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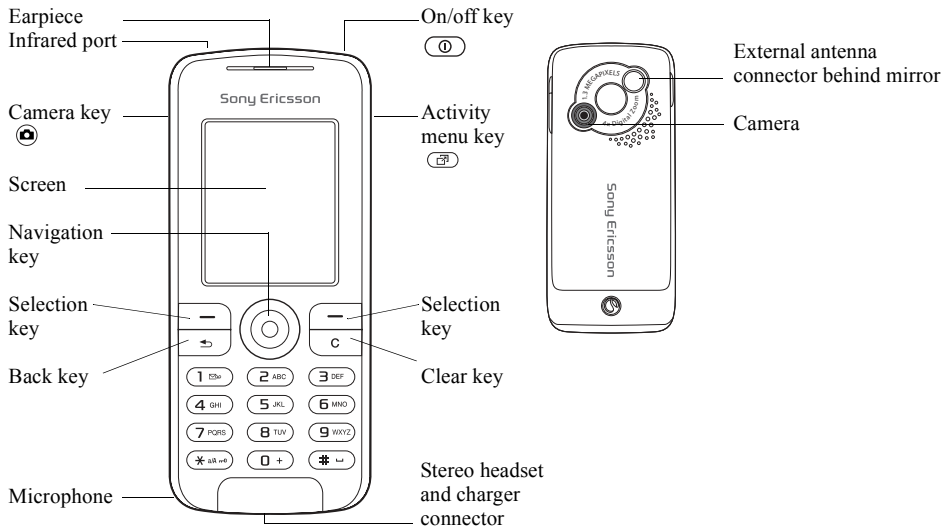
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# Getting to Know Your Phone

*Phone overview, assembly, SIM card, battery, turning on, use the menus, activity menu, file manager, language, entering letters, Style-up™ covers.*

Note



This symbol indicates that a service or function is network- or subscription-dependent. Because of this, all menus may not be available in your phone. Consult your service provider for more information.

### Assembling Your Phone

Insert the SIM card and attach the battery to use your phone.

#### SIM card

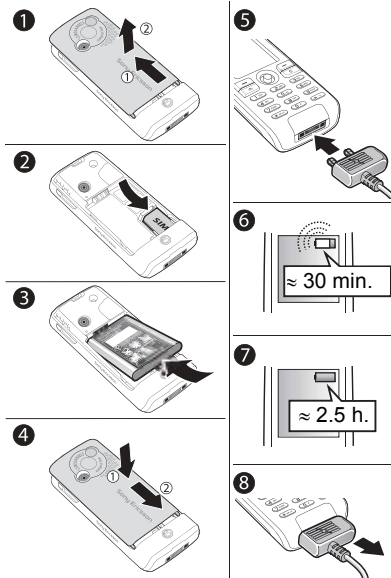
When you register as a subscriber with a service provider, you get a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card. The SIM card contains a computer chip that keeps track of your phone number, the services included in your subscription, and your phonebook information, among other things.





*Save contacts to your SIM card before you remove it from another phone. Contacts may have been saved in the phone memory ➡ 14 Contacts.*

## Getting to Know Your Phone

### To insert the SIM card and charge the battery




- 1 Slide the cover open and lift it off.
- 2 Insert the SIM card. Make sure the SIM card is placed under the silvery holders.
- 3 Place the battery in the phone with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- 4 Place the cover on the phone and slide it into place.
- 5 Connect the charger to the phone. The symbol on the charger plug must face upwards.
- 6 It may take 30 minutes for the battery icon to appear.
- 7 Wait approximately 2.5 hours or until the battery icon indicates that the battery is fully charged. For an indication of charging, press  to activate the screen.
- 8 Remove the charger by pulling it out.

 *Some functions use more battery power than others and may cause a need for more frequent recharging. However talk-time or standby time may become noticeably shorter due to wear and you may have to replace your battery. Only use approved batteries from Sony Ericsson ➔ 61 Battery.*

### PIN


You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) from your service provider to activate the services in your phone. Each PIN digit appears as \*, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example 112 or 911. This is so that you can see and call an emergency number without entering a PIN ➔ 13 Emergency calls. Press **C** to correct mistakes.

 If you enter the wrong PIN three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked ➔ 52 SIM card lock.

