

## 1 Safety instructions


- Only use the charger plug supplied. Do not use other chargers as this may damage the battery cells.
- Only insert rechargeable batteries of the same type. Never use ordinary, non-rechargeable batteries. Insert rechargeable batteries so they connect to the right poles (indicated in the battery compartment of the handset).
- Do not touch the charger and plug contacts with sharp or metal objects.
- The operations of some medical devices may be affected.
- The handset may cause an unpleasant buzzing sound in hearing aids.
- Do not place the basic unit in a damp room or at a distance of less then 1.5m away from a water source. Keep water away from the handset.
- Do not use the telephone in environments where there is a risk of explosions.
- Dispose of the batteries and maintain the telephone in an environment-friendly manner.
- As this telephone cannot be used in case of a power cut, you should use a mains-independent telephone for emergency calls, e.g. a mobile phone.

## 2 Getting started

## 2.1 Installing the base

For installation, do the following:

- **1** Plug one end of the adaptor into the outlet and the other end into the adaptor jack on the back of the base.
- **2** Connect one end of the telephone cord with the wall phone jack and the other end to the bottom of the telephone.
- **3** Put the telephone- and AC power line cord in the base guides as shown on the picture below.




- Back view of base -

## 2.2 Installing the handset

- **1** Open the battery compartment.
- **2** Insert the batteries respecting the polarity (+ and -).
- **3** Close the battery compartment.
- **4** Leave the handset on the base unit for 20 hours. The Line/Charge indicator on the base will light up.

Before you use the telephone for the first time, you must first make sure the battery is charged for 20 hours. If you do not do this, the telephone will not work optimally.

## 2.3 Twin/Triple/Quattro version

If you have purchased a Twin, Triple or Quattro version:

- 1 Plug one end of the adaptor into the outlet and the other end into the adapter jack on the bottom of the charger.
- **2** Insert the battries inside the handset.
- **3** Charge the handset for at least 20 hours.

## 2.4 Installing the Skype software

To be able to make calls over internet, you need a broadband connection and Skype installed on your computer. Download Skype for free from http://www.skype.com/go/getskype. Run the setup and follow the installation procedure.

## 2.5 Installing the phone software

To be able to use the Butler 4872 phone together with Skype, you need to install the phone software on your computer. This software will be the bridge between Skype and the phone. Minimum system requirements:

- PC running under Windows XP or 2000;
- 32 MB free memory;
- 20 MB free hard disk space;
- Internet connection with 56kbps or higher.
- **1** Install the software from the CD included with the phone.





- 2 Insert the CD when the PC is on. If the program doesn't run automatically, click on the Start icon and select "Run". Enter D:\CD\_Start.exe (if D in not your CD-ROM drive, enter the appropriate letter).
- **3** Click "Install Software".




The installation wizard will guide you through the process.

When "Plug in your phone..." appears, connect the USB plug of the phone to the PC and click "Next"...



When "Can Windows connect..." appears, select "No, not this time" and click "Next".




When the new hardware wizard starts, select "Install software automatically" and click next.



Click "Continue Anyway" when the following screen appears.



- When the hardware wizard is completed, click "Finish".
- After 5 minutes the software will detect the phone. Click "Next".



- **10** The software will now end the installation of all the drivers and after a while you can click "Finish" with "Reboot now" selected.
- Installation is now completed.





The systray Icon will show different information on the status of the phone/PC connection and Skype.




If the Topcom 'VoIP' icon has the following colours:


- Green: Connection is OK and Skype is seen by the phone




## 2.10 Navitating the menu

## 3 Using the telephone

## 3.1 Switching the handset ON/OFF

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**1** Press ans hold the OFF key to switch the handset off.


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
**2** Press the off-hook key or place the handset in the base to switch the handset back on.






**3** Select "Language" and confirm.

**4** Select a language and confirm.

The screen displays "Saved". If you have chosen English, your handset's menus will be in English.






#### 3.3 Making a normal telephone call

## **Direct dialling**











**3** Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.

## **Pre-dialling**

With the pre-dialling feature, you can enter and modify a number before making the call.



**1** Dial a number of up to 25 digits.

Press and hold the 0 key to insert a pause. The screen displays a P.



**2** Press the soft menu key to correct.



**3** Select "Save" to save the number in the phonebook.



**4** Press the off-hook key to start the call.



Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.

## Redial a number from the list


You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead.
















