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Section 1: Getting Started

This section helps you to quickly start using your device.

Understanding This User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 180. Also included is important safety information, beginning on page 146, that you should know before using your device. This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to "Securing Your Device" on page 13.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

→ Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures. For example:

From a Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Settings** → **Display** → **Screen timeout**.

Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) are included with the device for charging the battery.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off. For battery use information, see "About Device" on page 144.

Tip: Touch the Time field to display battery charge status.

Charging the Battery

Your device comes with a Wall/USB Charger (Outlet Connector, Charging Head, and USB cable) to charge your device from any standard AC power outlet.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

1. Insert the USB cable into the Charging Head (1).



Insert the USB cable into the device's Charger/ Accessory Port (2).



Warning! While the device is charging, if the touch screen does not function due to an unstable power supply, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the USB cable from the device.

- Plug the Charging Head into a standard AC power outlet.
- When charging is complete, unplug the Charging Head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Note: You cannot charge the battery using the USB cable and your PC.

Note: If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the USB power adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

Installing the SIM Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, available optional services, and many others features.

Important! The plug-in SIM card information and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratching or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.

 Carefully slide the SIM card into the SIM card socket (1) until the card locks into place (2). The illustration shows the screen facing up. Caution! Make sure that the SIM card's gold contacts face downward and that the notched corner of the card goes in first.



Note: If the card is not inserted correctly, the device will not detect the SIM card. Re-orient the card back into the slot if the SIM is not detected.

Turning Your Device On and Off

Turning Your Device On

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

Note: Your device's internal antenna is located along the top back of the device. Do not block the antenna; doing so may affect signal quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than is necessary. For more information, refer to "GPS Applications" on page 95.



Turning Your Device Off

- 1. Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.
- 2. At the **Device options** prompt, touch **Power off**.
- 3. At the Power off prompt, touch OK.

Setting Up Your Device

When you first turn on your device, you are asked to set up a few things. To do that, the following screens display. Some screens can be skipped (touch **Skip**) or re-displayed (touch **Back**). Some screens display depending on the options you choose.

Let's Set Up Your Device

Use this screen to quickly and easily set up email accounts, import contacts, and configure Wi-Fi.

- 1. Touch **Español**, if desired. English is the default.
- Touch Terms & Conditions, read the End User License Agreement for Ready2Go, then touch next to begin.

- 3. Touch get started to begin.
 - or -

Touch **Remind Later** to set up your device later and then touch **exit**.

To access this screen later, touch **Apps** → AT&T Ready2Go.

- 4. Read and follow the instructions on each screen to set up your phone. Throughout the Ready2Go Setup Wizard you can do the following:
 - Touch next to view the next screen.
 - Touch **back** to re-display the previous screen.
 - Press Home to exit the Ready2Go Setup Wizard and return to the Home screen.
- Once set up is complete, touch exit.Depending on your set up choices, some of the following screens may not display.

Creating a New Google Account

In order to utilize your device to the fullest extent, you will need to create a Google Account when you first use your device. With a Google Account, Google applications will always be in sync between your tablet and computer.

If you need to create a Google account, follow these steps:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Gmail.
 The Add a Google Account screen displays.
- Touch New to create a new Google account.For more information, refer to "Setting Up Your Gmail Account" on page 53.

Using Google Maps

In order to use some applications related to Google Maps, you must first connect Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 114.

You must also enable location services to use Google Maps. Some features require Standalone or Google location services. For more information, refer to "Location Services" on page 128.

Task Manager

Your device can run applications simultaneously and some applications run in the background.

Use Task Manager to see which applications are running on your device and to end running applications to extend battery life. You can also uninstall applications from your device and see how much memory is used by applications.

Task Manager Application

The Task Manager application provides information about applications, including **Active applications**, **Downloaded**, **RAM manager**, **Storage**, and **Help**.

To access the Task Manager:

 Add the Active Apps Manager widget to a Home screen and then touch Active applications on the Active Apps Manager widget. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 29.

- or -

Touch and hold **Home** and then touch

Task manager.

- Touch Active applications to view applications running on your device. Touch End to end an application or End all to end all running applications.
- Touch Downloaded to view applications installed from Google Play. Touch Uninstall to remove an application from your device.
- Touch RAM manager to display the amount of Random Access Memory (RAM) currently in use. Touch Clear memory to clear inactive and background processes.
- Touch Storage to view internal (Device memory) and external (SD card) storage memory statistics.
- **6.** Touch **Help** to view useful tips for extending battery life.

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSD or microSDHC memory cards with maximum capacities of 32 GB (depending on the memory card manufacturer and type). Memory cards are used to store music, photos, videos, and other files.

Note: You can only store music files that you own (from a CD or purchased with the device) on a memory card.

Installing a Memory Card

- Open the Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot (1), pushing gently until it clicks into place (2).
- 3. Replace the Memory Card Slot cover.



Removing a Memory Card

Important! To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Storage.
- Under SD card, touch Unmount SD card and then touch OK.

- Open the Memory Card Slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- Gently press down on the memory card (1), so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out (2).
- Replace the Memory Card Slot cover.For more information, refer to "Memory Card" on page 92.

Securing Your Device

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually. You can unlock the device using one of the default Unlock screens or, for increased security, use a personal screen unlock pattern.

Unlocking the Device

 The Lock screen displays.
- 2. Swipe across the screen as shown.



The last screen you accessed displays.

Tip: Touch one of the app shortcut icons and then swipe to launch that application.

Note: You can customize the Lock screen and set the type of Screen Unlock you want to use (Swipe, Face unlock, Face and voice, Pattern, PIN, Password, or None). For more information, refer to "Lock Screen" on page 129.

Troubleshooting

If your device has fatal errors, hangs up, or freezes, you may need to reset the device to regain functionality.

 $\bullet\,$ If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the

Power/Lock Key for 8 to 10 seconds.



Front View

The following items can be found on the front of your device as illustrated.


- Light Sensor: Used to control screen brightness automatically when taking photos with the front-facing camera.
- Front-Facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- Display Screen: The orientation of the display screen rotates with the tablet as you turn it. For more information, refer to "System" on page 142.
- Menu Key: Display a list of options for the current app or screen.
- Home Key: Display the central Home screen. Touch and hold to display recent apps that have been accessed.
- 6. Back Key: Return to the previous screen or option.



Side Views

The following items can be found on the sides of your device as illustrated.

- 1. Microphone: Used for video chat.
- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- 3. SIM Card Port: Insert your SIM card here.
- Volume Key: From a Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume. During music playback, press to adjust volume.
- Infrared Blaster: Used to emit infrared signals used for controlling external devices.
- Memory Card Slot: Install a memory card for storage of files



Back View and Bottom

The following items can be found on the back of your device as illustrated.

- 1. 3.5mm Headset Jack: Used for headphones.
- **2. Camera Lens**: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- Charger/Accessory Port: Plug in a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.
- External Speakers: Used in music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.



Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

- Status Bar: The area along the top of the Home screen which displays notifications (on the left side), battery power, and connection details (on the right side). For more information, refer to "Status Bar" on page 27.
- Time: Displays the current time. For more information, refer to "Date and Time" on page 141.
- Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 29.
- App Shortcuts: Shortcuts to apps. For more information, refer to "App Shortcuts" on page 28.
- Current Page: Indicates which Home screen page is being displayed. For more information, refer to "Extended Home Screen" on page 20.
- Primary Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common features which are displayed on all Home screens. For more information, refer to "Primary Shortcuts" on page 28.
- 7. Apps: Display the Apps screen.



Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the main Home screen page, indicated by \bigcap , plus additional pages that extend beyond the display width to provide additional space for adding app shortcuts and widgets. For more information, refer to "Adding and Removing Home Screen Pages" on page 21. Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right pages. As you scroll, the indicator at the bottom of the display shows the current page.

Note: The main Home screen page, indicated by \(\frac{1}{\sqrt{1}} \), always displays when you touch \(\begin{array}{c} \text{Home} \end{array} \)

Customizing the Home Screen Pages

You can customize the Home screen pages to suit your needs and preferences.

- **1.** Navigate to one of the Home pages.
- 2. Touch and hold on an empty part of the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays.
- Touch Set wallpaper to change the Home screen wallpaper. For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 30.
- 4. Under Add to Home screen, touch:
 - Apps and widgets to add app shortcuts or widgets to the Home screen.
 - Folder to add a folder to a Home screen. For more information, refer to "Folders" on page 29.
 - Page to add a new Home screen.

Adding and Removing Home Screen Pages

Your device comes with seven Home screen pages. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding pages.

Note: The main Home screen page, indicated by \bigcap , always displays when you touch Home.



- From a Home screen, pinch the screen from the left and right side to the center to display the editing screen.
- **2.** Use these controls to configure pages:



Remove: Touch and drag a page to the Trash Can to remove the page from the Home screen.



Add: Touch to add a new page, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven pages have been added.



Default Home Page: Touch the Home icon at the top of a page to set it as the default Home screen.

- To rearrange the order of pages, touch and drag a page to a new location.
- 4. Touch **Back** to return to the Home screen.

Navigating Your Device

 - Touch so to close all recently used apps.

Context-Sensitive Menus

Context-sensitive menus offer options for features or screens. To access context-sensitive menus:

- Touch | Menu to display a list of options.
- . Touch an option in the list.

Screen Navigation

Touch

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on-screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Touch a menu item to select it.
- Touch an application's shortcut to launch the application.

Touch and Hold

Activate on-screen items. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget on the Home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Swipe, Flick, or Slide

Swipe, flick, or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- Unlocking the screen.
- · Scrolling the Home screens or a menu.

Pinch and Spread

"Pinch" the screen using your thumb and forefinger to zoom out or "spread" the screen to zoom in when viewing a picture or a Web page. For example:



- Pinch a photo in Gallery to zoom in.
- Pinch a webpage to zoom in or out.

Notifications

When you receive a Notification, a notification icon displays on the left side of the Status Bar. Notifications indicate the arrival of Gmail, Email, alarms, and more.

Notification Panel

The Notification Panel displays ongoing connections and events, as well as summaries of all current Notifications.

Quick Settings are also located on the Notification Panel. For more information, refer to "Quick Settings" on page 24.

- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.
 The Notification Panel screen displays.
 - Ongoing: Lists all connections and background processes currently running.
 - Notifications: Lists events and notifications from apps.
- 2. Touch a Notification to respond to it.
- To delete a Notification, touch and slide it left or right.
 or –

To delete all Notifications, touch Clear.

 Touch Home, Back, or swipe up to close the Notification Panel.



Quick Settings

Quick Settings allows you enable/disable common features such as Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, GPS, Screen rotation, and more.

1. Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.

- The Notification Panel screen displays.

 Touch a Quick Setting button to enable (green) or disable (grey) a setting or feature.
- 2. Scroll left or right to display additional Quick Settings, or touch to list all of the Quick Settings.



To configure Quick Settings, touch 🎤 . For more information, refer to "Notification Panel" on page 122.

Touch **:** to return to a single row of Quick Settings.

- 3. The Quick Settings are:
 - Wi-Fi: Touch to enable or disable Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 84.
 - GPS: Touch to enable or disable Standalone GPS services. For more information, refer to "Location Services" on page 128.
 - Sound/Mute: Touch to enable or disable sound mode.
 - Screen rotation: When On the screen rotates automatically from landscape to portrait and vice versa. When Off the screen is fixed in the current mode, either portrait or landscape.
 - Bluetooth: Touch to enable or disable Bluetooth. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 87.
 - Blocking mode: When enabled, notifications for selected features will be disabled. For more information, refer to "Blocking Mode" on page 119.
 - Power saving: When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power. For more information, refer to "Power Saving Mode" on page 124.

- Multi window: Display two apps on the screen at once. For more information, refer to "Using the Multi Window" on page 32.
- Driving mode: New notifications are read aloud when enabled.
- Smart stay: Set the screen to stay on as long as you look at it.
 For more information, refer to "Smart Screen" on page 123.
- Sync: Synchronizes your device with the network.
 Synchronizes contacts, email, time, and a variety of accounts.
- Airplane mode: Airplane mode allows you to use many of your tablet's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where accessing data is prohibited.
- Touch Settings to open the Settings application. For more information, refer to "Settings" on page 114.

