About this instruction manual

This instruction manual basically explains operations as follows:



Notes on handling

Important cautions

Installation of the unit

- Select a place which is level, dry and neither too hot nor too cold (between 5°C and 35°C, 41°F and 95°F).
- Leave sufficient distance between the unit and the TV.
- Do not use the player in a place subject to vibrations.

Power cord

- · Do not handle the power cord with wet hands!
- A small amount of power (3.8 watts) is always consumed while the power cord is connected to the wall outlet.
- When unplugging the player from the wall outlet, always pull the plug, not the power cord.

To prevent malfunction of the unit

- There are no user-serviceable parts inside. If anything goes wrong, unplug the power cord and consult your dealer.
- Do not insert any metallic object into the unit.
- Do not use any non-standard shape disc available on the market, because it may damage the unit.
- Do not use a disc with tape, seals, or paste on it, because damage to the unit may result.

Note about copyright laws

• Please check the copyright laws in your country before recording from DVD VIDEO, Audio CD, and Video CD discs. Recording of copyrighted material may infringe copyright laws.

Note about the copyguard system

• The DVD VIDEO disc is protected by the copyguard system. When you connect the unit to your VCR directly, the copyguard system activates and the picture may not be played back correctly.

Safety precautions

Avoid moisture, water and dust

Do not place the unit in moist or dusty places.

Avoid high temperatures

Do not expose the unit to direct sunlight or place it near a heating device.

When you're away

When away on travel or otherwise for an extended period of time, remove the plug from the wall outlet.

Do not insert foreign objects into the unit

Do not insert wires, hairpins, coins, etc. into the unit.

Do not block the vents

Blocking the vents may damage the unit.

Care of the cabinet

When cleaning the unit, use a soft cloth and follow the relevant instructions on the use of chemically-coated cloths. Do not use benzene, thinner or other organic solvents and disinfectants. These may cause deformation or discoloring.

If water gets inside the unit

Turn off the power switch and remove the plug from the wall outlet, then call the store where you made your purchase. Using the unit in this state may cause a fire or electrical shock.

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
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Names of parts and controls

Front panel



① ①/| button (17)

Turns the unit on or off (standby).

② STANDBY indicator

Lights when the power cord is connected and the unit is on standby. When the unit is turned on, the STANDBY indicator goes off.

③ Key control buttons (40)

Used to shift the musical key of a song being played to match with your voice.

raises the key, and \flat lowers the key. $\$ returns to the original (normal) key.

④ DVD 1 to DVD 3 trays (17)

Used to load discs. To insert/remove discs, press the \triangleq (OPEN/CLOSE) button located on the right of the tray corresponding to disc number.

⑤ ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) buttons (17)

Used to open and close disc trays 1 to 3 respectively. When, after opening the DVD1 tray, another \triangleq (OPEN/CLOSE) button is pressed, the DVD1 tray is first closed, then the other DVD tray selected is opened.

6 1 through 3 (DISC) buttons with indicators (18)

Used to start playback of the disc in the tray corresponding with the number indicated on the button (these function the same as the DISC 1 through 3 buttons on the remote control unit). While playing, the corresponding indicator blinks.

In this manual, they are sometimes called "DISC" buttons.

⑦ SHUTTLE knob (19, 25)


Performs rapid advance/reverse playback operations. Also used for slow-motion playback of a picture (for DVD/ Video CD/SVCD).

(8) Numeric buttons

Mainly used to select title/track numbers when reserving songs for karaoke or starting from a desired title/track.

- (9) ▷ (PLAY) button (18) Starts playback. Also used as a SELECT button for the PBC of Video CDs/SVCDs. Functions the same as the ▷ (SELECT) button on the remote control unit.
- 10 II (PAUSE) button (18) Pauses playback
- (1) (STOP) button (18) Stops playback.
- 12 I ◄◄/►►I (SKIP) button (19) Used to skip chapter, title or track. Also used for the page selection of a menu screen (for Video CD/SVCD).
- (3) KARAOKE ON/OFF button (35) Turns the karaoke function on or off.
- Display window
 Indicates the current status of the unit.
- (5) RESERVE button (36) Used to reserve songs to be played back for karaoke.
 (6) CANCEL button (36)
- Cancels reserved songs.
- I MIC 1/2 jacks (35) Used to connect microphones.
- (B) MIC 1/2 level controls (35) Used to control the input level of microphones connected to the MIC 1/2 jacks.

