

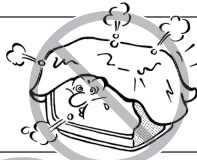


- 5) **Do not use this apparatus near water.**



- 6) **Clean only with a dry cloth.**

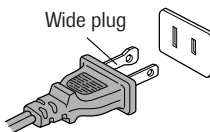
- 7) **Do not block any ventilation openings.** Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.



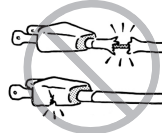
- 8) **Do not install near any heat sources** such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



- 9) **Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding type plug.** A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.



- 10) **Protect the power cord** from being walked on or pinched, particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where it exits the apparatus.



- 11) **Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.**

Installation, Care, and Service

Installation

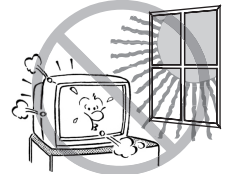
Follow these recommendations and precautions and heed all warnings when installing your TV:

- 16) Never modify this equipment. Changes or modifications may void: a) the warranty, and b) the user's authority to operate this equipment under the rules of the Federal Communications Commission.

- 17) **DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY, DEATH, OR EQUIPMENT DAMAGE!** Never place the TV on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The TV may fall, causing serious personal injury, death, or serious damage to the TV.



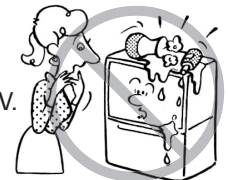
- 18) Never place or store the TV in direct sunlight; hot, humid areas; areas subject to excessive dust or vibration; or locations with temperatures at or below 41°F (5°C).



- 19) Always place the TV on the floor or a sturdy, level, stable surface that can support the weight of the unit.



- 20) Never place items such as vases, aquariums, or candles on top of the TV.



- 21) Never block or cover the slots or openings in the TV cabinet back, bottom, and sides. Never place the TV:
 - on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface;
 - too close to drapes, curtains, or walls; or
 - in a confined space such as a bookcase, built-in cabinet, or any other place with poor ventilation.



The slots and openings are provided to protect the TV from overheating and to help maintain reliable operation of the TV.

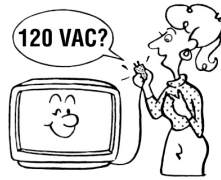


- 22) Never allow anything to rest on or roll over the power cord, and never place the TV where the power cord is subject to wear or abuse.

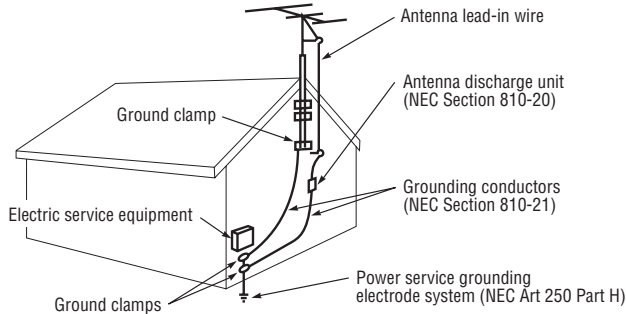
- 23) Never overload wall outlets and extension cords.



- 24) Always operate this equipment from a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power source only.



- 25) Always make sure the antenna system is properly grounded to provide adequate protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges (see Section 810 of the National Electric Code).



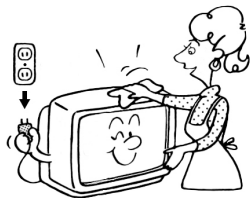
- 26) **! DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH!**
- Use extreme care to make sure you are never in a position where your body (or any item you are in contact with, such as a ladder or screwdriver) can accidentally touch overhead power lines. Never locate the antenna near overhead power lines or other electrical circuits.
 - Never attempt to install any of the following during lightning activity:
 - a) an antenna system; or b) cables, wires, or any home theater component connected to an antenna or phone system.

Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 27) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.

- 28) Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.

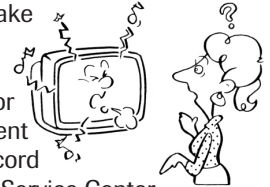


- 29) **! WARNING: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK!** Never spill liquids or push objects of any kind into the TV cabinet slots.

- 30) [This item applies to projection TVs only.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.

- 31) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.

- 32) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.

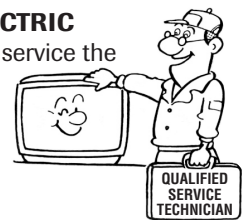


- 33) **Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube:** If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. **This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY.** Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:

- **Fixed Images**, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
- **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).

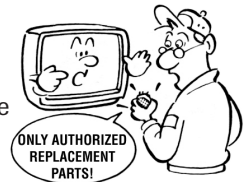
Service

- 35) If you have the TV serviced:

- Ask the service technician to use only replacement parts specified by the manufacturer.

- 36) When the TV reaches the end of its useful life, ask a qualified service technician to properly dispose of the TV. Improper disposal may result in a picture tube implosion and possible personal injury.

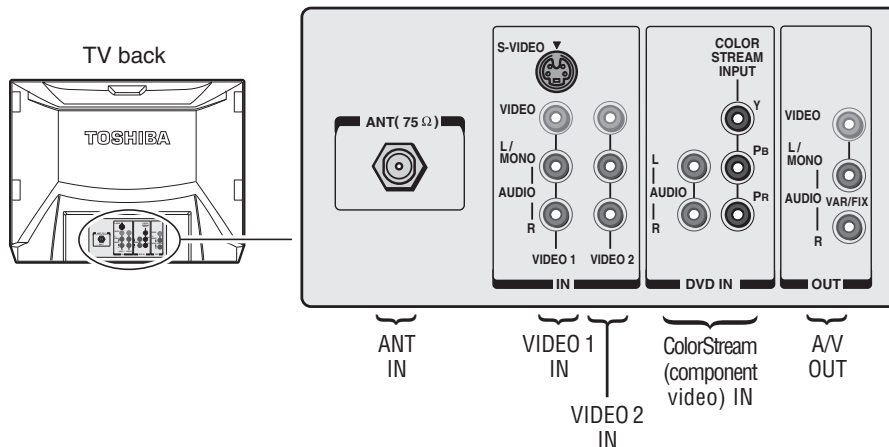
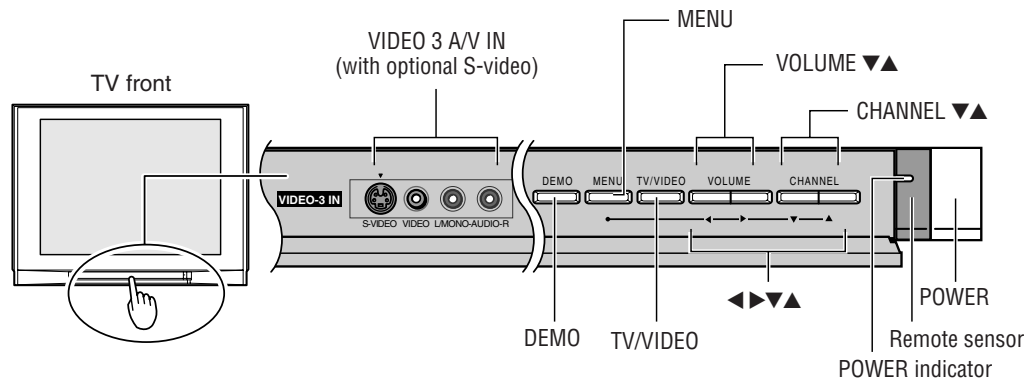
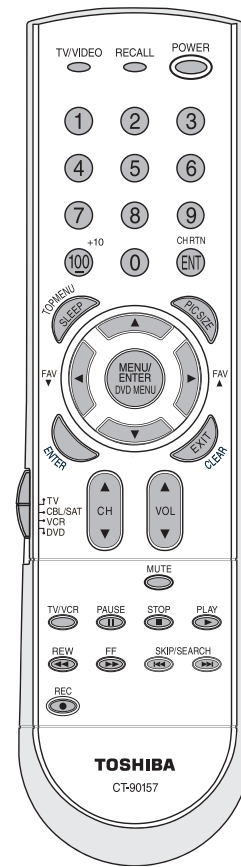
Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.

- This manual applies to models 32AF43 and 36AF43. The model and serial numbers are on the back of the TV. Write these numbers in the space on the front cover of this manual for future reference.
- You may need to purchase additional audio or video cables to connect other equipment to your TV. See “Connecting Your TV” on pages 7–12 for more information.
- Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You also can use the controls on the TV if they have the same name as those referred to in the instructions.

Please read all safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep this manual for future reference.

Exploring your new TV

You can operate your TV using the buttons on the remote control or TV front panel (behind the door). The TV’s front and back panels provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other devices to your TV.



Connecting your TV

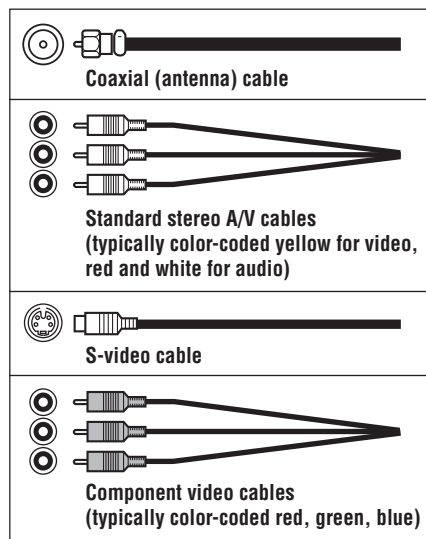
Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- **Coaxial cable** is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- **Standard stereo A/V cables** usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. Your TV's standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- **S-Video cable** is for use with video equipment that has S-Video connectors.
- **Component video cables** come in sets of three (typically color-coded red, green, and blue), and are for use with video equipment that has component video connectors. Your TV's ColorStream® (component video) inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.

NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:

- **For GOOD picture quality:** Use a standard yellow video cable.
- **For BETTER picture quality:** If your equipment has S-video connectors, use an S-video cable **instead of** a standard yellow video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect a standard yellow video cable at the same time* or the picture performance will be unacceptable.)
- **For BEST picture quality:** If your equipment has component video connectors, use component video cables **instead of** a standard yellow video cable or S-video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection.)



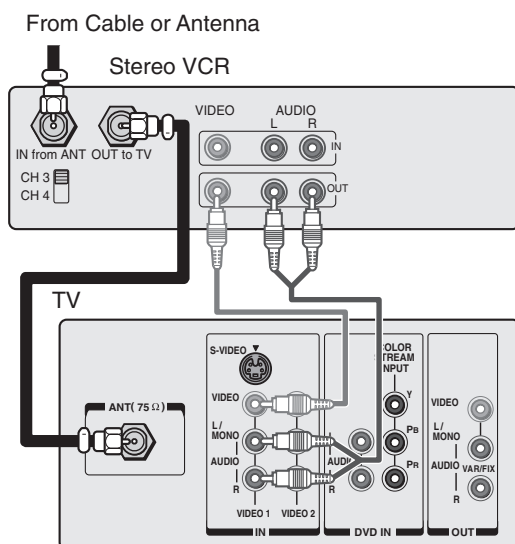
CAUTION: Do not plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

Connecting a VCR

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables



Note:

- If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to the VCR's AUDIO OUT terminal using only one audio cable.
- If you have a VCR with S-video, use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) instead of a standard video cable for better picture quality. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO-1 on the TV back (or VIDEO-3 on the TV front) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

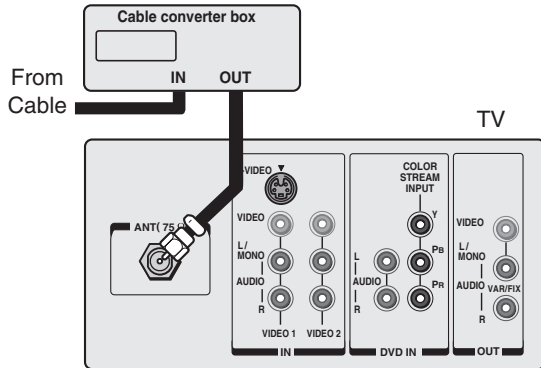

Connecting a cable converter box

This connection allows you to watch basic and premium channels. Tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and then use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables



Note:

When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control may not operate certain features, such as channel ▲▼, channel block, favorite channels, or channel labels.

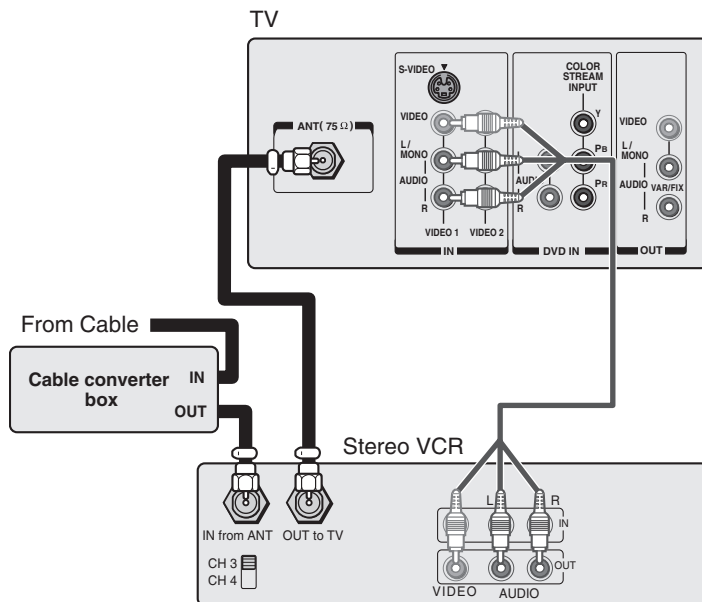
Connecting a cable converter box and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, as well as watch videotapes.

Set the TV signal source to VIDEO 1 (see “Selecting the signal source” on page 21); tune the VCR to channel 3 or 4 (the same channel as the converter box output switch); and use the cable converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- three coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables



Note:

- When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control may not operate certain features, such as channel ▲▼, channel block, favorite channels, or channel labels.
- If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to the VCR's AUDIO OUT terminal using only one audio cable.
- If you have a VCR with S-video, use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) instead of a standard video cable for better picture quality. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO-1 on the TV back (or VIDEO-3 on the TV front) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

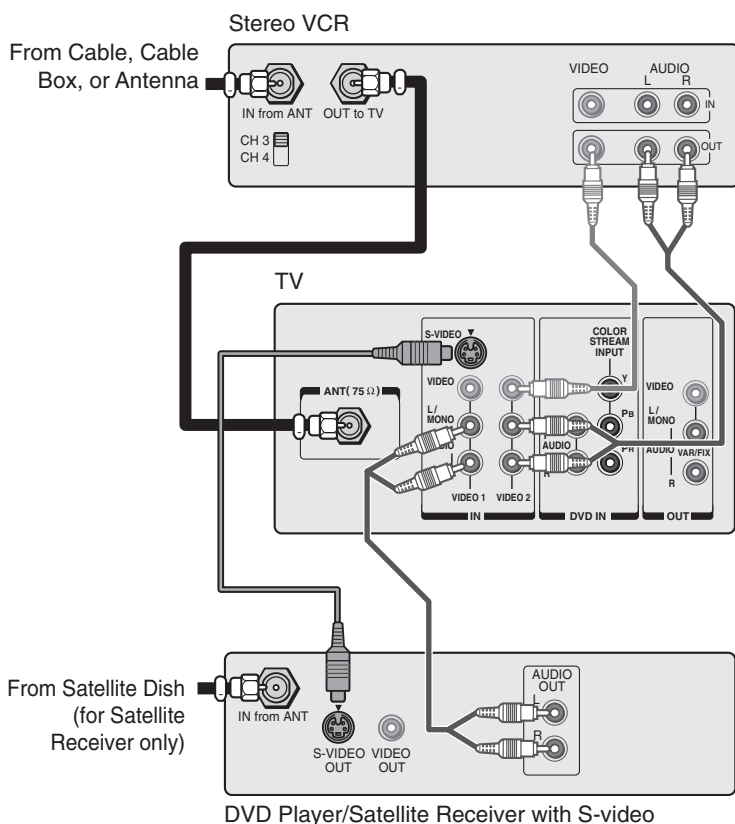
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Connecting a DVD player or satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, or TV programs, and record from the satellite receiver or TV. You can record one TV program while watching another TV program.

You will need:

- two (or three, if satellite receiver is used) coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one S-video cable
- one pair of standard audio cables



Note:

- For the highest possible picture quality from a DVD player/satellite receiver that does not have component video connections, use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver. **If your DVD player (or satellite receiver) has component video, see “Connecting a DVD player with component video and a VCR” on page 10.**
- Do not connect both an S-video cable and a standard video cable to VIDEO-1 on the TV back (or VIDEO-3 on the TV front) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.
- Do not connect the DVD player/satellite receiver and VCR to the same A/V inputs on the TV. (See the illustration at left, which shows the DVD player/satellite receiver connected to VIDEO-1 and the VCR connected to VIDEO-2.)

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Connecting a DVD player with component video and a VCR

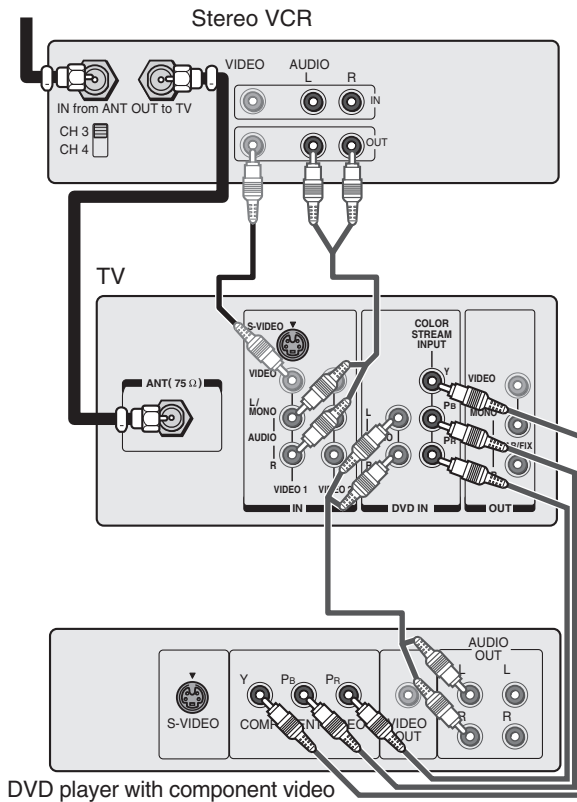
This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, or TV programs. You can record one TV program while watching another TV program. You also can record a TV program while watching a DVD.

