2 IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

Warning: To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not expose this TV set to rain or moisture.

LOCATION

Place the TV set on a flat, level surface and in a dry area free from dust and moisture. Do not place the unit in direct sunlight, or where it would be affected by smoke, steam, vibration or heat from heat radiating appliances. To prevent excessive internal temperature rise, place the unit so that there is at least 15 cm of space between it and the surrounding walls.

FIRE AND SHOCK PRECAUTIONS

- Adequate ventilation must be provided to prevent heat build up inside unit. Keep the inside of unit free from foreign objects, such as hairpins, nails, paper, etc. Do not build the set into a bookcase or other enclosures in which it would be poorly ventilated. Do not place it on carpet or a bed as low ventilation holes could become obstructed.
- Do not set liquids, including flower vases and vessels filled with chemicals or water etc., on top of the unit as liquid could
 get inside the unit. If a hazardous object falls inside the TV set, unplug it immediately and call a qualified technician for
 removal.
- When placing or moving the TV set, take care to insure that the power cord is fitted into the allocated slot. To avoid damage to the power cord, never allow heavy objects such as the TV set itself to be placed on the power cord. Keep cord away from heat radiating appliances. Do not allow cord to become knotted or tangled. Do not lengthen the cord. When removing the power plug from the socket, always hold onto the plug, never pull by the cord.

WARNING

- Do not remove the back cover of the TV set. Accidental contact with high voltage components could result in electric shock. When internal adjustment is necessary, please contact your distributor.
- If your set produces sound but no picture, or it emits smoke or produces a strange sound or smell, continued operation is dangerous. Immediately turn off power and remove the power plug from the socket and contact your distributor.
- During vacation or other occasions when you will not be using the set for an extended period, remove the power plug from the socket.
- This appliance should not be operated by children or infirm persons without adequate supervision.

CUSTOMER NOTICE

If a continual DISCOLOURATION or a COLOURED PATCH appears on your picture image, it may be caused by one of the following..

- External speakers placed near to the TV.
- Vacuum cleaners switched ON or OFF near the TV.
- Moving or rotating the position of the TV while it is turned on.
- The TV has been left in the STANDBY mode for some period of time, without being turned OFF using the front panel power button.


If this happens then...

- 1. Switch OFF the TV by using the FRONT PANEL POWER button.
- 2. Leave the TV switch OFF for at least 20 minutes.
- 3. Then switch ON the TV using the FRONT PANEL POWER button.

Note: You may need to repeat steps 1, 2 and 3 for the best result.

3 Television Installation Connect antenna or video facility

- 1.Use 75 Ω coaxial cable plug or 300-75 Ω impedance converter to plug in antenna input terminal on the rear of the cabinet.
- 2. Connect the video facility to the audio, video in jack on the rear of the cabinet.




Battery installation and replacement for remote control unit.


 75Ω coaxial cable

The remote control unit uses two 1.5v AAA batteries. For battery installation and replacement see as follows:


- Turn the remote control unit upside down. Press down the grip of the battery compartment and slide the cover in the direction of the arrow.
- Install two new batteries, make sure that battery polarity matches with the (+)(-) marks inside the compartment, otherwise it would damage the unit.




Close the battery compartment cover.





6 CONTROL YOUR TV

6-1 MAIN Power ON/OFF



This switch will turn the television ON/OFF totally.




With Mains status On, you can also turn off using Remote Control Hand Set.


This status is called Stand-By mode.

In this mode:

- ※ The TV has an Automatic Power OFF function. With No Signal condition, the TV will automatically turn OFF after 10 min.

Direct Access Tuning


Using the numeric keys on Remote Control Hand Piece, Channels can be selected directly.






By pushing this key, sound output will be muted. Push [MUTE] again, or Volume Up/Down, and sound Volume will return.



This key will call the On screen display.





7 Tuning procedure

7-1 Auto Search Function: Automatic Search and Memory (ASM) is available for program installation from Antenna input.

- Using[MENU]key on the front or [MENU] key on the Remote for ASM.
 - A. Push [MENU] key repeatedly to select "PRESET"
 - B. Push [P+] or [P-] key, to select "ASM"
 - C. Push [V+] or [V-] key, to start ASM . and memorize into program list (0~129).
 - D. Wait until function has finished.



