Introduction

Welcome to the world of Franklin. This Franklin model is a powerful, electronic reference with two built-in books - the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary* and the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary*. There is also one slot in the back for a book card.

With the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary, you can:

- find translations, with comprehensive definitions, most of which contain parts of speech and usage examples;
- conjugate words quickly and easily;
- let state-of-the-art spell correction help you find the word you're looking for;
- hear the pronunciations of headwords, definitions and travelers' phrases;
- use the Grammar Guide, a comprehensive outline of Spanish and English grammar that includes fun quizzes and lessons;
- learn a new word every time you turn the unit on;
- use the MatchMaker function to find words of whose spelling you're unsure, or to help solve crossword puzzles;

- improve your spelling and vocabulary using the learning exercises;
- create your own list of study words in My Word List,
- play seven fun and educational games, including Hangman, Conjumania, Gender Tutor, Word Train, Guess that Word, Word Auction and Word Blaster.

With the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, you can:

- find thousands of words with comprehensive definitions, most of which contain parts of speech and usage examples;
- let state-of-the-art spell correction help you find the word you are looking for;
- hear the pronunciation of English headwords and definitions;
- use the Grammar Guide, a comprehensive outline of English grammar that includes fun quizzes and lessons;
- learn a new word every time you turn the unit on;
- use the MatchMaker function to find words of whose spelling you are unsure, or to help solve crossword puzzles;
- improve your spelling and vocabulary using the Learning Exercises;



✓ About Screen Illustrations

Some screen illustrations in this User's Guide may differ slightly from what you see on screen. This does not mean that your unit is malfunctioning.

Using the Special Features

Your unit is equipped with several special features that many, but not all BOOKMAN book cards use. To learn if you can use the special features with a particular book card, read its User's Guide.




On/Off: Turns the unit on and off.

Function Keys: Each of these keys corresponds to the dictionary or organizer function that appears directly above it on the screen.

Speaker: The speaker is located on the front of the unit.

Headphone Jack: The headphone jack is designed for 3.5 mm, 35 ohm impedance stereo headphones. **Caution**: Monophonic headphones will not work with this unit.

Volume Control: The dial, located under the headphone jack, controls the volume of the speaker or headphones.



Serial Port: Plug in a serial cable here to connect the unit to your PC.

AC Adaptor Jack: The AC/DC adaptor is in the 9 volt range within a current range of 200 to 300 milli-amperes.



This symbol indicates that the inner core of the plug of an AC adaptor is negative and that the outer part of the plug is positive. If the symbol on your AC/DC adaptor does not match the above symbol, confirm its compatibility at its place of purchase.


Book Card Slot: The card slot is located on the back of the unit. It enables you to read electronic books purchased from **franklin.com** and is compatible with most BOOKMAN and BMC cards.

Battery Compartment: The battery compartment is located on the back of the unit. It holds two AAA batteries.

Installing Batteries

Your unit is powered by two AAA batteries. Follow these instructions to install or replace them.

- 1. Turn your unit off and turn it over.
- Lift the battery cover on the back of your unit by pushing up on the catch.



- 3. Remove the old batteries, if necessary.
- Install the batteries following the +/- markings in the battery compartment.
- 5. Replace the battery cover.

Warning: If the batteries wear-out completely, or if you take more than a few seconds while changing the batteries, any information that was entered in the built-in book or book card may be erased. You should always keep written copies of your important information.

Battery disposal: Do not dispose of batteries with normal household waste. Please obey your local regulations when disposing of used batteries.

Battery Precautions


- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged. Never recharge batteries that come with the device.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the device before being charged.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.
- The supply terminals are not to be shortcircuited.
- Do not expose batteries to direct heat or try to take batteries apart. Follow the battery manufacturer's instructions for battery use.
- Always remove a weak or dead battery from the device.
- To avoid damage caused by leakage of the battery fluid, replace the battery or batteries once every two years regardless of how much the device has been used during that time.
- Should a battery leak, the device may become damaged. C1lean the battery compartment immediately, avoiding contact with your skin.
- Keep batteries out of reach of small children. If swallowed, consult a physician immediately.

