

This manual describes the 20MC4204 and 13MDTD20. These two models are different in size and design, but operate identically. The 20MC4204 is illustrated in this manual.

#### **DVD Disc Menus...**

Some explanations in this manual describe DVD disc menus. DVD manufacturers set the menus, which vary among DVDs. Not all DVDs have menus. If the DVD has a menu, access it by pressing the DISC MENU button on the remote control. Details are on page 28.

#### Setup Menus...

Some instructions explain how to use the setup menus of the TV/DVD. There are two setup menus: one for the TV features while the unit is in TV mode, and one for the disc features while the unit is in DVD mode. Access the setup menus by pressing SETUP on the remote control.

While in TV mode, you can select only the TV setup menu.

In DVD mode, you can select both the TV setup menu and the setup menu for the unit's DVD player. Press the SETUP button once to select the TV setup menu. Press SETUP twice to get to the DVD player's setup menu.

Even if you set a DVD feature in the unit's setup menu, it will not be available if the current disc does not include that feature.

#### Available Disc Features...



All features described in this manual are not available on every disc. If the feature is not available on the disc, you cannot use the TV/DVD to make it available.

An  $\times$  will appear in the top right corner of the TV screen if you try to access a feature that is not currently available.

For example, some features are available only during playback, while others are available only if playback is stopped. If you cannot access a feature, try stopping or starting playback, then try the feature again.

## Playable Discs 7

#### **Playable Discs**

The DVD player of this TV/DVD will play many types of discs, including Digital Video Discs (DVDs) and Audio Compact Discs (CDs). It will play MP3 and JPEG files as well.

To play a DVD, make sure it meets the requirements for Region Codes and Color Systems as described below. Discs that have the following logos will play on the DVD player of this TV/DVD. Finalize CD-R, CD-RW, DVD+R and DVD+RW Discs before playing them in the TV/DVD.

- A disc may not play properly if the disc's recorded area is less than 55mm across.
- Do not glue paper or put stickers on to the disc. These may damage the disc, and the TV/DVD may not read it correctly.



#### **Region Codes**

This TV/DVD has a Region One (1) DVD player. DVDs must be labeled for ALL regions or for Region 1 in order to play on the unit. You cannot play DVDs that are labeled for other regions. Look for the symbols below on your DVDs. If these region symbols do not appear on your DVD, you cannot play the DVD in this TV/DVD.





The number inside the globe refers to a region of the world. Region 1 represents the United States, Canada, upper regions of North America, Bermuda, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and small regions near Australia. A DVD labelled for a specific region can only play on DVD players with the same region code.

#### **Color Systems**

DVDs are recorded in different color systems throughout the world. The most common color systems are NTSC (which is used primarily in the United States and North America), PAL, and SECAM.

The DVD player of this unit uses NTSC, so DVDs you play must be recorded in the NTSC system. You cannot play DVDs recorded in other formats. The color system of the DVD may be listed on the DVD or on the disc case.

#### **Unacceptable Discs**

If you insert an unacceptable type of disc, a Disc Error message may appear on the TV screen. The following discs will not play on this DVD player.

## 8 Remote Control Setup

#### **Putting Batteries in the Remote Control**

- Remove the battery compartment lid on the bottom of the remote control by sliding the lid down and off, following the direction of the arrow on the lid.
- Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and ends aligned as indicated.
- Replace the battery compartment lid.


#### **Recycling Guidelines/Battery Safety**






Hooking Up Your TV/DVD with a Cable TV Signal or Outdoor Antenna

To view any channel, set the TV/DVD to the output channel (channel 03 or 04) of the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver. Then, select channels at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.





Your Cable Box/Satellite Receiver may have audio/video out jacks instead of the single antenna out jack (RF coaxial or 75 ohm) shown here.

If so, connect audio/video cables to the audio/video out jacks of the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver and to the AUDIO/VIDEO IN jacks on the front of the TV/DVD.

Press SELECT on the remote to set the TV/DVD to AUX, not channel 3 or 4. Select channels you want to watch at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver as usual, leaving the TV/DVD on AUX.



## Hooking Up Your TV/DVD to Another Video Source (VCR, DVD player, Camcorder, etc.)

You may need this connection if you want to play discs or tapes on other equipment but watch them on the TV/DVD. Press SELECT on the remote to choose AUX at the TV/DVD when viewing materials playing on other equipment. Audio and video cables are not supplied.








