You Can Make Copies Using Various Functions



- You can reduce or enlarge the copy image. With the Auto Reduce/Enlarge function, the machine
 automatically calculates the reproduction ratio based on the sizes of the originals and the paper
 you have specified.

- Copier functions such as Duplex and Combine allow you to save on paper by copying multiple pages onto single sheets.

- You can copy onto various types of paper such as envelopes.

1. ADF

Lower the ADF over originals placed on the exposure glass.

If you load a stack of originals in the ADF, the ADF will automatically feed the originals one by one.

2. ADF cover

Open this cover to remove originals jammed in the ADF.

3. Input tray for the ADF

Place stacks of originals here.

4. Extender for the ADF tray

Extend this when placing paper longer than A4 in the input tray for ADF.

5. Exposure glass

Place originals face down here.

6. Cover for the exposure glass

Open this cover to place originals on the exposure glass.

7. Output tray for the ADF

Originals scanned with the ADF are output here.

8. Stop fence for the ADF

Pull out this fence to prevent originals from falling off.

9. Control panel

See page 25 "Guide to the Names and Functions of the Machine's Control Panel".

10. Standard tray

Copied/printed paper and fax messages are delivered here.

11. Media slot

Insert a USB flash memory device.

12. Ventilation holes

Prevent overheating.

13. Front cover open button

Push this button to open the front cover.

14. Front cover

Open to access the inside of the machine and remove jammed paper.

Open here to replace the toner cartridge and the drum unit.

15. Lower paper tray (option)

Load paper here.

16. Tray 1

Load paper here.

17. Main power switch

To operate the machine, the main power switch must be on. If it is off, turn the switch on.

18. Bypass tray open lever

Push this lever to open the bypass tray.

19. Tray Extension

Pull this fence to prevent paper from falling off.

20. Bypass tray

Use to copy or print on thick paper, OHP transparencies, envelopes, and label paper (adhesive labels).


21. Extender for the bypass tray

Pull this extender out when loading A4D, $8^{1}/_{2} \times 11D$ or larger size paper in the bypass tray.

22. Paper guides

When loading paper in the bypass tray, align the paper guides flush against the paper.

Exterior: Rear view



1. Ventilation holes

Prevent overheating.

2. Power connector

Connect the power cord to the machine. Insert the other end into an electrical outlet.

3. Rear cover open lever

Pull this lever to open the rear cover.

4. Rear cover

Open to access the inside of the machine and remove jammed paper.

Open here to replace the fusing unit.

5. External telephone connector

For connecting an external telephone.

6. Line interface connector

For connecting a telephone line.

7. USB 2.0 [Type B] port

Use a USB cable to connect the machine to a computer.

8. Security slot

Connect a security cable to prevent theft.


9. Ethernet port

Use a network interface cable to connect the machine to a network.

10. Slot

Optional wireless LAN interface unit can be inserted.

Interior: Front view



1. Toner cartridge

Pull out the toner cartridge and remove jammed paper.

Messages appear on the screen when the toner cartridge needs to be replaced, or a new cartridge needs to be prepared.

For details about the messages that appear on the screen when consumables need to be replaced, see "Replenishing and Replacing Consumables", Maintenance and Specifications.




When you remove jammed paper, pull out the toner cartridge with the drum unit. If you want to remove
only the toner cartridge, pull down the lever on the right side of the toner cartridge, and then pull the
toner cartridge out.

2. Drum unit

Messages appear on the screen when the drum unit needs to be replaced, or a new drum unit needs to be prepared.

For details about the messages that appear on the screen when consumables need to be replaced, see "Replenishing and Replacing Consumables", Maintenance and Specifications.

Interior: Rear view



1. Fusing unit

Pull out the fusing unit and remove jammed paper.




2. Lower paper tray

You can install a 250-sheet paper feed unit or a 500-sheet paper feed unit.

1. [ID Card Copy] key

Press to jump to the ID card copy setting menu.

2. [Job Information] key (scanner and facsimile mode)

Press to obtain status information on transmitted data.

3. Original Selection key (copier, scanner and facsimile mode)

Press to select the most suitable scanning method for the original.

4. Color Selection key

Press to scan originals in full color.

5. [Duplex/Combine/Series] key (copier mode)

• Duplex

Perform duplex printing when copying a multiple-sheet original.

Combine

Combines and prints the pages of a multiple-sheet original onto a single sheet.

Series

Prints each page of a double-page spread as a single-page copy.

6. [Copy] key

Press to activate the copy function.

7. [Facsimile] key

Press to activate the facsimile function.

