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Introduction

Welcome to the world of Franklin. This Franklin model is a powerful, electronic reference with a built-in book, plus one slot in the back for a book card*. With the *Harrap's Shorter Dictionnaire français-anglais*, you can:

- find translations of thousands of words, most of which contain parts of speech and usage examples;
- conjugate words quickly and easily;
- let state-of-the-art spell correction help you find the word you're looking for;
- hear the pronunciation of English headwords and travellers' phrases;
- see an English word's synonyms, antonyms, and other related words using Franklin's built-in English Thesaurus;
- use the Grammar Guide, a comprehensive outline of English grammar;
- learn a new word every time you turn the unit on;


- use the MatchMaker function to find words of whose spelling you are unsure, or to help solve crossword puzzles;

- create your own list of French or English study words in My Vocabulary List;
- create a list of phrases that you want to remember in My Phrase List;

Using the Special Features

Your unit is equipped with several special features that many, but not all BOOKMAN book cards use. To learn if you can use the special features with a particular book card, read its User's Guide.




On/Off: Turns the unit on and off.

Function Keys: Each of these keys corresponds to the dictionary or organiser function that appears directly above it on the screen

Speaker: The speaker is located on the front of the unit.

Headphone Jack: The headphone jack is designed for 3.5 mm, 35 ohm impedance stereo headphones. **Caution**: Monophonic headphones will not work with this unit.

Volume Control: The dial, located under the headphone jack, controls the volume of the speaker or headphones.



Serial Port: Plug in a serial-USB or serial-serial cable here to connect the Collegiate Dictionary to your PC.

AC Adaptor Jack: The AC/DC adaptor is in the 9 volt range within a current range of 200 to 300 milli-amperes.



This symbol indicates that the inner core of the plug of an AC adaptor is negative and that the outer part of the plug is positive. If the symbol on your AC/DC adaptor does not match the above symbol, confirm its compatibility at its place of purchase.

Book Card Slot: The card slot is located on the back of the unit. It enables you to read electronic books purchased from **franklin.com** and is compatible with most BOOKMAN and BMC cards.

Battery Compartment: The battery compartment is located on the back of the unit. It holds two AAA batteries.

Key Guide

Soft Keys

Soft Key functions are represented by the labels displayed along the bottom of the screen. To perform a Soft Key function, press the unlabeled key at the top of the keyboard that directly corresponds to the label you want. These labels change to reflect the different functions available in the various books and exercises in this device.

For example, in the main menu, the following Soft Keys are available:

BOOKS Displays the Books menu.

LEARN Displays the Learning menu.

EXER Displays the Exercises menu.

GAMES Displays the Games menu.

SETUP Displays the Setup menu.

Organiser Keys

In the Organiser, the following Soft Keys are available:

CLOCK Goes to the clock.

DATA Goes to the Databank menu.

CALC Goes to the calculator.

CONV Goes to the metric converter.

CURR Goes to the currency converter.

Function Keys

b Located on the top of the device, turns the product on or off.

Goes to the main menu. Goes to the word entry screen in any book that has one.
Clears the calculator. In the metric converter and databank, goes to its main menu.

Backs up, erases a letter, or turns off the highlight at an entry.

Enters a word, selects an item, or begins a highlight in an entry.

Says an English word and speaks English travellers' phrases.

Goes to the Organiser: clock, databank, calculator, metric converter and currency converter.

MENU Goes to the main menu.

Displays a help message. When at an inflection screen, displays grammar information about the inflection you were viewing.

At a word entry screen, types a ? to stand for a letter in a word. At a menu, displays a menu item. At a dictionary entry, displays the headword. In games, reveals the word and forfeits the game. In the databank entry screen, types an underscore.

Exits the book you were reading.

Shifts to type capital letters and punctuation marks.

Shifts to allow prev (*prec*), next (*suiv*), and to type a hyphen.

Combination Keys*

At a dictionary entry, pages up or down.

At a dictionary entry, displays the next or previous entry.

Transfers a word between books.

+ J Types a hyphen.

→ N Types a ç.

FN + M In the Databank entry screen, types @.

At the Word Entry screen, types an asterisk to stand for a series of letters in a word. In games, gives a hint.



Installing Batteries

Your unit is powered by two AAA batteries. Follow these instructions to install or replace them.

- 1. Turn your unit off and turn it over.
- Lift the battery cover on the back of your unit by pushing up on the catch.