Your TV has ColorStream® (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DVD player with component video (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream®) can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one set of component video cables
- one pair of standard audio cables

From Cable, Cable Box, or Antenna



Note:

- If your DVD player does not have component video connections, see "Connecting a DVD player or satellite receiver and a VCR" on page 9.
- The ColorStream (component video) inputs on this TV are for use with devices that output 480i interlaced signals ONLY. This TV will not accept or display 480p or 720p progressive scan signals or 1080i interlaced high-definition signals. **If you connect a high-definition set-top receiver, 480p progressive scan DVD player, or other similar device to the TV's ColorStream inputs, you must switch the device's output to 480i interlaced mode first.** Failure to do this will cause a poor picture or no picture to display.
- If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to the VCR's AUDIO OUT terminal using only one audio cable.
- If you have a VCR with S-video, use an S-video cable instead of a standard video cable. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO-1 on the TV back (or VIDEO-3 on the TV front) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

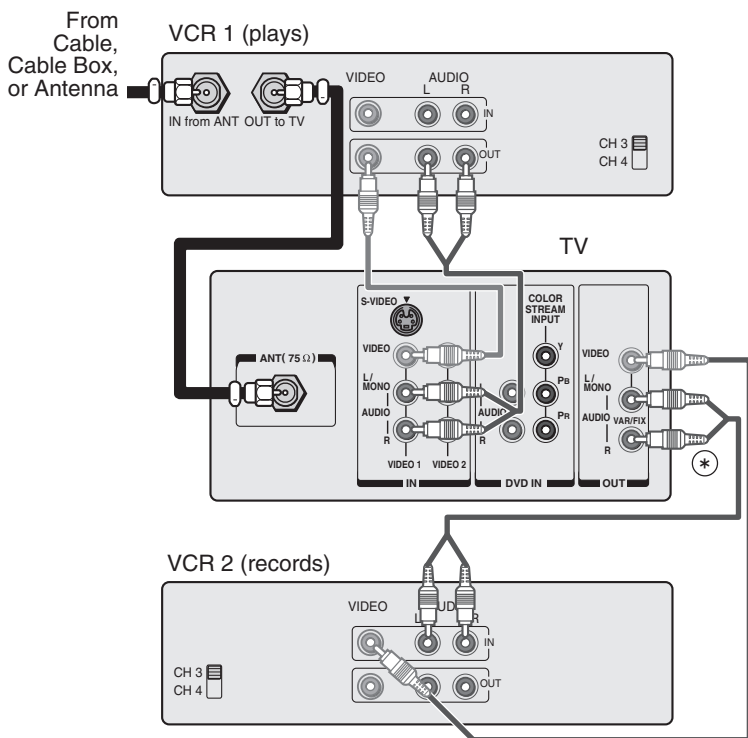

Connecting two VCRs

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from “VCR 1” to “VCR 2” (as illustrated below) while watching the videotape. You also can record from one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables



Note:

- Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input connections on the TV at the same time. (See the illustration at left, which shows VCR1 connected to VIDEO-1 IN on the TV, and VCR2 connected to A/V OUT on the TV.)
- If your VCR has S-video, you can use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) instead of a standard video cable for better picture quality. Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO-1 (or VIDEO-3) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.
- To dub or edit, VCR 2 must select Line IN, and the TV must select VIDEO-1.
- **When recording to VCR 2, set AUDIO OUT to FIXED.** With AUDIO OUT set to FIXED, the TV's volume setting will not affect the sound level being recorded. See "Selecting fixed/variable AUDIO OUT" on page 39.

* The AUDIO OUT connections can output either FIXED or VARIABLE audio. See "Selecting fixed/variable AUDIO OUT" on page 39.

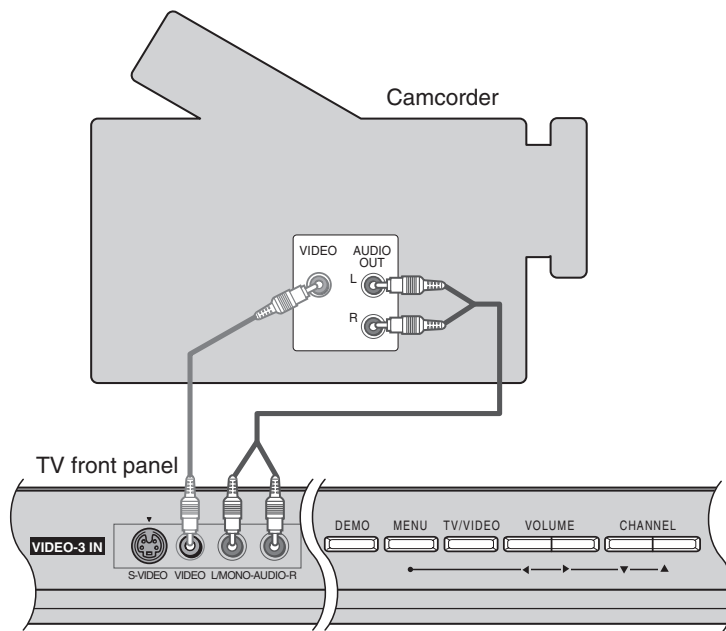

Connecting a camcorder

This connection allows you to watch videos recorded on a camcorder.

You will need:

- one set of standard A/V cables (see notes at right)



Note:

- For better picture quality, if your camcorder has S-video, you can use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) instead of a standard video cable.
- Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

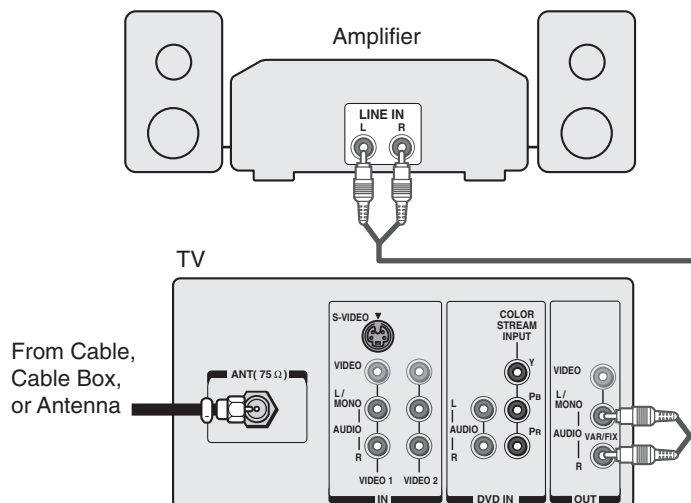
Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier to adjust the audio level. This connection also allows you to use external speakers.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the built-in speakers. (See “Turning off the built-in speakers” on page 39.)

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of standard audio cables



Note:

- When using an external audio amplifier, if you set AUDIO OUT to VARIABLE, the volume of both the TV and amplifier must be set above 0 (zero) or you will not hear any sound. See “Selecting fixed/variable AUDIO OUT” on page 39.
- If you set AUDIO OUT to VARIABLE, the TV’s volume controls will adjust the volume. If you set AUDIO OUT to FIXED, you must use the amplifier’s volume controls to adjust the volume. See “Selecting fixed/variable AUDIO OUT” on page 39.

Using the remote control

Preparing the remote control for use

Your TV remote control can operate your TV and most cable converter boxes, satellite receivers, VCRs, DVD players, and HTIBs (home theater in a box), even if they are different brands.

If you have a Toshiba device:

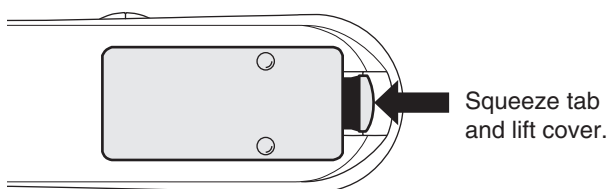
Your TV remote control is preprogrammed to operate most Toshiba devices. See pages 14 and 17.

If you have a non-Toshiba device or a Toshiba device that the remote control is not preprogrammed to operate:

You can program the TV remote control so it will operate the other device. See pages 15–16.

Installing the remote control batteries

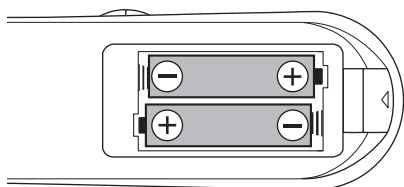
- 1 Remove the battery cover from the back of the remote control.



Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- If you do not intend to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.

- 2 Install two “AA” size batteries, making sure to match the + and – signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.

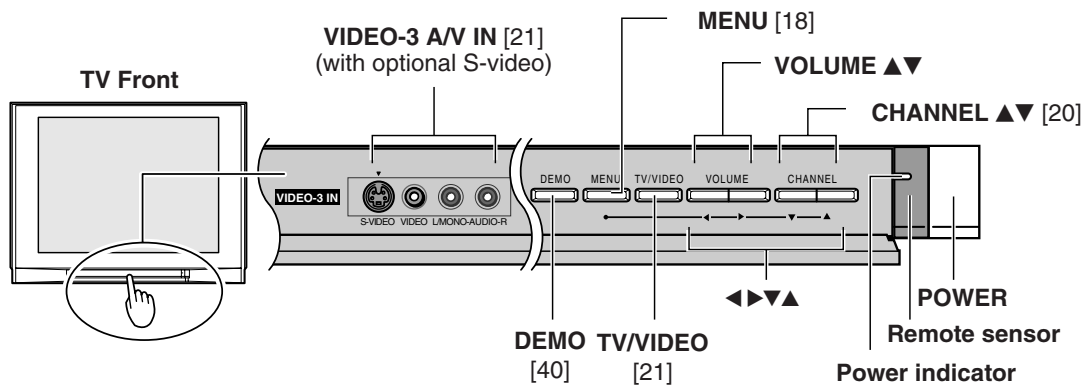


- 3 Reinsert the battery cover in the remote control until the tab snaps.