Installing Book Cards

Your unit contains two built-in books. You can purchase more titles on book cards at **www.franklin.com**. To install a book card, follow these steps.

Warning: Inserting a book card may erase any userentered information. You should always keep written copies of your important information.

- 1. Turn your unit off and turn it over.
- Remove the blank protector or any other book card that might be installed.
- Align the tabs on the book card with the notches in the slot.



4. Press the book card down until it snaps into place. **Warning:** Never install or remove a book card while your unit is on. Any information that was entered in the built-in book or book card will be erased.

Selecting a Book

To switch between the two built-in books, or to open a book on an installed book card, open the Card menu.

- 1. Turn your unit on.
- Press CARD.



Icons appear for each available book.

- 3. Press ▶ or ◀ to highlight your selection.
- 4. Press ENTER to select it.
- 5. Press CARD to return to the Card menu.


✓ BOOKMAN Card Troubleshooting

Make sure your book card is installed correctly. If your card is performing erratically, follow the reset instructions in "Resetting Your Unit" on page 85. If this does not fix the problem, remove the card and then remove the white rubber strip located between the two metal pins. Clean the rubber strip with your fingers and then replace it making sure it is completely in its notch.

Using Function Keys in Book Cards

The function keys appear at the top of the keyboard on your unit. These keys correspond in the order listed to the dictionary and organizer keys at the bottom of the screen. The dictionary function keys change with the book card. The organizer function keys are unaffected. **Note:** Once you access the organizer from a book card, you will exit the book card. You must press **CARD** and select your book card to return to it.

The function keys on your unit correspond to the function keys on your card as illustrated below.



Transferring Words Between Books

The built-in dictionaries can transfer words with one another and with certain other book cards. To send an English word from the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary* to the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary*, follow these steps:

- Highlight an English word in the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary.
 To highlight a word in a dictionary entry, press ENTER to start the highlight, and use the arrow keys to move the highlight to the word
- 2. Hold FN and press CARD.
- 3. Highlight SPEAKING SPEAKING

you want.

- Press ENTER.
 The word you highlighted appears in the Merriam-Webster Dictionary.
- Press ENTER again, if needed, to search for that word.
- 6. Press (to hear the word.
- Press THES to find a thesaurus entry for the word.
 Note: To transfer words between books, an installed book card must be able to send or receive words. To learn if a book card can send or receive words, read its User's Guide.



Using the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary

The Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary is the dictionary that opens every time you turn on your device. To access this dictionary at any other time, follow these steps:

- 1. Turn your product on.
- Press CARD.
- 3. Use the arrow keys to highlight RESPRICE.
- Press ENTER.

Many features of the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary* are the same or similar to those of the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary*. Differences are specifically noted.

Changing the Language

Message Language

When you turn on this product for the first time, you must choose the message language. Press **A** for English or press **B** for Spanish.

Note: The English dictionary and thesaurus is English-only. You cannot set or change the language.



The message language is the language of prompts, help, and other messages. You can change the message language after your initial decision. See "Changing the Settings" on page 24 to learn how.

Entry Language

The entry language is the language in which you enter words at the Word Entry screen. This determines which dictionary you will use, Spanish or English.

- 1. Press **MENU**.
- Use the direction keys to highlight LENG., and then press ENTER to access the Spanish-to-English dictionary.

Select Legen at the icon menu to go to the English-to-Spanish dictionary.

Or you can press **LANG** at the Word Entry screen to switch between Spanish and English.

<u>Using the Larousse</u> Spanish-English Dictionary Menu

When you press **MENU** in the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary*, you will see ten icons. Use these to quickly take you to different parts of your dictionary. Use the arrow keys to highlight the icon you want and press **ENTER**.



Viewing a Demonstration or Tutorial

You can view a demonstration or tutorial of this dictionary any time you want.

1. Press MENU.



- 2. Use the arrow keys to highlight and press **ENTER**.
- Press ▼ to highlight either *Tutorial* or View Demo and press ENTER.