#### **Digital Stereo Hookups**

You can connect the TV/DVD to a Stereo that has a coaxial digital audio in jack. Use this hookup if you want to hear the TV/DVD sound through the Stereo instead. Use these connections for a Dolby Digital-compatible Stereo or for a Receiver that has a Mini-Disc or Digital Audio Tape deck.

- Connect the antenna/Cable TV signal. Details are on pages 9.
- Connect a coaxial digital audio cable (not supplied) to the COAXIAL DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack on the TV/DVD.
  Also connect the cable to the Stereo's coaxial digital audio in jack.
- If the Stereo is Dolby Digital-compatible, set Dolby Digital to BITSTREAM. If the Stereo is not Dolby Digital-compatible or if you connected to a Mini-Disc or Digital Audio Tape Deck, set Dolby Digital to PCM. Details are on page 48. An incorrect setting causes noise distortion and damages speakers. To see if your Stereo has Dolby Digital, look for a Dolby Digital logo on your Stereo. Or, refer to the Stereo owner's manual.







To Stereo's coaxial digital audio in jack

- You cannot use a Mini-Disc or Digital Audio Tape deck to copy Dolby Digital 5.1 channel surround sound discs.
- If the disc is not recorded in Dolby Digital 5.1 channel surround sound, you will not hear multi-channel sound even if you use the Digital Stereo hookup.
- To see if your disc is recorded in Dolby Digital, look for a Dolby Digital logo on disc or on its case.
- To see if your Stereo has Dolby Digital, look for a Dolby Digital logo on your Stereo. Or, refer to the Stereo owner's manual.


## 12 Watching TV

This unit selects available TV channels automatically when you connect an Antenna or Cable TV signal to it. To reset TV channels, see pages 18 and 19. If you are using a Cable Box or Satellite Receiver, you do not need to set channels at the TV/DVD.

- Press STANDBY-ON to turn on the TV/DVD.
- To watch TV, press CH. ▲ or ▼ to select memorized channels. Memorized channels are those that appear automatically when you flip through channels. If a channel is skipped, you still can use the Number buttons to select it. This is a non-memorized channel; it may have weak reception in your area. To update your memorized and non-memorized channels, see page 19.

  Remember, if you are using a Cable Box/Satellite Receiver, set the TV/DVD to channel 3 or 4 or AUX. Change channels at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.
- Press VOL. ▲ or ▼ to adjust the volume.






Before you begin, turn on the power of any equipment connected to the TV/DVD. Make sure other equipment is set to the correct channel. Details are on page 10-11.

- Press STANDBY-ON to turn on the TV/DVD.
- Press OPEN/CLOSE <u>★</u> to open the disc tray. The unit will switch to DVD mode automatically.
- Place a disc on the tray. Some DVDs are recorded on both sides. Make sure the label of the side you want to play is facing up.

  Or, if the DVD is recorded on only one side, place the disc on the tray with the label facing up and the shiny side facing down.




- Press PLAY ➤ to close the tray. The tray will close and playback will begin. If playback does not start automatically, press PLAY ➤ again.

  If a DVD menu appears instead, see page 28.

  To play MP3 or JPEG files, see page 42-43.

  You also can close the tray by pressing OPEN/CLOSE ▲.
- Press STOP to stop playback.

REMINDER: Only certain discs will play.
See page 7 for details.



- Even if you turn off the unit in DVD mode, if you turn it on again with the STANDBY-ON button, it will be in TV/DVD mode. If the unit was shut down by unplugging the power cord or due to a power failure, it will be in DVD mode when you turn it on again.
- An "X" may appear on the screen when you try to access a feature that is not available. This is not a problem with the TV/DVD.
- If a disc is dirty or scratched, the picture may be distorted or playback may stop. Remove the disc and try a different one.
- Pressing OPEN/CLOSE



Connect an antenna or Cable TV signal here. This brings TV channels to the TV/DVD. If you do not connect an antenna or Cable TV signal to the TV/DVD (or connect to a Cable Box/Satellite Receiver through this jack), you will not receive any TV channels. Details are on pages 9.

## 18 Menu Language, Auto Channel Programming

#### Menu Language

This affects the language of the TV/DVD's setup menus and on-screen display terms. This does not alter the language of TV programming or discs.

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in TV mode.

Press SETUP.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select LANGUAGE.



Press ENTER to select ENGLISH, ESPAÑOL or FRANÇAIS. The selected language will flash inside the []. This will be the language of the TV/DVD setup menus.



#### **Auto Channel Programming**

To auto program only the channels which are available in your area, follow the steps below.