**3** Select a number. If the number is in the phonebook, the name will be shown.



**4** Press the off-hook key to start the call or select "Option".

If you selected "Option", scroll and select:

"Delete Call": to remove the number from the call list;

"Save Number": to store the number into the phonebook; "Delete All": to erase the call list.



Confirm selection. 6



Press the on-hook key to hang up or to go to standby.

## 3.4 Making a Skype telephone call

## Making a Skype call from the online contact list



**1** Press the Skype-key.

The Skype nickname is shown on the display.








**3** Press the left key to switch between the Skype nickname and account ID name.


**4** To start the call:

Press the Skype-key to start the call.

OR



Select "Option", then scroll until "Call Contact" is selected. Start the call by confirming.





If the Skype nickname contains special characters the phone can't display, the account ID name will be shown instead.

## Making a Skype call using speed-dial numbers



Make sure you have added speed-dial numbers to your contacts.







**1** Enter the speed-dial number (0-99).

**2** Press the Skype-key to start the call.

**3** Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.



You can also store speed-dial numbers into the phonebook (See "4 Phonebook").


## Making a SkypeOut call



To make SkypeOut calls, you have to buy SkypeOut credits!

You can call fixed lines or mobile numbers via Skype at low rate if you have SkypeOut credits:


**2** Press the Skype-key to start the call.



**3** Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.

## Redial one of the last 5 called contacts







**2** Select "PC OUT" and confirm.

The number/Skype nickname you last called appears on the display.

**3** Scroll through the called contact list.



**4** Press the left key to switch between the Skype nickname and account ID name.



**5** Press the Skype-key to start the call or press the off-hook key.

**6** Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.

## Make a conference call with your Skype contacts

You can call more then one contact at the same time by selecting the contacts first in the contact list.



**1** Press the Skype-key.

The Skype nickname is shown on the display.



**2** Select a contact person.




**3** Press the right key to select the contact persons you want to call. The netstatus icon in front of the contact name will be changed into  $\checkmark$ .



4 Select "Option".



**5** Select "Conference" and confirm.



## Putting a call on hold

During a Skype call (normal, conference and SkypeOut), you can put the call on hold.



**1** Select "Option".



2 Select "Hold" and confirm.

Now, the other side cannot hear what you are saying.

To continue the conversation:



1 Select "Option".



2 Select "Unhold" and confirm.

## 3.5 Receiving a normal telephone call

When you receive an external call, the screen displays "External Call".

To take the call:



**1** Press the off-hook key.

OR

Lift the handset off its base (if "Auto Talk" is activated (See "8.7 Autotalk"))



The call in progress icon appears on the screen. The call duration is displayed after 15 seconds.



**2** Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.



You can turn the ring volume off during incoming call by selecting "Quiet".

## 3.6 Receiving a Skype call

When you receive a Skype call, the screen displays the contact person who is calling you. To take the call:

**1** Press the Skype-key.

OR

Lift the handset off its base (if "Auto Talk" is activated (See "8.7 Autotalk"))

The call in progress icon appears on the screen. The call duration is displayed after 15 seconds.

**2** Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.

## 3.7 Handsfree mode

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to both sides of your conversation.

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**1** To switch any call to handsfree, press the handsfree key during the call.

## 3.8 Adjust earpiece/handsfree volume

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**1** Press up or down to select volume 1-5 during a normal or handsfree call.

## 3.9 Secrecy function (Mute function)

During a conversation, you can turn off the microphone so the person on the other side of the line will not hear you.

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**1** Press the soft menu key to deactivate the microphone.

"Mute On" appears on the display.

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**2** Select "Off" to activate the microphone again.

## 3.10 Locating a handset (Paging function)

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**1** Press the paging key on the base.

All handsets registered with the base will ring for 30 seconds.

## 3.11 Keypad Lock

You can lock the keypad to prevent accidental dialling while carrying the handset around.

 **1** Press and hold the keypad locked key until "Locked" and the keypad locked icon appear on the display.

**2** To unlock, select "Unlock", followed by the keypad locked key.

## 3.12 Using the alphanumerical keypad

With your telephone, you can also enter alphanumeric characters. This is useful for entering a name into the phonebook, giving a name to the handset, ...

To select a letter, press the corresponding key as many times as necessary.

For example, to select an 'A', press '2' once. To select a 'B', press '2' twice and so on.

To select 'A' and then 'B' consecutively, press '2' once, wait until the cursor moves on to the next character, then press '2' twice.

During entering text, the available character under each key appears below on the display.