To stop the demonstration or exit from the *Tutorial* and go to the Word Entry screen, press **CLEAR**.

To go to the main menu, press MENU.

When a book card is installed in your unit, select *View Demo* from the Setup menu to see the demonstration for that card.

✓ Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows to the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move around menus or view more text.

✓ Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at any screen by pressing **HELP**. Press ▲ or ▼ to read. To exit help, press **BACK**.

Changing the Settings

When using this dictionary, you can activate the *Learn a Word* feature, adjust the screen contrast, the shutoff time, the type size, and the message language.

Learn a Word helps you increase your vocabulary by displaying a different headword and definition each time you open your dictionary.

Contrast enables you to set how light or dark the screen appears.


The *Shutoff* time is how long your unit stays on if you forget to turn it off.

Type Size enables you to set the size of the font displayed on screen.

The *Message Language* is the language of prompts, help, and other messages.

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Use the arrow keys to highlight and press **ENTER**.

Settings will be highlighted.



3. Press ENTER to select it.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to move ► to Learn a Word, Contrast, Shutoff, Type Size or Mensajes (Messages).

- Press

 ✓ or

 ✓ to change the setting.

 Your changes are automatically saved.
- Press ENTER when done.Press CLEAR to return to the dictionary Word Entry screen.

✓ Learn a Word

Your dictionary comes with a Learn a Word feature to help you increase your vocabulary. Each time you turn your dictionary on, you can see a different headword and definition. If you wish to turn this feature on, press **MENU**.

Highlight 122 and press ENTER. Press


ENTER again to select *Settings*. Use ◀ or ▶ to turn the feature on or off and press **ENTER** when done.

The entry language determines the language of the words you'll be shown. For example, if Spanish is the current entry language, you will be shown Spanish words with their English translations. To learn how to change the entry language, see "Changing the Language" on page 20.

Translating Spanish Words

Your Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary is fully bilingual. Try translating a Spanish word.

- Press CLEAR.
- 2. Press **LANG** to change the entry language from English to Spanish, if needed.
- 3. Type a word (e.g., estudiar).
 To erase a letter, press BACK. To type accents, type the letter (e.g., e) and press
 ▲ or ▼ repeatedly until the accent you want appears (e.g., é). If you want to type an ñ, then hold FN and press N. To type a capital, hold CAP and press a letter key. To type a number, hold FN and press Q-P. To type a hyphen, hold FN and press J.
 - Press ENTER to view the English translation.




Press **PACE** or **▼** to scroll.

- Hold FN and press ▶ or ◀ to view the next or previous definition.
- 6. Press CLEAR when done.

✓ Understanding Definitions

Dictionary entries consist of headwords, parts of speech, the translation, and/or definitions. Other forms of the word may follow the headword. Capitalized words indicate the category for which the word is used. After the translation or definition, you may see a list of usage examples.

- In the Spanish Word Entry screen, type saber.
- 2. Press ENTER.



✓ Explanation of Genders

Spanish nouns are different than English nouns in that they must either be masculine or feminine. Each definition of a noun indicates which gender it is with *m* or *f*.

✓ Misspelling Words

If you enter a misspelled word, a list of corrections appears. Highlight the word you want and then press **ENTER** to see its dictionary entry.

Translating English Words

You can also use the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary* to translate English words into Spanish.

- 1. Press CLEAR.
- Press LANG to change the entry language from Spanish to English, if needed.
- Type a word (e.g., read).
 To erase a letter, press BACK. To type accents, type the letter (e.g., e) and press
 ▲ or ▼ repeatedly until the accent you want appears (e.g., é). To type a capital,

hold **CAP** and press a letter key. To type a number, hold **FN** and press **Q-P**. To type a hyphen, hold **FN** and press **J**.

Press ENTER to view the Spanish translation.



Press to hear the word pronounced.

Press **SPACE** or ▼ to scroll.

- Hold FN and press ▶ or ◀ to view the next or previous definition.
- Press CLEAR when done.

✓ Choosing Multiple Forms

Some words in this dictionary have more than one form (e.g. *resume*, *résumé*). When the word you are looking up has multiple forms, the different forms appear in a list.

