# **About This Manual**

The instructions in this manual are for model CDP-M555ES.

### Conventions

- Instructions in this manual describe the controls on the player. You can also use the controls on the remote if they have the same or similar names as those on the player.

Indicates hints and tips for making the task easier.

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
# Unpacking

Check that you received the following items:

- Audio cord (1)
- Video cord (1)
- Monaural (2P) mini-plug cord (1) (Connecting cord for CONTROL A1 II) (supplied for Canadian models only)
- Remote commander (remote) (1)
- Size AA (LR6) batteries (3)

### Inserting batteries into the remote

You can control the player using the supplied remote. Insert three size AA (LR6) batteries (supplied) by matching the + and – ends on the batteries to the diagram inside the battery compartment. Insert the negative (–) end first, then push in and down until the positive (+) end clicks into position. When using the remote, point it at the remote sensor



### When to replace batteries

If  $\square$  flashes in the remote's display, replace all the batteries with new alkaline batteries. Use of battery types other than alkaline batteries, such as manganese batteries, may not last longer than the alkaline batteries. The loaded memory in the remote will be retained for a few minutes while you replace the batteries.


### Notes

- Do not leave the remote near an extremely hot or humid place.
- Do not drop any foreign object into the remote casing, particularly when replacing the batteries.
- Do not expose the remote sensor to direct sunlight or leave too near lighting apparatuses. Doing so may cause a malfunction.
- If you do not use the remote for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery leakage and corrosion.


# Hooking Up the System

### Overview

This section describes how to hook up the CD player to an amplifier. Be sure to turn off the power of each component before making the connections.




### What cords will I need? Audio cord (supplied) (1)



### Hookups


When connecting an audio cord, be sure to match the color-coded cord to the appropriate jacks on the components: Red (right) to Red and White (left) to White. Be sure to connect firmly to avoid hum and noise.



• If you have a digital component such as a digital amplifier, D/A converter, DAT, or MD

Connect the component via the DIGITAL OUT (OPTICAL) connector using an optical cable (not supplied). Take off the cap and plug in the optical cable.

Note that you cannot use fading in or out (page 26) and Time Fade (page 26) functions when making this connection.




### Note

When you connect via the DIGITAL OUT (OPTICAL) connector, noise may occur when you play CD software other than music, such as a CD-ROM.

You can check the disc information by observing the TV screen when you connect the player and your TV with the video cable.

V If you have a Sony component with the CONTROL A1 (or CONTROL A1) jack

Connect the component via the CONTROL A1II (or CONTROL A1) jack. You can simplify the operations of audio systems composed of separate Sony components. For details, refer to the supplementary "CONTROL A1II Control System" instructions.

### Connecting the AC power cord


Connect the AC power cord to a wall outlet.

### Note on placement of the player

Be sure to place the player in a flat, horizontal place. If the player is left in a slanted position, it may cause a malfunction or damage the player.









# **Connecting Another CD Player**

If you have a Sony CD player in which 5, 50, 200, 300, or 400 discs can be inserted and which is equipped with the CONTROL A1II (or CONTROL A1) jack and the command mode of that player can be set to CD 3, you can control that player as the second player with this player. After connecting this player and an amplifier, follow the procedure below. Be sure to turn off the power of each player before making this connection.




### What cords will I need?

- Audio cord (1) (Use the cord supplied with the player to be connected.)
- Monaural (2P) mini-plug cord (1) (supplied for Canadian models only)
- **1** Connect the players with an audio cord (see also "Hookups" on page 5).




**2** Connect the players with a monaural (2P) miniplug cord.



For details on this connection, refer to the supplementary "CONTROL A1II Control System" instructions.

**3** Set the command mode of this player to CD1 (factory setting) or CD2, and set that of the second player to CD3.

Check the display for the current command mode of this player, if the mode is CD3, change the mode as described on the next page.



### Current command mode



- **4** Connect the AC power cord of both players to an AC outlet.
- **5** Perform "Player check" by following the steps in "Storing player data in the remote" on page 9.


### Notes

- Do not connect any player other than the one used as the second player to the 2ND CD IN jacks of this player.
- When connecting a second CD player, do not connect the DIGITAL OUT (OPTICAL) connector of this player to the amplifier.