- 5. Touch the Brightness slider and drag it to set the brightness or touch Auto to allow the device to set brightness automatically based on available light and battery charge status. For more information, refer to "Brightness" on page 122.
- 6. Touch the time and date at the top to configure:
 - Touch Automatic date and time or Automatic time zone to use network-provided date and time or time zone.
 - Touch Use 24-hour format to enable the 24-hour format.
 - Touch Manual setup to display the Date and time settings screen. For more information, refer to "Date and Time" on page 141.
- 7. Touch Home, Back, or swipe up to close the Notification Panel.

Notifications display in the Status Bar and, in some cases, under the Notifications heading on the Notifications Panel to alert you to activity on the tablet such as new messages, application downloads, software updates, and more.

The following table lists those icons:



System Alert: Check under the Notifications heading in the Quick Settings for alerts.



Download: An application or file is being downloaded or has been downloaded to the device.



Download Successful: A recent application download or update completed successfully.



New Email Message: You have new email. Touch Reply to view and answer the email.



New Gmail Message: You have new Gmail. Touch the icon for additional information.



Music Player: Music is playing. Display the Status Details to see the song title and music player controls. For more information, refer to "Music Player" on page 72.



Music App: A song is playing in the Music app. Touch the Music icon or touch the Status Details to see the song title and music player controls. For more information, refer to "Play Music" on page 78.

GPS Active: Displays when GPS is active.



Software Update: There may be a software update available for this device. For more information, refer to "Software Update" on page 145.



Updates Available: Updates to the applications you have downloaded are available.



Select Input Method: When the keyboard is being displayed, open the Notification Panel screen to display a menu of quick keyboard settings. For more information, refer to "Keyboards and Input Methods" on page 133.



Wi-Fi Direct: Displays when Wi-Fi Direct is active and your tablet is connected to another device. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi Direct" on page 86.



Screenshot Captured: A screenshot has been captured.



Nearby Devices: The Nearby devices setting is enabled. For more information, refer to "Nearby Devices" on page 118.



Blocking Mode: Notifications for selected features are disabled. For more information, refer to "*Blocking Mode*" on page 119.



Driving Mode: New notifications will be read by your device.



Event: This is a notification for one or more events. For more information, refer to "Creating an Event or Task" on page 100.



Navigation Active: The Navigation App is active. For more information, refer to "*Navigation*" on page 109.



USB Connected: Device is connected to a computer using a USB cable.

Status Bar

The Status Bar displays icons to show network status, battery power, and other details.



Battery Level: Shown fully charged.



Charging Indicator: Battery is charging.



Device Power Critical: Battery has only three percent power remaining. At about 15 percent power remaining, a pop-up is displayed to remind you to charge immediately.



USB Connection Indicator: The device is connected to a computer using a USB cable, but it is not charging. The battery is only charged while connected to a computer, if the device is turned off. When the device is off, press the Power/Lock key to see the battery charging indicator.



Battery Fully Charged: When the battery is fully charged, this indicator is displayed.



Signal Strength: The greater the number of bars, the stronger the signal.



Airplane Mode: Indicates that the Airplane Mode is active, which allows you to use many of your device's features, but it cannot access online information or applications.



Bluetooth Active: Bluetooth is turned on. For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 87.



Wi-Fi Active: Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Alarm Set: Displays when you set an alarm to ring at a specified time. For more information, refer to "Alarm" on page 96.



Smart Stay: Set the screen to stay on as long as you look at it. For more information, refer to "Smart Screen" on page 123.

Primary Shortcuts

Primary Shortcuts display at the bottom of all Home screens. The default Primary Shortcuts are: Email, Calendar, Browser, Camera, Settings, and Apps.

App Shortcuts

Use App Shortcuts for quick access to applications or features, such as Email or other applications.

- Navigate to the Home screen on which you want to place the App Shortcut.
- 2. Touch Apps.
 - or –

Touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the **Home screen** options pop-up displays and then touch **Apps and widgets**.

- 3. Touch the Apps tab.
- Touch and hold the App Shortcut until the Home screen displays, then drag the App Shortcut to where you want to place it and release.

Removing App Shortcuts

 Touch and hold the App Shortcut until Remove displays, then drag the App Shortcut to the Remove icon.

Widgets

When you first turn on your tablet, there are various widgets on the center Home screen. They can also appear on the Home screens to the left and right of the center Home screen.

Widgets are self-contained applications that you can place on the Home screens to access your favorite features.

For more information, refer to "Applications" on page 94.

Adding Widgets to a Home screen

- Navigate to the Home screen on which you want to place the Widget and touch Apps.
- 2. Touch the Widgets tab.

Note: Swipe across the screen horizontally to view all Widgets.

Touch and hold the widget's icon until the Home screen displays, then slide your finger where you want to place the icon and release it.

Note: There must be room on the screen where you want to place the widget, otherwise the widget will not add to the Home screen.

Removing Widgets

■ Touch and hold the Widget until Remove displays, then drag the widget to the Remove icon.

Note: This action does not actually delete the Widget, it just removes it from the current Home screen.

Folders

Place Folders on a Home screen to organize items together.

Adding Folders

To create a folder on a Home page:

- 1. Navigate to the desired Home screen.
- Touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays and then touch Folder.

The Create folder pop-up displays.

Touch the Unnamed folder field, use the keyboard to enter a name for the folder, and touch OK.

A new folder displays on the Home screen.

Managing Folders

To rename a folder:

Touch the folder, touch the current name, and use the keyboard to enter a new name for the folder.

To add an App Shortcut to a folder:

- Add the App Shortcut to the Home screen that the folder is on.
- Touch and hold the App Shortcut, drag it to the folder, and drop it.

To remove an App Shortcut from a folder:

- 1. Touch the folder to view the contents.
- 2. Touch the App Shortcut, drag it out of the folder, and drop it on the Home screen.

Removing a Folder

Touch and hold the folder until Remove displays, then drag the folder to the Remove icon.

Note: Any App Shortcuts in the folder are also removed.

Wallpapers

You can choose a picture to display on the Home Screen, Lock screen, or on both the Home and Lock screens. Choose from preloaded wallpaper images or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area
 of the screen until the Home screen options pop-up
 displays and touch Set wallpaper.
- 2. Touch Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens

The **Select wallpaper from** pop-up displays the following options:

- Gallery: Access the Gallery to select a photo. Touch a photo to select it. Crop and resize the picture, if desired. Touch **Done** to save the picture as wallpaper.
- Live wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded interactive animated wallpapers. Touch a wallpaper to see an example. If available, touch Settings to view options for the selection. Touch Set wallpaper to save your choice.
- Wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images. Touch an image to view it. Touch Set wallpaper to save it as wallpaper.

Apps Screen

The **Apps screen** displays all applications installed on your wireless device. Applications that you download and install from Google Play or from the web are also added to a Home screen.

The Apps icons are arranged in a customizable grid. To arrange the Apps icons in alphabetical order:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- 3. Touch Alphabetical grid.

To manually change the order of the icons on the Apps screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- 2. Touch Menu → Edit.
- 3. Touch and hold an icon and drag it to a new position.
- 4. Touch Save to save the changes.

You can place shortcuts to applications on the Home screen for quick access to the application. For more information, refer to "App Shortcuts" on page 28.

To view your downloaded applications:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- Touch Downloaded applications to view downloaded apps.
- Touch an icon on the Downloaded applications screen to launch the application.
 - or -

Add an App Shortcut to a Home screen by dragging the App icon onto the Home Screen. For more information, refer to "App Shortcuts" on page 28.

Application Information

To view information about an App, such as the amount of storage it uses, force the App to stop, uninstall updates, and clear data:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 → Application manager.
- Touch the All tab, scroll through the apps list, and touch the app to open a screen with details about the App.

Using the Multi Window

This feature allows you to run multiple applications on the current screen at the same time.

Note: Only applications found within the Multi window panel can be active atop another current application on the screen.

When launching applications that contain multimedia files (music/video), audio from both files will be played simultaneously.

Activating and Deactivating Multi Window

To activate Multi window:

From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 → Display → Multi window.

A check mark displays when Multi window is activated.

- 2. Touch Home to return to the Home screen.
- **3.** Touch the Multi window tab) to open the application panel showing all the available Multi window apps.

Note: Initially, the entire Apps panel is briefly displayed, then minimized to only show the tab.

To deactivate Multi window:

 Touch and hold Back. This action hides the Multi window tab from view.

Note: Once you have set the Multi window option On, you only need to touch and hold **Back** to re-activate the Multi window feature.

Tip: You can also activate/deactivate Multi window using Quick Settings. For more information, see "Quick Settings" on page 24.

Repositioning the Multi Window

The Multi window contains two components: tab and Apps panel. The tab can be moved up and down along the side of the Apps panel. The Apps panel can be relocated to either the left or right side of the screen.

To move the tab:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- In a single motion, touch and hold the tab) for approximately one-second, then slowly drag it up or down along the end of the Apps panel to reposition it.

Note: This is a quick way to get the tab out of the way if you can't get to a button or option behind it.



To relocate the Multi window Apps panel:

- Activate the Multi window feature.
- Touch the tab to display the Apps panel (containing the scrollable apps).

3. In a single motion, touch and hold the tab) for approximately one-second, then pull it toward the center of the screen to detach it (1), then slowly drag it to its new location on either the left or right edge of the screen (2).



Customizing the Multi Window Apps

The applications found within the Apps panel of the Multi window can be organized by either being rearranged or removed.

To rearrange the Multi window applications:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 2. Touch the tab to display the Apps panel.
- In a single motion, touch and hold a desired app until it detaches from the panel, then carefully drag it to a new location in the list of apps.

To remove a Multi window application:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 2. Touch the tab to display the Apps panel.
- Touch the Edit button (located at the bottom of the list) to reveal a staging area that can house any removed applications from the Multi window panel.
- Touch **Done** once you have completed the removal process.

To restore a Multi window application:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 2. Touch the tab to display the Apps panel.
- Touch the Edit button (located at the bottom of the list) to reveal the staging area containing any previously removed apps.
- 4. Locate the desired application.
- In a single motion, touch and hold a desired app until it detaches from the staging area, then carefully drag it to a new location in the list of apps.

Using Multi Window to Run Multiple Apps on the Same Screen

Any of the apps found within the Multi window panel can be run at the same time as a current on-screen app.

Once multiple apps are running on the same screen, you can then choose to either swap their positions or maximize a desired app. Note: Only applications found on the Multi window Apps panel can be active atop another application on the screen. When launching applications that contain multimedia files (music/video), audio from both files will be played simultaneously.

In this example we will be launching both the Internet and Maps applications.

- 2. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 3. Touch the tab to display the Apps panel.
- Touch and hold Maps until it detaches from the panel.
- In a single motion drag Maps off of the Apps panel and drop it on to either the top or bottom area of the current on-screen app (Internet).

Note: Once two applications are running, the device displays a split screen view containing both the initial app and the new Multi window app. Each application is now running independent of the other.

To switch the arrangement of the applications:

- With the two
 applications shown in a
 split screen, touch the
 Border Bar to show the
 on-screen icons.
- Touch the desired application area (top or bottom).
- Locate and touch Switch Apps. The current apps are switched.



To increase the size of a desired application window:

- With the two applications shown in a split screen, locate the Border Bar indicating the edge of the app window.
- In a single motion, touch and hold the Border Bar, then drag it to resize the desired window.

To split the current applications:

- 1. With the two applications shown in a split screen, touch the Border Bar to show the on-screen icons.
- 2. Touch the desired application area (top or bottom).
- Locate and touch Maximize. The current apps are the both maximized.
- To exit the Multi window app, touch 🗙

Multiple Users

This device can be shared with multiple people by creating User profiles. Users have their own space, which they can customize with their own apps, wallpaper, and so on. Users can also adjust device settings like Wi-Fi that affect everyone.

To set up an Owner profile and profiles for other users:

From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 → Users.

For more information, refer to "Users" on page 127.

Screen Capture

Touch and hold the Power/Lock Key and Home to capture and save an image of the current screen.

