






If you're using the Big League Baseball Encyclopedia™ for the first time, read this section.

Install the Digital Book

You must install the Big League Baseball Encyclopedia™ before you can use it.

- 1. Turn the Digital Book System off.
- Insert the Big League Baseball Encyclopedia[™] in a slot on the back.



Align the book's tabs with the notches in the slot. Then snap the book in place.

3. Press ON/OFF).


? Protecting Information

Installing a digital book while the Digital Book System is on may erase information that you entered in the other installed digital book.

Adjust the Contrast

After you've installed the Big League Baseball Encyclopedia™, you can adjust the screen contrast at any time.

1. Turn the contrast wheel on the left side of the Digital Book System.



2. If the screen is still blank, check the batteries.


Resuming Where You Left Off



There are two ways to request stats using the Big League Baseball Encyclopedia™.

A request specifies which stats you wish to see. You can enter requests for stats at the Request l ine



The Request Line

Or you can select items from the menus. To see the main menu, press MENU





Understanding Menus


Use 🗘 or 🖒 to highlight the menu you wish to view.

To select a menu item highlight it, then press ENTER



Following the Arrows

When viewing stats, you'll see arrows at the top right of Big League Baseball's screen:

Learn About The Stats

To enter a request you need to learn the stats.

Simple Requests



This section shows the simplest ways to find stats by player, team and league.

Finding Players' Stats

In this example, we'll find batting and other stats for Hank Aaron.

1. At the Request Line, type a players' name. Then press ENTER.

```
Type your request...
hank aaron_
...then press GME
```

To erase letters, press 🔄.

2. Press to see the player's full name and handedness, on the top line.



3. Press repeatedly to see his date of birth, weight, height, and position (s) played.



You can press plus to zoom to the left.

4. Press 😃 to see his career batting stats.



To see more career stats, press 🖒.

5. Press 🕕 repeatedly to see his annual stats.



6. When you're done, press CLEAR).



Viewing Pitcher's Stats

To see career and annual stats for a pitcher, type a name at the Request Line. Then press (ENTER).



To see pitcher's batting stats (if he batted), press (MORE).



More About Entering Players' Names

- You can enter players by their first name and last name, last name and first name, or last name alone (e.g., MEL OTT, OTT MEL, or OTT). It is best to type the first name first.
- •If you misspell a name, or if you enter a name shared by more than one player, you'll see a list of players.
- •You can enter a players' nickname. If you type in a nickname, you will see a list of players.

Press to move down the list. When the player you want is highlighted press ENTER



Viewing the Stats

To view a player's biographical stats, highlight the player's name and use the (to scroll to the right. Zoom to the left before trying to view the player's career and annual stats.

To see a player's career and annual stats, highlight the line you wish to view, and scroll to the right.

Finding Team Stats

To find teams' annual batting and pitching stats, enter a team and a year. You can enter a team's name, city, or city abbreviation.

In this example, we'll find the stats for the 1986 New York Mets.

 At the Request Line, type a team name and a year. Then press ENTER.

```
Type your request...
mets 1986
...then press (RH2)
```

To type the year, press plus the numbered keys. If you don't enter a year, you'll see the team's first-year stats.

You can also type **mets 86**, **86 mets** or **1986 mets**.

2. Press 🖒 to see the team batting stats.



3. Press repeatedly to see individual batting stats.



To see more batting stats, press .

4. Press MORE to see team pitching stats.



To see more pitching stats, press 🖒.

- 5. Press repeatedly to see team member's pitching stats.
- 6. When you're done, press CLEAR.



At team stats, you can see the following year's stats by pressing plus or those of previous years by pressing plus .



Moving From Team to Player Stats

At team stats, you can see players' career and annual stats simply by pressing ENTER when their names are highlighted.

To return to team stats, press (BACK).



Typing Numbers and Years

To type years, first press the and then press a number. Hold down the to type more than one number.

When entering years, if you enter two digits Big League Baseball assumes the twentieth century (e.g., 69 means 1969).