Simply highlight the form you want and press **ENTER** to see its dictionary entry. For example, enter *resume* at the Spanish Word Entry screen.





Highlight the form you want and press **ENTER** to see its dictionary entry. To go back to the Multiple Forms list, press **BACK**.

Finding Letters in Words

If you are uncertain about how to spell a word, type a question mark (?) in place of each unknown letter. To find prefixes, suffixes, and other parts of words, type an asterisk (*) in a word. Each asterisk stands for a series of letters. **Note**: If you type an asterisk at the beginning of a word, it may take a little while to find the matching words.

- Press LANG to switch to the Spanish Word Entry screen, if needed.
- Type a word with ?s and *s.To type an asterisk, hold down FN and press ?.
- Press ENTER.
- Press ▼ to move the highlight to the word you want and press ENTER to view its definition
- Press CLEAR when done.

Highlighting Words


Another way to look up words is by highlighting them in dictionary entries or word lists. You can then find *their* definitions or phrases, hear them pronounced, or add them to *My Word List*.

 At any text, press ENTER to start the highlight.



To turn the highlight off, press BACK.

Use the arrow keys to move the highlight to the word you want.



To... Press... define the word ENTER find a phrase FN+? hear the word add word to My Word List LEARN

3. Press CLEAR when done.

Hearing Words

The Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary can pronounce the words that appear on almost any screen - in definitions, spell correction lists, My Word List, and games. When you want to hear how a word is pronounced, just highlight it and press .

To adjust the volume, turn the volume control on the side of the unit. You can plug headphones into the headphone jack which is just above the volume control. Try this example.

- 1. Type a word at the Word Entry screen. For example, type *teléfono*.
- 2. Press to hear it pronounced.
- 3. Press ENTER to see its definition.

- 5. Press **ENTER** to start the highlight.
- Move the highlight to a word you want to hear.



- 7. Press to hear the highlighted word pronounced.
- 8. Press CLEAR when done.

Using Learning Exercises

Using Learning Exercises, you can read cultural notes, test your spelling, improve your vocabulary, browse the TOEFL® Test* Word List, and get grammar guidance.

Cultural Notes

1. Press **MENU**, highlight and press **ENTER**.

Or you can press **LEARN**.

Use ▼ to highlight Cultural Notes and press ENTER.

You can choose to read either English cultural notes which refer to the United Kingdom and the United States, or Spanish cultural notes which refer to Spain and Latin America.

Speaking Spelling Bee

Press MENU, highlight and press FNTER

Or you can press **LEARN**.

 Use ▼ to highlight Speaking Spelling Bee and press ENTER.

 Press ENTER to see the translation. Press BACK to return to Speaking Spelling Bee.
- 5. Press **SPACE** for a new word.
- 6. Press CLEAR when done.

Flashcards

Press MENU, highlight and press ENTER.

Or you can press **LEARN**.

Use ▼ to highlight Flashcards and press ENTER.

You can choose My Flashcards (English) which uses English words from My Word List, My Flashcards (Spanish) which uses

Spanish words from *My Word List*, or TOEFL® Test Flashcards which uses words from the TOEFL® Test Word List.

3. Highlight the list you want and press **ENTER**.

A word will be displayed on the screen for you to study or define. Press to hear it. Press **ENTER** to see the definition. Press **BACK** to return to Flashcards.

- 4. Press **SPACE** to see a new word.
- Press CLEAR when done.

Viewing the TOEFL® Test Word List

1. Press **MENU**, highlight and press **ENTER**.

Or you can press **LEARN**.

2. Use ▼ to highlight TOEFL® Test Word List and press ENTER to view the list.

Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll.

You can also type the first few letters of a word to find it on the list (e.g., type *col* to find *collaborate*).


Press ENTER or CONJ at any word to view its translation or to conjugate it. Press to hear it. Press BACK to return to the list.

Using the Grammar Guide

Your Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary includes a helpful grammar guide that describes parts of speech. To use the Grammar Guide, follow these instructions.

