#### Laser Safety:

This machine is considered a class 1 laser device, safe for office/EDP use. The machine contains two GaAlAs laser diodes, 5-milliwatt, 760-800 nanometer wavelength for each emitter. Direct (or indirect reflected) eye contact with the laser beam might cause serious eye damage. Safety precautions and interlock mechanisms have been designed to prevent any possible laser beam exposure to the operator.




## Copier, Facsimile, Printer, and Scanner Functions

- You can send originals by fax or email, and receive faxes from other parties. See Facsimile Reference < Basic Features>, and Facsimile Reference < Advanced Features>.
- You can print documents created in computer applications. See Printer Reference.
- You can scan originals and send scan files to a computer. See Scanner Reference.


## **Utilizing Stored Documents**


## Monitoring the Machine Via Computer

## Preventing an Unauthorized Copy



- Using the printer driver, you can embed a pattern in the printed document. If the document is copied on a machine with the Copy Data Security Unit(\*), protected pages are grayed out in the copy, preventing confidential information from being copied. If the document is copied on a machine without the Copy Data Security Unit(\*), the hidden text becomes conspicuous in the copy, showing that the copy is unauthorized. See the printer driver Help and *Printer Reference*.
- Using the printer driver, you can embed text in the printed document for unauthorized copy prevention. If the document is copied, scanned, or stored in a Document Server by a copier or multifunction printer, the embedded text appears conspicuous in the copy, discouraging such unauthorized copying. See the printer driver Help and *Printer Reference*.
- If a document protected by unauthorized copy guard is copied on a machine that is equipped with the Copy Data Security Unit (\*), the machine beeps to notify users that unauthorized copying is being attempted. See Security Reference.


- Connect the power cord directly into a wall outlet and do not use an extension cord.

## **ENERGY STAR Program**

#### Low-Power mode and Off mode or Sleep mode

This product automatically lowers its power consumption when it is not operated for a fixed time (standard setting time: 1 minute). This is called "Off mode" on a single function copying machine, and "Sleep mode" on a multiple function machine equipped with optional facsimile and printing functions.

- Off mode: Same as the condition when the operation switch is turned off.
- Sleep mode: Same as the condition when the operation switch is turned off.
   Receiving fax messages and printing from a computer are possible.

If you want to operate this product while it is in either of these modes, do one of the following:

- Turn on the operation switch.
- Place an original in the Auto Document Feeder (ADF).
- Lift and lower the exposure glass cover or the ADF.

The default interval before entering Off mode or Sleep mode can be adjusted. To change it, see p.58 "Auto Off Timer".

The ENERGY STAR Program establishes two modes which lower the power consumption of the product when it is not operated for a fixed time. These modes are the Low-power mode and the Off mode or Sleep mode. This product has only one mode, the Off mode or Sleep mode. This mode meets the requirements of both the Low-power mode and Off mode or Sleep mode. In this manual, the Off mode is called the Auto Off mode.

#### Duplex Priority

The ENERGY STAR Program recommends the duplex function. By conserving paper resources this function is less of a burden to the environment. For applicable machines, duplex function (one-sided originals—) two-sided copies) can be selected preferentially when the operation switch or the main power switch is turned on, the [Energy Saver] key is pressed, or the machine resets automatically.



# 1. Exposure glass cover (optional) or Auto Document Feeder (ADF) (optional)

See p.17 "External Options". (The illustration shows the ADF.)

## 2. Exposure glass

Place originals face down here for copying.

## 3. Internal tray

Copied, printed paper or fax messages are delivered here.

## 4. Main power switch

If the machine does not operate after turning on the operation switch, check the main power switch is turned on. See p.23 "Turning On the Power".

## 5. Main power indicator

Lights when the main power switch is turned on, and goes off when the switch is turned off.

#### 6. On indicator

Lights when the operation switch is turned on, and goes off when the switch is turned off.

## 7. Operation switch

Press to turn the power on (the **On** indicator lights up). To turn the power off, press again (the **On** indicator goes off). See p.23 "Turning On the Power".

## 8. Control panel

See p.19 "Control Panel".

## 9. Internal tray 2 (1 bin tray) (optional)

The indicator lights when paper is delivered to internal tray 2 (1 bin tray). If internal tray 2 has not been installed, the indicator does not light. See p.17 "External Options".

## **10.** Duplex unit (unit for two-sided copies)

Allows you to print on both sides of a piece paper in copier and printer function.