To enter a nineteenth century year, type all four digits (e.g., 1892).

Finding League Standings


League standings include won/lost percentages and games behind first place.

In this example, we'll find the National League standings for 1992.

1. At the Request Line, type nl 1992. Then press ENTER.

Type a space between the league and year. To type the year, press plus the number keys.


2. Press J to see the NL East standings.



Eastern division records are shown before the Western division

Press to see each teams won/lost percentage and games behind.

4. Press repeatedly to see the NL West standings.



- 5. To see teams' won/lost percentage and games behind, press ♣.
- 6. When you're done, press (CLEAR).

More About Standings

- •At league standings, you can see the following year's standings by pressing plus vip. To see the previous year, press plus plus vip.
- You can find teams' won/lost records and winning percentages over seasons by entering their league and a year range.

For example, enter AL 1937-64.

•Also at league standings, you can see team stats by pressing ENTER when a team is highlighted.

Finding League Standings



Bad Requests

If you see the "Bad Request" message, check the following:

- that you typed correct stat abbreviations and spaces between each element in your request,
- that your ratio doesn't mix batting and pitching stats or contain a ratio itself, or
 that your request contains no more than
- that your request contains no more than two limiters.

In this example, we'll find the 1992 World Series results.

- 1. At the Request Line, press MENU .
- 2. Under Requests, select World Series.
 Then press ENTER.



3. Type a year. Then press **ENTER**

World Series and Award Winners



4. To see more stats press the arrow keys.



To see the Series results for the following year, press \bigcirc plus $\stackrel{\text{DN}}{\smile}$. To see the previous year's results, press \bigcirc plus $\stackrel{\text{LP}}{\smile}$.

5. To see more stats on a specific game, highlight the game. Then press **ENTER**



To see the line scores for the other games, press $\bigcirc + \bigcirc$ + \bigcirc $\bigcirc + \bigcirc$.

6. When you're done, press CLEAR.



Allstar Game Results

Includes date, complete line score, pitchers, and attendance. If you don't type a year, you will see the stats for the first All-star game ever played in 1933.



Award Winners

Includes NL Most Valuable Player (NL MVP), AL Most Valuable Player (AL MVP), NL Rookie of the Year (NL ROY) and AL Rookie of the Year (AL ROY).

Not all of these awards are listed for every year. You'll only see ROY listed from 1947 on as this was the first year it was given.



Finding Hall of Fame Players

To find Hall of Fame players (HOF), type HOF at the Request Line.
Then press ENTER.

Players are listed in order of years that they played. The last to play are listed first.



Finding First Time Players

To find all the first time players of a given year, and their first-year stats, simply type a year (e.g., 1939) and press ENTER.

Press \bigcirc plus $\stackrel{\text{DN}}{\smile}$ to see the next player. To see the previous one \bigcirc + $\stackrel{\text{LP}}{\smile}$.

First time players are listed alphabetically by year.



Birthdays

To find all players born on a date select Birthdays under the Request menu.



Type in a date. Then press ENTER

To find all players born on a certain day (e.g., 08/18), don't fill in a year.

Press SPEC to type a backslash (/).

Best and Worst Batting Stats

You find the all-time best and worst hitters by entering MAX or MIN at the Request Line followed by a stat abbreviation.

You can enter your request by typing it or by using the menus. In this example, we'll find the player with the most career hits.

Type the Request

1. At the Request Line, type max h. Then press ENTER.

```

...then press (CH2)
```

2. Press 🕠 to move down the list.

- 3. Press ENTER when a player's name is highlighted to see their career stats.
- 4. When you're done, press (CLEAR).

1. At the Request Line, press MENU .

Viewing Player Lists

Player lists contain up to 30 players. To zoom to the top or bottom of a list, press plus or or . To see a player's career stats, press ENTER when his name is highlighted.



Viewing the Menus

There are five menus that you can use.

