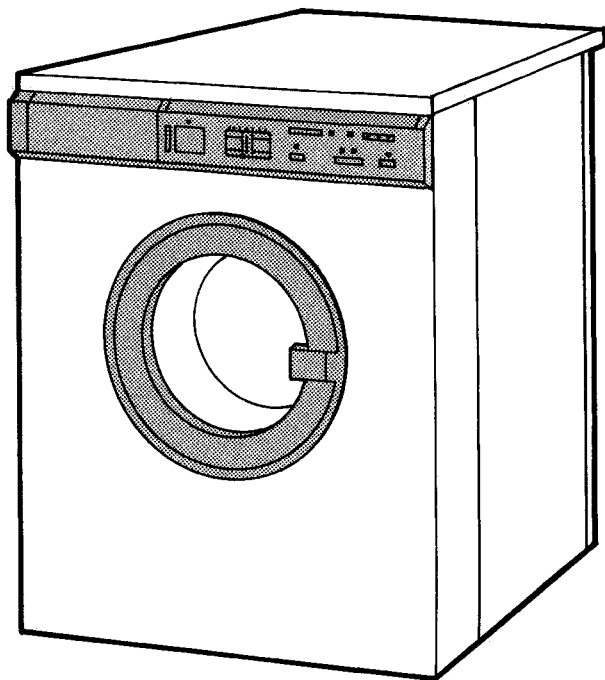

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WARNINGS

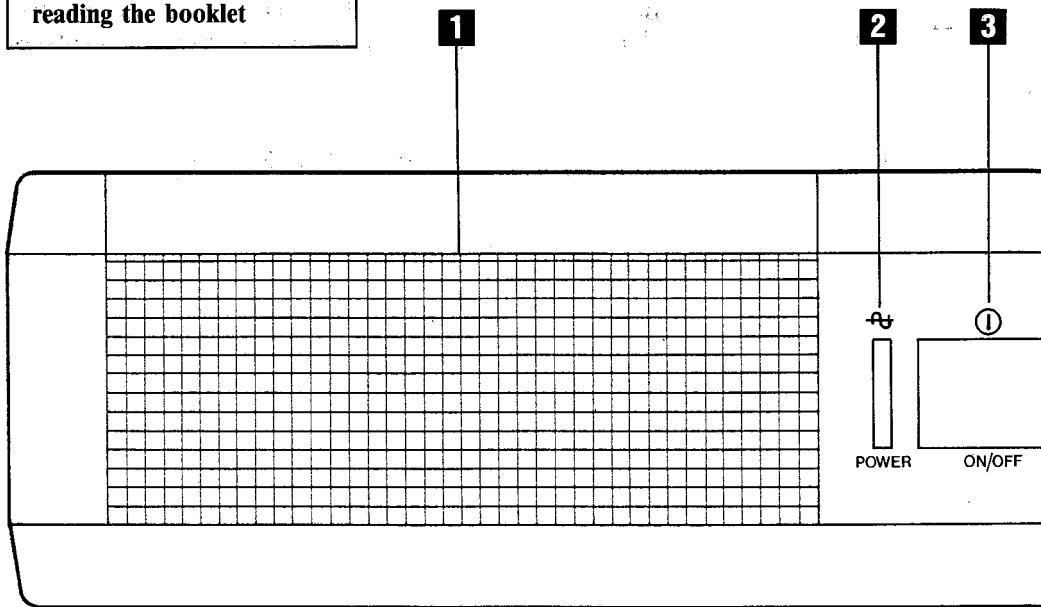
It is most important that this instruction book should be retained with the appliance for future reference. Should the appliance be sold or transferred to another owner, or should you move house and leave the appliance, always ensure that the book is supplied with the appliance in order that the new owner can be acquainted with the functioning of the appliance and the relevant warnings.

THESE WARNINGS ARE PROVIDED IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY. YOU MUST READ THEM CAREFULLY BEFORE INSTALLING OR USING THE APPLIANCE.

