#### **MP-85 Controls**

Just above the LCD screen on the top edge of the MP-85 is the Main Power switch. Normally, this switch can be left in the **ON** position. Switching the Main Power to **OFF** disables the battery power, as well as the soft power on switch. At the opposite side of the top edge of the MP-85 is the built-in high-quality microphone.



To the right of the color TFT LCD is the RECORD or **O** button used to perform various operations depending upon the menu displayed. Below that is the NAVIGATION cluster with PREVIOUS and NEXT or << and >> buttons, UP and DOWN or + or – buttons, and a center ENTER or **M** button. The PLAY/PAUSE/POWER or >||button is just below the NAVIGATION cluster rounding out the front panel controls. Holding down the >|| button for 3 seconds will power on or power off the device so long as the Main Power switch is set to **ON**.

#### MP-85 Menu System

The MP-85 features an easy-to-use menu system controlled by the NAVIGATION cluster. Volume is controlled by pressing the UP and DOWN or + or – buttons while listening to a musical selection or viewing a video. The PREVIOUS and NEXT or << and >> buttons are used to navigate through the menus. The ENTER or **M** button is used to select menu items. Holding the **M** button down for more than one second will always return you to the main selection menu.



The battery indicator appears GREEN when the battery is fully charged, YELLOW when the battery is partially discharged, and RED when the battery is nearing depletion and should be recharged. The battery indicator also graphically displays the approximate charge remaining in the battery.

As you navigate the application icons on the Main Menu using the PREVIOUS and NEXT buttons, the icons become highlighted and a text description of the selected application appears at the bottom of the screen. Select an application by pressing the **M** button when its icon is highlighted.

#### **Playing Music**

To display the Music Menu, highlight the Music application icon on the Main Menu and press **M**. The Music Menu contains a variety of information to enhance your listening experience.



The status bar ① contains information on repeat function, play or pause, shuffle, and battery level. The next line ② shows the position of the song in the current playlist, followed by the equalizer selection, and playback quality. The equalizer graphic ③ displays 16 bands of audio response. This display can be swapped with the lyrics of the playing song should the recording support this feature. The name of the MP3 file is displayed ④ followed by a bar graph showing progress of the song being played and duration in hours, minutes, and seconds ⑤. The volume control ⑥ displays a bar graph as well as a numerical representation of the volume from 00 to 40. The total length of the song in hours, minutes, and seconds appears in the lower right corner ⑦.

On the Main Menu, highlight the Music icon and press the **M** button. The Music Player screen will display as shown above.

#### Volume adjustment

Press the + or - button to increase or decrease the volume.

#### **Play list**

Press the **M** button to display the file Explorer menu. Press the + or - buttons to scroll through a list of available music selections. Press the **M** button to play the selected file. If no file is selected, press and hold **M** button to return to the Main Menu.

#### **Equalizer setting**

From the Main Menu scroll to the Settings icon and press **M**. Highlight Music and press **M**. Scroll to EQ Select and press **M**. Scroll through the available selections and highlight the setting you prefer. Press **M**.

#### **Repeat mode**


From the Main Menu scroll to the Settings icon and press **M**. Highlight Music and press **M**. Scroll to Repeat Mode and press **M**. Scroll through the available selections and highlight the setting you prefer. Press **M**.

#### Screen display

While on the Music Player screen, press and hold the **O** button. The display will switch from equalizer graphics to the lyrics display. Press and hold the **O** button again to return to the equalizer graphics display.

#### **Playing Videos**

To display the Video Player screen, highlight the Video application on the Main Menu and press **M**. Using the + and – buttons scroll through the available list of videos and select one by highlighting it and pressing **M**. The Video Player will be displayed and the video will begin playing immediately.



The upper status bar ① contains a numerical volume indicator that you control using the + and – buttons, the play/pause indicator controlled by the >|| button, the position of the video in the current playlist, and battery status. The lower status bar shows progress of the video being played ② in hours, minutes, and seconds, as well as a bar graph ③. The total length of the video in hours, minutes, and seconds appears in the lower right corner ④.

The status bars are displayed for the first few seconds when a video is first played, or whenever the video is paused.

#### Fast forward/ Fast backward

While watching a video you can fast forward or backward by pressing the << or >> buttons.

