

- 2. Retain Instructions: The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- 3 Heed Warnings: All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to
- 4. Follow Instructions: All operating and usage instructions should be followed.
- 5. Cleaning: Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 6 Attachments: Use only attachments recommended by the manufacturer. Use of other attachments may be hazardous.

Using the Remote Control

To load a battery in the remote:

- 1. Press in the direction of the arrow
- 2. Slide the compartment out
- 3. Place the battery in the compartment with the positive side (+) facing up
- 4. Push the compartment in to close



To use the remote:

- Point the remote at the remote sensor of the photo frame at a distance of no more than 15' and at an angle no greater than 60 degrees.
- Batteries will last for about one year under typical usage. Replace the batteries if the remote is no longer working.
- Do not spill water on the remote control.
- Do not use the remote control for other equipment at the same time.
- Remove the batteries if the remote control will not be in use for an extended period of time.



The battery used in this device may present a fire or chemical hazard if mistreated. Do not recharge, disassemble, incinerate, or heat the batteries.

Used batteries should be disposed of safely and not incinerated. Attention should be shown to the environment aspects of battery disposal.

Installing a Memory Card

Your picture frame supports the following types of memory cards:

- Compact Flash cards (CF)
- Secure Digital cards (SD)
- MultiMedia Card (MMC)
- xD-Picture card (xD)


Simply insert the memory card of your choice into its corresponding card slot located on the left panel of the photo frame. Take care to orient the card in the proper direction.

Getting photos and files onto your picture frame for viewing couldn't be easier!

Powering your Digital Picture Frame

Your Picture Frame should be connected to an AC 100-240V wall outlet.

 Using the supplied power adapter, plug one end of the adapter into your photo frame's Power In Jack and plug the other end into an AC 100-240V wall outlet.





Do not connect the power plug to a power outlet other than that which is indicated here or on the label as this may result in the risk of fire or electric shock.

Do not handle the power plug with wet hands. Doing so may cause electric shock

Use only AC adapters of the type specified here. Failure to do so may cause a fire or damage the player.

Turning Your Photo Frame On/Off

- To turn your photo frame on, set the Power Switch to the "On" position.
- To turn your photo frame off, set the Power Switch to the "Off" position.

Menu Interface Navigation

To select the different menu options and files of your digital photo frame:



Select Card Screen

Upon turning on the power, your photo frame will display the "Select Card" screen shown below.

 Use the navigation keys to select an available card slot and then press EN-TER to confirm.



SELECT CARD SCREEN

Inserted: A card icon that is in-color indicates that a memory card has

been inserted (installed) in the corresponding slot.

No Card: A card icon that is grayed-out indicates that a memory card

has not been installed in the corresponding slot and is not

available for use.

Selected: A highlighted frame indicates that the card slot is selected. Only

card slots with an installed memory card may be selected.

Select Mode Screen

Upon selecting a card, your photo frame will display the "Select Mode" screen shown below.

 Use the navigation keys to select a player mode and then press ENTER to confirm.



SELECT MODE SCREEN

File Mode: Manage and play files from an installed memory card.

Music Mode: Play music files from an installed memory card.

Photo Mode: View photo files from an installed memory card.

Video Mode: Play video from an installed memory card.

PHOTO MODE

To display your photos, select Photo Mode from the "Select Mode" screen and press ENTER.

Photo List

Upon entering Photo Mode, your photo frame will scan the memory card for available photos and display the "Photo List" screen shown below. The Photo List displays thumbnail images of all available photos.

 To display a photo (full screen), use the navigation keys to select a thumbnail and press ENTER to confirm.



The Photo List will display supported Photo files, only.

Your photo frame can display baseline JPEG files of up to 32 million pixels and 14MB in size, as well as BMP files up to 1024 x 1024 and 14MB in size.

PHOTO MODE

Photo View

Upon entering a thumbnail in the "Photo List", your photo frame will display the photo in full-screen Photo View mode.

- To view the previous photo, press
- To view the next photo, press

Zoom

To increase the level of magnification, press ZOOM.

 Each successive press of ZOOM will change the level of magnification as shown below



To pan around the magnified picture, use the navigation keys.

Rotate

To rotate the picture, press ANGLE.

 Each successive press of ROTATE will change the angle of rotation as shown below



Screensize (Screen Ratio)

To toggle the screensize between 4:3 (standard) and 16:9 (widescreen), repeatedly press the LEFT button **on the photo frame**.

PHOTO MODE

Slideshow

To display your photographs as a slideshow, press (2) at any time.

- To play background music during the slideshow, press the ENTER key
- To adjust the volume level, press VOL- or VOL+
- To mute the audio, press MUTE. To restore the audio, press MUTE again.
 - Pressing the ENTER key on the main unit while background music is playing will also mute the audio.



