INSTALLATION (Speakers and Decorative Insert)

DISASSEMBLE AND FIX THE DECORATIVE INSERT



To remove the insert, release 3 pcs screws (1), then pull out the insert from the main unit.




To fix the insert, place it with two holes into main unit speaker holder (2), then fix it by 3 pcs screws (3).

PLACE AND FIX THE SPEAKER

- Insert the speaker stud into the hole of the main unit (1).
- Push the speaker backward to the end until it clicks (2).

DISASSEMBLE THE SPEAKER

- Push the speaker forward from the back side (1).
- Release the speaker from the main unit speaker holder (2).





ANGLE ADJUSTMENT (Speakers)

Used to connect the bracket (included) to set the speaker box on an angle.

VERTICAL ANGLE


Insert the bracket with (A) side and push upward to adjust for vertical angle.






TILT ANGLE

Insert the bracket with (B) side and push upward to adjust for desired angle.






INSTALLATION (Wall Mounting)

Installation options:

Wall mount

To mount the center section on the wall:

- Position the bracket (supplied) on the wall (as show below) where you want to hang the whole unit. Drill 2 holes slightly undersized for a firm fit.
- Secure the bracket on the wall using 2 dowels and 2 screws (supplied).
- The mounting screws should be anchored into solid wall support, such as wood frame or concrete wall.
 Mount the center unit onto the wall bracket.
- Make sure the mounting tab on the center unit fits securely into the mounting slot on the wall bracket.
- Screws and plastic dowels are also provided for speakers if they are to be wall-mounted away from the center section.



Note: speakers can be wall mounted separately as on below drawing.









Battery Installation

- 1. Remove the battery tray by pressing point (1a) inside, then sliding point (1b) area at the same time.
- 2. Pull out the battery tray.
- Install or replace the button-type battery "CR2032" (supplied).
- 4 Close the battery tray.






Note: Pull out insulation tag from the button battery tray before operating the remote control.

Tuner: To recall preset stations CD: To recall tracks

Repeat 1/ALL function for CD/iPod mode

Plays 10 seconds of each CD track

50. RANDOM Button

CD play in random sequence

To increase volume level



The cord is fixed on main unit.





- 2. Do not mix new batteries with old or used batteries.
- 3. Only use batteries of the same type and brand.
- If the unit will not be used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries and store them in a cool place.
- 5. Carefully follow the battery manufacturer's instructions for proper use and disposal.
- 6. DO NOT ALLOW YOUNG CHILDREN TO HANDLE BATTERIES.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

POWER ON/OFF

When the AC power is connected, "-- -- : -- -- shows on the LCD display.

- Press the POWER/STANDBY button to turn the unit 'ON'. Note: The LCD display lights up and "HELLO" greeting shows on display, the STANDBY LED light goes off. Volume at 13 (max 30).
- You can now select your desired music source by pressing one of the function buttons: TUNER/BAND or CD PLAY/PAUSE ► or AUX or iPod on main console.
- To switch to POWER OFF, press the POWER/STANDBY button to turn the unit 'OFF'. "GOOD BYE" appears on display. The STANDBY LED lights.
- Display back light ON/OFF won't be affected by power ON/OFF.




NOTE: Please turn off the unit to standby mode before disconnecting main power supply from the unit.

SETTING THE TIME

When the unit is first connected to an AC power outlet, the display shows "-- --: -- --". To set the clock to the current time proceed as follows:

- 1. In power off mode, press and hold the PROG button for 2 seconds, the "12" hour digits begin to flash.
- 2. Press the ◄◄ / ▶▶ to select your desire either 12 or 24 hour clock time format.
- 3. Press the PROG button to hour mode until the hour flashes.
- Press the ◄◄ / ▶► to adjust the hour time while it is flashing. Be sure to set the hour correctly for AM or PM.
- 5. Press PROG button once to minute mode and the minutes will flash.
- Press the ◄ / ► to adjust the minute time while it is flashing.
- 7. Press the PROG button once more, the display stops flashing and the clock begins to run.



TIMER ON/OFF SETTING

NOTE: The clock should be adjusted before the Timer On/Off setting.

- Press the SUREWAKE TIMER button on remote control once, the TIMER ON indicator and hour digit begin to flash.
- Press the ◄◄ / ►► to adjust the hour time up or down. Be sure to set the hour correctly for AM or PM.
- 3. Press the SUREWAKE TIMER button once, the minute digits begin to flash.
- Press the ◄◄ / ►► to adjust the minute time up or down.
- Press the SUREWAKE TIMER button on remote control again, the TIMER OFF indicator and hour digit begin to flash.
- Press the ◄◄ / ▶► to adjust the hour time up or down. Be sure to set the hour for correctly for AM or PM
- 7. Press the SUREWAKE TIMER button once, the minute digits begin to flash.
- Press ◄ / ▶ button to adjust the minute time up or down.
- Press the SUREWAKE TIMER button once; setting to: TUNER or CD or iPod are selected by pressing the ◄◄ / ▶▶ button.
- 10. Press the SUREWAKE TIMER button, then press the **|◄◄** / **▶▶** to select the volume level.
- 11. Press the TIMER button on remote control once more, then the Timer On and Off adjustment is finished with the " ① " display remaining ON (The SUREWAKE TIMER setting will show you once on display).


