POWER SUPPLY:

1. TFT LCD

2. Speaker

The speaker outputs high quality stereo sound.

3. ▼/ Button, ▲/ Button

 $\checkmark/44$: direction button and button for searching disc backward.

▲/**>**: direction button and button for searching disc forward.

4. ◀ /₩ Button and ▶ />> Button

- ◀ /◄<: direction button and button for play the previous track.
- ► /►): direction button and button for play the next track.

5. ENT Button

Press to access playback or confirm your selection.

6. **■**(Stop) Button

Press to stop playback. Then press I button to resume playback from the stopped spot. Press this button twice to stop playback completely.

7. ► (Play/Pause) Button

Press once to pause playback, then press it again to resume playback.

8. MENU Button

Press to display or cancel the disc menu.

9. TITLE Button

Press to display the title menu if it exists in the disc.

10. ZOOM Button

Press to activate the zoom function.

11. SETUP Button

Press to enter the player's system setup menu.

12.OPEN Button

Push to open the disc tray cover.

13. Remote Control Sensor

Receive signal from the remote control for operation.

14. Power Indicator

Light green when the player is on work; It turns red when the player is in standby mode.

15. Charge Indicator

Light is red when the battery is being charged; green when it is fully charged.

16. A-B /+ Button

A-B: Press to play a certain selected segment repeatedly.

+ Button: Press to increase the level of brightness, contrast and color.

17. SLOW / - Button

SLOW: Press to activate the slow playback function.

-Button: Press to decrease the level of brightness, contrast and color.

18. MODE Button

Press to change the level of brightness, contrast and color.

Press and hold for 1 to 2 seconds to change the aspect ratio between 16:9 and 4:3.

1. VOLUME Control

Used for adjusting the sound level of speakers and headphones.

2. Headphone Jack

When headphones are plugged in, the speakers automatically turn off. You may also use this jack to connect to an external amplifier or audio source.

3. AUDIO Input/Output Jack

Used for connecting to an external amplifier or audio source.

4. VIDEO Input/Output Jack

Used for connecting to an external monitor or video source.

5. AV IN/OUT Switch

Switch to IN, to input an external Audio/Video source. Switch to OUT when the player is connected to an external monitor.

6. DC 9.5V IN Jack

Used for connecting to power supply, including Car Adapter.


1. Headphone Jack

When the headphones are plugged into this unit, the speaker will turn off automatically.

2. Power ON/OFF Switch

Used to switching the power on or off.

Remote Control



1. POWER Button

Press to access standby mode or playback mode.

2. INFO Button

Press to display the detailed information of the disc during playing. Press this button again to exit from the information display.

3. TITLE Button

Press to display title menu if it exists

in the disc.

4. Direction Buttons

Press to select different options.

5. ENTER Button

Press to access playback, or confirm your selection.

6. SETUP Button

Press to enter the player's system setup.

Remote Control

7. 0-9 Number Buttons

Press to select an option in the menu.

8. KM PREV Button

Press to return to the previous list or the previous track or chapter. If it is a DVD disc, it needs to press this button twice to return to the previous track.

9. M NEXT Button

Press to skip to the next list, track or chapter.

10. SUBT Button

Press to select different subtitle languages if there are multiple subtitle languages existing in the disc.

11. ANGLE Button

Press to access various camera angles if the DVD disc contains multiple camera angles.

12. A-B Button

Press to play a section of the disc from point A to point B. Press once to select the starting point (A), press again to select the end point (B). In A-B repeat playback, press this button again to stop the repeat.

13. ZOOM Button

14. REP Button

Press to repeat a chapter, track, title, or the entire disc.

15. MENU Button

Display the actual DVD Disc Menu on screen in play mode.

16. PAUSE Button

Press to pause playback.

17. STOP Button

Press to stop playback. Then press the PLAY button to resume playback from the stopped spot. Press this button twice to stop playback completely.

18. PLAY Button

Press to begin to play.

19. GOTO Button

Press to select the desired disc starting time, track or title.

20. +10 Button

Press this button and the additional number buttons to select item numbers which are greater than 9.

21. → FWD SCAN Button

Press to search forward fast.

Press to search backward fast.