Remote control unit



Function the same as the 1 through 3 buttons on the front panel. (2) ◄◄/►► (SLOW(-)/SLOW(+)) buttons (19, 25) Perform rapid advance/reverse playback operations. Also used for slow-motion playback of a picture (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD). ③ **■ (STOP) button (18)** Stops playback. Also used to erase all the programmed tracks for program play. ④ I→→/ (PREVIOUS/NEXT) buttons (19) Performs skipping a chapter, title or track. Also used for the page selection of a menu screen (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD). **(5)** TITLE button (for DVD) (20) Displays a DVD title menu on the TV screen or monitor.

Used to start playback of the disc in the corresponding tray.

(1) DISC 1 through DISC 3 buttons (18)

- (6) ▲/▼/►/◄ (CURSOR) buttons Used to select an item from a menu or on-screen display, or to change the setting of an item in the on-screen display.
- ⑦ RETURN CHOICE button (20, 42) Returns to the previous menu (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD). When pressed while holding down the SHIFT button, the Preference on-screen display appears on the TV screen.
- ⑧ PLAY MODE button Displays an on-screen display for controlling the advanced playback functions.
- ③ SUBTITLE button (for DVD/SVCD) (30) Used to display the Subtitle selection display on the TV screen, as well as used to turn the subtitle on or off (for DVD) or select the subtitle (for SVCD).
- DIGEST KARAOKE button (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD) (23, 35) Displays beginning scenes of each title, chapter, or track on the TV screen. Pressing this button while holding down the SHIFT button turns the karaoke function on or off.
 STROBE - KARAOKE MENU button
- (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD) (24, 37) Displays nine continuous still pictures. Pressing this button while holding down the SHIFT button displays the karaoke menu on the TV screen.
- Numeric buttons (10)
 Mainly used to select a title/track number, or a TV channel. Also used to enter a time for the Time search and a chapter number for the Chapter search.

(3 3D PHONIC button (32) Produces a simulated surround effect.

- HEATER POSITION button (31) Selects a picture character from 4 settings.
- (5) SHIFT button (16, 33, 35, 42, 45) Used together with other keys for activating their second functions
- 16 TV/VIDEO button (16)
- Switches the TV input mode.
- Infrared signal-emitting window Point this window toward the remote sensor on the front panel when pressing buttons.
- ⑧ DVD ॑/| TV ॑/| button (16, 17)

Turns the unit on or off (standby). Pressing this button while holding down the SHIFT button turns the TV on or off.

- (19 II (PAUSE) button (18) Pauses playback.
- 20 ⊳ (SELECT) button (18)

Starts playback. Also used as a SELECT button for PBC of Video CDs/SVCDs. Functions the same as the \rhd (PLAY) button on the front

panel. (1) MENU button (for DVD) (20)

Displays a DVD menu on the TV screen or monitor.

22 ENTER button

Executes the selected item in a menu or on-screen display when pressing the button.

23 DISPLAY - TIME button (33)

Displays the status information (only for DVD) or the time information (for all types of discs) when the karaoke function is off. When the time information is displayed, pressing this button while holding down the SHIFT button changes the time mode. When the karaoke function is on, pressing this button displays the karaoke menu.

24 ANGLE button (for DVD) (29)

Changes camera angles during playback of a DVD containing multiple camera angles.

25 AUDIO button (31)


Selects the audio (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD).

26 CANCEL button (26)

Cancels the previous settings.

- ZOOM-RESERVE button (for DVD/Video CD/SVCD) (25, 36)
 Zoom-in for a close-up view of the scene. Pressing this button while holding down the SHIFT button displays the karaoke reservation table on the TV screen.
- 28 TV VOL buttons (16) Adjust the TV volume.
- 29 TV ch buttons (16) Changes the TV channels.


Display window

Operational Principles

On-screen displays

The unit provides several on-screen displays. With some displays, you can set or select preferences or functions, while the others are display-only.

Opening displays

The Opening display appears automatically in some conditions.


At the bottom, the following information are indicated depending on the unit's status.