Note: A copy of the screenshot is automatically saved to the clipboard.

To view the screen shots:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → My Files.
- Touch Device storage → storage → emulated → 0 → Pictures → Screenshots.
- 3. Touch a screen capture file to display it.

Entering Text

Your device uses a virtual QWERTY keyboard for text entry called the *Samsung keyboard*. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications. Access the keyboard by touching any text entry field.

You can also use voice input to speak your inputs.

The virtual QWERTY keyboard displays at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen orientation updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.

Text Input Methods

Your device offers three text input methods.

- Google voice typing
- · Samsung keyboard
- Swype

You can set a default text entry method in Settings. For more information, refer to "Keyboards and Input Methods" on page 133.

To change to a different text input method while entering text:

1. Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notifications Panel.

Touch Select input method.

2. Touch an input method to activate it.

Using the Samsung Keyboard

The Samsung keyboard is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring optional predictive text. Input characters by touching the on-screen keys with your finger or use speech recognition.

You can enable predictive text, to have the Samsung keyboard match your key touches to common words and display them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.

Keyboard Types

In addition to the default QWERTY keyboard, there is also a *Floating* keyboard.

To change the keyboard type:

- Access the QWERTY keyboard.
- 2. Touch and hold on the keyboard, select from the pop-up menu, and then touch **Floating**.
- Touch the tab at the top of the Floating keyboard to move it.

Configuring the Samsung Keyboard

You can configure the Samsung keyboard to your preferences. While entering text:

Touch and hold Options on the keyboard and then touch Settings.

The Samsung keyboard settings screen displays.

For more information, refer to "Configuring the Samsung Keyboard" on page 134.

Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by touching the Shift key
to toggle the case, before touching the letter key(s).

- Touch once to switch from abc to Abc mode.
- Touch twice to switch to ABC mode. When ABC mode is enabled, the Shift key background turns blue.

Entering Symbols and Numbers

The number keys are displayed at the top of the keyboard and are always available.

- To enter common symbols, touch sym to switch to symbol mode, then touch the corresponding key.
- There are two pages of symbols. Touch next page.
- Touch and hold a vowel key (A, E, I, O, U, or Y) or the C, N, or S
 key to open a small window where you can chose an accented
 vowel or other alternate letter. Slide to the letter until it is
 highlighted, and release.
- Touch and hold the Period key (.) to open a small window with a set of common symbols.

Using Predictive Text

By using Predictive text, you can have next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which compensates for pressing the wrong keys on the QWERTY keyboard.

Note: Enable Predictive text in Samsung keyboard settings. For more information, refer to "Configuring the Samsung Keyboard" on page 134.

While entering characters, potential word matches display in the Predictive text area above the keyboard.

Touch a word to insert it into your text.

Tip: Touch **(v)** to display more words.

Using Google Voice Typing from the Samsung Keyboard

When you enable the Google voice typing setting, you can use your voice to enter text instead of the keyboard.

For more information about enabling Voice input, see "Using Google Voice Typing" on page 42

Editing Text

You can edit the text you enter in text fields by cutting, copying, or pasting text. These operations can be performed within and across apps. However, some apps do not support editing some or all of the text displayed while others may offer their own way to select text.

Editing Existing Text

To edit text that you have entered:

- Touch the text at the point you want to edit.
 The Cursor displays at the point you touched.
- Touch and drag the Cursor to a better position, if necessary.
- 3. Enter additional text or delete text by repeatedly touching the

 Delete key.

Copying, Deleting, or Replacing Text

To select and copy, delete, or replace text:

- Touch and hold the text or word you want to select.
 The selected text is highlighted between
- 2. Touch and drag either tab to select more or less text.

Tip: Touch Select all in the pop-up to select all text in the field.

Touch on another area of the screen or touch **Done** to deselect the text.

- 3. Depending on the action you want to take for the selected text, in the pop-up touch:
 - Select all to highlight all text in the field.
 - Cut to remove the selected text.
 - Copy to save the selected text to the clipboard.
 - · Paste to paste previously copied text.
 - Clipboard to display the text saved to the clipboard.
 - **Translate** to translate the highlighted word. For more information, refer to "S Translator" on page 111.

– or –

Enter text by typing or speaking to replace the selection with what you type.

- or -

Touch the Delete key to delete the selected text.

Pasting Text

To paste previously copied text:

 Touch the text at the point you want to paste the copied text.

The **Cursor** displays at the point you touched.

2. Touch the Cursor.

A pop-up displays.

3. Touch Paste in the pop-up.

To paste text directly from the clipboard:

- Touch and hold on the keyboard and then select from the pop-up menu to display the text saved to the clipboard.
- Touch a text block to paste that text where the Cursor is positioned.

Closing the Keyboard

To close the keyboard:

■ Touch Back to close the keyboard.

Using the Handwriting Feature

You can enter text simply by using your finger to handwrite letters on your screen.

- From a screen where you can enter text, activate the keyboard by touching a text input field on the screen.
 If the Samsung keyboard is not displayed, touch
 Select input method on the Notifications Panel and then touch Samsung keyboard.
- Touch and hold Options, then touch Handwriting.
 The handwriting pad displays.
- 3. Use your finger tip to write out each character.

Note: To properly recognize the written characters, do not use script.

As you write, suggestions are offered in the word options area in case the correct letters were not recognized.

Handwriting Tips

- For uppercase letters, write the letter larger than the lowercase letters.
- Write a dash (horizontal line) to add a space.
- Delete words by sweeping backward across them.
- To display numbers and symbols, touch 2## and then touch a number or symbol key. Touch the button marked 1/2 or 2/2 to see more symbols and emoticons. Touch x to exit the numbers and symbols keyboard.
- To return to the Samsung keyboard, touch **Keyboard**.

Handwriting Settings

To change the Handwriting settings:

- While entering text using the Handwriting feature, touch the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Touch Select input method.
- Touch Set up input methods, then touch per next to Samsung keyboard to display Samsung keyboard settings.
- Touch Handwriting.
 For more information, refer to "Configuring the Samsung Keyboard" on page 134.
- **5.** Press ***** repeatedly to return to your message.

Using Google Voice Typing

You can use your voice to enter text using the Google voice typing feature.

While entering text using the Samsung keyboard:

- **1.** Touch **•** on the keyboard.
- At the Tap to speak prompt, touch and speak clearly and distinctly into the microphone.
 The software converts your voice to text, which is
 - displayed in the message.
- Keep speaking to add more text.
- **4.** Touch to display the Samsung keyboard.

Entering Text Using Swype

Swype lets you enter words by tracing over the letters on the virtual QWERTY keyboard. Instead of touching each key, use your finger to trace over each letter of a word. You can also touch letters to enter words.

Swype provides next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which can compensate for touching the wrong keys on the virtual QWERTY keyboards.

Enabling Swype

The Samsung keyboard is the default text input method, so to use Swype, you must first change the default keyboard setting.

To enable Swype:

- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Touch Select input method.
- Touch Swype to activate it. The Swype keyboard is displayed.

Using Swype to Enter Text

- Swipe your finger continuously over the letters to form a word. As you swipe over letters, words matching your pattern display at the top of the Swype keyboard.
 To enter a word, lift your finger, or touch a word at the top of the keyboard.
- 2. While entering text, use these options:
 - If you make a mistake, touch to delete a single character.
 Touch and hold to delete an entire word or field.
 - By default, Swype starts with a capital at the beginning of text.
 Touch to start with a capital letter or touch twice to enter all capitals.
 - Touch +1 to switch to a symbols keyboard, and then touch keys to enter symbols.

Swype Settings

For information on how you can configure your Swype settings, see "Configuring the Swype Keyboard" on page 136.

Swype Text Entry Tips

- Create a squiggle (like an S shape) to create a double letter (such as pp in apple).
- Touch and hold a key to view the punctuation menu then make a selection.
- Move your finger or stylus over the apostrophe to enter contractions.

Double-tap on the word you want to change to correct a misspelled word, then touch the delete key to erase one character. Touch and hold the delete key to erase an entire word.

This section explains how to manage contacts and accounts.

Accounts

Your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts. With synchronization, information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

- Samsung Account: Add your Samsung account. For more information, refer to "Signing In to your Samsung Account" on page 140.
- Email: Add an Email account to sync Contacts. For more information, refer to "Email" on page 54.
- Google: Add your Google account to sync your Contacts, Calendar, and Gmail. For more information, refer to "Gmail" on page 53.
- LDAP: Add an LDAP account to find entries in an LDAP directory server.
- Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync: Add your Exchange account to sync Contacts, Calendar, and Email.
- Facebook: Add your Facebook account to sync Contacts.

Setting Up Your Accounts

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the **Accounts** setting.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Add account
- Touch the account type.
- Follow the prompts to enter your account credentials to complete the set-up process.

Your tablet communicates with the appropriate account servers to set up your account. When complete, your account displays in the **Accounts** area of the Settings screen.

Contacts

Store contact information for your friends, family, and colleagues to quickly access information or to send a message.

To access Contacts:

From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.

Creating Contacts

- Touch Contacts → Create.
 The Save contact to pop-up displays.
- 2. Touch Device or an account.
 - or -

Touch Add new account to add a different account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Your Accounts" on page 45.

Touch the Contact photo to set up a photo to identify the contact.

- 4. Touch contact fields to display the keyboard and enter information:
 - Some fields have preset values. Touch the field and touch the desired value. For example, touch the ____ Label tab and touch a label for the field.
 - Other fields need information to be entered. Touch the field and use the on-screen keyboard to input information.
 - Touching the check box next to some fields may make additional fields available.
 - Touch
 to add additional fields. Touch
 to remove an unused field. Also, touch
 Add another field to add other fields.
 - Touch the screen and swipe up or down to display additional fields or touch Next on the keyboard to move to the next field.
- **5.** Touch **Sack** to remove the keyboard.
- When you finish entering information, touch Save.
 – or –

Touch \times Cancel \rightarrow OK to cancel and discard changes.

Tip: Display a contact's record and touch the Email field to send an email, the Address field to display the address on a map, or the Website field to link to the website.

Updating Contacts

To update an existing contact:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch **Edit**.
- **4.** Continue entering contact information. For more information, refer to "Creating Contacts" on page 46.

Deleting Contacts

To delete a contact:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch iii Delete.
- 4. At the prompt, touch **OK**.

Managing Photo IDs

To remove or update a contact's Photo ID:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch **Edit**.
- 4. Touch the Contact photo, then touch Remove, Image, Pictures by people, or Take picture.

Contacts Display Options

There are various ways to display your Contacts and general Contacts settings.

- Touch Contacts.
- **2.** Touch **Groups**, **Favorites**, or **Contacts**, above the Contacts List, to view contacts various ways:
 - Groups: Displays the possible Groups, such as Not assigned, Co-workers, Family, Friends, and so on. The number of contacts in the group is displayed next to the group name.
 Touch a group name to show only contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Creating a New Group" on page 50.
 - Favorites: Show only your favorite, or starred, contacts. For more information, refer to "Favorites" on page 52.
 - Contacts: Show all your contacts. Touch the Search field and enter a keyword to list contacts that contain that keyword.
- 3. From the Groups, Favorites, or Contacts list, touch

 | Image: | Menu to display the options for each display.
- From the Contacts list, touch \(\subseteq \) Menu → Settings to display and manage Contacts settings.

Linked Contacts

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person.

Linking, or joining, imported contact records allows you to see all the contact's numbers and addresses together in one contact entry. Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated, because any changes that your contacts make to their information in the respective accounts is automatically updated the next time you synchronize with the account.

Linking Contacts

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch **Menu** → Link contact.
- Touch the contact you want to link.
 The linked contact's information is displayed with the original contact's information.
- 5. Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to link other contacts.

Separating Contacts

- Touch Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- Touch Menu → Separate contact.
 A list of Joined contacts displays.
- Touch → OK to separate a joined contact.
 The contact is removed from the list.

Sharing Contact Information

You can send one or more contact's information by way of Bluetooth to other Bluetooth devices or in an Email or Gmail as an attachment.

