## **Connecting to a TV**

Connect the power supply cord after making all connections.

- Before making any connections, we recommend that you temporarily disconnect all the units from AC power.
- Use the High Speed HDMI cables. Non-HDMI-compliant cables cannot be utilized. It is recommended that you use Panasonic's HDMI cable. When outputting 1080p signal, please use HDMI cables 5.0 meters (16.4 ft.) or less.







- When using the TV or amplifier/receiver that does not have the indication of "(ARC)" (non-ARC-compatible) on the HDMI terminal, the amplifier/receiver and TV must also be connected using an optical digital cable in order to enjoy the TV's sound through the amplifier/receiver.