- 3. Remove the old batteries, if necessary.
- Install the batteries following the +/- markings in the battery compartment.
- 5. Replace the battery cover.

Warning: If the batteries wear-out completely, or if you take more than a few seconds while changing the batteries, any information that was entered in the built-in book or book card may be erased. You should always keep written copies of your important information.

Battery disposal: Do not dispose of batteries with normal household waste. Please obey your local regulations when disposing of used batteries.

Battery Precautions

- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged. Never recharge batteries that come with the device.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the device before being charged.
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.
- · The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Do not expose batteries to direct heat or try to take batteries apart. Follow the battery manufacturer's instructions for battery use.
- Always remove a weak or dead battery from the device.
- To avoid damage caused by leakage of the battery fluid, replace the battery or batteries once every two years regardless of how much the device has been used during that time.
- Should a battery leak, the device may become damaged. Clean the battery compartment immediately, avoiding contact with your skin.
- Keep batteries out of reach of small children. If swallowed, consult a physician immediately.

✓ Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows to the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move around menus or view more text.

√ Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at any screen by pressing **AIDE**. Press ▲ or ▼ to read. To exit help, press **ARR**.


✓ About Screen Illustrations

Installing Book Cards

Your unit contains a built-in book. You can purchase more titles on book cards at **www.franklin.com/fr**. To install a book card, follow these steps.

- 1. Turn your unit off and turn it over.
- Remove the blank protector or any other book card that might be installed.
- Align the tabs on the book card with the notches in the slot.




4. Press the book card down until it snaps into place.

Warning: Never install or remove a book card while your unit is on. Any information that was entered in the built-in book or book card will be erased.

Selecting a Book

Once a book card is installed in the unit, you can select the book you want to use.

- 1. Turn your unit on.
- 2. Press CARTE.



Icons appear for each available book. The built-in book is highlighted.

- 3. Press ▶ or ◀ to highlight your selection.
- 4. Press ENTRER to select it.
- 5. Press CARTE to return to the card menu.


✓ BOOKMAN Card Troubleshooting

Make sure your book card is installed correctly. If your card is performing erratically, follow the reset instructions in "Resetting Your Unit" on page 91. If this does not fix the problem, remove the card and then remove the white rubber strip located between the two metal pins. Clean the rubber strip with your fingers and then replace it making sure it is completely in its notch.

Using Function Keys in Book Cards

The function keys appear at the top of the keyboard on your unit. These keys correspond in the order listed to the dictionary and organiser keys at the bottom of the screen. The dictionary function keys change with the book card. The organiser function keys are unaffected. Note: Once you access the organiser from a book card, you will exit the book card. You must press **CARTE** and select your book card to return to it. The function keys on your unit correspond to the

function keys on your card as illustrated below.



Changing the Language

Message Language

When you turn on this product for the first time, you must choose the message language. Press **A** for French or press **B** for English.

The message language is the language of prompts, help and other messages. You can change the message language after your initial decision. See "Changing the Settings" on page 23 to learn how.

Entry Language

The entry language is the language in which you enter words at the word entry screen. For books with French and English parts, this determines which one you will use. For example, to switch between the French-to-English and English-to-French dictionaries, try the following:

- Press MENU.
- Press ENTRER to select Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng.

Select *Harrap's Shorter Eng-Fr* from the Books menu to go to the English-to-French dictionary.

Or you can press **LANG** at the word entry screen to switch between French and English.


Using the Main Menu

Use the main menu to quickly take you to different books and exercises in your device. The main menu contains five tabs: *Books*, *Learning*, *Exercises*, *Games* and *Setup*. Use ▶ and ◀ to move to another tab. Use ▲ and ▼ to highlight the option you want and press **ENTRER** to select it. You can also go directly to a tab by pressing the tab's respective Soft Key.

Understanding the Menus



The **Books** tab enables you to look up English translations of French words and French translations of English words. You can search for French or English travellers' phrases or idioms. You can also find synonyms of English words.



The **Learning** tab enables you to access *My Vocabulary List*, *My Phrase List*, conjugate French or English words, and read English grammar topics. You can also access the TOEFL® Test word list.



The **Exercises** tab allows you to access *Spelling Bee* and *Flashcards*. You can try both exercises using French words saved to *My Vocabulary List*. You can also try the exercises using English words saved to *My Vocabulary List* and those found in the TOEFL® Test word list.