#### Select a file for playing


You can interrupt playing the current video and return to the list of available videos by pressing **M**. Using the **+** and – buttons scroll through the available list of videos select one by highlighting it and pressing **M**.

#### Volume adjustment

The volume of the video being played can be adjusted using the + or – buttons. Pressing either button will display the status bars briefly.

#### **Picture Viewing**

To display pictures in the Picture Viewer, highlight the Photo application on the Main Menu and press **M**. Using the + and – buttons scroll through the available list of pictures and select one by highlighting it and pressing **M**. The Picture Viewer will display the selected picture.



#### Select a picture

In the Picture file list press the + or - button to select from the files and press **M** to display the picture. Press the << or >> buttons to displays other pictures in the play list while viewing a picture. Press and hold the **M** button to return to the Main Menu.

#### **FM Radio**

The MP-85 has a fully function FM radio built-in that is accessed from the Main Menu. The radio incorporates manual and autoscan capability for locating active stations. The 20 memories allow you to store active stations in your area for quick access. The ear phone serves as an antenna for the FM radio.

#### FM Radio Menu

#### manu (Manual Tune)

Press << or >> to select and press **M** to enter the mode. Use << or >> to search for radio stations. Press **M** to return to the FM Radio menu.

#### auto (Auto Tune)

Use << or >> to select and press **M** to enter mode. The MP-85 will auto select radio stations and place them into memory. The memory will store up to 20 active stations.

#### mem (Memory)

Use the << or >> buttons to select the Memory feature and press M to enter the function. Use the + and – buttons to scroll through the available channels. Press the >|| button followed by the << or >> to decide whether or not to save the station to that memory location. Press >|| twice to return to the FM Radio menu.

#### pres (Presets)

Press << or >> to select stations stored in memory. Press M to return to the FM Radio menu.

#### del (Delete)

Press the + or – buttons to select a memory channel. Press the >|| button followed by the << or >> to decide whether or not to save the station to that memory location. Press >|| twice to return to the FM Radio menu.

#### **Recording an FM Broadcast**

The MP-85 can record on-the-air FM broadcasts and store them for later replay.

Press and hold the **O** button to enter the FM Record mode. Press the **O** button again to start recording. During recording press **O** to pause, and press **O** again to resume recording. Press and hold **O** to stop recording and automatically save the recording.

#### **Recording Voice Memos**

To record voice memos, highlight the Record application icon on the Main Menu and press **M**. Press the **O** button to start recording. Press the **O** button again to pause recording, or press and hold the **O** button to save the recording and enter standby mode for the next recording. Press and hold the **M** button to save the recording file and return to the main interface.



#### **Reading Text Files**

The MP-85 is capable of storing and reading .txt files. To display a text file, highlight the Text application icon on the Main Menu and press **M**. The file Explorer will display a choice of either searching for files on Internal Memory or an optional SD Card if one is installed. Choose the location where you have stored your text files and press **M**. A list of text files will be displayed. Scroll through the list using the **+** and **-** buttons and press **M** to view a particular file.

#### Navigation

The MP-85 contains a file Explorer application to locate file, and either access them using their default applications automatically, or to delete them. Folders can be created using a PC and accessing the MP-85 through the USB port.

Access the file Explorer application by selecting the Navigation icon on the Main Menu and press M.

#### Selecting a file

While in the file explorer, press the + or - buttons to select Inside Memory or SD Card, then press **M** to display all files stored in the selected storage device. Press + or - to select from the files in the list and press **M** button to view the selected file. If there is no file recognized, the device will return to the previous directory automatically.

#### **Deleting a file**

To delete a file from the list, highlight the file then press the **O** button. A delete dialogue box will pop up. Press << or >> buttons to select **Yes** or **No**. to decide whether to delete the file or not. Press **M** button to delete or exit.

#### **Playing a Game**

The MP-85 comes with the popular game Tetris. The game is accessed from the Main Menu by highlighting the Game application icon and pressing **M**.

#### Start and pause

Press the >|| button to switch between start and pause functions.

#### How to play

Press the + or - buttons to move the square to the left or right. Press the << button to control the direction, and press the >> button to drop the square quickly.

#### Exit the game

Press and hold the M button to exit the game and return the Main Menu.