8. [Scanner] key

Press to activate the scanner function.

9. Scroll keys

Press these keys to move the cursor in each direction.

When the $[\blacktriangle] [\blacktriangledown] [\blacktriangledown] [\blacktriangleleft]$ keys appear in this manual, press the applicable key for the direction that you want to move the cursor.

10. [Pause/Redial] key (facsimile mode)

Pause

Press to insert a pause in a fax dialing sequence. The pause is indicated by "-".

Redial

Press this to select a recently-dialed destination.

11. [On Hook Dial] key (facsimile mode)

Press to use the On Hook Dial function.

12. [Reset] key

Press to clear the current settings.

13. Main power indicator

The main power indicator goes on when you turn on the main power switch.

14. [User Tools] key

Press to change the default settings to meet your requirements.

15. Quick Dial keys

Press to enter letters and symbols.

Press to select the registered destination at a single touch.

16. [Search Destination] key (scanner and facsimile mode)

Press to search for a destination registered in the destination list.

17. [Check Destination] key (scanner and facsimile mode)

Press to check the specified destination.

18. Resolution Selection key (facsimile mode)

Press to specify the resolution of the fax.

19. Density Selection keys (copier, scanner, and facsimile mode)

Press to adjust the scanning density under the copier, scanner, and fax functions.

20. [Sort] key (copier mode)

Press to automatically sort printed copies.

21. [Printer] key

Press to activate the printer function.

22. Fax Received indicator (facsimile mode)

Lights continuously while data other than personal box or Memory Lock file is being received and stored in the fax memory.

23. Communicating indicator (facsimile mode)

Lights continuously during data transmission and reception.

24. Selection keys

Correspond to items on the display. Press to select the corresponding item.

25. Data In indicator

Flashes when the machine is receiving print jobs or LAN-Fax documents from a computer.

26. [Escape] key

Press to cancel an operation or return to the previous display.

27. Alert Indicators

Lights up when a machine error occurs.

Steady red: printing is not possible, or is possible but print quality cannot be ensured.

Flashing yellow: the machine will soon require a replacement consumable.

28. [OK] key

Press to set a selected item or an entered numeric value.

29. Number keys

Use to enter the numbers for copies, fax numbers, and data for the selected function.

30. [#] key (Enter key)

Press to confirm values entered or items specified.

31. [Start] key

Press to start copying, printing, scanning, or sending.

32. [Clear/Stop] key

Clear

Clears an entered numeric value.

• Stop

Stops a job in progress, such as copying, scanning, faxing, or printing.

Changing the Display Language

You can change the language used on the display. English is set as default.

Press the [User Tools] key, and then select the setting items using the $[\blacktriangledown]$ or $[\blacktriangle]$ key.

- 1. Select [Language] ▶ Press [OK]
- 2. Select the language you want to use Press [OK]

Turning On/Off the Power


The main power switch is on the front side of the machine. When this switch is turned on, the main power turns on and the main power indicator on the right side of the control panel lights up. When this switch is turned off, the main power turns off and the main power indicator on the right side of the control panel goes out. When this is done, machine power is off. Fax files in memory may be lost if you turn this switch off. Use this switch only when necessary.

Turning On the Main Power



- Do not turn off the main power switch immediately after turning it on. Doing so may result in damage to the memory, leading to malfunctions.
- 1. Make sure the power cord is firmly plugged into the wall outlet.
- 2. Push the main power switch.

The main power indicator goes on.



Turning Off the Main Power

ACAUTION

When disconnecting the power cord from the wall outlet, always pull the plug, not the cord.
 Pulling the cord can damage the power cord. Use of damaged power cords could result in fire or electric shock.

Important

After turning the machine's power off, wait at least a few seconds before turning it back on.

- Before unplugging the power cord plug, turn off the main power switch and make sure the main power switch indicator turns off. Not doing so may result in damage to the memory, leading to malfunctions.
- Do not turn off the power while the machine is in operation. Doing so may result in damage to the memory, leading to malfunctions.
- Do not hold down the main power switch while turning off the main power. Doing so forcibly turns
 off the machine's power and may damage the memory and cause malfunctions.
- 1. Push the main power switch.

The main power indicator goes out.

Placing Originals

Placing Originals on the Exposure Glass


ACAUTION

 Keep your hands away from the hinges and exposure glass when lowering the ADF. Not doing so may result in an injury if your hands or fingers are pinched.

Mportant (

- Do not lift the ADF forcefully. Otherwise, the cover of the ADF might open or be damaged.
- 1. Lift the ADF.
- Place the original face down on the exposure glass. The original should be aligned to the rear left corner.