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in TV mode.

Press SETUP.


Press ▲ or ▼ to select CHANNEL SET UP. Then, press ENTER.




Press ▲ or ▼ to select AUTO CH PROGRAMMING. Press ENTER. The TV/DVD memorizes available channels. When scanning is complete, the TV/DVD will go to the lowest available channel automatically.

To stop channel scanning before it is finished, press SETUP on the remote.







- If you select Spanish or French but need English menus, press SETUP. Press ▲ or ▼ to select IDIOMA or LANGAGE. Press ENTER to select ENGLISH. Then, press SETUP.
- The TV/DVD cannot change channels at the Cable Box or Satellite Receiver. Set the TV/DVD to channel 3, 4 or AUX. Change channels at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver. Details are on page 9.
- Channel settings will be saved even if the power fails.
- You cannot set up TV channels if the unit is in DVD mode.

## Adding/Deleting Channels 19

You can delete TV channels you no longer receive or seldom watch. Or, you can add more channels if the TV/DVD did not memorize all your favorite channels.

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in TV mode.

Press SETUP.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select CHANNEL SET UP. Then, press ENTER.



Press ▲ or ▼ to select ADD/DELETE CH. (TV) or (CATV) will appear beside ADD/DELETE CH. This indicates whether you connected an Antenna (TV) or a Cable TV signal (CATV) to the TV/DVD. Then, press ENTER. The menu will disappear and a TV channel will appear. The channel number will appear, along with ADD/DELETE.




Press ▲ or ▼ until the channel you wish to add or delete appears. You also can use the Number buttons or CH. ▲ or ▼ to choose a channel.



Press ENTER to add or delete the channel. To add a channel, press ENTER so ADD and the channel number appear in light blue (teal). To delete a channel, press ENTER so DELETE and the channel number appear in light red (purple).

To delete another channel, repeat steps 4-5.

Press SETUP when you are finished.



- To confirm that a channel has been added or deleted, press CH. ▲ or ▼ to see if you can or cannot select the channel. Only memorized/added channels can be selected with CH. ▲ or ▼. Use the Number buttons to select deleted channels.
- If you connected an Antenna to the TV/DVD, channels 2-69 will be available to add or delete. If you connected to Cable TV, channels 1-125 will be available.
- If you select a channel that is blocked by V-Chip, the PROTECTED PROGRAM ... message will appear and the add/delete display will disappear. Details on V-Chip are on pages 23-27. Unblock the V-Chip ratings first, then try adding/deleting channels again.

### 20 Picture Control


The TV/DVD's picture controls – BRIGHT, SHARPNESS, TINT, COLOR and CONTRAST – are preset to factory specifications. Although the factory settings are usually the best, you may need to make some adjustments for a natural looking image.

- Press PICTURE so the first Picture Control appears.
- Within 5 seconds, press ▲ or ▼ to select BRIGHT, CONTRAST, COLOR, TINT or SHARPNESS.



Within five seconds, press ► or < to adjust the item.




- Degaussing: Magnetism from nearby appliances and speakers might affect the color of the TV picture. If this happens, move the TV/DVD away from the appliance. If the color is still not correct, disconnect the TV/DVD's power cord from the AC outlet, then reconnect it after 30 minutes.
- The TV/DVD keeps the picture settings after a power failure.

## Sleep Timer 21

Use the Sleep Timer to program the TV/DVD to shut off in a certain amount of time.

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in TV mode.



Each press of SLEEP will increase the time by 30 minutes. You may set a Sleep Timer of 30, 60, 90 or 120 minutes.


After 10 seconds, the Sleep Timer information will disappear from the screen.



The TV/DVD will turn itself off after the selected amount of time has passed.

#### To Cancel the Sleep Timer

Press SLEEP repeatedly until "SLEEP 0 MINUTE" appears.




- To see how much time remains before the TV/DVD turns itself off, press SLEEP once. The information will disappear in 10 seconds.
- A power failure will cancel the Sleep Timer.

## 22 Closed Captions

Follow the steps below to select Closed Captions for TV programming. Not all TV programs and commercials have Closed Captions or all types of Closed Captions (second language, half-screen text, etc.). If Closed Captioning is not broadcast, you cannot receive it. This does not indicate a problem with the TV/DVD. Check your TV program listings for shows with Closed Captions.

If the TV/DVD receives poor quality television signals, the captions may contain errors, or there might be no captions at all. Some possible causes of poor quality signals are:

- Automobile ignition noise
- Electric motor noise
- Weak signal reception
- Multiplex signal reception (ghosts or screen flutter)
- Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in TV mode.