#### Settings

The Settings application gives you access to various settings for the MP-85. Select the Settings applications from the Main Menu by highlighting it and pressing **M**. Six setting categories are displayed – Music, FM Radio, Record, Display, System, and PowerOff Time. Selecting one of the categories will reveal either subcategories or options to choose.

#### Music

There are four options in this setting: Repeat Mode, Play Mode, EQ Select, and User EQ Select. Select the item to be set, and then press >> or << to conduct settings accordingly. Press the **M** button to confirm or press the >|| button to exit without saving.

#### Repeat Mode

There are seven options for this setting: Once, Repeat 1, Folder Once, Folder Repeat, All Once, All Repeat, and Intro.

Play Mode


There are two options for this setting: Order and Shuffle.

EQ Select

There are eight options for this setting: Normal, 3D, Rock, Pop, Classic, Bass, Jazz and User EQ.

User EQ

This option gives you a graphic display with five frequencies to set. Each setting has seven levels that you can adjust to suit your own listening preferences.



#### Record

There are two options for this setting: REC Quality and REC Volume. Press the + or - button to select the item to be set. Press **M** to confirm the selection or press the **>||** button to exit without saving.

REC Quality

There are two options for this setting: High Quality and Normal Quality.

REC Volume

There are five options for this setting: +1, +2, +3, +4 and +5. With a higher level, the recording volume will be higher.

#### Display

Under this setting, there are three options: Blight Time (duration of background light), Lum (brightness), and Blight Mode (normal or power save). Press the + or - button to select the item to be set. Press **M** to confirm the selection or press >|| to exit without saving.

Time of background light

There are six options for this setting: 5 sec, 10 sec, 15 sec, 20 sec, 30 sec and Always On.

- Brightness adjustment
  There are five options for this setting: 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. With a higher level, the brightness is lower.
- **Background light display modes** There here are two options for this setting: Normal and Power Save.

#### System

There are four options for this setting: Language, About, Upgrade, and Default Set. Press the + or - button to select the item to be set. Press **M** to confirm the selection or press the >|| button to exit without saving.

Language

There are several languages for this setting including English, Spanish, Simplified Chinese, and Traditional Chinese.

About

There are no options to choose for this setting. Rather it displays a popup window containing the firmware version, date of the firmware, remaining flash memory, and remaining SD card if one is installed. Press **M** to exit.

Upgrade

When this option is chosen a dialog box pops up, prompting whether or not to conduct a firmware upgrade. If there is no firmware to be upgraded, exit by pressing M.

Default Set

This option allows you to recover your factory default settings. When this option is chosen a dialog box pops up. Select **Yes** to restore defaults, or **No** to exit without making changes.

PowerOff Time

There are six options for this setting: Off, 10 min, 15 min, 30 min, 60 min, and 120 min.

#### **SD Card Operations**

You can add more memory to the MP-85 by inserting a low-cost high-capacity SD in the slot at the bottom of the player.

#### Inserting an SD card

Insert SD card into the device with SD logo showing on top of SD card. Press the SD card again to eject.

#### **Connection between SD card and PC**

When an SD card is inserted, two mobile discs will be displayed when this device is connected to the PC, disk G and disk H. You can then conduct storage operations to both discs and the operation methods are the same with those for other mobile discs.

#### Operations when the device is not connected with PC

Select the Navigation application from the Main Menu. There will be two options, Inside Memory and SD Card. Press the + or - button to select and press **M** to enter. When Inside Memory is selected all files stored in it will be displayed, and when SD Card is selected all files stored in it will also be displayed. Press the + or - button to select from the files and press **M** to play the selected file.

#### Upgrading the Firmware of the MP-85

Firmware upgrades may be issued from time to time to correct bugs in the software or to add and optimize some functions of the player. Normally when the device is working properly, a firmware upgrade is not necessary. Improper firmware upgrading may result in a device that cannot be turned on or cannot function properly. The latest firmware is available at the AVAYON Technologies Website at <a href="http://www.avayon.com">http://www.avayon.com</a>. Instructions are provided at the Website.

#### Introduction to AVI Conversion

AVIConverter V2.0 provides simultaneous conversion of audio and video into a format compatible with the MP-85 video application. AVIConverter can convert files with a format of avi, mpg, mpeg, rm, rmvb, wmv, or dat, into high quality AVI. AVI is one of the most popular video formats for portable media players. Video files with XviD/DivX format codes may have higher video quality as well as smaller file size.