#### 11. Front cover

Open to access the inside of the machine.

## 12. Paper tray (upper: Tray 1, lower: Tray 2)

Load paper here.

## 13. Paper tray unit (optional <upper: Tray 3, lower: Tray 4>)




#### 1. Bypass tray

Use when copying onto OHP transparencies, adhesive labels, translucent paper, postcards, and custom size paper.

## 2. Right side cover

Open this when a paper jam occurs.




#### 1. Ventilation holes

Prevent overheating. Do not obstruct the ventilation holes by placing objects near them or leaning things against them. If the machine overheats, a fault might occur.

Consists of two paper trays.

## 7. Bridge unit

Relays copies to the finisher.

## 8. 2 Tray finisher

Sorts, stacks, and staples copies. You can also punch copies. (The Punch function is optional.)

#### 9. Booklet finisher

Sorts, stacks, and staples copies. The saddle stitch function can staple the copies in the centre and folds them like a booklet.



## 9. [Interrupt] key (copier/scanner mode)

Press to make interrupt copies during copying or scanning. See "Interrupt Copy", Copy Reference.

## 10. Main power indicator and On indicator

The main power indicator goes on when you turn on the main power switch.

The On indicator lights when the power is on.

## **∰**Important

Do not turn off the main power switch while the power indicator is lit or blinking. Doing so may damage the hard disk.

#### 11. Operation switch

Press to turn the power on (the **On** indicator goes on). To turn the power off, press again (the **On** indicator goes off).

## 12. [Sample Copy] key

Press to make a single set of copies or prints to check print quality before making multiple sets.

## 13. [Start] key

Press to start copying. Start scanning or printing documents stored using the Document Server function.

## 14. [Clear/Stop] key

Clear

Press to delete a number entered.

Stop

Press to stop a job in progress, such as scanning, faxing, or printing.

## 15. [#] key

Press to enter a value.

## 16. Number keys

Use to enter the numbers for copies, fax numbers and data for the selected function.

## **Display Panel**

The display panel shows machine status, error messages, and function menus.

The function items displayed serve as selector keys. You can select or specify an item by lightly pressing them.

When you select or specify an item on the display panel, it is highlighted like Keys appearing as OK cannot be used.



☐ A force or impact of more than 30 N (about 3 kgf) will damage the display panel.

## Note

☐ The following display is of a machine with the optional 2 Tray finisher and LCT installed.

The copying screen is displayed as default after power on.



#### Common key operations

The following keys are common to all screens:

## ❖ Key list

[OK]	Acknowledges a selected function or entered values, and then returns to the previous display.
[Cancel]	Deletes a selected function or entered values, and then returns to the previous display.
[▲Prev.] [▼Next]	Moves to the previous or next display when all items cannot be shown on the same display.
[OK] [Yes]	Closes displayed messages.
[Clear]	Cancels entered values but does not change the settings.
[Exit]	Returns to the previous display.

## When the Authentication Screen is displayed

When Basic Authentication, Windows Authentication, LDAP Authentication, or Integration Server Authentication is set, the authentication screen is displayed. Unless a valid user name and password are entered, operations are not possible with the machine.

#### Note

- Consult the User Administrator about your login user name and login password. For details of the various types of user authentication, consult the respective administrators.
- □ When User Code Authentication is set, the screen for entering a user code is displayed instead. For details, see p.74 "Authentication Information".
- 1 Press [Enter] for Login User Name.



- Enter a login user name, and then press [OK].
- 3 Press [Enter] for Login Password.
- Enter a login password, and then press [OK].
- Press [Login].

When the user is authenticated, the screen for the function you are using appears.

#### Note

☐ When the entered login user name or login password is not correct, "Authentication has failed." appears. Check the login user name and password.

## **∰**Important

- ☐ To prevent unauthorized users from using the machine, always log off when you have finished using the machine.
- Press [User Tools / Counter].

## **Turning On the Power**

This machine has two power switches.

## Operation switch (right side of the control panel)

Press to activate the machine. When the machine has finished warming up, you can make copies.

### Main power switch (left side of the machine)

Turning off this switch makes the main power indicator on the right side of the control panel go off. When this is done, machine power is completely off.

When the fax unit (optional) is installed, fax files in memory may be lost if you turn this switch off. Use this switch only when necessary.



☐ This machine automatically enters Energy Saver mode or turns itself off if you do not use it for a while. See p.58 "Auto Off Timer" and p.59 "Panel Off Timer".