Start with the first page to be scanned.

- 3. Lower the ADF.

Placing Originals in the Auto Document Feeder


Be sure not to load the original untidily. Doing so may cause the machine to display a paper misfeed message. Also, be sure not to place originals or other objects on the top cover. Doing so may cause a malfunction.

- 1. Adjust the original guides to the original size.
- 2. Place the aligned originals squarely face up in the ADF.

Do not stack originals beyond the limit mark.

The first page should be on the top.

When placing originals that are longer than A4 \square or $8^1/_2 \times 11 \square$, open the extenders.

3. Copy

This chapter describes frequently used copier functions and operations. For the information not included in this chapter, see Copy on the supplied CD-ROM.

Basic Procedure

To make copies of originals, place them on the exposure glass or in the ADF.

When placing the original on the exposure glass, start with the first page to be copied. When placing the original in the ADF, place them so that the first page is on the top.



To copy onto paper other than plain paper, specify the paper type in User Tools according to the weight of the paper you are using. For details, see "System Settings", Connecting the Machine/System Settings


The following procedure explains copying onto paper whose size and orientation matches that of the originals exactly.

1. Press [Copy]



2. Make sure no previous settings remain

When there are previous settings remaining, press the [Reset] key.



- 3. Place the originals
- 4. Make desired settings

- 5. Enter the number of copies with the number keys
- 6. Select the paper tray
- 7. Press [Start]

When placing the original on the exposure glass, press the [#] key after all originals are scanned.

8. When the copy job is finished, press [Reset] to clear the settings




Reducing or Enlarging Originals

This section describes methods of reducing or enlarging images by specifying a reproduction ratio, or a paper size.


Base Point

The base point of reduce/enlarge differs depending on how the original is scanned. When the original is placed on the exposure glass, the upper left corner will be the base point. When it is placed in the ADF, the bottom left corner will be the base point.

• Placing the original on the exposure glass




• Placing the original in the ADF



Preset Reduce/Enlarge

This function allows you to reduce or enlarge images by selecting a preset ratio.




Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the $[^{\blacktriangledown}]$ or $[^{\blacktriangle}]$ key.

- 1. Press [R/E]
- 2. Press [Enlarge] or [Reduce]
- 3. Select a ratio ▶ Press [OK]
- 4. Select the paper tray
- 5. Place the originals Press [Start]

Zoom

You can specify the reproduction ratio in increments of 1%.




Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the [▼] or [▲] key.

- 1. Press [R/E].
- 2. Press [Zoom].
- Enter the desired ratio with the number keys Press [OK]
 Pressing the [▼] or [▲] key changes the ratio in increments of 1%. Pressing and holding down the [▼] or [▲] key changes it in increments of 10%.
- 4. Select the paper tray
- Place the originals ► Press [Start]

Auto Reduce/Enlarge

The machine automatically calculates the reproduction ratio based on the sizes of the originals and the paper you have specified. The machine will enlarge or reduce the image of the originals to fit them to the paper.





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• If you select a reproduction ratio after pressing [Auto R/E], the Auto Enlarge/Reduction function is canceled.

Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the $[\P]$ or $[\P]$ key.


- Specify the original size

- 2. Press [Auto R/E]
- 3. Select the paper tray
- 4. Place the originals ▶ Press [Start]

Duplex Copying

Copies two one-sided pages or one two-sided page onto a two-sided page.



- Copying one two-sided page on one two-sided page is available for SP 3610SF only.
- You cannot use the bypass tray with this function.



For SP 3610SF, two types of Duplex are available.

1 Sided Orig.-> Duplex Copy

Copies two one-sided pages on one two-sided page.


2Sided Orig.->Duplex Copy


Copies one two-sided page on one two-sided page.

The resulting copy image will differ according to the orientation in which you place your originals (\square or \square).

Original orientation and completed copies


To copy on both sides of the paper, select the original and copy orientation according to how you want the printout to appear.





Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the $[^{\blacktriangledown}]$ or $[^{\blacktriangle}]$ key.

1. Press [Duplex/Combine/Series].



- 2. Select the duplex mode Press [OK]
- 3. Select the paper tray
- 4. Place the originals ▶ Press [Start]


This mode can be used to select a reproduction ratio automatically and copy the originals onto a single sheet of copy paper.

The machine selects a reproduction ratio between 25 and 400%.


Orientation of the original and image position of Combine




Placing originals (originals placed in the ADF)

The default value for the copy order in the Combine function is "From Left to Right". To copy originals from right to left in the ADF, place them upside down.

