Installation, Care, and Service

Installation

Follow these recommendations and precautions and heed all warnings when installing your TV:

15) Never modify this equipment. Changes or modifications may void: a) the warranty, and b) the user's authority to operate this equipment under the rules of the Federal Communications Commission.

DAMAGE! Never place the TV on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The TV may fall, causing serious personal injury, death, or serious damage to the TV.



- 17) Never place or store the TV in direct sunlight; hot, humid areas; areas subject to excessive dust or vibration; or locations with temperatures at or below 41°F (5°C).
- Always place the TV on the floor or a sturdy, level, stable surface that can support the weight of the unit.




19) Never place items such as vases, aquariums, or candles on top of the TV.



- 20) Never block or cover the slots or openings in the TV cabinet back, bottom, and sides. Never place the TV:
 - on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface;
 - too close to drapes, curtains, or walls; or
 - in a confined space such as a bookcase, built-in cabinet, or any other place with poor ventilation.

The slots and openings are provided to protect the TV from overheating and to help maintain reliable operation of the TV.






- 21) Never allow anything to rest on or roll over the power cord, and never place the TV where the power cord is subject to wear or abuse.
- 22) Never overload wall outlets and extension cords.



23) Always operate this equipment from a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power source only.



24) Always make sure the antenna system is properly grounded to provide adequate protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges (see Section 810 of the National Electric Code).



25) DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH!

• Use extreme care to make sure you are never in a position where your body (or any item you are in contact with, such as a ladder or screwdriver) can accidentally touch overhead power lines. Never locate the antenna near overhead power lines or other electrical circuits.



Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 26) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.
- 27) Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



WARNING: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK!

Never spill liquids or push objects of any kind into the TV cabinet slots.

- 29) [*This item applies to projection TVs only*.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.
- 30) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.
- 31) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.
- 32) Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube: If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY. Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:
 - **Fixed Images**, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
 - **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).

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Introduction

Welcome to Toshiba

Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.


This manual applies to models 32AFX62 and 36AFX62. Before you start reading, check your model number by looking at the rear of the TV.


Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You can also use the controls on the TV if they have the same name as those on the remote control.

Please read all the safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep the manual for future reference.

Exploring your new TV

You can operate your TV using the buttons on the front panel or the remote control. The back panel and front panel (behind the door) provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other equipment to your TV.





Connecting your TV

Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- **Coaxial cable** is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- Standard stereo A/V cables usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. Your TV's standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-Video cable is for use with video equipment that has S-Video connectors.
- Component video cables come in sets of three (typically color-coded red, green, and blue), and are for use with video equipment that has component video connectors. Your TV's ColorStream[®] (component video) inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.

NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:


- For GOOD picture quality: Use a standard yellow video cable.
- For BETTER picture quality: If your equipment has S-video connectors, use an S-video cable *instead of* a standard yellow video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect a standard yellow video cable at the same time* or the picture performance will be unacceptable.)
- For BEST picture quality: If your equipment has component video connectors, use component video cables *instead of* a standard yellow video cable or S-video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection.)


Connecting a VCR


This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables







Caution:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable instead of a standard video cable.

Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.


Connecting a cable converter box

This connection allows you to watch cable and premium channels.

To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels, select ANT-2 and tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), then use the converter box to change channels. You will need:


When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

Connecting a cable converter box and VCR

This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, watch videotapes, and record one TV channel while watching another TV channel. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels or record with the VCR, select ANT-2, change the TV channel to 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and then use the converter box to change channels.

You will need:

- one two-way cable signal splitter
- four coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables



Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable instead of a standard video cable. Do not connect a standard video cable and an Svideo cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

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
Connecting

Connecting a DVD player or satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, and TV programs. You can record one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two (or three, if satellite receiver is used) coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one S-video cable
- one pair of standard audio cables



Note:

For the highest possible picture quality from a DVD player or satellite receiver that does not have component video connections, use an S-video cable between the TV and DVD player or satellite receiver. If your DVD

player or satellite receiver is component video compatible, see "Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR" below.

Do not connect both an S-video cable and a standard video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Do not connect the DVD player/satellite receiver and VCR to the same video channel on the TV. (See the illustration at left, which shows the DVD player/satellite receiver connected to Video-1 and the VCR connected to Video-2.)

Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, and TV programs, and record one channel while watching another channel.


Your TV has ColorStream (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a component video compatible DVD player (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream®) can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one set of component video cables
- one pair of standard audio cables



Connecting two VCRs

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from one VCR to another VCR while watching a videotape. You can also record from one TV channel while watching another channel. You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables



Note:

For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables between the TV and DVD player. Connect the component video cables from the DVD player to the TV's ColorStream inputs.