- ▲ Always switch off and unplug appliance after use.
- ▲ Any electrical work required to install this appliance should be carried out by a qualified electrician or competent person.
- ▲ This appliance is designed to be operated by adults. Children should not be allowed to tamper with the controls or play with the product.
- ▲ This product should be serviced by an Authorized Zanussi Network Service Centre, and only genuine Zanussi spare parts should be used.
- ▲ It is dangerous to alter the specifications or modify this product in any way.
- ▲ Care must be taken to ensure that the appliance does not stand on the electrical supply cable.
- ▲ Do not overload the appliance.
- ▲ As some duvets and eider-downs should be washed/dried in large commercial machines because of their bulk, please check with the manufacturer of the item before washing/drying in a domestic machine, even if the dry weight of the item is within the limit advised.
- ▲ Never tumble dry items that have had contact with chemicals such as dry cleaning fluid. These are of a volatile nature and could cause an explosion.
- ▲ Always check that there are no volatile or flammable objects left in pockets.
- ▲ The door becomes very hot during the drying cycle. Keep children away from the appliance when it is in operation.
- ▲ Leave the porthole door slightly ajar when not in use to preserve the door seal.
- ▲ Fluff filters must be cleaned after every use.
- ▲ Do not operate the appliance with a damaged filter or with no filter at all, as this may cause a fire.
- ▲ Zanussi tumble dryers are designed to be vented through to the open air. The appliance should have its own ventilation system which should not be joined with any other ventilation system connected to any other appliance.
- ▲ In order to prevent the appliance from overheating, it is important that the condensation vents are not obstructed.
- ▲ Pets or children have been known to climb into tumble dryers. Check your drum before use.
- ▲ The users should always check that they have not left their gas lighters (disposable or otherwise) in their clothing.
- ▲ Under no circumstances should you attempt to repair the machine yourself. Repairs carried out by inexperienced persons may cause injury or more serious malfunctioning. Refer to your local Zanussi Service Centre. Always insist on genuine Zanussi spare parts.