- NOW READING: The unit is now reading the disc information (TOC).
- **REGION CODE ERROR!:** The DVD disc loaded cannot be played because the region code of the disc does not match the unit.
- CHANGE \rightarrow DISC 1: The unit is now changing the • disc tray to DISC 1.
- OPEN: The selected tray is now opening. •
- CLOSE: The selected tray is now closing.

Preference displays

When the unit is stopped, pressing the RETURN-CHOICE button while holding the SHIFT button accesses the preference display for setting the preferences.






Preliminary Knowledge

Status displays

Pressing the DISPLAY-TIME button during playback accesses the status display.

For a DVD disc, pressing the DISPLAY-TIME button toggles between the DVD function status display and the disc/time display and off.

For a Video CD or Audio CD disc, pressing the DISPLAY-TIME button switches the disc/time display on and off. DVD function status



Karaoke reservation


When karaoke mode is on, pressing the DISPLAY-TIME button, or pressing the STROBE-KARAOKE MENU button while holding down the SHIFT button accesses the karaoke menu display in which you can set several karaoke functions.

Pressing ZOOM-KARAOKE RESERVE button while holding down the SHIFT button accesses the karaoke reservation display in which you can reserve songs to be played. Karaoke function display

To prevent the monitor from burning out [SCREEN SAVER]



A television monitor screen may be burned out if a static picture is displayed for a long time. To prevent this, the unit automatically activates the screen saver function if a static picture, such as an on-screen display or menu, is displayed for over 5 minutes.

- · Pressing any button on the unit or the remote control unit will release the screen saver function and return to the previous display.
- You can select one of several screen saver modes available (see page 44).
- The screen saver function is not activated during Audio CD playback or after stopping Audio CD playback.

On-screen quide icons

During DVD playback, you may see icons displayed over the picture. These have the following meanings.



: Displayed at the beginning of a scene recorded from multiple angles. (See page 29.)



: Displayed at the beginning of a scene recorded with multiple audio languages. (See page 31.)



- : Displayed at the beginning of a scene recorded with multiple subtitle languages. (See page 30.)

You can set the unit not to display on-screen icons above via the preference settings described on page 44.

About invalid operation icon

When you press a button, if the unit does not accept its operation, 🚫 appears on your television screen. Operations are occasionally unacceptable even if \bigotimes is not displayed.

Note that some operations may not be accepted. For example, some discs may not allow rapid advance/reverse or slow-motion playback.

How to use numeric buttons

To select a track/title number

To select a number between 1 and 10

Press the corresponding button for the number.

· To select a number higher than 10

Use the +10 button.

Examples: To select 13 $+10 \rightarrow 3$ To select 34 $+10 \rightarrow +10 \rightarrow +10 \rightarrow 4$ To select 40 $+10 \rightarrow +10 \rightarrow +10 \rightarrow 10$

To enter a time or chapter number

The method for entering a time for Time search or chapter number for Chapter search is different from above. See the corresponding sections in this manual for the details

To select a TV channel.

Press the corresponding numeric buttons (between 0 and 9) while holding down the SHIFT button.




Disc structure

A DVD disc is comprised of "titles," while an Audio CD, Video CD or SVCD is comprised of "tracks." Each title may be divided into some "chapters." For example, if a DVD disc contains some movies, each movie may have its own title number, and each movie may be divided into some chapters. In a DVD karaoke disc, each song usually has its own title number and does not have chapters. In general, each title has independent content, while each chapter in the same title has continuity.

Connections


*In the following description, "TV" may be substituted with "monitor" or "projector." *Before using the unit, you have to connect the unit to a TV and/or amplifier.

Before making any connections

- Do not connect the AC power cord until all other connections have been made.
- Since different components often have different terminal names, carefully read the instructions supplied with the component you are going to connect.

To connect to a TV

You can enjoy using the unit by simply connecting it to a TV. To improve audio sound quality, connect the audio outputs to your separate audio equipment. (See the following pages.)



Connect the unit to a TV equipped with stereo audio input and video input jacks using the supplied audio/video cables.

- If your TV has a monaural audio input instead of stereo, you need to use an optional audio cable which converts stereo audio output to monaural.
- If your TV has an S-video input, you should connect it with the S-VIDEO output of the unit using the supplied S-video cable in addition to the (standard) video connection to get better picture quality.
- The ATTENUATOR switch should be normally set to OFF. If you hear distorted audio because the sensitivity of the TV's audio input is too high, set this switch to ON.