### Changing the command mode of the player



- **1** Press MENU/NO.
- **2** Turn the JOG dial until "Command Mode?" appears in the display.
- **3** Push the JOG dial. The current command mode appears.




**4** Turn the JOG dial to select CD1 or CD2, then push the JOG dial again.

# Setting Up the Remote

### Understanding the 2-way remote system

The supplied remote operates under a 2-way remote system. While you use the remote and the remote's display is on, the component responds to signals sent from the remote by sending signals back to the remote.



During remote operations, point the remote toward the player at all times.

To avoid unintentional operations, turn off the 2-way remote system of this or connected player when:


- you connect via CONTROL A1/CONTROL A1II two or more components supplied with a remote with the mark (for example, when you connect this player to another set of this player or certain receiver/amplifier). In this case, you need to turn off the 2-way remote system of the components except the one you want to use as a main unit for the system. When you use the remote, make sure to turn on the main unit.
- you connect this player to a receiver/amplifier supplied with the RM-TP501, RM-TP501E, or RM-LJ301 remote control. In this case, you need to turn off this player's 2-way remote system.

To turn off this player's 2-way remote system, see "To turn off the 2-way remote system" on page 8.

### To turn off the 2-way remote system

You may need to turn off the player's 2-way remote system depending on which components you connect to this player. See "Understanding the 2-way remote system" on page 7 to see if you need to do so.

Even though you turn off the player's 2-way remote system, you can use the remote supplied with the player by pointing the remote toward the unit such as a receiver that the 2-way remote system is turned on. In this case, position the player in the proximity of the unit that the 2-way remote system is turned on.



- **1** Press MENU/NO.
- **2** Turning the JOG dial until "2WAY OFF ?" appears in the display window.
- **3** Press YES.

### To return to normal setting

After following steps 1 and 2, and "2WAY ON ?" is displayed, then press YES. If you connect to the Sony CD player CDP-CX260 or CDP-CX88ES, press OPERATE on the transmitter/ receiver to turn it off, and set the 2-way remote system of the player to on.

### Note


If you use this player with a receiver/amplifier, turn the receiver/amplifier on when using this player.

### How to use the remote

Press  $I/\bigcirc$  on the player to turn on the player. If the following message appears in the remote's display while setting up the remote, point the remote at the main player.

to a main unit	

Note that the displayed message disappears automatically if you don't proceed for more than a few moments.



You can select an item shown in the remote's display by moving the cursor (►). To move the cursor down, push the Easy scroll key downward. To move the cursor up, push the Easy scroll key upward.



When you press BACK, the remote's display returns to the previous display.

### Storing player data in the remote

The remote checks and stores the player data such as the command mode sent from the player(s) so that you can use the remote to control the player(s). Turn on the player before operation.

**1** Press MENU.

Note the  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  mark indicates that the menu continues.

Press the Easy scroll key downward to see the next items.

2 Move the cursor (►) to "Set up" by using the Easy scroll key, then press the Easy scroll key.

**3** Move the cursor to "Player check," then press the Easy scroll key.

The display shows the disc data in the player after "Now player checking..." appears.

When you connect another CD player, the disc data in the second CD player also appears.



When you change the command mode of the player or connect a 2nd player, be sure to perform "Player check."


# Adjusting the display contrast of the remote

**1** Press MENU.



2 Move the cursor (►) to "Set up" by using the Easy scroll key, then press the Easy scroll key.

**3** Move the cursor to "Contrast adjust," then press the Easy scroll key.



- **4** Adjust the contrast by pressing the Easy scroll key up or down and holding until the desired level of contrast is attained.
- **5** Press the Easy scroll key.


### Turning off the LCD back light

You can conserve the remote's batteries by turning off the LCD (Liquid Crystal Display) backlight.

**1** Press MENU.



2 Move the cursor (►) to "Set up" by using the Easy scroll key, then press the Easy scroll key.



3 Move the cursor (►) to "Back light mode" by using the Easy scroll key, then press the Easy scroll key.




**4** Move the cursor to "OFF," then press the Easy scroll key.




If you erase all the data stored in the remote (page 31), follow the procedure above to turn the backlight off again.

# **Inserting CDs**


You can insert up to 400 discs into this player.








- **1** Press  $I/\bigcirc$  to turn on the player.
- **2** Open the front cover by pressing OPEN/CLOSE.



