
# Inserting the battery

This recorder uses a lithium ion battery specified by Olympus (LI-50B). Do not use any other type of battery.

While pushing down on the grooves using both thumbs, slide the battery cover in the direction indicated by the arrow.




With the back label of the battery facing up, line up the terminals of the recorder and battery. Insert the battery by sliding in direction (A) while pushing down in direction (B).



- Be careful of the direction of the battery when inserting it.
- The supplied rechargeable battery is not fully charged. Before using the unit the first time or after long periods of disuse, it is recommended that you charge it until full (@P.22).

3 Close the battery cover by sliding all the way in direction (B) while pushing down in direction (A).



#### Notes

- Be sure to stop the recorder before replacing the battery. Unloading the battery while the recorder is in use may corrupt the file. If you are recording into a file and the battery runs out, you will lose your currently recorded file because the file header will not be able to close. It is crucial to change the battery once you see only one Hash mark in the battery indicator.
- The battery cover is not attached at the time of purchase.
- Do not use too much force when inserting the battery. Use only the method listed above to install and remove the battery. Otherwise, damage may occur.

- If it takes longer than 15 minute to replace the dead battery or if you take the battery in and out repeatedly at short intervals, you may have to reset the time when you have loaded fresh batteries (\*\*\* P.28).
- Remove the battery if you are not going to use the recorder for an extended period of time.
- When playing a voice/music file, the recorder may be reset due to the reduction of the voltage output of the battery depending on the volume level even if [22] is displayed in the battery indicator. In this case, lower the volume of the recorder.
- When replacing rechargeable battery, be sure to use lithium ion battery (LI-50B) specified by Olympus. The use of other manufacturers' products can damage the recorder and should be avoided.

Lithium ion battery is self discharging. After unpacking this product, charge the supplied lithium ion battery before using the recorder for the first time.



The included AC adapter (A515) can be connected to this recorder for charging. We recommend using the AC adapter when recording or operating the recorder for long periods.



- Do not put in or take out the battery or AC adapter when the recorder power is on or when this recorder is connected to another device. It may cause problems with the values and functions set in the recorder.
- The charger can be used within the range of AC 100 V to AC 240 V (50/60 Hz). When using the charger abroad, you may need a plug adapter to convert the plug to the shape of the AC wall outlet. For details, ask at your local electrical shop or travel agent.
- Do not use travel voltage converters as they could damage your charger.

# Charging by connecting to a computer via USB

You can charge the battery by connecting to a PC's USB port. When charging, be sure to correctly place the rechargeable battery (supplied) into the recorder (1887 P.21).



- Charging is completed when battery indication becomes [1] (charging time: approximately 3 hours \*).
  - \* It shows the approximate time when charging the rechargeable battery fully from no remaining power at the room temperature. The charging time will be changed depending on the remaining amount and the state of battery.
- You cannot charge when [1]\*1 or [1]]\*2
  is displayed. Charge the battery at the
  temperature from 5°C to 35°C (41°F to 95°F).
  - \*1 [C]: When surrounding temperature is low.
  - \*2 [1]: When surrounding temperature is high.
- When using time becomes notably short even after the battery are fully charged, replace them with new ones.
- Be sure to push the USB connector all the way in. Otherwise, the recorder may not operate properly.
- Be sure to use the attached dedicated cable for the USB connection cable. If any other company's cable is used, it may cause problems. Also, please do not connect this dedicated cable to any other company's product.

#### **Battery indicator**

The battery indicator on the display changes as the battery loses power.

- When [ ] appears on the display, replace the battery as soon as possible.
   When the battery is too weak, [ ] and [Battery Low] appears on the display, the recorder shuts down.
- While charging, the battery indicator constantly changes and does not show the actual amount of power remaining.

#### Cautions concerning the rechargeable batteries

Read the following descriptions carefully when you use the lithium ion battery (LI-50B).

#### Discharging:

The rechargeable batteries self-discharge while this is not in use. Be sure to charge them regularly before use.

#### **Operating temperature:**

The rechargeable batteries are chemical products. The rechargeable batteries efficiency may fluctuate even when operating within the recommended temperature range. This is an inherent nature of such products.

#### Recommended temperature range:

#### When operating appliance:

0°C - 42°C/ 32°F - 107.6°F

#### Charging:

5°C - 35°C/ 41°F - 95°F

# Storage for a long period:

–20°C - 30°C/ –4°F - 86°F

Using the rechargeable battery outside the above temperature range may result in declining efficiency and shorter battery life. In order to prevent battery leakage or rust, remove the rechargeable battery from the products when you will not be using them for a long time, and store them separately.

#### Notes

- This recorder is designed to fully charge batteries regardless of their energy level. However, for best results when charging newly purchased rechargeable batteries or batteries that have not been used for a long time (more than one month), it is recommended to fully charge the batteries then discharge repeatedly for 2 to 3 times.
- When disposing rechargeable batteries, always observe the local laws and regulations. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods.
- If lithium ion batteries are not fully discharged, protect against shortcircuiting (e.g. by taping the contacts) before disposing.


# Recording from external microphone or other devices







#### VCVA

# Precautions on using the recorder connected to a PC

- When you are downloading a file from the recorder or uploading a file to the recorder, do not remove the USB cable even if the screen is indicating you can. Data is still being transferred while the LED indicator light is blinking. When removing the USB cable, be sure to follow the description in 
   P.111. If the USB cable is removed before the drive is stopped, data may not be successfully transferred.
- On a PC, do not format the drive of the recorder. Initialization is not successfully achieved on a PC. For initialization, follow the instructions in the [Format] display of the recorder (FET P.94).