### To turn the phone on and off



- 1 Press and hold **Ⓚ** to turn on or off.
- 2 Enter your SIM card PIN, if you have one.
- 3 At first startup, select the language for phone menus.
- 4 Select **Yes** if you want the setup wizard to help you with instructions and tips or **No**. The setup wizard is also available in the menu system, ► **Settings** ► **General** ► **Setup Wizard**.

 If you press **Ⓚ** shortly when the phone is on, the shut down menu will be displayed ➔ 9 Shut Down Menu.

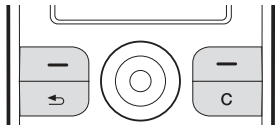
### To make and receive calls

Enter the area code and phone number ► **Call** to make the call. ► **End Call** to end the call.  
When the phone rings ► **Answer** to answer the call.

## Getting to Know Your Phone

### Navigating the Menus

The main menus are shown as icons on the desktop. Some submenus include tabs that appear on the screen.



- Press the navigation key in the center or in a direction:  
Press to go to the desktop or to select items.  
Press , , or to move through menus and tabs.
- Press to go back one level in the menus or to end a function or application.  
Press and hold to return to standby.
- Press to select the options shown immediately above these keys on the screen.
- Press to delete items.

### Shortcuts

From standby, you can use , , , to go directly to a function.

### To create a standby shortcut

- 1 If, for example, has no predefined shortcut  
▶ Yes.
- 2 Scroll to a function to create a shortcut to ▶ **Shortcut**.

### To edit a standby shortcut

- 1 ▶ **Settings** ▶ **General** ▶ **Shortcuts** and select an existing shortcut you want to edit ▶ **Edit**.
- 2 Scroll to and select a function ▶ **Shortcut**.

### Help texts

Help texts exist in your phone. To access help texts  
▶ **Info**.

### More options

▶ **More** to enter a list of options.

### Activity Menu

Open the activity menu from almost anywhere in the phone to view and handle new events, and access bookmarks and shortcuts.

### To open and close the activity menu

Press . Use or to scroll between the tabs.




### Activity menu tabs

- **New Events** – such as missed calls and messages.
- **My Shortcuts** – applications that are running in the background and your shortcuts. You can add, delete and change the order of shortcuts.
- **Bookmarks** – your Internet bookmarks.
- If you want new events to appear as pop-up text instead of in the activity menu, ► **Settings**  
► **General** ► **New Events** ► **Pop-up**.

### Shut Down Menu

Open the shut down menu from almost anywhere in the phone. You can use it to shut down the phone, turn on silent or activate a profile. For more information about profiles ► *48 Profiles*.

#### **To open and close the shut down menu**

Press  and select an option from the list.

### File Manager

Items are saved in folders. Create subfolders to move items to. Access camera pictures by selecting the desktop icon **Camera Pictures**. Unrecognized items are saved in the **Other** folder.

#### **To manage items and folders**

- 1 ► **File Manager** and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to an item ► **More** ► **Manage Files** ► **Move**.
- 3 Select the folder you want to move the item to, or **New Folder** and name the folder ► **OK**.

#### **To select several items**

- 1 ► **File Manager** and select an item ► **More** ► **Mark**, select **Mark Several** or **Mark All**.
- 2 Scroll and select more items by pressing **Mark** or **Unmark**.

#### **To check memory status**

► **File Manager** ► **More** ► **Memory Status**.

### File information

View information for items. Copyright protected items cannot be copied or sent.

### Synchronizing items

### Languages

Select the language for phone menus and the languages that you may use when writing.

## Getting to Know Your Phone

### To change the phone language

- ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Language ▶ Phone Language, select a language.
- From standby, press:
  - 0000 for English or
  - 8888 for Automatic language (SIM dependant).

### To select writing languages

- ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Language ▶ Writing Language.
- Scroll and select languages by pressing Mark or Unmark. ▶ Save to exit the menu.

### To switch between writing languages

Press and hold (#) when writing.

## Entering Letters and Characters

### To enter letters using multitap text input

- Press (2) – (9) until the desired character appears.
- To shift between capitals and lower case letters, press (\*a/A).
- To enter numbers, press and hold (0+) – (9).

- To add a space, press (#-).
- For the most common punctuation marks, press (1).
- To enter the + sign, press (0+).
- To change input method, press and hold (\*a/A).





