



INSTALLATION LOCATION For safety and optimum performance of your

- DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT:
 Install the DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT in a horizontal and stable position. Do not place anything directly on top of the DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT. Do not place the DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT directly on top of the TV.
- Shield it from direct sunlight and keep it away from sources of intense heat. Avoid dusty or humid places. Avoid places with insufficient ventilation for proper heat dissipation. Do not block the ventilation holes on the sides of the DVD/VCR COMBINA-TION UNIT. Avoid locations subject to strong vibration or strong magnetic fields.

AVOID THE HAZARDS OF ELECTRICAL SHOCK AND FIRE

- Do not handle the power cord with wet hands.

If your TV is not compatible with progressive scan, set the INTERLACE/PROGRESSIVE SCAN SELEC-TOR to I(INTERLACE).







Data on an audio CD is divided into sections called "tracks", each of which is given a track number.





- Press to insert discs into or remove them from the tray. 3. DVD OUTPUT Light (Green) [page 12]
- This light appears when the DVD output mode is selected. You can only watch DVDs when the green DVD OUTPUT light is on. To make the green DVD OUT-PUT light come on, press DVD on the remote control or OUTPUT on the front panel.
- 4. VCR OUTPUT Light (Green) [page 12] This light appears when the VCR output mode is selected. You can only watch tapes when the green VCR OUTPUT light is on. To make the green VCR OUTPUT light come on, VCR on the remote control or OUTPUT on the front panel.
- 5. CASSETTÉ COMPARTMENT
- 6. POWER Button [page 16] Press to turn the power on and off.

- 7. POWER Light
- This light appears when the power is on.
- 8. STOP/EJECT Button (VCR) EJECT

 11. AUDIO In Jacks [page 21] Connect audio cables coming from the audio out jacks of a camcorder, another VCR, or an audio source here.
- VIDEO In Jack [page 21] Connect a video cable coming from the video out jack of a camcorder, another VCR, or a video source (laser disc player, camcorder, etc.) here.
- 13. F.FWD Button (VCR) [page 18]

Press to rapidly advance the tape, or view the picture rapidly in forward during playback. (Forward Search).

- 14. **REW Button (VCR) [page 18]** Press to rewind the tape, or to view the picture rapidly in reverse during the playback mode (Rewind Search).
- **15. REC/OTR Button [page 19]** Press once to start a recording. Press repeatedly to start a One-Touch Recording.
- 16. REC Light [page 19]

Lights up during recording.

17. TIMER REC Light [page 20]

This light appears when the DVD/VCR is in standby mode for a timer recording or during a One-Touch Recording. It flashes if T-SET is pressed for a timer recording, but there is no tape in the DVD/VCR. It flashes when all timer recordings or One-Touch Recordings are finished.

18. OUTPUT Button [page 12]

Press to select DVD mode or VCR mode.

- You can switch the output mode either by pressing OUTPUT on the front panel, or by pressing DVD or VCR on the remote control. However, if you press OUTPUT on the front panel first, you need to reselect the corresponding mode by pressing DVD or VCR on the remote control.

Therefore, in order to use the VCR features or view TV channels on the DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT, you still need to either connect the RF cable between the ANT-OUT jack of the DVD/VCR COMBINA-TION UNIT and the TV's Antenna In jack, or connect the yellow video cable as described earlier (Fig.1). FOR TVs WITH COMPONENT VIDEO IN JACKS



The component video connection only supplies video (picture) in the DVD mode of the DVD/VCR COMBI-NATION UNIT. Therefore, in order to use the VCR features or view TV channels at the DVD/VCR COMBI-NATION UNIT, you still need to either connect the RF coaxial cable between the ANT-OUT jack of the DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT and the TV's Antenna In jack, or connect the yellow VCR video cable as described earlier (Fig. 1). 



AUTOMATIC CHANNEL SET UP

VCR

You can automatically program the tuner to scan only the channels you receive in your area.