From the Learning Exercises Menu


- Press MENU.
- 2. Highlight and then press **ENTER**. Or you can press **LEARN**.
- 3. Press ▼ to highlight *Grammar Guide* and then press **ENTER**.



- Press ▼ to highlight the topic you want to study and then press ENTER.
- 5. Press **SPACE** or **▼** to read.
- Press FN + ▶ or ◀ to view the next or previous topic.

From an Inflection Screen

- 1. Press **MENU**, highlight substitution or by and then press **ENTER**.
- 2. Type a word to conjugate (e.g., *leer*), and then press **CONJ**.
- Press FN + ▶ or ◀ repeatedly to find the tense you want to read about in the Grammar Guide.
- 4. Press HELP.



Information about the tense will be displayed along with usage examples.

Press BACK to return to the inflection screen or press CLEAR to return to the Word Entry screen.

Using My Word List

In the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary, you can save up to 40 words total, in both English and Spanish, in My Word List for personal study or review. My Word List is saved between sessions unless your product is reset.

Warning: Inserting a book card may erase any user-entered information. You should always keep written copies of your important information.

Adding Words from the Learning Exercises Menu

- 1. Press MENU.
- Highlight and then press ENTER.
 Or you can press LEARN and then press ENTER.



Press LANG to switch from the English to the Spanish List, if needed.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Add a word and press ENTER.
- Type a word.
- Press ENTER to add the word.
- 7. Press CLEAR when done.

Adding Words from the Word Entry Screen

You can also add words to *My Word List* directly from the Word Entry screen.

- 1. Press CLEAR.
- Press LANG to choose the language of the word you want to add (e.g., Spanish).
 English words will be added to the English List; Spanish words will be added to the Spanish List.
- 3. Type the word you want to add to your word list (e.g., *elegante*).



Advanced Verb Conjugations

From the Icon Menu

- For example, press MENU, use the arrow keys to highlight (Spanish Conjugation) and then press ENTER.
 - To choose English conjugation, select GUE You can also press CONJ and then LANG to choose the language.
- 2. Type a word (e.g., estudiar).
- Press CONJ.
 If needed, highlight the part of speech or translation you want and press ENTER.
 These are the principal forms of the Spanish verb "estuidar". The English translations are below each Spanish inflection.
- Press SPACE or ▼ to scroll.


From a Dictionary Entry

Some words have different parts of speech or multiple translations. You can easily find which part of speech or specific translation you will need to conjugate by first looking up the word and then pressing **CONJ**. Follow this example.

1. Press **MENU**, use the arrow keys to highlight (PAR), and then press **ENTER**.

To choose English, select also press **CONJ** and then **LANG** to choose the language.

- 2. Type a word (e.g., saber).
- 3. Press ENTER to look it up.



Read the definition to find the verb you want (e.g., *to know*).

Press CONJ to conjugate the headword, saber.

Highlight the part of speech you want (e.g., *verb*) and press **ENTER**. Then highlight the translation you want (e.g., *know*) and press **ENTER**.

These are the principal forms of the Spanish verb "saber". The English translations are below each Spanish inflection.

- Press SPACE or ▼ to scroll.
 Press ? to display the root word.
- Press either CONJ or hold FN and press
 ▶ repeatedly to view more inflections.



✓ Accenting Letters

You can look up accented words without typing accents. If there are no Multiple Forms, the Spanish Professor will take you directly to the word. If there are Multiple Forms, you will have to choose the correct word from a Multiple Forms list. See "Choosing Multiple Forms" on page 30 for more information. Remember, if you want to enter an accent yourself, type the letter and press ▲ or ▼ until the appropriate accent appears. You can also hold **FN** and press **N** to get an \tilde{n} .

✓ Getting Grammar Guidance

When viewing inflections, you can press **HELP** to go directly to the Grammar Guide and view detailed descriptions of how to use the inflections you were viewing along with usage examples.



✓ Viewing English Inflections

If you are unfamiliar with inflections, it may be helpful to look at some inflected forms of English verbs. Switch the entry language back to English, type *write*, and press **CONJ** to see the different forms of the English verb "to write". This will give you a good idea of each inflection form.