Combine 1 Side (2 Orig.)



Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the [▼] or [▲] key.

- 3. Select the paper tray
- 4. Place the originals Press [Start]




- You cannot apply this function to sheets longer than 356 mm (14 inches) fed from the bypass tray.
- The default setting for the original orientation is the unreadable direction (). When placing originals in an unreadable direction, specify the original orientation. To specify the orientation, select [Always Specify] for [Orientation] in [Copier Features], and then perform the following procedure after Step 2. For details about the setting item, see "Copier Features", Copy .
 - 1. Select the original orientation Press [OK]
- When placing originals on the exposure glass, press the [#] key after all the originals have been scanned.
- To cancel the One-Sided Combine function, press the [Duplex/Combine/Series] key twice.

Two-Sided Combine

Combines various pages of originals onto two sides of one sheet.

- The Combine Copies function for two-sided originals is available for SP 3610SF only.
- You cannot use the bypass tray with this function.



There are following types of Two-Sided Combine.

For SP 3610SF

Combine: 4 Orig. 1-> 1->2

Copies four one-sided originals to one sheet with two pages per side.

Combine: 8 Orig. ☐ → 📆

Copies eight one-sided originals to one sheet with four pages per side.

Combine: 2 Orig. 2-> 2-> 2-2

Copies two two-sided originals to one sheet with two pages per side.

Combine: 4 Orig. 2 -> 2

Copies four two-sided originals to one sheet with four pages per side.

For SP 3600SF


Combine 2 Side (4 Orig.)

Copies four one-sided originals to one sheet with two pages per side.

Combine 2 Side (8 Orig.)

Copies eight one-sided originals to one sheet with four pages per side.

Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the [▼] or [▲] key.



- 2. Select the combine mode Press [OK]
- 3. Select the paper tray
- 4. Place the originals Press [Start]



- The default setting for the original orientation is unreadable direction ((). When placing originals in unreadable direction, specify the original orientation. To specify the orientation, select [Always Specify] for [Orientation] in [Copier Features], and then perform the following procedure after Step 2. For details about the setting item, see "Copier Features", Copy .
 - 1. Select the original orientation ▶ Press [OK]
 - 2. When copying two-sided documents, select the original orientation Press [OK]
 - 3. Select the duplex orientation Press [OK]
- When placing originals on the exposure glass, press the [#] key after all the originals have been scanned.
- To cancel the Two-Sided Combine function, press the [Duplex/Combine/Series] key twice.

Copying onto Custom Size Paper from the **Bypass Tray**

Paper that has a horizontal length of 60.0-216.0 mm (2.37-8.50 inches) and a vertical length of 127.0-900.0 mm (5.00-35.43 inches) can be fed in from the bypass tray.

Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the $[\mathbf{v}]$ or $[\mathbf{A}]$ key.

- 1. Load the paper face up in the bypass tray
- 2. Press [#]



- 3. Select [Paper Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 4. Select [Custom Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 5. Enter the horizontal size with the number keys Press [OK]
- 6. Enter the vertical size with the number keys ▶ Press [OK]
- 7. Press [#]
- 8. Select [Paper Type] ▶ Press [OK]
- 9. Specify the type of the paper as necessary Press [OK]
- 10. Place the originals Press [Start]

When the copy job is finished, press the [Reset] key to clear the settings.

Copying onto Envelopes


This section describes how to copy onto regular size envelopes. Place the original on the exposure glass and place the envelope in the bypass tray.

Specify the thickness of the paper according to the weight of the envelopes you are printing on. For details about the relationship between paper weight and paper thickness and the sizes of envelopes that can be used, see "Recommended Paper Sizes and Types", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.

About handling envelopes, supported envelope types, and how to load envelopes, see page 93 "Envelopes".

Press the [Copy] key, and then select the setting items using the [▼] or [▲] key.

- 1. Load the envelope with the side you want to copy face up in the bypass tray
- 2. Press [#]



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- 3. Select [Paper Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 4. Select [Regular Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 5. Select the envelope size Press [OK]
- 6. Press [#]
- 7. Select [Paper Type] Press [OK]

- You must log in as an Administrators group member to create a shared folder.
- If "Everyone" is left selected in step 6, the created shared folder will be accessible by all users. This
 is a security risk, so we recommend that you give access rights only to specific users. Use the
 following procedure to remove "Everyone" and specify user access rights.







Displaying the Top Page

There are two modes available with Web Image Monitor: guest mode and administrator mode.

Displayed items may differ depending on the machine type.

Guest mode

This mode requires no login to enter.