Press SETUP.
Press ▲ or ▼ to select CAPTION.



Press ENTER repeatedly to select CAPTION1, CAPTION2, TEXT1, TEXT2 or OFF.

CAPTION1: Displays standard Closed

Captions (what a character is

saying).

CAPTION2: Displays foreign language closed

captions (foreign language words showing what a character is

saying).

TEXT1 and TEXT2: Display half-screen text (such as a

channel guide, schedule or

announcement).

OFF turns off Closed Captions. Captions will not appear on the

screen.

V-CHIP SET UP
LANGUAGE (ENGLISH)

► CAPTION [CAPTION1]

Press SETUP to exit the menu.

- If a black box appears on the screen, a text mode is selected.
   Select CAPTION1, CAPTION2 or OFF.
- The TV/DVD retains the Closed Caption setting if the power fails.
- Abbreviations, symbols and other grammatical shortcuts may be used in order to keep pace with the on-screen action. This is not a problem with the TV/DVD
- Changing channels may delay Closed Captions for a few seconds.
- Adjusting or muting the volume may delay Closed Captions for a few seconds.
- If Closed Captions are active, the on-screen display will disappear after five seconds.
   This is also true when MUTE is pressed.

#### **TV Rating Settings**

V-Chip enables parents to prevent their children from watching inappropriate material on TV. V-Chip reads the ratings for TV programming (except for news and sports programs, unedited movies on premium cable channels, and Emergency Broadcast System signals), then denies access to programming if the program's rating meets the limitations you select. In this case, a "PROTECTED PROGRAM by ..." message appears on the TV screen. You must select a different TV channel or play a disc instead.


V-Chip affects only TV channels. It does not block DVD playback. To block DVD viewing, change the PARENTAL feature. Details are on pages 49-52.

TV programming may be rated by the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) or according to the Television Parental Guidelines. In order to block any inappropriate programming, set your limits in both places (MPAA RATING and TV RATING).



- To access the V-CHIP SET UP menu, the TV/DVD must be on a TV channel that is not protected. If "PROTECTED PROGRAM ..." appears on the screen, change to a channel that is not protected (blocked).
- You cannot block a subrating (D, L, S or V) if the main category is set to VIEW.
   However, you can set a subrating to VIEW even when the main category is set to BLOCK.
- Changing the category to BLOCK or VIEW automatically changes all its subratings to the same (BLOCK or VIEW).

#### **MPAA Rating Settings**

You can block TV channel viewing according to the Motion Picture Association of America ratings. To do so, follow these steps.



- If you enter the wrong code in the CONFIRM CODE space, repeat step 5. Enter the same new code exactly in the CONFIRM CODE space.

## 28 DVD Disc Menus, Title Menus

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ➤ or OPEN/CLOSE ▲ to activate DVD mode.

#### **DVD Disc Menus**

Some DVDs contain menus that describe the contents of the disc or allow you to customize disc playback. For example, the menu may offer choices for subtitle languages, special features or scene selection.


To use the DVD disc menu and select features, follow these steps.


- Press ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ to select an item, then press ENTER. Continue this process to set up all the features you want or to start disc playback.

#### **Title Menus**

Some DVDs have a title menu, which lists the titles available on the DVD. Use the title menu to play a specific title.

- Press TITLE. The title menu will appear.
  If the feature is not available, × may appear on the TV screen. Or if the DVD only has a main menu as described above, it may appear when you press TITLE.
- Press ♠, ▼, ◀ or ▶ to select a title, then press ENTER. Playback will begin at the title you selected.





- Menus vary among discs.
   Follow the information with the DVD.
- Not all DVDs have disc or title menus.
- Some DVDs may refer to chapters as "scenes." Some DVDs may refer to the title menu as the "scene index."
- The TITLE button may not be active with all DVDs.


## Fast Forward/Reverse Search 29

- Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ➤ or OPEN/CLOSE ▲ to activate DVD mode.
- During playback, press ►► or ◄◄ on the remote control.
  - During DVD playback, pressing ►► or ◄◄ will forward or reverse the picture at approximately 2, 8, 20, 50 or 100 times the normal speed. The speed may vary depending on the disc. ►► 1, ►► 2, ►► 3, ►► 4 or ►► 5 will appear briefly on the TV screen to indicate forward searching. Or, ◄◄ 1, ◄◄ 2, ◄◄ 3, ◄◄ 4 or ◄◄ 5 will indicate reverse searching.
    For DVD playback, the sound will be mute during the search.
  - For Video CDs, Audio CDs or MP3 playback, pressing
     → or ◄ will forward or reverse the picture or sound at approximately 2, 8 or 30 times the normal speed. The speed may vary depending on the disc.
     → 1, → 2 or → 3 will appear briefly on the TV screen to indicate forward searching. Or, ◄ 1, ◄ 2 or ◄ 3 will indicate reverse searching.
     For MP3 or Audio CD playback, the sound will be intermittent during the search.