You can change the input character set from English to Latin, Greek or Russian by pressing and holding the #-key for 2 seconds.

Press '0' to select a space.

Press the \*-key to switch between small letters and capitals.

Press and hold the #-key for 2 seconds to change the input character set.

Press the soft menu key to correct.

## 4 Phonebook

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Each handset can store up to 50 names and numbers. Names can be up to 16 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits.

## 4.1 To add an entry

**1** Press the soft menu key.

If the phonebook is empty, "Phonebook Empty" appears on the display. If names have been stored, they are listed.

**2** Select "Option".

**3** Select "New Entry" and confirm.

**4** Use the keypad to enter the name, then select "Save".

**5** Use the keypad to enter the number, then select "Save".

**6** Select the desired ring melody and select "Save".

**7** Return to standby.

## 4.2 To dial an entry

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**1** Press the soft menu key.

**2** Select the desired name or use the keypad to enter the first letter of the name.

**3** Press the off-hook key to start the call.

**4** Return to standby.

## 4.3 Show Details

**1** Press the soft menu key.

**2** Select the desired name or use the keypad to enter the first letter of the name.

3 Select "Option".4 Select "Show Details" and confirm.

The name, number and ring melody you have assigned to the entry appear on the display

the display.

**5** Return to standby.



## 4.4 Delete an entry or all entries

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**1** Press the soft menu key.

**2** Select the desired name or use the keypad to enter the first letter of the name.

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**3** Select "Option".

To delete one entry:

4 Select "Delete Entry" and confirm.

To delete all entries:

**4** Select "Delete All" and confirm.

**5** Press the right menu key to confirm or the left menu key to cancel.

**6** Return to standby.

## 4.5 Edit name and number

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**1** Press the soft menu key.

**2** Select the desired name or use the keypad to enter the first letter of the name.



**3** Select "Option".



4 Select "Edit Entry" and confirm.

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**5** Press the soft menu key to delete and use the keypad to change the name.

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6 Select "Save".



**7** Edit the number and select "Save".

## 4.6 Copy a phonebook entry to another handset

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**1** Press the soft menu key.

**2** Select the desired name or use the keypad to enter the first letter of the name.

The available handsets (all the handsets that are registered on the base) are shown.

**5** Select the desired handset and confirm.

"Copying to handset x" appears on the display.

"Receive phonebook record?" appears on the display of the destination handset.

**6** On the destination handset, press the right menu key to confirm or the left menu key to cancel the transfer.

**7** Return to standby.

## 4.7 Copy all phonebook entries to another handset



By copying all entries from one handset to another, you will erase all existing records at the destination handset.

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**1** Press the soft menu key.

**2** Select the desired name or use the keypad to enter the first letter of the name.

**3** Select "Option".

4 Select "Copy All" and confirm.

The available handsets (all the handsets that are registered on the base) are shown.

**5** Select the desired handset and confirm.

"Copying to handset x" appears on the display.

"Replace all phonebook records?" appears on the display of the destination handset.

On the destination handset, press the right menu key to confirm or the left menu key to cancel the transfer.



**7** Return to standby.

## 5 Caller Identification

## 5.1 Normal incoming PSTN calls



This service only works when you have a Caller ID/Clip subscription. Please contact your telephone company.

When you receive a call from your fixed telephone line, the telephone number of the caller appears on the handset display. The telephone can receive calls in both FSK and DTMF. You can also see his or her name if it is transmitted by the network. If the name is programmed in the phonebook, the name in the phonebook is displayed!

The telephone can store 30 calls in a Call List (received and missed) that can be reviewed later. When the memory is full, the new calls automatically replace the oldest calls in the memory.

Missed calls are signalled by a blinking icon on the display. The handset name is replaced by this icon and the amount of missed calls.

## To read the received calls



**1** Press the down button.



**2** Select "Clip" and confirm.

The Received calls list appears on the display. This is a combination of received and missed calls.



**3** Select the desired name or number.



**4** Press the off-hook key to start the call. OR



Select "Option".

To delete one entry: Select "Delete Entry" and confirm. Return to standby. To delete all entries: Select "Delete All" and confirm. **6** Return to standby. To add the number to the phonebook: **5** Select "Add Entry" and confirm. **6** Use the keypad to enter the name, then select "Save".  $\overline{\mathbf{C}}$ **7** Use the keypad to edit the number, then select "Save".  $\bigcirc$ 

Select the desired ring melody end select "Save".  $\odot$

#### 5.2 Skype incoming calls

When you receive a Skype call, the name of the contact will appear on the screen. The last 30 missed and received calls are stored in the PC call list. When the memory is full, the new calls automatically replace the oldest calls in the memory.

