bar.
- Touch Wallpapers, then select a source, from Gallery, Live Wallpapers, or Wallpapers.
- Select a screen, from Home screen wallpaper or Lock screen wallpaper.
- Select a photo or wallpaper, then follow the prompts to update the screen.

More

More includes shortcuts to specific items, such as contacts, Browser bookmarks, and directions to a favorite location.

- Touch and hold on the screen.
 - or –

Touch Customize in the Application bar.

- Touch More to display available shortcuts. Scroll the shortcuts by sweeping your finger right and left.
- Touch a shortcut to add it to the selected Home screen
 or –

Touch and hold on a shortcut, then drag it to a panel.

More shortcuts

Available shortcuts include:

- Bookmark: Launch a bookmarked web page.
- Contact: Link to a specific contact.
- Directions & Navigation: Access directions and navigation to a favorite location.
- Gmail label: Access marked info from your Gmail account.
- Latitude: Find your friends on a map and share or hide your location.
- . Music playlist: Link to a music playlist.
- . Select setting: Link to a favorite or often-used setting.

Section 3: Contacts and Accounts

Accounts

Your device provides the ability to synchronize information from a variety of accounts, including Google, a Corporate Exchange server, and Email accounts. With synchronization, you can ensure that information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

Setting Up Your Accounts

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the Accounts & sync setting.

Adding an account

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Apps →
 - → Accounts & sync → ■■ Add account.
- Touch an account type, then follow the prompts to enter your credentials and sign in.
- The device communicates with the provider's server to set up your account on the device.

Managing accounts

Configure synchronization of account details, such as calendar events and contacts.

1. From the Home screen, touch Apps →

→ Accounts & sync.

- 2. Touch an account, to configure settings:
 - Synchronization: Touch a setting to enable or disable synchronization. When enabled, a check mark appears in the check hox
 - Account settings: Touch to configure advanced settings, available for some types of accounts.

Synchronizing your accounts

You can choose to have your device automatically maintain synchronization with your accounts, or manually synchronize each account when you want to check messages.

You may also choose to limit automatic or background synchronization to extend battery life.

- → Accounts & sync.
- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
- **Settings**

- Set synchronization options:
 - Background data: When enabled applications can sync. send. and receive data at any time.
 - . Auto-sync: When enabled, applications can sync data automatically, at any time. You can manually sync accounts with the Sync option available in the accounts.

Contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- The first time you access Contacts, you can choose an option:
 - Create a new contact: Add new contacts to be stored on the device
 - Sign in to an account: Set up an account on your device, to sync contacts from the account on your device.
 - Import contacts from a file: Bring contacts in from a file you previously exported, such as from another device.
 - Import from SIM card: Copy contacts stored on your SIM card to vour device.
- 3. Follow the prompts to complete the action.

Creating Contacts

1.	From the Home screen, touch	Apps →
	Contacts → New.	

- At the Save contact to prompt, select an account for saving the contact (available options depend on the accounts you have set up).
- Touch contact fields to enter information. While entering information, touch (+) to add fields, or (-) to delete a field:
 - Touch the blank Photo to choose a picture to identify the contact.
 - Enter the contact's name in the First name and Last name fields. then touch to enter other name-related fields like **Prefix**. Middle name, Suffix, Phonetic given name, Phonetic middle name, or Phonetic family name.
 - Touch Organisation fields to enter a Company name and Job title.
 - Touch Phone to enter a telephone number, then touch ____ Label to choose a label from Home. Mobile. Work. Work Fax. Home Fax, Pager, Other, or Custom to create a custom label.
 - Touch Email to enter an email address, then touch ____ Label to choose a label from **Home**, **Work**, **Other**, or **Custom** to create label