Example: Playing a DVD in reverse at twice the normal playing speed.

Press PLAY ► to return to normal playback.



## 30 Title/Chapter Playback, Specific Time Playback

#### Title/Chapter Playback

During DVD playback, press SEARCH MODE until CH (for chapter) or TT (for title) appears on the TV.The number of available titles or chapters will appear at the right ( /4, for example).




Enter a title or chapter number using the Number buttons. The title or chapter will play.




#### Specific Time Playback


During DVD, Audio CD or Video CD (without PBC) playback, press SEARCH MODE until the time search display appears.



Within 30 seconds, use the Number buttons to enter the elapsed playing time (of the current track or title) at which you want play to begin. Enter the time in hours, minutes and seconds. Within a few seconds, playback will start at the specified time.

- Example: 1 hour, 23 minutes and 30 seconds  $1 \rightarrow 2 \rightarrow 3 \rightarrow 3 \rightarrow 0$
- Make sure the time you enter is within the total time of the current title or track. If it is not, the time space will clear and playback will continue at its current point. The total time available in the current track or title will appear in the time search display.
- If you make a mistake entering the time, press CLEAR to clear the time area. Enter the correct information.






- When playback is stopped, use the Number buttons to select a title for immediate playback. During playback, use the Number buttons to choose a chapter for immediate playback.
- Title/Chapter Playback is not available with some DVDs.

There are three ways to play a specific Audio CD, Video CD (without PBC), MP3 or JPEG file: Use the Number buttons, SEARCH MODE or PREV I◀◀ and NEXT ▶►I.

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ► or OPEN/CLOSE to activate DVD mode.

#### **Using the Number Buttons**

Press the Number buttons to enter a track number.

Playback will start at the selected track. For tracks 10 and above, press the +100/+10 button so the search display (TR \_ \_ /12 - an example of total tracks) appears on the TV. Press the Number button of the first digit, then press the Number button of the second digit. For example, to play track 26, press +100/+10, then Number 2, then Number 6. For single-digit tracks (1-9), press a single Number button. If you enter a track number that is not available on the disc, playback will not begin (or the current track will continue to

play).

#### **Using SEARCH MODE**

Press SEARCH MODE so the track search display (TR \_ \_ /13, for example) appears. The total number of available tracks appears at the right ( /13, for example). Within 30 seconds, press the Number buttons to select an available track number. Playback will begin at the selected track. For a single-digit track (1-9), enter a zero first. For example, to play track 5, press 0, 5. You do not have to use the +100/+10 button in search mode for tracks 10 or above.



#### Using PREV | ◀ and NEXT ▶ ▶

During playback, press NEXT ►► to skip the current track and move to the next track.

During playback, press PREV | ◀ to return to the beginning of the current track or press repeatedly to go to previous tracks.

- PREV | ◀ and NEXT ▶ I does not function when playback is stopped.
- You cannot use NEXT ►► to go from the last track on the disc to the first track.
- Using PREV I◀◀ or NEXT ▶▶I will only affect MP3 files during Dual Playback.


## 32 Paused and Step-by-Step Playback, Resume On

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ➤ or OPEN/CLOSE to activate DVD mode.

#### Paused and Step-by-Step Playback

- **During playback, press PAUSE II.** Playback will pause and the sound will be mute.
  - Pressing PAUSE II once during Dual Playback will pause a JPEG file only. Pressing PAUSE II one more time will pause an MP3 playback.
- Press PAUSE II repeatedly to see a DVD or Video CD picture advance one frame (or step) at a time. The sound will remain mute.

  Pressing PAUSE II repeatedly during Audio CD, MP3 or JPEG playback will have no effect.
- Press PLAY ► to resume playback.



#### Resume On

Press STOP ■ during playback. In a few seconds, the following Resume message will appear on the TV screen.

For DVD, AudioCD or VideoCD:

Resume ON

Press 'PLAY' to play from here.
To play the beginning,
press 'STOP' first and then 'PLAY'.