**3** Turn the JOG dial until you find the disc slot where you want to insert a disc, while checking the disc number (written beside every slot and also indicated in the small display).



Disc slot at the loading position


The disc number at the loading position appears in the display. If the disc has a Disc Name (see page 27), the Disc Name appears instead of the disc number. As you turn the JOG dial, the disc number or the Disc Name changes.



Disc number or the Disc Name

You can classify discs by using the Group File function or Artist Name function. This feature lets you easily find the disc you want to play. For details, see "Grouping discs (Group File)" on page 33 and "Classifying discs according to Artist Name (Artist File)" on page 36.


**4** Insert a disc with the label side facing right.



After inserting the disc, you can enter the original disc title to replace the disc numbers (see "Labeling discs (Disc Name)" on page 27) so you can locate it easily whenever you want to play it.



- **5** Repeat steps 3 and 4 to insert more discs.
- **6** Close the front cover by pressing OPEN/CLOSE.



The rotary table turns and the disc slot at the loading position is set to the playing position. Always keep the front cover closed except when inserting or removing discs.

### CAUTION

### • Do not insert an 8 cm (3-inch) CD adaptor.

The player cannot play an 8 cm CD. Do not insert an 8 cm (3-inch) CD or an 8 cm (3-inch) CD adaptor (CSA-8). It may damage the player and disc.

### • Do not move the player after inserting discs.

• Be sure to place the player in a flat, horizontal position. Do not place the player in a slanted position.



- Do not move the player and avoid any physical shock after inserting discs.
- When transporting the player, remove all discs from the player.
- Make sure to insert the disc at a right angle to the rotary table.

If the disc is not inserted into the slot completely (ex. when you press  $\triangleq$ ), reinsert the disc at a right angle to the rotary table.

### • Do not attach seals or stickers, etc. to CDs.

If seals or stickers, etc. are attached to a CD, the player may not operate properly and the player or the disc may be damaged.

### Notes

- If you drop a disc into the player and/or the CD does not go into the slot correctly, consult your nearest Sony dealer.
- Make sure the rotary table comes to a complete stop before inserting or removing discs.
- The front panel closes automatically when you press
   Decareful not to put your hand into the player after pressing Decomposition, otherwise your hand may be caught in the front panel.

### **Removing CDs**


After following steps 1 to 3 of "Inserting CDs" on page 10, remove the discs. Then close the front cover.

### **`** To remove discs easily

After following steps 1 to 3 of "Inserting CDs" on page 10, press  $\triangleq$  (DISC EJECT). The disc in the selected slot moves up and you can remove the disc easily. When you press  $\triangleq$  again, the disc returns to the loaded position. If the disc does not return to the loaded position, reinsert the disc.

# Playing a CD

You can play all the tracks on a disc in the original order (Continuous Play). You can also play up to 400 discs consecutively. Make sure you have inserted the discs correctly as indicated on pages 10 and 11.



- **1** Turn on the amplifier and select the CD playing position.
- **2** Press  $I/\bigcirc$  to turn on the player.
- Press CONTINUE to select ALL DISCS or 1 DISC Continuous Play mode.
   Each time you press CONTINUE, "ALL DISCS" or "1 DISC" appears alternately in the display.

When you select	The player plays
ALL DISCS	All discs in the player consecutively in the order of disc number. Empty disc slots are skipped.
1 DISC	Only the one disc you have selected.

**4** Turn the JOG dial until the desired disc number or Disc Name (see page 27) appears in the display to select the first disc (ALL DISCS) or the disc you want (1 DISC).



**5** Push the JOG dial to start playing and adjust the volume on the amplifier.

The selected disc is set to the playing position, and the player plays all the discs from the selected one (ALL DISCS) or all the tracks once (1 DISC).

Go to the next track	Turn the $\bowtie$ AMS $\bowtie$ dial clockwise by one click.
Go back to the preceding track	Turn the $\bowtie$ AMS $\bowtie$ dial counterclockwise by one click.
Stop playing and remove the disc	Press OPEN/CLOSE.

### 🍟 When you turn off the player


The player remembers the last playing disc and the play mode: Continuous (on page 13), Shuffle (on page 20), or Program (on page 21). When you turn on the player again, the player plays the same disc in the same play mode.

