### Installing

# Important Safety Instructions

In this instruction manual, most of the warnings and precautions are common for all kinds of TVs. Therefore, the illustrations of generic TVs are used with some exceptions.



- 1) Read these instructions.
- 2) Keep these instructions.
- 3) Heed all warnings.
- 4) Follow all instructions.
- 5) Do not use this apparatus near water.
- 6) Clean only with dry cloth.
- Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



- 9) Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- 10) Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- 11) Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 12) Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-ov

### USE

### AC power cord

Observe the following to prevent the AC power cord from being damaged. If the AC power cord is damaged, it may result in a fire or an electric shock. Stop using it and ask your dealer or Sony service center to exchange it.

- $\hfill\square$  Do not place the TV where the power cord is subject to wear or abuse.
- □ Do not pinch, bend, or twist the cord excessively. The core lines may be bared and cut, causing a short-circuit, and resulting in a fire or an electric shock.
- $\Box$  Do not convert or damage the power cord.
- Do not allow anything to rest on or roll over the power cord.
- □ Do not move the TV with the power cord plugged in.
- $\Box$  Keep the power cord away from heat sources.
- □ When you disconnect the AC power cord, disconnect it from the wall outlet first.
- □ Be sure to grasp the plug when disconnecting the power cord. Do not pull the power cord.
- Do not use the supplied AC power cord on any other equipment.
- Use only an original Sony AC power cord, not other brands.
- □ Use only the supplied AC power adapter, including the AC power cord. Otherwise, it may result in a fire or an electric shock.

### Wall outlet

Do not use a poor fitting outlet. Insert the plug fully into the outlet. If it is loose, it may cause arcing and result in a fire.

Contact your electrician to have the outlet changed.

### Wiring

When connecting cables, be sure to unplug the AC power cord for your safety.


Take care not to catch your feet on the cables. It may damage the TV set.

#### Electric shock

Do not touch the AC power cord or the TV with a wet hand. If you plug/unplug the AC power cord from the TV with a wet hand, it may cause electric shock.

### Lightning storms

For added protection for this TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the TV due to lightning and power line surges.



If you will not be using the TV set for several days, the TV set should be disconnected from the AC power outlet for environmental and safety reasons. The



TV set is not disconnected from the AC power source when the TV set is switched off. To disconnect the TV set completely, pull the plug from the AC power outlet. Store the TV set in a cool place in order to avoid damaging.

### Overloading

This TV set is designed to operate on a 100 - 120 V AC supply only. Take care not to connect too many appliances to the same AC power outlet as this could result in a fire or an electric shock.







### **Optional equipment**

Do not install optional equipment too close to the TV set. Picture distortion and/or noisy sound may occur if the TV set is positioned in close proximity to any equipment emitting electromagnetic radiation.

#### Small accessories

Keep small accessories out of children's reach.

### **Heat-rash**

Do not allow your skin to remain in contact with the TV or AC power adapter for a long period of time. Otherwise, they may get hot and cause a heat-rash or blister.



### **ANTENNAS**

### Outdoor antenna grounding


If an outdoor antenna is installed, follow the precautions below. An outdoor antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can come in contact with such power lines or circuits.

WHEN INSTALLING AN OUTDOOR ANTENNA SYSTEM, EXTREME CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO KEEP FROM CONTACTING SUCH POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS AS CONTACT WITH THEM IS ALMOST INVARIABLY FATAL.

Be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges.

Section 810 of the National Electrical Code (NEC) in USA and Section 54 of the Canadian Electrical Code in Canada provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

### BATTERIES

### CLEANING

## Cleaning the cabinet of the TV set

Unplug the AC power cord when cleaning this TV. If not, it may result in electric shock. Clean the cabinet of the TV with a dry soft cloth.



Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth slightly dampened with a solution of mild soap and warm water. Never use strong solvents such as thinner or benzine for cleaning. If using a chemically pretreated cloth, please follow the instruction provided on the package. The ventilation holes can accumulate dust over time. To ensure proper ventilation, we recommend removing the dust periodically (once a month) using a vacuum cleaner.

### Handling and cleaning the OLED screen

The surface of the screen is specially coated to reduce image reflection. Do not scour, hit or subject the screen to impact.

- $\hfill\square$  Unplug the AC power plug when cleaning the TV.
- ☐ Take care when touching the TV if it has been powered on for an extended period.
- □ The surface of the screen is specially coated. Do not attach stickers to it.
- $\hfill\square$  The surface of the screen is specially coated. Do not touch the screen directly.
- □ Wipe the screen surface gently with the supplied cleaning cloth, or a soft dry cloth by supporting it with a hand on its back side, to remove dust.
- □ Stubborn stains may be removed with the supplied cleaning cloth, or a soft cloth slightly dampened with a mild detergent solution.
- $\Box$  The screen may become scratched if the cleaning cloth is dusty.
- □ Never use strong solvents such as thinner or benzene for cleaning.
- Do not apply detergent solution directly on the TV as damage to TV may result.
- □ Never use abrasive cleaner.
- □ If commercially available cleaning cloths are used, follow the precautions of the products.