- Folder (directory) names displayed by file management tools such as Explorer in Microsoft Windows and Finder in Macintosh are different from the folder names that can be set with the recorder or the "Olympus Sonority".
- If folders or files stored on the recorder are moved or renamed by using a file management tool in Windows or Macintosh, the order of files may be changed or files may become unrecognizable.
- Data can be written or uploaded to the recorder even though the attribute of the recorder drive is shown as Read-only by the operating system of the PC.
- As the noise may cause adverse effects on electronics devices nearby the recorder, unplug the external microphone and earphone when you connect the recorder to a PC.



DAISY stands for Digital Accessible Information System. Originally intended as a replacement for audio tapes for visually impaired people, the books and information are now used by people with various reading disabilities. DAISY is a worldwide accessible information system developed and maintained by the Daisy Consortium, an international collaborative development organization.

#### What is multimedia DAISY?

While listening to audio via computer, it is possible to simultaneously view drawings and pictures. Since the portion being read is highlighted, it is possible to know what section is being read. It is also possible to change the speed of the audio and jump to different pages. There are children and students studying with multimedia DAISY as learning materials.

#### How do you play multimedia DAISY?

After installing the "Olympus Sonority" software supplied with this recorder onto a computer (F87 P.115), select the [DAISY tray] folder from the browser window, and then press the play button to experience multimedia DAISY. During playback, it is possible to skip text and headings, as well as quickly jump to a section by clicking it. If a bookmark is set in advance, it is also possible to start playback from that position at any time. For more details, please see "Playing contents" (F87 P.134).


## Playing songs in a particular order

Lists created and saved as a file on a computer are called playlist files. By transferring a playlist file to the [**Music**] folder of this recorder, it is possible to play songs in a particular order.

- With playlists, it is possible to play multiple songs on this recorder in a freely determined order.
- This recorder supports .m3u playlist files.

#### Creating a playlist

This section explains the procedure to create, transfer, and play a playlist. This explanation will use the files and folders shown in the [**Music**] folder below and play the files in order from 1 to 8.



#### Windows

- Click the [Start] button, select [Programs] → [Accessories] → [Notepad].
  - · Notepad opens.
- Enter the names of files in the [Music] folder in the order you want them to be played.
  - The file names in the playlist are entered in the following manner: Drive letter (F:):\Folder name\File name.
  - The easiest way to ensure that the file names are entered correctly is to open the properties for the file you want to enter into the play list, copy the file name, and then paste that name into the playlist being created in Notepad.
  - If there are too many characters, playback may not be possible. As a guide, try to keep entries on a single line to within 256 characters.
  - Instead of the drive letter "F", any single half-width character can be used.
  - A maximum of 999 songs can be entered into a single play list.
- From the [File] menu, select [Save
  As]. Enter a file name followed by
  the extension ".m3u" and then
  save the file.



When there are layers of folders, use the "\" mark to indicate the layers when entering information.



# 4 Drag the saved playlist file to the [Music] folder of the recorder to transfer it to the recorder.

- Transfer the playlist file to the top level (first layer) of the [Music] folder.

#### Note

- 5 The transfer begins.
  - Wait until the transfer of the content has been completed. When it has been completed, the transferred content is displayed in the contents listing of the device. Also, the transferred content is displayed in the Library.





- When a content file is transferred to the recorder, a [.pos] file will be automatically created for each content file in the Audible folder.
- When the [\*.pos] file is deleted, using Explorer, the stored Playback Position will be deleted.
   The next time the file is selected, playback starts from the beginning of the file.
- When a content file is transferred to the recorder, a system file will be created as a hidden file inside the Audible folder. When this file is deleted using Explorer, it is no longer possible to playback the Audible content.

Audible content that has been transferred into the [Audible] folder on the recorder from a computer can be enjoyed with an exclusive mode optimally suited for the operation of Audible content.

#### **Audible mode**

When you select the [Audible] folder in the [Audibbooks] folder, the recorder automatically switches to the Audible mode. The Audible mode is an exclusive mode for enjoying Audible content ( modes 3, and 4 formats\*) transferred from a computer. The operating method for Audible mode differs from when other folders on the recorder are selected (Normal mode). Please see the "Operating recorder in Audible mode" (\*\* P.164) for details.

#### File Display screen in Audible mode

### Playback position and section

In the Audible mode, the starting position can be moved easily by referring to the Playback Position which is the positional information stored from previous stops for each file, and by referring to "Section" where the content distributor has preset the position.

#### Playback position

The Playback Position (positional information) is stored in the [.pos] file, which is created automatically by the recorder for each Audible content file ([.aa] file).

The Playback Position is initially located at the beginning of the file, and the stop position will be updated by playback or the use of S. Play (slow playback)/F. Play (fast playback).

Press the ▶►I or I◄◀ button to move the stop position while the recorder is stopped. The Playback Position will not be updated.

#### **Section**

Up to a maximum 100 divisions (chapters of a story or segments of news) are set arbitrarily for each file by the distributor of the content.

- When a content file is transferred to the recorder, a [.pos] file will be automatically created for each content file in the Audible folder.
   You can not set the Index marks in the Audible mode.
- When the [\*.pos] file is deleted, using Explorer, the stored Playback Position will be deleted.

### Operating recorder in Audible mode

- When the ►►I button is held down while the recorder is stopped, the recorder moves to the end of the file and then stops.

- When the >>I button is held down during playback and the end of the file is reached, the recorder goes back to the beginning of the file and stops.

#### Rewinding

Press and hold the I◀◀ button while the recorder is stopped.

When the button is released fast rewinding stops. The Playback Position is not updated. When the ►OK button is pressed playback resumes from that position.

- When the I◀◀ button is held down while the recorder is stopped, the recorder returns to the beginning of the file and then stops. If the I◀◀ button is still held down, the recorder moves back to the end of the previous file and continues fast rewinding.