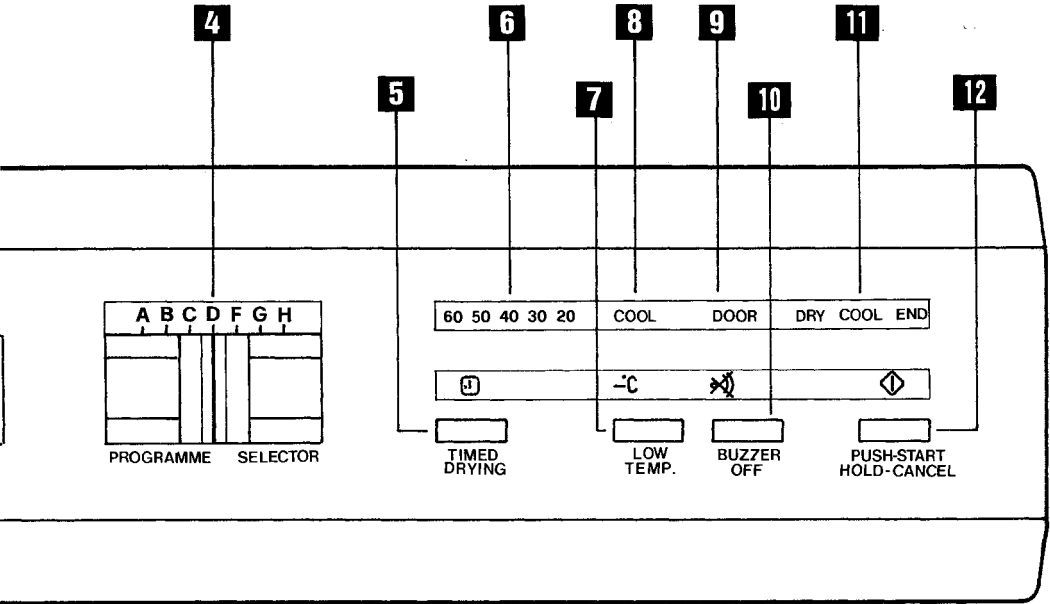

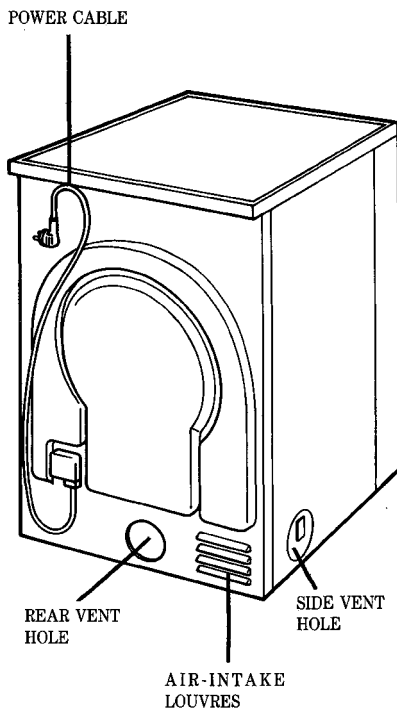
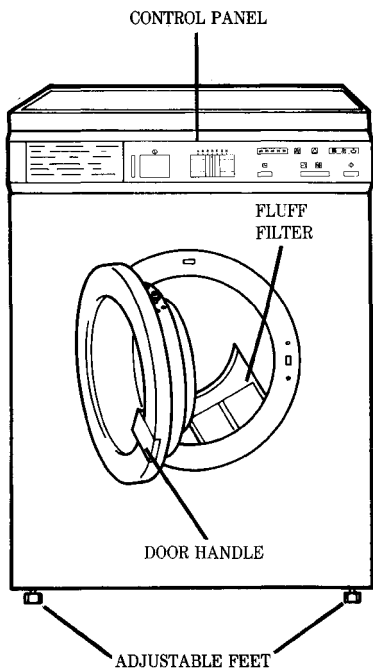

YOUR MACHINE

The TE350 is an electric sensor tumble dryer, and features seven sensor programmes for different degrees of dryness with automatic temperature and timer control (no more guessing).

If you want to take charge, you have got the option to choose a timed drying cycle to suit your needs.

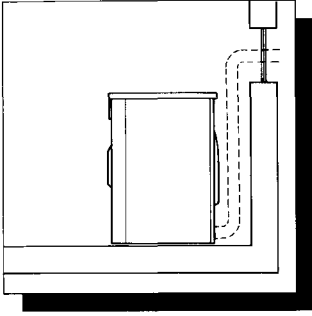


INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE INSTALLER

1

Install the appliance in a well ventilated room or close to a window since, whilst drying, the tumble dryer will expel a certain amount of moist air.

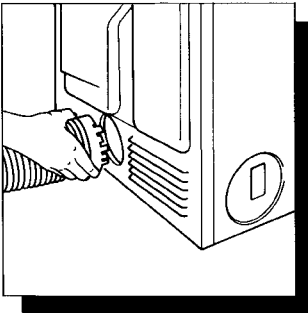
Room temperature must not exceed 35°C.



2

Condensation may be discharged either through a vent outlet provided at the back or through the side vent outlet.

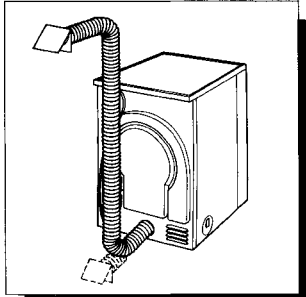
The unused outlet must be covered with the cover provided for such a purpose.



3

With the special plastic flexible tube (vent hose), available on request by your local dealer, you may discharge condensation directly outdoors.