### Note

If " $\neg$ " appears in the large display, the disc has reached the end while you were pressing  $\triangleright$ . Turn the  $\mid \blacktriangleleft \triangleleft$  AMS  $\triangleright \triangleright \mid$  dial counterclockwise or press  $\blacktriangleleft \triangleleft$  to go back.

### Playing CDs

Locating a specific track or a point in a track while observing the remote display



**1** During stop mode, press TRACK.

Press the Easy scroll key. To return to the previous display, press BACK.


### Note

When you select a CD TEXT disc, track titles appear in step 2 instead of the track numbers.

# Using the Display

You can check stored disc information, such as the Disc Names (see page 27) or Artist Names (see page 36), by using the display.

Unlike a normal CD, a CD TEXT disc includes information such as the disc title or artist name. The display shows the CD TEXT information so that you can check the current disc title, artist name, and track title. When the player detects a CD TEXT disc, "CD TEXT" appears in the display. If your CD TEXT disc has multi-language capacity, "MULTI CD TEXT" appears in the display. If you want to check the information in another language, refer to "Selecting the language of the CD TEXT information" on page 15.




### Display information of the normal discs

The display shows the current disc number, total number of tracks, and total playing time of the disc.






### Display information of the playing disc

While playing a disc, the display shows the current disc number, track number, playing time of the track, and the next disc number.







Current disc number

The large display shows up to 13 characters of the information. When you press SCROLL, all the information scrolls in the display.

The information is displayed as follows:

- When the Artist Name is assigned to the current disc
  - Disc Name/ & Assigned Artist Name
- When no Artist Name is assigned to the current disc

### **Display information of CD TEXT discs**

### Display information in stop mode

The display shows the disc title. When you press SCROLL, the disc title scrolls in the display. When you assign the artist Name (see page 36), the artist name also appears and scrolls in the display.



### Display information while playing a disc

The display shows the disc and track title alternately. When you press SCROLL, the disc title and track title scroll in the display.

The display shows up to 13 characters of the information. When you press SCROLL, all the information scrolls in the display.

- The information is displayed as follows:
  - When the Artist Name is assigned to the current disc
    - Disc title of CD TEXT/♥ Assigned Artist Name
  - When no Artist Name is assigned to the current disc



# Selecting the language of the CD TEXT information


You can select the language used to display the CD TEXT information when you select a CD TEXT disc with multi-language information.

Once you select the language, the display shows the information in the selected language until you turn off the player. If the player cannot read the language memorized in a CD TEXT disc, "other lang." appears.

**1** Press MENU/NO in stop mode. "Select lang.?" flashes.



**2** Push the JOG dial. The current operating language flashes.



- **3** Turn the JOG dial until the language you want appears in the display.
- **4** Push the JOG dial to select the language. "Reading text" appears momentarily, then the display shows the information in the selected language.


### ϔ You can check the current language

- 1 Press MENU/NO while playing a CD TEXT disc. "Show lang.?" flashes.
- 2 Push the JOG dial. The current language appears momentarily.
- You can also check the current language while selecting a CD TEXT disc without multi-language information.

### Note

If you select a CD TEXT disc that does not contain the information of the selected language, the display shows the information in another language according to the disc's priority.

# Locating a Specific Disc



### Locating a disc on the player

Turn the JOG dial until the desired disc number or Disc Name (see page 27) appears in the display. Push the JOG dial to start play.

### To skip discs quickly

Press +100. Each time you press +100, the player skips 100 discs.

# Locating a disc by searching for a specific Disc Name (Name Search)

You can search for and locate a desired disc by the first character of the Disc Name (see page 27). The Name Search function can display the Disc Name in alphabetical order.

- **1** Press NAME SEARCH. "NAME SEARCH" appears in the display.
- 2 Turn the JOG dial to find the desired disc. As you turn the JOG dial, the Disc Names starting with the input character appear in the display.



First character

The following characters are displayed as the first character.

A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9

If "NOT FOUND" appears in the display while inputting the first character with the JOG dial, no disc has been labeled using the input character.

### Notes

- When searching for input characters, blanks and symbols before the first character in the Disc Name are ignored.
- When searching for input characters, upper and lower cases cannot be differentiated.
- Push the JOG dial to select the disc.In Program Play mode, the disc will be added to the end of the program.

### To cancel Name Search


Press NAME SEARCH again.