- •The **Focus** menus lets you focus requests.
- •The **Other** menu lets you view a demo or set the shutoff time.
- •The **Qualifiers** menu lets you add qualifiers to requests without typing them.
- •The **Request** menu lets you enter player or team requests.
- •The **Stats** menu lets you add batting or pitching stats to requests.

Select a menu item by highlighting it, then pressing (ENTER).

Best and Worst Pitching Stats

In this example, we'll find the pitchers with the most career wins.

Type the Request

1. At the Request Line, type max w. Then press ENTER.

2. Press J to move down the list.



3. When you're done, press CLEAR .

Or Use the Menus

- 1. At the Request Line, press MENU
- 2. Under Request, select Maximum. Then press (ENTER).
- 3. Press (MENU).



4. Under Stats, select Pitching Statistic.
Then press ENTER.



- 5. Under Stats, select Won. Then press ENTER
- 6. Press (ENTER) to see the results.
- 7. Press 🕕 to move down the list.
- 8. When you're done, press CLEAR.



Biggest, Smallest, Shortest, Tallest

You can request player lists using the biographical stats: HT, WT, and AGE. For example, enter "MAX WT" to see baseball's all-time heavyweights.



Using the MORE key

When you enter a player's name, Big League Baseball Encyclopedia™ shows batting stats if the player batted for more seasons than he pitched. If he pitched for an equal number or more seasons than he batted, you see his pitching stats.

How do you see a pitcher's batting stats, if he has any? Try this example:

- 1. At the Request Line, type **steve carlton**.
- 2. Press ENTER and then use the arrows to see his pitching stats.
- 3. Press MORE to see his batting stats.
- To return to his pitching stats, press MORE again.

To see a batter's pitching stats, follow the same steps. Try **babe ruth** as an example.

Requests with Ratios

A ratio is one stat divided by another. You can type a ratio after MAX or MIN in your requests.

However, you can't

- divide a batting stat by a pitching stat or vice versa (e.g., AB/IP), or
- use stats in ratios that are already ratios (i.e., BA, ERA, SLG).

In this example, we'll find the players with the most home runs per at-bat.

Type the Request

1. At the Request Line, type max hr/ab.
Then press (ENTER).



Press SPEC to type a backslash (/).

2. Press J or 🖒 to see more stats.



3. When you're done, press CLEAR.

Or Use the Menus

- 1. At the Request Line, press MENU.
- 2. Under Request, select Maximum. Then press ENTER.
- 3. Press MENU.
- 4. Under Stats, select Batting Statistics. Then press ENTER.



- 5. Select Home Runs. Then press ENTER.
- 6. Press (MENU)



- 7. Under Focus, select Make a Ratio (/).
 Then press (ENTER).
- 8. Press (MENU).



- 9. Under Stats, select At Bats. Then press ENTER.
- 10. Press ENTER
- 11. Press the arrow keys to see more stats.
- 12. When you're done, press **CLEAR**.



About Infinite Ratios


The value of a ratio is infinite when its denominator is zero. For example, if you enter MAX W/L, you'll see this:



INF means that Ben Shields never lost a game.

When you type requests with ratios, you'll often want to limit the denominator to see players with significant at-bats, innings pitched, etc. See "Adding a Limiter" to learn how.

Advanced Requests



This section shows how to add limiters and qualifiers to your requests.

Adding a Limiter

To limit the statistical range of your player requests, type a limiter after MAX or MIN and the stat or ratio. Limiters always have this structure:

a stat or ratio + GT or LT + a number

GT means greater than, LT less than.

In this example, we'll find the players with the most home runs who have a career batting average less than .250.

Type a Request

1. Type max hr ba lt .250. Then press (ENTER).

```
Type your request...
max hr ba 1t .250
...then press (RIE)
```

2. Press the indicated arrow keys to see more.




3. When you're done, press CLEAR.

Or Use the Menus

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Under Requests, select Maximum. Then press ENTER.
- 3. Press (MENU).
- 4. Under Stats, select Batting Statistics. Then press ENTER.
- 5. Select Home Runs. Then press ENTER.
- 6. Press (MENU).