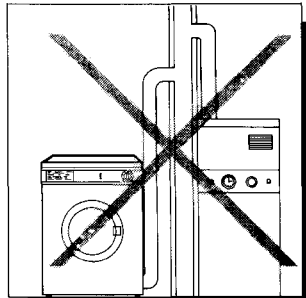
The length of the vent hose must not be more than 2 m and it must not contain more than two bends when it is placed in position for operation.



4

It is absolutely essential not to connect the flexible vent hose to, for example, a chimney or flue pipe designed to carry the exhaust from a fuel burning heating appliance.

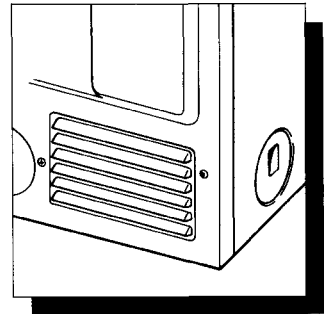
The capacity of the venting circuit must be at least 150 m³/h.

The tumble dryer must be installed in a clean place, where dirt does not build up.

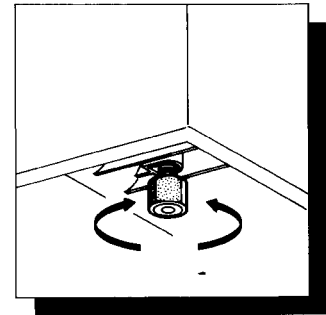
Make sure there are no obstructing items or materials near the air-intake louvres provided at the back (such as for example paper, rags, etc.).

Level the tumble dryer into place by screwing or unscrewing the front feet as required.

Accurate levelling will keep vibration and noise to a minimum when the dryer is in use.

THE ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS

WARNING

This appliance must be earthed

The manufacturer declines any liability should this safety measure not be observed.

If the plug that is fitted to your appliance is not suitable for your socket outlet, it must be cut off and the appropriate plug fitted.

The cut off plug should be disposed of to prevent the hazard of electric shocks in case it should be plugged into a 13 Amp socket in another part of your home.

Important

The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

GREEN AND YELLOW - EARTH
BLUE - NEUTRAL
BROWN - LIVE

If you fit your own plug, the colours of the wires in the mains lead of your appliance may not correspond with the markings identifying the terminals in your plug, this is what you have to do:

Connect the green and yellow (earth) wire to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter «E» or the earth symbol or coloured green, or green and yellow.

Connect the blue (neutral) wire to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter «N» or coloured black.

Connect the brown (live) wire to the terminal which is marked with the letter «L» or coloured red.

The plug moulded on to the cord incorporates a fuse. For replacement, use a 13 Amp BS 1362 fuse.

Only ASTA approved fuses should be used.

The fuse cover/carrier must be replaced in the event of changing fuse.

The right fuse cover/carrier colour is the one shown by the coloured insert at base of the plug.

The plug must not be used if the fuse cover/carrier is lost.

A replacement cover/carrier must be obtained from Zanussi Service Agents whose addresses are listed on the attached «Service and Spares Nationwide».

In addition, avoid connecting the dryer to the same socket as your washing machine (or any other appliance) by means of an adaptor.

Have an extra socket installed if necessary by a qualified electrician.

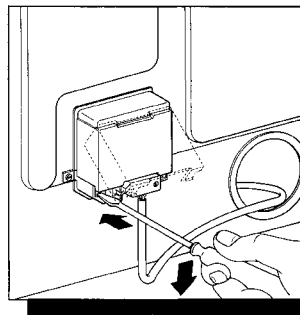
This appliance complies with E.E.C. directive no. 87/308 of 2.6.87 relative to radio interference suppression.

ELECTRIC CABLE REPLACEMENT

If necessary, the electric cable can be replaced.

Unplug the appliance.

The terminal board is located at the back of the appliance and is easily accessible.