### T9™ Text Input

The T9™ Text Input method uses a built-in dictionary to recognize the most commonly used word for each sequence of key presses. This way, you press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key.


### To enter letters using T9™ Text Input

- ▶ Messaging ▶ Write New ▶ Text Message.
- For example, if you want to write the word “Jane”, press (5), (2), (6), (3).
- If the word shown is the one you want, press (#-) to accept and add a space. To accept a word without adding a space, press (C). If the word shown is not the one you want, press (G) or (Q) repeatedly to view alternative words. Accept a word and add a space by pressing (#-).
- Continue writing your message. To enter a period or other punctuation marks, press (1) and then (G) or (Q) repeatedly. Accept and add a space by pressing (#-).

### To add words to the T9 Text Input dictionary

- 1 While entering letters ► **More** ► **Spell Word**.
- 2 Edit the word by using multitap input. Navigate between the letters with  and . To delete a character, press . To delete the entire word, press and hold .
- 3 When you have edited the word ► **Insert**. The word is added to the T9 Text Input dictionary. Next time you enter this word using T9 Text Input, it will appear as one of the alternative words.

### To select another writing method

Before, or while entering letters, press and hold  to select another writing method.

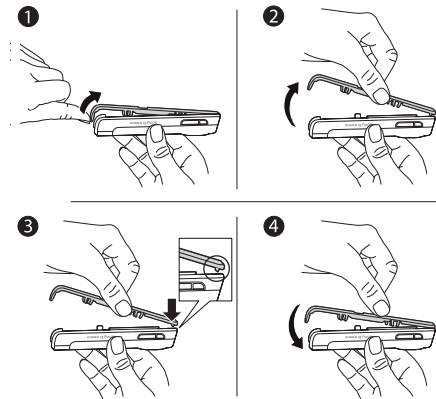
### Options when entering letters

► **More** to view options when entering letters.

## Changing Style-up™ Covers

Some kits may include additional Style-up™ covers. Follow these instructions to change covers.

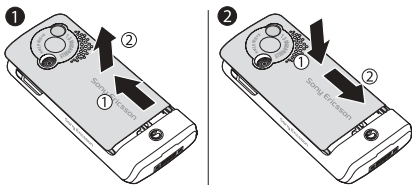
### To change the front cover



- 1 Insert your thumbnail into the groove on the bottom of the phone.
- 2 Gently lift the front cover away from the phone.
- 3 Align the cover with the top of the phone as shown.
- 4 Snap the cover into place by gently pushing down until it is lying flat.

## Calling

### To change the battery cover



- 1 Apply pressure with the heel of one hand while pushing away with the thumb of your other hand. You may need to apply significant pressure the first time you remove the battery cover.
- 2 Locate the notches along each side of the phone. Using the notches as a guide, slide the battery cover upward applying pressure with the heel of your hand until it clicks in place.

## Calling

*Calls, contacts, voicemail, voice control, call options.*

### Making and receiving calls

Turn on the phone and make sure that you are within range of a network to make and receive calls ➤ 7 *To turn the phone on and off*. If your subscription includes the Caller ID service and the caller's number is identified, the number is displayed. If the number is saved in **Contacts**, the name, number, and picture (if defined) are displayed. If the number is a restricted number, **Withheld** is displayed.

### To make a call

Enter the phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable) ► **Call** to make the call. ► **End Call** to end the call.

### To redial a number

If the connection failed, **Retry?** is displayed ► **Yes**.





*Do not hold the phone to your ear while waiting. When a call connects, the phone gives a loud signal.*


**To answer or reject a call**

► **Answer** to answer a call. ► **Busy** to reject a call.



**To change the ear speaker volume**

During a call, press  or  to increase or decrease the volume.

**To select more options during a call**

Press  and select an option.

**To turn off the microphone**

Press and hold . To resume, press and hold  again.

**To use the loudspeaker during a voice call**

► **More** ► **Turn On Speaker** or ► **Turn Off Speaker**.

**Missed calls**

When you have missed a call, it appears in the Activity menu if **New Events** is set to **Activity Menu**.

► **Call** to call the missed number.

If **New Events** is set to **Popup**, **Missed calls** appears. ► **Yes** to view the missed calls in the call list now or ► **No** to do it later. To change the Activity menu settings ► **8 Activity Menu**.

**Call list**

Information about the last calls is saved in the call list.

