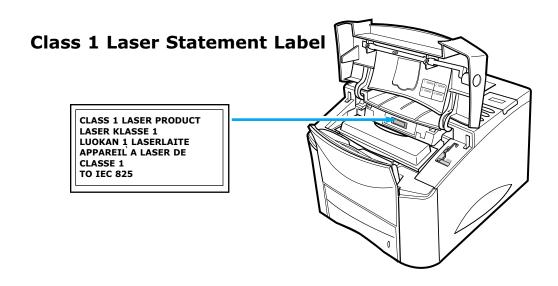

Replacing the fitted plug (UK Only)

Important

The mains lead for this machine is fitted with a standard (BS 1363) 13 amp plug and 13 amp fuse. When you change or examine the fuse, you must re-fit the correct 13 amp fuse. You then need to replace the fuse cover. If you have lost the fuse cover, do not use the plug until you get another fuse cover from the people who sold you the machine.

The 13 amp plug is the most widely used type in the UK. However, some buildings (mainly old ones) do not have normal 13 amp plug sockets. You need to buy a suitable plug adaptor. Do not remove the moulded plug.

Warning

If you cut off the moulded plug, get rid of it straight away. You cannot rewire the plug or you may get an electric shock if you put it into a socket.

Important warning: You must earth this machine.

The wires in the mains lead use the following colour code:

Green and Yellow : Earth
Blue : Neutral
Brown : Live

If the wires in the mains lead do not match the colours marked in your plug, do the following:

You must connect the blue wire to the pin which is marked with the letter 'N' or coloured black.

You must connect the brown wire to the pin which is marked with the letter 'L' or coloured red.

You must have a 13 amp fuse in the plug, adaptor, or at the distribution board.

Safety Precautions

Before using the printer, please read the instructions in this guide carefully and put the guide in a safe place close to the printer, so that it is available when you need it later. Please take the following precautions when using and maintaining your printer.

- Unplug the printer before cleaning it. Do Not use any liquid or aerosol cleaners. Simply use a damp cloth. Refer to the page of this guide for further details.
- Do Not place the printer on an unstable surface or close to a radiator or source of heat.
- Take care not to block or cover the ventilation holes on the side of the printer. Do Not insert any object in these holes.
- Check that the electrical power source to which you wish to connect the printer complies with the electrical specifications of this printer: (100 ~ 240V) - Power cord may differ from one country to another.
- Connect all your computer equipment, including the printer to a power point with earthing device. Avoid plugging your printer into the same power point as equipment likely to cause voltage variations, such as a photocopying machine or an air conditioner.
- Check regularly that the power cable is in good condition and is not damaged in any way.
- If you use an extension cord, check that total intensity of all equipment connected to it does not exceed the maximum intensity allowed for the extention cord. Check that the total intensity of the equipment connected to the same power point does not exceed 15 amps.
- Unless otherwise indicated in this guide, do not attempt to repair the printer yourself. Should you detect a fault, return your printer to an authorized service center or your dealer.
- Systematically return your printer to an authorised service center or your local dealer if one of the following situations occurs:
 - The power cord or plug is damaged.
 - A liquid has been spilled on and/or in the printer.
 - The printer has fallen or been dropped or the bodywork is damaged in any way.
 - The printer is not operating correctly or you have noticed a significant drop in the quality of the printing.

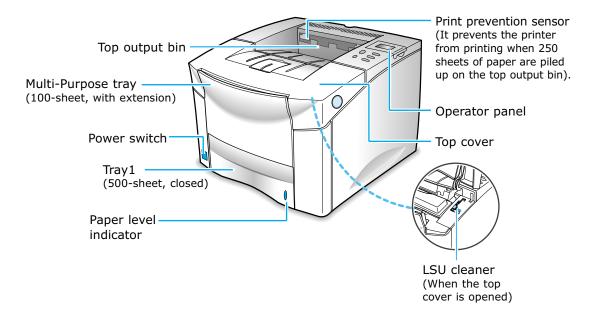

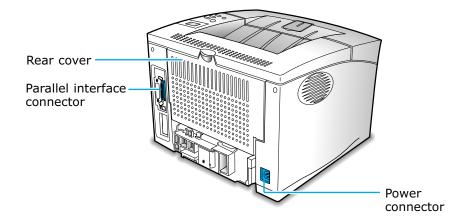
Front View

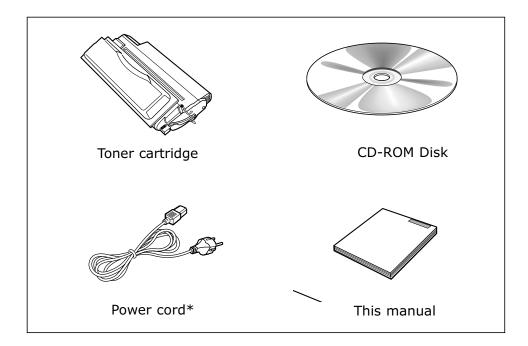

Unpacking Your Printer

Items Supplied

When you start unpacking the box of your printer, you will find the following items in addition to your printer.



