

- 4. **Polarization -** Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug.

A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other.



A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong.

The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety.





- 5. Power Sources This video product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. DHU500 Series - Front




- 1. POWER Turns the DVR unit ON/OFF.
- 2. CDRW DRIVE Drive bay for CD-RW Drive
- 3. LED POWER AND HDD LIGHTS Indicates unit power and HDD activity
- 4. NUMBER / LETTER PAD
 - Use the numbers to switch between cameras in View mode.
 - Use the Numbers and Letters for Menu data input.
- 5. **SCREEN SELECT / MENU NAVIGATION** Performs a dual purpose:
 - Changes the Camera view to Single, 4 Camera, 9 Camera or 16 Camera views.



- Use the $\uparrow\downarrow\leftarrow\rightarrow$ buttons to navigate through the MENU options (in MENU mode).
- 6. STOP / EJECT Stops the playback of a previously recorded event / Ejects the CDRW Drive.
- 7. **PAUSE -** Pauses the playback of a previously recorded event.
- 8. **REV -** REVERSES the playback of a previously recorded event.






- 9. **PLAY/FWD** Starts the playback of a previously recorded event. If the PLAY/FF button is pressed during playback, the FAST FORWARD option will become active.
- 10. **REC** Manually starts/stops recording of the currently displayed camera.
- 11. VOLUME UP / DOWN Raises and Lowers the system volume.
- 12. AUDIO Switches between cameras 1-4 to receive audio
 * Only one channel audio available on the 4-Channel DVR Model.
- 13. MENU Accesses the DVR system menu options. See page 21for details.
- 14. SEARCH Accesses the Search Menu. See the Operators Manual for Search Menu options
- 15. **USB PORT** Connection port for a removable USB Hard Drive (USB Key)




DHU500 Series - Back



- BNC VIDEO INPUTS Video inputs for direct connection to Cameras or for looping input to a DVR. The number of ports will vary based on the DVR model (4 Channel, 8 Channel or 16 Channel).
- 2. **AC INPUT** Connect the AC power using the power cord provided with the unit from the DVR to an electrical outlet.
- 3. **COMPOSITE** A Composite Video OUT connection used to connect the DVR to a Slave Monitor or DVR.
- 4. **S-VIDEO** Outgoing connection for S-VIDEO.
- 5. **VGA PORT** Used to connect the DVR to a computer Monitor.
- 6. **AUDIO INPUTS** Connect up to 4 camera Audio inputs.





- 7. AUDIO OUT Connect the Audio OUT to the AUDIO IN on an DVR or Monitor.
- 8. RS232 PORT Connection for an RS-232 Device.
 - * Not available on 4-Channel DVR Model.
- 9. **ETHERNET PORT** Connects the DVR to a router for connection to the internet. Refer to the Instructions on Page 48 for Remote Connection.
- 10. NTSC/PAL SWITCH Changes the DVR unit between NTSC and PAL modes.
- 11. **ALARM / SENSOR BLOCK -** Ports for connecting an Alarm or Sensor Device (such as a Motion Sensor or Window/Door Sensor).

TURNING ON FOR THE FIRST TIME



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Starting the DVR - Self Test Screens

Once the DVR has been connected and powered on, the following self-test screens will appear:

DIGIMERGE LOADING PROGRAMS

NOTE: If a new **HARD DRIVE** is detected by the system, the DVR will automatically FORMAT the new drive.

Starting the DVR - QUAD Display

After the system self-tests have been completed, the DVR will switch to the CAMERA viewing screens (in QUAD MODE) with the following information displayed on screen:

- CH1-CH4: Camera title indicators
- HDD%: Percentage of Hard Drive used
- MM/DD/YYYY HH:MM:SS:
 The current system date and time.



If a camera is not detected, or the Camera is in COVERT MODE, the associated portion of the QUAD or MULTI screen will display a BLUE SCREEN.

Powering Off the DVR/Stopping Recording

In order to power down the DVR Unit, or to manually stop the current recording, the default system password of '00000000' will need to be entered (when prompted). If the default password is changed, then the new user specified password will be used instead.







Main Menu Control

- Enter the **MENU** screen by pressing the **MENU** button. The System Password may be required, based on system settings.
- Scroll through the 5 Main options by pressing the ↑↓ buttons.
- To enter a sub-menu, navigate to the option and press the **SEL** button.
- To exit a **SUBMENU**, press the **MENU** button. To save the changes, select the **SAVE & EXIT** option and press the **SEL** button.
- Pressing the **MENU** button from the **MAIN MENU** will exit the **MENU** configuration screen

Outlined below are the buttons used to access menu settings:

↑↓←→ : Scroll up and down within a menu option / Change menu optionsSEL : Press this button to select and change the values in a menu option