- Touch Address to enter a physical address, then touch ____ Label to choose a label from Home. Work. Other, or Custom to create your own label.
- Touch **Notes** to enter additional information for the contact.
- Touch Website to enter a URL.
- Touch **Event** set a date for an event, then touch **Label** to choose a label from Birthday. Anniversary. Other, or Custom to create your own label.
- Touch **Groups** to assign the contact to a group, then touch Label to choose a group from Friends, Family, Coworkers, or to **Create new group**. For more information about Groups, see "Groups" on page 30.
- Touch Add another field to create new fields for the contact. including Phonetic name, Phone, Email, IM, Address, Nickname, Website, Internet call, Event or Relationship.
- 4. When you finish entering information, touch



Updating Contacts

Make changes to update an existing contact.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display it, then touch Fdit.
- 3. Touch contact fields to modify information.
- 4. While entering information, use these controls:
 - Touch 🕕 to add fields.
 - Touch (to delete a field.
 - Touch Add another field to create a new field for the contact.
- 5. When you finish entering information, touch **Done**.

Contacts Display Options

Choosing contacts to display

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch to choose contacts to display, All contacts, or by Starred status, or touch an Account or Group name.
 - 3. Touch Customize to define a custom view:
 - Touch **Only contacts with phone numbers** to restrict the view.
 - Touch an account to set display options for contacts from the account.

Choosing how contacts display

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch Menu → Settings for these options:
 - Touch **List by** to sort contacts by first or last name.
 - Touch **Display contacts by** to show contacts by first or last name.

Joining Contacts

Your device can synchronize contacts with multiple accounts. When you synchronize contacts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person. When you join contacts, all the contact's information displays in one Contact record.

Joining also helps you keep contacts updated, because changes in the respective accounts are made automatically when you synchronize with the account.

Joining contacts

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
- 2. Touch a contact to display it, then touch Fdit.
- 3. Touch Menu → Join.
- Touch a contact record to join it to the original contact.

Tip: If another contact has a similar name, Contacts displays it here for you to choose.

Removing joined contacts

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- . Touch a contact to display it, then touch Fdit.
- Touch Menu → Separate, then confirm the separation at the prompt.

Exporting and Importing Contacts

To back up and restore your contact information, you can export your contact list to a storage device, such as a PC, or import your contact list (previously exported) from a storage device.

- Connect your device to the storage with a USB cable.
- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch Menu → Import/Export.
- 4. Touch an option, then follow the prompts to complete the operation:
 - Import from SIM card
 - Export to SIM card
 - · Import from USB storage
 - Export to USB storage
 - . Share visible contacts

Sharing Contacts

You can send contact namecards as vCards via Bluetooth to a Bluetooth device, or as an attachment via Gmail or Email.

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices will accept contacts, and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

Sharing a single contact

Section 4: Entering Text

Text Input Methods

Your device offers several text input methods:

- Android keyboard: Enter text by touching keys on a virtual QWERTY keyboard. Android keyboard includes predictive text, which matches your key touches to common words so you can select a word to insert it into your text.
- Samsung keypad: Enter text by touching keys on a virtual QWERTY keyboard. Samsung keypad includes optional XT9 predictive text, which matches your key touches to common words so you can select a word to insert it into your text.
- Voice input: Use the Voice Input option of either keyboard to speak your entries.

Virtual QWERTY Keyboard

Your device offers two virtual QWERTY keyboards for text entry, the Android keyboard and the Samsung keypad. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications.

Touch any text entry field to display a keyboard at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.

Choosing the Text Entry Method

You can choose a default entry method in Settings, and choose a method at any time from the System bar.

For information about choosing the default entry method, see "Current input method" on page 83.

To change the entry method while entering text, touch the System bar, then choose a new keyboard, or voice input.

Entering Text Using the Samsung Keypad

The Samsung keypad is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring optional XT9 predictive text. Input characters by tapping the on-screen keys with your finger, or use speech recognition.

You can enable XT9 predictive text, to have the Samsung keypad match your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.



Configuring Samsung keypad

Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters

The default case is Abc, so the first word of sentences is automatically capitalized.