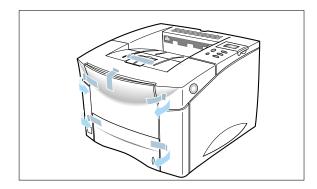

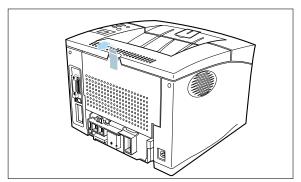
- A printer cable is not included in the package items.
- Cable specifications
 - The parallel cable should be compatible with the centronics® parallel interface and IEEE standard 1284.
- * Power cord may differ from one country to another.

Preparation

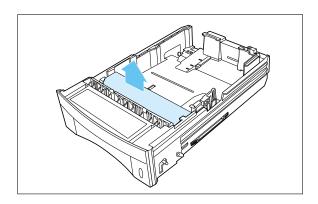
During the storage and transport of your printer, adhesive tape is used to block some of the elements that may move or open unexpectedly and consequently be damaged.

1 Before connecting up your printer and starting to use it, you must remove all the adhesive tapes, as illustrated in the figure below.





2 Slide the tray out of the printer. Remove the packaging material from the tray.





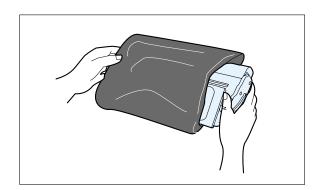
Installing Toner Cartridge

To install a toner cartridge in your printer proceed as follows.

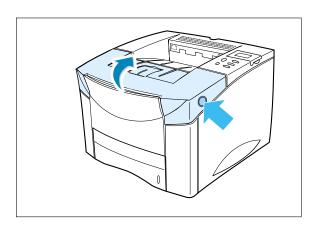
1 Remove the toner cartridge from its packaging.



- **Notes:** Do not remove the cartridge from its packaging until you are ready to use it.
 - Do not expose the cartridge to light, it could damage the cartridge permanently.

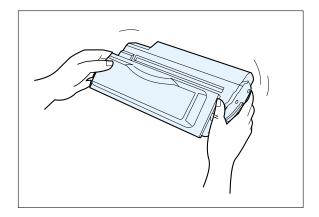


2 Open the top cover of the printer by pressing the button on the right side of the printer.

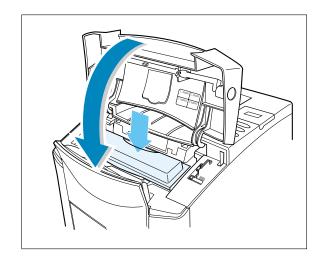


Installing Toner Cartridge

3 Rotate the cartridge and gently shake it from side to side to distribute the toner evenly inside the cartridge.



4 Position the cartridge as shown with the arrow pointing into the printer. Slide the cartridge into the printer as far as it will go.



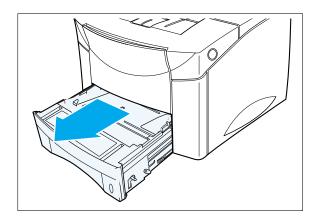
5 Close the top cover.

Notes: If toner gets on your clothing, wipe it off with a dry cloth and wash clothing in cold water. When printing text at 5% coverage, a toner cartridge lasts an average of 10,000pages in simplex mode.



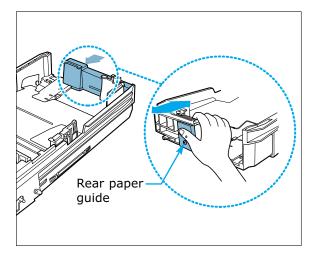
To load paper in the tray, proceed as follows.

1 Pull the Tray1 completely out of the printer.

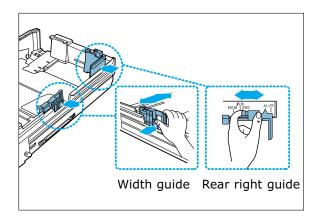


2 Squeeze the back of the rear paper guide and slide it to the desired paper size until it clicks into place.

The paper sizes are indicated on the bottom of the tray1.

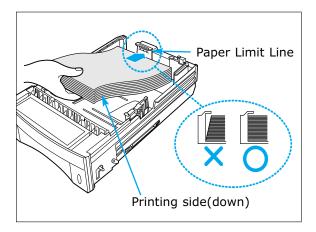


- 3 Lift the rear right guide and slide it to match the width of the paper. The paper sizes are indicated on the bottom of the tray.
- 4 Squeeze the width guide and slide it to the far right side of the tray.



Notes: If the tray is not properly adjusted, the printer might display an error message or paper might jam.

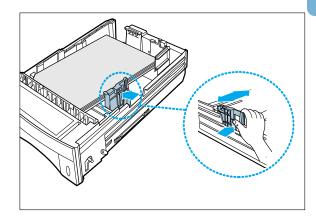
5 Place the paper against the rear paper guide as shown.