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices accept contacts and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

- 1. Touch 🔼 Contacts.

Tip: Set up a contact record for yourself to share your information with others.

- Touch Selected contact or touch Multiple contacts, touch one or more contacts or touch Select all, and touch Done.
- At the prompt, choose a sending method such as Bluetooth.
- 5. Follow the prompts to send the contact information.

Importing and Exporting Contacts

To back up and restore your contacts information, you can export your contacts list to a storage device, such as a PC, or import your contacts list (previously exported) from a storage device.

- Use the USB cable to connect your device to the storage device.
- Touch Contacts.
- **4.** Touch an option and then follow the prompts to complete the operation.

Groups

Assign contacts to Groups to make searching for contacts faster or to quickly send messages to group members.

Creating a New Group

Create a new group when you add or edit a contact.

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch Groups above the Contacts List.
- 3. Touch **☐** Menu → Create.
- **4.** Touch the **Group name** field and use the keyboard to enter a new Group name.
- Touch Add member to add contacts to the new group. For more information, refer to "Adding Group Members" on page 51.
- Touch Save to save the new group name.

Tip: Contacts can belong to more than one group. Just touch the contact's **Groups** field and touch each group.

Once you create a new group, the Contacts List can be set to display only the contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Contacts Display Options" on page 48.

Renaming a Group

To rename a group that you created:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch Groups and then touch the group you want to rename.
- 3. Touch Menu → Edit.
- Touch the Group name field and use the keyboard to enter a new Group name.
- **5.** Touch **Save** to save the new group name.

Deleting Groups

To delete a group that you created:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch **Groups** and then touch any group you want to delete.
- Touch Delete groups.
 The groups that can be deleted display.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each group to delete.
- Touch Delete to delete the groups. Choose from Group only or Group and group members.

Adding Group Members

To add a contact to a group, just Edit a contact's Group field. For more information, refer to "Updating Contacts" on page 47.

To add multiple contacts to a group:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch **Groups** and then touch the group to which you want to add members.
- Touch Add member.
 The contacts that can be added display.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to add.
- **5.** Touch **Done** to add the contacts to the group.

Removing Group Members

To remove contacts from a group:

- 1. Touch La Contacts.
- Touch Groups and then touch the group from which you want to remove members.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- **5.** Touch **Done** to remove the contacts.

Favorites

Mark contact records with a \bigstar gold star to identify them as favorites.

Adding Favorites

To add a contact to the Favorites list:

- 1. Touch 🔼 Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display it.

Tip: You do not have to edit the contact to change the Starred status.

Accessing Favorites

You can view your favorites two ways for fast viewing or messaging.

To view your favorites list:

- Touch Contacts.
- Touch Favorites above the Contacts List. Only your starred contacts display.

Note: Touch Groups above the Contacts List and then touch Starred in Android to list the Favorites that are being saved on your Google account.

Removing Favorites

To remove one or more contacts from your favorites list:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch Favorites above the Contacts List.
- Touch Menu → Remove from favorites.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- Touch Done to remove the contacts.

To remove one contact from your favorites list:

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display it.
- Touch the ★ Star next to the contact's name so that it is no longer gold ★.

Section 4: Messaging

This section describes how to send and receive messages and other features associated with messaging.

Types of Messages

Your tablet supports these types of messages:

- Email and Gmail Messages
- Google+
- Hangouts
- Messenger

Gmail

Send and receive email with Gmail, Google's web-based email.

To access Gmail:

■ From a Home screen, touch \longrightarrow Apps \rightarrow \bigcirc Gmail.

Setting Up Your Gmail Account

If you did not set up a Google account during the initial configuration, the first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google account.

- Default image size: Set the default size for image attachments.
- Priority senders: Enter email addresses that you want treated as a priority.
- Set as the default folder: When enabled, show the priority sender inbox whenever you open email.
- Email notifications: Enable or disable display of notifications for new emails in the Status bar.
- Select ringtone: Choose a sound to play with new email notifications.
- Touch an account to configure specific settings. Available options depend on the account.

Composing and Sending Email

- 2. If you have multiple accounts set up, choose an account from the menu at the top of the screen.
- 3. Touch Compose, then touch fields to enter recipients and the email text.

Google+

Google+ makes messaging and sharing with your friends a lot easier. Hangouts

Previously known as Google Talk, Hangouts is an updated place to hangout, share photos, and even video calls. This is a free application for instant messaging offered by Google. Conversation logs are automatically saved to a Chats area in your Gmail account. This allows you to search a chat log and store them in your Gmail accounts.

Note: Before using this application, you must first have an active Gmail account available and be currently logged in.

From a Home screen, touch Apps → Hangouts.

Messenger

With Google Messenger, you can bring groups of friends together into a simple group conversation, putting everyone on the same page. When you get a new conversation in Messenger, Google+ sends an update to your tablet.

To get started, touch the Messenger icon on the home screen of the Google+ app or use the Messenger icon on your Applications screen.

Camera

Touch **Cancel** to use the device storage for storing pictures and videos.

Camera Settings



- **Storage**: Set whether to store your photos on your device or on your memory card, if one is installed.
- Reset: Set all Camera settings to the defaults.

Camcorder

Use your device's built-in Camcorder to record high-definition video in 1080p resolution.

- **Rotate right**: Allows you to rotate the photo clockwise 90 degrees.
- Crop: Allows you to crop the image. Touch and drag the crop box or the sides or comers of the crop box to create the crop area, then touch Done. Touch Cancel to stop without cropping the photo.
- Set as: Assign the photo as a Contact photo or a Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens wallpaper.
- **Details**: Provides details about the photo, such as title, time taken, size, and so on.

Settings:

- Accounts: Manage your account information.
- SNS data management: Enable Sync only via Wi-Fi to only sync photos and videos when connected to a Wi-Fi network.
- Tags: Enable Tag buddy and Face tag. Tag buddy identifies each photo with information such as the weather, location, people in the photo, or date created. Face tag scans each photo to detect people's faces, which you can then tag with their name.
- Sound & shot: Play the recorded sound when viewing pictures taken in Sound & shot mode.

Setting a Picture As

 - **Share via**: Share the video. Touch an option, such as Email, and follow the on-screen instructions.
 - Delete: Touch videos to select them for deletion or touch
 Select all to delete all videos.
 - Auto play next: Touch to enable or disable automatic playing of videos in the order they appear.
 - Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.

Playing Videos

- Touch a video to play it. While playing a video, touch the screen to display or hide on-screen playback controls.
- Touch the icon in the lower left corner of the display screen while the video is playing to change the Display Mode from original size to full screen in ratio or full screen.

Music Player

Music Player plays songs stored on your tablet or an installed memory card.

To access Music Player:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Apps** →
 - Music Player.

The Music Player application searches your device's internal storage or on an installed memory card for music and playlists. This can take from a few seconds to several minutes, depending on the amount of new music added since you last opened the application. It then displays your music in several ways.

- Touch a tab, such as Songs, Playlists, Albums, and so on, to change the way you view the contents of your library.
- 3. Touch at the top left of the Application Bar to return to the main Music screen.

Music menu

- Music menu: Enable or disable the music display options that appear on the main music screen.

Playing a Playlist

- Touch Favorites, Most played, Recently played, or Recently added, or touch a playlist title that you created.
- 3. Touch a song to start playing the playlist at that song.

Deleting a Playlist

- Touch the Playlists tab then touch and hold the playlist that you want to delete.
- 2. Touch **Delete** when the pop-up displays.
- 3. Touch OK.

Playing Music

To play a song:

- 1. Touch at the top left of the Application Bar to return to the main Music screen.
- Touch a song or touch an album or genre and then touch a song in the list of songs on the album.
 The song you touch starts to play. The tracks in the current list play in order until you reach the end of the list (unless you choose a repeat option). Otherwise, playback stops only if you stop it, even when you switch applications.

Accessing the Music Player

If you navigate away from the Music Player application and music is playing, the Music notification icon is displayed in the System Bar.

You can change songs or easily return to the Music Player:

When a song is playing, the Music Player screen displays and various controls are available.

- 1. Touch at the top left of the Application Bar to return to the main Music screen.
- 2. Touch a song or playlist to begin playback.

 The music player displays below (portrait mode) or to the right (landscape mode) of the music listing.
- 3. Touch the song thumbnail to enlarge the music player.

Music Player Screen

During playback, use the sound and playlist controls:

- Song Title/Artist/Album: Identifies the song, artist, and album.
- 2. Info: Touch to view information about the current song.
- 3. Select Device: Play music on DLNA-enabled devices.
- 4. Volume: Touch to display the volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key on the side of the device to adjust playback volume.
- SoundAlive: Touch to view and set SoundAlive options.
- Favorite: Touch the star
 to mark the current song as a favorite.
- Progress Bar: Touch and drag the end of the progress bar to scan forward or backward through the current song.
- Shuffle: When enabled, songs play in random order.
 When disabled, songs play in the order they appear in List view



- **9. Repeat**: Touch to repeat the current song, repeat all songs, or disable repeat mode.
- Time Indicators: Indicates elapsed time and total song length in minutes and seconds.
- Main View: Touch to return to the main Music Player screen.
- 12. Playback Controls:
 - Touch to advance to the next song. Touch and hold to scan forward through the current song.
 - Touch to go back to the previous song. Touch and hold to scan backward through the current song.
 - Touch III to pause playback. Touch to resume playback.
- 13. List Mode: Touch to switch to the list of songs.

Options While Playing a Song

There are various options and controls available while a song is playing:

- **1.** Touch at the top left of the Application Bar to return to the main Music screen.
- 2. Touch a song or an album, and then a song.
- 3. Touch the music player to enlarge it.
- - Add to playlist: Add the song to a new playlist or an existing playlist.
 - Via Bluetooth: Play the current song by using a Bluetooth device.
 - Play via Group Play: Use Group Play to share your music. For more information, refer to "Group Play" on page 105.
 - Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.
 - Alarm tone: Use the current song as an alarm tone.
 - **Settings**: Displays Music Player settings.
 - End: This option returns you to the home screen.

Play Music

The Google Play Music app contains a music player that plays music and other audio files that you copy from your computer or store online.

Note: Some options described in this manual may not be available until you sign in to your Google account.

Google Play Music

Google Play Music is a service from Google that gives you instant access to your personal music collection on the Internet and your compatible Android devices without the hassle of wires or syncing. For more information, visit: music.google.com.

Accessing the Music App

To access Play Music:

- From a Home screen, touch **Apps** → **Play Music**.
 - The Play Music app searches your online library and your device's internal storage for music and playlists. This can take from a few seconds to several minutes, depending on the amount of new music added since you last opened the application.

Changing Library View

You can change the way you view the contents of your library.

- 1. Touch Play Music.
- Near the top-left of the Application bar, touch and then touch an option to set whether to view All music or On device only.
- Touch an option to set how you view your library.
 The choices are: PLAYLISTS, RECENT, ARTISTS, ALBUMS, SONGS, or GENRES.

Play Music Menu

To configure Play Music settings:

■ Touch Menu → Settings.

To get help using Play Music:

For more information touch Menu → Help.

Play Music Options

Options are available for playing songs, albums, or playlists:

- 1. Touch Play Music.
- 2. Touch an album or song.
- Touch the label area under an item to display options.

Options display depending on the item view.

To play a song:

- 1. Touch Play Music.
- 2. Touch a song in your library to listen to it.
 - or -

While viewing a list of songs, touch next to a song and touch **Add to queue**.

- or -

While viewing a list of albums, artists, playlists, or genres, touch the label area under an item and touch **Add to queue**.

Shopping for Music at the Play Store

To visit the Google Play Store where you can find and buy music:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps
 - → Play Store.
- 2. Touch Music.

The Google Play Store music section displays.

To view information about finding and buying music:

- 1. Touch Play Music.

Making Online Music Available Offline

In addition to playing the music that you add to your online library, you can play music stored on your device's internal storage. Then you can listen to music when you have no Internet connection. To do this, make some of your online music available offline.

Tip: You can also copy music directly from your computer to your device. For more information, refer to "Synchronizing with Windows Media Player" on page 91.