The unit is compatible with the PAL and NTSC color systems. Set the VIDEO OUT SELECT switch on the rear panel to match the color system of your TV. Make sure that the color system of the DVD/Video CD/SVCD disc labeled on the package matches your TV.


If you use a multi-system TV, you can play discs recorded on both PAL and NTSC systems.

(NOTE)

Connect VIDEO OUT of the unit directly to the video input of your TV. Connecting VIDEO OUT of the unit to a TV via a VCR may cause a monitor problem when playing back a copy-protected disc.

To connect to a TV with the component video input jacks

You can enjoy high picture quality by connecting the unit's COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks to the COMPONENT VIDEO IN jacks of your TV with the video cables.




• Connect "Y" to "Y," "PB" to "PB," and "PR" to "PR" correctly.

NOTES

- When the component video input jacks of the TV are of the BNC type, use an adapter to convert the pin jacks to BNC jacks (optional).
- If you do not connect the unit with the S-video cable, some functions of your TV may not work.

To connect to an audio amplifier or receiver

You can enjoy high-quality audio by connecting the unit's audio output to your amplifier or receiver.




 Connect the unit's AUDIO OUT to any line-level inputs (such as AUX, DVD, CD, etc.) of an audio amplifier or receiver.

To connect to audio equipment with a digital input

You can enhance the sound quality by connecting the unit's DIGITAL OUT (optical) to the digital input of an amplifier, DAT or MD by using an optional digital cable. The digital stereo audio signal from a disc is directly transferred. If you connect the unit to a Dolby Digital, DTS or MPEG Multichannel decoder or an amplifier with a built-in decoder by using an optional digital cable, you can enjoy high-quality surround sound.

When you make the digital connection, also make the analog connection, because, depending on the disc type, no audio may be reproduced from the DIGITAL OUT.



• For digital connection, connect the unit's DIGITAL OUT (optical) to the digital input of audio equipment using an optional digital cable.

NOTES

- When you connect the unit's DIGITAL OUT to digital audio equipment, before using, make the "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" setting in the "AUDIO" page of the preference display correctly according to the connected audio equipment. If the "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" is not set correctly, loud noise may be generated from speakers, causing damage to your speakers. See "DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT" on page 43.
- With the digital connection, the unit's settings for COMPRESSION and DOWN MIX in the AUDIO page of the preference display are invalid. Settings for these items must be made from the decoder.

To connect the power cord

When all the audio/video connections have been made, insert the smaller plug of the supplied AC power cord to the unit's AC IN connector, then insert the other end to the wall outlet. Make sure that plugs are inserted firmly. The STANDBY indicator lights and setup is completed.

🕂 Warning

- Disconnect the power cord if you are not going to use the unit for a long time.
- Disconnect the power cord before cleaning the unit.
- Disconnect the power cord before moving the unit.
- Do not connect or disconnect the power cord with wet hands.
- Do not pull the power cord when disconnecting it, as this may damage the cord and cause fire, electric shock, or other accidents.

A Caution

- Do not damage, alter, twist, or pull the power cord, as this may cause fire, electric shock, or other accidents.
- To prevent any accidents or damages caused by an unsuitable AC power cord, only use the supplied power cord. If the cord is damaged, contact a dealer and get a new power cord.
- Do not put anything heavy, or the unit, on the power cord, as this may cause fire, electric shock, or other accidents.

Using the remote control unit

Using the remote control, you can operate not only all the functions of the unit, but also basic functions of your TV.

To install batteries in the remote control unit

The battery compartment is located on the back of the remote control unit.

1 Press down on the point shown by the arrow at the top of the compartment cover, and pull up the cover to open the compartment.

- 2 Place the two accessory R6P (SUM-3)/AA(15F) batteries in the remote control according to the polarity markings ("+" and "-") inside the compartment and on the batteries.
- **3** Place the cover over the compartment, and press down lightly.

• The batteries will last about six months with normal use. If the functions of the remote control become erratic, replace the batteries. See below for more information.

Precautions for the safe use of batteries

Observe the following precautions for the safe use of batteries. If they are used improperly their life will be shortened, they may burst or their contents may leak.