The **Games** tab allows you to access the 14 games included in your device: *Anagrams*, *Conjumania*, *Gender Tutor*, *Hangman*, *Jumble*, *Letris*, *Letter Poker*, *Word Blaster*, *Word Builder*, *Word Deduction*, *Word Dozer*, *Word Train* and 1 or 2 player *Link Four*. You can also adjust the game settings.



The **Setup** tab allows you to access a demonstration and tutorial of how this device works. You can also adjust the device settings.

Viewing a Demonstration or Tutorial

You can view a demonstration or tutorial of this dictionary any time you want.

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press SETUP.

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Setup menu.

 Press ▼ to highlight either *Tutorial* or View Demo and press ENTRER.
 To stop the demonstration or exit from the *Tutorial* and return to the Setup menu, press EFF.

Note: When a book card is installed in your unit, select *View Demo* from the Setup menu to see the demonstration for that card.

Changing the Settings

When using this dictionary, you can activate the *Learn a Word* feature, adjust the screen contrast, the shutoff time, the type size, and the message language.

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2 Press **SETUP**

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Setup menu.

Settings will be highlighted.

3. Press ENTRER to select it.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to move ➤ to Learn a Word, Contrast, Shutoff, Type Size or Langue des messages (message language). Learn a Word helps you increase your vocabulary by displaying a different headword and definition each time you turn on your dictionary.

Contrast enables you to set how light or dark the screen appears.

The *Shutoff* time is how long your unit stays on if you forget to turn it off.

Type Size enables you to set the size of the font displayed on screen.

Langue des messages (message language) is the language of prompts, help, and other messages.

- 6. Press ENTRER when done.

Translating Words

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press BOOKS.

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Books menu.

3. Use ▲ or ▼ to highlight *Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng*, then press **ENTRER**.

To translate English words into French, select *Harrap's Shorter Eng-Fr.*

You can also press **LANG** at the word entry screen to change the entry language from French to English.

To erase a letter, press **ARR**.

letter key. To type a *ç*, hold **FN** and press **N**. To type a hyphen, hold **FN** and press **J**. Press to hear an English word pronounced.

Press ▼ or **ESPACE** to scroll.

If there is more than one definition, the message, *Entry 1 of #* appears, where # stands for the number of available definitions. Hold **FN** and press ▶ or ◀ to view the next or previous definition.

Press EFF when done.Press MENU to go to the main menu.

✓ Understanding Translations

Entries may consist of headwords, parts of speech, the translation, and/or definitions. Other forms of the word may follow the headword. After the translation or definition, you may see a list of usage examples.


✓ Explanation of Genders

French nouns are different from English nouns in that they must either be masculine or feminine. Each definition of a noun indicates which gender it is with M or F.

✓ Choosing Multiple Forms

Some words in this dictionary have more than one form (e.g. *résume*, *résumé*). When the word you are looking up has multiple forms, the different forms appear in a list.


Simply highlight the form you want and press **ENTRER** to see its entry. For example, select *Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng* from the Books menu, then type *resume* at the word entry screen.



Highlight the form you want and press **ENTRER** to see its entry. To go back to the Multiple Forms list, press **ARR**.

✓ Correcting Misspellings

This device has a spell corrector that helps you if you misspell a word. If you enter a misspelled word, a list of corrections appears. For example, select *Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng* from the Books menu, then type *blue* at the word entry screen and press **ENTRER**.



Highlight the word you want and then press **ENTRER** to see its entry.

To go back to the corrections list, press ARR.

✓ Understanding Confusables

Confusables are homonyms, homophones and spelling variants that are easy to confuse, e.g. *rain*, *reign*, *rein*. If the word you looked up is a confusable, the **CONF** Soft Key will be made available. Press **CONF** to view the confusables.



Hearing English Words

This dictionary can pronounce English words that appear on almost any screen - in definitions, thesaurus entries, spell correction lists, *My Vocabulary List*, confusables and games. When you want to hear how an English word is pronounced, just highlight it and press

To adjust the volume, turn the volume control on the side of the unit. You can plug headphones into the headphone jack which is just above the volume control. Try this example.

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press BOOKS.
 You can also press

 or

 until you reach the Books menu
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ to highlight *English Thesaurus*, then press **ENTRER**.
- 4. Type an English word (for example, *ptarmigan*).
- 5. Press **b** to hear it pronounced.
- 6. Press ENTRER to see its entry.

