

OWNER'S MANUAL



PLEASE READ BEFORE OPERATING THIS EQUIPMENT

TO PREVENT FIRE OR SHOCK HAZARDS, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS UNIT TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

Important Safety Instructions

1. Read Instructions - All the safety and operating instruction should be read before the product is operated.

3. Heed Warnings - All warning on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

10. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instruction.


12. Grounding or Polarization - This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarizes plug.

Alternate Warnings - This product is equipped with a three-wire groundingtype plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin. This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

13. Power-Cord Protection - Power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and point where they exit from the product.

14. Protective Attachment Plug - The product is equipped with an attachment plug having overload protection. This is a safety feature. See Instruction Manual for replacement or resetting of protective device. If replacement of the plug is required, be sure the service technician has used a replacement plug specified by the manufacturer that has the same overload protection as the original plug. 15. Outdoor Antenna Grounding - If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna-discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antennadischarge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

16. Lightning - For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

17. Power Lines - An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

18. Overloading - Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or integral convenience receptacles as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

19. Object and Liquid Entry - Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the product.

20. Servicing - Do not attempt to service this product yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

21. Damage Requiring Service - Unplug this product from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

a) When the power-supply cord or plug is damaged,

b) If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the product,

c) If the product has been exposed to rain or water,

d) If the product does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions as an improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the product to its normal operation.

e) If the product has been dropped or damaged in any way, and

f) When the product exhibits a distinct change in performance - this indicates a need for service.

22. Replacement Parts - When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.


23. Safety Check - Upon completion of any service or repairs to this product, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine that the product is in proper operating condition.




Powering the Unit

Power the unit by connecting it to a standard AC outlet ($120V \sim 60Hz$) via the attached AC cord.




Powering The Unit

The unit requires 4 x 1.5V AA batteries, not included




Changing the Remote Battery

WARNING: Danger of explosion if the remote control's battery is incorrectly installed. Replace only with the same or equivalent battery.



- 1. Push the Release Button and pull out the Battery Compartment to access the battery.
- 2. Replace the old battery with an equivalent new battery (CR2025).
- 3. The positive side of the battery, as indicated by a plus symbol, must be facing up when inserted into the remote.

Locations of Controls



Control Definitions

1. Power Button

Press the Power Button to turn the unit off and on.

2. Snooze Button

Press the Snooze Button to delay alarm for six minutes.

3. DC Jack

DC Jack for 5V adaptor +-9--

4. LINE IN Jack

Use the Auxiliary Input to connect an external audio source to the unit.

5. AV Out Jack

AV Out for video out function from iPhone/iPod

6. iPod Dock

iPod Connector to dock iPhone/iPod

7. Volume Up/Down Button

Turn the Volume Button to adjust the volume of audio output from the unit. Also select up/down for alarm time and time setting

8. LCD Display

Use the LCD Display to view the time and current function of the unit.

9. Clk Set Button

Press and hold the Clk Set Button, with the unit powered off, to set the time.

10. AL Set Button

Press and hold the AL Set Button to set the alarm time.

11. AL Mode Button

Press the AL Mode Button to select alarm method (Buzzer or iPhone/iPod)

12. Sleep Button


Press the Sleep Button to trigger the unit switch off in 120mins, 90mins, 60mins, 30mins, 10mins, 5mins

13. Display Button

Press the Display Button to show the current time and the alarm time.

14. Battery Door

Press and open the battery door to open battery compartment.

Setting the Clock

- 1. Turn the unit off by holding the **Power Button**.
- 2. Press and hold the **Clk Set Button** for 3 Sec. HRS on left side of the display will flash.
- 3. Release the **Clk Set Button**, press +/- button on the unit to adjust the HR.
- 4. Press and hold the Clk Set Button again, MIN. on right side of display will flash.
- 5. Release the Clk Set Button, press +/- button to adjust the Min.
- 6. Press the Clk Set Button to confirm your set time.

Connecting to an Audio Player using the Line In Jacks

- 1. Plug one end of a Stereo 3.5mm Cable (not included) into the Line In Jacks on the unit.
- 2. Plug the other end of the Stereo Cable into the audio output/headphone out put on an Mp3 Player or Other Audio Source.
- 3. Press the **Power Button** to turn the unit on.
- 4. Audio played from the connected Mp3 Player or Other Audio Source will now be heard on the unit.

If connecting to the headphone output of an audio source, the source's volume controls may need to be adjusted for optimal sound.

Playing an iPod

- 1. Dock an iPod to the unit by following the "Docking an iPod" directions.
- 2. Turn the unit on by pressing the Power Button.
- 3. Press the Play/Pause Button on iPhone/iPod to play.
- 4. Press the **Skip/Search Buttons** on iPhone/iPod to skip through tracks or search through individual tracks.

Setting up the alarm

- 1. Press once and hold the "AL SET" Button to setup the alarm.
- 2. Press "+" / "-" to adjust the hour/minute
- 3. Press the "AL SET" to confirm the alarm.
- 4. Press the "AL MODE" to trigger alarm and select alarm method (Buzzer or iPhone/iPod)