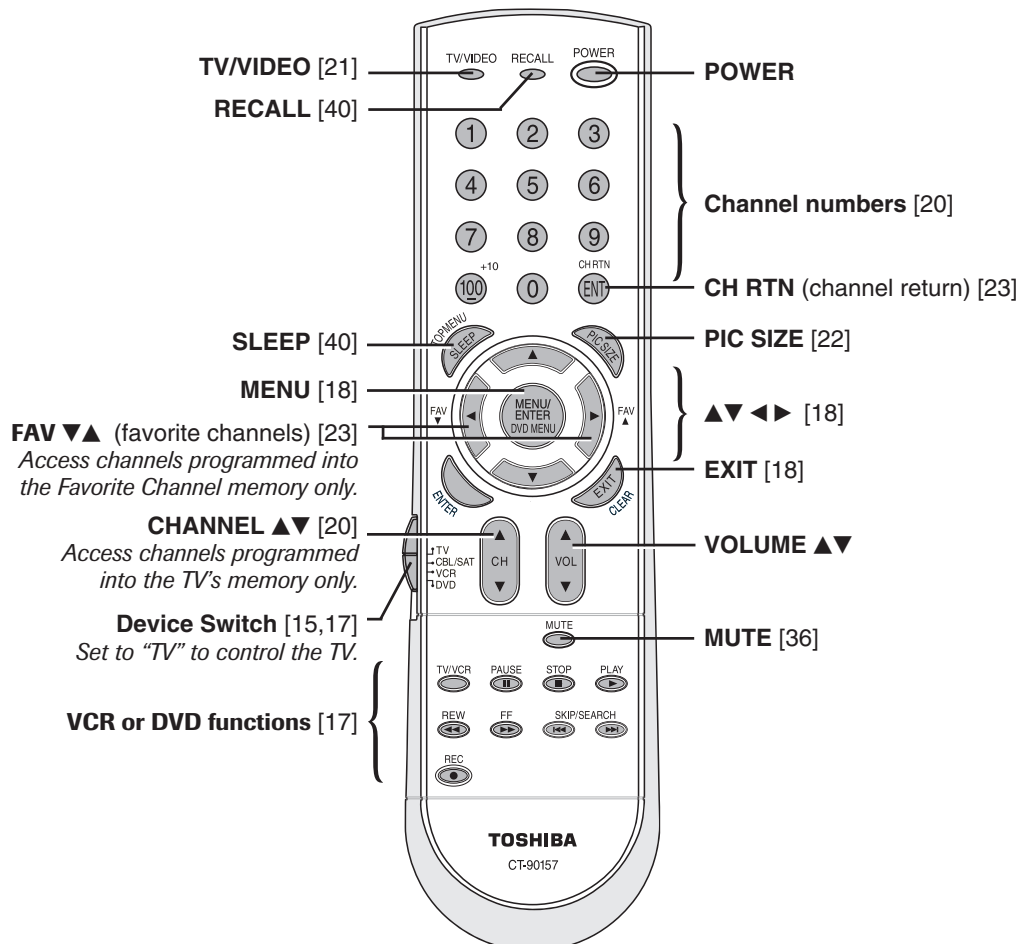
Location of controls on TV and remote control

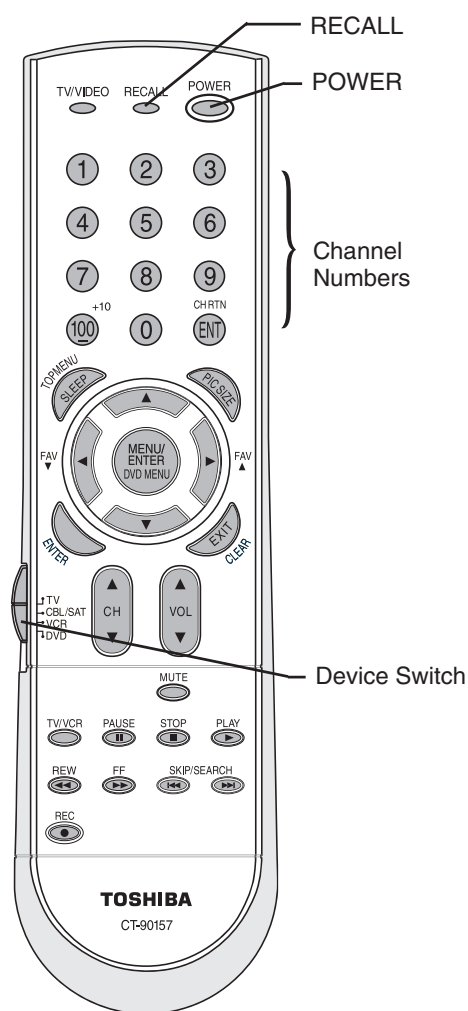


Remote control



Programming the remote control to operate a cable converter box, satellite receiver, VCR, DVD player, or HTIB (home theater in a box)

Your Toshiba TV remote control is preprogrammed to operate most Toshiba devices. To program your TV remote control to operate a non-Toshiba device or a Toshiba device that it is not preprogrammed to operate, follow the steps below. For details on using the remote control to operate the device, see page 17.



- 1 In the remote control code table (below and on the next page), find the code for your device. If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find one that works.
- 2 Set the Device Switch to the type of device you are programming the remote control to operate—CBL/SAT (for a cable converter box or satellite receiver), VCR (for a VCR or TV/VCR combo), or DVD (for a DVD player or HTIB [home theater in a box]).
- 3 While holding down RECALL, press the Channel Number buttons to enter the 3-digit code for your device.
- 4 To test the code, turn on the device, point the remote control at it, and press POWER.
 - If the correct code was entered, the device will turn off.
 - If the device does not respond, repeat steps 1–4 using another code.

Note: After programming the TV remote control to operate your other device, confirm that all necessary keys are operational. If some keys on the TV remote control do not operate certain features on your other device, reprogram the remote control using another code (if other codes are listed for your device). If, after trying all listed codes, the necessary buttons do not operate your device, use the device's original remote control.

- 5 Remember to set the Device Switch back to “TV” to control the TV.
- 6 For future reference, write down the code(s) you used:

Note:

Each time you change the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.

Some newer VCRs respond to either of two codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled “VCR1/VCR2.” If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (“VCR1” or “VCR2”) and reprogram the remote control.

Remote control codes

In some cases you may not be able to operate your device with the TV remote control. Your other device may use a code that is not recognized by the TV remote control. If this happens, you will need to use the remote control provided with the device.

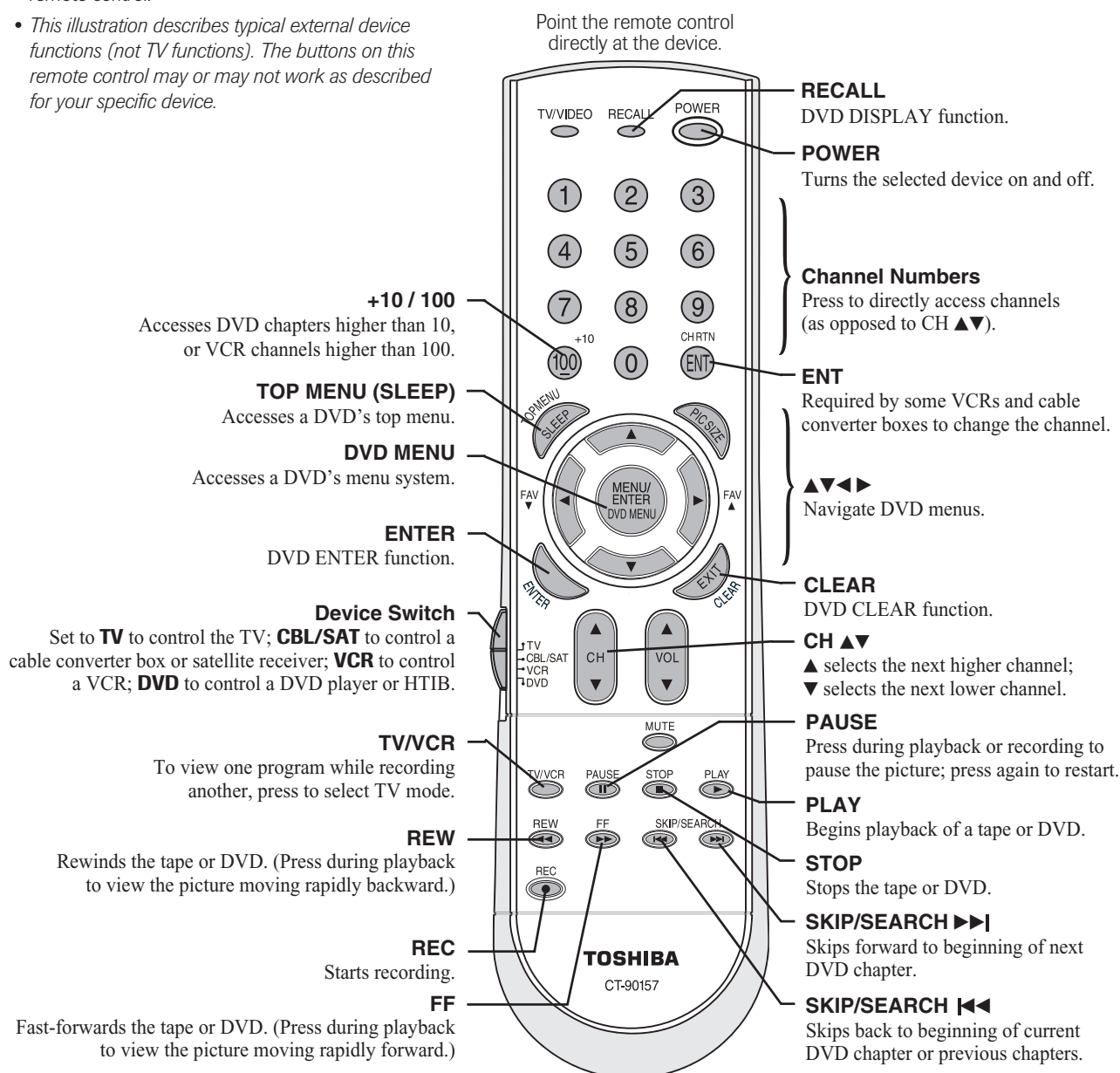
If you have a non-Toshiba device or a Toshiba device that the remote control is not preprogrammed to operate, you must first program the remote control to recognize the device (if you have not already done so). See pages 15–16.