In the guest mode, the machine status, settings, and print job status can be viewed, but the machine settings cannot be changed.

Administrator mode

This mode requires an administrator login to enter.

In the administrator mode, you can configure various machine settings.



- When entering an IPv4 address, do not begin segments with zeros. For example: If the address is "192.168.001.010", you must enter it as "192.168.1.10".
- 1. Start your Web browser.
- 2. Enter "http://(machine's IP address or host name)/" in your Web browser's address bar.

The top page of Web Image Monitor appears.

If the machine's host name has been registered on the DNS or WINS server, you can enter it.

When setting SSL, a protocol for encrypted communication, under the environment in which server authentication is issued, enter "https://(machine's IP address or host name)/".


3. To log in to Web Image Monitor in the administrator mode, click [Login] on the top page.

The window for entering the login user name and password appears.

Depending on the configuration of your Web browser, the login user name and password might be saved. If you do not want to save them, configure your Web browser's settings so that this information is not saved.



1. Menu area

Displays the content of a selected menu item.

3. Help

Clicking the Help button (?) in the header area displays the contents of Help.

An internet connection is required to view the contents of Help.

4. Refresh

Click the upper right in the work area to update the machine information. Click the Web browser's [Refresh] button to refresh the entire browser screen.

5. FAQs/Knowledge Base

Click to view the Frequently Asked Questions. An internet connection is required to view the Frequently Asked Questions.

6. Basic Information area

Displays the basic information of the machine.

7. Work area

Displays the contents of the item selected in the menu area

8. Adding Paper and Toner

This chapter describes how to load paper into the paper tray and recommended paper sizes and types.


Loading Paper into Paper Trays


Every paper tray is loaded in the same way.

In the following example procedure, paper is loaded into Tray 1.




- Be sure to select the correct paper size and feed direction using the paper size dial on the tray.
 Otherwise, the machine might be damaged, or printing problems might occur.
- Do not mix different types of paper in the same paper tray.
- Make sure the paper stack does not exceed the upper limit mark inside the paper tray. Excessive stacking can cause paper jams.
- After loading paper, specify the paper size using the control panel or paper size dial, and paper type using the control panel. When printing a document, specify the same paper size and type in the printer driver as specified on the machine.
- If you load paper whose size is not indicated on the paper size dial, you can specify the paper size in [Tray Paper Settings]. For details, see "Changing Paper Size Settings", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.
- Do not move the side paper guides and end guide forcefully. Doing so may damage the tray.
- When loading a low number of sheets, be sure not to squeeze the side paper guides and end
 guide in too tightly. If the side paper guides and end guide are squeezed too tightly against the
 paper, the edges may crease or the paper may misfeed.
- When loading label paper, load it one by one.
- The envelope lever is kept down by the factory default. Before printing with paper, except for
 envelopes, be sure to raise the envelope lever all the way up.






2. Pull the tray carefully until it stops, lift the front side of the tray, and then pull it out of the machine.


Place the tray on a flat surface.

3. Pinch the clip on the side paper guide and slide it to match the paper size.



4. Pinch the end guide and slide it inward to match the standard size.




5. Fan the paper before loading it in the tray.



6. Load the new paper stack print side down.

Make sure paper is not stacked higher than the upper limit (upper line) marked inside the tray.




7. Adjust the paper guides to close any gaps.

Do not move paper loaded in the tray more than a few millimeters.

Moving the loaded paper excessively can cause damage to paper edges on the openings of the tray's lifting plate, resulting in sheets being folded or becoming jammed.

8. Lift the front side of the tray, and then slide it into the machine carefully until it stops.



To avoid paper jams, make sure the tray is securely inserted.




- When loading paper larger than A4D or 8¹/₂ × 11D into Tray 1, extend the tray. For details, see "Extending Tray 1", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.
- Letterhead paper must be loaded in a specific orientation. For details, see page 87 "Loading Orientation-fixed Paper or Two-sided Paper".
- You can load envelopes into Tray 1. For details about loading envelopes, see "Loading Envelopes", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.


Loading Paper into the Bypass Tray


Use the bypass tray to use OHP transparencies and paper that cannot be loaded in the paper trays.

- The maximum number of sheets you can load at the same time depends on paper type. Do not stack paper over the limit mark. For the maximum number of sheets you can load, see page 88 "Recommended Paper Sizes and Types".
- Do not mix different types of paper.
- After loading paper, specify the paper size and type using the control panel. When printing a document, specify the same paper size and type in the printer driver as specified on the machine.
- When loading label paper, load it one by one.
- While pressing and holding the button in the upper center of the bypass tray, pull the tray open.