- 7. Press to hear the English headword pronounced.
- 8. Press ENTRER for a highlight.

Highlighting Words

Another way to look up words is by highlighting them in entries or word lists. You can then find *their* definitions, translations, thesaurus entries, or add them to *My Vocabulary List*.



Finding Letters in Words

If you are uncertain about how to spell a word, type a question mark (?) in place of each unknown letter. To find prefixes, suffixes, and other parts of words, type an asterisk (*) in a word. Each asterisk stands for a series of letters. **Note**: If you type an asterisk at the beginning of a word, it may take a little while to find the matching words.

- Go to any word entry screen.
 You can access a word entry screen by selecting Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng, Harrap's Shorter Eng-Fr, or English Thesaurus from the Books menu, or English Conjugations or French Conjugations from the Learning menu.
- Type a word with ?s and *s (for example, sc??ol*).



To type an asterisk, hold down **MAJ** and press **?**.

Press ENTRER.



The list of possible matches is displayed.

- Press ▼ to move the highlight to the word you want and press ENTRER to view its entry.
- Press EFF when done.Press MENU to go to the main menu.

Translating Travellers' Phrases

You can find translations of French or English travellers' phrases in categories ranging from *Emergencies* to *Business Communication* to *Time & Dates*. Note that the English phrase always appears before the French phrase.

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press BOOKS.

- Use ▲ or ▼ to highlight English Phrases, then press ENTRER.



Using the English Thesaurus

You can look up thesaurus entries of English words using the English Thesaurus. Thesaurus entries consist of synonyms, antonyms, classmates and words to compare. Many words have more than one thesaurus entry.

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press BOOKS.

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Books menu.

- Use ▲ or ▼ to highlight English Thesaurus, then press ENTRER.
- Type a word (for example, splendid).
 To erase a letter, press ARR. To type a capital, hold MAJ and press a letter key.
 To type a hyphen, hold FN and press J.
- Press ENTRER to view the thesaurus entry.

✓ Understanding Thesaurus Entries

A thesaurus entry consists of a group of synonyms, antonyms and classmates. Synonyms are words that have similar meanings, e.g. *happy/joyous*. Antonyms are words that have the opposite meaning of the word being defined, e.g., *happy/unhappy*. Classmates are words that are related in some way to the word being defined, e.g. *octagon/polygon*, *triangle*, *rectangle*, *pentagon*....

Finding Idioms

Your device includes a helpful feature that locates idioms and their translation.

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press BOOKS.

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Books menu.

 Use ▲ or ▼ to highlight English Idioms, then press ENTRER.

To find English translations of French idioms, select *French Idioms*.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll through the list of English keywords.

You can also type a letter to go to the first word beginning with that letter. For example, type **Io** to highlight *Love*.

Press ENTRER to select the highlighted keyword. A list of all idioms relating to that keyword is displayed.



- Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll through the list of idioms.
- Press ENTRER to select the highlighted idiom.

The translation of the idiom is displayed.



8. Press **EFF** or **MENU** when done.

Using My Vocabulary List

You can save up to 40 words total, in both French and English, in *My Vocabulary List* for personal study or review. *My Vocabulary List* is saved between sessions unless the batteries run out of power or your device is reset.

Adding Words from the Learning Menu

- 1 Press MENU
- 2 Press LEARN

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Learning menu.

My Vocabulary List will be highlighted.

3. Press ENTRER to select it.



- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Add a Word and press ENTRER.

Adding Words from a Word Entry Screen

You can also add words to My Vocabulary List directly from any word entry screen. Select Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng from the Books menu or French Conjugations from the Learning menu to add a French word. Select Harrap's Shorter Eng-Fr or English Thesaurus from the Books menu, or English Conjugations from the Learning menu to add an English word. Try this example:

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press BOOKS.

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Books menu.

- Use ▲ or ▼ to highlight Harrap's Shorter Fr-Eng, then press ENTRER.
 You can also press LANG, when available, to change the entry language from French to English. French words will be added to My French Vocabulary List, English words will be added to My English Vocabulary List.
- 4. Type the word you want to add to your word list (for example, *élégant*).
- Press LIST.
 Add ... will be highlighted. Note: Your word is included in the menu item.
- 6. Press ENTRER to add the word.
- Press EFF to return to the word entry screen.

Press **MENU** to go to the main menu.