**To call a number from the call list**

- 1 ► **Calls** from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the name or number you want to call ► **Call**.

**To add a call list number to contacts**

- 1 ► **Calls** from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the number you want to add ► **More** ► **Save Number**.
- 3 Select **New Contact** to create a new contact, or an existing contact to add the number to.

**Emergency calls**

Your phone supports the international emergency numbers, for example 112 and 911. This means that these numbers can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is in range.



*In some countries, other emergency numbers may also be promoted. Your service provider may have saved additional local emergency numbers on the SIM card.*

## Calling

### **To make an emergency call**

Enter, for example, 112 ► Call.

### **To view your local emergency numbers**

- Contacts ► Options ► Special Numbers
- Emergency Nos.

## Contacts

Choose your default contacts from one of the following:

- **Phone Contacts** – detailed information saved in the phone memory.
- **SIM Contacts** – names and numbers only on the SIM card.

### **To select default contacts**

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Default Contacts.
- 2 Select Phone Contacts or SIM Contacts.

### **To check the memory status**

- Contacts ► Options ► Advanced
- Memory Status.



*The number of entries you can save depends on the amount of memory available in the phone or on the SIM card.*

## Managing contacts

Save numbers, add pictures, ringtones and personal information.

### **To add a contact**

- 1 ► Contacts ► New Contact ► Add.
- 2 Enter the name ► OK.
- 3 Enter the number ► OK.
- 4 For phone contacts only, select a number type. Scroll between the tabs and select fields to enter more information. Except in phone numbers, you can enter symbols such as @ ► More ► Add Symbol and select the symbol ► Insert.
- 5 When you have entered all information ► Save.



*It is recommended to enter the + sign and country code with all numbers.*

### **To add a picture or a ringtone to a contact**

- 1 ► Contacts and select the contact you want to add a picture or personal ringtone to ► More ► Edit Contact.
- 2 Select the relevant tab and then select a **Picture** or **Ringtone** ► Add. Select a picture or sound and ► Save.



**To add your own business card**

- ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **My Business Card**  
and enter the information for your business card ▶ **Save**.

**To send your business card**

- ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **My Business Card**  
▶ **Send My Card** and select transfer method.

**To call a phone contact**

- 1 Select **Contacts** and scroll to the contact you want to call, or enter the first letters of the contact.
- 2 Use  or  to select a number ▶ **Call**.

**To call a SIM contact**

- If **SIM Contacts** is default ▶ **Contacts** and select the name and number from the list ▶ **Call**.
- If **Phone Contacts** is default ▶ **Contacts**  
▶ **Options** ▶ **SIM Contacts** and select the name and number ▶ **Call**.

**To copy names and numbers to the SIM card**

- 1 ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **Advanced**  
▶ **Copy to SIM**.
- 2 Select **Copy All** or **Copy a Number**.



*When copying all contacts from the phone to the SIM card, all existing SIM card information is replaced.*

**To copy SIM contacts to phone contacts**

- 1 ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **Advanced**  
▶ **Copy from SIM**.
- 2 Select **Copy All** or **Copy a Number**.

**To always save to the SIM card**

- 1 ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **Advanced**  
▶ **Auto Save on SIM**.
- 2 Select **On**.

**To send contacts**

- To send a selected contact, ▶ **More**  
▶ **Send Contact** and select a transfer method.
- To send all contacts, ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options**  
▶ **Advanced** ▶ **Send All Contacts**.

## Calling


### **To edit a phone contact**

- 1 ▶ **Contacts** and select a contact ▶ **More** ▶ **Edit Contact**.
- 2 Scroll to the relevant tab and edit the information ▶ **Save**.

### **To edit a SIM contact**

- 1 If **SIM Contacts** is default ▶ **Contacts**.  
If **Phone Contacts** is default ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **SIM Contacts**.
- 2 Select the name and number you want to edit.
- 3 ▶ **More** ▶ **Edit Contact** and edit the name and number.

### **To delete a contact**

- ▶ **Contacts** select a contact, press .

### **To delete all contacts**

- ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **Advanced**  
▶ **Delete All Contacts** ▶ **Yes** and ▶ **Yes**. Names and numbers on the SIM card are not deleted.

