

About DVD

The MPEG II video compression technology provides capacity for an excellent picture of minimum 500 lines resolution on screen, up to 8 language soundtracks, up to 9 views from different camera angles and up to 32 language subtitles (provided by the DVD disc itself which supports these features).

Care of disc

Video disc contains high-density compressed data that needs proper handling

About MP3

MP3 (MPEG 1, Audio Layer3) is a digital audio format for quick down loading files that sound as good as CDs. MP3 uses entropy encoding to reduce the number of redundant sounds in an audio signal to a minimum. It takes music from a CD and reduces it by a factor of 12, with no noticeable loss of quality .On a normal CD of 74 minutes you can store over 130 songs.

Disc information

Sampling rate should be 44. 1 kHz and bit rate is recommended within the range from 128 Kbps to 256 Kbps, in order to achieve the best performance. In general, higher quality settings result in larger file sizes.

No-play disc


Tips for making a good MP3 CD

- · Use good quality CD-RW disc, CD-R Gold Ultima is recommended. Up to 650 MB (74-minute CD) of MP3 files can be recorded.
- · Select a high quality CD Recorder (Writer). HP CD- Write+9200 is recommended.
- Select an advanced Cd burning software. Easy CD Creator 5.0 is recommended.
- . MP3 is data and not WAV information as such Mode1 must be selected when compiling and burning your discs.
- . Drag and drop (Direct CD) must not be used to compile the disc. The player will not recognize this format.
- Only single session recordings can be used. Multi session recordings are not recognized and will not be played.
- Select Data CD Project (soft ware user interface), file system should comply with the standard of ISO 9660 or Joliet, OR select MP3 CD Project for convenience operation (available in Easy CD Creator5.0)
- It is advised to finalize the CD after burning.


System connection to a TV set

• Connect the player's L/R to TV's audio L/R inputs, see Diagram 2. Please see the Set Up Menu on Page 17 for the correct Video Output








- 1 The player is equipped with composite A/V outputs at the rear of the player. Your TV will require at least one set of A/V inputs. The patch cord supplied with the player will connect your player's A/V output to your TV'S inputs.
- 2 Please remember to push the "Line" or "Input" or "Video/TV" button on your TV remote to view the DVD signal. Depending on your brand of TV, this button will have a different name for the same function, as per the examples above.
- That function will allow your TV to be switched from the broadcast reception mode to one of the A/V signals. Some TVs have more than one A/V input.
- The player is equipped for stereo playback. To fully realize 2 channel sound, a Stereo TV or A/V receiver is necessary. Howerer, a Mono TV may be used providing the TV one set of A/V Inputs. The A/V input for Mono sound. You may connect either the Left or Right audio channel from the DVD Composite audio out to the mono TV audio input.

Connecting to an Audio Amplifier

Set the amplifier to the corresponding output mode. See your amplifier's user guide.



Digital audio connection to a digital Amplifier




GETTING STARTED

- Unpack the unit.
- Read through this owner's manual before installation and use.
- Loading batteries in the remote control.
- Connect the system, make sure the connections are secure.
- Connect the power plug to the AC power outlet.

Loading batteries in the remote control

- · Remove the battery compartment cover.
- Load two AAA (UM-4 or R03) batteries into the battery compartment.
- Make sure that the batteries have been inserted in the correct polarities matching to the symbols+,marked in the battery compartment. Close the battery compartment cover.
- When replacing batteries, replace both batteries.
 Do not mix new and used batteries operating together, other wise, the operation lifetime will be much shorter than normal.
- Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a prolonged period of time.



The remote control transmits a directinal infrared beam. Be sure to aim the remote control directly at the infrared sensor of the unit during operation.

If the sensor has been covered or there is a large object between the remote control and the sensor, the sensor will not respond.

Switch on the player

Press the main power switch on the DVD player. Power on the TV set, and the amplifier is connected.

Set up the system

Select the corresponding setting of the TV set (AV1, AV2, S-Video, DVD etc).

