

VCR Setup

- Connect an antenna or a RCA Cable between the ANTENNA jack on the rear of the TV and the ANTENNA OUT jack on the VCR.
- Connect the RCA Jack of the VCR to the RCA AV1 or AV2 of the set.
- Press the PLAY button on the VCR.
- When connecting the S-VIDEO VCR to the S-VIDEO socket, the picture quality will be further improved.
- Connect the S-VIDEO socket of the VCR to the S-VIDEO socket of the set.
- Connect the audio cable from the S-VIDEO VCR to the AUDIO sockets of the set.
- Select the S-VIDEO by pressing the TV/AV button repeatedly.
- Press the PLAY button on the VCR. The VCR playback picture appears on the screen



Tips

• To avoid picture noise (interference), leave an adequate distance (20 inches or more) between the VCR and TV.




Auto programme tuning

Up to 125 TV stations can be stored by programme numbers (1 to 125). Once you have preset the stations, you will be able to use the PR+/PR- or NUMBER buttons to scan the stations you programmed.

Stations can be tuned using automatic or manual modes.

Note : In some models up to 181 CH stations can be stored.

All stations that can be received are stored by this method. It is recommended That you use auto programme during installation of this set.



MULTI PIP

This function can be operated when input signal is TV signal.

When pressing MULTI PIP button, a still picture of TV signal is displayed on main screen and each still picture of live signal searched from TV signal is displayed on sub screen.

In case of sub screens, after shortly showing a video of live signal searched from TV signal and displaying the still picture from first sub screen, it is moving to other sub screen conse quently and displays the still picture of live signal in the same way.



Troubleshooting Check list

Problem	Check item		
No picture on screen and no sound from speakers.	 Insert the AC power cord plug securely in AC power outlet. Make sure the remote control is not in the standby mode (The POWER/Standby indicator is red.) Turn on the MAIN POWER button on the top of the display. 		
No picture/No picture from AV terminal.	 Check the brightness setting of the display. Lamp may have malfunction. Make sure a cable with no VIDEO input signal is connected to the VIDEO INPUT terminal. 		
Picture is displayed, but no sound from the speakers.	 Check the sound setting. Make sure the sound is not muted. Make sure a pair of headphones is not connected. Make sure the connectors of the optional speaker system are securely inserted. Make sure the setting of AV OUTPUT terminal 		
Picture is too light	Make sure COLOUR and CONTRAST settings.		
Picture is too dark.	 Make sure BRIGHTNESS setting is not set too low. Check to see if BRIGHTNESS setting Lamp may have malfunction. 		
Remote control does not work.	 Change the batteries. Make sure the infrared transmitter window is not receiving strong light such as light from fluorescent lamps. 		
No picture from AV OUT terminal.	Make sure AV INPUT is not set.Make sure the input source other than AV
