



Power Supply:

Connect one end of the supplied power cord to the power jack on the unit rear panel and the other end to the AC100-240V wall outlet. If the unit will not be used for a long time, disconnect the plug from the outlet.

Power Management:

- Before plugging the power cord into the AC outlet, make sure that all the connections have been properly made.
- If the unit will not be used for a long period of time, disconnect the power and remove the batteries from the remote.

Unit's Front and Side Panel





1. TFT Panel

Present the high resolution picture.

2. Speaker

Output sound.

3. Remote Sensor

Sense the remote signal.

4. Power Indicator

Lights green under the normal use. Lights red in the standby mode.

5. MODE

Press to shift modes.

6. MENU

Press to display the system menu.

7. CH+

Press to skip channels forward.

It also works as the up direction button while working with the menu.

CH-

Press to skip channels backward.

It also works as the down direction button while working with the menu.

8. VOL+

Press to increase the volume.

It also works as the right direction button while working with the menu.

VOL-

Press to decrease the volume.

It also works as the left direction button while working with the menu.

9. POWER

Press to turn the power on/off.

10. OPEN/CLOSE

Press to open/close the disc room.

11. STOP

Press to stop the disc playback.

12. PLAY/PAUSE

Press to start/hold playback.

13. SLOW/STEP

Press to have the playback advanced in a slow motion, which would be futher slowed down for each time you pressed this button, if you pause the playback with the Play/Pause button and then repeatedly press this button, it will move step-by-step forward.

14. **NEXT**

Skip to the next DVD chapters/titles or CD tracks.

15. PREV




Wall Mounting

The TV case can be attached onto the wall, using the VESA standard mounting.

- 1. Release the screws and take off the unit stand.
- 2. Use VESA standard mountings to fix the unit onto the wall. Take care when mounting, it may cause damage or serious injury should it fall from the wall.

Press to enter/exit the standby mode.

2. CC

Set the Close Caption mode as CC on Mute/Off/On.

3. VOLUME +/-

Press to adjust the volume.

4. LCD SETUP

Press to show the TV setup menu.

5. DVD SETUP

Press to show the DVD setup menu.

6. OPEN/CLOSE

Press to take in/out the disc.

7. RETURN

Press to locate the previously viewed channel.

8. MTS/SOUND

Under the DVD mode, press to select the audio mode. Under the ATV mode, press to set the audio as MONO, STEREO or SAP.

Under the TV mode, press to set the audio language.

9. CHANNEL +/-

Press to skip channels.

10. Direction & OK button

When working with the systme menu, press the direction buttons to select the option, press OK to confirm settings.

11. EXIT

Press to exit the menu setup.

12. Numeric key pad

Press to input data.

13. MODE

Press to show the mode selective menu.

14. SLEEP

Press to set the sleep timer.

15. EPG

Press to show the Electronic Program Guide.

16. FAV

Press to show the Favorit Channel List. If no channel is set on the list, the button does not function.

17. INFO

Press to show the current working status.



Press to start/hold playback under the DVD mode.

24. Stop

Press to stop plalyback.

Press to search fast backward through a disc.

26. F.FWD

Press to search fast forward through a disc.

27. Program

Press to access the program menu.

28. Goto

Go to the desired section in a disc.

29. Menu

Press to show the root menu under the DVD mode.

30. Subtitle

Press to set the subtitle under the DVD mode.

31. A-B

Repeat a specified section A-B on a disc.

32. Slow/Step

Press to have the playback advanced in a slow motion, which would be futher slowed down for each time you pressed this button, if you pause the playback with the Play/Pause button and then repeatedly press this button, it will move step-by-step forward.

33. NEXT

Repeatedly press the button to skip forward through a disc.

34. PREV

Repeatedly press the button to skip backward through a disc.

35. Repeat

Press to repeat a special section on a disc.

36. Zoom

Press to zoom in/out the picture.

Remote Control

Preparation


- Remove the battery compartment cover located on the rear of the remote control. Insert 2 x "AAA" batteries, making sure to match their polarities (+/-) to the markings on the inside of the compartment. Replace the cover.
- Batteries in the remote will last for approximately 6 months under the normal use. Replace the batteries if the remote control does not work. Do not mix old with new batteries, or different types of batteries.
- Remove the batteries from the remote if it will not be used for a long period of time.

Warnings:

The battery used in this device may present a fire or chemical burn if mistreated. Do not recharge, disassemble, incinerate, or heat the battery (~212°F). Keep batteries away from children.

Using the Remote Control

To use the remote, point it at the remote sensor within 20 feet, by an angle of ±30 degrees.



The operating distance may vary depending on the brightness around.

Notes:

- 1. Do not point bright lights directly at the remote control sensor.
- 2. Do not place objects between the remote control unit and the remote control sensor.
- 3. Do not use this remote control for other equipments at the same time.

Cable Connections

Set the unit into the relative input/output mode to enable the signal pass.

2. Insert one end of the supplied power cord to the player's power jack and the other end to the 110-240V AC wall outlet.

