



## **Using the Charger**

- A charger is provided with yepp.
- Use only approved NI-MH rechargeable battery and charger.
- Insert the rechargeable battery into the battery slot.
  - \* Make sure that you put the polarity of the battery in the right direction.
- Plug the charger into a wall outlet.
- \* The charger can be operated from an AC 120V/60Hz source
- # Red light indicates that battery is being charged.
- # Green light indicates that battery is fully charged after charging about 4 hours.
- \* When light color changes to green, remove the rechargeable battery from the charger within one hour.

#### Warning:

- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- After charging the rechargeable battery, disconnect charger from power source.
- Do not overload the outlet or extension cords.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out.
   When the operation time is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- Don't charge the rechargeable battery over 24 hours.
- Overcharging or overdischarging will shorten the life of the rechargeable battery.
- To use the rechargeable battery for long time, repeat full charging and full discharging.
- When using the rechargeable battery for the first time or when left unused for a long time, charge it fully before using it again.
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short circuiting can occur when a metallic object (coin, clip or pen) causes a direct connection between the + and - terminals of the battery. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery.

## **Inserting the Battery**

## **Using the SmartMedia Card**

**Using the Rechargeable Battery** 



Open the battery cover by pushing it in the direction of the arrow.


Insert the battery into the groove and make sure that you put the polarity of the battery in the right direction. Close the battery cover by pushing it in the direction of the arrow.

### **Using a Disposal Battery**



- Open the battery pack cover in the direction of arrow
- Insert the battery correctly and close the battery pack cover.
- Plug the battery pack into the extension battery connection port.

Your yepp player allows you to expand memory capacity by adding a SmartMedia card.



- Insert the SmartMedia card into the memory expansion slot on your yepp player in the direction of the arrow.
- Confirm the SmartMedia card mark is displayed on the display.
- Push the SmartMedia card again in the direction of the arrow to take out the SmartMedia card from the slot.

#### Note:

- Do not insert/eject the SmartMedia card during playback of music/voice files.
- Make sure to turn off the player before inserting/ejecting the SmartMedia card.
- Use 3.3V SmartMedia cards only.
- SmartMedia cards of 8MB~128MB can be used.
- Do not touch the metal face of the SmartMedia card.




## Listening to Music with yepp

First, insert a battery and connect the earphones and the remote controller to the player.

## Playing Music

When you press the ▶/ ■ button(yepp player)/
the ▶ ■ button(remote controller), the yepp
logo appears and a music/voice file is played.




#### Note:

- $\bullet$  If the  $\blacktriangleright \! \! \! \parallel$  button on remote controller is pressed while playing, yepp is paused.
- WMA file can be played only at a bit rate between 48Kbps and 192Kbps.[supplied by Windows Media Player (Ver 8.0)]

## Stopping Music (Power Off)

When you press the ►/■ button (yepp player) or the ■ button(remote controller) while playing, the music stops.

If no buttons are pressed within 5 seconds, the vepp automatically powers off.



## **Setting up Volume/Hold Functions**

### **Adjusting the Volume**

Press the +/- button on the side of the yepp player to adjust the volume while playing.

Note: Volume ranges from 00 to 30.

- Press briefly to adjust step by step.
- Press and hold to adjust continuously.



#### **HOLD Function**

Under Hold mode, no buttons work,

#### **HOLD** function on the player

Slide the switch on the player in the direction of the arrow.

- Then no buttons on the yepp player will work. Only the remote controller buttons will work.
- When a button is pressed, "Hold" message will appear on the display.
- The 
   mark will appear on the display.

#### HOLD function on the remote controller

Slide the switch on the remote controller in the direction of the arrow.

The 

mark will appear on the display.

No buttons on the remote controller will work.


(Volume control dial will work.)

Only the yepp player buttons will work.



## **Changing Modes**

Press the MODE button on the yepp player or the A-B button on the remote controller in STOP mode.




## **Recording Voice**

### **To Record Voice**

- Press the REC button(player) in STOP mode.

   Use the ◀◀ / ▶▶ button to select built-in memory/SmartNedia card and start recording using the REC or ▶ button
- Press the ▶/■ button to pause while recording.