### **To set the default item for a contact**

- 1 ▶ **Contacts** and scroll to a contact ▶ **More** ▶ **Default Number**.
- 2 Select the phone number, email address or Web address that you want to be displayed first for the contact.

### **Synchronizing contacts**

### **Speed dialing**

Save phone numbers that you want to reach easily in positions 1-9 in your phone.

### **To set or replace speed dialing numbers**

- 1 ▶ **Contacts** ▶ **Options** ▶ **Speed Dial**.
- 2 Scroll to the position ▶ **Add** or ▶ **Replace** and select a phone number.

### **To speed dial**

From standby, enter a speed dial number 1-9 ▶ **Call**.



## Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voice message when you cannot answer a call.

### **To save your voicemail number**

Press and hold **1** ► **Yes** enter the number  
 ► **OK**. You can get the number from your service provider.

### **To call your voicemail service**

If you have saved your voicemail number, press and hold **1**.

### **To check your voicemail number**

► **Messaging** ► **Settings** ► **Voicemail Number**.

## Voice Control

Manage calls with your voice and a handsfree. Create voice commands to voice dial, answer or reject calls. Voice commands cannot be saved on the SIM card.

### **To activate voice dialing and record names**

- **Settings** ► **General** ► **Voice Control**  
 ► **Voice Dialing** ► **Activate** ► **Yes**  
 ► **New Voice Cmd**. Select a contact.
- Select the phone number to add the voice command to. Record a voice command such as “John mobile”.
- Instructions appear. Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say the command that you want to record. The voice command is played back to you.
- If the recording is ok select **Yes**, if not **No** and record again. You can change the recording later by selecting **Edit Names** or **New Voice Cmd**.  
 ► **Add**.



*Turn the Media Player off before using voice dialing. Scroll to the Media Player and press **5** to turn off.*

## Calling

### **To activate voice answering and record voice answer commands**

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Voice Control ▶ Voice Answer ▶ Activate.
- 2 Instructions appear. ▶ **Continue** and lift the phone to your ear. Wait for the tone and say “Answer”, or another word. If the recording is ok ▶ **Yes**. If not ▶ **No** and record again.
- 3 Say “Busy”, or another word ▶ **Yes**.

Follow the instructions that appear, save when finished.



*You cannot use voice answering if you have selected an MP3 file as ringtone.*

### **The magic word**

Record and use a voice command as a magic word to activate voice control without pressing any keys. The magic word can only be used with a handsfree or a Bluetooth™ headset.

### **To activate and record the magic word**

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Voice Control ▶ Magic Word ▶ Activate.
- 2 Follow the instructions that appear, save when finished.

### **To use voice dialing**

- Without a handsfree: from standby, press and hold **Calls** and say the name.
- With a handsfree: say your magic word or press the call handling button. Wait for the tone and say the name you recorded earlier, for example “John mobile”, the call connects.

### **To answer or reject a call**

When the phone rings, say “Answer” or say “Busy”.

### **Play caller name**

Hear your recorded voice commands for contacts names when receiving a call.

### **To turn the caller name on or off**

- ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Voice Control ▶ Play Caller Name.

### **To edit your voice commands**

- ▶ **Contacts** select the contact ▶ **More** ▶ **Edit Contact**. Scroll to the relevant tab and edit your voice command.



## Forwarding Calls

Forward calls, for example, to an answering service.



*When the Restrict calls function is activated, some Forward calls options are not available.*

### To activate a call forward

- 1 ▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Forward Calls.
- 2 Select a call type and forward option ▶ Activate.
- 3 Enter a phone number to forward your calls to, or ▶ Lookup to find a contact ▶ OK.

### To deactivate a call forward

Scroll to the forward option ▶ Deactivate.

### To check all forward options

▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Forward Calls ▶ Check All.



## More Than One Call

Handle more than one call simultaneously.

### Call waiting service

When activated, you hear a beep if you receive a second call.

### To activate the call waiting service

- ▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Manage Calls ▶ Call Waiting
- ▶ Activate ▶ Select.

### To make a second call

- 1 ▶ More ▶ Hold to hold the ongoing call.
- 2 Enter the number to call ▶ Call.

### Receiving a second call

When you receive a second call, select one of the following options:

- To answer and put the ongoing call on hold, ▶ Answer.
- To reject and continue the ongoing call, ▶ Busy.
- To answer and end the ongoing call, ▶ Replace Active Call.