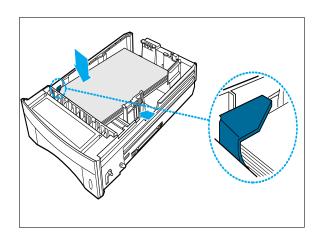
Notes: • Do not fold or crease the paper.

- Place the paper with the recommended print side face down.
- Don't exceed the paper limit line indicated on the tray.

6 Squeeze the width guide and slide it to the left until it lightly rests against the edge of the paper.

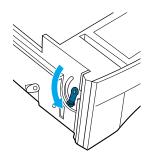


7 Make sure the paper is under the tab on the tray.



8 Gently slide the tray back into the printer. The printer automatically senses the size of paper loaded if the tray1 is adjusted correctly.

Notes: If jam 0 often occurs when 24lb letter, legal or folio size paper is used, push down the lever on the left side of the tray as shown in the figure to ensure proper paper feeding.





Connecting the Parallel Cable

To print from computer software, you need to connect your printer to your computer with a parallel interface cable.

Cable Specifications (Not provided)

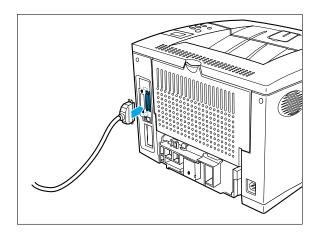
The parallel cable should be compatible with the Centronics® parallel interface and IEEE standard 1284. If you purchase a parallel cable, ensure that it:

- Is compatible with Centronics interface.
- Supports bi-directional communications(IEEE standard 1284).
- Is shielded.
- Has the appropriate connector:
 - 25 pin D-Sub connector on the computer side.
 - Amphenol 36 connector on the printer side.

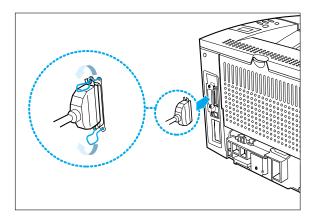
Connecting the Parallel Cable

To connect the printer to your computer use a parallel cable and proceed as follows.

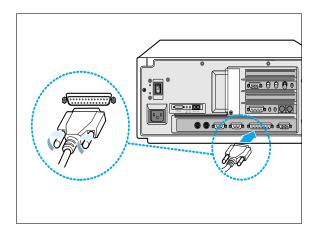
- 1 Check that both the printer and the computer to which it is to be connected are powered off and disconnected from the power point.
- 2 Plug the appropriate end of the parallel cable into the connector on the rear of the printer.



3 Push the clip at each end of the connector down into the notches on the plug as shown.



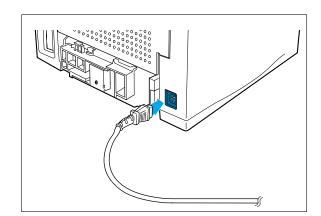
4 Plug the other end of the cable into the appropriate parallel connector on your computer and tighten the screws.



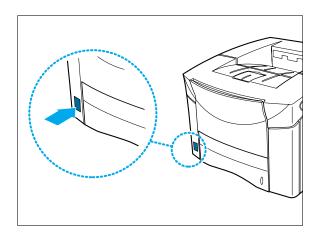
Connecting the AC Power Cord

To connect the printer to a power point, proceed as follows.

- 1 Plug the appropriate end of the supplied power cable to the connector on the rear of the printer.
- Plug the other end into a suitable power point.
 - Power cord may differ from one country to another.



3 Power the printer on by pressing the power on/off button.



Result: You will hear some movement inside the printer.
The printer enters the Ready state.



Testing the Printer!

Print a configuration page to make sure the printer is operating correctly.

Make sure that the READY status message appears on the display.



Press On Line.

Result: The OFFLINE message appears on the display and the printer is off-line.



- 3 Press Menu > or < Menu to enter the menus.</p>
- 4 Press Menu > or < Menu one or more times until the TEST MENU message is displayed.



5 Press Item> or <Item one or more times until the SELFTEST message is displayed.



6 Press Enter to print.

Notes: • The message 'PRINTING PCL6' appears and remains on the display until the page prints.

• The printer returns to the Ready state after printing.



Setting Up the Printer Driver

The printer drivers provided on the CD must be installed to take full advantage of the printer's features.

Printer drivers access the printer features and allow the computer to communicate with the printer.

If you install the printer driver using the CD, PCL 6 is installed. The CD includes the following printer drivers.

- PCL 6
 - You can use the PCL 6 driver in Windows 95, Windows 98, Windows NT 4.0 and Windows 2000.
 - The PCL6 driver supports Watermark, Overlay, N-Up and Poster printing.
- Postscript.
- Font Navigator.
- Linux Driver.

Notes: • You cannot use PostScript in Windows 3.1.

• PCL 6 is the combination of the PCL 5e driver and the new PCLXL printer language.