Compoent Input1/2 (Y Cb/Pb Cr/Pr)

The component port is capable of accepting high-definition signals from standard video sources. (e.g., cable/satellite boxes, DVD players, VCRs, etc.)

- 1. Connect the Y/Pb/Pr port by the component cable to input the video signal.
- 2. Connect "R" "L" port by the supplied AV cable to input the audio signal. The red/white plug of the AV cable is for the audio conneciton and the yellow plug for the video connection.

S-Video Input

The S-Video port is capable of accepting signals from standard video sources. (e.g., cable/satellite boxes, DVD players, VCRs, etc.)

- 1. Connect the S-Video port by the S-Video cable to input the video signal.
- 2. Connect the AUDIO-L/R port by the supplied AV cable to input the audio signal.

Cable Connections

AV1/2 Input

The CVBS port is capable of accepting signals from standard video sources(e.g., cable/satellite boxes, DVD players, VCRs, etc.)

- 1. Connect the VIDEO port with the yellow plug of the the supplied AV cable.
- 2. Connect the L/R port with the red & white plug of the supplied AV cable to input the audio signal.

VGA Input


The VGA port of the TV is capable of accepting high-definition signals from computers with a VGA output jack. When used as a computer moniter, connect the VGA jack and the PC Audio In jack with a 15-Pin D-Sub cable and a 3.5mm stereo audio cable.


HDMI1/2 Input

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) is a new type of connection that transmits digital audio and video signals simultaneously over a single cable. A HDMI cable is required for the HDMI connection.


These HDMI input connectors are capable of receiving video at resolutions up to 1080p (1080-progressive).



Preparations

- 1. Connect the cables.(Refer to the "Cable Connections" section for details).
- 2. Press the POWER button to turn on the player.
- 3. Press the MODE button to select the TV signal mode.
- 4. Press the CH+/- buttons to skip channels. Or you can press the number buttons to input channels directly. For the initial use, you need to scan channels under the Channel Menu. See the "Channel Menu" section for details.



Adjust the PC Screen

Upon switching to the PC mode, the moniter will be automatically regulated for a proper functioning. If the result is not up to your expectation, please perform the following steps to adjust the screen manually .

- 1. Enter the "Advanced" sub-menu from the SETUP menu, select "Auto" and press the left/right direction button to adjust the monitor automatically.
- 2. Or if you still have problem with the monitor after, adjust "H-Pos", "V-Pos", "Clock" as well as "Phase" accordingly under the SETUP menu.


DVD Operation

Preparation

After all necessary connections have been made, press POWER to turn on the player and then press the MODE button to select DVD. The following discs can be read by the player: DVD /CD / MP3 /JPEG.

Disc Loading

- 1. Put the disc slightly into the disc tray.
- 2. The disc will be taken automatically into the tray.



Warning: Do not play poor quality discs that may damage the player's lens.

DVD Playback

MENU

Normally a DVD disc consists of several titles and chapters. The root menu will be displayed automatically once the disc data is recognized by the player. Press the direction buttons to select the desired title/chapter from the menu and press OK to play. During playback, press MENU to display the root menu. Some discs start playback automatically.

SUBTITLE

Press SUBTITLE button to select subtitle language for multi-subtitle discs.

ANGLE

Press the ANGLE button to select the angle. A DVD can be recorded from various camera positions, which lets you enjoy the same scene from different perspectives. In this case, you'll usually find a marking on the DVD sleeve.

DVD Operation

CD Playback

The player will play all tracks on a CD disc by default.

MP3 Playback

- 1. Load a disc into the disc tray.
- 2. It will start playback automatically. Or press direction button to select the file from the menu and press OK or PLAY/PAUSE button to start playback. Press left/right button to enter /exit file folders.
- 3. Press the STOP button to stop playback.

JPEG Playback

JPEG is a common picture format that requires small amounts of storage per image and has low loss in resolution. Hundreds of pictures can be stored on a disc in this format. In order to view JPEG photo albums, you can ask your film development company to make a "PICTURE CD" when they develop your film.

Normal Playback

Load a JPEG disc in.

Press the direction buttons to select the target file and press OK to access.

Picture Rotation

There are four kinds of rotational modes: Inversion, Enantiomorphism, rotate left and rotate right. Press direction buttons to select:

"UP" ---- Inversion/Normal

"DOWN" ----- Enantiomorphism/Normal

"LEFT" ---- Rotate left

"RIGHT" ---- Rotate right

Zoom

Press ZOOM button to zoom in/out picture.

Press direction buttons to move the zoomed picture.

During playback, press the STOP button to return to the previous menu.

NOTE: Depending on how the disc was made, a JPEG disc may allow playback, but not rotation or zooming of the images.

Playback Function

Start Playing

Press PLAY/PAUSE to start playback

Pause Playing

During playback, press PLAY/PAUSE once to hold playing, press it again to resume.

Stop Playing

Press STOP once to stop playback at a time point. (Pre-stop mode) It will resume from where it was stopped. Press it twice to stop playback completely.