7-2 SEARCH

- A. Push [MENU] key repeatedly to select "PRESET".
- B. Using [P+] or [P-] key, select "POSITION".Using [V+] or [V-] or numeric keys to change POSITION Number.
- C. Push [P+] or [P-] key to select "BAND".

 Push [V+] or [V-] key to change BAND.
- D. Push [P+] or [P-] key to select "SEARCH".
- E. Push [V+] or [V-] key to start search.
- F. Wait until function has finished.

7-3 FINE TUNING

- A. Push [MENU] key repeatedly to select "PRESET".
- B. Using [P+] or [P-] key, select "POSITION".

 Using [V+] or [V-] change POSITION.
- C. Using [P+] or [P-] key, select "FINE TUNING".
- D. Using [V+] or [V-] key, adjust for best tuning.

7-4 AFT Function: Automatic Fine Tuning Keep Tuning at the best position., always.

- A. Push [MENU] key repeatedly to select "PRESET".
- B. Using [P+] or [P-] key, select "AFT", Using [V+] or [V-] key, to set AFT ON or OFF.

7-5 SKIP Function: Use to "SKIP" Channels. After setting to "ON", the channel will not be selected by Channel Up/Down keys.



7-6 SWAP Function: Program Number and Channel exchange

- A. Push [MENU] key repeatedly to select "PRESET".
- B. Using [P+] or [P-] key, select "SWAP". Using [V+] or [V-] key, enter to SWAP.
- C. Using [P+] or [P-] key, select "PROGRAM A" or "PROGRAM B" .
- D. Using [V+] or [V-] key or numeric keys, change "PROGRAM A №" or "PROGRAM B №".
- E. Pushing [P+] or [P-] key, select "EXCHANGE" Push [V+] or [V-] key repeatedly until "OK" is displayed on screen. PROGRAM A and PROGRAM B are exchanged.




PROGRAM EXCHANGE

PROGRAM A PROGRAM B EXCHANGE


8 Menu Operation

8-1 [MENU] key on front

TV mode: Push [MENU] key continuously, to scroll through the MENU selection, as follows.




AV mode: Push [MENU] key continuously, to scroll through the MENU selection, as follows.



8-2 [MENU] key on the remote handset

TV mode : [MENU] key selects as follows:



8-3 TIME

(The ON/OFF timer cannot be set unless the clock has already been set.)

- A. Select "TIME" with the [MENU] key.Using the [P+]/[P-] key, select the item.
- B. Using the [P+]/[P-] key, select "CLOCK", "OFF-TIME" or "ON-TIME"
- C. Using the [V+] key, minutes will increase from "00" to "59".Using the [V-] key, hours will increase as follows;"0,1...23,--: --"
- D. Using [P+]/[P-] keys, select "POSITION"Using [V+]/[V-] keys, change POSITION.
- E. Using [P+]/[P-] keys, select "ALARM"Using [V+]/[V-] keys, ALARM timer can be set.


After presetting, preset time has come, alarm symbol will be displayed on screen.


The timer can be set "0" to "90" Minutes.

8-4 SETUP

Setup your TV as your favorite

- A. Using the [MENU] key, select SETUP.Using the [P+]/[P-] keys, select the item.
- B. Using [P+]/[P-] keys, select "BLUE BACK" or "C-SYS".
- C. Using the [V+] or [V-] keys, change to ON or OFF.
- D. Pushing [P+]/[P-], select "C-SYS".Using the [V+]/[V-] keys, the colour system will be changed as follow:





8-5 PICTURE MENU Function: Brightness, Contrast, Colour Sharpness, Tint




A. By pushing the key, Picture Menu will appear.

B. Select each function using the [P+]/[P-] keys.

C. Each value can be controlled by the [V+]/[V-] keys.

D. Repeat any functions if required.



NOTE: TINT control will be appeared only if a NTSC signal is being received.

8-6 SOUND MENU

Function: Bass, Treble, Balance.




A. By pushing the key, Sound Menu will appear.

B. Select each function using the [P+]/[P-] keys.

C. Each value can be controlled by the [V+]/[V-] keys.

D. Repeat any functions if required.



9 Trouble Shooting

Before arranging for service, firstly know the status and then check simply as follows:

No picture or sound.	Check if the power supply is plugged in.

No TV signal.	Check if the TV/AV button is not set to TV status.

Picture lacks colour or picture	Check colour, brightness and contrast controls are correctly adjusted.