7. Under Focus, select Add a Limiter.
Then press (ENTER).



- 8. Select Batting Average. Then press (ENTER)
- 9. Press MENU.



- 10. Under Focus, select Less Than.
 Then press (ENTER).
- 11. Type . 250. Then press ENTER .
- 12. Press (ENTER) to see the results.



Understanding Limiters

- Each limiter must begin with its own stat abbreviation or ratio, even when that stat or ratio is the same as the one following MAX or MIN. For example, to see the players with the most home runs, who have at least 500 home runs, you would enter "MAX HR HR GT 499." Notice the second HR
- When you're limiting a ratio, you'll usually want to limit the denominator. For example, to see the players with the best home-runto-at-bats ratio who have at least 1000 career at-bats, enter "MAX HR/AB AB GT 1000."



Limiting Biographical Stats

Type weights in pounds, heights in inches (e.g., 74 for players who are 6' 2"), and ages in years.

Ages are based on birthdays before or after July 1. So, a player who was 24 at season's start, and was born on June 30, is considered a 24 year old for the entire season.



Including Pitchers

Pitchers with no at-bats aren't included in biographical requests. To include them, add a P to your request (e.g., MAX WT P). You must also add a P to specify hits (H), strikeouts (SO) and bases on balls (BB) allowed by a pitcher (e.g., MAX H P).

Limiting By Team

To narrow your lists to a single team, add a team limiter to your requests. Team limiters can be a team's name, city, or city abbreviation.

You can type only one team limiter in a request. If you type a team that has had more than one home city, or a city with more than one team, you'll see a list of team choices.

In this example, we'll find the Yankee all-time RBI leader.

Type a Request

 At the Request Line, type max rbi yankees. Then press ENTER.

2. Use the indicated arrows to see more stats.

Player	
DiMaggio, Joe	1537
DiMaggio, Joe Mantle, Mickey	1589

3. When you're done, press CLEAR.

Or Use the Menus

- 1. At the Request Line, press MENU.

 Under Requests, select Maximum. Then press ENTER).
- 2. Press MENU . Under Stats, select Batting Statistics. Then press ENTER
- 3. Select Runs Batted In. Then press ENTER .
- 4. Press MENU



- Under Focus, select Limit by Team. Then press ENTER.
- 6. Type in yankees.
- 7. Press (ENTER) to see the results.



The player stats that you see aren't necessarily their career totals. To find career stats, press ENTER when a player's name is highlighted.

Limiting by Year


You can add a year limiter to your requests. Here are some examples:

Year Limiters	<u>Examples</u>
a single year	1969
a starting year	1945-
an ending year	-1900
a year range	1980–89

In this example, we'll find the pitchers with the most strike outs from 1980-1989.

Type a Request

1. Type max so p 1980-1989. Then press (ENTER).



To type a year, press and then the number keys.

2. Use the indicated arrows to see more stats.



3. When you're done, press (CLEAR).

Or Use the Menus

- 1. At the Request Line, press MENU.
- 2. Under Request, select Maximum. Then press (ENTER).
- 3. Press MENU.
- 4. Under Stats, select Pitching Statistics. Then press ENTER.



- 5. Select Strike Outs. Then press (ENTER)
- 6. Press (MENU).

- 7. Under Qualifiers, select Pitcher. Then press (ENTER).
- 8. Press (BACK).
- 9. Press MENU .

- 12. Press (ENTER) to see the results.
- 13. When you're done, press CLEAR

Adding Qualifiers


You can also narrow your lists by adding one or more qualifiers to your requests.

<u>Qualifier</u>	<u>Meaning</u>
AL, NL	American or National League
BR, BL, BS	Bats right, left, or switch hitter
HOF, NHOF	Hall of Famers or not
QUAL	Qualifiers for league leader titles
Р	Pitchers (with H, BB, SO,WT,
	HT, AGE)
SS	Any single season
TR, TL	Throws right or left

In this example, you will find the right-handed batter who is not in the Hall of Fame but who hit the most home runs.