✓ Verb Conjugations

The Spanish Professor conjugates verbs into the following forms: present, imperfect, preterite, future, conditional, present subjunctive, imperfect subjunctive 2, present perfect, pluperfect, preterite anterior, future perfect, conditional perfect, present perfect subjunctive, pluperfect subjunctive, pluperfect subjunctive, pluperfect subjunctive, present progressive, and past progressive.

Translating Travelers' Phrases

There are two ways in which you can translate several helpful phrases in categories ranging from *Emergencies* to *Business Communication* to *Time & Dates*.

Note: Travelers' phrases are only available in the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary*.

Browsing Through Phrases

- Press MENU.
- Use the arrow keys to highlight Line and then press ENTER to view the English phrases.

Select 🔛 to view the Spanish phrases.



You can also hold **FN** and press ? to go straight to the Phrases menu in the same language as the lookup language.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the category you want and press ENTER.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the phrase you want to translate and then press ENTER.



To hear a phrase pronounced, press **ENTER** to start a highlight, use the arrow keys to highlight the speaker symbol (��) in front of the phrase you want to hear, and then press **ENTER** to hear it.

Searching for a Specific Phrase

If more than one phrase is found, hold FN and press ▶ to scroll.

In the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary, you have seven fun games to choose from.

Changing Game Settings

Before you play, you can choose the source of the words, the skill level, the language, and whether or not graphics will be used.

Getting Help in the Games

Note: If you reveal the game word, you lose the round.

Hangman

Hangman selects a mystery word and challenges you to guess it letter by letter. The letters of the mystery word are hidden by question marks. The number of guesses remaining is indicated by #'s.

Type letters that you think are in the mystery word. If you are correct, the letter appears in place of the corresponding question mark(s). To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTER**. Press **BACK** to return to the game.

Conjumania!™

Conjumania! teaches verb conjugations. It shows you an infinitive verb and asks you to enter a conjugation. Your conjugation must be spelled correctly, including accents. Type your guess and then press **ENTER**. To see the

translation of the game word, press **ENTER**. Press **BACK** to return to the game. To try a new conjugation, press **ENTER**.

Gender Tutor™

Gender Tutor asks you to guess the gender of Spanish nouns. Press **M** for masculine and **F** for feminine. To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTER**. Press **BACK** to return to the game.

Word Train™

In Word Train, you and the train take turns typing letters to form a word. Whoever types the last letter of the word wins. To view the letters you can type at your turn, hold **CAP** and press?. Press? to end a round and reveal the word. To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTER**. Press **BACK** to return to the game.

Guess the Word

In *Guess the Word*, you must type the missing letters in the mystery word. To read the definition of the mystery word, press ▼, if needed. Press ◀ or ▶, if needed, to select a missing letter, and then type the letter that you think belongs there. Continue typing letters until

the word is complete or no more tries are left. Or press ? to give up and reveal the word. To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTER**. Press **BACK** to return to the game. Press **SPACE** to play a new round.

Word Auction™

In Word Auction, you try to bid on all the letters of a mystery word, before your cash runs out. The amount of each bid depends on the frequency of the letter. All bids will cost you whether correct or incorrect. If you guess the word by revealing all of the letters, your remaining cash is added to the next round. To see the translation of the game word, press ENTER. Press BACK to return to the game.

Word Blaster™

In Word Blaster you try to guess the mystery word before all its letters appear. As soon as you know the word press ENTER. Then type your guess and press ENTER. If you're wrong, Word Blaster asks you for another word. The speed at which the letters appear is set by the skill level. To see the translation of the game word, press ENTER. Press BACK to return to the game.

Using the Merriam-Webster Dictionary

The Merriam-Webster Dictionary is an Englishonly book. Many features of the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary are the same or similar to those of the Merriam-Webster Dictionary. In addition, the Merriam-Webster Dictionary includes a thesaurus, speech for headwords and definitions, quizzes and lessons in the Grammar Guide, an SAT* Word List, and more educational, fun games. Other differences are specifically noted in the relevant sections.