- Channel memory programming is NOT needed when you connect the VCR to a cable box or a satellite box as in "CONNECTING TO A TV WITHOUT A/V TERMINALS" on page 13. In this case, select channel 3 on your TV. Then, the channel you want to record or view may be selected at the cable box or satellite box.
- If noise appears, change the RF output channel of the VCR to channel 4 by pressing PLAY for 3 seconds during playback. Then select the same channel (CH4) on your TV.
- Follow the steps below once. Repeat only if there is a power failure or if the VCR is unplugged for more than 30 seconds. (In these cases, the programmed channels are erased.)
- You must follow the steps below before attempting to play or record a video tape. If you want to play or record a video tape BEFORE programming the tuner, you can cancel it by pressing CLEAR/C.RESET.
 - You need to connect the antenna or cable to the VCR first. Then, connect the DVD /VCR power plug to a standard AC outlet.



- If a tape ends during TIMER RECORDING, the VCR will stop, eject the tape, and switch to the DVD mode automatically as the TIMER REC light blinks. (If the DVD power is off, the VCR will become STANDBY status).
- If a tape is not in the VCR or does not have a safety tab, the TIMER REC light flashes and timer recording will not operate. Please insert a recordable tape.
- When all timer recordings are finished, the TIMER REC light will flash.

To use the VCR again as usual, press T-SET to disable the flashing TIMER REC light, then press VCR/TV to select the VCR position. Select either VCR or DVD mode, then continue with the other features as described in this manual.

• When timer recordings are set, the TIMER REC light will come on. To use the VCR as usual until the time for the recording, press T-SET so that TIMER REC light disappears. Press VCR/TV to choose the VCR position. Select either VCR or DVD mode, then continue with the other features as described in this manual.

If you want to use the DVD player during a VCR timer recording or while the TIMER REC light is on or flashes.

• You can use the DVD player while the TIMER REC light is on or flashes, or during a timer recording. Press POWER to turn on the DVD. Press DVD on the remote control to choose DVD mode, then continue with the other DVD features as described in this manual. You don't have to set the TIMER off to use the DVD only.

TO STOP AN AUTOMATIC TIMER PRO-GRAM ALREADY STARTED Press STOP/EJECT on the DVD /VCR COMBINA-TION UNIT.

TO CHECK, CORRECT, OR CANCEL AN AUTOMATIC TIMER PROGRAM

1 Press T-SET.

- If the DVD output mode is selected, you have to switch it to the VCR mode by pressing the VCR on the remote control or the OUTPUT on the VCR.
 - **2** Select main menu by pressing MENU.
 - 3 Select "TIMER PROGRAMMING" by pressing ▲ or ▼. Then, press ►.
 - 4 Select the program number you want to check by pressing ▲ or ▼.
- The details of the selected program appears on the TV screen.
- Go to the digit you want to change by pressing ▶ or
 Then, enter correct numbers by pressing ▲ or ▼.
- You may cancel the entire program by pressing \blacktriangleleft while the program number flashes.
 - **5** Press CLEAR/C.RESET to exit.
 - 6 Press T-SET to return to timer stand-by mode.

COPYING A VIDEO TAPE

VCR

You can make copies of video tapes made by friends or relatives for your enjoyment.


You can not copy a DVD to a videotape. Warning:

Unauthorized recordings of copyrighted video tapes may be an infringement of copyright laws.

Connect the recording VCR (this unit), the playing VCR (another source) and your TV using the following diagram.

• You can use the AUDIO/VIDEO input jacks on the front panel of the DVD/VCR instead of using the jacks on the back.

[Recording VCR] (this unit)



- **1** Insert a pre-recorded tape into the playing VCR.
- 2 Insert a tape with a safety tab into the recording VCR.
- **3** Press SPEED on the recording VCR to select the desired recording speed (SP/SLP).
- 4 Select the "L1" or "L2" position on the recording VCR.
- When you use the A/V input jacks on the back of the DVD/VCR, select "L1" position by pressing [0], [0], [1] on the remote control or the CHANNEL (▲▼) buttons.
- When you use the A/V input jacks on the front of the DVD/VCR, select "L2" position by pressing [0], [0], [2] on the remote control or the CHANNEL (▲▼) buttons.
 - **5** Press REC/OTR on the recording VCR.
 - 6 Begin playback of the tape in the playing VCR.
- For best results during dubbing, use the VCR's front panel controls whenever possible. The remote control might affect the playing VCR's operation.
- Always use video-quality shielded cables with RCA-type connectors. Standard audio cables are not recommended.
- You can use a video disc player, satellite receiver, or other audio/video component with A/V outputs in place of the playing VCR.

