




- (1) Carefully Unpack your Magnavox television, ensuring the following items are present:-
- · Instruction Booklet

- · Remote Control
- AA size batteries for remote Control

- · 75 Ohm antenna Lead
- (2) Carefully remove electrostatic sticker from television screen.
- 3 Read through the instruction booklet and familiarise yourself with the operation of the product.
- (4) Connect the antenna lead supplied to the aerial terminal located on the back panel of the television set (refer page 6 'Locations Of Controls') and the other end to the aerial wall socket in your home. If using an indoor antenna plug this directly into the aerial terminal located on the back panel of the television (refer page 6 'Locations of Controls').
- (5) Connect your Magnavox Colour Television to the power outlet and switch on television.
- Your Magnavox television will now commence tuning automatically. ('Out of Box' Tuning).





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

FRONT PANEL




BACK PANEL