> Missed calls are signalled by a blinking icon. When the calls are read, the icon will not blink anymore.

## To read the received Skype calls



**1** Press the down button. **2** Select "PC-In" and confirm.

The most recently received calls appear on the display.

Return to standby.

The following information will be shown:



The icon in front of the sequence number is shown with a red dot to indicate that the call is not read.

**1** Scroll through the list.

**2** Press the Skype-key to start the call or press the off-hook key.

3 Return to standby.

You can only delete the call list by erasing the call history on your Skype PC program.

#### Skype voice mail 6



To have voice mail, you need to have a subscription.



When you have voice mail subscription and you have received a new message, the new message icon appears on the display. You can also send a voice mail message to one of your skype contacts by the menu (outbox) without calling them first.

#### 6.1 Listen to your voicemail messages



**1** Select "Menu".



**2** Select "Voicemail" and confirm.





**3** Select "Inbox" and confirm.



**4** Scroll through the list of voicemails.

Return to standby.







New unlisted messages are shown with the red dot icon.

**6** Press the right key to listen to the message.



You can also enter the voicemail inbox menu directly by pressing and holding the *'1'* \sum\_.



You can only delete the message list by erasing the call history on your Skype PC program.

#### 6.2 Send a voicemail message directly

You can send a voicemail message directly to one of your contacts in two ways:

## By the voicemail menu



1 Select "Menu"



**2** Select "Voicemail" and confirm.



**3** Select "Outbox" and confirm.



**4** Scroll through the contact list to select the desired contact person.



**5** Select "Send".



**6** Start speaking your message after the greeting text.



Press the on-hook key to hang up or put the handset back on the base.

## By the contact list:

**1** Press the Skype-key.

The Skype nickname is shown on the display.



**2** Scroll through the called contact list.

**3** Press the right key to select the contacts you want. The netstatus icon in front of the contact name will be changed.

Start speaking your message after the greeting text.



#### 7 **Chat function**

You can use your handset to chat by using the alphanumerical keypad.


## 11.2 List alert

## 11.3 Setting the netstatus by the handset





When setting the netstatus to "Offline" or "Do not disturb", the handset will not ring during incoming Skype call.



You can enter the Netstatus menu directly by pressing the netstatus key in standby.

#### 11.4 Chat alert

When someone is writing a text message (chat), you can get a warning tone.

To turn this alert On or Off:

## 12 Additional handsets and base stations





## 15 Warranty

## 15.1 Warranty period

The Topcom units have a 24-month warranty period. The warranty period starts on the day the new unit is purchased. The warranty on batteries is limited to 6 months after purchase. Consumables or defects causing a negligible effect on operation or value of the equipment are not covered. The warranty has to be proven by presentation of the original purchase receipt, on which the date of purchase and the unit-model are indicated.

## 15.2 Warranty handling

A faulty unit needs to be returned to a Topcom service centre including a valid purchase note. If the unit develops a fault during the warranty period, Topcom or its officially appointed service centre will repair any defects caused by material or manufacturing faults free of charge.

Topcom will at its discretion fulfil its warranty obligations by either repairing or exchanging the faulty units or parts of the faulty units. In case of replacement, colour and model can be different from the original purchased unit.

The initial purchase date shall determine the start of the warranty period. The warranty period is not extended if the unit is exchanged or repaired by Topcom or its appointed service centres.

## 15.3 Warranty exclusions

Damage or defects caused by incorrect treatment or operation and damage resulting from use of non-original parts or accessories not recommended by Topcom are not covered by the warranty. Topcom cordless phones are designed to work with rechargeable batteries only. The damage caused by the use of non-rechargeable batteries is not covered under warranty.

The warranty does not cover damage caused by outside factors, such as lightning, water and fire, nor any damage caused during transportation.

No warranty can be claimed if the serial number on the units has been changed, removed or rendered illegible.

Any warranty claims will be invalid if the unit has been repaired, altered or modified by the buyer or by unqualified, non-officially appointed Topcom service centres.

## 16 Disposal of the device (environment)



At the end of the product lifecycle, you should not throw this product into the normal household garbage but bring the product to a collection point for the recycling of electrical and electronic equipments. The symbol on the product, user guide and/or box indicate this.