For MP3 or JPEG:




Press PLAY ▶. In a few seconds, playback will resume from the point at which it stopped last. You can resume playing at the same point even if you turn off the unit, then turn it on again later. However, opening the disc tray will cancel the Resume feature. Playback will start at the beginning the next time you insert the disc.

For MP3 and JPEG files, playback will resume from the beginning of the current track.

To cancel Resume and start playing the disc from the beginning, press STOP ■ a second time while playback is stopped. The Stop symbol (■) will appear briefly on the TV screen. Press PLAY ► to start playing the disc from the beginning.

The resume information will be saved even when the power is turned off.



- Set Still Mode to FIELD in the DISPLAY menu if paused images are blurry. Details are on pages 46-47.
- Resume On is not available for Video CDs with PBC.

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ➤ or OPEN/CLOSE to activate DVD mode.


#### Repeat

During playback, press REPEAT until the repeat mode you want appears on the TV.

On a DVD, select CHAPTER, TITLE or OFF.

On an Audio CD or Video CD (without PBC), select TRACK, ALL (all tracks on the disc) or OFF. With MP3 or JPEG files, select TRACK, GROUP (all tracks in the current folder), ALL or OFF.

Selecting a new track, chapter or title will cancel Repeat Playback.

#### **A-B** Repeat

Follow these steps to play a section of a DVD, Audio CD or Video CD repeatedly.


- Press PLAY ► to play the disc to the point at which you want repeated playback to begin.
- Press REPEAT A-B to set the starting point (A).
  If you make a mistake, press CLEAR. This will erase point A and let you start over. G OFF will appear briefly on the TV screen.




Play the disc to the point at which you want repeated playback to end, then press REPEAT A-B again. Within a few seconds, the section will begin to play. The segment will play over and over until you cancel the A-B Repeat feature or stop play.



To cancel A-B Repeat Playback, press REPEAT A-B so G OFF appears on the TV screen.
Regular disc playback will resume.





- Repeat and A-B Repeat are not available with some discs.
- A-B Repeat is not available with MP3 playback.
- The entire A-B Repeat section must be within a single title or track. If you do not enter Point B before the end of the track or title is reached, the end of the track or title will become Point B automatically.
- Stopping playback will cancel A-B Repeat.
- If you choose Group Repeat during Dual Playback, all tracks or files in each folder will play repeatedly. For example if you choose Group Repeat during Dual Playback of MP3 folder A and JPEG folder B, all MP3 files in folder A and all JPEG files in folder B will be repeated.

### 34 Markers

Use Markers to remember your favorite places on a DVD, an Audio CD or a Video CD (without PBC). To set the Markers, follow these steps.

- Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ➤ or OPEN/CLOSE ▲ to activate DVD mode.
- Play the disc to within 30 seconds prior to the point at which you want to set the Marker. During playback, press SEARCH MODE repeatedly until the Markers appear at the top of the TV screen.




- Within 30 seconds, press or to select a Marker (1-10). Make sure \_ \_ \_ : \_ : \_ : \_ appears beneath the number.
- Let the disc play to the point at which you want to set the Marker (up to 30 seconds away).

When the disc reaches the point you want to remember, press ENTER. The title or track number and its elapsed playing time will appear beneath the Markers.

A checkmark will replace the Marker number. The Marker display will disappear in about 30 seconds, or press SEARCH MODE again to remove the Marker display.

- Opening the disc tray or turning off the TV/DVD will erase all the Markers.
- To erase a single Marker, press SEARCH MODE until you see the Markers. Press 

  or 

  to select a Marker (a checkmark). Press CLEAR. Press SEARCH MODE to remove the display.
- To erase all the Markers, press SEARCH MODE until you see the Markers. Press ► to select AC (All Clear), then press ENTER. Press SEARCH MODE or RETURN to remove the display.


## Subtitles, Camera Angles 35

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ► or OPEN/CLOSE ▲ to activate DVD mode.

#### **Subtitles**

Select a language for DVD subtitles during playback. You may select only the subtitles that are available on the DVD.

During playback, press SUBTITLE repeatedly to select a subtitle language. The number of available languages appears at the right of the subtitle display. In the example below, six languages are available ( /6). After a few seconds, the subtitles will appear. Press SUBTITLE to turn off subtitles. When no subtitles are available, "NOT AVAILABLE" appears at the right of the subtitle display.


#### **Camera Angles**


Some DVDs contain scenes recorded from different angles. The camera angle will not change if the DVD does not contain sequences recorded from different perspectives.