23. SLOW Button

Press to activate slow playback function.

24. AUDIO Button

Press to select different languages when a DVD disc which contains multiple audio languages is played. Press to select different audio track when a CD disc is played.

Remote Control

Installation Steps

Follow the steps below to install the battery.

Step1: Pull the battery holder out from the remote control in the direction of the arrow.



Step2: Load a new battery properly with the (+) sided up.



Step3: Insert the battery holder back into the original position.



Battery Property

Battery Type: CR2025 3V

Battery Life: Approximately 1 year under normal use (at room temperature).

Caution

- 1. Improper use of the battery may cause overheating, explosion or ignition, which can result in an injury or a fire. Battery leakage may damage the remote control.
- 2. Do not expose the remote control unit to direct sunlight.
- 3. Do not recharge, disassemble, deform or heat the battery.

System Connections

- Always ensure that the DVD player, TV and any other electrical equipment to be connected with are switched off and unplugged from the power supply.
- Ensure that you observe the color coding when connecting audio and video cables.



System Connections

Connecting to External AV Source

The player supports AV signal input function. Use the audio/video cable to connect the unit to an external AV signal source such as a DVD, VCR etc. After connecting, push AV IN/OUT switch on the right panel to switch to AV IN.

NOTE: Noise may occur in speakers when there is an external audio signal input while playing a DVD disc. Unplug the audio cord to clear the noise.



Connecting to Headphones

Connect headphones to the headphone jack on each side of the unit.



When headphone is connected, the speakers will turn off automatically.

Power Supply Preparation

Using the AC Adapter

The player is supplied with an AC adapter for powering the unit and charging the battery.

- Connect AC adapter to the right side of the DVD player in the jack marked "DC 9.5V IN", as shown on the right.
- Plug the two-prong end of the power cord into a grounded electrical outlet. The power indicator will turn red.




NOTE: Please turn the player's power off before unplugging.

Using of Car Adapter

The player is supplied with a Car Adapter for powering the unit and charging the battery while in a vehicle.

Connect the Car Adapter Power Plug to the unit's power jack and plug the other end to the vehicle's 12V accessory/cigarette socket, as shown on the right figure.



Attention

- > Do not operate the unit or view video software while driving a vehicle.
- Place the unit in a proper position for viewing.
- > Detach the battery pack when using the AC or car adapter as power source.
- > Disconnect the player from the Car Adapter when starting the vehicle.

Rechargeable Battery

About Rechargeable Battery Pack

Your portable DVD player comes with a lithium ion rechargeable battery that attaches to the rear of the DVD player. Charge the battery fully before initial use. Charging time is normally about 5 hours. A fully charged battery delivers about 3 hours of use, but playing time varies from disc to disc. If the battery will not be used for a long period of time, fully charge the battery prior to storage.

Working conditions and precautions for the rechargeable battery

- New batteries should be fully charged before initial use.
- Battery should only be used and charged when temperatures are between 32-100F.
- Never put the battery in fire or water.
- Do not expose the battery to high temperatures or store in hot, sunny places.
- > Maintain well-ventilated conditions around the product to avoid overheating.
- Don't put the product on a bed, sofa or anything that may block ventilation to the product.
- Do not short the battery terminals.
- Do not open the battery.
- Detach the battery after charging is complete. When charging the battery pack, the charge light will turn red, when the charging is complete, the light will turn green.
- Detach the battery when it is not in use.
- When the battery is weak, "will appear on the LCD screen and about five minutes later, the player will power OFF automatically.

WARNING


Do not touch any metal objects to the battery connectors, as it will make the battery in standby mode. To exit the standby mode, connect the battery and DVD player to AC or DC power.

Rechargeable Battery

Attaching the Battery Pack

Refer to the following steps for attaching the Battery Pack:

- 1. Make sure the player is off and the AC or car adapter is disconnected.
- 2. Place the DVD player on a soft and smooth surface.
- With one hand on the DVD player to prevent it from moving, take the battery and align the plastic tabs on the battery pack with holes on the player, and push the battery pack into the DVD player.
- 4. The battery pack will click into place.



Charging the Battery Pack

The battery pack must be attached to the DVD player to charge it using the supplied AC or car power adapter.