If the photo frame is turned off during the slideshow, the slideshow will resume the next time the photo frame is turned on.


MUSIC MODE

To play your digital audio files, select Music Mode from the "Select Mode" screen and press ENTER.

Music List

Upon entering Music Mode, your photo frame will scan the memory card for available audio files and display the "Music List" screen shown below. The Music List displays the filenames of all available audio files.

 Use the navigation keys to select an audio file and press ENTER to start playback.

The Music List will display supported audio files, only.

Your photo frame can play digital MP3 and WMA audio files.

MUSIC MODE

Music Controls

Use the navigation keys to select an audio file and press ENTER to start play-back.

During playback:

- To pause playback, press 🐠. To resume playback, press 🐿 again
- To play the next file, press
- To play the previous file, press
- To fast-forward through the current file, press and hold
- To reverse through the current file, press and hold
- To stop playback, press
- · To adjust the volume level, press VOL- or VOL+
- To mute the audio, press MUTE. To restore the audio, press MUTE again.


VIDEO MODE

To play your digital video files, select Video Mode from the "Select Mode" screen and press ENTER.

Video List

Upon entering Video Mode, your photo frame will scan the memory card for available audio files and display the "Video List" screen shown below. The Video List displays the filenames of all available video files.

 Use the navigation keys to select a video file and press ENTER to start playback.

The Video List will display supported Video files, only.

Your photo frame can play digital AVI and MP4 video files from most digital cameras.

VIDEO MODE

Video Controls

Use the navigation keys to select a video file and press ENTER to start playback.

During playback:

- To play the next file, press
- To play the previous file, press
- To stop playback, press
- To adjust the volume level, press VOL- or VOL+
- To mute the audio, press MUTE. To restore the audio, press MUTE again.



Reverse and fast-forward play is not available in video mode.


FILE MODE

To browse and play all your digital files, select File Mode from the "Select Mode" screen and press ENTER.

File List

Upon entering File Mode, your photo frame will scan the memory card for all available files and display the "File List" screen shown below.

- Use the navigation keys to select a file and press ENTER to start playback.
- To return to the File List during playback, press MENU. If MENU is pressed during slideshow playback, the photo frame will return to the Photo List screen instead.







Before connecting the Digital Photo Frame to a TV set, be sure to turn the power off and unplug both units from the wall outlet.

CABLE CONNECTION

Headphones



- Be sure that your unit is at low volume level before connecting the headphone.
- Increase the volume gradually to a comfortable listening level.

Audio-Only Output

To output audio only, use the AV connection but do not connect the Video cables.

COMPUTER CONNECTION (USB)

Connect the DP-562 to a computer with the USB cable provided to:

- Transfer files to and from your photo frame's installed memory cards
- Perform basic file management functions.

USB Driver Installation (Required for Windows 98 SE Only)

It is not necessary to install the USB driver if your computer is running Microsoft Windows ME/2000/XP or newer, or Macintosh OS X. Computers running these operating systems will recognize your photo frame automatically when connected.

If your computer is running Windows 98 SE:

- 1. Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
- Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
- Double-click on the folder "Win98 USB Drivers" and then on the folder "english".
- Double-click on the SETUP icon (SETUP.EXE) to start the USB driver installation program.
- 5. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation and then restart your computer.



Mini-CDs should only be used in normal tray-loading CD/DVD drives. Mini-CDs may be used in slot-loading drives with the proper adapter; please contact your computer or drive manufacturer for more information.

Connecting to a Computer

Connect the photo frame to your computer with the supplied USB cable. Upon connection:

 Your computer will automatically recognize any memory cards installed in your photo frame. An icon representing your installed memory cards will appear as "Removable Disks" when you open "My Computer".



COMPUTER CONNECTION (USB)

 It may take Windows several minutes to recognize and set up the device the first time it is connected depending on your hardware configuration.

Transferring Files

The USB 2.0 High-Speed connection makes it easy to transfer music, video, or photo files (or any other data) quickly between the photo frame and your computer. Simply use the photo frame as you would a floppy disk using basic operating system commands.

If you need further assistance with transferring files, please refer to your operating system's instruction manual or on-screen help.



Do not disconnect or otherwise interrupt the photo frame during transmission - this could damage or corrupt the photo frame's firmware or your files.

Microsoft Windows

- Double-click the "My Computer" icon on your desktop and then double-click the Removable Disk icon that corresponds with the photo frame's installed memory card.
- 2. Drag your media files (or other files) to the Removable Disk.
 - You may choose to use folders/subfolders to organize your media and data.