  Press the ▶/■ button again to resume recording.
- Press the **REC** button to stop recording. A new voice file is created.
  - The Voice messages are recorded on the built-in memory or SmartMedia card in order of VI001, VI002.....



#### Note:

- When the recording function does not work well, format the relevant memory first before starting recording again.
- Voice recording function button is available on the player only.
- Do not take out or insert the SmartMedia card while voice recording is under way.
- When memory is full, recording stops automatically.

(The available time is displayed on the right of display(player) when recording begins.)

## **Searching for Music/Voice Files**



#### Note:

- With VBR files, pressing the ◀◀ button within the first 5 seconds of the start of track may not result in the previous track playing.
- With VBR files, the actual running time may differ from that of the player display.
- VBR(Variable Bit Rate) file:
   MP3 file whose compression rate changes when played.

### Searching for Specific Parts in PLAY Mode

Press and hold the ◀◀ / ▶▶ button while playing to find the part you want to listen to.

Release the ◀◀/▶▶ button to resume playing.



## Searching for Music/Voice Files in PLAY Mode.

Press the ▶▶ button briefly while playing to advance to the next track.


Press the ◀◀ button briefly within 5 seconds from the start of the track to play the previous track. Press the ◀◀ button briefly after 5 seconds from the start of the track to play the beginning of the current track.



## Searching for Music/Voice Files in STOP Mode.


Press the ◀◀ / ▶► button in STOP mode to skip to the previous or next track.

Press the ▶/ ■ button to play.



## FM Listening Function(All models except YP-700HBB)


Turn on the power of yepp and connect the remote controller.



### Note:

- Only buttons on the remote controller will work in the FM mode.
- In FM mode, you can't connect yepp to a computer.
- Backlight function of the remote controller display will not work in the FM mode.

To exit FM mode, press the MODE button.



#### Note:

- Up to five stations(a, b, c, d, and e) can be saved.
- You can replace one station with another at each saved location, but it is not possible to delete a saved station.
- Press the A-B button to access the saved location directly.

## **Loop Repeating**

## **Setting up MENU**

#### **Loop Function**

### **Starting Point**

While playing music/voice files, press the MODE button briefly (yepp player)/ the A-B button (Remote controller) at the beginning of the loop you want to set.

A flickers in the display.



### **Ending Point**

Press the **MODE** button briefly (yepp player)/ the **A-B** button (Remote controller) at the end of the loop.

(AB) appears in the display. The loop is played repeatedly.




#### Note:

Press the MODE button briefly (yepp player)/ the A-B button (Remote controller) to cancel the loop.

Press and hold the MODE button on the yepp player to switch to MENU mode.

Use the ▶/■ button to select and the ◄◄/▶▶ button to move.

Press the **MODE** button one more time to cancel the **MENU** mode.



- Play mode : To select track repeating mode.
- Equalizer: To use equalizer function.
- Play list: To select files to listen to.
- File: To delete or format music/voice files.
- Setting: To change the basic setup options of the display.
- Track: To search for the file quickly.
- Exit menu : To exit MENU.

#### Note:

- In MENU, Go up can be used to exit the current setting.
- In MENU mode, no input for 10 seconds will cancel the MENU mode.


## **Repeating Tracks**



### Track Repeating Function On the yepp Player

In MENU, select 1.Play mode.

In **PLAY MODE**, use the ◀◀/▶▶ button to move to the mode you want and press the ▶/ ■ button to select.



- Normal: To play all the tracks in order one time. Nor. ▶ Shuffle: To play tracks at random.
- Repeat one: To repeat one track. One
- Repeat all: To repeat all tracks. All)

- Intro: To play the first 10 seconds of each track. intro

#### On the Remote Controller

Each time the **EQ/REP** button is pressed and held, the mode will change in order of REP, ALL, SHU, INT and Normal.

- REP Repeats one track only.
- ALL Repeats all tracks.
- SHU Enables random playback.
- INT Enables yepp to repeat the first 10 seconds of each track.

#### Note:

Normal mode is not indicated on the display.