Depress with a screwdriver the two tongues of the terminal board lid, lift it, unscrew the screw fixing the terminals and replace the cable.

NOTE

Installation and, in particular, connection to the electric mains and to the discharge vent must be carried out by competent personnel or qualified technicians.

Please ensure that when the appliance is installed it is easily accessible for the engineer in the event of a breakdown.

DOOR REVERSAL

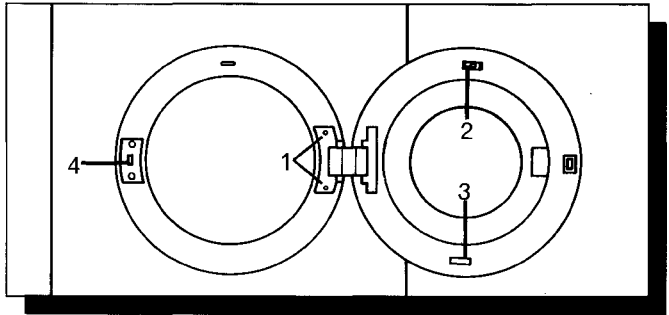
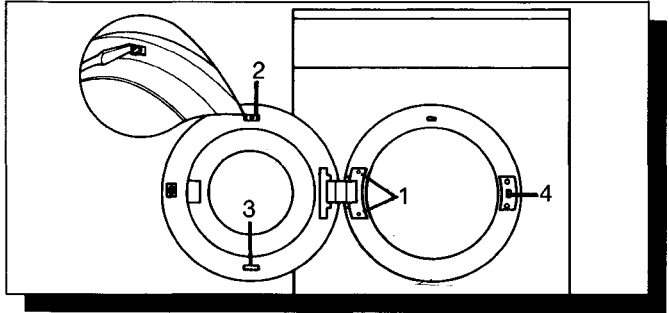

This operation must be carried out by qualified personnel.

To make it easier to load or unload the laundry the door can be reversed.

To do this operate as follows:

- Remove the door by unscrewing the two screws (1) fastening the hinge to the cabinet.
- Remove the safety pin (2) by bending the two fastening tags.
- Remove the block (3) by bending the two fastening tags.
- Refit the safety pin (2) and block (3) on the opposite sides of the door, making sure they are accurately engaged.
- Remove the plastic plate (4) by unscrewing the two fastening screws.
- Refit the plastic plate (4) on the opposite side.
- Refit the door by screwing in the two screws (1) which fasten the door to the cabinet.



USE OF CONTROLS

To obtain the best drying results it is essential to get to know the controls and how to use them properly.

1

PROGRAMME CHART

This lists the drying programmes.

2

PILOT LIGHT

It lights up when the on/off switch is depressed and goes out when it is pressed again.

3

ON/OFF SWITCH

Before using the machine, depress the on/off switch.

4

PROGRAMME SELECTOR

The red bar in the centre of the slider should be moved to line up with the required programme.

5

MANUAL DRYING PUSH BUTTON

If you do not wish to use the automatic sensor programmes this push button allows you to manually select the required drying time.

Push the button until the desired drying time is lit up on the display.

6

MANUAL DRYING TIME LIGHT

The display will show the drying time selected.

7

COOLING PHASE LIGHT

This light indicates that the cooling phase is in operation.

8

REDUCED TEMPERATURE PUSH BUTTON

This reduces the drying temperature, and should be used when drying polyester-cotton, or particularly delicate synthetics. Drying times are longer when this function is used.

Programme «H» (delicate synthetics) reduces the temperature automatically.

9

WARNING LIGHT

The light starts blinking when the door is open or when the temperature control units are not functioning correctly.

USE OF CONTROLS

10

BUZZER

SILENCER

PUSH BUTTON

If you do not wish the buzzer to sound at the end of the drying programme, depress this push button.

11

PROGRAMME

PHASE DISPLAY

This shows the progression of the programme.