Type the Request

1. At the Request Line, type max hr br nl nhof. Then press ENTER.



2. Press the arrows to see more stats.



3. When you're done, press CLEAR).

Or Use the Menus

- 1. At the Request Line, press MENU.
- 2. Under Requests, select Maximum. Then press ENTER.
- 3. Press (MENU).
- 4. Under Stats, select Batting Statistics. Then press ENTER.
- 5. Select Home Runs. Then press ENTER.
- 6. Press (MENU).



7. Under Qualifiers, select Bats Right.
Then press ENTER.



- Under Qualifiers, select Not Hall of Fame and National League.
- 9. Press (BACK).
- 10. Press (ENTER) to see the results.



Using Other Qualifiers

- P narrows your list requests to pitchers only.
 You can type P only in requests with H,
 SO, BB, WT, HT, or AGE. After biographical
 stats, P includes pitchers who have never
 batted. After H (hits), SO (strike outs) and BB
 (bases on balls), P specifies the number of
 each stat given up by a pitcher.
- SS narrows requests to single season totals.
- QUAL narrows requests to players with enough at-bats or innings pitched to qualify for the annual league leader titles in the various statistical categories. You may want to combine QUAL with SS in your requests.

Digital Book System

Installing & Removing Digital Books

To install a digital book, **first turn off your Digital Book System**. Then align the digital book's tabs with the notches in either book slot on the back and snap the book into the slot. If you install only one book, it doesn't matter which slot you use. But make sure that the book's metal contacts are facing down.

To remove a book, first turn off the Digital Book System. Then compress the book's tab and lift the book from the slot.

Restarting the Digital Book System

If the keyboard fails to respond or the screen performs erratically, first press CLEAR and then press ON/OFF. If nothing happens, hold CLEAR and press ON/OFF. If nothing happens still, press the recessed reset button on the back of your Digital Book System using a paper clip.

If you install or remove digital books when the Digital Book System is on, or when you reset the Digital Book System, you may erase information that you entered in the installed digital books.

Switching Between Digital Books

- 1. With two digital books installed, press (CARD).
- 2. Highlight a symbol by pressing 🖒 or 🗘 .
 Then press ENTER .

To return to the first book, repeat these steps.

Sending Words Between Books

Some digital books can send and receive words from other digital books.

- Highlight a word in a digital book.
 Read its User's Manual to learn how.
- 2. Hold and press CARD
- 3. Highlight the other digital book's symbol. Then press ENTER.

You see its main display. You may have to press <a>ENTER again to look up the word.

Replacing the Batteries

Your unit uses CR2032 lithium batteries. Before replacing them, have four new batteries ready.

- 1. Turn your Digital Book System off.
- Remove the battery cover on the back.Then remove all batteries.
- 3. Promptly slide two new batteries into the battery cavity with the metal clip over it.
 - Don't bend the clip; it's an electrical contact. And make sure the batteries' plus (+) signs face up.
- Slide two new batteries into the other cavity. Then replace the battery cover.
 - To prevent deleting information from installed digital books:
 - Always replace the batteries before they lose all power, and never remove the batteries while the Digital Book System is on.
 - Never mix old and new batteries. And, once batteries have been removed, install new ones within two minutes.

Protecting the Digital Book System

- Don't touch the metal contacts on the back of your digital books or the rubber contacts in the book slots of the Digital Book System. CAUTION: Touching the contacts with statically charged objects, including your fingers, could erase information that you entered in your installed digital books.
- Don't put excessive pressure or weight on your digital books or Digital Book System.
- Don't expose your digital books to extreme or prolonged heat, cold, or other adverse conditions.

When you're not using your Digital Book System, keep two digital books or dummy books in its slots to prevent dust build-up.

Cleaning the Digital Book System

To clean the digital books, apply isopropyl alcohol with cotton swab.

To clean the Digital Book System, apply a mild household cleaner onto a soft cloth. **CAUTION:** Spraying liquids directly on your Digital Book System could damage its circuitry.
