


Pull the string loop through the hole in the lens cap.








### Loading the batteries


Make sure the camera is turned off (i.e. the mode dial is set to OFF).




Slide the battery compartment lock on the battery compartment cover in the direction of 3.



Slide the battery compartment cover in the direction of the arrow printed on it, using your fingertip. Using a fingernail could result in injury.






Close the battery compartment cover, then press it down and slide it in the opposite direction of the arrow printed on it.

- When pressing the battery compartment cover shut, be sure to press the center of the cover, as it may be difficult to close properly by pressing the edge.
- Make sure the cover is completely closed.

### 3 Inserting the card

Insert the card fully with the contact area facing towards the monitor side (back of the camera). Insert until you feel the card locked into place. • Note the orientation of the card. If it is inserted incorrectly, it may become jammed.



### 3 Ejecting the card


Push in the card lightly to unlock it, then pull it

Close the cover tightly 4



• NEVER open the card cover, eject the card, remove the batteries, or disconnect the optional AC adapter while the camera is in use or the camera is communicating with a computer. Doing so could destroy all data on the card.





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
### **Playing back movies**



### **Quick View**

Display the movie frame (picture with ⊕) you want to play back.

→ See steps 1 and 2 in "Viewing still pictures".



## 3 Press △ on the arrow pad to select MOVIE PLAY.

The card access lamp blinks while movie data is accessed. The camera starts playing back after loading the movie data.



- When playback finishes, the screen returns to the beginning of the movie.
- If you press (3) again, the MOVIE PLAYBACK screen appears.



Select an item displayed on the screen by pressing △ or ▽ on the arrow pad, and then press (a) to start one of following operations


- PLAYBACK: Plays back the entire movie again. FRAME BY FRAME: Plays back
- the movie manually by one frame at a time.

  EXIT: Leaves the movie playback mode.

### **Erasing pictures**



Display the picture you want to erase. → See steps 1 and 2 in "Viewing still pictures".




### Using the zoom

Shoot a wider picture (wide-angle) Press the zoom lever toward W to zoom out.



## Mode dial

S-Prg : Scene program shooting

A/S/M/ssi : Sets controls for Aperture-priority auto exposure/Shutterpriority auto exposure/Manual exposure/My mode setup

P : Full automatic exposure with one press of the shutter button.

OFF : Turns off the power.

: Displays pictures.

Turns the monitor on/off.


Turns the monitor on/off.Press quickly twice to play back the last recorded image.

### Menu screen : Selects menu items — Takes close-up pictures :Sets aperture/shutter speed/exposure Shooting (Working range: 0.2-0.8 m (0.6-2.6 ft)). compensation/manual focusing values : Selects pictures to be displayed. Selects area for metering. Playback: Selects pictures for printing (Print reserve). ### **CAMERA**

DRIVE Selects the drive mode from sequential shooting, auto bracketting, or self-timer

	shooting.		
ISO	Selects the ISO sensitivity. (AUTO/100/200/400)		
A/S/M/	Selects the exposure mode from A (Aperture priority auto), S (Shutter priority auto), M (Manual mode), or 🖼 (My mode setup) when the Mode dial is set to "A/S/M/\surface".		
<u>\$½</u>	Adjusts the flash intensity for different shooting conditions.		
\$ SLOW	Adjusts the flash for slow shutter speeds. (\$SLOW1/③ \$SLOW/\$SLOW2)		
NOISE REDUCTION	Reduces the noise on images during long exposures.		
DIGITAL ZOOM	Zooming can be set up to 7.5x in combination with the optical 3x zooming (equivalent to 32 mm-96 mm on a 35 mm camera).		
FULLTIME AF	Keeps the image in focus at all times without having to press the shutter button halfway.		
AF MODE	Selects the auto focus mode (iESP or SPOT).		
PANORAMA	The Olympus standard SmartMedia card (supplied) allows you to combine pictures side by side. (*CAMEDIA Master is required.)		
FUNCTION	Lets you shoot pictures in black & white or sepia tone, etc.

### **PICTURE**

<b>1</b>	Sets the record mode. (TIFF/SHQ/HQ/SQ)
WB	Adjusts the white balance according to the light source. (AUTO/PRESET/Q)
WB½	Allows you to make fine changes to the white balance manually.
SHARPNESS	Adjusts the sharpness of images.
CONTRAST	Adjusts the contrast of images.

## Menu functions for playback operation

### (still pictures)

Runs through all saved pictures one after another (slide-show).

### **MOVIE PLAY (movies)**

Plays back movies.

Sets the date/time.

### INFO

Changes the amount of shooting information (ISO, White Balance, etc.) displayed on the Monitor.

### ROTATE (still pictures)

Changes the orientation of the played back picture among three angles. (-90°/+90°/0°)