Pull the extender out when loading paper larger than A4 $^{\square}$ or 8 $^{1}/_{2}$ × 11 $^{\square}$.





3. Adjust both sides of the paper guide to match the paper width.





- When using the bypass tray, it is recommended that you set the paper direction to $\overline{\mathsf{D}}$.
- When loading thick paper or OHP transparencies, specify the paper size and the paper type.
- Letterhead paper must be loaded in a specific orientation. For details, see page 87 "Loading Orientation-fixed Paper or Two-sided Paper".
- You can load envelopes into the bypass tray. For details about loading envelopes, see "Loading Envelopes", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.
- When copying from the bypass tray, see "Copying from the Bypass Tray", Copy . When printing from a computer, see page 85 "Printing from the Bypass Tray Using the Printer Function".
- When the [Panel Key Sound] is turned off, it does not sound if you load paper into the bypass tray.
 For details about [Panel Key Sound], see "System Settings", Connecting the Machine/ System Settings.

Printing from the Bypass Tray Using the Printer Function

- If you select [Machine Setting(s)] in [Bypass Tray] under [Tray Setting Priority] in [System] of the [Printer Features] menu, the settings made using the control panel have priority over the printer driver settings. For details, see "System", Print.
- The default of [Bypass Tray] is [Driver/Command].

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- · Settings remain valid until they are changed.
- For details about setting printer drivers, see "Printing Documents", Print.
- Region A (mainly Europe and Asia)
 - [A4D] is the default setting for [Printer Bypass Paper Size].
- Region B (mainly North America)
 - $[8^{1}/2 \times 11^{\overline{D}}]$ is the default setting for [Printer Bypass Paper Size].

Specifying regular sizes using the control panel

Press the [User Tools] key, and then select the setting items using the [▼] or [▲] key.

- 1. Select [Tray Paper Settings] ▶ Press [OK]
- 2. Select [Printer Bypass Paper Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 3. Select the paper size Press [OK]

Specifying a custom size paper using the control panel

Press the [User Tools] key, and then select the setting items using the $[{}^\blacktriangledown$] or $[{}^\blacktriangle$] key.


- 1. Select [Tray Paper Settings] ▶ Press [OK]
- 2. Select [Printer Bypass Paper Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 3. Select [Custom Size] ▶ Press [OK]
- 4. Enter the horizontal value ▶ Press [OK]
- 5. Enter the vertical value ▶ Press [OK]

Specifying thick paper or OHP transparencies for paper type using the control panel

- Usually only one side of OHP transparencies can be used for printing. Be sure to load them with the
 print side up.
- When printing onto OHP transparencies, remove printed sheets one by one.

Press the [User Tools] key, and then select the setting items using the [▼] or [▲] key.

- 1. Select [Tray Paper Settings] ▶ Press OK
- 2. Select [Paper Type: Bypass Tray] ▶ Press [OK]
- 3. Select the type of the paper set in bypass tray ▶ Press [OK]
- 4. If you have selected [Recycled Paper], [Color Paper], [Letterhead], [Label Paper], [Envelope], or [Preprinted Paper] for the paper type, press [Escape]



- 5. Select [Maintenance] ▶ Press [OK]
- 6. Select the paper thickness setting for the specified paper type ▶ Press [OK]
- 7. Select the tray where the specified type of paper is loaded Press [OK]
- 8. Select the paper thickness Press [OK]

Loading Orientation-fixed Paper or Two-sided Paper

Orientation-fixed (top to bottom) or two-sided paper (for example, letterhead paper, punched paper, or copied paper) might not be printed correctly, depending on how the originals and paper are placed.

Settings for the User Tools

Specify [Auto Detect] for [Letterhead Setting] in [System] under the [Printer Features] menu, and then place the paper as shown below.

- To print on letterhead paper when [Auto Detect] is specified for [Letterhead Setting], you must specify [Letterhead] as the paper type in the printer driver's settings.

Recommended Paper Sizes and Types

This section describes recommended paper sizes and types.

Mportant !

- If you use paper that curls, either because it is too dry or too damp, a paper jam may occur.
- Do not use paper designed for inkjet printers, as these may stick to the fusing unit and cause a
 misfeed.
- When you load OHP transparencies, check the front and back of the sheets, and place them correctly, or a misfeed might occur.

- *1 When a print job is performed on A5 or $5^{-1}/2$ " X $8^{-1}/2$ " paper, it is recommended to set the paper horizontally. While a print job is performed on paper that is loaded vertically, smearing may occur near the edges of the printed paper. Also, use the bypass tray when printing on paper that is set horizontally.
- *2 Do not stack over the limit mark. The number of sheets you can load in the paper tray varies depending on the weight and condition of the paper.