Installing the Driver

Software Requirements

To install and run the printer driver, you must be running one of the following platforms.

- Macintosh System 7.5 or later.

Install Procedure

To install the printer driver on your hard disk, make backup copies of the print driver CD. Keep the original CD in a safe place and use the copies.

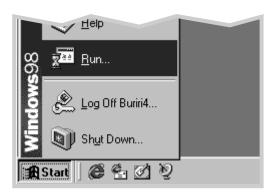

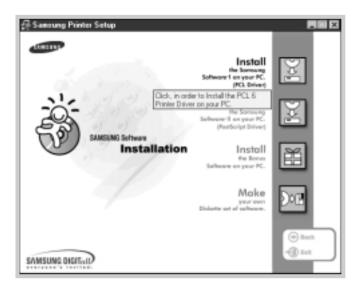

Uninstalling the Printer Driver

An uninstall utility is supplied with the printer driver to enable you to remove the driver and all associated files from your hard disk, if so required. To uninstall the driver, proceed as follows.

Select Start → Programs → Samsung ML-7300 → Samsung ML-7300 **Driver uninstall** from the windows task bar.

The PCL 6 driver is removed from your hard disk.

Installing the Font Navigator (FontNav)

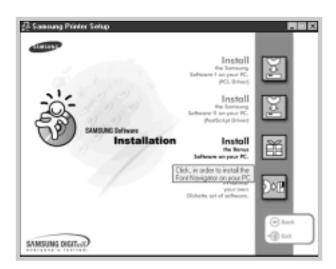

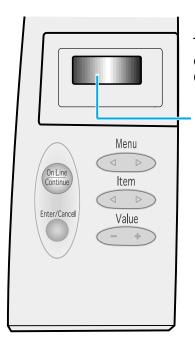

Operator Panel Buttons

LCD panel



The operator panel, on the front right side of your printer, has a 2-line LCD(Liquid Crystal Display) and five buttons.

Using Panel Buttons

Use the five operator panel buttons to open a menu, scroll through a list of values, change printer settings, and respond to printer messages.

The following table describes the functions of each button.

Button	Function
On Line/Continue	 Places the printer either online or offline. Allows the printer, to continue printing when the printer is in recoverable error state.
Enter/Cancel	 Cancels the print job that the printer is processing when the printer is online. Saves the selected value for that item when the printer is offline.
Menu	Cycles through the operator panel menus.
Item	Cycles through the selected menu's items.
Value	Cycles through the selected menu item's values.

Operator Panel Menus

A number of menus are available to make it easy for you to change printer settings. Some menus are displayed only if a specific option is installed in the printer. When you select a new setting from the operator panel, the asterisk(*) moves next to the selected setting to identify it as the current user default setting.

Notes: Changes made from a software application override the user default settings made from the printer operator panel.

Changing Printer Setting

To change an operator panel setting, proceed as follows.

- 1 Make sure the 'READY' message appears on the display.
- 2 Press On Line.

Result: The 'OFFLINE' message appears on the display and the printer is off-line.

- 3 Press Menu until the menu you need appears on the display.
- 4 Press Item until the menu item you need appears on the display.
- 5 Press Value until the setting you need appears on the display.
- 6 Press Enter to save the selection.

Result : An asterisk(*) appears beside the current user default setting for that menu item.

A value can be:

- A phrase or word that describes a setting.
- A numerical value that you can increase or decrease.
- An On or Off setting.

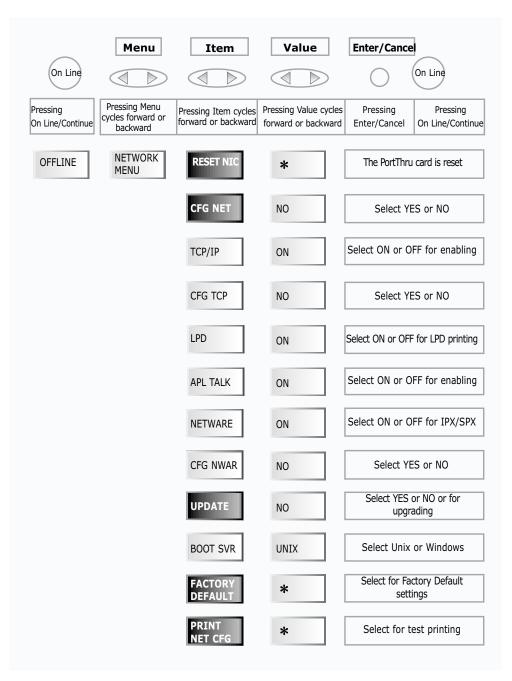

Upgrading the Firmware



- 1 Set **UPDATE** to **YES** in the Network menu on the printer front panel.
- Set BOOT SVR to UNIX.
- 3 Reset the printer.
- 4 It may take 3 minutes to reboot the printer. Rebooting time depends on network traffic.
 - **Notes:** Firmware upgrading requires Tftp protocol. Check whether Tftp daemon is installed in advance.
 - Setting IP Address Assignment Method to DHCP is recommended in order to execute Firmware upgrading.