12

PROGRAMME

STARTING

PUSH BUTTON

Press this push button to start the drying programme. This button can be used to cancel the programme at any stage by pressing for a few seconds.

STARTING

Once the laundry is loaded and before starting the dryer, be sure that:

- The mains switch is on.
- The vent hose, if you have one, is in position.
- The door is properly closed.



Switch on the on/off switch, and the pilot light will come on. Select the programme or the desired drying time. If required depress the reduced temperature button and/or the buzzer silencer push button.

At this point push the start button and the dryer will start.


STOPPING

THE TUMBLE

DRYER

The end of the cycle is signalled by the buzzer (if the  push button has not been activated) and by the cycle completion  light.

To help avoid creasing the drum will continue to rotate for a period of time, if you are not able to remove the laundry immediately.

Depress the on/off  push button, open the door, and unload the laundry.

The appliance should be unplugged once the programme has finished.

DRYING

PROGRAMMES

The dryer is provided with various programmes, each of which is suitable for different types of fabrics.

You should ensure that the correct programme is used for the type of fabric being dried.

Refer to the programme chart after consulting the fabric care label in the garment, first ensuring that the garment is suitable for tumble drying.

TIME CONTROLLED CYCLES

Time controlled drying cycles are ideal for drying small loads of laundry and to complete the drying cycle of sensor programmes, if necessary.

Type of laundry	Degree of drying required	Quantity	Timed drying setting
For all types of fabric	According to your needs	4.5 kg (10 lb) max	Selected time: max. 60 mins.

DRYING FOR EXAMPLE 4 kg (9 lb) OF COTTON

You have for example just machine-washed and spun 4 kg (9 lb) of laundry.

They are cotton fabrics of medium weight which you want to iron as soon as they are dried.

LOAD THE LAUNDRY

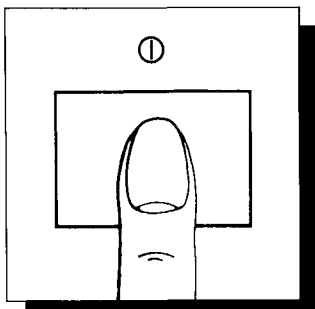
Open the door by pulling the handle outwards.

Load the items you have to dry one at a time shaking them out loosely and close the door.

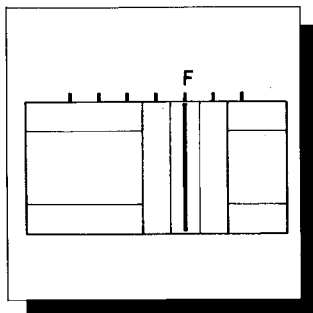

PROGRAMME SELECTION

Switch on the on/off switch (pilot light will light up).



Slide the programme selector until the red line in the centre of the slider lines up with letter F.






START

Ensure that:

The plastic venting hose (if you have one) is in position;



The warning light  is off (if lit, the door may be open).

Press the  start push button.

The drying cycle display  will light up to show the dryer is in operation.

4

ONCE THE DRYING CYCLE IS CONCLUDED

The end of the cycle is signalled by the buzzer signal and the cycle completion light . To help avoid creasing the drum will continue to rotate for a period of time, if you are not able to remove the laundry immediately. Depress the re-set button  for a few seconds (only if the cycle completion light is still lit), open the door and unload the laundry. Check the filter and clean if necessary. When you have finished using the dryer, switch off the on/off switch and unplug at the mains.

DRYING FOR EXAMPLE 2 kg (4 lb) OF SYNTHETICS

You have for example just machine-washed and briefly spun 2 kg (4 lb) of synthetics which do not need ironing.

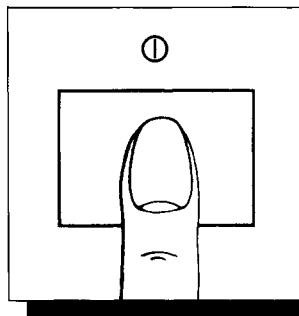
1 LOAD THE LAUNDRY

Open the door by pulling the handle outwards.