### **MAGNETIC INFLUENCE**

This TV contains a strong magnet in the speaker unit that generates a magnetic field. Keep any items susceptible to magnetic fields away from the speaker.

### SOUND

If a snapping or popping sound from the TV is continuous or frequent while the TV is operating, unplug the TV and consult your dealer or service technician. It is normal for some TV's to make occasional snapping or popping sounds, particularly when being turned on or off.




### **CARRYING THE TV**

### Carry the TV in the specified manner

To avoid dropping the TV and causing serious injury, be sure to follow these guidelines:

- Before carrying the TV, disconnect all cables.
- □ When you carry the TV, place your hand as illustrated and hold it securely. Do not put stress on the screen.
- □ Do not carry the TV by holding the screen. It may cause damage to the TV and/or serious injury.
- □ When lifting or moving the TV, hold it firmly with both hands from the bottom.



□ When carrying, do not subject the TV to shocks or vibration, or excessive force.

### VENTILATION

The slots and openings in the TV are provided for necessary ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating, these slots and openings must never be blocked or covered.

Unless proper ventilation is provided, the TV may gather dust and get dirty. For proper ventilation, observe the following:

Never block the slots and openings by covering with a cloth or placing the TV on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface, or too close to furniture. It may cause overheating and result in a fire, an electric shock or serious injury.








Never place the TV in a confined space, such as a bookcase or built-in cabinet, unless proper ventilation is provided.

- Do not install the TV face up, down or sideways.
- $\hfill\square$  Do not install the TV turned over or upside down.


Leave some space around the TV set as shown below. Otherwise, air-circulation may be inadequate and cause overheating, which may cause damage to the TV set.



Leave at least this space around the set.

Never install the TV set as follows:

Air circulation is blocked.



### **Objects and ventilation holes**

Never push objects of any kind into the TV through the cabinet slots as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or an electric shock. Do not place any objects on the TV.



### MOISTURE

### Moisture and flammable objects

- □ The TV must not be exposed to dripping or splashing. Do not place objects filled with liquids, such as vases, on the TV.
- □ Do not use power-line operated TV sets near water — for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc. It may result in a fire or an electric shock.



- Do not let this TV get wet. Never spill liquid of any kind on the TV. If any liquid or solid object does fall through, do not operate the TV. It may result in electric shock or damage to the TV. Have it checked immediately by qualified personnel.
- □ To prevent fire, keep flammable objects or open flame (e.g. candles) away from the TV.



### INSTALLATION

### Placement

The TV should be installed near an easily accessible AC power outlet.

Observe the following in placing the TV. Otherwise the TV may fall from the stand, causing damage or serious injury.



 $\hfill\square$  Place the TV on a stable, level surface.

Do not place the TV or remote control in a place subject to extreme temperature, such as in direct sunlight, near a radiator, near a heating vent or near fire. Otherwise, overheating may result and cause enclosure deformation or a malfunction. Do not install the TV in a place directly exposed to air conditioning. If the TV is installed in such a location, moisture may condense inside and cause a malfunction.

- Never place the TV in hot, oily, humid or excessively dusty places.
- □ Do not install the TV where insects may enter.
- □ Do not install the TV where it may be exposed to mechanical vibration.
- Do not install the TV in a location where it may protrude, such as on or behind a pillar, or where you might bump your head on it. Otherwise, it may result in injury.


### **Placement for viewing**

It is recommended to watch the TV at a distance of 3 - 7 times that of the screen height, and in moderate brightness. Watching the TV for too long or in a dark room may cause eye fatigue. To obtain a clear picture, do not expose the screen to direct illumination or direct sunlight. If possible, use spot lighting directed down from the ceiling.

#### Outdoor use

Do not install this TV outdoors. If the TV is exposed to rain, it may result in a fire or an electric shock. Do not expose the TV to direct sunlight, it may heat up and become damaged.





Do not install this TV in a vehicle.

Bumping of the vehicle may cause the TV to fall down and cause injury.

Do not install this TV in a ship or vessel. If the TV is exposed to seawater, it may cause a fire or damage the TV.

### **Medical institutions**

Do not place this TV in a place where medical equipment is in use.

It may cause a malfunction of medical equipment

### Attachments

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer, as they may cause hazards.