Using XT9 Predictive Text

XT9 is a predictive text entry mode that makes text entry faster by matching your key touches to common words, or words you have saved to your settings.

Editing Text

Use the text selection tools to select text or position a cursor for inserting text, then use the editing tools in the Application bar to select, cut, copy and paste text.

Inserting new text

As you enter characters, predictive text matches your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by touching to toggle the case, before touching the letter key(s).

Email

Send and receive email using popular email services.

Section 12: Health and Safety Information

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your Galaxy Tab. The terms "GALAXY" or "mobile device" are used in this section to refer to your Galaxy Tab. Read this information before using your GALAXY.

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries. Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user: and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to Radio Frequency (RF) energy from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth® headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free

kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC exposure limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the exposure limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model of a device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. near the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Implantable Medical Devices

Any such dispute shall not be combined or consolidated with a dispute involving any other person's or entity's Product or claim, and specifically, without limitation of the foregoing, shall not under any circumstances proceed as part of a class action. The arbitration shall be conducted before a single arbitrator, whose award may not exceed, in form or amount, the relief allowed by the applicable law. The arbitration shall be conducted according to the American Arbitration Association (AAA) Commercial Arbitration Rules applicable to consumer disputes. This arbitration provision is entered pursuant to the Federal Arbitration Act. The laws of the State of Texas, without reference to its choice of laws principles, shall govern the interpretation of the Limited Warranty and all disputes that are subject to this arbitration provision. The arbitrator shall decide all issues of interpretation and application of this arbitration provision and the Limited Warranty.

For any arbitration in which the Purchaser's total damage claims, exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, are \$5,000.00 or less ("Small Claim"), the arbitrator may, if the Purchaser prevails, award the Purchaser's reasonable attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs as part of any award, but may not grant SAMSUNG its attorney fees, expert witness fees or costs unless it is determined that the claim was brought by the Purchaser in bad faith. In a Small Claim case, the Purchaser shall be required to pay no more than half of the total administrative, facility and arbitrator fees, or \$50.00 of such fees, whichever is less, and SAMSUNG shall pay the remainder of such fees. Administrative, facility and arbitrator fees for arbitrations in which the Purchaser's total damage claims, exclusive of attorney fees and expert witness fees, exceed \$5,000.00 ("Large Claim") shall be determined according to AAA rules. In a Large Claim case, the arbitrator may grant to the prevailing party, or apportion among the parties, reasonable attorney fees, expert witness fees and costs. Judgment may be entered on the arbitrator's award in any court of competent jurisdiction.

This arbitration provision also applies to claims against SAMSUNG'S employees, representatives and affiliates if any such claim arises from the Product's sale, condition or performance.

Purchaser may opt out of this dispute resolution procedure by providing notice to SAMSUNG no later than 30 calendar days from the date of Purchaser's original purchase of the Product. To opt out, Purchaser must send notice by e-mail to optout@sta.samsung.com, with the subject line: "Arbitration Opt Out." Purchaser must include in the opt out e-mail (a) Purchaser's name and address; (b) the date on which the Product was purchased: (c) the Product model name or model number: and (d) the IMEI or MEID or Serial Number, as applicable, if Purchaser has it (the IMEI or MEID or Serial Number can be found (i) on the Product box: (ii) on the Product information screen, which can be found under "Settings;" (iii) on a label on the back of the Product beneath the battery, if the battery is removable; and (iv) on the outside of the Product if the battery is not removable). Alternatively. Purchaser may opt out by calling 1-888-987-4357 and providing the same information. These are the only two forms of notice that will be effective to opt out of this dispute resolution procedure. Opting out of this dispute resolution procedure will not affect the coverage of the Limited Warranty in any way, and Purchaser will continue to eniov the benefits of the Limited Warrantv.

Severability

If any portion of this Limited Warranty is held to be illegal or unenforceable, such partial illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the enforceability of the remainder of the Limited Warranty.