Repeat Function

Use the REPEAT button to perform the repeat function.

1. Repeatedly press the REPEAT button to cycle through the repeat modes as below,

DVD Mode REP: CHAPTER - - > REP:TITLE - - > REP:ALL - - > REP:OFF
CD Mode REP: 1 - - > REP:ALL - - > REP:OFF

2. Use the A-B button on the remote to repeat a section A-B. Press A-B once to set the starting point A, press it twice to set the ending point B, the player starts repeating section A-B. To cancel, press A-B.

NOTE: Some discs do not support the repeat function.


Search Function

Go to the desired section in a disc.

Press the GOTO button, below picture appears on the screen.

DVD

Search by title /chapter/time



- 1. Press the direction buttons to move between title/chapter/time entry, press the numeric buttons to input data. Press the OK button to start search.
- 2. Press GOTO once again to exit.

NOTE: Some DVD discs do not support the search function.

Fast Playback

Press F.FWD/F.BWD on the remote to go fast forward/backward through a disc. Repeatedly press the button to change the search speed as below.

Playback Function

Slow Playback

During playback, press the SLOW/STEP button to start slow motion playback, which would be futher slowed down for each time you pressed this button, if you pause the playback with the Play/Pause button and then repeatedly press this button, it will move step-by-step forward.

Zoom Function

Repeatedly press the ZOOM button to achieve the following zoom effect.

ZOOM 2 - ZOOM3 - ZOOM 4 - ZOOM1/2 - ZOOM1/3 - ZOOM1/4 - ZOOM:OFF


NOTE: There is no zoom function for MP3 or CD discs.

Programming Chapters/Tracks

You can store up to 16 programs.

1. Press the PROGRAM button to display the program menu.

e.g. DVD Mode




- 2. Press the direction buttons to move between the input fields and press the number buttons to input data.
- 3. Press direction buttons to select "Play" and press OK to start playback.
- 4. To clear, select "CLEAR" from the menu and press OK.
- 5. To quit, press the Program button.

DVD Setup

Various features can be preset through the DVD setup menu and the TV setup menu. Use the LCD SETUP button to access the TV setup menu, read the TV section for detailed menu descriptions.

Press the DVD SETUP button to display the DVD menu.



While working with the setup menu:

- 1. Press the direction buttons to select the desired item.
- 2. Press the right direction button or the OK button to confirm.
- 3. To exit, press DVD SETUP again.

System Setup

- 1. TV System Select the TV System from NTSC/PAL/AUTO. The default setting is NTSC. (The TV System for north America is NTSC. AUTO should only be used if you have a Multi-System TV).
- 2. Screen Saver Set the Screen Saver ON/OFF. The default setting is On. The screen saver is useful to prevent your display from becoming damaged. If the Screen Saver is set ON, the screen saver picture appears when you leave the player in the stop mode for about a few minutes. Press any button on the unit/remote to exit the screen saver.
- 3. Power Resume Set the power resume function On.Off. The default setting is Off.
- **4. TV Type -** Set the screen aspect ratio as 4:3 PS(Pan Scan), 4:3 LB(Letter Box) or 16:9(Wide Screen). 4:3 LB(Letter Box): This is selected when the unit is connected to a normal TV. 4:3 PS(Pan Scan): This is selected when the unit is connected to anormal TV. Wide-screen images are shown on the screen with some parts cut out automatically.
- **5. Rating -** There are eight levels of Parental Control. Level one opens discs to people of all ages, level eight is suitable only for adults. To change the parental control setting, a 4-digit code is required to be input first. (The default code is 8888). When the input code is confirmed, the level setting menu will appear, select the appropriate level by the UP/DOWN button and press OK to confirm.

DVD Setup

- **6. Password -** Move the cursor to the PASSWORD prompt and press OK. Input the password 8888, if it is the first use. After confirmation, you will be required to input a new 4-digit code, and verify again.
- 7. **Default -** This function allows you to set the unit back to the factory default.

Symptom	Check and Action
No Power	 Make sure the unit has been powered on manually. Check if the power cord has been properly connected to the power outlet. Check if the main power has been switched on.
No Picture	 Try another TV channel Check if the system connection is proper and secure. Check if the connection cables are damaged.
No Sound	 Increase the volume. Check if the MUTE function of the unit has been activated. Check if the sound system has been properly set. Check if the AV audio signal input cable has been connected properly.
Color Distorted	 Reset the color system of the unit. Check if the system has been properly connected. Check if the AV video signal input cable is connected properly.
Picture and Sound are interfered	 Check if the system has been properly connected. If using antenna, adjust the antenna.
Remote Control does not work	 Remove the obstacles between the remote control and the player. Point the remote control towards the remote sensor on the player. Check if the batteries of the remote control have been loaded with correct polarities. Replace the batteries of the remote control.
Malfunction	Should the player develop a malfunction, unplug the player for 30 minutes. After that, power on the player and the restore function should reset the player.