✓ Adding Highlighted Words

You can also add words to *My Vocabulary List* from entries and correction lists. First highlight a word and then press **LIST**. *Add "your word"* will be highlighted. Press **ENTRER** to add the word.

Viewing My Vocabulary List

- 1. Press MENU.
- Press LEARN.





The prompt "Erase the list? (Y/N)" appears.

Press Y to erase the list or press N to cancel.

Note: When you erase one list, the other is not erased.

✓ Adding Words Not in This Dictionary

When you add a word not in this dictionary, you are given three options: *Add Anyway*, *Cancel* and *Correction List*. Highlight the option you want and press **ENTRER**. **Caution**: Adding words that are not in this

Caution: Adding words that are not in this dictionary uses considerably more memory than adding words that are. If you add only words that are not in this dictionary, My Vocabulary List may contain as few as 10 words.

Using My Phrase List

The dictionary conjugates English verbs into the following forms: present indicative, present progressive, preterite, past progressive, future, present perfect, future perfect, pluperfect, present conditional, past conditional, and imperative.

Using the TOEFL® Test Word List

The TOEFL® Test Word List contains English words you might find on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL® Test).

- Press MENU.
- Press LEARN.

You can also press ◀ or ▶ until you reach the Learning menu.

3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight *TOEFL® Test Word List*, then press **ENTRER**.



√ Conjumania

Conjumania teaches verb conjugations. It shows you an infinitive verb and asks you to enter a conjugation. Your conjugation must be spelled correctly, including accents. Type your guess and then press **ENTRER**. Hold **MAJ** and press **?** for a hint. Press **?** to reveal the game word.

To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTRER**. Press **ARR** to return to the game. To try a new conjugation for the current verb, press **ESPACE**. Hold **FN** and press ▶ to conjugate a new verb.

✓ Hangman

Hangman selects a mystery word and challenges you to guess it letter by letter. The letters of the mystery word are hidden by question marks. The number of guesses remaining is indicated by #s.



Type letters that you think are in the mystery word. If you are correct, the letter appears in place of the corresponding question mark(s). Hold **MAJ** and press ? to reveal one letter. Press ? to reveal the game word.

To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTRER**. Press **ARR** to return to the game. To try a new word, press **ESPACE**.

✓ Gender Tutor

Gender Tutor asks you to guess the gender of French nouns. Press **M** for masculine and **F** for feminine. Press **?** to reveal the correct gender. To see the translation of the game word, press **ENTRER**. Press **ARR** to return to the game. To try a new word, press **ESPACE**.

✓ Jumble


Jumble tests your ability to unscramble letters and form words. It shows a series of letters. Type words made from these letters and then press **ENTRER**. The number of possible solution words appears to the right of the screen.



Hold MAJ and press ? to shuffle the letters in the root word. Press ? to end a round and reveal the word or words. Press ENTRER to turn on the highlight, then use the arrow keys to highlight the word you want. Press ENTRER again to see the translation of the word. Press THES to see the thesaurus entry of an English word, if available. Press ARR to return to Jumble. To try a new jumble, press ESPACE.

✓ Letris

In *Letris*, letters fall from the top of the display to the bottom. Use ◀ or ▶ to move the falling letter to make a word.



When you make a valid word, it disappears and your score increases based on the length of the word.

When the score reaches 50, a dinosaur appears on the display. At 100, the dinosaur shoots fire from its mouth, burns up all the letters and jumps off the display. At 200, the dinosaur jumps down and squishes all the letters. At each of these new levels, the falling letter drops faster.

The game is over when there is no room for a new letter to fall into the screen. To play again, press **ESPACE**.

✓ Letter Poker

Letter Poker challenges you to make longer words with the letters you are dealt than the house does with its letters. You and the house take turns betting and discarding, but you do not see the house's letters until the end of the game. The scoring is similar to normal poker: one four-letter word is better than a three and two-letter word (in normal poker four of a kind is better than a full house). The longer your word, the better your chances of winning. To play, type a word from your letter cards and press

ENTRER.



You can make two words by typing a space between them. Watch for the dealer's moves.

You need to know the following poker terms before you begin to play, as they appear as prompts on the screen.

Press the initial letter to make your choice. For example, to Bet, press **B**, to Raise, press **R** and so on.

Bet Means you want to bet on your hand. You can bet up to \$100.

Pass Means you'll pass the bet to the dealer.

Fold Means that you want to end, and lose, the hand.

See Means you'll match the dealer's bet.