## **Turning On the Main Power**

- Make sure the power cord is firmly plugged into the wall outlet.
- Open the switch cover and turn on the main power switch.

The main power indicator goes on.




## #Important

Do not turn off the main power switch immediately after turning it on. Doing so may result in damage to the hard disk or memory, leading to malfunctions.

## **Turning On the Power**



☐ If the power does not come on when the operation switch is pressed, check the main power switch is on. If it is off, turn it on.

## **Turning Off the Power**

- Make sure the exposure glass cover or the ADF is in the right position.
- Press the operation switch.

The **On** indicator goes off.



Note

- ☐ Even if you press the operation switch, the indicator does not go out, but blinks in the following cases:
  - When the exposure glass cover or ADF is open.
  - During communication with external equipment.
  - When the hard disk is active.
  - If a file is waiting to be transmitted within the next minute using the "Send Later" facsimile function.

## **Turning Off the Main Power**

## **∰**Important

- ☐ Do not turn off the main power switch when the **On** indicator is lit or blinking. Doing so may result in damage to the hard disk or memory.
- ☐ Make sure to turn off the main power switch before pulling out the power plug. Not doing this may result in damage to the hard disk or memory.
- Make sure the On indicator is not lit.
- 2 Open the switch cover, and then turn off the main power switch.

The main power indicator goes out.

# When the fax unit (optional) is installed

When the main power switch is turned off while using the fax function, waiting fax and print jobs may be canceled, and incoming fax documents not received. If you have to turn off this switch for some reason, keep the following points in mind:

#### **∰**Important

- ☐ Make sure 100% is shown as available memory on the display before turning off the main power switch or unplugging the power cord. Fax files in memory are deleted an hour after you turn off the main power switch or unplug the power cord. See "Turning Off the Main Power/In the Event of Power Failure", Facsimile Reference <Advanced Features>.
- ☐ The **On** indicator does not go out, but blinks in dial-in mode even if you press the operation switch. When this happens, check the explanations below, and turn off the main power switch.
  - the computer is not controlling the machine.
  - the machine is not receiving a fax.

#### Saving Energy



#### Tenergy Saver Mode

If you do not use the machine for a certain period after an operation, or when you press the [Energy Saver] key, the display disappears and the machine goes into Energy Saver mode. When you press the [Energy Saver] key again, the machine returns to the ready condition. The machine uses less electricity in Energy Saver mode.

#### **∅** Note

☐ You can change the amount of time the machine waits before switching to Energy Saver mode after copying has finished or the last operation is performed. See p.59 "Panel Off Timer".

# Q Auto Off

The machine automatically turns itself off when the job is finished, after a certain period of time has elapsed. This function is called "Auto Off".

#### **∅** Note

- ☐ You can change the Auto Off time. See p.58 "Auto Off Timer".
- ☐ The Auto Off Timer function will not operate in the following cases:
  - When a warning message appears
  - When the service call message appears
  - When paper is jammed
  - When the cover is open
  - When the "Add Toner" message appears
  - When toner is being replenished
  - When the User Tools/Counter/Inquiry screen is displayed
  - When fixed warm-up is in progress
  - When the facsimile, printer, or other functions are active
  - When operations were suspended during printing
  - When the On-hook dialing function is in use
  - When a recipient is being registered in the address list or group dial list
  - When the Data In indicator is on or blinking
  - When the screen of stored document under the printer function is displayed



# **Changing Modes**

#### **𝒜** Note

- ☐ You cannot switch modes in any of the following situations:
  - When scanning in a fax message for transmission
  - During immediate transmission
  - When accessing User Tools
  - During interrupt copying
  - During On hook dialing for fax transmission
  - While scanning an original

☐ The copying screen is displayed as default after power on. You can change this default setting. See p.51 "Function Priority".



## System Reset

The machine returns automatically to its initial condition when the job is finished, after a certain period of time has elapsed. This function is called "System Reset".

#### **𝒯** Note

☐ You can change the System Reset time. See p.59 "System Auto Reset Timer".

#### **Multi-Access**

You can carry out another job using a different function while the current job is being performed. Performing multiple functions simultaneously like this is called "Multi-accessing".

This allows you to handle jobs efficiently, regardless of how the machine is being used. For example:

- While making copies, you can scan documents to store in the Document Server.
- While printing documents stored in the Document Server, the machine can receive print data.
- You can make copies while receiving fax data.
- While printing print data, you can make operations for copying.