If connected to a RF modulator, select the appropriate channel until the DVD screen appears.

If amplifier has been connected, select the corresponding output mode.

Load a disc

Press OPEN button on the Top panel to open the disc lid.

Load a disc with the label side facing up. Close the lid manually.

Automatic playback

The unit will take a few seconds to load the disc's initial data, display the disc type logo on the left upper corner on screen, and then start playing back automatically.

NOTE Normally ,when a MP3 disc is loaded, the player will take longer time to load.



GETTING STARTED

Problem disc messages

The following message will display on screen when there is a format problem with the loaded disc:

"WRONG REGIONAL DISC"

Region code of the disc does not match the player's region code (region 1 to region6).

"WRONG PASSWORD"

The rating level of the disc is higher than the rating level of the player, The player will not play the disc.

"WRONG DISC"

The player is equipped with automatic disc quality detection software. When the player detects a problem or damaged disc, the unit may play at a lower quality or stop completely, depending on the damage level.

DTS DISC

For DTS digital audio stream only No analog audio output.

This player does not have a DTS decoder built-in. It may result in no analog audio output if you select DTS sound output.

- Make sure you select Dolby 5.1 or 2 channel down mix instead of DTS setting.
- Connect the digital audio output (coaxial) to a digital amplifier, in order to enjoy DTS audio system.

Power management

If the player will not be in use for a long period of time, please unplug the unit for your personal safety.

ON SCREEN DISPLAY


An On Screen Display (OSD) indicator will be displayed at the upper part of the TV screen when certain functions are executed, or when pressing the OSD button on the remote control.

The OSD indicator is a user friendly interface designed to display the status of playback type. When a different disc is loaded (DVD, CD, MP3), the OSD indicator bar will be different.







Press OPEN button on the top panel.

Play/Pause/Stop



Press PLAY/PAUSE button to play the disc. Press PLAY/PAUSE button to pause(still Picture).

Press PLAY/PAUSE button to resume normal playback.



Press STOP button to stop in two modes.
a) Press the STOP button once and the STOP function memorizes the position.
The OSD will show "Prestop". Press the PLAY button to resume playback.
b) Press the STOP button twice to stop playback completely. The TV screen shows STOP. Pressing PLAY will start playing from the beginning.

Skip Forward/Backward



Press ▶▶I button to skip advance DVD chapter or CD/MP3 track.



Press ▶ ◆ button to skip backward DVD chapter or CD/MP3 track.

Fast Forward/Reverse



Press and hold ▶▶ or ◄◄ for about two seconds to fast forward/reverse.

Press PLAY button to resume normal playback.

The player is muted in fast forward or reverse mode.

button will decrease the slow speed.

Disc Title/Menu



While playing a DVD.

Press the MENU/PBC button to return to the DVD disc Root Menu.



Press PLAY button to resume playing from where you previously stopped it.



While playing a DVD, press the TITLE button to return to the beginning of the DVD disc.

NOTE

Some DVD discs don't have the TITLE function.

FUNCTION BUTTONS

Select an item in the menu

In the DVD disc start menu or in the palyer's set up menu.



Press DIRECTION button to highlight function icons.



Press ENTER button to confirm a selection.

Numeric Key Pad

(Random Program access)

Mute



Press the MUTE button to turn off the audio or restore the audio.





To cancel the function, Press the A-B button again.

Press REPEAT button repeatedly to select the repeat mode.

FUNCTION BUTTONS

Multi-Angle/ Subtitle/Audio



While playback a DVD disc, press ANGLE button to view different camera angles on the disc. A DVD disc may contain up to 9 selectable camera angles.



While playback a DVD disc, press SUBTITLE button to select the language of the viewable subtitle. A DVD disc may contain up to 32 selectable subtitles.



While playback a DVD disc, press AUDIO button to select the language of the audio sound track. A DVD disc may contain up to 8 selectable audio sound tracks.

NOTE Some DVD discs do not have multiple ANGLES, SUBTITLES or AUDIO features.