Upgrading the Firmware in Abnormal Cases

Any error in the process of upgrading may result in disabling PortThru. In this case, perform the following steps.

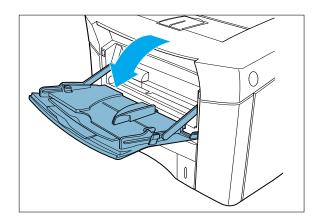
Loading Paper

Using the Multi-Purpose Tray

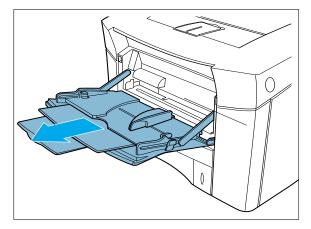
Multi-Purpose tray provides a convenient way to print envelopes, transparencies, or other type of media without having to unload the other tray.

To load paper in the Multi-Purpose tray, proceed as follows.

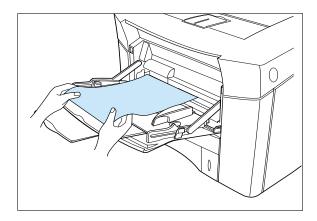
1 Pull the Multi-Purpose tray towards you.



2 Slide the length guide out toward you.



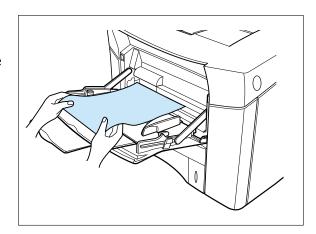
3 Flex the sheets back and forth to loosen them, then fan them.



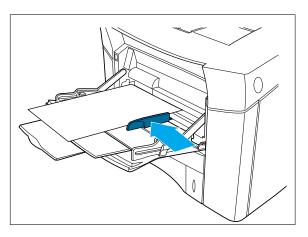
Notes: • Do not fold or crease the paper.

• Place the paper with the recommended print side face up.

4 Place the paper against the side of the Multi-Purpose tray with the recommended print side face up and the top edge going in first toward the printer as shown.



5 Adjust the paper guide to the size of the paper inserted by pushing the guide.



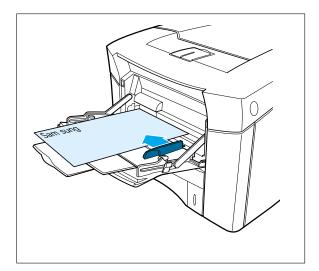
Using the Manual Feed

The Manual Feed feature allows you to print from the Multi-Purpose tray onto special media such as envelopes or letterhead.

If the Tray menu item is set to Manual, the printer will print only from the Multi-Purpose tray.

Manual Feed can be selected through the software or printer driver too.

- Select Manual as the paper source.
 - Set the source item in the properties dialogue box to Manual.
 - You can select Manual as the paper source by setting the Tray item using the operator panel menu.
- 2 Print your document.
- 3 Place a sheet of paper in the Multi-Purpose tray.
- 4 Press continue key when you are prompted.



Letterhead / Prepunched Paper

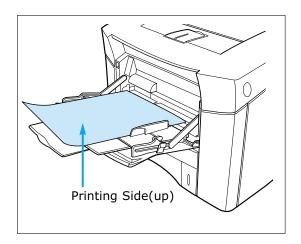
Special paper includes letterhead, prepunched, envelopes, labels, and transparencies.

When printing letterhead and prepunched paper, it is important to load the trays with the correct orientation.

For Multi-Purpose tray,

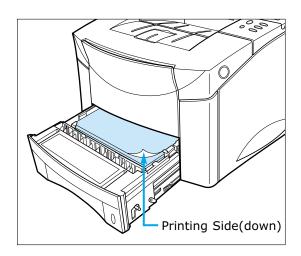
Load the paper with the side-to-beprinted facing up, and the top, short edge toward the printer.

- Set the source item in the properties dialogue box to Manual or MP.
 - To print continuously from Multi-Purpose tray, set the source item to MP.
 - To print a sheet of paper from Multi-Purpose tray, set the source item to Manual.



For ALL other trays,

Load paper with the side-to-beprinted facing down, and the top, short edge toward you.



Envelopes

Many types of envelopes can be printed from the Multi-Purpose tray. The types of envelopes are COM-10, MONARCH, DL, C5 and C6($60 \sim 90 \text{g/m}^2$). The printer will automatically feed up to 10 envelopes. Printing performance depends on the construction of the envelope.

Printing information

- Set margins at least 0.6inch(15mm) from the edge of the envelope.
- Always test a few sample envelopes before purchasing large quantities.
- Select THICK paper for better quality.

Envelopes quidelines

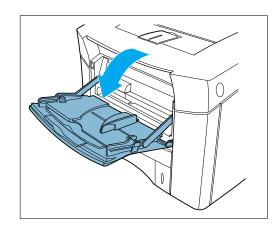
For best performance, use envelopes made from 75g/m²(20lb bond) paper.