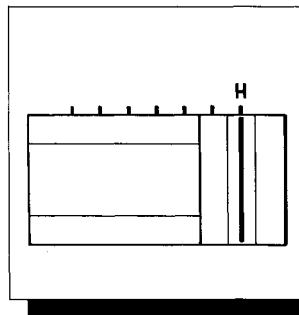
Load the items you have to dry one at a time, shaking them out loosely and close the door.


2 PROGRAMME SELECTION

Switch on the on/off switch (pilot light will light up).



Slide the programme selector until the red line in the centre of the slider lines up with letter H.






In this programme, temperature reduction switches on automatically (lamp  lights up).

3 START


Ensure that:

The plastic venting hose (if you have one) is in position;


The alarm light  is off (if lit, the door may be open). Press the  start push button.

The drying cycle display  will light up to show the dryer is in operation.

4 ONCE THE DRYING CYCLE IS CONCLUDED

The end of the cycle is signalled by the buzzer signal and the programme end light .

To help avoid creasing the drum will continue to rotate for a period of time, if you are not able to remove the laundry immediately.

Depress the on/off  push button, open the door, and unload the laundry.

The appliance should be unplugged once the programme has finished.

HINTS ON DRYING

● Do not overload the dryer. During the first times you're using the dryer weigh the laundry loads.

Here is a list of the average weights of the more common laundry items according to an approximate basis.

Sheet	700 to 1000 gr
Pillowcase	100 to 200 gr
Tablecloth	400 to 500 gr
Table napkin	50 to 100 gr
Kitchen towel	70 to 120 gr
Linen hand towel	100 to 150 gr
Sponge hand towel	150 to 250 gr
Sponge bath towel	700 to 1000 gr
Bathrobe	1000 to 1500 gr
Shirt	200 to 300 gr
Apron	150 to 200 gr

● However, the best and most economical load is the maximum indicated for the different types of fabric.

● Always load well spun laundry.

The higher the spin speed the lower is electric energy consumption and the shorter is the drying time.

● Do not leave the damp laundry load in a heap too long before drying.


● Sort the laundry out: Separate synthetics from cotton and linen and dry them separately.

● Close poppers and zips and fasten any buttons found loose.


● Do not use the tumble dryer to dry the following:

- Dry-cleaned fabrics or fabrics cleaned with chemical solvents.
- Woollen garments and those manufactured from synthetic/wool mixtures of the heat-shrinkable type.
- Very delicate articles such as silk and curtains made of synthetic material.
- Foam-rubber articles.
- Fibre-glass articles.

● In some cases, labels on articles may also be of help.

 Vigorous drying

 Delicate drying

 Do not tumble dry

● Avoid drying dark clothes with light coloured fluffy items such as towels as they could attract the fluff.

● If you overdry the laundry, besides wasting energy, any subsequent ironing may become more difficult because the fabric could be heavily crumpled.

● Remove the laundry when the dryer has finished drying.

● To avoid a static charge when drying is completed, use either a fabric softener when you are washing the laundry or a fabric conditioner specifically for tumble dryers.

● When you have finished tumble drying do not forget to clean the filter. If the filter is dirty, drying times are increased considerably and consequently energy consumption is also increased.

MAINTENANCE

IMPORTANT

You are advised to unplug the appliance before all cleaning and maintenance operations.

EXTERNAL CLEANING

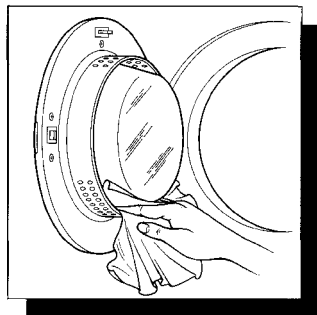
Use only soap and water and then dry thoroughly.