During DVD playback, press ANGLE repeatedly to select a different angle. The number of available angles appears at the right of the angle display. In this example, eight angles are available ( /8).

#### Helpful Hints

- With some DVDs, you must select a subtitle language in the disc menu.
- If the desired language does not appear after pressing SUBTITLE several times, the disc does not have subtitles in that language.
- Opening the disc tray will cancel your subtitle setting.

## 36 Slow Motion, Zoom

 Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ➤ or OPEN/CLOSE to activate DVD mode.

#### **Slow Motion**

- Press PAUSE II during DVD or Video CD playback.
- Press ➤➤ or ◄◄. Slow motion playback will begin.

  Press ➤➤ or ◄◄ repeatedly to play the DVD forward or backward at approximately 1/16, 1/8 or 1/2 the normal speed. Reverse slow motion is not available on a Video CD.

An I► 1 (1/16), I► 2 (1/8) or I► 3 (1/2) will appear briefly on the TV screen to indicate slow forward playback.

An ◀ 1 (1/16), ◀ 2 (1/8) or ◀ 3 (1/2) will indicate slow reverse playback.

#### Zoom

# 42 MP3/JPEG Playback

The TV/DVD will play MP3 and JPEG files that you record and finalize on a CD-RW (Compact Disc-Rewritable) or CD-R (Compact Disc-Recordable).

These discs may contain pictures in a IPEG format or audio tracks in an MP3 format. For example, you may have photographic film developed by a retailer that places the pictures on a CD-R for you. These pictures may be in JPEG format. Or, you may copy or download MP3 music files from certain legal Internet sites, then copy those files onto a CD-R or CD-RW. You cannot make or record such discs using this TV/DVD. See your computer manual for details on recording. Keep these characteristics in mind when making discs you intend

to play on the TV/DVD.


- Record MP3 files at a sampling frequency of 44.1 kHz or 48 kHz. Record in a constant bit rate between 32 kbps and 320 kbps.
- When recording IPEG files, the size of the picture should be between 32  $\times$  32 and 6300  $\times$  5100 dots.
- Before you begin, press SELECT to put the TV/DVD in DVD mode. Then, press PLAY ▶ or OPEN/CLOSE ▲ to activate DVD mode.
- When you put a CD-RW or CD-R with MP3 or JPEG files in the TV/DVD, a file list will appear on the TV screen when you press DISC MENU (If you use PLAY ► to close the disc tray, playback may start automatically). Press ▲ or ▼ to select a folder, an MP3 file or a JPEG file.
- If you choose a track or file, press PLAY ▶ or **ENTER.** Starting with the track or file you selected, the tracks/files will play in the order they were recorded, i.e. 1, 2, 3.


If you select a folder and press ENTER, the tracks or files within that folder will appear. Press ▲ or ▼ to select the track or file you want, then press **PLAY** ▶ or **ENTER**.

- Press TITLE to return to the first item in the highest level of folders or files.

- To change the transition mode of JPEG playback, press MODE during playback. Then press ◀,▶ or ENTER to switch CUT IN/OUT and FADE IN/OUT. - To change the size of the playback image, press MODE repeatedly until the size status appears at the top of the TV screen during playback. Then press **◄**, **▶** or ENTER to switch between NORMAL(100%) and SMALL(95%).
- 90 degrees clockwise or counter-clockwise.





- JPEG images and MP3 tracks are known as files. Groups of files are called folders.
- Folders have the 🔲 icon.
- MP3 files have the 🗓 icon.
- IPEG files have the icon.
- A maximum of 255 folders can be recognized. A maximum of 999 files can be recognized.
- During playback, press the Number buttons to select another track. Or, press PREV I◀◀ or NEXT ▶▶I to change tracks. If a track is not available, "X" may appear on the TV screen. Playback may resume at an incorrect track or may continue with its current track.
- Specific Time Playback is not possible with MP3 files.
- Progressive JPEGs (JPEG files saved in the progressive format) will not play on this DVD player.
- High resolution JPEG files takes longer to be displayed.
- Changing size may have no effect on some files (e.g. files with a small picture size).




- When you try to play a DVD whose rating exceeds the level you set, an on-screen message will indicate the DVD cannot play. Remove the DVD, then set PARENTAL LEVEL to ALL. # 56 Glossary

**AUDIO IN jacks:** red and white jacks that receive sound from other equipment that is connected to the TV/DVD.

**Automatic Channel Setup:** process in which the TV/DVD memorizes all available TV channels. Then, when you push CH.  $\triangle/\nabla$ , you only scan through channels you receive.