- 1. Attach the battery pack to the DVD player, as shown above.
- Plug the supplied AC Power Adapter into the player's power jack marked" DC 9.5V IN", located on the right side of the DVD player.
- Plug the other end of the AC Power Adapter Cord into a household AC Outlet as shown below.



Rechargeable Battery

Detaching the Battery Pack

If the DVD Player is not going to be used for long periods of time, the battery pack should first be fully charged and then detached. When the DVD Player is turned OFF, the DVD player is still consuming some power in STANDBY mode. This will eventually discharge the battery.

Make sure the power is turned OFF and the AC or Car Adapter is disconnected before detaching the Battery Pack.

To detach the Battery Pack:

- 1. Push the battery pack latch toward the rear of the player and slide the rechargeable battery from the main unit (see drawings below).
- 2. Store the rechargeable battery in a safe place.

Care of Discs

Holding Discs

Do not touch the playing surfaces when loading or removing discs.



Cleaning

Fingerprints or stains on the disc may affect the quality of sound and picture. Clean your discs using a soft clean cloth to wipe them. If necessary, moisten the cloth with mild soapy water to remove heavy dirt or fingerprints.



Do not wipe in a circular direction. Concentric scratches on the disc tend to result in noise. Gently wipe from the center of the disc to the $\,$ outer edge.



PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE USING YOUR DVD PLAYER FOR THE FIRST TIME.

WARNING: Only use high quality discs, poor quality discs could damage the player's lens.

Pre-operation

- 1. Connect the unit to power supply through the provided AC adaptor.
- 2. Switch "POWER ON/OFF" to "ON" on the left panel to turn on the DVD player. The main unit power indicator light is green and screen displays an initial image.
- 3. Push OPEN button on the unit to open the disc tray cover, put a disc in the disc tray with printed side facing up. Close the disc cover. (See below)




- 4. The player will search disc and play it automatically.
- 5. Adjust the volume with the VOLUME control on the right panel to the desired level.
- 6. To turn the player off, switch the "POWER ON/OFF" on the left panel to "OFF".




Pre-operation

- 1. Load a Picture CD disc in the disc tray, the player will read the disc automatically.
- The screen displays the Root Folder with several subdirectories/subfolders. Use ▲, ▼ direction buttons to select a desired folder. (See page 36). Then you can press any of the following button to confirm your selection: ▶, ENTER, PLAY (on the remote control), ▶II, ENT, (on the front panel),
- The screen enters the selected subfolder with several files. Use ▲ , ▼ direction buttons
 to select the desired file. Then press ENTER button on remote control or ► button on
 front panel to confirm your selection and the player starts playing.
- 4. In the folder mode, press ◆ button to return to last folder or directory. Or move the yellow light bar to ______, then press ENTER button on the remote control or ▶ button on front panel to confirm.

NOTE: Many discs have other items besides pictures.



To set up your system:

- 1. Press the SETUP button on the remote control.
- 2.The setup menu will appear on the screen. It includes General Setup Page, Speaker Setup page, Dolby Digital Setup, Video Setup Page and Preference Page. You can exit from the setup menu by pressing SETUP button again at any time during setting.
- 3. Press or ▶ (direction buttons) to select a sub-menu to set up.
- Press ▲ or ▼ (direction buttons) buttons to select the item that you want to set up in the sub-menu.



Press ▲ or ▼ button to highlight this item. Press ENTER to reset.

Then all the settings of your unit are back to the original state.

Definitions

Letterbox Screen

This refers to a screen on which the playback picture of wide-screen DVDs appears with black bands running along the top and bottom.

Pan & Scan Screen

This refers to a screen on which the playback picture of wide-screen DVDs is cut off at the left and right sides.

Title, Chapter (DVD)

DVDs are divided into some large sections (titles) or some small sections (chapters). Each section is numbered: these numbers are called "Title number" or "Chapter number".


Track (CD)

JPEG

JPEG is a common picture format that has small file size and low quality loss rate of picture. Hundreds of pictures can be stored in a disc in this format. In order to utilize real digital album, use film to make a "PICTURE CD" in JPEG format.
