- To disconnect the AC power cord (mains lead), pull it out by the plug, not the cord.



### **Preparing the remote** commander

Before using the remote commander for the first time, remove the insulation film.



### To know when to replace the battery

With normal use, the battery (CR2025) should last for about 6 months. When the remote commander no longer operates the unit, replace the battery with a new one



### To turn on/off the power Press I/() (power).

The **I**/ $^{\circlearrowleft}$  (power) button indicator will light up in green when the unit is turned on.

### To adjust the volume

Press **VOLUME** +/- (**VOL** +/- on the remote).

### To reinforce the bass sound


Press **MEGA BASS**.

The MEGA BASS indicator lights up. You can achieve high quality bass sound. To return to normal sound, press the button again.


### Power management system

After playback of the iPod (or component connected to **AUDIO IN** jack) has finished, if no operation is performed for about 30 minutes, the unit will automatically turn off.

**1** Attach the adapter for your iPod/iPhone.



2 Set your iPod/iPhone in the Docking Tray.



- Remove the case or cover from your iPod before setting it in the tray to ensure a stable connection
- **3** Press ►II (direct power-on).