## **Setting up EQ**



### **EQ Function** On the yepp Player

In MENU, select 2. Equalizer.

In EQ, use the ◄◄/►► button to move to the setting you want (out of the 8 settings) and press the ►/■ button to select. If you want manual equalizer, select User and Bass/Treble.



Note:
DBB is for Dynamic Bass Booster, which enhances bass response.

#### On the Remote Controller

Each time the EQ/REPbutton is pressed, the mode will change in order of Classic, Jazz, Rock, and Normal.



#### Note:

- DBB and User cannot be accessed with the remote controller.
- Normal mode is not indicated on the display.

## **Managing Files**



### **Editing Play List**

- In MENU, select 3. Play list
- 2 In PLAY LIST, select the mode (Music or Voice) to edit and select Edit.
  - Select **Delete** to erase play list.



Move to the file to add to
Play list and press the ►/■
button to add. The file is added
to Play list.
• Press the ►/■ button again to cancel.



Select Confirm to save

Play list.

Select Cancel not to save Play list.



### Listening to Files Selected in Play List

- In MENU, select 3. Play list
- 2 In PLAY LIST, select the mode (Music or Voice) to use Play list and select On.




When Play list is selected, \( \bigsis \) is displayed on yepp player. Press the \( \rightarrow \bigsis \) button to play the file saved in Play list.





### **Deleting**

- In MENU, select 4. File
- In FILE, select Delete and the mode (Music or Voice) the target file is in.
- Move to the file to delete and press the ►/■ button to select. The file is deleted.
- Select Go up → Cancel to exit the mode.



### **Formatting**

- In MENU, select 4. File
- 2 In FILE, select Format and the memory to format. Select Cancel to exit the mode.



### Note:

- You can also format in yepp Explorer.
- All files will be deleted when formatting the memory.



### **Setting Function**


In MENU, select 5. Setting

In **SETTING**, use the ◀◀/▶▶ button to move to the function you want to change and select the function by using the ▶/■ button.



### Display → 1. Information

- Play time: displays current play time
- Remain time: displays remaining play time
- Total time: displays total play time



- Free memory: displays remaining memory 12/0 MB FR

### Display → 2. Logo

- Default: "yepp" logo
- User define: displays user-defined logo
- None: displays no logo.



#### Note:

yepp homepage (http://www.samsungyepp.com) offers a program to edit the user defined logo. You can download from SUPPORT. You can't use vepp logo Editor on Mac.

## **Searching Quickly For Music/Voice Files**

### **Backlight**

Press the ◀◀ / ▶▶ button to set the backlight "ON" time.

When a button is pressed, backlight will stay on for the time you set.



### Scroll speed

Press the ◀◀/▶▶ button to set the scroll speed.



#### Contrast

Press the ◀◀/▶▶ button to set the contrast.



### **Track function**

In MENU, select 6. Track

In TRACK, select the memory or the track to listen to first.
When **Direct flash** is selected, first track in flash memory is played first.
When **Direct SMC** is selected, first track in SMC is played first.



When **DIRECT TRACK** is selected, select the track number by using the ◄◄/▶►button. When the ▶/■button is pressed, playback starts from the selected track number.



## **Connecting yepp to PC**



Before connecting yepp to PC, make sure to install yepp Audio Manager. If "Add New Hardware Wizard" appears, press the [Cancel] button and install yepp Audio Manager.




Note: How to delete the yepp Audio Manager (Rioport Manager):

- If yepp Audio Manager (Rioport Manager) is already installed on your PC, remove the existing yepp Audio Manager (Rioport Manager) first before making a new installation.



### Connecting yepp to PC with USB cable

- Insert the battery into yepp and turn on the yepp.
- Plug one end of the USB cable into the USB port on the back of the PC.
- 3 Plug the other end of the USB cable into the USB port on the right side at the bottom.
  - PC may temporarily malfunction if you unplug the USB cable from PC while yepp Audio Manager is initiating or executing a command.
  - USB driver is installed a message saying that it is searching for a new device. If USB driver is not installed, try one more time after rebooting PC.