### Handling two calls

If you have calls ongoing and on hold, select one of the following options:

- To switch between the two calls, ▶ More ▶ Switch.
- To join the two calls, ▶ More ▶ Join Calls.
- To connect the two calls, ▶ More ▶ Transfer Call. You are disconnected from both calls.
- To retrieve the held call, ▶ End Call ▶ Yes.
- To end both calls, ▶ End Call ▶ No.

## Calling



*You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls or joining them into a conference call.*

### **Conference calls**

Start a conference call by joining an ongoing call and a call on hold. You then put the conference on hold to call and add up to five participants or just to make another call.

#### **To join the two calls into a conference call**

► More ► Join Calls.

#### **To add a new participant**

- 1 ► More ► Hold to put the joined calls on hold.
- 2 ► More ► Add Call and call the next person.
- 3 ► More ► Join Calls.
- 4 Repeat the procedure to include more participants.

#### **To release a participant**

► More ► Release Party and select the participant.

#### **To have a private conversation**

- 1 ► More ► Talk to and select the participant.
- 2 ► More ► Join Calls to resume the conference call.

### **Two voice lines**

Make separate calls with different phone numbers if your subscription supports alternate line service.

#### **To select a line for outgoing calls**

► Settings ► Calls and select line 1 or 2.

#### **To change the name of a line**

► Settings ► Display ► Edit Line Names and select the line to edit.

## **My Numbers**

View, add and edit your own phone numbers.

#### **To check your phone numbers**

► Contacts ► Options ► Special Numbers  
► My Numbers and select one of the options.

## **Accept Calls**

Receive calls only from certain phone numbers.

#### **To add numbers to the accepted callers list**


- 1 ► Settings ► Calls ► Manage Calls  
► Accept Calls ► Only from List.
- 2 ► Edit ► New ► Add. Select a contact.

**To accept all calls**

- ▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Manage Calls ▶ Accept Calls
- ▶ All Callers.

 **Restricted Dialing**

Restrict outgoing and incoming calls when at home or abroad. You need a password from your service provider.

 *If you forward incoming calls, you cannot activate some Restrict calls options.*

The following calls can be restricted:


- **All Outgoing** – all outgoing calls.
- **Outgoing Intl.** – all outgoing international calls.
- **Outgoing Intl Roam** – all outgoing international calls except to your home country.
- **All Incoming** – all incoming calls.
- **Inc. When Roaming** – all incoming calls when you are abroad (when roaming).

**To activate or deactivate a call restriction**


- 1** ▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Manage Calls ▶ Restrict Calls and select an option.
- 2** Select **Activate** or **Deactivate** and enter your password ▶ OK.

 **Fixed Dialing**

The fixed dialing function allows calls to be made only to certain numbers saved on the SIM card. The fixed numbers are protected by your PIN2.

 *You can still call the international emergency numbers even when the fixed dialing function is activated.*

Partial numbers can be saved. For example, saving 0123456 allows calls to be made to all numbers starting with 0123456.

 *When fixed dialing is activated, you cannot view or manage any phone numbers saved on the SIM card.*

**To activate or deactivate fixed dialing**

- 1** ▶ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ Special Numbers ▶ Fixed Dialing.
- 2** Select **Activate** or **Deactivate**.
- 3** Enter your PIN2 ▶ OK and then ▶ OK again to confirm.

**To save a fixed number**

- ▶ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ Special Numbers
- ▶ Fixed Dialing ▶ Fixed Numbers ▶ New Number and enter the information.

### Additional Calling Functions

#### Tone signals

Use telephone banking services or control an answering machine by sending tone signals during a call.

Connect to a POP3 or IMAP4 mail server to send and receive email messages with your phone. You can use the same email settings in your phone as in your computer email program.

With a POP3 email account, messages are downloaded to each computer or device used for access. With an IMAP4 email account, messages can be kept on the server, which makes it easier to manage your email from multiple computers and devices.

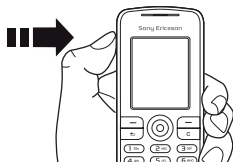

### To take pictures and video clips



- 1 Press and hold  to start the camera, press  or  to switch between video and photo.
- 2 Press  again to take the picture or start the video.
- 3 To end video recording, press again.



 Alternatively, you can select Camera to start the camera, and then Capture to take the picture or Record to start the video.