Volume Up/Down



While play back a disc. press the VOLUME button - or + to adjust the volume level.



Step



(STEP)---Press STEP button when play a DVD file.

Zoom



Press the ZOOM button repeatedly and the TV Screen will display:

Setup



Press the SETUP button to enter the player's setup menu.

The SETUP Menu allows the viewer to adjust the setting details of the player. Please read the SETUP Menu contents of the manual, for further directions on how to utilize the SETUP Menu.

Program



Press the PROGRAM button to enter the program menu.

For DVD/CD/MP3 disc Pgrogram Playback

- A. Press PROGRAM button three times to select the Program.
- B. Press ENTER to display the Program List.
- Press the Direction buttons to highlight the input table.
- Press the Numeric button to input numbers. To delete incorrect input: press CLEAR button or select the Clear All in the Program List and confirm by pressing ENTER button.
- F. Repeat above steps can preset up to 20 tracks.
- G. To start program playback, press Play button or select the Play in Program List and press ENTER button.
- F. To exit program playback, press PROGRAM button to select Normal (N) or Random(R) playback.



Symptom	Check and Action
No Power	 Make sure the unit has been powered on manually. Check if the power cord has been properly connected to the power outlet. Check if the Main Power switch on the unit is turned on.
Does not play	 No disc, load a disc. Disc has been loaded upside down. Place the disc with the label side up. Disc's region code does not match to the player's. Disc's rating level is higher than the player's setting. Disc is incorrect type for the player. Disc is damaged or dirty. Clean the disc or try another one. Moisture may be condensed inside the player. Remove the disc and leave the unit power on for one or two hours.
No Picture	Check if the TV set has been powered on, use TV remote to select A/V signal for DVD rather than broadcast. Check if the system connection is proper and secure. Check if the connection cables are damaged. Clean the disc. Please press OPEN button, then press PROGRAM and ZOOM button to return factory default status.
Picture noisy / distorted	The disc is dirty or damaged. Clean the disc or try another disc. Reset the color system of the TV set. Make sure the DVD is not connected through a VCR,Cable or Satellite dish.
Picture not full screen	Select the screen format from the player's Set Up Menu. see " Set Up Menu. " of this manual. Select the screen setup from DVD disc menu.
Problem message displayed on screen	Following messages will be displayed when there is a problem with the loaded disc: * "WRONG REGIONAL DISC": Disc's region code does not match to the player's * "WRONG PASS WORD": The player refuses to play a disc with a rating level higher than the player's rating level setting.



TROUBLE SHOOTING

Symptom	Check and Action
Problem message displayed on screen	"WRONG DISC": The player is equipped with automatic disc quality detection software. When the player detects a problem or damaged disc, the player may keep playing the disc at lower quality or stop playing, depending on the damage level of the disc.
Malfunction	 Press and hold the standby button (if any) for about 5 seconds to power off. Should the player develop a malfunction, unplug the player for 30 minutes. After 30 minutes, power on the player and the restore function should reset the player.
Cannot SKIP or SEARCH	 Some discs are programmed that do not allow users to SKIP or SEARCH at some sections, especially at the beginning WARNING section. Single Chapter disc cannot apply SKIP function.
No sound or sound output not complete	 Check if the TV and Amplifier have been switched on,and correctly set. Check if the TV and Amplifier system connections are secured. Press AUDIO button to select other audio tracks output of disc. Check if the MUTE function of the TV or Amplifier has been activated. There will be no sound output during REVERSE PLAY / PAUSE / STEP / SLOW and SEARCH.
MP3 disc no sound or noisy	 When PC program files or other data files are mixed with MP3 files in the same disc, the player may play the non-MP3 files with noise or no sound. Check the disc, if all the files on disc are MP3 files, Skip the file and try other ones.
Remote control does not function	 Make sure the Power button on the unit has been turned on manually. Remove the obstacles between the remote control and the player. Point the remote control towards the remote sensor on the player. Check if the batteries of the remote control have been loaded with correct polarities. Replace the batteries of the remote control.