#### 

- ☐ See p.52 "Print Priority" for setting function priority. As default, [Display Mode] is set to first priority.
- □ When the optional 1000-sheet finisher, 2 Tray finisher or booklet finisher is installed on the machine, you can specify the output tray where documents are delivered. For details about how to specify the output tray for each function, see the following descriptions:

  - p.53 "Output: Document Server (Document Server)"
  - p.53 "Output: Facsimile (facsimile)"
  - p.54 "Output: Printer (printer)"

## Function compatibility

The chart shows function compatibility when print priority is set to "Interleave". See p.52 "Print Priority".



# **Using the Document Server**

#### Storing Data

#### File name

Stored documents are automatically named "COPY0001", "COPY0002". You can change assigned file names.

#### User name

You can register a user name to identify the user or user group that stored the documents. To assign it, you can register the user name using the name assigned to the user code, or by entering the name directly.

#### 

For details about user codes, see p.72 "Registering Names".

#### Password

To prevent unauthorized printing, you can set a password for any stored file. A protected file can only be accessed if its password is entered. When a password is set for the documents, appears next to the documents.

#### 

To store documents without using Document Server functions, see the manuals for those modes.

#### **∰**Important


Data stored in the machine might be lost if some kind of failure occurs. The manufacturer shall not be responsible for any damage resulting from loss of data.

- Be careful not to let anyone know your password, especially when entering a password or recording it. Keep any record of your password in a secure place.
- ☐ Avoid using a single number or consecutive numbers for a password such as "0000" or "1234", since the numbers like this are easy to guess, so using them will not provide a worthwhile level of security.
- ☐ A document accessed with a correct password remains selected even after operations are complete, and it can be accessed by other users. To stop this, be sure to press the [Clear Modes] key to cancel the document selection.
- ☐ The user name used when adding a document to the Document Server is to identify the document creator and type. It is not to protect confidential documents from others.

#### Note

- ☐ Enter a four-to eight-digit password.
- □ By default, data stored in the Document Server is deleted after three days (72 hours). You can specify the time taken for the stored data to be deleted automatically. See p.66 "Auto delete File in Document Server".
- ☐ If you do not want stored data to be automatically deleted, select **[No]** in Auto Delete File before storing a document. If you select **[Yes]** later, data stored after will be automatically deleted.

- ☐ When the machine is printing a document stored using the copier function, wait until printing has finished before you store a document in the Document Server.
- 1 Press the [Document Server] key.

- Using [Address Management Tool] in SmartDeviceMonitor for Admin, you can backup Address Book data. We recommend backing up data when using the Address Book.
- ☐ Printer option is required to use SmartDeviceMonitor for Admin.

## Dos and Don'ts

#### **A** CAUTION:

- After scanning originals continuously, the exposure glass may become warm—this is not a malfunction.
- The area around the ventilation hole might feel warm. This is caused by exhaust air and is not a malfunction.

- When the machine is not in use and in stand-by mode, you may hear a small noise inside. This is caused by the image stabilization process and is not a malfunction.
- Do not turn off the power when the machine is still in operation.
- The machine might not produce good images if condensation forms inside as a result of rapid temperature change.
- Do not open the covers of the machine when it is in operation. If you do, misfeeds might occur.
- Do not move the machine when the power is on.
- If you operate the machine improperly or a machine failure occurs, settings might be lost. Be sure to make a note of your machine settings.
- The manufacturer shall not be liable for any loss or damage resulting from mechanical failure, loss of settings, or use of the machine.

## Where to Put Your Machine

## **Machine Environment**

Choose your machine's location carefully. Environmental conditions greatly affect its performance.

#### **Optimum environmental conditions**

#### $\triangle$ CAUTION:

- Keep the machine away from humidity and dust. Otherwise a fire or an electric shock might occur.
- Do not place the machine on an unstable or tilted surface. If it topples over, an injury might occur.

#### riangle CAUTION:

- If you use the machine in a confined space, make sure there is a continuous air turnover.
- Temperature: 10-32 °C (50-89.6 °F) (humidity to be 54% at 32 °C, 89.6 °F)
- Humidity: 15-80% (temperature to be 27 °C, 80.6 °F at 80%)
- A strong and level base.
- The machine must be level within 5 mm, 0.2 inches: both front to rear and left to right.
- To avoid possible buildup of ozone, make sure to locate this machine in a large well ventilated room that has an air turnover of more than 30 m<sup>3</sup>/hr/person.