*If you try to record a strong light source such as direct sunlight or a lamp, the screen may black out or the picture may be distorted.*

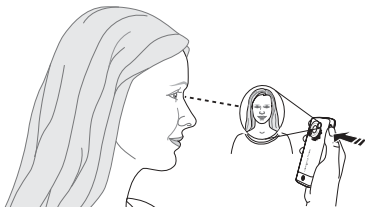

### To take a self-portrait



- 1 Hold the phone as shown in the illustration. You can see your reflection in the mirror provided.
- 2 Press and hold  to activate the camera. Press  again to take the picture.

### Camera options

When the camera is activated ► **More** to view more options:

- **View All Clips** (video).
- **Shoot Mode** (video) – choose between **For Picture Msg** and **High-Quality Video**.
- **Video Size** – choose between **Large 176x144** and **Small 128x96**.


- **Night Mode** – enhance picture quality in poor lighting conditions with longer exposure time.
- **Effects** – select different effects for your picture or video.
- **View All Pictures** (pictures).
- **Shoot Mode** (pictures) – select from **Normal** for no frame, **Panorama** to combine a few pictures into one wide picture, **Frames** to add a frame to your picture and **Burst** to take a few pictures in rapid succession.
- **Picture Size** – choose between **Large 1280x1024**, **Medium 640x480** and **Small 160x120**.
- **Self-Timer** (pictures) – the picture is taken a few seconds after you press the camera button.
- **Picture Quality** – choose between **Normal** and **Fine** picture quality.
- **Shutter Sound** (pictures) – select different shutter sounds.

### Saving and sending pictures and video clips

When you have taken a picture or recorded a video clip, it is saved in the phone memory. You can send the picture or video clip instantly in a picture message. To exchange pictures and video clips using other transfer methods ► *32 Exchanging pictures and video clips*.

### Pictures and Video Clips

Your phone comes with one or more pictures and video clips, which you can delete to free memory. All pictures and videos are saved in **File Manager**. When you have taken a picture, you can also access it by selecting **Camera Pictures**. You can use a picture as a screen saver, wallpaper, or for a phone contact ➤ *14 To add a picture or a ringtone to a contact*. You can send and receive pictures and video clips using a transfer method. The number of pictures or video clips that you can save depends on the size of the files. There is support for GIF, JPEG, WBMP, BMP, PNG, SVG-Tiny, MP4 and 3GP.

 *Animations are handled like pictures.*

#### To view your pictures

- 1 Select **Camera Pictures** or **File Manager** ▶ **Pictures** and select a picture in a folder.
- 2 Pictures are shown in thumbnail, for full view ▶ **View**.
- 3 ▶ **Horizontal** to view the picture horizontally.
- 4 ▶ **More** to display options, for example **Rotate**, or **Slide Show**, where all pictures in the folder are displayed in a slide show.

#### To view your video clips

- 1 ▶ **File Manager** ▶ **Videos** and select a video clip in a folder.
- 2 ▶ **View** ▶ **Play**.
- 3 ▶ **Stop** to stop the video clip, ▶ **More** to display options, for example **Horizontal**, or **VideoDJ?**, to edit the video clip.

#### To search camera pictures by time line

To view video clips that have been transferred to your computer, use QuickTime™ player software found on the CD that comes with your phone.

**Screen saver and wallpaper**

The screen saver activates when in idle mode for a few seconds. After a few more seconds sleep mode activates, to save power. If you have a picture as wallpaper, this picture is shown in standby mode.

Play music and video clips that you download or receive in a picture message or transfer from your computer. The following file types are supported: MP3, MP4, 3GP, AAC, AMR, MIDI, IMY, EMY and WAV (16 kHz maximum sample rate). You can also use streamed files that are 3GPP compatible.

### Transferring music

Disc2Phone computer software and USB drivers are included on the CD that comes with your phone. Use Disc2Phone to transfer music from CDs or your computer to your phone memory.



*Before installing any new or updated version of the computer software, all previous software related to phone communication has to be uninstalled. It is recommended to uninstall from the Add/Remove Programs in the Control Panel (Windows).*

### Music and video clips

Play music and video clips saved in your phone. The music list keeps on playing until you press **Stop**.