- *1 When a print job is performed on A5 or $5^{-1}/2$ " × $8^{-1}/2$ " paper, it is recommended to load the paper horizontally. While a print job is performed on paper that is loaded vertically, smearing may occur near the edges of the printed paper.
- *2 For copier mode, see "Copying onto Regular Size Paper from the Bypass Tray", Copy. For printer mode, see page 85 "Specifying regular sizes using the control panel".
- *3 When loading thick paper in the bypass tray, do not stack paper over the limit mark. The number of sheets you can load in the bypass tray varies depending on the weight and condition of the paper.

- *5 When loading OHP transparencies in the bypass tray, do not stack paper over the limit mark.

*1 Print quality will decrease if the paper you are using is close to the minimum or maximum weight. Change the paper weight setting to thinner or thicker.



- Recommended paper: Paper with calcium carbonate (CaCO3) ratio of 15% or less.
- Certain types of paper, such as OHP transparencies, may produce noise when delivered. This
 noise does not indicate a problem and print quality is unaffected.
- The paper capacity described in the tables above is an example. Actual paper capacity might be lower, depending on the paper type.
- When loading paper, make sure the stack height does not exceed the limit mark of the paper tray.
- If multiple sheet feeding occurs, fan sheets thoroughly or load sheets one by one from the bypass tray.
- Flatten out curled sheets before loading them.
- Depending on the paper sizes and types, the copy/print speed may be slower than usual.
- When loading envelopes, see "Loading Envelopes", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.
- When loading thick paper of 106–162 g/m² (28 lb. Bond–90 lb. Index), see page 93 "Thick Paper".
- We recommend that you use specified label paper.
- When loading OHP transparencies:
 - If multiple sheet feeding occurs, place one sheet at a time.
 - When copying onto OHP transparencies, see "Copying onto OHP Transparencies", Copy.
 - When printing on OHP transparencies from the computer, see "Specifying thick paper or OHP transparencies for paper type using the control panel", Paper Specifications and Adding Paper.
 - Fan OHP transparencies thoroughly whenever you use them. This prevents OHP transparencies from sticking together, and from feeding incorrectly.
 - Remove copied or printed sheets one by one.



Thick Paper

This section gives you various details about and recommendations concerning thick paper.

When loading thick paper of 106-162 g/m² (28 lb. Bond-90 lb. Index) in the paper trays or bypass tray, follow the recommendations below to prevent misfeeds and loss of image quality.

- Jams and misfeeds can occur when printing on thick smooth paper. To prevent such problems, be
 sure to fan smooth paper thoroughly before loading them. If paper continues to become jammed or
 feed in together even after they are fanned, load them one by one from the bypass tray.
- When loading thick paper, set the paper direction according to its grain, as shown in the following diagram:





- Select [Thick Paper 1] or [Thick Paper 2] as the paper thickness in [Tray Paper Settings].
- If [Thick Paper 2] is selected, the print speed may change.
- Even if thick paper is loaded as described above, normal operations and print quality might still not be possible, depending on the paper type.
- Prints might have prominent vertical creases.
- Prints might be noticeably curled. Flatten out prints if they are creased or curled.
- When printing onto thick paper, the print speed changes.

Envelopes

This section gives you various details about and recommendations concerning envelopes.



• Do not use window envelopes.

- Fan the envelopes before loading them to separate them and prevent the glue on them from causing them to stick together.
- Some kinds of envelope might cause misfeeds, wrinkles or print poorly.
- When loading envelopes in the \square orientation, load them with flaps closed.
- Before loading envelopes, press down on them to remove any air from inside, flatten out all four
 edges. If they are bent or curled, flatten their leading edges (the edge going into the machine) by
 running a pencil or ruler across them.
- When loading envelopes, do not stack paper over the limit mark. If you squeeze extra envelopes into the bypass tray, misfeeds might occur.

In copier mode

When copying onto envelopes, load them according to the applicable orientation shown below.



When loading envelopes, select "Envelope" as the paper types using both the User Tools and printer driver, and specify the thickness of envelopes. For details, see "Printing on Envelopes", Print

Recommended envelopes

For information about recommended envelopes, contact your local dealer.

For details about the sizes of envelopes you can load, see page 88 "Recommended Paper Sizes and Types".