#### **Environments to avoid**

Locations exposed to direct sunlight or other sources of strong light (more than 1,500 lux).

- Locations directly exposed to cool air from an air conditioner or heated air from a heater. (Sudden temperature changes can cause condensation to form inside the machine.)
- Locations close to machines generating ammonia, such as a diazo copy machine.
- Places where the machine will be subject to frequent strong vibration.
- · Dusty areas.
- Areas with corrosive gases.

## Moving

#### **⚠** CAUTION:

 Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet before you move the machine. While moving the machine, you should take care that the power cord will not be damaged under the machine.

## #Important

- Be careful when moving the machine. Take the following precautions:
  - Turn off the main power. See p.24 "Turning Off the Main Power".
  - Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet. When you pull out the plug from the socket, grip the plug to avoid damaging the cord, thereby reducing the risk of fire or electric shock.
  - Close all covers and trays, including the front cover and bypass tray.

- Do not carry the machine, by holding the scanner assembly. Keep the machine level and carry it carefully, taking care not to jolt or tip it. Rough handling may cause a malfunction or damage the hard disk or memory, resulting in loss of stored files.
- ☐ Do not take off the holding stand.
- ☐ Protect the machine from strong shocks. Impact can damage the hard disk and cause stored files to be lost. As a precautionary measure, files should be copied to another computer.

## **Power Connection**

#### **↑** WARNING:

- Connect the machine only to the power source described on the inside front cover of this manual. Connect the power cord directly into a wall outlet and do not use an extension cord.
- Do not damage, break or make any modifications to the power cord. Do not place heavy objects on it. Do not pull it hard nor bend it more than necessary. These actions could cause an electric shock or fire.







# Changing the Photoconductor Unit (PCU)







- \*7 If you want to use thick ( $128-163 \text{ g/m}^2$ , 34 lb.-43.5 lb.) paper, select [Thick Paper] on the display panel. See "Copying from the Bypass Tray", Copy Reference.
- \*8 With paper longer than 433 mm, misfeeds, jams and creasing may occur. Make sure that paper is placed correctly so that it feeds in straight.

J	When using OHP transparencies, fan them for each use. If you store the sheets in the tray, they may adhere and may cause feeding problems.
J	When copying onto OHP transparencies, remove copied sheets one by one.
J	If multiple-sheet jams occur, load the paper sheet by sheet.
J	Postcards should be fed using the bypass tray. Select <b>[Thick Paper]</b> on the display panel. See "Copying from the Bypass Tray", <i>Copy Reference</i> .

Paper or Two-Sided Paper". ☐ If you load paper of the same size in the same orientation in two or more trays, the machine automatically shifts to the other tray when the first tray in use runs out of paper. This function is called "Auto Tray Switching". (However, if one tray has recycled or special paper, the settings of the other trays must be the same for Auto Tray Switching to work.) This saves interrupting a copy run to replenish paper when making a large number of copies. See "General Features 1/4 Auto Tray Switching", Copy Reference and p.55 "Tray Paper Size: Tray 1–4".

 Do not use aluminum foil, carbon paper, or similar conductive paper to avoid a fire or machine failure.

## **∰**Important

- ☐ To prevent faults, do not use any of the following kinds of paper:
  - Paper for inkjet printers
  - Thermal fax paper
  - Art paper
  - · Aluminum foil
  - Carbon paper
  - · Conductive paper
  - Colored OHP transparencies
  - Paper with perforated lines
  - Hemmed-edge paper
- ☐ Do not use paper designed for inkjet printers, as these may stick to the fusing unit and cause a misfeed.
- Do not use copy paper that has been already copied onto, faults could occur if you do.

## **∅** Note

- ☐ To prevent misfeeds, do not use the following kinds of paper:
  - Bent, folded, or creased paper
  - Torn paper
  - Slippery paper
  - Perforated paper
  - Rough paper
  - Thin paper with little stiffness
  - Paper with a dusty surface
- ☐ If you copy onto rough grain paper, the image might be blurred.

## **Paper Storage**

## Note

- ☐ When storing paper, the following precautions should always be followed:
  - Do not store paper where it will be exposed to direct sunlight.
  - Avoid storing paper in humid areas (humidity: 70% or less).
  - Store on a flat surface.
- ☐ Do not store paper vertically.
- ☐ Under high temperature and humidity conditions, or low temperature and humidity conditions, store paper in vinyl bags.