One difference is that you can hear entire definitions in the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary*.

Hold **FN** and press to hear the definition. **Note**: If you have a word highlighted, you will not be able to hear the definition by holding **FN** and pressing .

Using the Thesaurus

✓ Understanding Thesaurus Entries

A thesaurus entry consists of a group of synonyms, antonyms and classmates. Synonyms are words that have similar meanings, e.g. *happyljoyous*. Antonyms are words that have the opposite meaning of the word being defined, e.g., *happylunhappy*. Classmates are words that are related in some way to the word being defined, e.g. *octagonlpolygon*, *triangle*, *rectangle*, *pentagon*....

✓ Understanding Flashing Messages

When you first see a definition, notice the upper right corner of the screen. Often either THES or CONF (or both) will flash briefly. THES means the word you looked up has a thesaurus entry.

If you see THES flash, press THES to view the thesaurus entry.

CONF means the word you looked up has a confusable. If you see **CONF** flash, press **CONF** to view the confusables.

✓ Understanding Confusables

Confusables are homonyms, homophones and spelling variants that are easy to confuse, e.g. *rain*, *reign*, *rein*. If the word you looked up is a confusable, **conf** will flash once in the upper right of the screen. Press **CONF** to view the confusables



Highlighting Words

Another way to look up words is by highlighting them in dictionary entries, thesaurus entries or word lists. You can then find *their* definitions, thesaurus entries, or add them to *My Word List*.

 At any text, press ENTER to start the highlight.

To turn the highlight off, press BACK.



Note: This list is separate from the English List and Spanish List saved in the *Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary*.

In the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, you can add words to My Word List in a way similar to that described for the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary on page 41. To access My Word List,

press **MENU**, highlight and press **ENTER**. Or you can press **LEARN**, highlight *My Word List* and press **ENTER**.

√ Adding Words Not in This Dictionary

When you add a word not in this dictionary, you are given three options: *Add Anyway*, *Cancel* and *Correction List*. Highlight the option you want and press **ENTER**.

Caution: Adding words that are not in this dictionary uses considerably more memory than adding words that are. If you add only words that are not in this dictionary, *My Word List* may contain as few as 10 words.

Playing Games

In the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, you have 10 fun games to choose from: Hangman, Anagrams, Word Train, Word Builder, Letter Poker, Jumble, Word Deduction, Word Blaster, and 1 or 2 Player Link Four. For instructions about playing Hangman, Word Train and Word Blaster, see pages 55, 56 and 57, respectively.

Changing Game Settings

Before you play, you can choose the source and size of the words, the skill level, and whether or not graphics will be used. Although you change the game settings in the same manner for the Larousse Spanish-English Dictionary, each setting applies to all games in the Merriam-Webster Dictionary only. For detailed instructions, see "Changing Game Settings" on page 53.

Getting Help in the Games

During any game you can read instructions by pressing **HELP**. In all games except *Link Four* you can get a hint by holding **CAP** and pressing ? or reveal the game word by pressing ?. **Note**: If you reveal the game word, you lose the round.

Anagrams

Type an anagram and then press **ENTER**. The number of anagrams possible appears to the right of the screen.

Hold **CAP** and press ? to shuffle the letters in the selected word. Press ? to end a round and reveal the word or words. Press **ENTER** to highlight a word. Press **ENTER** again to see the definition of the word or press **THES** to see the thesaurus entry. Press **BACK** to return to *Anagrams*.

Word Builder

Word Builder makes anagrams for you. Before you play, type letters you want Word Builder to build words from and press **ENTER**.

Word Builder shows the anagrams it has built.

To see the definition or thesaurus entry of a particular anagram, press **ENTER** to turn the highlight on, use the arrow keys to move the highlight to the anagram you want and press **DICT** or **THES**. Press **BACK** to return to *Word Builder*.

Word Deduction

In Word Deduction, you must guess the puzzle word. The letters of the puzzle word appear as underscores. You are limited to a certain number of guesses. When you enter a word, the number of letters that are found in the puzzle exactly as you typed them are listed under perfect. The number of letters that are found in the puzzle but not where you typed them are listed under misplaced. The number of guesses remaining appears to the right of the current guess.