To make your online music available offline on your device:

- Touch Play Music.
- Change your library view to Albums, Artists, or Playlists. For more information, refer to "Changing Library View" on page 78.

- If you have signed in to your Google account, touch
 Menu → Choose on device music and touch the album or playlist you want to make available offline.

Music Hub

The Music Hub app lets you upload your music collection to the cloud, stream and purchase songs from an extensive catalog, and listen to personal radio.

Note: You must sign up for an account before accessing some of the Music Hub options.

- Sign on to your Samsung account if you have not already done so.
- 2. From the Home screen, touch Music Hub.

Section 6: Connections

This section describes the various connections your device can make including accessing the Internet with your Browser, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and Connecting to your PC.

Browser

Your device is equipped with a full HTML Browser that allows you to access the Internet.

■ From a Home screen, touch Apps → Browser.

Navigating the Internet

The following options are available for Internet navigation.

Command Keys

- Touch
 — Back or ← to return to the previous page.
- Touch > Forward to go forward to a recent page.
- Touch C Refresh to reload the current page.

Touching and Dragging

 Touch and drag your finger on the screen to navigate pages and to reposition pages within the screen.

Entering Text in a Field

 While browsing, touch a text field to display the virtual QWERTY keyboard to enter text.

Zoom

- Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.
- Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to zoom out by making an inward pinching motion on the screen. To zoom in, make an outward stretching motion by sliding your fingers apart.

Tip: For convenient browsing, you can rotate the device to landscape mode.

Selecting Items On a Page

While browsing, use gestures and menus to navigate:

- Touch an item to select it.
- Touch a hyperlink to follow the link.
- Touch and hold on a hyperlink for options.

Using Browser Windows

You can have multiple windows open at one time and easily switch between windows.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Browser.
- 2. To open a new window, touch \+\ at the top of the screen.
- To switch to another open window, touch its tab at the top of the screen.
- **4.** To delete an open window, touch the tab at the top of the screen, and then touch \(\infty\).

Entering a URL

Access a website quickly by entering the URL.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Browser.
 Touch the URL field at the top of the screen, then enter
- the URL using the virtual QWERTY keyboard.

 As you enter characters, potential matches display.

Note: Use the
Delete key to clear the URL field, if necessary.

- 3. Touch a match to complete the URL.
 - or –

Continue entering characters and touch the **Go** key to load the page.

Creating Bookmarks

While browsing, bookmark a site to quickly access it later.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch \longrightarrow Apps \rightarrow \bigcirc Browser.
- Browse to a website, touch Add bookmark next to the website's address at the top, then enter the required information and touch OK.
- 3. A gold star to indicates that the website has been added to your Bookmarks.
- 4. Touch to view your Bookmarks.

Browser Menu

While viewing a webpage:

To configure web settings:


■ Touch Menu → Settings.
Follow the on-screen instructions.

Browser Quick Controls

Use Quick Controls to maximize your viewing area while browsing the Internet.

1. From a Home screen, touch \blacksquare Apps \rightarrow \bigcirc Browser.

- - The Application and URL bars are hidden.
- 3. Touch **Sack** to return to the webpage.
- Slowly swipe inward from the left or right edge of the screen to access Quick controls.



- **5.** Without lifting your finger, move to an option and then lift your finger to initiate the option.
- To cancel, display the Quick controls and touch
 Settings → Labs and touch Quick controls to uncheck it.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- · Access the Internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi protocol.

Finding Wi-Fi Networks

You can have your device automatically notify you of available networks. For more information, refer to "Configuring Wi-Fi Settings" on page 85.

Turning Wi-Fi On or Off

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

- 1. From a Home screen, touch \blacksquare Apps \rightarrow o Settings.
- Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Wi-Fi ON or touch on to turn Wi-Fi OFF.
 or —
- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.
 The Notification Panel screen displays.
- Touch the Wi-Fi Quick Setting button to turn Wi-Fi ON/OFF. (When enabled, the Wi-Fi icon is highlighted green.)

Scanning and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for available Wi-Fi connections, then displays them on screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch \longrightarrow Apps \rightarrow o Settings.
- 2. Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Wi-Fi ON
- Your device automatically scans for available Wireless Access Points. When the scan is complete, touch a Wi-Fi network to connect.
- If the Wi-Fi network is open, your device automatically connects. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

Adding a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Apps** → **⑤** Settings.
- Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Wi-Fi ON.
- Touch Add Wi-Fi network, then enter network information:
 - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point (WAP).
 - Security: Select the type of security used by the WAP.

Note: Depending on the Security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required, such as a Password.

- Password: If the WAP is secured, enter the password or hex key.
- . Show advanced options:
 - Proxy settings: If required, select the appropriate proxy setting.
 - IP settings: If required, select the appropriate IP setting.
- 4. Touch Connect to save the settings.

Configuring Wi-Fi Settings

Set up and configure advanced Wi-Fi settings.

- . From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
- 2. Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Wi-Fi ON.
- 3. Touch | Menu for options:
 - Advanced:
 - Network notification: Have your device alert you to new Wireless Access Points (WAPs). Touch Network notification to turn notifications On or Off.

- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi. Option are: Always, Only when plugged in, or Never.
- Auto network switch: Automatically switch between Wi-Fi networks and mobile networks.
- MAC address: View your device's MAC address, required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
- IP address: View your device's IP address (not configurable).
- WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
- WPN PIN entry: (Not configurable) View the PIN used by your device to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment.

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows device-to-device connections so you can transfer large amounts of data over a Wi-Fi connection.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
- Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Wi-Fi ON.

- Touch Wi-Fi Direct. Your device begins to search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct connections.
 - To initiate a new scan, touch Scan.
- Enable Wi-Fi Direct (similar to Steps 1, 2, and 3) on the device to which you want to connect.
- Once the device you want to connect to is displayed under Available devices, touch it.
 An Invitation to connect displays on the other device to which you want to connect.
- 6. On the other device, touch Accept. (You have 30 seconds to touch Accept on the other device.)
 Once connected, the other device will show as
 Connected in your list of Wi-Fi Direct devices and the
 icon will display on the Status Bar.

Sharing Information with Connected Device

To share videos, photos, or other information with the connected device, follow these steps:

- View the information that you want to share. For example, if you want to share a photo, find the photo in your camera viewer or My Files folder, then touch the Share, Share via, or Send via option.
- 2. Touch the Wi-Fi Direct option.

The Wi-Fi Direct settings screen displays, Wi-Fi Direct is turned on, and your device scans for other devices.

Touch a connected device name, then touch Done.The other device displays a pop-up that indicates it is receiving the file.

The file is transferred and can be found in **My Files** in the ShareViaWifi folder.

Note: Depending on the other device model, the prompts and shared folder information may differ.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

You do not need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Turning Bluetooth On or Off

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
- Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Bluetooth ON, or touch to turn Bluetooth OFF. - or -
- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.
 The Notification Panel screen displays.
- Touch the Bluetooth Quick Setting button to turn Bluetooth ON/OFF. (When enabled, the Bluetooth icon is highlighted green.)

Note: When Bluetooth is on, the Bluetooth icon street displays in the Status Bar.

Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it to exchange information between your device and the target device.

Tip: After pairing, your device and the target device recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch \longrightarrow Apps \rightarrow \bigcirc Settings.
- 2. Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Bluetooth ON.
- Enable the target device's discoverable or visible mode.
- Touch the Bluetooth tab and then touch Scan. Touch Stop at any time to stop scanning.
- **5.** From the list of found devices, touch the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
 - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch **OK**. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.

- If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device attempts to pair with the device automatically. Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.
- 6. Once your tablet is paired with the target device, touch

 ★ next to the device name in the Paired devices list.
 - Touch **Rename** to change the named of the paired device.
 - Touch **Unpair** to unpair from the paired device.

Sharing Data with a Bluetooth Device

To send data to a Bluetooth device:

- 1. Select a file or item from an appropriate application.
- 2. Select an option for sharing data with the Bluetooth feature.

Note: The method for selecting an option may vary by data type.

- Search for and pair with a Bluetooth device. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 88.
- **4.** Follow the prompts to send data to the paired device.

Receiving Data from a Bluetooth Device

To receive data from a Bluetooth device:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch \longrightarrow Apps \rightarrow o Settings.
- Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Bluetooth ON.

Note: To select the length of time that your device will be visible, select ☐ Menu → Visible timeout.

- 3. Pair with the Bluetooth device from which you want to receive data. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 88. A Bluetooth authorization request pop-up displays when a Bluetooth device sends data to your device.
- Select Accept to confirm that you are willing to receive data. A File received message displays.
- To see your transferred files, touch Menu → Received files.

Additional Bluetooth Settings

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
- 2. Under Wireless and networks, touch off to turn Bluetooth ON.
- 3. Touch **Menu** for options:
 - Visibility timeout: Use this setting to control when to automatically turn off the Discoverable option.
 - Received files: Show the list of files received by using Bluetooth.

Managing Downloads

Files, apps, and other items you download in Browser, Gmail, Email, or in other ways, are stored on your tablet's internal storage. You can use the Downloads app to view, reopen, or delete what you have downloaded.

To manage the demands on their networks or to help you avoid unexpected charges, some mobile networks place restrictions on the size of the files you can download. When you are connected to such networks, and you try to download an oversized-file, you are asked or required to delay downloading the file until the next time you are

connected to a Wi-Fi network. At that time, the download resumes automatically. The Downloads app can also be used to view and manage these queued files.

Downloaded files are stored in the Download directory in your tablet's internal storage. You can view and copy files from this directory when connected to a computer with a USB cable.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Downloads.
- 2. Touch an item to open it.
- For more information about using the Downloads app, see "Downloads" on page 102.

Uninstalling an App

Many apps come pre-installed on your device, and you can download additional apps from Google Play Store. If you decide to, you can uninstall apps you downloaded from Google Play Store and other sources.

Uninstall Apps with Application Manager

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Application manager.
- 2. Touch the DOWNLOADED tab.
- 3. Touch the app you want to uninstall.

- 4. Touch the Uninstall button.
- **5.** Touch **0K** to confirm you want to uninstall the app.

Uninstall Apps with Google Play Store

You can also use Google Play to uninstall apps you downloaded from there (see "Play Store" on page 110).

Tip: To uninstall updates to pre-installed apps, touch the app and touch Uninstall updates. Touch OK to uninstall the updates.

Uninstall Apps from the Apps Screen

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- - or -

Touch **Downloaded applications** and then touch **Menu** → **Uninstall**.

- A
 appears on apps that can be uninstalled.
- Touch an app's icon and then touch OK to uninstall and remove the app from your tablet.

Note: You cannot uninstall the apps that are included with Android. You can only uninstall the apps you have downloaded

Synchronizing with Windows Media Player

Ensure that Windows Media Player is installed on your PC.

- Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable.
 Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the Auto Play screen.
- Click the option to Sync digital media files to this device to synchronize music files.
- Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list and begin synchronizing.
- When finished, exit Windows Media Player and disconnect the USB cable.

Connecting as a Mass Storage Device

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the files directory from the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.

Note: The file directory of the memory card displays as folder Card, separate from the internal memory, which is folder Tablet.

- Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.
- Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable. Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the Auto Play screen.
- Click the option to Open device to view files.You should see a Card and a Tablet folder.
- **4.** Copy files from the PC to the memory card (Card folder).
- When finished, close the PC folder and disconnect the USB cable.

Kies Via Wi-Fi

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware, synchronize files, and transfer data to and from your device directly by connecting to the PC.

To learn more about Samsung Kies and download the Kies software (for both PC and Macintosh), visit: samsung.com/us/support/downloads.

Connecting with Samsung Kies

1. Install Samsung Kies software on your PC.

Warning! Close any running applications before connecting your device to a PC.

- 2. Run Samsung Kies.
- 3. From a Home screen, touch **Apps** → **◎ Settings**.
- Touch More settings → Kies via Wi-Fi.
 Select the source of the Wi-Fi connection for Kies air.
- 5. Refer to Samsung Kies Help for more information.

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSD or microSDHC memory cards for storing music, photos, videos, and files.

Installing and Removing a Memory Card

For more information about installing and removing a memory card, see "Memory Card" on page 12.