Precaution

- Remove the batteries from the remote control if it is not going to be used for a long period of time.
- Remove dead batteries and dispose of them properly.
- Never leave dead batteries lying around, take them apart, mix them with other refuse, or throw them into an incinerator.
- Never touch liquid that has leaked out of a battery.
- · Do not mix new and old batteries, or batteries of different types, when replacing them.



To use the remote control unit for TV operation

You can operate your TV from the remote control unit.

Setting the remote control signal for operating your TV.





Inserting and removing discs

Up to three discs can be set in the unit. You may insert a disc into any of disc trays 1 through 3.

Press ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) located on the right of the tray corresponding to disc number. The corresponding disc tray opens.



3 Press \triangleq (OPEN/CLOSE) to close the disc tray.

Hints

- If you press \triangleq (OPEN/CLOSE) for the disc being played, the unit stops and then opens the tray.
- You can change, insert or remove the disc by pressing ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) for a disc tray which is not in use for playback while the disc in aother tray is being played, without stopping play.

- NOTES

- The unit can playback DVD, Audio CD, Video CD and SVCD discs only. Do not load other disc types. For details about playable disc types, see page 11.
- When loading a disc in the tray, be sure to position the disc inside the recess. Otherwise, the disc may be damaged when the tray is closed, and the disc may not be removed from the unit.

Basic playback

Now you can play a disc. First, let's enjoy simple playback according to following procedure.

To start playback

Press ⊳,

or

press one of the DISC buttons (1 through 3) on the front panel or DISC 1 through 3 on the remote control unit.


The unit starts playback from:

- the selected disc indicated in the display window when pressing ⊳ or
- the corresponding disc when pressing a DISC button.

The indicator on the DISC button (1 - 3) on the front panel corresponding to the disc being played flashes.

NOTES

- The 1 through 3 buttons on the front panel function the same as the respective DISC 1 through 3 buttons on the remote control unit.
- During playback, the display window shows the disc number and the title/chapter or track number being played.
- When the resume point is memorized, the unit starts playback from that point instead of the beginning. See page 19.
- With Video CD or SVCD discs with PBC control or some DVD discs, the menu display may appear on the TV screen after starting playback. In such a case, select an item to be played back from the menu. For operation using a menu, see page 20.
- With some DVD discs, the unit starts playback automatically after inserting the disc.

To stop playback completely

Press ■.

The unit stops playback.

To stop playback temporarily

Press II.

The unit pauses playback. To continue playback, press \triangleright .







To advance or reverse play rapidly while monitoring

During playback

From the remote control unit


Press ►► or ◄◄.

Pressing \rightarrow advances playback rapidly, while pressing \triangleleft reverses playback rapidly. Each time you press the button, advance or reverse playback speed increases. To return to normal playback, press >.

From the front panel

Use the SHUTTLE knob.

To advance playback rapidly, turn the shuttle knob to the right and hold, and to reverse play rapidly, turn the shuttle knob to the left and hold. When you release the shuttle knob, the unit returns to normal playback. The playback speed changes according to the amount you turn the shuttle knob.



To locate the beginning of the scene or song

During playback

Press **I** or **I**

Press I do locate the beginning of the current chapter, title, or track, and press >> I to locate the beginning of the next chapter, title, or track.

NOTE

When you play a Video CD/SVCD disc with the PBC function or a DVD disc, the unit may locate a different place, but it will generally locate the beginning of the title or chapter or track.

To resume playback

When RESUME on the SYSTEM page of the preference display is set to ON, the unit memories the position on a disc where you interrupt playback and resumes playback from that position next time you press >. (See Page 45.) When the unit memorizes the resume position, "RESUME" is displayed in the display window.

When the disc you interrupted playback last time remains selected and stopped:

Press \triangleright .

The unit starts playback form the position where you interrupted playback last time.

To clear the memory of the resume position

Take out the disc from the unit, or press ■ while stopped.

NOTES

- Pressing a DISC button (1-3) does not activate the resume function. It always starts playback from the beginning.
- · The resume function does not work with Audio CD discs.
- The resume function does not work if RESUME on the SYSTEM page of the preference display is set to OFF.
- You can store the position where you interrupt playing by pressing ■, as well as by turning the unit off.
- In the case of a Video CD/SVCD disc with PBC function, the unit may resume playback from a point slightly earlier than the resume point you stored.
- The resume function does not work in the program or random mode.