The ColorStream inputs on the TV are for use with DVD players that offer 480i interlaced scanning ONLY. **If you have a 480p progressive scan DVD player, you must switch the DVD player to 480i interlaced mode first**, and then connect it to the TV's ColorStream inputs. Failure to do this will cause unacceptable picture performance.

You can connect a high-definition set-top receiver only if the output is switched to the 480i interlaced mode first. **This TV will not accept or display 480p or 720p progressive scan signals or 1080i interlaced high-definition signals.**

If your DVD player is not compatible with component video, use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) instead of component video cables.

Do not connect both S-video and standard video cables between the TV and DVD player at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.

Note:

Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.

If you have S-VHS VCRs, use S-video cables instead of a standard video cable. Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

To dub or edit, VCR 2 must select Line IN, and the TV must select Video-1.



Connecting a camcorder

This connection allows you to watch video materials recorded on a camcorder.

You will need:

• one set of standard A/V cables

If you have an S-VHS camcorder, the picture quality will increase if you use an S-video cable instead of a standard video cable.

Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.


Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier to adjust the audio level. This also allows you to use external speakers.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the built-in speakers. (See"Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 45.)

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of standard audio cables


Connecting an A/V receiver

This connection allows you to use an A/V (audio/video) receiver to enhance your TV's sound.


If you have a system with Dolby Pro Logic[®] surround sound, you can add to the realism of the sound by using the TV speakers as center channel speakers.

You will need:

- one set of standard A/V cables
- one single audio cable for the Audio Center Channel

Caution:

To avoid damaging the speakers:

- Turn off the TV before connecting or disconnecting the Audio Center Channel cable.
- Do not connect from the A/V receiver's Center Speaker OUT terminal (amplified signal) to the TV's Audio Center Channel IN terminal.

Note:

Refer to the instructions provided with your A/V receiver for details about your surround sound system.

When the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the TV speakers will function only as center channel speakers.

To adjust the volume of the center channel speakers, use the center level control on the A/V receiver.

To use the TV speakers as normal speakers, set the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch to the OFF position.




Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.



2. Install two "AA" size alkaline batteries. Match the + and - signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.




3. Slide the battery cover back on the remote control until the lock snaps.

Note:

Your TV remote control may not operate certain features on your VCR, DVD player, cable TV converter, or other electronic device.

Refer to the owner's manuals for your other devices to determine their available features. If your TV remote control does not operate a specific feature on another device, use the remote control that came with the device.



Note:

· Battery life expectancy is about one year with normal use.

Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- · Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.
- · If the batteries are dead or you do not intend to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices

Device code setup

1. Refer to the device code table on pages 18–19 to find the code for the brand of your device.

If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find one that works.

- 2. Repeatedly press MODE until the device mode indicator (CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, AUDIO2) lights up.
- 3. While holding down the RECALL button, press the Channel Number buttons to enter the four-digit code for your device. If a valid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink two times. If an invalid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink one long blink.
- 4. Point the remote control at the device and press POWER to test the code.

If the device responds to the remote control, you have entered the correct code.

If the device does not respond to the remote control, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 3 and 4 using another code.


5. To control the TV, repeatedly press MODE until the TV mode indicator lights up.

Searching and sampling the code of a device (8500)

If you do not know the device code for a particular target unit, you can cycle the remote through the available codes for that device mode and sample functions in order to find the code that properly operates the target device. The keys available to be sampled, provided they are applicable to that mode, are 0, 1, 2, 3, POWER, VOL \blacktriangle , CH \blacklozenge , PLAY and STOP. Invalid keys will be ignored while in program mode.

To cycle through each available device code and sample its functions:

- 1. Press MODE to select the mode you want to set up.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 8-5-0-0. The remote control will enter program mode.
- 3. Point the remote control at the target device and press POWER (or other function buttons that are available to be sampled).
- If the device responds to the remote control: Press RECALL to store the device code. The mode indicator will blink two times and the remote control will exit program mode.
 - If the device does not respond to the remote control: Press ▲, and then press POWER. Repeat this step until the device responds to the remote control, and then press RECALL.
- **Note:** When a search cycle is complete, the mode indicator will blink three times. The remote control will begin to cycle through the available codes again. If no key is pressed within 10 seconds while programming, the remote control will exit the program mode and return to the previous code.



Note:

- Every time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2." If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to any of the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control.

For the TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, and DVD modes, the volume controls (VOL ▲▼ and MUTE) can be programmed (locked) to the selected device mode. This feature does not apply to the AUDIO1/2 modes.