Important! To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, always unmount the card before removing it from the device.

Mounting an SD Card

Note: When an SD card is installed, it is automatically mounted. You will only need to mount an SD card if you have unmounted it but have not removed it from the device.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Storage.
- 2. Touch Mount SD card.

Unmounting an SD Card

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 → Storage.
- Touch Unmount SD card.
- At the prompt, select **OK** to safely unmount the memory card.
- Remove the SD card from the slot. For more information, refer to "Removing a Memory Card" on page 12.

Note: Unmounting an SD card will stop some applications from functioning. Applications may not be available until you mount the SD card again.

Formatting a Memory Card

Formatting permanently erases all content from the memory card and prepares it for use with your device.

Formatting a Memory Card Using Your Device

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Storage.
- 2. After mounting the SD card, touch Format SD card.
- Follow the prompts to confirm the formatting of the card.

Formatting a Memory Card Using Your Computer

Consult your computer and/or memory card reader documentation for information about formatting memory cards.

Section 7: Applications

This section contains a description of each application that is available on the Apps screen, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is already described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that particular section is provided.

Note: This manual only addresses applications that have been loaded on your device as of the date of purchase. Information concerning third party applications that you may choose to download from the Google Play Store or otherwise should be obtained from the application provider directly.

Updating Applications

Once you have registered your device (see "Software Update" on page 145) and signed into your Google account (see "Setting Up Your Gmail Account" on page 53), you may see the New updates notification in the Status Bar if there is a new version of one or more apps available or, when you open an application that is preloaded on your device, a New updates message may be displayed.

To update the applications:

- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.
 The Notification Panel screen displays.
- 2. Touch New updates.

GPS Applications

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPS-enabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- · inside a building or between buildings
- in a tunnel or underground passage
- · in poor weather
- · around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- · in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important! If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.

Location of Internal Antennas



Accessing the Apps Screen

To access the Apps screen:

From a Home screen, touch Apps.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequentlyused applications to one of the Home screens, if it is not there by default. For details, see "App Shortcuts" on page 28.

Alarm

Set alarms for reminders or for wake-up times.

Adding and Configuring Alarms

- 1. From the Apps screen, touch \bigcirc Alarm.
- 2. Touch + Create alarm to display the Create alarm screen.
 - or -

Touch an existing alarm to display the Edit alarm screen.

- 3. Touch fields on the screen to configure the alarm.
 - Some fields have preset values. Touch the field and touch the desired value.
 - Other fields have to be input. Touch the field and use the on-screen keyboard to input information.
 - Touching the check box next to some fields may make additional fields available.
- 4. Touch Save to save the alarm.

The main Alarm screen displays showing the new or updated alarm.

Activating Alarms

- 1. From the Apps screen, touch \(\infty \) Alarm.
- Touch Turn alarm on to activate the alarm. A gray alarm means the alarm is deactivated.
- **3.** Touch an alarm to change any of its settings and then touch **Save** to save the updates.

Editing and Deleting Alarms

- 1. From the Apps screen, touch Alarm.
- 2. Touch and hold an alarm and then touch one of the following options:
 - Edit: Edit the alarm.
 - Delete: Delete the alarm.
 - or -

Touch **Touch Delete**, touch the existing alarms you want to delete or touch **Select all**, and then touch **Delete**.

Turning Off an Alarm

When the alarm sounds, to turn off the alarm:

Touch and drag to the right.

Setting the Snooze Feature

To activate the Snooze feature after gan alarm sounds:

 Touch and slide to the left. Snooze must first be set in the alarm settings.

Amazon Kindle

Use the Amazon Kindle application to download books for reading, right on your device.

Note: You must be registered with Amazon to use the Kindle application.

From the **Apps** screen, touch **M** Amazon Kindle.

AT&T AllAccess

AT&T AllAccess is the easy-to-use, all-in-one tool that helps you view and manage your data plan.

- 1. From the Apps screen, touch AT&T AllAccess. The AT&T AllAccess screen displays.
- 2. Follow the on-screen instructions to manage your data plan.

AT&T Device Help

AT&T Device Help provides online information to help with your tablet questions.

From the **Apps** screen, touch **AT&T Device Help**.

AT&T Locker

AT&T Locker allows you to store, share, and sync all of your photos, videos, and documents in one safe, convenient place; the AT&T cloud.

- 1. From the Apps screen, touch AT&T Locker.
- At the AT&T Locker home screen, touch Sign Up to create an account or touch Log In if you already have an account.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to use AT&T Locker.

AT&T Ready2Go

- 7. Touch c to clear the result.
- For more advanced problems, rotate your device to landscape mode and use the advanced operators sin, In, cos, log, tan, and so on.
- Touch and hold entries in the Calculator's display field to copy or cut the contents of the display. Paste the copied value in another app.

Calendar

Your device includes a powerful Calendar to help you organize your schedules more conveniently and effectively. Learn to create and manage events and tasks, and set alarms to remind yourself of important events and tasks.

The Settings screen has tabs on the left side of the screen. Information related to the tabs displays on the right side of the screen. There are four major groups of settings: Wireless and network, Device, Personal, Accounts, and System.

Wireless and Network

Control your device's wireless connections.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi protocol.

For more information about using your device's Wi-Fi features, see "Wi-Fi" on page 84.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

For more information about using Bluetooth, see "Bluetooth" on page 87.

Data Usage

Monitor data usage, and control your device's connection to mobile data service.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Data usage.
- Touch Mobile data to enable or disable the mobile data connection.
- Touch Set mobile data limit to disable your mobile data connection when your specified limit is reached.
- Touch the Data usage cycle drop-down menu and select a date.

The data usage displays as a visual (chart) and also displays a list of each application with a breakdown of data usage by application.

Note: Data is measured by your device. Your service provider may account for data usage differently.

More Settings

This tab displays additional wireless and network features.

From the Settings screen, touch More settings.
 Options display Airplane mode, Mobile networks, VPN,
 Nearby devices, and Kies via Wi-Fi.

Airplane Mode

Airplane mode allows you to use many of your tablet's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where accessing data is prohibited.

Important! When your tablet is in Airplane Mode, it cannot access online information or applications.

- Touch the Airplane mode check box to enable/disable Airplane mode.
 - or -

Press and hold the **Power** button then touch **Airplane mode**.

— or —

Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notification Panel, then touch the ■♣ → Airplane mode Quick Setting button to turn Airplane mode ON/OFF.

Mobile Networks

Before you use applications such as Google Maps, you must enable the Mobile networks options.

■ Touch Settings → More settings → Mobile networks.

The following options display:

- Mobile Data: To enable data access over the mobile network, this option must be selected. It is set on by default.
- Data Roaming: Allows you to connect to your service provider's partner networks and access data services when you are out of your service providers area of coverage.
- Access Point Names: To use Wi-Fi you need access to a
 wireless access point (hotspot). Touch Access Point Names
 to display a list of the Access Point names. The active access
 point displays a green-filled circle to the right of the name.
- Network Operators: Using this feature you can view the current network connection. You can also scan and select a network operator manually, or set the network selection to Automatic.

Important! You must deactivate data service prior to searching for an available network.

Note: Connecting to 2G networks slows the data transfer speed and time.

Default Setup Options

Your device default is set to Automatic to automatically search for an available network. You can set this option to Manual to select a network each time you connect.

- 1. Touch Network operators.
- 2. Touch Default setup.
- Touch Manual to locate and connect to a network manually or touch Automatic to allow the device to automatically select a network.

VPN

The VPN settings menu allows you to set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

Important! Before you can use a VPN you must establish and configure one.

Adding a Basic VPN

Before you add a VPN you must determine which VPN protocol to use: PPTP (Point-to-Point Tunneling Protocol), L2TP (Layer 2 Tunneling Protocol), L2TP/IPSec PSK (Preshared key based L2TP/IPSec), or L2TP/IPSec CRT (Certificate based L2TP/IPSec).

- Before using VPN, you must first set up a screen unlock PIN or password. For more information, refer to "Screen Lock" on page 129.
- From the **Settings** screen, touch **More settings** → VPN.
- Touch Basic VPN.
- 4. Enter a name for the VPN network in the Name field.

- **5.** Select a VPN type from the **Type** drop-down menu:
 - PPTP (Point-to-Point Tunneling Protocol)
 - L2TP/IPSec PSK (Layer 2 Tunneling Protocol / Internet Protocol Security Pre-Shared Key)
 - L2TP/IPSec RSA
 - IPSec Xauth PSK
 - IPSec Xauth RSA
 - IPSec Hybrid RSA
- Enter the Server address and any other required fields that are dependent upon the Type you entered previously.
- Touch the Show advanced options check box to display additional VPN options.
- 8. Touch Save to save your VPN settings.

Adding an Advanced IPsec VPN

- Before using VPN, you must first set up a screen unlock PIN or password. For more information, refer to "Screen Lock" on page 129.
- From the
 Settings screen, touch More settings
 → VPN.
- Touch Advanced IPsec VPN.
- 4. Touch Add VPN Connection.
- Enter a password, confirm the password, and touch OK.
- Enter a name for the VPN connection in the VPN connection name field.
- Touch the IPsec connection type drop-down menu and select an entry.
- 8. Enter any other required information.
- Touch the Show advanced options check box to display additional VPN options.
- 10. Touch Save to save your VPN settings.

Delete a VPN

- 3. In the pop-up that opens, touch Delete network.

Nearby Devices

This option allows you to share your media files with nearby DLNA (Digital Living Network Alliance) enabled devices that are connected to the same Wi-Fi.

Warning! If file sharing is enabled, other devices can access your data. Use the Wi-Fi network and this option with care.

To configure this option:

- Connect to a Wi-Fi network. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 84.
- From the Settings screen, touch More settings → Nearby devices.
- Touch the File sharing check box to activate file sharing.

The . Nearby devices icon displays on the Status Bar.

- 4. In the Advanced section, set the following options:
 - Shared contents: Select the media you would like to share.
 Touch OK.
 - Allowed devices list: Indicate the devices accessible to your device.
 - Not-allowed devices list: Indicate the devices not accessible to your device.
 - Device: Set whether to download data to Device or SD card.
 - Upload from other devices: If a nearby device attempts to upload data, this setting indicates the response. Options are: Always accept, Always ask, and Always reject.

Kies via Wi-Fi

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware, synchronize files, and transfer data to and from your device directly by connecting to the PC.

For more information, refer to "Kies Via Wi-Fi" on page 92.

Device

This section of the Settings screen contains settings for your device.

Blocking Mode

When enabled, notifications for selected features are disabled.

- 1. Touch Settings.
- 2. Touch off to turn Blocking mode ON.
- Touch Blocking mode.
- Touch Turn off notifications to not sound/display any notifications.
- **5.** Touch **Turn off alarm** to not sound/display any alarms.
- To set an time limit for Blocking mode, touch Always to enable, and configure the From and To time fields.

Note: When this option is enabled, displays in the Status Bar.

Driving Mode

Enable the Driving mode settings to allow your device to read new notifications aloud.

- Touch Settings.
- Touch off to turn Driving mode 0N.
 When Driving mode is on, the following options are available:
 - Alarm: Read out alarm information when alarms sound.
 - Schedule: Read out scheduled alarm information when alarms sound.

Note: When this option is enabled, displays in the Status Bar

Sound

Volume

Set the volume level for all types of sounds.

- 1. From the **③** Settings screen, touch Sound → Volume.
- 2. Touch and drag the sliders to set the volume for:
 - Music, video, games, and other media: Sounds made by music apps, video apps, and more.
 - Notifications: Sounds for alerts to new messages and other events.
 - System: Application sounds and other sounds made by your device.

Tip: You can also set System volume from the Home screen by pressing the Volume Key.

3. Touch **0K** to save your settings.

Notifications

Select a default ringtone for message, alarm, and other notifications.

- From the **Settings** screen, touch Sound → Default notification sound.
- 2. Touch a ringtone to hear a sample and select it.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the setting.

System

You can activate or deactivate both touch and screen lock sounds.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Sound**.
- 2. Touch the check box next to any of the following options to activate the feature:
 - Touch sounds: Makes a sound when you touch the screen.
 - Screen lock sound: Makes a sound when your screen is locked or unlocked.

