

DVDs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a separate "title". "Chapters" are sections of titles.

Audio CDs are divided into "tracks". A "track" is usually one song

Note: Numbers identify each title, chapter, and track on a disc. Most discs have these numbers recorded on them, but some do not

Maintenance

Cleaning the Disc

- defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback. andle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.