### Note


The Name Search function on the player does not work during ALL DISCS shuffle play.

# Locating a disc while observing the TV screen

When you connect the player and your TV (see page 5), you can select the disc while observing the TV screen.



**1** Set your TV to the connected input of the player. The disc information display appears on the TV screen.



Track title (appears when the current disc is CD-TEXT disc)

\* Each time you press SCROLL, the Disc Name and Artist Name interchange.

2 Move the cursor to a desired disc by using CURSOR ↑/↓/←/→.
When you press CURSOR ↑/↓, the cursor moves

by one.

When you press CURSOR  $\leftarrow / \rightarrow$ , the cursor moves by ten.

**3** Press CURSOR ENTER.




Artist names of CD TEXT disc are not displayed. Only the assigned Artist Names are displayed.

### Locating a disc using the remote

You can locate a disc using the remote. If you have stored the Disc Names (see page 27), you can use them to locate a disc.

Before following the procedure below, be sure to load the Disc Name data into the remote's memory by following the procedure in "Loading the Custom Files into the remote" on page 30.





- **1** Press DISC.
- 2 Press the number button of the disc. Example: To enter number 35 Press 3, then 5.

**3** Press ENTER to start play.

To locate a disc directly while observing the remote's display **a** 

1 Move the cursor (►) to the desired disc by using the Easy scroll key.

2 Press the Easy scroll key. If the player has no disc in the slot you selected, "NO DISC!!!" appears.



### 🍟 When you operate the 2nd player

Follow the procedure on page 41 so that "2nd player" appears in the remote's display, then operate from the step 1.

### Notes

- The Shuffle (on page 20) and Program (on page 21) Play modes are canceled when you locate a disc using the remote.
- If the MEGA CONTROL button or the HIT LIST button is lit, you cannot locate a disc by observing the remote's display.

# To locate a disc by scanning each Disc Name (Name Scan)

You can locate a desired disc quickly by scanning the Disc Names (see page 27) in the display. Note that you cannot use this function in the ALL DISCS Shuffle Play mode.

**1** Press NAME SCAN.

"NAME SCAN" appears in the display, and the Disc Names scroll in the display.

**2** Press ▷ when the Disc Name of the desired disc appears.

The disc is set to the playing position, and the player starts playing.

In Program Play mode, the disc is added to the end of the program if you press ENTER instead of  $\triangleright$ .

### Note


If "NO ENTRY" appears in the display, no disc has been labeled with the Disc Name. Try the Name Scan function again after labeling the discs. To locate a disc using the Disc Name data on the remote **a** 

You can search for and locate a desired disc by using the Disc Name data on the remote.

Before following the procedure below, be sure to load the Disc Name data into the remote's memory (see page 30).

**1** Press MENU.

- 2 Move the cursor (►) to "Name search" by using the Easy scroll key, then press the Easy scroll key.
- **3** Push the Easy scroll key up or down until the first character in the Disc Name of the CD you want appears.



Each time you push the Easy scroll key up or down, the characters appear in the following order.

A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9

**4** Press the Easy scroll key to input the character you want.

The display shows the Disc Names starting with the input character. The second CD player's disc numbers are displayed in reverse contrast.



If "not found" appears after inputting the first character, no disc has been labeled using the input character.

**5** Move the cursor to the disc number you want to play, then press the Easy scroll key.


### Notes

- Shuffle Play (on page 20) and Program Play (on page 21) are canceled when you use this function on the remote.
- The Disc Names of the 2nd player do not appear when the player is in Artist Play (on page 36) or Group Play (on page 33) mode.

# Specifying the Next Disc to Play

You can specify the next disc to play while playing a disc in Continuous or 1 DISC Shuffle Play mode.

While playing a disc, turn the JOG dial. "NEXT DISC" flashes in the display and the disc number or Disc Name (see page 27) changes as you turn the JOG dial. When the desired disc number or Disc Name appears in the display, stop turning the JOG dial.




After the current disc is played, the next disc you have specified starts playing.

If you want to skip to the next disc right away, push the JOG dial while playing the current disc.

To cancel the disc you have specified Press CONTINUE twice.

# Playing the Disc Just Inserted (Easy Play)

You can play the disc that was just inserted in slot 1 by pressing only one button.