Display

Wallpaper

You can choose a picture to display on the Home Screen, Lock screen, or to both the Home and lock screens. Choose from preloaded wallpaper images or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

- From the **Settings** screen, touch **Display** → Wallpaper.
- 2. Touch Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens

The Select wallpaper from screen displays the following options: **Gallery, Live wallpapers**, and **Wallpapers**.

For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 30.

Notification Panel

Customize the Notification panel.

- **2.** Touch **Brightness adjustment** to adjust the screen brightness from the Notification panel.
- To customize which Quick Setting buttons appear at the top of the notifications panel, touch and drag buttons to reorder them.

Multi Window

Enable or disable the Multi window feature.

- From the Settings screen, touch Display.
- 2. Touch **Multi window** to enable/disable this feature.

Brightness

Set the default screen brightness.

- From the **Settings** screen, touch **Display** → Brightness.
- Touch and drag the slider to set the brightness or touch Automatic brightness.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the setting.

Screen Timeout

Set the length of delay between the last key press or screen touch and the automatic screen timeout (dim and lock).

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Display**.
- Touch Screen timeout and select the screen delay time.The screen delays shutting off after inactivity for the selected period of time.

Daydream

The Daydream setting controls what the screen displays when the phone is docked, or while charging. You can choose to display a Colors screen, or display photos stored on your phone.

- 1. Touch **Settings** → **Display**.
- 2. Touch off to turn Daydream ON.
- 3. Touch Daydream for options:
 - Colors: Touch the selector to enable or disable display of a colorful screen.
 - Flipboard: Display pictures from Flipboard. After enabling the option, touch to choose pictures to display.
 - Photo Table: Touch the selector to enable or disable display of pictures in a photo table. After enabling the option, touch to choose pictures to display.
 - Photo frame: Touch the selector to enable or disable display of pictures in a photo frame. After enabling the option, touch to choose pictures to display.

Smart Screen

Set the screen to stay on as long as you look at it.

- From the Settings screen, touch Display →
 Smart screen.
- 2. Touch Smart stay to enable this feature.

Note: When this option is enabled, displays in the Status Bar.

Font Style and Size

Set the font for screen displays and the size you want it to display.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Display.
- Touch Font style then touch a font or touch Get fonts online to browse and download a new font.
- 3. Touch Font size and select a font size.
- **4.** Touch **Increase legibility** in enhance clarity of the text.

Show Battery Percentage

Display the battery percentage remaining on the Status Bar.

- From the Settings screen, touch Display.
- **2.** Touch **Show battery percentage** to enable this feature.

Storage

From this menu you can view the device memory or mount, unmount, or format an SD card.

Device Memory

From the Settings screen, touch Storage.
 The Device memory displays as Total space,
 Applications, Pictures, videos, Audio, Downloads,
 Miscellaneous files, and Available space.

SD Card

Once a memory card has been installed in your device, the SD card memory displays as Total space and Available space.

For more information about mounting, unmounting, and formatting an SD card, see For more information, refer to "Memory Card" on page 92.

Power Saving Mode

When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power.

- From the Settings screen, touch Power saving mode.
- 2. Touch off to turn Power saving ON.
- 3. Touch CPU power saving to limit the maximum performance of the CPU.
- Touch Screen power saving to use low power level for the screen.
- Touch Auto enable to turn on Power saving mode whenever the battery power falls below 20%, even if Power saving mode is turned OFF.
- Touch Learn about Power saving mode to display more information about saving power mode.

Battery

See how much battery power is used for device activities.

- From the Settings screen, touch Battery.
 The battery level displays in percentage. The amount of time the battery was used also displays. Battery usage displays in percentages per application.
- 2. Touch Refresh to update the display.

Note: Other applications may be running that affect battery use.

Application Manager

You can download and install applications from Google Play or create applications using the Android SDK and install them on your device. Use Application manager settings to manage applications.

Warning! Because this device can be configured with system software not provided by or supported by Google or any other company, end-users operate these devices at their own risk.

Memory Usage

See how memory is being used by Downloaded or Running applications.

- From the Settings screen, touch Application manager.
- Touch DOWNLOADED, RUNNING, SD CARD, or ALL to display memory usage for that category of applications.

The graph at the bottom of the Downloaded tab shows used and free device memory. The graph at the bottom of the Running tab shows used and free RAM.

Downloaded

Displays apps you have downloaded onto your device.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Application manager.
- Touch the **DOWNLOADED** tab to view a list of all the downloaded applications on your device.

- Touch an application to view and update information about the application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

Running Services

View and control services running on your device.

- From the Settings screen, touch Application manager.
- 2. Touch the RUNNING tab.

All the applications that are currently running on the device display.

- Touch Show cached processes to display all the cached processes that are running. Touch Show services in use to switch back.
- Touch one of the applications to view application information.

The following options display:

• **Stop**: Stops the application from running on the device. This is usually done prior to uninstalling the application.

Warning! Not all services can be stopped. Stopping services may have undesirable consequences on the application or Android System.

• Report: Report failure and other application information.

Note: Options vary by application.

Users

This device can be shared by multiple people by creating User profiles. Users have their own space, which they can customize with their own apps, wallpaper, and so on. Users can also adjust device settings like Wi-Fi that affect everyone.

Set Up Owner Profile

To set up the Owner profile:

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Users**.
- 2. Touch Owner.

The My local profile screen displays.

- Touch fields to display the on-screen keyboard and enter the owner information. For more information about entering information, see "Creating Contacts" on page 46.
- 4. When you finish entering information, touch <a>Save.

Change Owner Nickname

To change the Owner nickname:

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Users**.
- 2. Touch Nickname.

The Nickname pop-up displays.

- Touch the Nickname field and use on-screen keyboard enter the new nickname.
- 4. Touch OK.

Add a New User

To add a new User:

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch Users.
- 2. Touch Add user.
- If the new User is able to set up their space now, touch Set up now. Touch Not now to create an empty User space that can be modified later.

The AT&T Ready2Go screen displays.

Touch get started and follow the prompts to set up the new User space.

Delete a User

To delete a User:

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Users**.
- 2. Touch the user's profile entry.
- Touch Delete user.

Browser Bar

This Internet browser toolbar adds numerous ways to interact with a web page—including sharing it, finding related apps, saving it to read later, and much more—without having to leave the page. Browser Bar also offers one-click access to popular apps such as Facebook, Twitter, Wikipedia, Amazon, and more.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Browser Bar.
- **2.** Configure the following options:
 - **About**: View details about the Browser Bar toolbar.
 - Toolbar: Touch off to turn Browser Bar ON.
 - Active Browsers: Select which browsers use Browser Bar.
 - Autoshow: Touch to show Browser Bar whenever you visit a new web page.
 - Manage Extensions: Manage toolbar extensions.
 - Privacy Policy: View the privacy policy.
 - Analytics: Allow/disallow the gathering of anonymous browsing data used for analytics.
 - Clear Cookies: Delete cookies, tokens, history, and cached content.

Personal

This section of the Settings screen lets you manage the personal settings for your device.

Location Services

You value your privacy. So, by default, your device only acquires your location when you allow it. To use Location-Based Services, you must first enable location services on your device.

Before you use applications such as Google Maps and find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the Use wireless networks option or enable the GPS satellites.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Location services.
- Touch Access to my location to allow apps that have asked your permission to use your location information.
- 3. Touch Use GPS satellites to enable the GPS satellite.
- Touch Use wireless networks to enable location information using the wireless network.
- Touch My places to save your favorite locations for use with services that require location information.

Lock Screen Screen Lock

Choose settings for unlocking your screen. For more information about using the lock and unlock features, see "Securing Your Device" on page 13.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Lock screen**.
- Touch Screen lock for these settings:
 - Swipe: Swipe the screen to unlock it.
 - Face unlock: Look at your tablet to unlock it. Follow the on-screen instructions to set up Face unlock.
 - Face and voice: Look at your tablet and speak a phrase to unlock it. Follow the on-screen instructions to set up Face and voice unlock
 - Pattern: A screen unlock pattern is a touch gesture you create and use to unlock your device. Follow the prompts to create or change your screen unlock pattern.
 - PIN: Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen.
 - Password: Create a password for unlocking the screen.
 - None: No pattern, PIN, or password is required.

Note: Additional options are available only if you set Screen lock to display the lock screen (any setting other than Swipe or None).

The following options are available depending on the Screen Lock type that you have selected.

Swipe options

The options available when Screen lock is set to Swipe are:

- Multiple widgets: Display multiple widgets on your lock screen.
 Appears as an options after a lock mode is enabled.
- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Shortcuts: Set shortcuts to appear at the bottom of the Lock screen.
- Unlock effect: Set the effect you receive when unlocking the phone. You can select None or Light effect.
- Help text: Show help information on the Lock screen.
- Wake up in lock screen: Unlock the screen using wake-up command when swipe or motion lock is enabled.
- Set wake-up command: Designate your wake-up commands.
 Touch Set wake-up command and follow the on-screen prompts to create a new verbal command.

Face Unlock Options

These options are available when Screen lock is set to Face unlock or Face and voice:

- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Improve facial recognition: Improve your device's face matching capability by capturing your face in different lighting, with or without glasses, and bearded or clean-shaven. Follow the on-screen instructions.
- Presence check: Requires that you blink when using the Face unlock feature. This increases the security of the feature.
- Make pattern visible: See the pattern as you draw it.
- Secured lock time: Set how long to wait before your device is locked after the screen automatically turns off.

Pattern Options

These options are available when Screen lock is set to Pattern:

- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Make pattern visible: See the pattern as you draw it.

 Secured lock time: Set how long to wait before your device is locked after the screen automatically turns off.

PIN and Password Options

These options are available when Screen lock is set to Pin or Password:

- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Secured lock time: Set how long to wait before your device is locked after the screen automatically turns off.

Security Encryption

To require a numeric PIN or password to decrypt your tablet each time you power it on:

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Security.
- **2.** Touch **Encrypt device**. For more information, read the displayed help screen.

Tip: Make sure your battery is charged more than 80 percent. Encryption takes an hour or more.

Factory Data Reset Password

To set up or change a password that will have to be entered to perform a Factory Data Reset:

- From the Settings screen, touch Security → Set up/ change password.
- 2. Enter a new password and touch Confirm.
- 3. Enter the new password again and touch Confirm.

Note: The password does not get reset when a Factory Data Reset is performed.

SIM Card Lock

Prevent another user from using your SIM card to make unauthorized calls or from accessing information stored on your SIM card by protecting the information using a PIN code.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Security**.
- 2. Touch Set up SIM card lock.
- Touch Lock SIM card, enter your SIM PIN code, and touch OK.

Note: You must activate Lock SIM card before you can change your SIM PIN code.

- Touch Change SIM PIN.
 - Enter your old SIM PIN code and touch OK.
 - Enter your new SIM PIN code and touch **OK**.
 - Re-enter your new SIM PIN code and touch OK.

Passwords

When enabled, password characters display briefly as you touch them while entering passwords.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Security.
- Touch Make passwords visible to enable or disable brief displays of password characters.

Device Administration

- From the Settings screen, touch Security.
- To add or remove device administrators, touch Device administrators.
- **3.** To enable or disable installation of non-Google Play applications, touch **Unknown sources.**

An informational pop-up displays.

Read the message and touch **OK** to allow installation of non-Google Play applications.

Warning! Enabling this option causes your tablet and personal data to be more vulnerable to attack by applications from unknown sources.

4. Verify the applications have been installed.

Credential Storage

Trusted Credentials

If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason you do not trust it, you can disable or remove it.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Security**.
- 2. Touch Trusted credentials.

The trusted credentials screen has two tabs:

- System: Displays CA certificates that are permanently installed in the ROM of your device.
- User: Displays any CA certificates that you installed, for example, in the process of installing a client certificate.
- Touch a CA certificate to examine its details.A scrolling screen displays the details.
- Scroll to the bottom of the details screen and touch
 Turn off to disable a System certificate.