To use your TV remote control to operate a:

- cable converter box or satellite receiver, set the Device Switch to CBL/SAT.
- VCR, set the Device Switch to VCR.
- DVD player or HTIB, set the Device Switch to DVD.

Note:

- Even after the TV remote control is programmed, it may not operate certain features on your other device. If this happens and you wish to use those features, you will need to use the device's original remote control.
- This illustration describes typical external device functions (not TV functions). The buttons on this remote control may or may not work as described for your specific device.



Setting up your TV

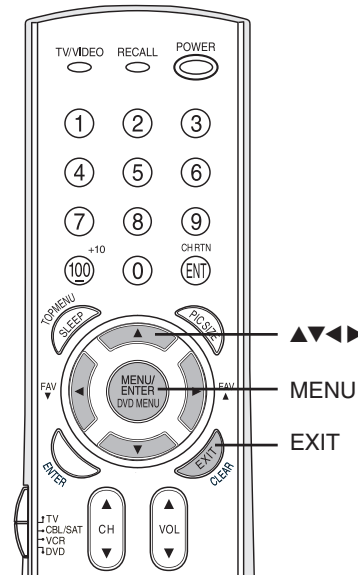
Learning about the menu system

After you have installed the batteries and programmed the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on the TV using the menu system. You can access the menus using the buttons on your TV or remote control.

- Press MENU to display the menu system.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select a menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select an item.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select or adjust a setting.
- If you do not make a selection within 15 seconds, the main menus close automatically (6 seconds for the other menus).
- To close an on-screen display instantly, press EXIT.

Note: The TV front panel does not have an EXIT button.

All menu adjustments are saved automatically, whether or not you press EXIT to close the display.

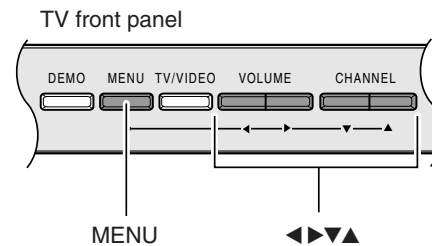

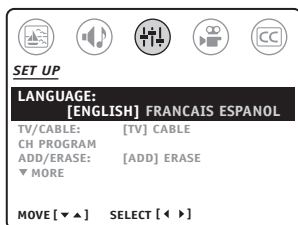


Changing the on-screen display language

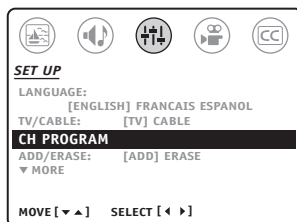
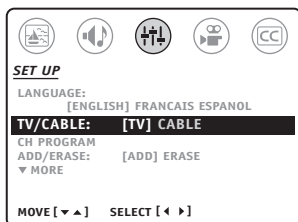
When you press CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ on the remote control or TV front panel, your TV will stop only on the channels stored in the channel memory. Follow the steps below and on the next page to program channels into the channel memory.

Programming channels automatically

Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in the channel memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels

To program channels automatically:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ until TV/CABLE is highlighted.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight either TV (if you use an antenna) or CABLE (if you have cable service).
4. Press ▼ to highlight CH PROGRAM.

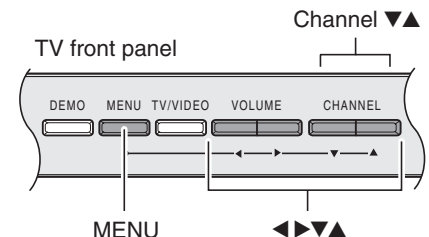
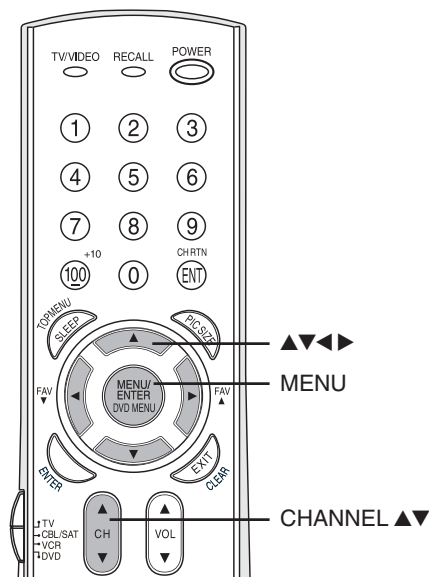


5. Press ◀ or ▶ to start channel programming. The TV will automatically cycle through all the TV or CABLE channels (depending on which you selected), and store all active channels in the channel memory.

While the TV is cycling through the channels, the message “CH PROGRAM” appears.

6. When channel programming is complete, the message “CH PROGRAMMING COMPLETED” appears.
7. Press CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ to view the programmed channels.

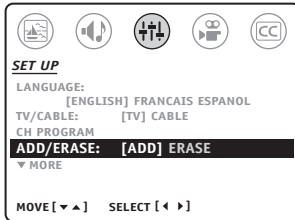

Adding and erasing channels manually

After you automatically program the channels into the channel memory (see previous page), you can manually add or erase specific channels.

To manually add or erase channels:

1. Select the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you must select the channel using the Channel Number buttons on the remote control.
2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight ADD/ERASE.



4. Press ◀ or ▶ to select ADD or ERASE, depending on the function you want to perform.
5. Repeat steps 1–4 for other channels you want to add or erase.

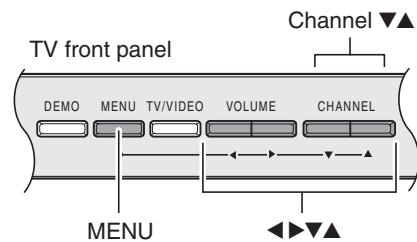
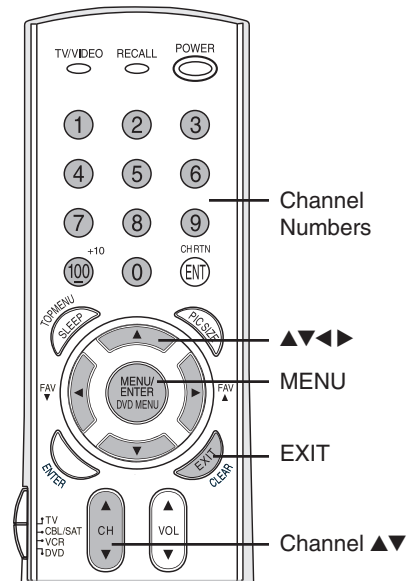
To change to the next programmed channel:

Selecting the signal source

To view a program from other devices connected to your TV (through the VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, VIDEO 3, or ColorStream inputs) or from the TV's antenna input (labeled "ANT" on the TV back panel, and designated as "TV" in the signal source menu, illustrated below), you must select the applicable signal source.

Note: If no device is connected to any of the inputs on the TV, no picture will display when you select that particular signal source. For device connection details, see "Connecting your TV" on pages 7–12.

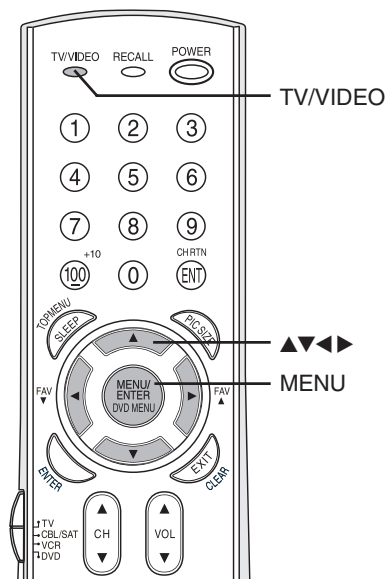
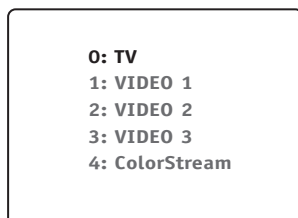
To select the signal source:

Press TV/VIDEO on the remote control or TV front panel. The current signal source displays in purple on-screen.