- When USB driver is not Installed automatically, refer to next page.
- 5 When USB driver is installed, "SAMSUNG YP-700" will appear in [System Properties] → [Device Manager] as shown in the picture on the right.

Connect yepp to PC. The window shown below appears. Select [Install from a list or specific location (Advanced)] and click [Next].



Insert Installation CD into CD-ROM drive.
Select [Search removable media (floppy, CD-ROM...)] and click [Next].



3 Sometimes a POP-UP window including the attention shown below appears. This software does not impair or destabilize the correct operation of your system. Click [Continue Anyway]






## **Connecting yepp to Mac**



Before connecting yepp to Mac, make sure to install the iTunes plugin.

### System Requirements.

- Mac (9~10)
- 20MB of available hard disk space
- CD-ROM drive (double speed or greater)
- USB port supported
- iTunes 2.0 & 3.0
- If it has not been previously installed, install it from Apple's Installation CD.
- This unit will work on Mac with iTunes 2.0/3.0 only.

### Installing software

Insert the Installation CD into CD-ROM drive.
The window shown below appears.
Double-click YP-700 iTunes Installer in
Installation CD.



2 Double-click Installation program, and screen below appears. Click [Continue].



3 Click [Install]and Installation starts.




When Installation is completed, restart system if operating in Mac OS 9. In Mac OS X, you have no need to restart system.

## **Setting Option Function (PC)**

### Connecting yepp to Mac with USB cable

- Insert the battery into yepp and turn on the yepp.
- Plug one end of the USB cable into the USB port on the back of the Mac.
- 3 Plug the other end of the USB cable into the USB port on the right side at the bottom of the yepp.
  - Mac may temporarily malfunction if you unplug the USB cable from Mac while iTunes is initiating or executing a command.

## **Copying Files to yepp (PC)**



Before copying files, turn on the power of yepp and connect yepp to PC.

 Double- click vepp Audio Manager icon on your desktop.



Click on the [File] → [Search Hard Disks for Tracks] / [Add Tracks...] and save the music files that you want on the database.



Select [copy to devices] → [Select Tracks From Database] / [Select Playlists From Database].

- Check the music file to send and click on the **IOK1** button.
- If the YP-700 memory capacity is insufficient, a warning message will pop up.





### Click on [Copy To Portable]

• The file is transferred.



Do you want to save more songs? You can use the 2X MP3 function to compress MP3 files.







Note : • You cannot transfer music files back from the yepp to the PC (due to copyright protection).

• Files recorded as VOC on the player are converted into WAV when they are stored on PC.

Before uploading files, execute iTunes. Connect yepp to Mac, turn on the yepp and then proceed.

Run iTunes.

2 Select files to save in Mac and Drag & drop files to folder to want to save.



\* In case of uploading VOC in Mac, it is saved in VOC.

## Make MP3 files from an Audio CD (PC)



Make sure to install yepp Audio Manager on PC before making an MP3 file. You can make MP3 files though yepp Audio Manager.

- Run yepp Audio Manager.
  - Double click the yepp Audio Manager.
- Insert the audio CD into the CD-ROM drive. • Press the [read a CD] button to
  - see CD information
- Check songs to convert into an MP3 file.







- Press the [Start Reading] button.
  - Conversion status is indicated on the right bottom of the window while the file is converted.



- File converting status will be displayed.
  - [Options] function should be set first to select the file format. (refer to P.49)





### Downsizing MP3 (PC)

2X MP3 is needed when there is not enough memory space to save more songs.

Before copying, click the button.



- First, select minimum sound quality you want to hear. Displayed minimum file size depends on selected value.
  - If selected value is bigger than remaining memory, convertible maximum file size is displayed only.



Move scroll bar with mouse to adjust the file size. Current file size is displayed at center.



After converted to 2X MP3, files are copied to yepp.

2X MP3 can't be saved on PC.



- Note: File types that can be converted to 2X MP3: Normal formatted MP3 that has sampling frequency of 22.05KHz or 44.1KHz (WMA and SM3 can't be converted to 2X MP3)
  - 2X MP3 is not available on Mac.



### **Deleting Files (PC)**