Caution! When you disable a system CA certificate, the Turn off button changes to Turn on, so you can enable the certificate again, if necessary. **5.** Touch **0K** to return to the certificate list.

Install from Device Storage

Install encrypted certificates from an installed memory card.

Note: You must have installed a memory card containing encrypted certificates to use this feature.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Security.
- Touch Install from device storage, then choose a certificate and follow the prompts to install.

Clear Credentials

Clear stored credentials.

Note: This setting only appears if you have installed encrypted certificates.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Security**.
- 2. Touch Clear credentials to remove all certificates.

Language and Input Language

Set the language used by your device.

- From the **Settings** screen, touch Language and input → Language.
- 2. Touch a language from the list.

Keyboards and Input Methods

Set the keyboard used by your device.

- From the Settings screen, touch Language and input.
- Touch Default and select a keyboard: Select Samsung keyboard or Swype.
- 3. Touch Set up input methods.

Configuring Google Voice Typing

To configure Google Voice Typing:

- From the Settings screen, touch Language and input.
- 2. Touch to Google voice typing.

 The following options are available:
 - Choose input languages: Touch Automatic to use the local language or select a language from the list.
 - Block offensive words: Enable or disable blocking of recognized offensive words from the results of your voice-input Google searches.

When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

 Download offline speech recognition: Enable voice input while offline. Touch the All tab to download speech recognition for other languages.

Configuring the Samsung Keyboard

To configure the Samsung keyboard:

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Language and input.
- 2. Touch next to Samsung keyboard to display the following options:
 - Input languages: Used to set a default text entry language.
 Touch this field, scroll through the options, and touch the desired input language. When activated, a check appears in the box.
 - Predictive text: Enable or disable XT9 predictive text. When enabled the system suggests words matching your text entries, and, optionally, completes common words automatically.
 When XT9 is enabled, touch the Predictive text field to set the following options:
 - Personalized data: Enter personalized data to improve prediction results.
 - Learn from Facebook: Log in to let your device learn your Facebook style.

- Learn from Gmail: Log in to let your device learn your Gmail style.
- Learn from Twitter: Log in to let your device learn your Twitter style.
- Learn from Contacts: Allow your device to learn your Contacts style.
- Clear remote data: Delete your anonymous data stored on the personalization server.
- **Clear personal data**: Remove all personalized data entered.
- SwiftKey Flow: Type words by swiping between letters.
- **Cursor control**: Move the cursor by sliding your finger across the keyboard.
- Key-tap sound: Check to play a brief sound each time you touch a key on the on-screen keyboard.
- Handwriting: Touch to display the following options:
 - Recognition type: Set the recognition after each stroke or after completion.
 - Recognition time: Set the recognition time in milliseconds.
 - **Pen thickness**: Set the pen thickness in pixels.
 - Pen color: Choose a pen color.
 - **Gesture quide**: Displays handwriting gestures you can use.

- Tutorial: Displays examples of the various gestures that can be used to edit handwriting.
- About: Displays information about the handwriting software.
- Advanced: Touch to display the following advanced options:
 - Auto capitalization: Enable or disable auto-capitalization.
 When enabled, the system automatically capitalizes words in your text based on common usage, such as at the beginning of sentences.
 - Auto spacing: Enable or disable auto spacing. When enabled, spaces are automatically inserted between words.
 - Auto punctuate: Enable or disable automatic insertion of a "full stop" (period and space to end a sentence) by touching the space bar twice.
 - Character preview: Check to display an automatic preview of the current character selection within the text string. This is helpful when multiple characters are available within one key.
- Tutorial: Launch a brief on-screen tutorial covering the main concepts related to the Samsung keyboard.
- **Reset settings**: Reset keyboard settings except personalized data and downloaded languages.

Configuring the Swype Keyboard

To configure the Swype keyboard:

- Touch next to Swype to display the following options:
 - **Settings**: Configure basic Swype settings.
 - My Words: Set options for managing your dictionary and data.
 - Languages: Manage the language used for Swype. The default language is English. Touch **Download languages**, to download additional languages.
 - Gestures: Displays helpful information on using gestures while using Swype.
 - Help: Touch How to Swype to view an on-screen manual for Swype. Touch Show helpful tips for more Swype information.
 - Updates: Check for available Swype updates.

Speech

Configure speech settings.

- From the Settings screen, touch Language and input.
- 2. Touch Voice search to configure:
 - Language: Choose a language for your voice input.
 - Speech output: Always provides audible readout of text, or only when using Hands-free functions.
 - Block offensive words: Enable or disable blocking of recognized offensive words from the results of your voice-input Google searches.
 - Hotword detection: When enabled, saying the word Google launches voice search.
 - Download offline speech recognition: Enable voice input while offline. Touch the All tab to download speech recognition for other languages.
 - Bluetooth headset: Record audio through Bluetooth headset, if available

- 3. Touch Text-to-speech options:
 - Select Samsung text-to-speech engine or Google Text-to speech Engine as your preferred TTS engine.
 - Touch 🗱 next to each TTS engine to configure.
 - Touch Speech rate to set the speed at which the text is spoken.
 - Touch Listen to an example to play a sample of speech synthesis (available if voice data is installed).

Mouse/Trackpad

This option sets your Pointer speed.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Language and input.
- Touch Pointer speed then drag the slider to the right to go faster or to the left to go slower.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save your setting.

Back Up and Reset

You can also back up your data to the Google server and reset your device to its factory defaults.

Back Up My Data

Enable backup of your information to the Google server.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch Backup and reset.
- Touch Back up my data to enable or disable back up of application data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to the Google server.

Backup Account

If you have enabled the **Back up my data** option, then the **Backup account** option is available.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Back up and reset.
- Touch Backup account and touch your Google Gmail account or touch Add account to set your Google Gmail account to be backed up to the Google server.

Automatic Restore

When enabled, backed-up settings are restored when you reinstall an application.

- 1. From the Settings screen, touch Back up and reset.
- Touch Automatic restore to enable or disable automatic restoration of settings from the Google server.

Factory Data Reset

Use Factory data reset to return your device to its factory defaults. This setting erases all data from the device, including Google or other email account settings, system and application data and settings, and downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files. If you reset the tablet in this way, the next time you turn on your tablet you are prompted to reenter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch Backup and reset.
- Touch Factory data reset.

The Factory data reset screen displays reset information.

Touch Reset device, then follow the prompts to perform the reset.

If you have set up a Factory Data Reset Password, the Password screen displays and the password must be entered.

For more information, refer to "Factory Data Reset Password" on page 131.

Accounts

Set up and manage accounts, including your Google accounts, Samsung accounts, and email accounts.

Your device provides the ability to synchronize information from a variety of accounts, including Email, Facebook, Google, and your Samsung account. Depending on the account, you can choose to synchronize your calendar, contacts, and other types of content.

With synchronization, you can ensure that the information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

Managing Accounts

To view the accounts you have added:

- From the Settings screen, touch (account).
 The (account) is either Google, Samsung account, or some other account you have added, such as Email.
 Each of your accounts (Google, Samsung, and so on) are listed under Accounts
- Touch Sync all to synchronize all accounts listed. Touch Cancel sync to stop the synchronization.
- Touch an account to view the sync settings for that account.
 - Touch Sync now to synchronize all data for the selected account.
 - or -

Touch the account data to synchronize, such as, Calendar, Contacts, and so on.

 To remove the account, touch Remove account and then touch Remove account at the prompt to remove the account and delete all its messages, contacts, and other data.

- For Google accounts, touch one of the items listed under Privacy to view various settings for that item.
 - or -

For Samsung accounts, touch **Account settings** to manage Samsung account settings.

- or -

For Email accounts, touch **Settings** to manage various settings for that account.

Adding an Account

To add a new account:

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch Add account.
- 2. Touch one of the account types.
- Use the keyboard and follow the prompts to enter your credentials and set up the account.

Tip: For more information about the types of accounts that you can add, see "Accounts" on page 45.

Signing In to your Samsung Account

Several applications and options require that you create and sign in to a Samsung Account.

To sign in to your Samsung account:

- From the Settings screen, touch Add account.
- Touch Samsung account.
 The Samsung account sign in screen displays.
- 3. Touch variety of services to display information about Samsung services that are available.
- If you have no Samsung account, touch Create new account.

- or -

If you do have a Samsung account, touch **Sign in**. The Samsung account screen displays.

Use the keyboard to enter the required information and touch Sign up or Sign in.

- Tip: The password is for your Samsung account, not the password you use for the email address you are entering. Plus, you can use only letters, numbers, !, @, \$, %, &, ^, and * for your Samsung account password.
 - If you are creating a new account, the Terms and Conditions screen displays. Read the Terms and conditions, Special terms, and Privacy policy and touch I accept all the terms above.

The Settings screen displays with Samsung account listed under Accounts.

System

Voice Control

To set voice control options for the Alarm, Camera, and Music apps:

- 1. From the **Settings** screen, touch **Voice control**.
- 2. Touch off to turn Voice control ON.

- Touch Alarm to stop or snooze alarms with the voice commands "Stop" and "Snooze."
- Touch Camera to take pictures with the voice commands "Smile," "Cheese," "Capture," and "Shoot."
- Touch Music to control the Music app with the voice commands "Next," "Previous," "Pause," "Play," "Volume Up," and "Volume Down."

Accessory

You can enable your tablet to play sounds when inserting and removing the device when docking.

- From the Settings screen, touch Accessory for these options:

 - Auto rotate screen: When this option is checked, the screen
 orientation changes when you rotate the device. When this

Section 9: Health and Safety Information

This device is capable of operating in Wi-Fi[™] mode in the 2.4 and 5 GHz bands. The FCC requires that devices operating within 5.15-5.25 GHz may only be used indoors, not outside, in order to avoid interference with Mobile Satellite Services (MSS). Read this information before using your mobile device.

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by

mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than $\frac{1}{2}$ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Additional information about the COSMOS study can be found at

Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries. Additional information about MOBI-KIDS can be found at

Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth® headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your wireless mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile device.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model mobile device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. near the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC SAR guidelines.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines.

A GPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. Government that are subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense policy and the 2008 Federal Radio navigation Plan (FRP). Changes may affect the performance of location-based technology on your mobile device.

Your Location

Location-based information includes information that can be used to determine the approximate location of a mobile device. Mobile devices which are connected to a wireless

network transmit location-based information. Additionally, if you use applications that require location-based information (e.g. driving directions), such applications transmit location-based information. The location-based information may be shared with third-parties, including your wireless service provider, applications providers, Samsung, and other third-parties providing services.

Navigation

Maps, directions, and other navigation-data, including data relating to your current location, may contain inaccurate or incomplete data, and circumstances can and do change over time. In some areas, complete information may not be available. Therefore, you should always visually confirm that the navigational instructions are consistent with what you see before following them. All users should pay attention to road conditions, closures, traffic, and all other factors that may impact safe driving or walking. Always obey posted road signs.

Emergency Communication

GALAXY should not be relied upon for essential communications (medical emergencies, calls to 911, or communications to emergency services). GALAXY is not designed or intended to be used for such communications.

Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) services which may be used on GALAXY to make phone calls do not support 911 calls and are only intended for talking with friends.

Care and Maintenance

Your mobile device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years:

Keep your Samsung Mobile Device away from:

Liquids of any kind

Keep the mobile device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits.

If the mobile device does get wet, do not accelerate drying with the use of an oven, microwave, or dryer, because this may damage the mobile device and could cause a fire or explosion. Do not use the mobile device with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the mobile device.

Extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 113°F.

Microwaves

Do not try to dry your mobile device in a microwave oven. Doing so may cause a fire or explosion.

Dust and Dirt

Do not expose your mobile device to dust, dirt, or sand.

Cleaning solutions

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the mobile device. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.

Shock or vibration

Do not drop, knock, or shake the mobile device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

Paint

Do not paint the mobile device. Paint can clog the device's moving parts or ventilation openings and prevent proper operation.

Responsible Listening

Caution! Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations.

Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices).

 noise cancelling headphones should allow you to hear the music
 at lower volumes than when using earbuds.

- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss.
 Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
 experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or
 experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your
 portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives

Implantable Medical Devices