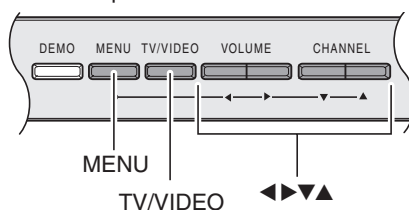
- Pressing TV/VIDEO on the remote control one time *displays* the current signal source. To change the source, continue pressing TV/VIDEO or use the Channel Numbers to select 0–4.
- Pressing TV/VIDEO on the TV one time *changes* the current signal source. Continue pressing TV/VIDEO to change the source.

Note:

- When the ColorStream signal source is active, the VIDEO OUT terminal outputs a black-and-white signal only. To receive a color VIDEO OUT signal, a standard video or S-video IN jack must be used instead of the ColorStream connections.

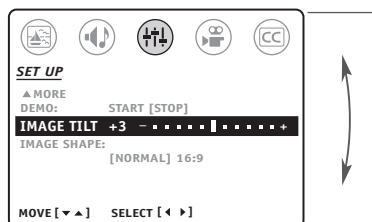


Adjusting the IMAGE TILT feature

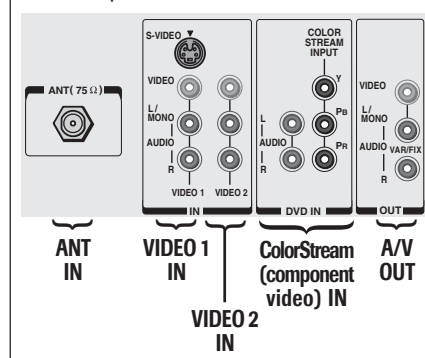
When you install or change the direction of the TV, the picture may become tilted (caused by terrestrial magnetism). If this happens, use the IMAGE TILT feature to obtain the best possible picture.

To adjust the image tilt:

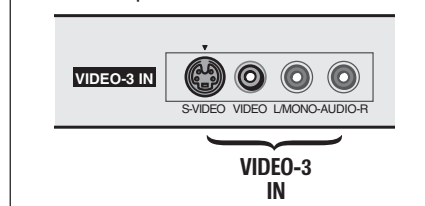
1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight IMAGE TILT.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to correct the picture tilt (from –10 to +10).

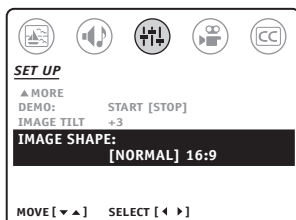
Adjusting the IMAGE SHAPE feature

The IMAGE SHAPE feature allows you to adjust the shape of the image when viewing 16:9 (widescreen) content from an external device (for example, a DVD player). This feature enables you to watch 16:9 content in the highest possible resolution (when you select “16:9” mode in step 2, below). See “*Notice of possible adverse effects on TV picture tube,*” below right.

To adjust the image shape:

1. Press PIC SIZE on the remote control. The SET UP menu opens and IMAGE SHAPE is highlighted.

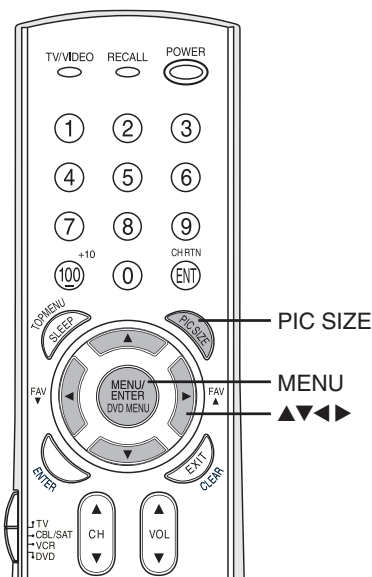
Note: You also can use the menu system to adjust the IMAGE SHAPE. Press MENU and then ◀ or ▶ to open the SET UP menu. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight IMAGE SHAPE. Then go to step 2.



2. Press ◀ or ▶ to select NORMAL or 16:9 mode, as described below.
 - **NORMAL**—Displays the picture in normal/conventional 4:3 format, regardless of the signal type.

To use the NORMAL IMAGE SHAPE mode, you must first adjust your DVD player's menu settings to normal/conventional TV mode (4:3 aspect ratio).
 - **16:9**—Compresses the signal to letterbox (16:9) mode (with bars at the top and bottom of the screen), regardless of the signal type.

To use the 16:9 IMAGE SHAPE mode, you must first adjust your DVD player's menu settings to widescreen TV mode (16:9 aspect ratio).
The 16:9 IMAGE SHAPE mode is not available when viewing an antenna signal source.



Note:

- The factory (default) setting for the IMAGE SHAPE feature is “NORMAL.”
- Aspect ratio is the ratio of width to height of your TV screen or of the image you are viewing.

NOTICE OF POSSIBLE ADVERSE EFFECTS ON TV PICTURE TUBE

Avoid displaying stationary images on your TV screen for extended periods of time. Fixed (non-moving) images (such as black or gray bars on widescreen/16:9 format images) can become permanently engrained in the picture tube. **This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY because it is the result of misuse.** See item 33 on page 4.

Switching between two channels

You can switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.

To switch between two channels:

1. Select the first channel you want to view.
2. Select a second channel using the Channel Numbers (0–9, 100).
3. Press CH RTN. The previous channel will display.

Each time you press CH RTN, the TV will switch back and forth between the last two channels you tuned the TV to.

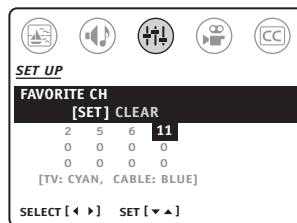
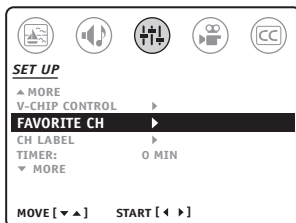
Programming your favorite channels

The favorite channel feature allows you to use the FAV ▼/FAV▲ keys to cycle through your favorite channels only, skipping over channels you do not usually watch.

You can program up to 12 of your favorite channels into the favorite channel memory.

To program a channel into the favorite channel memory:

1. Tune the TV to a channel you want to program as a favorite channel.
Note: The TV must be in "CABLE" mode to program a cable channel and in "TV mode" to program an antenna channel.
Select TV/CABLE in the SET UP menu.
2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight FAVORITE CH, and then press ▶ to open the FAVORITE CH menu.
4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight SET, press ▼, and then press EXIT.



5. Repeat steps 1–4 for up to 12 channels.

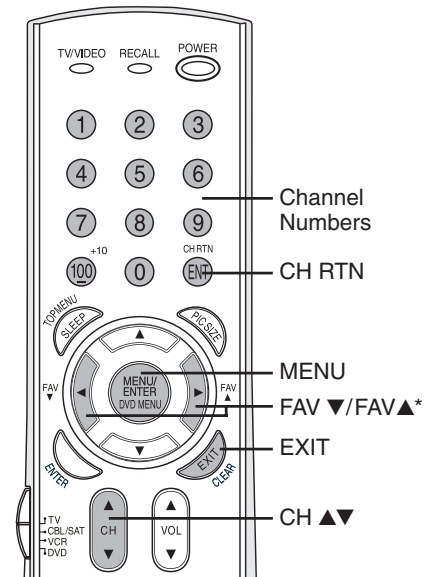
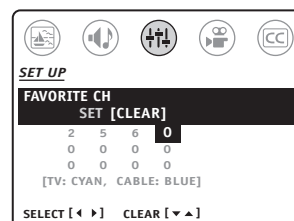
To select your favorite channels:

Press FAV ▼ or FAV▲ on the remote control.

Note: You can still use CH ▲▼ to cycle through the channels you programmed into the "regular" channel memory on page 19.

To clear a channel from the favorite channel memory:

1. Tune the TV to a channel you want to clear from the favorite channel memory.
2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight FAVORITE CH, and then press ▶ to open the FAVORITE CH menu.
4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight CLEAR, press ▼, and then press EXIT.
5. Repeat steps 1–4 for other channels you want to clear from the favorite channel memory.



*The FAV ▼/FAV▲ keys function as menu ◀/▶ keys when a menu is on-screen.

- Once programmed, antenna channels appear in light blue text and Cable channels appear in dark blue text in the FAVORITE CH menu (shown at left).

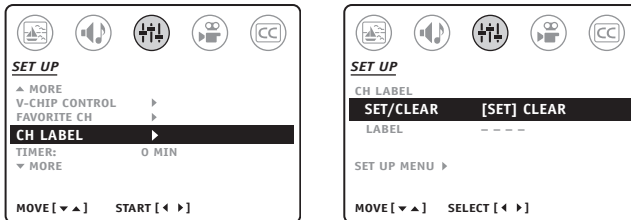
Labeling channels

You can choose any four characters to identify a channel. Channel labels appear above the on-screen channel number display each time you turn on the TV, change the channel, or press RECALL. You can assign labels to a maximum of 32 channels.

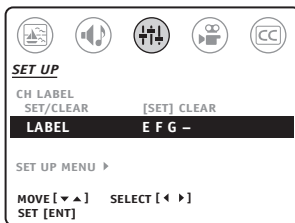
To create a channel label:

1. Tune the TV to the channel you want to label.

Note: The TV must be in "CABLE" mode to label a cable channel and in "TV mode" to label an antenna channel. Select TV/CABLE in the SET UP menu.
2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CH LABEL, and then press ▶ to open the CH LABEL menu.
4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight SET.