Do not use envelopes that:

- Are damaged in any way.
- Use metal claps, string ties, metal folding bars.
- Contain windows, holes, cutouts or embossing.
- Have exposed flap adhesive when the flap is in the sealed or closed position. For envelope specifications, see page Appendix A.4.

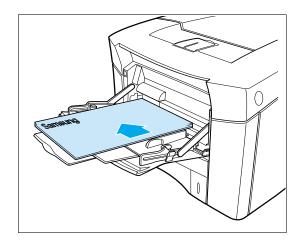
Loading envelopes

1 Open the Multi-Purpose tray. Pull out the extension.

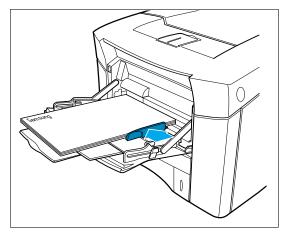


Loading Paper

2 Load up to 10 envelopes in the left side of Multi-Purpose tray with the side-to-be printed facing up, and the postage-end toward the printer.



3 Adjust the guide to touch the envelope stack without bending the envelopes.



4 Set the source item in the properties dialogue box to Manual or MP.

Notes: Do not use an envelope curled down side, refer to the figure.



Label

Labels automatically feed from the Multi-Purpose tray or the other trays.

Label guidelines

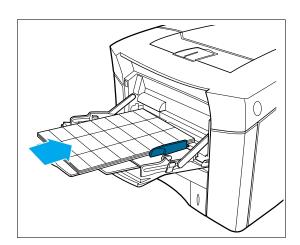
Make sure that labels meet the specifications for the tray you use.

- Use full label sheet. Partial sheets may cause labels to peel off during printing, resulting in a paper jam.
- The adhesive material should be stable at 400°F(205°C), the printers maximum temperature.
- Do not use labels that have the backing sheet exposed.

Notes: Do not print on both sides of labels.

Label orientation

• For Multi-Purpose tray, load the labels with the side-to-be-printed facing up, and the short edge toward the printer. Print a stack of 25 labels from Multi-Purpose tray.



Transparencies

Transparencies automatically feed from the Multi-Purpose tray or the other trays. Some brand of transparencies may require manual feeding.

The Multi-Purpose tray is a tray that holds up to 25 sheets of A4 or Letter size paper.

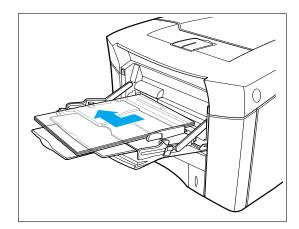
Transparencies guidelines

- Use only transparencies recommended for use in laser printers.
- Place transparencies on a flat surface to cool after removing them from the printer.

Transparencies orientation

 For Multi-Purpose tray, load the transparencies with side-to-be-printed facing up, and the top toward the printer.

Print a stack of 25 transparencies from the Multi-Purpose tray.



- Notes: Because transparencies are heavier than paper, do not load the trays to capacity.
 - Remove each transparency from the output bin before printing another.

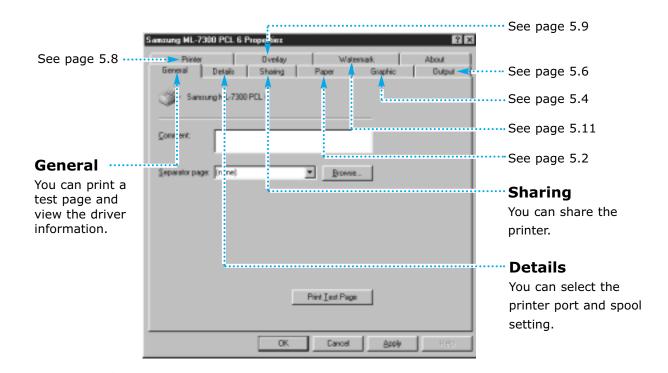
Using Features in the Printer Driver

When you print from a software application, many of the printer's features are available from the printer driver.

To change the settings from a software application, follow this procedure.

With Windows 95/98/NT 4.0/2000

- 1 Select Start-Settings-Printers from the Windows task bar.
- 2 Double-Click on the desired printer driver icon.
- 3 Select Printer-Properties.
- 4 Click on the appropriate tab.
- 5 Select the required options.