Note: Timer function with **SUREWAKE** starts the music quietly and then increases the volume to room level or your selected volume level to make sure you are awake.

To cancel the Timer On setting, press SUREWAKE TIMER button on remote control until " " display goes off.

Note: To turn off the set while timer is on, press POWER button.


SETTING THE SLEEP

Pressing SLEEP button on remote control permits settings from 10 to 90 minutes. When the desired time appears, releasing your finger will set the time. (Pressing "SLEEP" after the 10 minute showed, sleep timer position will cancel the sleep timer.)





Change of SLEEP Setting

















BASIC OPERATION

Electronic volume control

Electronic volume control display



- Press VOL-DOWN (-) button to adjust sound level down, the volume level (00 - 30) will be shown in the LCD display.
- 2. Holding down the button will result in continuous decrease of the sound level.
- 3. Similarly, press VOL-UP (+) button to adjust sound level up.

Muting Function

If the MUTE button is pressed, the audio output will be muted, and the current display begins to flashing.



Pressed the MUTE button again to resume.



BASSXPANDER Control

Press the BASSXPANDER button to get the rich bass sound.

BASSXPANDER shows on display



To switch off the BASSXPANDER function, press the button once more.

BASSXPANDER shows on display



PRESET EQUALIZATION

Press the EQ button on remote control repeatedly to cycle through the preset EQ showing on the LCD display -- PASS, CLASSIC, ROCK, POP and JAZZ.

LISTENING TO THE RADIO

- Press the POWER/STANDBY button to turn the system 'ON'.
- Press the TUNER/BAND button to select the radio function.



Example : FM mode



- 3. Press the TUNER/BAND button repeatedly to select AM or FM band.
- 4. Press the SKIP Forward or Backward buttons to tune to the desired station.



Auto tuning - Press the TUNING forward or backward buttons momentarily and release. The tuner will move forward or backward to the next available station.

Manual Tuning - Press and hold the SKIP forward/ backward buttons until the display approaches your desired station. Then tap the buttons repeatedly until the display shows the exact frequency.

5. When finished listening, press the POWER button to shut the system OFF.

Note: For AM reception, plug the supplied frame antenna into the AM ANT jack. Then adjust the frame antenna until it is in position with the best reception.

STORING PRESET STATIONS

1. Tune to the station you wish to store.



The unit enables you to program 30 stations of FM and 10 stations of AM band.

2. Press the PROG button once, and the preset station number will be flashing.



Press the PRESET button repeatedly to set the desired preset station number.

Press the PROG button again. The station is stored.



5. To store other stations, repeat above steps.

RECALLING PRESET STATION

Press the PRESET **V** buttons to select the desired station.

Note: When setting or recalling the preset station by directly pressing the number, on remote control unit to press key number 0, 1 to preset station 01; press 0, 9 to preset station 09; press 1, 5 to preset station 15.

PLAYING COMPACT DISCS

- Switch on the power and press the CD PLAY/ PAUSE button to select the CD mode.
- If there is no CD inside, a "NO DISC" display will appear.

When there is no disc



Loading a disc

 Press the CD DOOR OPEN/CLOSE button to open the CD door.



To load a disc, simply put the disc onto the center spindle of the player and then press the CD DOOR OPEN/CLOSE button again to close the CD door. After that, reading TOC will start.

Ensure that the disc is correctly mounted on the spindle and locked in place.

After reading TOC



The display will show the total number of tracks and the playing time of the disc.

Playing the disc ()

Press PLAY/PAUSE button to play the CD.

Pause the playing (

Press PLAY/PAUSE button while the disc is playing, the playing time will flash.




Press PLAY/PAUSE button again to resume.

To operate by remote control

Select desired track by pressing 0-9, then press PLAY/PAUSE button to start playback. Example: 03=Track 3, 11=Track 11.

Skip and Search Function

Press the SKIP Forward or Backward buttons momentarily during play mode or stop mode.

To place a dock insert:

- Refer to the compatibility table as that follows and select the correct dock insert for the iPod. Using the correct insert ensures the proper fit for your iPod. This can help to reduce the stress on the iPod dock connector when operating the iPod.
- 2. Carefully align and then gently insert the iPod into the dock. (The iPod must not be in a case or "skin").

Charging your iPod

Please ensure you are using the correct insert for your iPod and it is properly docked. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY CAUSE THE iPod can't charging result in its inability to charge.