Raise Means you'll increase the dealer's bet. You can raise it up to \$100.

Note: To type a bet, press **A - P** for numbers. The pot starts at \$1000, with a \$10 ante (the initial bet to start the game). If you are unable to make a word at the time, type letters that you are likely to use later from those you are dealt. To erase a letter, press ARR. To continue without typing letters, press ENTRER. If you bet before the house does, you see a prompt, "Pass, Bet or Fold." If the house bets first, you see a prompt, "See, Raise, or Fold." You can discard up to three letters. After discarding, you see a message showing how many cards, if any, the house discarded. If the hand ends in a tie, you do not lose your money. The pot carries on to the next hand. To try a new hand, press ESPACE. 74

✓ Word Blaster

In *Word Blaster*, you try to guess the mystery word before all of the letters are filled in on the screen.



One letter at a time is revealed. When you know the mystery word, press **ENTRER** and type in the answer. Hold **MAJ** and press **?** to flash the partially completed word on the screen. Press **?** at any time to reveal the game word. To try a new word, press **ESPACE**.

✓ Word Builder

Word Builder makes anagrams for you. Before you play, type letters you want Word Builder to build words from and press **ENTRER**.



Word Builder shows the anagrams it has built.



To see the translation of a particular anagram, press **ENTRER** to turn the highlight on, use the arrow keys to move the highlight to the anagram you want and press **ENTRER**. Press **THES** to see the thesaurus entry of an English word, if available. Press **ARR** to return to *Word Builder*. To try a new word, press **ESPACE**.

✓ Word Deduction

In Word Deduction, you must guess the puzzle word. The letters of the puzzle word appear as underscores. You are limited to a certain number of guesses. When you enter a word, the number of letters that are found in the puzzle exactly as you typed them are listed under perfect. The number of letters that are found in the puzzle but not where you typed them are listed under misplaced. The number of guesses remaining appears to the right of the current guess.



You can use the arrow keys to view previous guesses along with their score. Hold **MAJ** and press ? to reveal a single letter in the puzzle. Press ? to reveal the puzzle word and end the game.

Press **ENTRER** to turn on the highlight, then use the arrow keys to highlight the word you want. Press **ENTRER** again to see the translation of the word. Press **THES** to see the thesaurus entry of an English word, if available. Press **ARR** to return to *Word Deduction*. To try a new word, press **ESPACE**.

√ Word Dozer

In *Word Dozer*, letters randomly appear on the screen. Use the arrow keys to move the word dozer so that it pushes letters together into words. To pull a letter with the bulldozer instead of pushing it, hold **FN** and press the arrow key which will move the bulldozer backwards.



When you make a valid word, it disappears and your score increases based on the length of the word. When the score reaches 50, 100, 200, 400 ..., the *Word Dozer* shoots the rest of the letters off the screen and a new level starts.

Letters drop faster with each new level. The game is over when the screen is so crowded with letters that you cannot make a word or when a new letter appears in the same space as the bulldozer. To play again, press **ESPACE**.

✓ Word Train[™]


In *Word Train*, you and the train take turns typing letters to form a word. Whoever types the last letter of the word wins. **Note**: Winning words must be at least four letters long.

✓ Link Four

Link Four challenges you to connect four game pieces in any direction. You can play alone (1 Player Link Four) or with a friend (2 Player Link Four).



Use ◀ or ► to move your game piece to the post you want, then press **ENTRER**. The game piece is displayed along the bottom of the rack to show whose turn it is. The first player to link four game pieces wins. To play again, press **ESPACE**.

Using the Clock

The Clock displays the current time and date. You can save two times: Home time and World time.



Transferring Words Between Books

This dictionary can transfer words with certain other book cards. To send a word to another book, you must first install a book card in your unit, and that book card must be able to send or receive words. To learn if a book card can send or receive words, read its User's Guide.

 To highlight a word in a dictionary entry, press ENTRER to start the highlight, and use the arrow keys to move the highlight to the word you want.

Resetting Your Unit

If the keyboard fails to respond, or if the screen performs erratically, perform a system reset by following the steps below.

- Hold EFF and press .
 If nothing happens, try Step 2.
- 2. Use a paper clip to gently press the reset button on your unit.

The reset button is recessed in a pinsized hole below the book card slot.



Warning! Pressing the reset button with more than light pressure may permanently disable your unit. In addition, resetting the unit erases settings and information entered in its built-in book, and in an installed book card.