From time to time, apply a little wax furniture cream with a soft cloth.

CLEANING THE DOOR

Clean periodically the interior part of the door to eliminate any fluff.

Only an accurate cleaning ensures a correct drying.

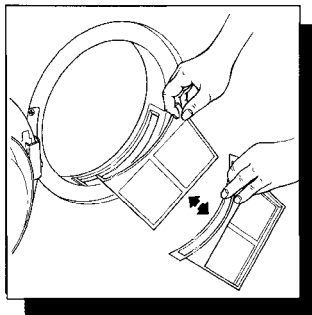


CLEANING

THE FILTER

Your dryer will only function well if the filter is clean.

The filter collects all the «fluff» which accumulates during drying and it must therefore be removed and cleaned at the end of each programme.







The filter is composed of two parts which facilitate cleaning operations.

It is perfectly normal for fluff to accumulate in the filter during drying. In fact, even fabrics dried in the open air lose their fibres, but we do not notice it.

SERVICING

In some cases, functional problems may be due to lack of basic maintenance or to incorrect procedures when starting the machine and, in such cases, may be easily solved without the need for a service call.

■ THE DRYER DOES NOT START	● The door is open (the warning light  is lit)	▶ Close the door (the warning light  will go out)
	● The plug is not fitted into the wall socket	▶ Fit the plug into the wall socket
	● There is no electric supply from the wall socket.	▶ Have the fuse replaced if it has blown ▶ Contact a qualified electrician
	● The programme selector is not set correctly	▶ Slide the selector to the desired programme
	● The On/Off switch has not been switched on (pilot light is off)	▶ Press the On/Off switch (pilot light lights up)
	● The start push button  has not been activated (programme phase display switched off)	▶ Press the start push button  (programme phase display lights up)
■ THE DRYER DOES NOT DRY PROPERLY	● The filter is clogged	▶ Clean the filter after each drying operation
	● The wrong programme has been selected	▶ Select the right programme. See the drying programmes (page 12)
	● Excessive laundry load	▶ Reduce the laundry load
	● The dryer is not correctly installed	▶ Check to see installation is in accordance with instructions (see pages 7 and 8). In particular, check efficiency of air-intake louvres and of the condensation vents.

If, after the above checks, there is still a fault, call your nearest Zanussi Service Force Centre, whose address and telephone number can be found on the following pages.

Please make sure you give the model and serial number of the appliance. This information can be found on

the rating plate, or on the guarantee certificate.

Original spare parts can be purchased from Zanussi Service Force Centres.

In-guarantee customers should ensure that the above checks have been made as the engineer will make a charge if the fault is not a mechanical or electrical breakdown.

Please note that proof of purchase is required for any in-guarantee service calls.

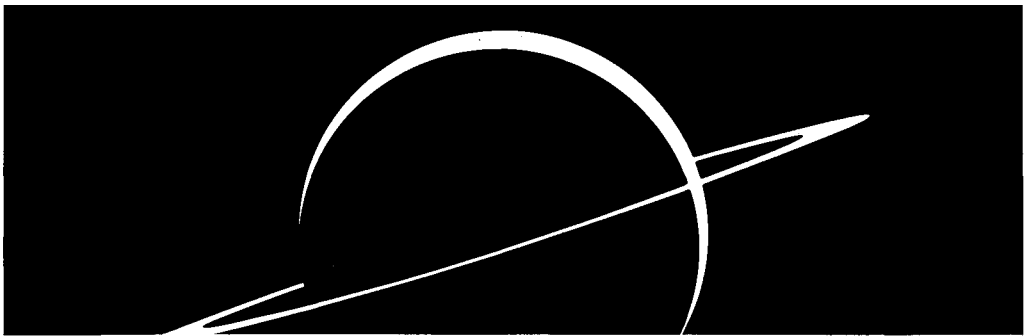
