

## Inserting the AC power plug

After all other connections have been made, insert the AC power plug to the wall outlet firmly.

## Installing the batteries in the remote control

Open the compartment cover, and place the two supplied R6(SUM-3)/AA(15F) batteries in the remote control according to the polarity markings ("+" and "-") inside the compartment. Then replace the cover.



The batteries will last about six months with normal use If the functions of the remote control become erratic, replace the batteries

# Troubleshooting

Power does not come on. ➡ Power plug is not inserted securely. Plug in securely.

## Operation

- "REGION CODE ERROR!" is shown on the TV. ➡ Region code of the inserted disc does not match the player. Check the region code of the disc printed on the disc jacket.
- Operation is not possible.
- → Microcomputer malfunction due to lightning or static electricity. Turn off the power and unplug the power cord, then connect the power cord again. ➡ Moisture condensation caused by a sudden change