- **1** Open the front cover by pressing OPEN/CLOSE.
- **2** Press EASY PLAY. Slot 1 moves into loading position.
- **3** Insert the disc in slot 1.
- **4** Press EASY PLAY. The EASY PLAY button is lit and the player starts playing the disc in slot 1.





# Playing Discs in Various Modes (Repeat/Shuffle Play)

You can play discs or tracks repeatedly (Repeat Play) in any play mode.

You can also have the player "shuffle" the tracks and play in random order (Shuffle Play). The player shuffles all the tracks on all discs or on the disc you specify.





### Playing repeatedly (Repeat Play)

Press REPEAT while playing a disc. "REPEAT" appears in the display. The player repeats the discs/tracks as follows:

### To cancel Repeat Play

Press REPEAT twice.

### To repeat the current track

While the track you want is being played, press REPEAT one or more times until "REPEAT 1" appears in the display.

### To cancel Repeat 1 Play

Press REPEAT.

- **1** Press SHUFFLE repeatedly until "ALL DISCS" and "SHUFFLE" appear in the display.



- Even if you press or turn off the player during ALL DISCS Shuffle Play, the player remembers which discs or tracks were played and which were not. Therefore, if you want to start ALL DISCS Shuffle Play again from the beginning, be sure to repeat the procedure from step 1.

# Creating Your Own Program (Program Play)

You can arrange the order of the tracks and/or discs to create three different programs that are stored automatically. A program can contain up to 32 "step." One "step" may contain a track or a whole disc. You can make programs using the controls on the remote or on the player. However, the programming procedures are different.



### Creating a program on the player





Even if you replace discs, the programmed disc and track numbers remain. Therefore, the player will play the new disc and track numbers. However, the programmed disc and track numbers that are not found in the player or on the disc are deleted from the program, and the rest of the program is played in the programmed order.

You can select the program number (PROGRAM 1,2, or 3) by using the remote The Press PROGRAM on the remote repeatedly until the

desired program number appears in the display.

### Note

If you select Group Play mode (on page 33), Artist Play mode (on page 36), or Hit List (on page 39), Program Play will be canceled.

### Checking the programmed order

You can check your program before or after you start playing.

Press CHECK.

Each time you press this button, the display shows the disc and track number of each step in the programmed order. (When a whole disc is programmed as one step, "AL" appears instead of the track number.) After the last step in the program, the display shows "– END –" and returns to the original display.

# Customising the Sound of Your Music (Digital Filter)

By selecting the type of filter you want, you can adjust the sound to match your system, your speakers, etc. This player has three types of filters.



Types of Digital Filter Sound Image	
STD (Standard)	<ul><li>wide ranging</li><li>ample spatial representation</li></ul>
1 (Clear)	<ul><li>clear</li><li>smooth sound reproduction</li></ul>

Set the FILTER control to the digital filter type you want. The display shows the digital filter type you select.


If you change the type of digital filter during play, the sound will be interrupted momentarily.

### Note

The Digital Filter function primarily changes characteristics outside the audible frequency. They cannot affect changes within the audible frequency such as those provided by the tone controls of the amplifier. Therefore, with certain combinations of hardware and software, there may be no noticeable effect after switching the filter.

# Using the Timer

You can start playing a disc at any given time by connecting a timer (not supplied). Refer also to the instructions for the timer if you need help.




- **1** Press one of the play mode buttons to select the desired play mode.
- **2** Set TIMER on the player to PLAY.
- **3** Set the timer to the desired time. The player turns off. When the set time comes, the player turns on and starts playing.
- **4** After you have used the timer, set TIMER on the player to OFF.

# Fading In or Out

You can manually fade the sound in or out to prevent tracks from starting or ending abruptly.

Note that you cannot use this effect when you use the DIGITAL OUT (OPTICAL) connector.



### Note

Fading lasts for about 5 seconds.

# What You Can Do With the Custom Files

The player can store four types of information called "Custom Files" for each disc. Once you have stored Custom Files for a disc, the player automatically recalls what you have stored whenever you select the disc. Note that Custom Files are erased if you do not use the player for about one month.