- Load only one size and type of envelope at a time.
- To get better output quality, it is recommended that you set the leading-edge print margin to at least 15 mm (0.6 inches) and the other margins to at least 10 mm (0.4 inches) each.
- Output quality on envelopes may be uneven if parts of an envelope have differing thicknesses. Print one or two envelopes to check print quality.
- Flatten out prints if they are creased or curled.
- Check the envelopes are not damp.
- High temperature and high humidity conditions can reduce print quality and cause envelopes to become creased.
- Depending on the environment, copying or printing on envelopes may wrinkle them even if they are recommended.
- Certain types of envelopes might come out creased, dirtied, or misprinted. If you are printing a
 solid color on an envelope, lines may appear where the overlapped edges of the envelope make it
 thicker.

Adding Toner

Refer to the maintenance guide provided with the new items for the replacement.

This section explains precautions when adding toner, how to send faxes or scanned documents when the toner has run out, and how to dispose of used toner.

MARNING

- Do not incinerate toner (new or used) or toner containers. Doing so risks burns. Toner will ignite
 on contact with naked flame.
- Do not store toner (new or used) or toner containers anywhere near naked flames. Doing so
 risks fire and burns. Toner will ignite on contact with naked flame.
- Do not use a vacuum cleaner to remove spilled toner (including used toner). Absorbed toner
 may cause a fire or explosion due to electrical contact flickering inside the vacuum cleaner.
 However, it is possible to use a vacuum cleaner that is explosion-proof and dust ignition-proof. If
 toner is spilled on the floor, remove the spilled toner slowly using a wet cloth, so that the toner is
 not scattered.

ACAUTION

- Do not crush or squeeze toner containers. Doing so can cause toner spillage, possibly resulting in dirtying of skin, clothing, and floor, and accidental ingestion.
- Store toner (new or used), toner containers, and components that have been in contact with toner out of reach of children.
- If toner or used toner is inhaled, gargle with plenty of water and move into a fresh air environment. Consult a doctor if necessary.
- If toner or used toner gets into your eyes, flush immediately with large amounts of water. Consult a doctor if necessary.
- If toner or used toner is swallowed, dilute by drinking a large amount of water. Consult a doctor if necessary.
- When removing jammed paper or replacing toner, avoid getting toner (new or used) on your clothing. If toner comes into contact with your clothing, wash the stained area with cold water. Hot water will set the toner into the fabric and make removing the stain impossible.

CAUTION

- When removing jammed paper or replacing toner, avoid getting toner (new or used) on your skin. If toner comes into contact with your skin, wash the affected area thoroughly with soap and water
- When replacing a toner or waste toner container or consumables with toner, make sure that the
 toner does not splatter. Put the waste consumables in a bag after they are removed. For
 consumables with a lid, make sure that the lid is shut.

Mportant !

- Always replace the toner cartridge when a notification appears on the machine.
- Fault may occur if you use toner other than the recommended type.
- When adding toner, do not turn off the main power. If you do, settings will be lost.
- Store toner where it will not be exposed to direct sunlight, temperatures above 35°C (95°F), or high humidity.
- Store toner on a flat surface.
- Do not shake the toner cartridge with its mouth down after removing it. Residual toner may scatter.
- Do not repeatedly install and remove toner cartridges. This will result in toner leakage.

Replace the toner cartridge when the following messages appear on the display.

"📥 Add toner Replace Toner Cartridge."



- If "LaToner is almost empty." appears, the toner has almost run out. Have a replacement toner cartridge at hand.
- If disappears when there is a lot of toner, follow the toner replacement instructions that appear on the screen: Pull out the cartridge, and then reinstall it.

Sending Faxes or Scanned Documents When Toner Has Run Out

When the machine has run out of toner, the indicator on the display lights. Note that even if there is no toner left, you can still send faxes or scanned documents.



- If number of communications executed after the toner has run out and not listed in the automatically output Journal exceeds 100, communication is not possible.
- 1. Make sure the machine is in facsimile or scanner mode.
- 2. Press [Exit], and then perform transmission operation.

The error message disappears.



- Any reports are not printed.
- If the fax or scanner screen does not appear in step 1, press the [Facsimile] key or the [Scanner] key.

Disposing of Used Toner

This section describes what to do with used toner.

Toner cannot be re-used.

Pack used toner containers in the container's box or a bag to prevent the toner from leaking out of the container when you dispose of it.

Region A (mainly Europe and Asia)

If you want to discard your used toner container, please contact your local sales office. If you discard it by yourself, treat it as general plastic waste material.

Region B (mainly North America)

Please see our local company website for information on the recycling of supply products, or you can recycle items according to the requirements of your local municipalities or private recyclers.