**Bands:** settings that allow you to tune channels.

- Antenna VHF (very high frequency; channels 2-13) and UHF (ultra high frequency; channels 14-69).
- Cable standard channels 1-125 can be received without a Cable Box.

**COAXIAL DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack:** jack on the rear of the TV/DVD that sends digital audio to a stereo, allowing you to adjust the volume at the stereo.

**Dolby Digital**: A surround sound system that provides 5.1 channel sound as used in movie theaters. Sound is heard through multiple channels, not just the right and left as with standard stereo.

<u>VIDEO IN jack:</u> yellow jack on the front of the TV/DVD that receives video from another source (VCR, Camcorder, etc.).

# Helpful Hints 57

If you are having problems with your product, check this list of problems and possible solutions before requesting service. You may be able to solve the problem yourself.

#### Location

For safe operation and satisfactory performance of your TV/DVD, remember the following:

- Shield it from direct sunlight and keep it away from sources of intense heat.
- · Avoid dusty or humid places.
- Avoid places with insufficient ventilation. Do not block the ventilation openings at the top and bottom of the TV/DVD. Do not place the TV/DVD on a carpet, as this will block the ventilation openings.
- Avoid locations subject to strong vibrations.
- $\bullet$  Do not place the TV/DVD near strong magnetic fields.
- Do not move the TV/DVD from a cold place to a hot place or vice versa.

### **Electrical Shock and Fire Hazards**

- Do not handle the power cord with wet hands.
- Do not pull the power cord when disconnecting the TV/DVD from the AC (alternating current) wall outlet.
   Grasp it by the plug.
- If you spill water on the TV/DVD, unplug the power cord immediately and take the TV/DVD to an authorized service center.
- Do not put your fingers or objects into the disc tray.
- Do not place anything on top of the TV/DVD.

### Channel reception is poor.

• Check connections, then set up the TV channels again. Details are on pages 12 and 18.

#### TV/DVD has no power.

• Connect the power plug to an AC (alternating current) outlet completely.

### Disc cannot play.

- Insert a playable disc. Make sure the disc is labelled for ALL regions or Region 1 and is NTSC compatible.
   Details are on page 7.
- Place the disc correctly in the disc tray. If the disc is one-sided, place the disc in the tray with the label facing up. If the disc is two-sided, make sure the label of the side you want to play is facing up.
- · Clean the disc. Make sure the disc is not scratched or warped.
- · Cancel the Parental Controls, enter the password or change the control level. Details are on pages 49-52.

### TV/DVD does not have a picture.

- Adjust the antenna or check the Cable TV or satellite signal connection. If using a Cable Box/Satellite
  Receiver, set the TV/DVD to channel 3 or 4 or AUX. Change TV channels at the Cable Box/Satellite Receiver.
  Details are on pages 9.
- Adjust the TV/DVD picture controls. Details are on page 20.
- Select an active TV channel. Details are on pages 18-19.
- Make sure the disc is compatible with the DVD player of the TV/DVD. Details are on page 7.

### TV/DVD has poor sound or no sound.

- ullet Press VOL. llot or llot to adjust the volume. Press MUTE to restore the muted volume.
- Check the audio settings for DVD mode. Details are on page 48.
- Check the audio settings of the disc. For example, you may have selected "soundtrack" playback or an unavailable sound setting (such as Dolby Digital). Details are on pages 37 and 48. Try other sound options provided in the DVD disc menu.

## You cannot choose a DVD feature, such as camera angle or audio or subtitle language.

• The feature must be recorded on the DVD. Not all DVDs contain multiple angles, subtitles, etc. Refer to the disc case to see what features are available. If the feature is not available, the  $\times$  may appear on the TV screen.

## TV/DVD does not display Closed Captions for TV programs.

• Make sure Closed Captioning is available for the program. Refer to the TV listings in your local newspaper.

## Remote control does not operate the TV/DVD.

- Aim the remote control directly at the remote sensor on the front of the TV/DVD. Details are on page 14.
- Remove all obstacles between the remote control and the TV/DVD.
- Inspect and replace the batteries in the remote control. Details are on page 8.

### Number buttons will not select channels above 69.

- Enter channel numbers as a two-digit number. If you want to select channels 100 and above, press the +100/+10 button, then the Number buttons for the last two digits.
- If you are using an antenna and do not have Cable TV/Satellite, only channels 2-69 will be available.