When you operate the functions described below while stopped, make sure that the desired disc number is selected by checking the the disc indicator in the display window. If it is not selected, press the corresponding DISC button to start playback and then press **■**.

Playing from a specific position on a disc

You can play a disc from the selected track, title or chapter, or from the specified time.

To locate a desired scene from the DVD menu

DVD discs generally have their own menus which show the disc contents. These menus contain various items such as titles of a movie, names of songs, or artist information, and display them on the TV screen. You can locate a desired scene by using the menu.





1 Press MENU or TITLE.

The menu appears on the TV screen.

Hints About menu

Normally, a DVD disc which contains more than one title may have a "title" menu which lists the titles. In this case, the menu appears on the TV screen by pressing the TITLE button. Some DVD discs may also have a different menu which appears by pressing the MENU button.

- When playing a DVD or Audio CD disc with DTS, use a DTS decoder to get the correct signals for your speakers. Never use the unit's analog output jacks, which output incorrect signals that may damage your speakers.

If you connect the analog outputs and digital outputs simultaneously, be sure to select the source of the amplifier correctly, or set the level control of the amplifier connected to the analog outputs to minimum.







Limiting playback by children

This function restricts playback of DVD discs which contain violent (and other) scenes according to the level set by the user. For example, if a movie which includes violent scenes supports the parental lock feature, such scenes which you do not want to let children view can be cut or replaced with other scenes.

IMPORTANT!

- If you connect the component video output to your TV:
- Set the DVD player's AV COMPULINK setting to DVD1.
- Make the video/audio connection between the DVD player and your receiver using the supplied audio/video cable, and do not make the S-VIDEO connection.

Notes for connection)

- If you connect a DVD player to a receiver via AV COMPU LINK in a system including a Dolby digital decoder, some functions may not be performed automatically.
- The AV COMPU LINK terminal on some televisions indicates "II." Do not connect a terminal indicating "II" with the AV COMPU LINK terminal on a receiver. If connected, the system will not work correctly.
- Connect the AUDIO OUT jacks of the DVD player to the audio input jacks of a receiver that indicates "DVD." Otherwise, the system will not work correctly.
- There may be no description about connections to a DVD player in the instruction manual of a television or VCR. However, a television or VCR with AV COMPU LINK terminals indicating "II" or "EX" can be connected to a DVD player.

Operation


You can enjoy pictures and/or sound by just putting a source component (which plays back the pictures and/or sound such as a DVD player or VCR) into play mode. You do not have to operate the TV and receiver, including not having to perform power switching.

- **1** Turn on the main power of the television.
- 2 Insert a disc into the source component.
- **3** Press \blacktriangleright of the source component.
- The following actions are performed automatically:
- Turning on the power for the television.
- Setting the source of the television to the external input (VIDEO-1 or VIDEO-2).
- Turning on the power for the receiver.
- Setting the source of the receiver to the component which has started playback.

Care and handling of discs

How to handle discs

When handling a disc, do not touch the surface of the disc. Since discs are made of plastic, they are easily damaged. If a disc gets dirty, dusty, scratched or warped, the images and sound will not be picked up correctly, and such a disc may cause the player to malfunction.



Label side

Do not damage the label side, stick paper to or use any adhesive on its surface.

Storage

Make sure that discs are kept in their cases. If discs are piled on top of one another without their protective cases, they can be damaged. Do not put discs in a location where they may be exposed to direct sunlight, or in a place where the humidity or temperature is high. Avoid leaving discs in your car!

Maintenance of discs

If there are fingerprints or other dirt adhering to a disc, wipe with a soft dry cloth, moving from the center outwards. If a disc is difficult to clean, wipe with a cloth moistened with water. Never use record cleaners, petrol, alcohol or any anti-static agents.



CAUTION

Sometimes during play noise or images may be garbled. This is sometimes due to the disc. (It may not be up to industry standards.)

These symptoms are caused by the discs, not by the malfunction of the unit.

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Troubleshooting

What appears to be a malfunction may not always be serious. Please go through the following list before requesting service.