TO MONITOR THE RECORDING


- **1** Turn on the TV and set the TV to channel 3.
- If noise appears, change the RF output channel of the VCR to channel 4 by pressing PLAY for 3 seconds during playback. Then select the same channel (CH4) on your TV. (See "RF OUTPUT CHANNEL" on page 13 for the detail).
 - **2** Press VCR/TV on the recording VCR.

MTS (Multi-Channel Television Sound) SYSTEM

VCR

When you play a VHS tape, or receive a broadcast on

the VCR's tuner, the current status will appear when you press DISPLAY on the remote control. When you record a MTS broadcast signal, you need to set it to MTS mode.



- 1)* Press MENU and select "TV STEREO" or "SAP" by pressing ▲ or ▼. Then, press ► to select mode. To exit, press CLEAR/C.RESET.
- Although a program may be broadcast in both stereo and sub audio, you must select the Recording mode to TV STEREO or SAP before you record a broadcast.
 - 2)* Press MENU and select "AUDIO OUT" by pressing ▲ or ▼. Then, press ►. Next, select "HIFI" or "MONO" by pressing ▲ or ▼. To exit, press CLEAR/C.RESET.
- While the VCR is set in HIFI stereo mode, HIFI appears on the TV screen. While the VCR is set in monaural (MONO) mode, HIFI disappears from the TV screen.

AUTO REWIND

When a tape reaches the end during recording, playback, or fast-forward, the tape will automatically rewind to the beginning. After rewinding finishes, the VCR will eject the tape and switch itself off.

• The VCR will not rewind the tape automatically during timer recording or One Touch Recording.

REAL TIME TAPE COUNTER

- This shows the elapsed recording or playback time in hours, minutes, and seconds. (The displayed time will not change during blank portions of the tape.)
- The indication will appear when the tape is rewound further than "0:00:00" on the tape counter.

BASIC PLAYBACK


DVD-V CD

Getting started

- Turn on the power of the TV, amplifier and any other components which are connected to the DVD.
- Make sure the TV and audio receiver (commercially available) are set to the correct channel.
- Select DVD mode by pressing DVD on the remote control or OUTPUT on the front panel.

1 Press POWER.

- "Load" will appear briefly on the display panel.
 - 2 Press OPEN/CLOSE to open disc loading tray.
 - **3** Place the chosen disc in the tray, with the label facing up.



4 Press PLAY.

- The tray will close automatically, and playback will then start from the first chapter or track of the disc. If the playback does not start automatically, press PLAY.
- When you playback the DVD which a title menu is recorded, it may appear on the screen. In this case, refer to "TITLE MENU" on page 23.

5 Press STOP to stop playback.

Notes

- A "prohibited icon" may appear at the top-right on the TV screen during operation, warning that a prohibited operation has been encountered by the DVD or the disc.
- With DVDs that use titles for playback program signals, playback may start from the second title, or it may skip these titles.
- During the playback of a two layered disc, pictures may stop for a moment. This happens when the 1st layer switches to the 2nd layer. This is not a malfunction.

GENERAL FEATURES

DVD may contain menus to navigate the disc and access special features. Press appropriate Number button or use Arrow $(\checkmark/\checkmark/\checkmark)$ to highlight your selection in the DVD main menu and press ENTER to confirm.

Note

• Unless stated, all operations described are based on remote control use. Some operations can be carried out using the menu bar on the TV screen.

PAUSE

1 During playback, press PAUSE.

• Playback will pause and sound will be muted.

² To continue playback, press PLAY.

• The DVD main menu will appear.

- Press MENU to call up the DVD menu.

- Track number will appear briefly on the DVD/VCR COMBINATION UNIT display panel.
- If SKIP is pressed while the playback is paused, the playback will be paused again after skipping to the next track.

TV ASPECT: QUICK

- Press Arrow (\blacktriangle/∇) for an item selection, then press ENTER.
- Select 4:3 LETTER BOX for a black bars appears on top and bottom of the screen.
- Select 4:3 PAN & SCAN for a full height picture with both sides trimmed.
- Select 16:9 WIDE if a wide-screen TV is connected to the DVD/VCR.
- The default setting is 4:3 LETTER BOX.