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


- 1. CH1-CH4 FRAMERATE: Set the number of Frames Per Second. Press the ↑ and ↓ buttons to highlight, and press the SEL button to select, and use the ← and → and SEL buttons to change the settings.
- 2. QUALITY Set the quality level for the recording to High, Mid or Low
- 3. **POST MOTION DURATION:** Set the duration that the DVR will record once motion is detected: 5, 30, 60, 90, 120, 150, 180, 210 or 240 seconds.
- 4. **SETUP MOTION**: Configuration for each Motion Sensor enabled Camera Press the ↑ and ↓ buttons to highlight the Setup Motion option, and press the **SEL** button to access the SETUP MOTION submenu. Press the ↑ and ↓ buttons to highlight a specific Camera, and press the **SEL** button to select.
 - POST MOTION: Set the length of time to continue recording after motion has stopped.
 - AREA: Press the SEL button on the AREA option to specify segments of the Camera view to have Motion Detection. 


Router Port Forwarding

You will need to enable port forwarding on your Router to allow for external communications with your DVR. The following ports will need to be forwarded to remotely connect to your DVR:

- DVR PORT: 2000 (or any other port you selected to use during setup)
- WEBSERVER PORT: 80 (or any other port you selected to use during setup)

Computers, DVRs, and other devices inside your network can only communicate directly with each other within the internal network. Computers and systems outside your network cannot directly communicate with these devices. When a system on the internal network needs to send or receive information from a system outside the network (i.e. from the Internet), the information is sent to the Router.



When a computer on the Internet needs to send data to your internal network, it sends this data to the external IP address of the Router. The Router then needs to decide where this data is to be sent to. This is where setting up Port Forwarding becomes important.

Port Forwarding tells the router which device on the internal network to send the data to. When you set up port forwarding on your Router, it takes the data from the external IP address:port number and sends that data to an internal IP address:port number (i.e Router External IP 216.13.154.34:2000 to DVR Internal IP 192.168.0.3:2000).

The instructions found online in the **Router Configuration Guide** or at http://www.portforward.com will assist you in the port forwarding configurations for a selection of different router models. Visit our website at http://www.digimerge.com for more details



Troubleshooting

When a malfunction occurs, it may not be serious and can be easily corrected. The following describes the most common problems and solutions. Please refer to the following before calling your DVR dealer

Problem:

DVR Unit is not receiving power, or is not powering up

Check:

- Confirm that all cables are connected correctly
- Confirm that the ON/OFF (I/O) switch on the rear of the unit (beside the power cable connection) is ON (in the I position)
- Confirm that there is power at the outlet:
 - Connecting the power cable to another outlet
 - Test the outlet with another plugged device (such as an electric calculator or phone charger)
- If the unit is connected through a power bar or surge protector, try bypassing the bar and connecting the power directly to the wall outlet

Problem:

DVR is not responding when any of the buttons are pushed.

Check:

- Turn the master power switch OFF using the (I/O) switch on the rear of the unit (beside the power cable connection):
 - Press the (I/O) switch to the OFF position (O)
 - Wait for 1 minute all LED light indicators on the front of the unit will be off
 - Press the (I/O) switch to the ON position (I)
- The unit will make an audible alert when powered back on

Problem:

There is no picture appearing on a Channel / Camera is not displaying

Check:

- Check the camera video cable and connections Disconnect and reconnect the cable at the DVR and at the Camera
- Try moving the camera to another channel or use another cable
- Check if the Camera is in COVERT mode.

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Problem:

The message "Can't display page is shown when failing to connect to DVR (when inputting the IP Address or Domain Name in the Internet Explorer).

Check:

Check the network connection

- Try connecting the DVR to a different port on the Router
- The DVR may not have the correct Network Settings. Refer to Technical Support.

Problem:

Cannot download the Active X Controls (when using Internet Explorer).

Check:

- Check that Windows XP Service Pack 2 is installed on the PC
- The DVR may not have the correct Network Settings. Refer to Technical Support.

Problem:

The Client Program is terminated with the error message "Unsupported OS version!".

Check:

 The client program only works on Window XP and Windows 2000. It does not support Windows 98, 98SE, or ME

Problem:

The Client Login box appears, and does not accept the User ID and Password.

Check:

 This happens when the User ID and Password are not correct. Check the exact ID and Password on the DVR unit.



CONNECTING MOTION/ALARM DEVICE



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Connecting Motion / Alarm Device

Motion detection and Alarm controls are enabled through the Menu system on the DVR. Additional motion sensor devices can be connected to the system (Motion Sensors, Door/ Window Sensors).

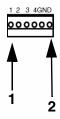
A motion detection or sensor unit can be used to send a signal to the DVR to begin camera recording on the selected Video Channel (when enabled in the Alarm Recording Menu)

 Example: A Window sensor unit has been installed on Alarm Block port #4. When this sensor is activated, the camera on port #4 will start recording (if enabled in the MENU on the DVR)


 Connect the GROUND Cable to the GND port on the Alarm Block on the DVR