#### To play music or view a video clip

- 1 ▶ **Media Player** and browse for songs by selecting **Artists**, **Tracks**, **Playlists** or **Videos**.
- 2 Highlight a title ▶ **Play**.



#### Media player controls



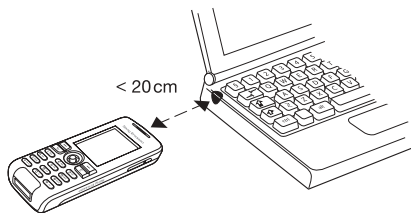

- Enter details ▶ Continue to confirm each entry ▶ Select to confirm appointment.

**To view an appointment**

**To set reminders options**

### Stopwatch



Your phone has a stopwatch that can save several laps.



## More Features

### SIM card lock

The SIM card lock protects your subscription, but not your phone itself, from unauthorized use. If you change SIM cards, the phone still works with the new SIM card.

Most SIM cards are locked at the time of purchase. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter a PIN (Personal Identity Number) every time you turn on your phone.

If you enter your PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked. This is indicated by the message **PIN Blocked**. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key). Your PIN and PUK are supplied by your service provider. You can edit your PIN and select a new four- to eight-digit PIN.

 *If the message **Codes do not match**, appears when you edit your PIN, you entered the new PIN incorrectly. If the message **Wrong PIN**, appears, followed by **Old PIN:**, you entered your old PIN incorrectly.*

### To unblock your SIM card

- 1 When **PIN Blocked** is displayed, enter your PUK ► **OK**.
- 2 Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ► **OK**.
- 3 Re-enter the new PIN to confirm ► **OK**.

### To edit your PIN


- 1 ► **Settings** ► **General** ► **Locks** ► **SIM Lock** ► **Change PIN**.
- 2 Enter your PIN ► **OK**.
- 3 Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ► **OK**.
- 4 Re-enter the new PIN to confirm ► **OK**.

### To turn the SIM card lock on or off

- 1 ► **Settings** ► **General** ► **Locks** ► **SIM Lock** ► **Protection** and select **On** or **Off**.
- 2 Enter your PIN ► **OK**.

### Keypad lock

Lock the keypad to avoid dialing a number by accident. You can still answer an incoming call and the keypad locks again after it. The keypad remains locked until you unlock it manually.

 *Calls to the international emergency number, for example, 112 or 911, can still be made, even when the keypad is locked.*

### To lock and unlock the keypad manually

- Press **\*aA** ► **Lock Keys**.
- To unlock the keypad, press **\*aA** ► **Unlock**.

**Automatic key lock**

Automatic key lock in standby means the keypad is locked a short while after you last press a key.

**To set the automatic key lock**

► Settings ► General ► Locks ► Automatic Keylock.

**Phone lock**

The phone lock protects the phone against unauthorized use if it is stolen and the SIM card is exchanged. You can change the phone lock code (0000) to any four- to eight-digit personal code.

**Phone lock on**

If the phone lock is on, enter your code ► OK.

**Automatic phone lock**

If the phone lock is set to automatic, you do not need to enter your phone lock code until a different SIM card is inserted in the phone.



*It is important that you remember your new code. If you should forget it, you have to hand in your phone to your local Sony Ericsson retailer.*

**To set the phone lock**

- 1 ► Settings ► General ► Locks ► Phone Lock ► Protection and select an option.
- 2 Enter the phone lock code ► OK.

**To edit your phone lock code**

► Settings ► General ► Locks ► Phone Lock ► Change Code.

**Code Memo**

Save security codes, such as for credit cards, in the code memo. Set a passcode to open the code memo.

**Checkword and security**

To confirm that you have entered the correct passcode for the code memo you must enter a checkword. When you enter your passcode to open the code memo, the checkword is shown for a short time. If the passcode is correct, the correct codes are shown. If you enter the incorrect passcode, the checkword and the codes that are shown are also incorrect.

## Troubleshooting

*Why doesn't the phone work the way I want?*

Some problems require that you call your service provider, but most of the problems you can easily correct yourself.

Before handing your phone in for repair, copy all saved items, messages and information to another device as content may be lost during repair.

The talk and standby times depend on several different conditions such as signal strength, operating temperature, application usage patterns, features selected and voice or data transmissions when using the mobile phone.

Turn off your mobile phone before removing the battery. Do not allow the battery to be put into the mouth. Battery electrolytes may be toxic if swallowed.