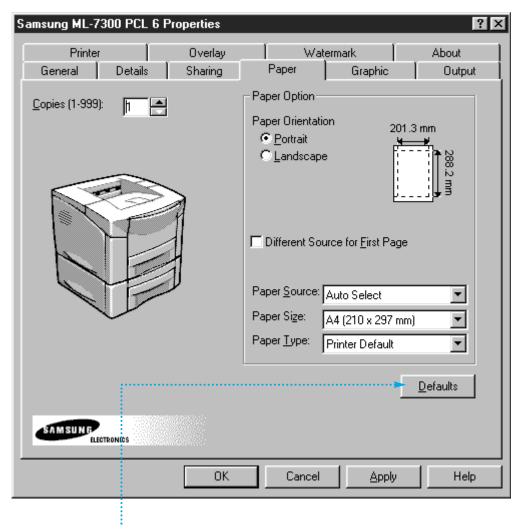

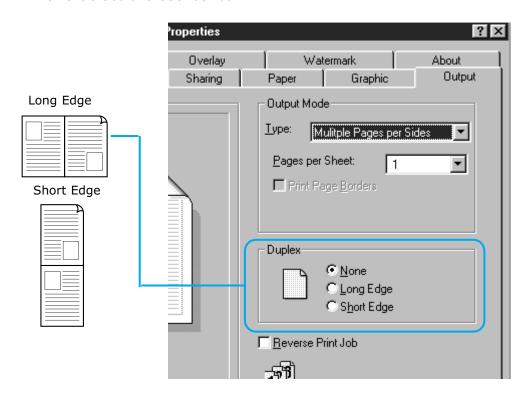
• For duplex printing, it is recommended to print less than 1,500 pages a day to keep a good image quiality.

Maintaining Your Printer

This chapter provides suggestions for high-quality and economical printing and information for maintaining the toner cartridge and the printer.

Toner Cartridge

Toner cartridge storage

Do not remove the toner cartridge from its package until you are ready to use it.

Notes: To prevent damage to toner cartridge, do not expose it to light.

Toner cartridge life

The life of the toner cartridge depends on the amount of toner that print jobs require.

When printing text at 5% coverage, a Samsung toner cartridge lasts an average of 10,000 pages in simplex mode, depending on which toner cartridge is installed. This assumes that print **DENSITY** and **ECONO** menu items are set to default.

Distributing the Toner

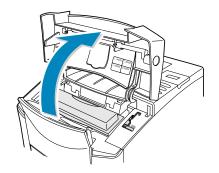
When toner is low, faded or light area might appear on a printed page.

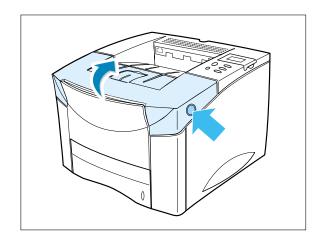
You might be able to temporarily improve print quality by distributing the toner.

Redistributing Toner

When toner is low, faded or light areas may appear on a printed page. You may be able to temporarily improve print quality by redistributing the toner. The following procedures may allow you to finish the current print job before replacing the toner cartridge.

1 Open the top cover by pushing the button on the side of the printer.

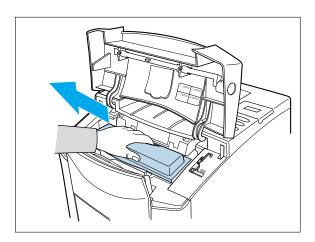




2 Remove the toner cartridge from the printer.

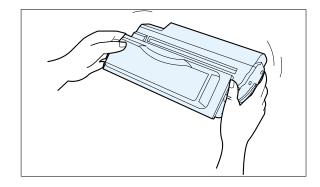
CAUTIONS:

- Avoid reaching too far into the printer. The fusing area may be hot.
- To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes.

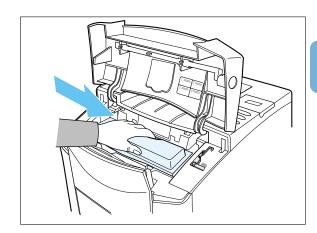


3 Gently shake the toner cartridge from side to side 5 or 6 times to redistribute the toner.

> **Notes:** If the toner gets on your clothing, wipe it off with a dry cloth and wash clothing in cold water. Hot water sets toner into fabric.



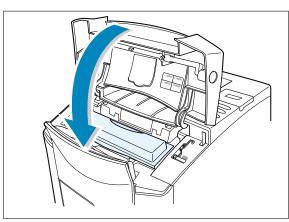
4 Reinsert the toner cartridge into the printer. Be sure that the toner cartridge is firmly in its place.



5 Firmly close the cover.



Remove the old cartridge and install a new toner cartridge. See "Installing Toner Cartridge" on page 2.3.



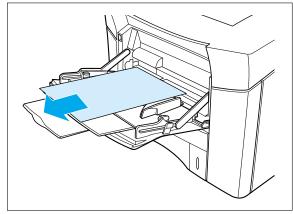
Cleaning the Printer

To maintain print quality, you should clean the printer.

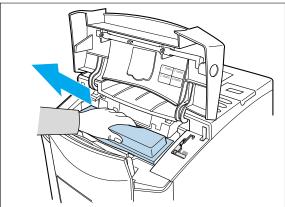
- Never use alcohol or solvent based cleaning agents to clean the printer as they may damage the printer casing and components.
- Never use a hard-bristled brush or abrasive pad.

To clean your printer, proceed as follows.