### **VOLUME ADJUSTMENT**

- □ Adjust the volume so as not to trouble your neighbors. Sound carries very easily at night. Therefore, closing the windows or using headphones is suggested.
- □ When using headphones, adjust the volume so as to avoid excessive levels, as hearing damage may result.

### SCREEN AND CABINET

- □ The screen and cabinet get warm when the TV is in use. This is not a malfunction.
- $\hfill\square$  Avoid spraying insect repellent with volatile material on the screen.
- □ Avoid prolonged contact with rubber or plastic material.
- □ Do not expose the OLED screen surface to direct sunlight, as doing so may damage it.
- Do not push or scratch the OLED screen, or place objects on top of the TV. The image may become distorted, or the OLED panel may be damaged.

### **Broken pieces**

Do not throw anything at the TV. The screen glass may break by the impact and cause serious injury.

Do not touch the broken glass with bare hands. As with any broken glass pieces, avoid skin contact and exposure to your eyes or mouth.

If the surface of the TV cracks, do not touch it until you have unplugged the AC power cord.

Otherwise electric shock may result.

The screen and cabinet get warm when the TV is in use.

Take care when you carry or move the TV.

#### Black dots

Non-luminous pixels may appear on the screen. This is not a malfunction. Although the OLED screen is made with high-precision technology, a few non functioning pixels may be evident. Red, green and blue dots may appear on the screen depending on the images displayed.

### SERVICING

Do not attempt to service the TV yourself since opening the cabinet may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

### **Replacement parts**

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician certifies in writing that he/she has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original parts.



Unauthorized substitutions may result in a fire, an electric shock or other hazards.

### Safety check

Upon completion of any service or repairs to the TV, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks (as specified by the manufacturer) to determine that the TV is in safe operating condition, and to so certify. Ask a qualified service technician to dispose of the TV.

# 3. Setting Up the Channel List – Initial Setup


The **Initial Setup** screen appears when you turn on the TV for the first time.



After you finish connecting the TV, you can run **Initial Setup** to create a list of available analog and digital channels if you have connected an antenna or cable directly to the TV's VHF/UHF/ CABLE input.

You will be prompted to select the language of your choice to be used for all the on-screen settings.

Use the remote control to navigate through the **Initial Setup**:



### ▲/↓ buttons:

Allow you to highlight options where applicable.

Follow the help text provided on the screen to run **Auto Program** with the connected signal source or select **Skip** to skip the **Auto Program** if you are receiving channels from a cable box or satellite receiver and the VHF/UHF/CABLE input is not connected. The **Auto Program** will scan for available channels. When the **Auto Program** is completed, the TV will display how many analog and digital channels are found.

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- If you accidentally turn off the TV during the **Initial Setup** process, the **Initial Setup** will restart from the beginning when the TV is turned back on.
- The Auto Program may be canceled while the channels are being scanned. Press **RETURN** first then press either *←*/*→* on the remote control, highlight "Yes" to cancel or "No" to resume Auto Program.
- During the **Initial Setup** except **Auto program**, if no operation is performed for more than 5 minutes, the screen turns black and "XEL-1" appears on and off. In this case, press **1**/**1**/**4**/**+**/**+**, ⊕ or **VOL +**/**-** to return to the previously viewed screen.




# *4. Adjusting the Viewing Angle of the TV*

- When adjusting the angle, hold the right side of the display panel.





# Protecting the TV Screen

# Precautions to Protect the Screen from Damage

Prolonged display of still images over time may cause permanent image retention (image burn). Avoid displaying images that cause image burn and take the following measures to protect the screen.

### Image Retention

Due to the characteristics of the material used in an OLED screen for its high-precision image, permanent image retention may occur if still images are displayed in the same position on the screen continuously, or repeatedly over extended periods.

### Images that may cause image retention

- wide screen sources with black bars at the top and bottom (Letterboxed Image)
- 4:3 screen sources with black bars at the left and right
- non-moving images such as photo
- game sources
- on-screen tickers, such as those used for news and headlines.
- on-screen menus, program guides, channel numbers, etc., of connected equipment such as a set-top box, video recorder, disc player, etc.

### • Fill the entire screen with images

Set Wide Mode to Wide Zoom or Full in the Screen settings (see page 34).

• Turn off the OSD (On Screen Display)

Press the **DISPLAY** button to turn off the OSD. Turn off the menus of connected equipment. For details, see the operating instructions supplied with the equipment.

Select the appropriate Picture settings for the room brightness

Setting **Picture Mode** to **Standard** in the **Picture** settings is recommended for home entertainment and when viewing a channel that often displays the station logo (see page 32).

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- **Auto Brightness Control** adjusts the brightness of the image automatically when highly contrasting images are displayed on the screen for a long period of time (see page 41).