For example, to lock the volume controls to always jump to the CABLE/SAT mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE to select the CABLE/SAT mode.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 8-0-0-0.
- 3. Press VOL ▲. The Mode indicator will blink two times (locked).

The following table describes in more detail the Volume Lock implementation.

To reset the volume controls to the original device code:

- 1. While holding down RECALL, press 8-0-0-0.
- Press VOL ▼. The Mode indicator will blink four times (unlocked).


Operational feature Reset (8900)

This feature clears all setup features not related to "Device code set up" and resets the Volume Lock to "TV."

To reset the features:

While holding down RECALL, press 8-9-0-0.

The Mode indicator will blink two times, and then pause and blink two more times.

Only the buttons used for operating the TV are described here.

SLEEP accesses the automatic TV shut-off function (page 41)







Setting up your TV

Learning about the menu system

After you have installed the batteries and programmed the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on the TV using the menu system. You can access the menus using the buttons on your TV or remote control.

- Press MENU to display the menu system.
- Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to select a menu.
- Press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to select an item.
- Press \blacktriangleleft or \triangleright to select or adjust a setting.






When you press Channel \blacktriangle or \bigtriangledown , your TV will stop only on the specific channels stored in the TV's channel memory. Follow the steps below and on the next page to program channels into the TV's memory.

Programming channels automatically


Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in its memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels. If you use both ANT-1 and ANT-2 input sources, you must program channels for each.

To program channels automatically:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark until TV/CABLE is highlighted.





Adjusting the tilt correction feature

Watching picture-in-picture (PIP)

The picture-in-picture (PIP) feature allows you to watch two pictures at the same time. The smaller picture can come from a TV broadcast or an external source, such as a VCR.


To display a TV broadcast as a small picture:

- 1. Turn on the TV and select the program you want to watch.
- 2. Press PIP once to display a small picture. A window 1/9 the size of the screen will appear. Press PIP a second time to display a 1/16-size window.




3. Press PIP CH ▲ ▼ to choose the program you want to be displayed as a small picture.

If the V-CHIP feature is active and you try to watch a TV program that exceeds the rating limits you set, the TV will enter into the program block mode. See "Using the V-CHIP menu" on page 32.




To display a picture from an external source as a small picture:

- 1. Make sure you have connected the external source equipment properly. For more information, see "Connecting your TV" on page 7.







The Multi-Window feature provides the following functions:

- The INFO (channel preview) function is a 6-picture multiwindow scan of the channels you programmed into the TV's memory using the CH PROGRAM function (page 23).
- The FAVORITE function is a 9-picture multi-window scan of the favorite channels you programmed into the TV's memory using the FAVORITE CH function (page 25).

You can use the VIDEO LOCK feature to lock the input sources (Video 1, Video 2, Video 3, ColorStream) and channels 3 and 4. You will not be able to select the input sources using the TV/VIDEO button or Channel Number buttons unless you clear the setting.

Note: The Video Lock feature is independent of the ENABLE BLOCKING option of V-Chip control (page 32).

To set up the video lock:

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select VIDEO LOCK.
- Press ◀ or ► to highlight the level of video locking you want, as follows:

Setting the sleep timer






The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to listen to high-fidelity stereo sound while you watch TV. MTS can also transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word STEREO or SAP appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or RECALL is pressed.


The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.



- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to highlight MTS.

You can leave your TV in STEREO mode because it automatically outputs the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural). If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise. The word STEREO or SAP displays in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

To listen to SAP (if available):



A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it.

For example, a TV station might broadcast music as a second audio program. If you have SAP on, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music instead of the program's normal audio.

However, if you have SAP on and the station you are watching is not broadcasting a second audio program, you will see the picture but not hear any sound. If this happens, put the TV in STEREO mode to hear the station's normal audio.

Troubleshooting

Before calling a service technician, please check the following table for a possible cause of the problem and some solutions.

Problem TV will not turn on	SolutionMake sure the power cord is plugged in, then press POWER.The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.
No picture, no sound	• Check the antenna/cable connections.
No sound, picture OK	The sound may be muted. Press VOLUME.The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.Check that the SPEAKERS function in the AUDIO menu is set correctly.
Poor sound, picture OK	• The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.
Poor picture, sound OK	Check the antenna connections.The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.Adjust the PICTURE menu.
Poor reception of broadcast channels	The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.Check the antenna connections.If you are using a VCR, make sure the TV/VCR button is set correctly.
Cannot receive above channel 13	• Make sure the TV/CABLE switch is set to the mode that corresponds with the signal source (antenna or cable).
Black box appears on the screen	• The closed caption feature may be set to one of the Text modes (T1, T2, T3, or T4). Turn closed captioning off.