### You can store this information:

When you use	You can
Disc Name (page 27)	Label discs using up to 20 characters
Delete Bank (page 32)	Delete unwanted tracks and store only the tracks you want
Group File (page 33)	Group discs in up to eight groups, to locate them easily
Artist File (page 36)	Classify discs according to an artist name

### Where are Custom Files stored?

Custom Files are stored not on the disc, but in the player's memory. Therefore you cannot use Custom Files when you play the disc on other players.

### If you replace discs with Custom Files

The Custom File information you have stored remains, since the Custom File information is assigned to each slot. Erase all the Custom Files (Disc Name, Delete Bank, Group File, and Artist File) of the old disc, and then file the new disc information in the Custom Files.

### Erasing all Custom Files of all discs

- **1** Press MENU/NO.
- **2** Turn the JOG dial until "ALL ERASE ?" appears.
- **3** Push the JOG dial. "ALL ERASE ??" flashes.
- Push the JOG dial."ALL ERASE" appears in the display, and all Custom Files are erased.

### Note

When you perform the operation as described above, all of your own settings are deleted and the original factory settings are restored.

# Labeling Discs (Disc Name)


You can label discs using up to 20 characters and have the player display the Disc Name each time you select the disc. The Disc Name can be anything you like, such as a title, musician's name, category, or date of purchase. You can also label the discs in the second player.

### ϔ When you select a CD TEXT disc

The disc title is automatically stored as the Disc Name. If the disc title has more than 20 characters, only the first 20 characters of the disc title are stored (see page 15). When you replace a disc with a CD TEXT disc, the disc title of the CD TEXT disc is also stored automatically. Note that you cannot change the Disc Name of a CD TEXT disc.

You can label discs while the front cover is open

### Labeling discs on the player



**1** Turn the JOG dial until the disc number to which you want to assign a Disc Name appears in the display.

When you label a disc with the front cover closed, the disc number of the disc at the playing position appears.

# Storing Specific Tracks (Delete Bank)

You can delete unwanted tracks and store only the tracks you want. When you select the disc containing a Delete Bank, the player will play only the remaining tracks.

- **3** Press CHECK repeatedly until the track you want to delete appears in the display.



**4** Press CLEAR. "DELETE" and "OFF" appear in the display.



# Grouping Discs (Group File)

You might find that too many discs make it hard to find the disc you want. This player has a feature that lets you classify discs into eight groups. Each disc can be put into only one group.

Once you classify discs, you can enjoy Continuous, Shuffle, or Repeat Play within a certain group (Group Play).


This unit can control a second CD player (see "Connecting another CD player" on page 6). Even when a second CD player is connected, the controls on both of the units will function. When you press the play button on either unit, the operating player stops and the idle player starts. Make sure that "2nd DETECTED" appears in this player's display after turning on both players. Note that, depending on the player, you may not be able to operate all the functions of the second CD player.

The controls indicated in the illustration below are effective while the MEGA CONTROL button is lit. To operate the master player, press MEGA CONTROL so that the MEGA CONTROL button goes off, and to operate the second player, press MEGA CONTROL so that the MEGA CONTROL button lights up.





# Playing Alternately (No-Delay Play/X-Fade Play)

When you connect a second player, you can play tracks in this player and those from the second player alternately from any play mode (see "Connecting another CD player" on page 6).

Select one of the following methods:

- No-Delay Play: The current player changes at each track. Each time the current player changes to the other player, the other player starts play without a break in sound immediately after the current player ends play. The other player skips the lead-in portion and starts playing from where the sound actually begins.
- X-Fade Play: The current player changes at each track or at the specified interval. You can select the interval, 30, 60, or 90 seconds. Each time the current player changes to the other player, the sound from both players is mixed. The current player ends play by fading out, and the other player starts play by fading in.



- **1** Select the desired disc and play mode for each player.
- **2** When you select No-Delay Play Press NO DELAY. "NO DELAY" appears in the display.

# When you select X-Fade Play

Press X-FADE. "X-FADE" appears in the display. Each time you press the X-FADE button, the indication appears as follows:

 $\rightarrow$ X-FADE off  $\rightarrow$  at track end  $\rightarrow$  after 30 sec –

To change the current player each time a whole track is finished, select "at track end." To change the current player at the specified interval, press X-FADE repeatedly until the interval you want appears in the display.

The MEGA CONTROL button lights up when a track in the second player is selected.

#### To cancel No-Delay/X-Fade Play

Press the corresponding button repeatedly until "NO DELAY" or "X-FADE" disappears from the display. The current player continues playing.