5. Press ▼ to highlight LABEL.
6. Repeatedly press ◀ or ▶ to select a character for the first space, and then press MENU. Repeat this step for all four characters.



Note:

For a blank space in the label name, choose a blank space from the list of characters.

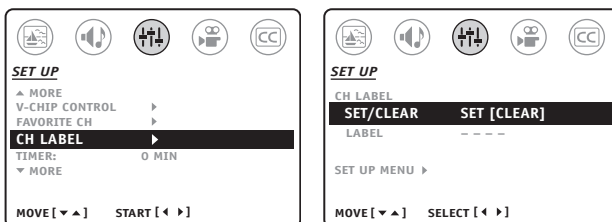

7. Repeat steps 1–6 for other channels you want to label.

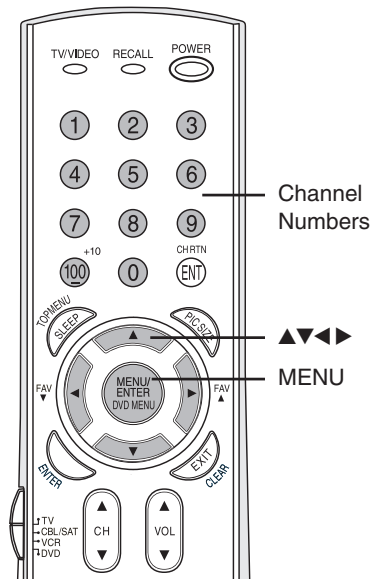
To erase a channel label:

1. Tune the TV to the channel whose label you want to erase.

Note: You must be in CABLE mode to erase a cable channel label and in TV mode to erase an antenna channel label. Select TV/CABLE in the SET UP menu.
2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CH LABEL, and then press ▶ to open the CH LABEL menu.
4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight CLEAR, and then press ▼.

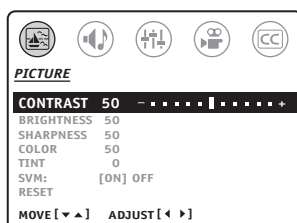

To adjust the picture quality:

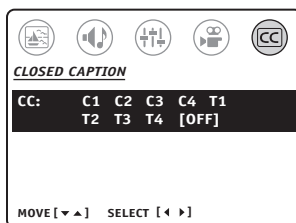
Using the closed caption feature

The closed caption feature has two options:

- Captions—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of programs and videos that are closed-captioned (usually identified as “CC” in program guides).
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the program, such as weather or stock data (when provided by individual stations).

To use the closed caption feature:

1. Tune the TV to the desired program or video.
2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the CLOSED CAPTION menu appears.
3. Press ▼ or ▲ to highlight CC.



4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight the closed caption mode you prefer, as described below.

• To view captions:

Highlight C1, C2, C3, or C4. (C1 displays the primary language in your area.)

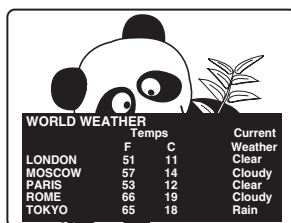
Note: If the program or video you selected is not closed-captioned, no captions will display on-screen.



• To view text:

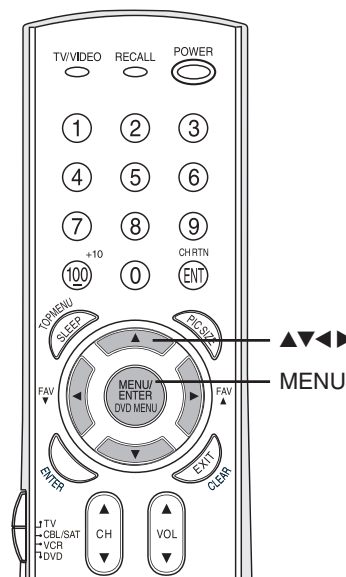
Highlight T1, T2, T3, or T4.

Note: If text is not available, a black rectangle may appear on-screen. If this happens, turn off the closed caption feature.



• To turn off the closed caption feature:

Highlight OFF.

A closed caption signal may not display correctly in the following situations:

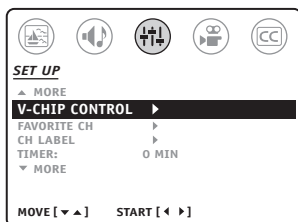
- When a videotape has been dubbed
- When the signal reception is weak
- When the signal reception is nonstandard

Using the V-CHIP (parental control) feature

The V-CHIP CONTROL menu includes the ENABLE BLOCKING, SET RATING, SET BLOCKING OPTIONS, NEW PIN CODE, BLOCK CHANNEL, VIDEO LOCK, and GAME TIMER functions. You can use these functions after entering the correct PIN code.

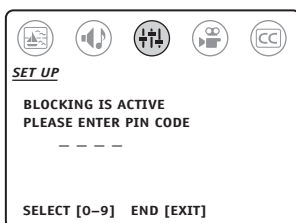
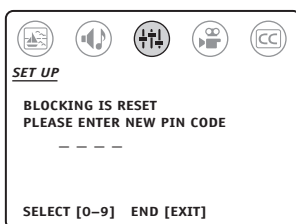
Entering the PIN code

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.

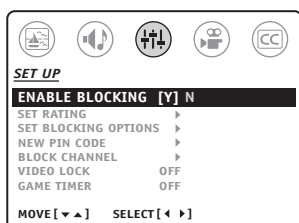

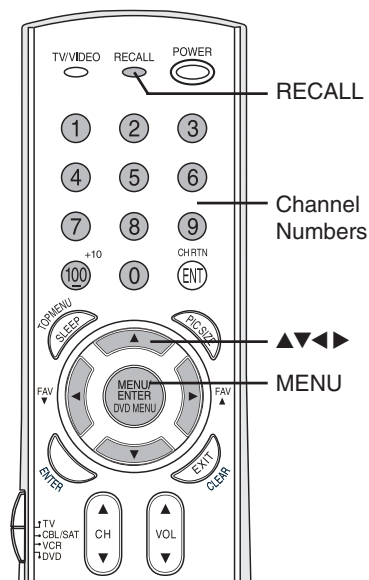

If you forget your PIN code:

While the PIN code entering screen is displayed, press RECALL four times within 5 seconds. The PIN code you stored will be released (returned to BLOCKING RESET status).

Using the SET RATING feature (V-Chip control)

Some TV programs and movies include signals that classify the content of the program (dialog, language, sex, violence). The SET RATING feature in the V-CHIP CONTROL menu detects these signals and blocks programs according to your rating selections. This feature includes blocking for MPAA, YOUTH TV, and TV ratings, as described below and on the next page.

Note:

The V-Chip function is only available for the U.S. V-Chip system. The Canadian V-Chip system (Puce-V) is not supported.

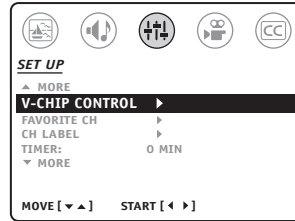

The SET BLOCKING OPTIONS feature in the V-CHIP CONTROL menu allows blocking of unrated movies (“MPAA UNRATED”) and unrated TV shows (“TV NONE RATING”).

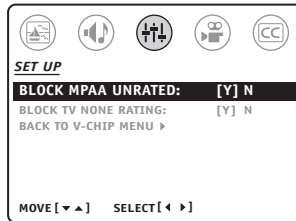

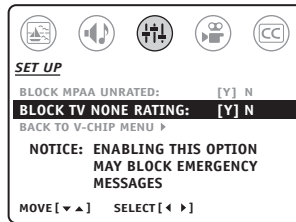

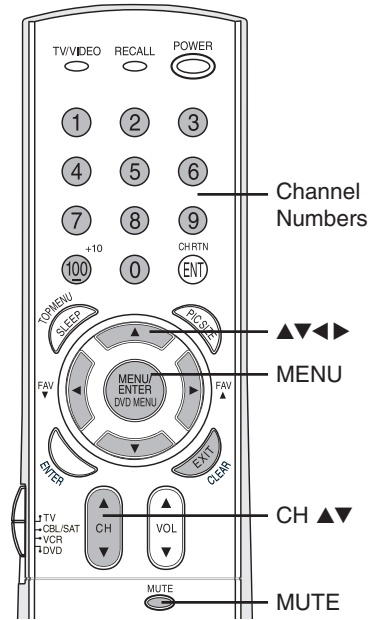
Unblocking programs temporarily

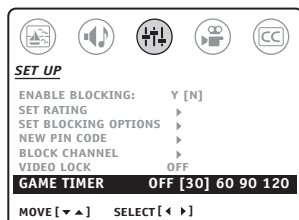
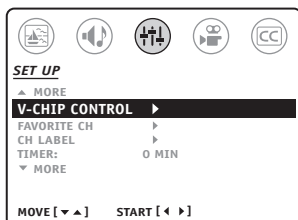


Using the GAME TIMER feature (V-Chip control)

To set the game timer:

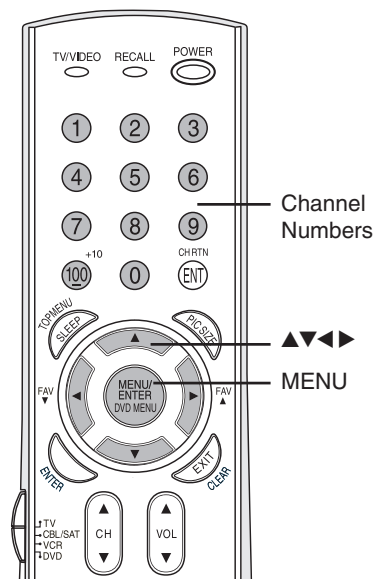
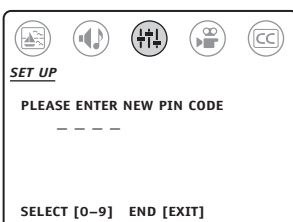
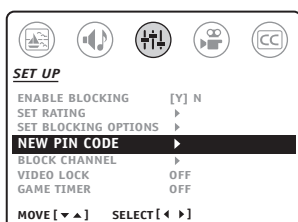
Using the NEW PIN CODE feature (V-Chip control)

Use this feature to create a new PIN code.