You can use the arrow keys to view previous guesses along with their score. Hold **CAP** and press ? to reveal a single letter in the puzzle. Press ? to reveal the puzzle word and end the game. Press **BACK** to return to the Games menu.

Letter Poker

Letter Poker challenges you to make longer words with the letters you are dealt than the house does with its letters. You and the house take turns betting and discarding, but you do not see the house's letters until the end of the

game. The scoring is similar to normal poker: one four-letter word is better than a three and two-letter word (in normal poker four of a kind is better than a full house). The longer your word, the better your chances of winning.

To play, type a word from your letter cards and press **ENTER**.

You can make two words by typing a **SPACE** between them. Watch for the dealer's moves.

You need to know the following poker terms before you begin to play, as they appear as prompts on the screen.

Press the initial letter to make your choice. For example, to Bet, press **B**, to Raise, press **R** and so on.

Bet Means you want to bet on your hand. You can bet up to \$100.

Pass Means you'll pass the bet to the dealer.

Fold Means that you want to end, and lose, the hand.

See Means you'll match the dealer's bet.

Raise Means you'll increase the dealer's bet. You can raise it up to \$100. **Note:** To type a bet, press **Q-P** for numbers.

The pot starts at \$1000, with a \$10 ante (the initial bet to start the game). If you are unable to make a word at the time, type letters that you are likely to use later from those you are dealt. To erase a letter, press **BACK**. To continue without typing letters, press **ENTER**.

If you bet before the house does, you see a prompt, "Pass, Bet or Fold." If the house bets first, you see a prompt, "See, Raise, or Fold."

You can discard up to three letters. After discarding, you see a message showing how

discarding, you see a message showing how many cards, if any, the house discarded. If the hand ends in a tie, you do not lose your money. The pot carries on to the next hand.

Jumble

Jumble tests your ability to unscramble letters and form words. It shows a series of letters. Type words made from these letters and then press **ENTER**. The number of possible solution words appears to the right of the screen.

Before you play, select a word list from the *Game Settings* menu. You can also type a word to play by selecting *Enter your own*.

Hold **CAP** and press **?** to shuffle the letters in the root word.

To see the definition or thesaurus entry of a particular word, use ▶ or ◀ to move the highlight to the word you want and press **DICT** or **THES**.

Press BACK to return to Jumble.

Link Four

Link Four challenges you to connect four game pieces in any direction. You can play alone (1 Player Link Four) or with a friend (2 Player Link Four).

Use ▶ or ◀ to move your game piece to the post you want, then press **ENTER**. The game pieces are displayed to the right of the screen to show whose turn it is.

The first player to link four game pieces wins.

Using the Organizer

The Organizer contains a clock, databank, metric converter, currency converter and calculator. To access the Organizer, press ORG. The clock is the default state in the organizer.

Using the Clock

The clock displays the current time and date. You can save two times: Home time and World time.

- 1. Press ORG.
- Press CLOCK to toggle between Home time and World time.
- From Home time, press ENTER to set the time and date.
- Use ▲ and ▼ to scroll through the options in the highlighted field.
- Use ▶ or ◀ to move to another field.
- Press ENTER when done.Press CLEAR to exit without saving the settings.
- 7. Press **CLOCK** to toggle to World time.
- Set World time the same way you set Home time.

Using the Databank

Adding Entries

You can store as many as 100 names and telephone numbers and addresses in the Databank. The total number of names you can add depends on the size of each entry.

- Type a postal address or e-mail address and press ENTER.
 - To type a number, hold **FN** and press **Q-P**. To type an @, hold **FN** and press **M**.
- 7. Press **MENU** to go to the dictionary.

Viewing or Editing Entries

- 3. Highlight *View: XX entries (XX% free)* and then press **ENTER**.
- 4. To edit an entry, highlight it and press **ENTER**

The password you set will be requested the first time the Databank is used during a session.

To change the password, repeat Steps 1-5.