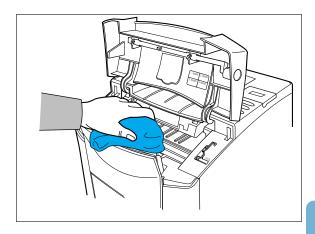
- 1 Check that the printer is powered off and disconnected from the power point.
- 2 Remove the paper from Multi-Purpose tray.



3 Open the top cover and remove the toner cartridge.



4 Use a soft cloth to remove any dust.



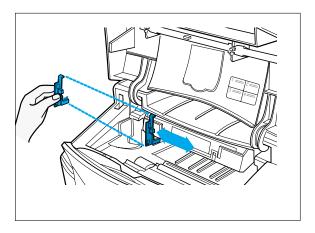
- 5 If the outer casing or the paper feed guides are dirty, clean them with a soft, clean cloth, slightly dampened with a gentle detergent.
- 6 Clean the inside of the printer with a damp cloth.
- 7 Replace the toner cartridge, close the top cover, plug in the power cord, and turn the printer on.

Notes: While cleaning the printer, be careful not to touch the transfer roller(the black, rubber roller, located underneath the toner cartridge). Skin oils on the roller can cause print quality problems.

Cleaning LSU

To obtain high quality from your printer, clean the **LSU(Laser Scanning Unit)** when characters have lines running through them.

- 1 Open the top cover and remove the toner cartridge.
- 2 Pull up on the LSU cleaner and put it on the LSU.
- 3 Slide the LSU cleaner horizontally across a track on the top of the LSU.



Notes: For more information on using method, see attached label on the inside of the top cover.

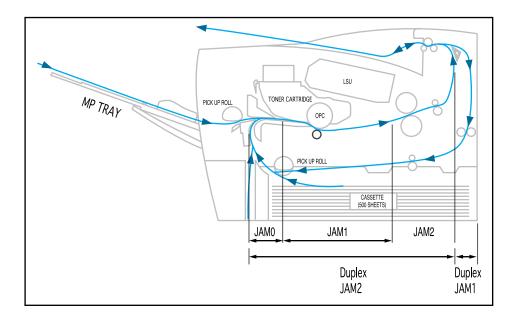

Clearing Paper Jams

If the printer's operator panel displays a paper jam message, look for paper in the locations indicated in the figure below, then perform the procedure for clearing the paper jam.

Notes: Be very careful not to tear the paper, when clearing paper jams. If a small piece of paper is left in the printer, it could cause additional jams.

Paper Jam Locations



Problem	Solution
'PAPER JAMO' message appears on the LCD	1 Slide the tray out of the printer, and remove any damaged paper from the tray.
	Notes: If the edge of the paper is visible in the feed area, slowly pull the paper down and out of the printer.

Error Messages

• Linux Driver Installation

Linux Driver Installation

This Linux driver is designed for Samsung ML-7300 Series printer and supports Linux Red Hat 6.0 or higher and Intel Linux. If your Linux version is not included, this driver might not work properly.

- Install Setup Script file configuration
 - a. /cdrom/linux/install.sh
 - b. /cdrom/linux/ssprt.db
 - c. /cdrom/linux/readme.txt

Installation

To install the driver, open the x terminal screen and take the following steps:

1. Mount the CD-ROM drive.

Notes: To mount the CD-ROM drive, you must be a super user or must be authorized to mount the CD-ROM by the super user. If you fail to mount the CD-ROM drive, ask the system administrator.

To mount the CD-ROM drive:

- 1 Insert the Samsung ML-7300 Series CD-ROM into the CD-ROM drive.
- Mount the CD-ROM drive under a directory like /mnt in order to access the files on the CD-ROM: >mount -t iso9660 /dev/cdrom /mnt/cdrom

2. Install setup script.

For details on installing the setup script, refer to the /cdrom/linux/readme.txt file.

Add the driver to the printer list by typing in: /cdrom/linux>install.sh (or) /cdrom/linux>./install.sh (if the path of the current working directory is not determined).

3. Set up the printer filter.

To set up:

- 1 Run **printtool** at x terminal.
- 2 To add the printer driver, click the **Add** button.
- 3 In the Add a Printer Entry window, decide the printer type you will use. Select **Local Printer** if you have a PCconnected printer.
- 4 Click the **OK** button.
- 5 If the Info button appears, ignore it, then click the OK button.
- 6 The Edit xxxx Entry window opens (where xxxx is the printer type you have selected at step 3).
 - If you are not an advanced user, do not change the Names/Spool Directory/File Limit in Kb/Printer Device option.
- 7 Click the Select button in the Input Filter to access filter setup.
- 8 Select **Samsung Printer PCL 5e Compatible** for the Printer Type item. Then select the default resolution and paper size.
- **9** To save the setting, press the **OK** button.
- 10 In the Edit xxxx Entry window, press the **OK** button to complete the printer driver installation.
- 11 You can find that the printer driver is added to the driver window. Select **Quit** from the **PrintTool** menu.