You need to know your current PIN code to use the NEW PIN CODE feature. If you do not remember your current PIN code, press RECALL four times within 5 seconds while the PIN code entering screen is displayed. This clears the existing PIN code and enables you to select a new PIN code.

Adjusting the sound

Muting the sound

Press MUTE to temporarily turn off the sound. While the sound is off, the screen will briefly display the word MUTE in the lower right corner. To restore the sound, press MUTE again.

When you press MUTE, the CLOSED CAPTION feature is automatically activated. To deactivate this feature, press MUTE again. This feature works only when the Closed Caption mode is set to OFF. See “Using the closed caption feature” on page 28 for details.

Using the MTS feature to select stereo/SAP broadcasts

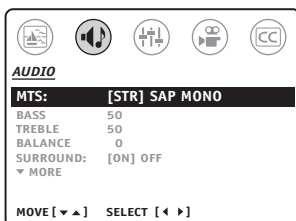
The MTS (multi-channel TV sound) feature provides high-fidelity stereo sound. The MTS feature also can transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word “STEREO” or “SAP” appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or RECALL is pressed.

Note: The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

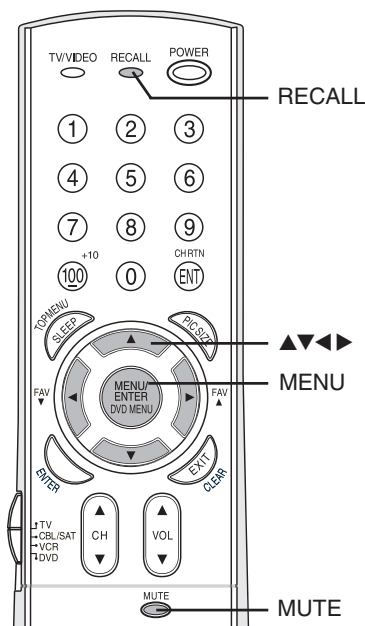
1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight MTS.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight STR.



You can leave your TV in STR mode because it automatically outputs the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural). If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise. The word “STR” or “SAP” displays in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

To listen to SAP (if available):

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight MTS.
3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight SAP. You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers while viewing the original program's picture. **See note at right.**



Note:

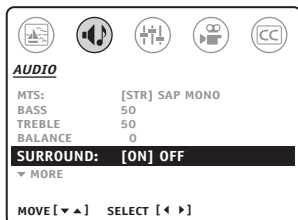
- A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it. For example, a TV station might broadcast music (or another language) as a second audio program. If you have SAP on, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music (or the other language) instead of the program's normal audio.
- If you have SAP on and the station you are watching is not broadcasting a second audio program, the station's normal audio will be output; however, occasionally there is no sound at all in this instance. If this happens, set the MTS feature to STR mode.

Using the SURROUND sound feature

The SURROUND sound feature expands the audio listening field wider and deeper to create exceptional sound quality from the TV's speakers. This feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.

To turn on the SURROUND sound feature:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight MTS.
3. Press ▶ to highlight STR.
4. Press ▼ to highlight SURROUND.
5. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight ON.



To turn off the surround sound feature:

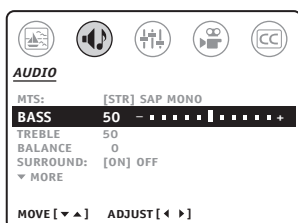

Adjusting the sound quality

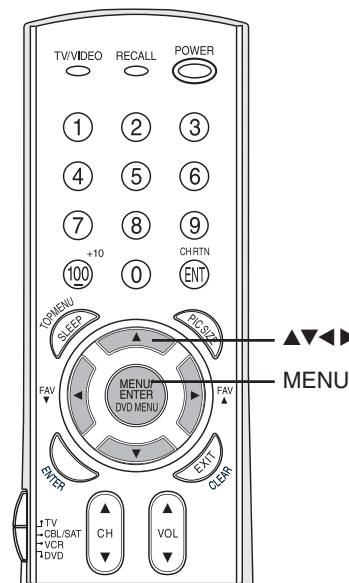
You can change the quality of your TV's sound by adjusting the bass, treble, and balance.

To adjust the sound quality:

1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.

 - ◀ makes the sound quality weaker or decreases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.

Turning off the built-in speakers

Use this feature to turn off the TV speakers when you connect external speakers to your TV. (See “Connecting an audio system” on page 12.)

To turn off the built-in speakers:

2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight SPEAKERS.

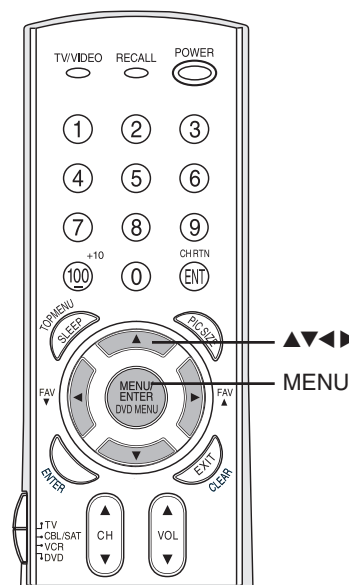
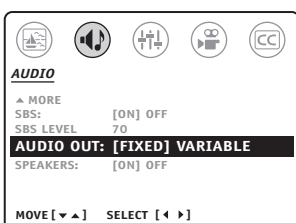

- Fixed audio output provides a cleaner signal than variable audio output.

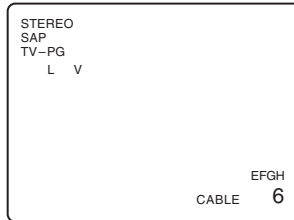

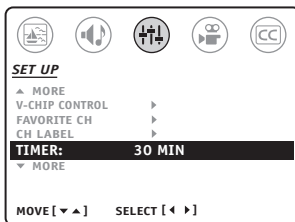

Setting the sleep timer

To set the sleep timer to automatically turn off the TV:

1. Press **SLEEP** to display the SET UP menu. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
2. Press **▶** to increase (or **◀** to decrease) the amount of time until the TV turns off automatically, in 10-minute increments to a maximum of 180.
3. Press **EXIT**.



To cancel the sleep timer:

Set the sleep timer to 0 in step 2 above, or turn off the TV.

Viewing the DEMO mode

When you press **DEMO** on the TV, the TV will automatically demonstrate several features of your TV.

To view the DEMO mode:

Press **DEMO**. *Also see note at right.*

To stop the DEMO mode:

Press **DEMO** or **POWER** on the TV, or press **RECALL**, **EXIT**, or **POWER** on the remote control.

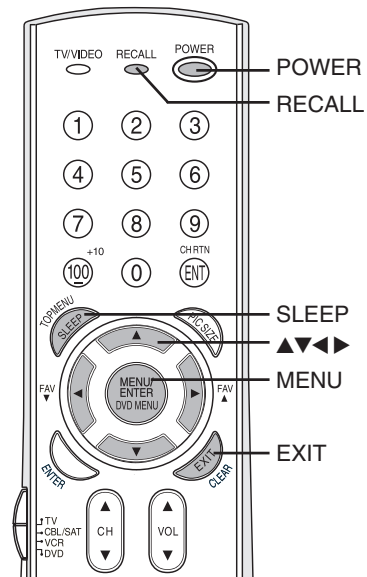
Understanding the auto power off feature

The TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This feature does not work in VIDEO mode.

Understanding the last mode memory feature

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the last mode memory feature automatically turns on the TV when the power is resupplied.

If the power is going to be off for a long time or you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.



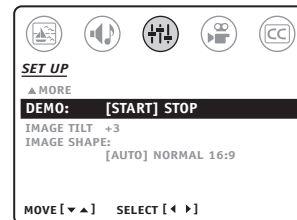

To display the amount of time remaining until the TV turns off automatically, press **SLEEP** once. To close the display, press **EXIT**.

Troubleshooting

Before calling a service technician, please check the following table for a possible cause of the problem and some solutions.

Problem	Solution
TV will not turn on	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure the power cord is plugged in, and then press POWER. • If the TV is plugged into a surge suppressor or multiple outlet extension, make sure the suppressor/extension is plugged in and turned on. • The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries (p. 13).
Picture problems	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check all connections (pgs. 7–12). • If using an antenna, the reception may be poor. Use a highly directional outdoor antenna. • The current station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. • Press the TV/VIDEO button (on the remote control or TV front panel) to make sure the correct signal source is selected (p. 21). If no device is connected to the inputs on the TV (pgs. 7–12), no picture will display when you select that particular signal source. • If you have a VCR connected, press the TV/VCR button on the remote control to make sure it is set correctly (p. 17). Also, try turning off the VCR.