#### You can change the method (No-Delay or X-Fade) during play

Press the corresponding button (NO DELAY or X-FADE) following the procedure in step 2.

# You can start X-Fade at any point of the track


Press FADER during X-Fade Play. Even after you have set the X-Fade mode and started X-Fade play, you can start X-Fade manually at any point you like. Note that you cannot do this operation while the sound from both players is mixed.

#### Notes

- Play starts from the second player if you start play while the MEGA CONTROL button is lit.
- When one player has played all the discs or tracks in the player ahead of the other player, play stops.
- Do not use the controls on the second player during No-Delay/X-Fade Play. They may not work correctly.

# Controlling the Player by Another Unit

When you connect the player to a Sony MD deck compatible with the Mega Control function, or operate a Sony MD deck by using computer software such as "MD Editor," you must set the player as shown below:

- **2** Turn the JOG dial until "CONTROL A1 ?" appears in the display window.

#### To return to normal setting

After following steps 1 and 2, and "CONTROL A1II ?" is displayed, then press YES.

#### Notes

- You can perform the operation above correctly only when you operate Disc 1 to Disc 200.
- You cannot operate this player correctly from another player that does not have the CONTROL A1II jack. In this case, operate the other player from this player.

# Precautions

#### On safety

- Caution The use of optical instruments with this product will increase eye hazard.
- Should any solid object or liquid fall into the cabinet, unplug the player and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

#### On power sources

- Before operating the player, check that the operating voltage of the player is identical with your local power supply. The operating voltage is indicated on the nameplate at the rear of the player.
- The player is not disconnected from the AC power source (mains) as long as it is connected to the wall outlet, even if the player itself has been turned off.
- If you are not going to use the player for a long time, be sure to disconnect the player from the wall outlet. To disconnect the AC power cord (mains lead), grasp the plug itself; never pull the cord.
- The AC power cord must be changed only at a qualified service shop.

#### On placement

- Place the player in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent heat build-up in the player.
- Do not place the player on a soft surface such as a rug that might block the ventilation holes on the bottom.
- Do not place the player in a location near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust or mechanical shock.

#### On operation

• If the player is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp room, moisture may condense on the lenses inside the player. Should this occur, the player may not operate properly. In this case, leave the player turned on for about an hour until the moisture evaporates.

#### On adjusting volume

• Do not turn up the volume while listening to a portion with very low level inputs or no audio signals. If you do, the speakers may be damaged when a peak level portion is played.

#### On cleaning

• Clean the cabinet, panel and controls with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder or solvent such as alcohol or benzine.

#### On transportation


• When transporting the player, open the front cover then remove all the discs from the player and turn the power off.

# Notes on CDs

#### On handling CDs

- To keep the disc clean, handle the disc carefully.
- Do not stick paper or tape on the disc.



- Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or heat sources such as hot air ducts, nor leave it in a car parked in direct sunlight as there can be considerable rise in temperature inside the car.
- After removing a disc from the disc slot, store the disc in its case.

#### On cleaning

• Before playing, clean the disc with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out.



• Do not use solvents such as benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners or anti-static spray intended for vinyl LPs.

# Troubleshooting

If you experience any of the following difficulties while using the player, use this troubleshooting guide to help you remedy the problem. Should any problem persist, consult your nearest Sony dealer.

# There's no sound.

- $\rightarrow$  Check that the player is connected securely.
- ➡Make sure you operate the amplifier correctly.

## The CD does not play.

- ➡There's no CD inside the player ("-NO DISC-" appears). Insert a CD.
- ➡Insert the CD with the label side facing right.
- $\Rightarrow$ Clean the CD (see page 44).
- ➡ Moisture has condensed inside the player. Remove the disc and leave the player turned on for about an hour (see page 44).

# The remote does not function.

- →Remove obstacles in the path of the remote and the player.
- →Point the remote at the remote sensor R on the player.
- $\Rightarrow$  Be sure to set up the remote correctly.
- →Replace all the batteries in the remote with new ones if the appears in the remote's display.
- Set the command mode of the remote according to the command mode of the player.

## The player functions incorrectly.

➡ The microcomputer chips may be operating incorrectly. Disconnect the AC power cord, then connect it back to the wall outlet to reset the player.