Macintosh OS X

- Open a Finder window. Locate the files you would like to transfer from your computer. Select the files/folders with the mouse and press APPLE-C (copy) on the keyboard.
- Click on the Removable Disk icon located on the left side of the finder window. The computer will display all files and folders currently stored in the memory card.
- 3. Press APPLE-V (paste) on the keyboard to transfer the files you selected in Step 1 to the memory card.

Disconnecting from a Computer

Disconnect your photo frame as instructed below to prevent data loss or file/firmware corruption.

COMPUTER CONNECTION (USB)

Microsoft Windows

 Double-click the green arrow in the taskbar located on the lower-right side of the computer screen (Safely Remove Hardware).

2. Safely Remove Hardware:

Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "Stop".

Stop a Hardware Device: Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "OK".

Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "OK".

3. When the "Safe to Remove Hardware" window appears, click the OK button and disconnect the USB cable from the photo frame and your computer.

Macintosh OS X


- On the left side of the Finder window, identify the appropriate Removable Disk icon.
- 2. Click on the "Eject" arrow on the right of the Removable Disk icon.
- 3. Disconnect the USB cable from the photo frame and your computer.

FACEPLATES

Your digital photo frame comes equipped with interchangeable face plates.


To attach a faceplate to your photo frame:

- 1. Affix "B" to the main unit
- 2. Press and push "A" into the main unit with the Coby logo facing down
- 3. The two parts are now attached



To detach a faceplate from your photo frame:

- 1. Press and pull "A"
- 2. While it is opened, detach the main unit by releasing it from "B"
- 3. The faceplate has been detached



FIRMWARE UPGRADES

From time to time, COBY may release firmware updates to improve the performance of the DP-562 or to add additional features. Please check the COBY website periodically at www.cobyusa.com to see if new firmware has been released for your photo frame.

- Download the latest firmware for your photo frame from <u>www.cobyusa.com</u>. Save this file to the computer.
- Connect your photo frame to the computer. Double-click the Removable Icon that corresponds to your photo frame, and then double-click the FIRMWARE folder to open it.
- Double-click the downloaded firmware file (you may need a file compression utility installed on your computer). In the window that appears, select the file that ends with ".BIN" and copy it to your photo frame's FIRMWARE folder.
- 4. Disconnect your photo frame from the computer and turn it off.
- 5. Turn the photo frame back on. The photo frame should update its firmware automatically.



Do not disconnect your photo frame from the computer or otherwise interrupt the firmware upgrade—doing so could damage your photo frame and render it inoperable.

The player does not turn on.

- Make sure the unit has been powered on manually (i.e., the Power Switch has been physically set to the ON position).
- Ensure that the power cord has been properly connected to the power outlet.

The sound quality of the music is poor.

- Try playing the file on your computer. If the sound quality is still poor, try down-loading the file again or re-encoding the file yourself.
- Ensure that the bit rate of the file is not too low. The higher the bit rate of the file, the better it will sound. The minimum recommended bitrate is 128kbps for MP3s and 96kbps for WMAs.

I cannot transfer files to the photo frame.

- Ensure that your computer is running a supported operating system.
- If you are running Microsoft Windows 98 SE, ensure that the USB driver has been properly installed.
- Ensure that the supplied USB cable is securely attached to the player and the PC, or try using another USB cable.

TROUBLESHOOTING

- If you have connected the player through a USB hub, try connecting the player directly to your computer.
- Ensure that the player's memory capacity is not full.

I cannot select a memory card.

- Ensure that a memory card has been installed.
- Ensure that the memory card is properly installed.
- Ensure that the memory card is not defective.

I cannot copy files to a target location.

Ensure that the target card has enough memory to contain the file.

The player will not play my music file.

- Ensure that the file is in a compatible format (MP3 or WMA).
- The file may be copy-protected. This player cannot play copy-protected files.

The player will not play my video file.

 Ensure that the video file will play on your computer using Windows Media Player 10. If the file works on the computer, use the same computer to convert the video to a compatible format.

The picture is noisy or distorted.

- Reset the color system of the TV set.
- Ensure that the photo frame is connected using the RCA AV cable.

There is no sound.

Ensure that the volume has been set to a reasonable level.

The remote control does not work.

- Make sure the unit has been powered on manually (i.e., the Power Switch has been physically set to the ON position).
- Remove any obstacles between the remote control and the frame.
- Point the remote control towards the remote sensor on the frame

TROUBLESHOOTING

- Ensure that the battery has been installed correctly in the remote control.
- · Replace the battery.

The photo frame has malfunctioned.

- Turn the photo frame off and let it rest for 30 minutes. After that, turn on the photo frame -- the restore function should reset the photo frame.
- Try updating the player's firmware. Please refer to the Firmware Upgrade section of this manual for detailed instructions.
